The Wiltshire FA have re-introduced the Wiltshire Premier Shield for Season 2019-20 after a break of 7 seasons. Whilst previously the competition involved just the 4 sides playing at Step 4 and above, the re-introduced Shield will now include the clubs playing at Step 5. This means there will be 10 teams entering this season's Shield and we will be one of the lowest level teams in the cup competition. The 10 teams will be Swindon Town, Chippenham Town, Salisbury, Swindon Supermarine, Melksham Town, Highworth Town, Westbury United, Bradford Town, Amesbury and Royal Wootton Bassett Town. The one and only season we have played in this competition before was Season 2001-2 when we defeated Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the First Round 1-0 before knocking out Swindon Supermarine 2-0 in the Second Round. We eventually went out at the Semi-Final stage losing 2-0 to Swindon Town. The First Round games are scheduled for October 7th, with the Second Round games in December. Last season all the clubs bar Swindon Town were in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, details of which are shown below.

Welcome to Tonight's Fixture

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Westfields for what is our second UHlsport Hellenic League home fixture of the 2019-20 Season and their first ever visit to the Gerard Buxton Ground. I hope they enjoy their short stay with us this evening and we wish them a safe journey home.

Westfields have moved across from the Midland Premier League where last season they were playing the likes of my old university in Loughborough, Shepshed Dynamo and Long Eaton, all places I view as being in the East Midlands and a good few hours away. Now they are travelling south to play the likes of ourselves, as well as those long journeys into deepest Berkshire to play Binfield, Virginia Water and Windsor. I am sure they are enjoying going to lots of new places but the travelling must be painful at times. Many of you may recall Westfields impressive FA Cup run in Season 2015-16 which saw them reach the First Round Proper and appear on both Football Focus and Match of the Day.

Westfields were tipped by many to be the favourites for the UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division title this season and early form would indicate that the tipsters might be right as they remain unbeaten in the league, having won heavily against Windsor and Longlevens, and drawing on Saturday with another of the expected top sides Brimscombe & Thrupp. It will certainly be a tough game tonight and we could do with a win else we could find ourselves at the very bottom of the table, albeit with games in hand. We are behind everyone else with our fixtures, in contrast to last season, due to the need for the replay in the FA Cup game with Aylesbury and the fact that our scheduled Bank Holiday Monday opponents Chipping Sodbury Town won their appeal to remain in the Western League, for one season at least, leaving the UHlsport Hellenic Premier with just 19 teams meaning one team will miss out each week. We will obviously catch up over the next few weeks.

First Team Season So Far

Whilst the results in the two league fixtures played so far have been disappointing, as was the FA Cup defeat against a side who were definitely beatable, the cup performances in the Bluefin League Challenge Cup and the FA Vase have been good allowing us to progress to the next round in both competitions. Following last Friday's 7-0 away win at New College the FA Vase sees us now travel to Tadley Calleva from the Sydenhams Wessex League in the Second Qualifying Round, with the game scheduled to take place on Saturday 14th September. Whilst it was a comfortable win on Friday, credit to the young New College side as they kept playing for 90 minutes and in Jack Rockett have a very talented player on their books. He certainly gave Joyce a bit of a run around in the closing stages of the match on Friday. I am sure that, whilst the two hat-tricks from Gio and Callum grabbed the headlines,

The resulting corner did bring a goal though. Pagliaroli's inswinger was only half cleared and the winger was able to recycle the ball into the box. It fell for Jon Davoile, who, with his back to goal, set a pass back to Harrison Lea and the midfielder steered in from an angle. Less than a minute elapsed before Bassett had their fifth. Bradbury raced onto a pass played over the top into the right corner, and the impressive youngster squared for an unmarked Mani Roper, who, after an initial poor first touch, calmly slotted beneath Pedrick. There should have been no way back into the game for Stonehouse. But Bassett appeared to take their foot off the gas, inviting pressure from their hosts.

Nathan Buckland fired across goal after getting in behind the defence before Chris Earle headed over Adam Philp's cross while unmarked. They then cut the deficit to three shortly after the hour. Bassett cleared a corner only as far as Earle, and he picked out the bottom right corner with a fine 25-yard drive.

Seven minutes later they made it 5-3 as Bassett's frailty defending set pieces haunted them again. Tim Williams steered in a free kick from deep on the right and an unmarked Philp guided a header into the bottom corner from twelve yards. Stonehouse could well have pulled within one goal too, which would have made things very interesting given that they were now in the ascendancy. The chance arrived in strange circumstances as the referee ignored his assistant flagging for offside. With the Bassett defence stopped, Earle found himself through one-on-one. However, Adam House was on hand to turn his shot around the post.

It was the last opportunity the Division One West side were able to conjure up, with Bassett failing to finally kill the game off as substitute Tinashe Gwavava snatched at a square pass from Alfie Presley when through. It was not Bassett's finest display. But producing five goals and, most importantly, a victory should hopefully allow Sam Collier and his team to kick on in the coming weeks after a stuttering opening fortnight.

Man of the Match: Caine Bradbury – having already played at full back and in central midfielder, the youngster continued to demonstrate his versatility by putting in a good quality display in the number ten role behind the striker.

Match Report v Stonehouse (A)

Bassett strike five in cup goalfest

Magpies Stadium, 17th August 2019

Royal Wootton Bassett Town struck five goals on the way to their first win of the 2019-20 campaign as they defeated Stonehouse Town 5-3 in a high-octane Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup second round encounter.

It certainly was not the prettiest of victories, with Bassett's performance veering from being dominant in spells to lacklustre in others. However, with a number of Sam Collier's team still getting acclimated to playing with one another, that is to be expected. And they still did more than enough to book a place in the next round of the Challenge Cup without facing too much real difficulty against plucky Division One West opposition.

Bassett controlled the game early on and were a perfectly-timed Ryan Thwaite tackle away from taking the lead after only twelve minutes as the defender slid in to deny Brad Pagliaroli. But the Bassett winger was not to be stopped three minutes later as he coolly sent Will Pedrick the wrong way from the penalty spot after Danny Langford had been clipped from behind by Jake Gardiner in the box. That lead was doubled ten minutes later as Pagliaroli this time turned provider. His towering corner caused a mini-scramble to ensue in the Stonehouse area and the ball dropped at the far post for defender Chris Jackson, who saw his first effort bounce off the post before scrambling the rebound just over the line.

A touch of brilliance from Stonehouse then halved the deficit for the hosts. They had struggled to create anything from open play in the opening half hour, but found the net when captain Alex Kibble powered a stunning free kick from the edge of the area into the top right corner. Yet the visitors restored their two goal advantage four minutes before half time. Racing onto Pagliaroli's ball over the top, Langford was able to get goalside of Lee Keveren before the defender hauled him down for another clear penalty. Pagliaroli went the same way from the spot, tucking the ball into the bottom left corner with Pedrick not even attempting a dive.

Bassett then began the second half seemingly brimming with confidence. And it looked as though they were going to run away with the tie as two goals made it 5-1. Caine Bradbury was unfortunate not to get his team's fourth when his shot on the turn was turned around the post by Kedrick.

Sam will have been particularly pleased with the clean sheet. In the Bluefin Challenge Cup progress was made after a 5-3 win away at Stonehouse. I was most impressed with the set up at Stonehouse, particularly the quality of the pitch, and once they have their floodlights installed they will turn out to be a great addition to Step 6 having been promoted from the Gloucestershire County League. We have a home fixture in the next round of the competition having drawn the current league leaders in Division One West, Hereford Lads Club, with the game being scheduled to be played on Saturday 28th September.

Ladies Team and FA Cup

Well done to Jonny, James and the Ladies on their big FA Cup win on Sunday. With just one win in eight FA Cup games before Sunday, it was an impressive result to win 7-0 against Chipping Sodbury Ladies to double our number of victories in the competition. The win secured prize money of £360 plus a guarantee of another £100 minimum in the next round with the possibility of a minimum of another £515 if the Ladies can win again in the next round. By the time you read these notes we will probably know who are opponents will be in the next round.

Development Team Changes and Cricklade

I am still annoyed by what the Club did in the Development game against Cricklade and how the Development Team management position was handled but it is not appropriate to use this editorial to air further my thoughts on the matter, the Chairman is fully aware how I feel on this subject.

Hellenic Premier Round-up

Sat 31-08-19: Six Goal Thriller Involving Today's Visitors

Just two league fixtures were scheduled in the division on Saturday due to the F.A. Vase, with one involving our visitors tonight **Westfields**. They made the journey down to Gloucestershire to take on a **Brimscombe & Thrupp** side who were most people's favourites for the title alongside Westfields at the start of the season, but have made an indifferent start to the season by their normal standards. Saturday saw the two sides share six goals and the points at The Meadow. Sam Gwynne put Westfields in front but Ed Major got Brimscombe back on level terms within a minute. Brimscombe went in front on 22 minutes courtesy of an own goal but it was back level ten minutes before the break when Keanu Hayes equalised for Westfields. Deep into first half injury time, Jack Smith put Brimscombe back in front as the home side led 3-2 at the break. Ten minutes after the interval it was all square again when Aidan Thomas fired in for Westfields. That was the end of the scoring as the two sides shared the points following a 3-3 draw.

The only other league game played saw **Brackley Town Saints** lose for the first time when they went down 2-0 at home against **Longlevens**, one for Tommy Callinan and an own goal securing the points for Longlevens who moved up into fourth spot as a result of the win.

Twelve Premier Division sides were involved in the FA Vase over the weekend with just five sides making it through to the next round. The action started on Friday night with an all UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division meeting between **Binfield** and **Virginia Water**. In front of an impressive attendance of 129, an extra-time goal from Josh Helmore sealed the tie in Binfield's favour. The same night **Royal Wootton Bassett Town** safely secured our passage into the next round courtesy of hat-tricks from Gio Wrona and Callum Parsons plus one for Alfie Presley in a 7-0 win at New College Swindon. A full match report on this game will be in Saturday's programme. Also on Friday two late goals secured **Shrivenham's** place in the next round following a 3-2 win over Milton United, David Bampton, Antonio Gerrish and Jordan Morris with the Shrivenham goals.

The only two winners on Saturday from the Premier Division were **Fairford Town**, 5-1 home winners over Abingdon Town, and **Flackwell Heath** who defeated Arlesey Town Town. The remaining six Premier Division sides all crashed out, including a couple to Division One Hellenic sides. **Ardley** lost 3-1 at home to Northampton ON Chenecks, **Burnham** also lost at home, going down 4-2 to Harborough Town. **Lydney Town** were beaten 3-1 by Combined Counties League side Frimley Green, whilst **Holmer Green** lost by a solitary goal at home to Raunds Town. The two sides to lose to lower lever Hellenic opposition were **Easington Sports**, beaten 6-0 at Risborough Rangers, and **Tuffley Rovers** who crashed 5-0 away at Shortwood United.

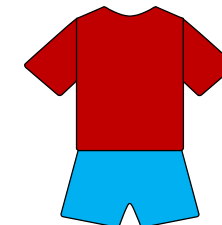
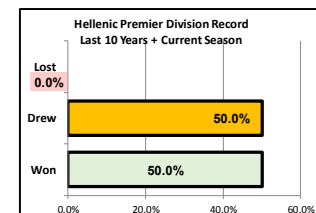
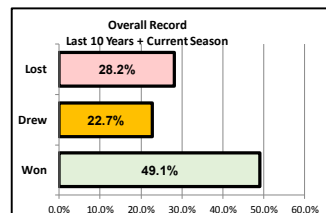

Westfields moved across from the Midland Premier League at the end of last season having finished in fourth spot in that Step 5 League. Westfields had requested a move to the UHlsport Hellenic League, which was granted by the FA as part of their summer review of Step 5 / Step 6 divisions across the country in the National League System.

Westfields were tipped by many to be the favourites for the UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division title this season and early form would indicate that the tipsters might be right as they remain unbeaten in the league and sit in fifth spot. They opened the season with an impressive 5-0 home win over Windsor with the goals shared across the team with five different scorers, including one from last season's top scorer Aidan Thomas. They then put four past Longlevens, as a 4-1 win maintained the 100% record. They travelled to Congleton in the FA Cup and came away with a 1-1 meaning a replay in midweek. Unlike ourselves, they made no mistake second time around winning 4-1 with that man Aidan Thomas hitting all four goals.

This was followed by a comfortable 8-0 win in the Bluefin Challenge Cup over Swindon Robins, a side who sit outside the National League System in the Hellenic Division Two West. The only defeat of the season followed in the FA Cup when they went down 3-2 at home against Lutterworth, so no repeat of that 2015-16 Cup run this season. The last two games have been drawn, 0-0 against Lydney Town on Bank Holiday Monday and then 3-3 last Saturday at Brimscombe & Thrupp.

Westfields • Club History



Westfields Football Club enter the new 2019/2020 season as members of the uhsport Hellenic Football League. Westfields have been laterally moved by the Football Association to the Hellenic Football League following a reorganisation of non-league football at Step 5 and Westfields will now enjoy a new challenge, entering new grounds and a new era as they face life going down the M4 as opposed to going up the M5, M6 and M1.

Whilst in recent seasons they have often met Bishops Cleeve, Lydney Town and Fairford Town in either pre-season friendlies or cup competitions the league generally will be a completely new challenge for Westfields who have been a dominant force in Midland football since they entered the West Midland League Division 2 back in the 1978/79 season.

Westfields go into the new season with a new management structure with Phil Glover as the Manager, Paul Willetts as the Assistant Manager/Head Coach, Scott Jackson as Assistant Coach and Rory Hollingshead as Goalkeeping Coach as the Westfields management team try and continue the historic rise of Westfields Football Club from the heady days of 1966 when the club was formed.

During the last 52 years Westfields have enjoyed a meteoric rise throughout West Midland League football leading up to the Midland Football League and along the way they have finished runners-up twice, narrowly missing out on promotion from the Midland Football League into the Southern League South & West, having finished runners-up to Gresley Rovers and Stratford Town in recent seasons.

Westfields celebrated their 50th anniversary year in 2015/2016 with an amazing giantkilling run in the FA Cup which saw them go through to the First Round Proper before losing in the First Round to Curzon Ashton following a Match of the Day game at allpay.park in the First Round tie which also featured Westfields' appearance on Football Focus and prior to that the Chief Executive Andy Morris had appeared live on the FA Cup First Round Draw as a studio panel guest in Manchester.

In fact 2016/2017 also saw Westfields celebrate their 50th anniversary with a celebratory dinner at The Three Counties Hotel, Hereford and Andy Morris was also a guest at the Non-League Paper luncheon at Chelsea football ground where he was given the Lifetime Achievement Award for 50 years' service as Secretary of Westfields Football Club. Other accolades were received during this season as presentations were made by the Herefordshire Football Association, the Midland Football League, Ladbrokes and the Emirates FA Cup Committee to celebrate the tremendous season that Westfields had enjoyed in their FA Cup run which gave them wins over Stourport Swifts, Tividale, St Ives Town, Highgate United, Walton Casuals and Leiston before they drew Conference North side Curzon Ashton at home and then lost in the replay 3-1.

Westfields have enjoyed tremendous support financially by being sponsored firstly by their ground sponsors allpay Ltd who for the first 15 years were also the shirt sponsors at the club and have given financial help to the club for which Westfields are indebted to Tony Killeen from allpay and his group of Directors for their financial support over many years. Westfields have also received tremendous support from Metclad of Nottingham and the Hereford Times, Hereford along with Life Member Ron Marshall who continues to support the club as he did from the early days in 1966. Westfields are a club geared up for success with a very strong committee which has been well established over many years and with a ground with an E certificate for higher-graded football.

The uhsport Hellenic League will certainly be a new challenge for Westfields but the team from Hereford are ready and waiting for the challenge ahead.

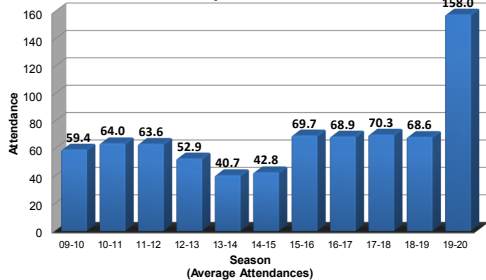

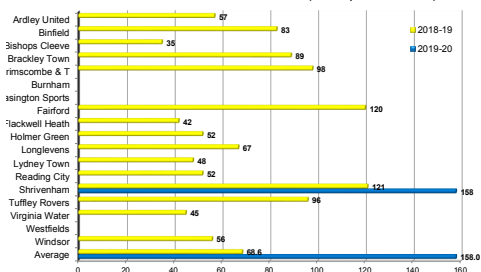

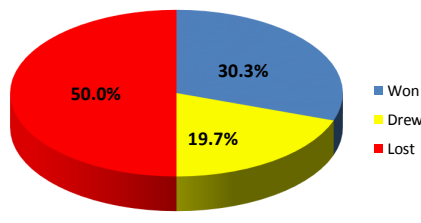

Callum Parsons

Parsons is a prolific goal scorer who joins Bassett this season from Highworth Town. Quick, with two good feet and, despite his diminutive size, a threat in the air, he poses a constant threat to opposing defences and is capable of conjuring up a goal from nowhere.

He made his debut in senior football with the Worthians back in the 2011-12 season. Having impressed for Highworth's Reserve side, Parsons made three substitute appearances for the first team towards the end of the campaign, scoring twice. After making his breakthrough, he moved to Fairford Town, spending the following two seasons with the Reds in Division One West where he demonstrated the immense potential that he had. Following a brief spell with Bassett at the end of that second season, Parsons moved back to Highworth for the 2014-15 campaign. He finished that year as second top-scorer for the Worthians with eighteen goals in 46 games and was a key part of the side that reached the FA Vase semi finals as he scored the only goal of the game in their quarter final away against Tadcaster Albion. Sixteen goals in 41 games followed a year later before Parsons made the move to Swindon Supermarine for his first taste of Southern League football.

And the forward proved a success at step four. Forming a potent partnership alongside his elder brother Josh and Connor Waldon, Parsons notched eighteen goals. He began the 2017-18 season with Supermarine, finding the net six times in sixteen matches before moving back to Highworth. He would help the Worthians to more success too as his 32 goals in 35 matches meant he finished as the team's top scorer, with Highworth earning promotion by virtue of finishing third. His haul that season included all five of Highworth's goals in a 5-2 Wiltshire Senior Cup quarter final triumph against Bassett. Parsons began last season with Thatcham Town before returning to Highworth, with whom he scored ten times in their opening Southern League campaign.

Set piece woe dogs Bassett in FA Cup exit

Aylesbury Vale Dynamos 1 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 0

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's vulnerability defending set pieces was again exposed as they fell to a 1-0 Emirates FA Cup Extra Preliminary round replay defeat away against Aylesbury Vale Dynamos.

Despite enjoying a number of chances and throwing everything they had at Aylesbury in the game's final twenty minutes, the tie was ultimately decided by Terry Griffiths' 23rd minute goal from a Bruno Brito corner, the centre half finding himself unmarked at the far post where he comfortably planted a header past a helpless Declan Lehmann.

For the fourth game in a row to begin the season, Bassett were left to feel a sense of frustration. Dynamos manager Paul Bonham admitted in his programme notes that his side had been fortunate to come away with a draw from the initial fixture on Saturday. But Sam Collier's team passed up opportunities to grab more than the solitary goal they were able to muster on that occasion. And that failure to convert openings came back to haunt them again on their visit to Buckinghamshire.

While evenly matched, it was the visitors who had the better opportunities in the opening exchanges, with Brad Pagliaroli snatching at a Danny Langford cross and Callum Parsons firing straight at James Weatherill after latching onto a Pagliaroli through ball. But it was ultimately Aylesbury, direct and reliant on set pieces, who made their chance pay.

They did come close three minutes before taking the lead when Alfi Touceda's snap shot took a deflection, forcing Lehmann to quickly adjust his feet and parry wide. But they would not be denied when Bruno Brito whipped in a towering corner to the far post and Griffiths – one of two home players lurking at the far post to have lost their marker – headed home. Their lead could well have been two before the break as well when another Brito delivery caused panic in the box. This time the ball fell for Dan Wilson, whose low strike seemed destined for the bottom corner only to be blocked on the line by Mani Roper.

Despite trailing, Bassett's performance remained flat after the restart, as it was the hosts who were playing with greater urgency. Pagliaroli did force Weatherill to tip over from a curling effort in the 49th minute. But Aylesbury initially appeared the likeliest to score – and extend their lead. On 51 minutes, Lehmann had difficulty snaring a Brito free kick, but was able to recover to knock the ball away before an Aylesbury player could direct it goalwards.

The NLP office was in absolute overdrive last week as we celebrated 40 years of the National League. It was while producing our special eight-page pull-out that it truly dawned upon us just how many extraordinary tales and history this division has created; so much so that we ended up writing far too much and spent most of Friday evening frantically trying to cut down word counts and squeeze in as many stories as we possible could!

There were interviews with the likes of Martin O'Neil and Neil Warnock, who both learned their trade in Non-League's highest tier, however for me, I particularly enjoyed speaking to Peter Hunter, who was secretary of the division when the one up, one down agreement was made with the Football League. It was during this conversation that I realised just how important the agreement made in 1987 was for both advancing the quality of the division and streamlining the entire Non-League pyramid. Before then clubs had to apply for a place in the Football League, with just one position up for grabs. At the time it seems as though this application process was a largely futile event for Non-League clubs to be a part of, with the bottom placed Football League club more often than not coming out on top in the lottery.

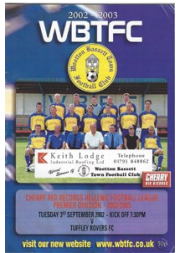
In many respects there was essentially a permanent divide between the Football League and Non-League – with the fairy tale dream of a team rising through from obscurity to break into the upper echelons of the English system seeming virtually impossible. It is amazing to see just what an impact the promotion and relegation agreement has had on Non-League football. Teams can now dare to dream of making a run through the divisions, while the guarantee of Football League clubs making the plunge into Non-League each year has increased both the quality and the fan base within the National League.

Nowadays, especially with the introduction of two up, two down, the division is in extraordinary health and with attendance records being broken and the likes of Tranmere Rovers using promotion from the National League as a springboard for further success, the future of the league is looking bright!

On This Date



Back in Season 2002-3 Wootton Bassett Town were mbarcking on their third season in the Hellenic League Premier Division with Pete Yeardley at the helm assisted by Mick Byrne . They entertained an in-form Tuffley Rovers at Rylands Way for their third league game of the season in confident mood having won two of their opening three league fixtures, although they had crashed out of the Challenge Cup a couple of days earlier losing 3-0 at Pewsey Vale.

Bassett went into the game without key players Rich Stevens, Mark Simpkins and Nick Tooley. Tuffley opened the scoring when in the 7th minute a through ball by defender Spencer Wilson was headed in by Colin Peacey. Allan Pluckrose went close to getting Bassett back on level terms on 25 minutes when his free kick went close. Tuffley increased their lead just after the half hour mark from the penalty spot when Luke Sharps fouled Stivelle Cooper in the box earning Sharps a booking. Scott Medcroft coolly dealt with the penalty with a neat touch to send the ball past Bassett debutant keeper Peter Baker.

Bassett pulled one back five minutes from the break when Stuart Lamont got on the end of an excellent cross into the box. However, having got within touching distance of the visitors the good work was undone on the stroke of half time with Colin Peacey grabbing his second for Tuffley after Bassett failed to pick him up. It could have been even worse as just before the break Tuffley could have made it four but Stivelle Cooper scuffed an easy opportunity to leave it 3-1 and with all to do at the break and a poor first half showing.

Manager Yeardley and coach Byrne read the riot act at half time and within ten minutes of the restart Allan Pluckrose went close to pulling a goal back for Bassett on two occasions, the first from a Paul Patel corner that he hit high and wide and then from another corner which was initially spilled by the Tuffley keeper but then held at the second attempt. Pluckrose continued to be Bassett's main threat until the introduction of substitute Rob Day but Bassett were unable to find the net again and nearly conceded again towards the end of the game but eventually went down 3-1 to their visitors from Gloucestershire.

The Bassett 'keeper then produced an outstanding save to keep out Brito's acrobatic half volley following a Keith Mupfururirwa cross before Brito fluffed his lines when Aylesbury had broke decisively from a Bassett corner.

Finally, the visitors seemed to kick into life – and they were helped by the energy that substitutes Callum Wright and Tony Joyce injected into the game. On the hour, Langford's blast from the edge of the area after a Gio Wrona corner was only half cleared produced a fine fingertip save from Weatherill to divert the ball over the bar. The 'keeper then had to punch over a curling Pagliaroli free kick as it sailed towards the top left corner.

A neat move involving Harrison Lea and Parsons set free Langford moments later, but the forward could only drag his shot across the face of goal and wide. Bassett were then dealt a boost when goals corer Griffiths received his marching orders for a second bookable offence with quarter of an hour remaining. The visitors subsequently set up camp inside the Aylesbury half. But the decisive breakthrough was not forthcoming.

Parsons saw a side foot effort blocked after a switch of play from Wright and cutback from Pagliaroli had seemingly opened up the home defence. Langford then saw a low rebound effort from a free kick of his that had hit the wall held low on the dive. Finally, with two minutes of time to go, Pagliaroli cut inside from the right only to see his snap shot from an angle rattle the base of the near post.

Chris Jackson was then sent off in the dying stages for a heavy challenge on Joe Fitzgerald that arguably merited a second yellow rather than the straight red he received. That decision summed up the frustrating nature of Bassett's night though as a cheap, avoidable goal and failure to convert their chances contrived to see them bow out of the FA Cup at the first opportunity.

Man of the Match: Harrison Lea – started the game at right back where he acquitted himself well before moving into a more advanced position from which the youngster's composure on the ball helped contribute towards some of his team's better opportunities in front of goal..
