The Wiltshire FA have re-introduced the Wiltshire Premier Shield for Season 2019-20 after a break of 7 seasons. Whilst previously the competition involved just the 4 sides playing at Step 4 and above, the re-introduced Shield will now include the clubs playing at Step 5. This means there will be 10 teams entering this season's Shield and we will be one of the lowest level teams in the cup competition. The 10 teams will be Swindon Town, Chippenham Town, Salisbury, Swindon Supermarine, Melksham Town, Highworth Town, Westbury United, Bradford Town, Amesbury and Royal Wootton Bassett Town. The one and only season we have played in this competition before was Season 2001-2 when we defeated Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the First Round 1-0 before knocking out Swindon Supermarine 2-0 in the Second Round. We eventually went out at the Semi-Final stage losing 2-0 to Swindon Town. The First Round games are scheduled for October 7th, with the Second Round games in December. Last season all the clubs bar Swindon Town were in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, details of which are shown below.

## Welcome to Reading City

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Reading City for what is our third UHlsport Hellenic League home fixture of the 2019-20 Season and our second so far this week. I hope all from Reading enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home along the M4.

Reading have started the season well, as they did last season, and will be hoping that, unlike last season, they can continue that good form at the start and mount a promotion challenge after flirting with relegation last season. They have already defeated Burnham and Shrivenham in their opening fixtures, drawn with league leaders Binfield, but lost for the first time on Tuesday night away at Flackwell Heath when their former manager Marcus Richardson scored the winning goal against them. See elsewhere in the programme for our record against them in previous meetings.

## Westfields

I understand that Westfields well and truly lived up to their title favourites tag on Tuesday night as they ran out comfortable 6-1 winners in our biggest defeat for over 18 months. Conceding two early goals we were always going to be up against it and from what I have been told from those in attendance we struggled to handle their pace and overall fitness. We have certainly not made the start the management team would have wanted and Sam intimated in his interview with Your Sport Swindon on Tuesday night that the team probably needed refreshing. Not sure whether Sam meant changes within the existing squad or new signings, but by the time you read these notes there may well have been some new signings on board. Unfortunately Chris Jackson is still suspended for one more game following his sending off away at Aylesbury in the FA Cup, for an offence that probably only warranted a second yellow and a one game ban, but having received a straight red he has had to miss three games, and so is not available until Tuesday night.

On the same night we were losing against Westfields, Fairford Town were coming back from 2-0 down to win 3-2 against Longlevens. If you look at the Fairford side that night it included a number of players who have recently played for us who we have replaced with what on paper look to be better players. Few would include Nathan Hawkins, Dan Bailey, Mason Thompson and Harvey Scholes in their side ahead of our current players who play in their position but as a group there certainly seems to be more of a togetherness and team effectiveness from the Fairford players than we currently have. So far this has seen them win four of their opening five league fixtures and they currently sit 3rd in the table. It just goes to show that sometimes it is not just about the quality of the individual players you sign but how you bring them together and how they gel and operate as a unit. Hopefully we will start to turn things round in the league, starting here today against a good Reading side.



All at Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC were deeply saddened to hear of the recent passing of Purton FC Secretary Alan Eastwood. Throughout local football, Alan was rightly known as Mr Purton having first joined the club as a player back in 1972 and remained with them for 47 years until his sad passing on the eve of the 2019-20 Season

Despite serious ill health Alan had continued to fulfil the Secretary role at Purton and carried out the role with such skill and diligence that he was honoured with the Wiltshire Senior League's Club Secretary of the Season award in Season 2017-18.

As a player Alan had formed a very successful goal scoring partnership with Allan Coole back in the 1970's. Alan went on to score 125 goals for the club before hanging up his boots and taking on the administration at Purton, holding down just about every role in the club since and becoming the recognised face of Purton Football Club to everyone in Wiltshire and beyond.

Alan was rightly proud of the season his Purton side that went the whole league season unbeaten in season 2003-4 to win the Hellenic League Division 1 West title, having previously lifted the Division 1 title back in 1995-96. Alan's match day programme for Purton became renowned for the impressive historical information it contained, with Alan having kept a copy of each season's final programme going back to when he first joined the club enabling him to trace past results and reports for his programmes. His programmes always were a great read, containing a quiz, football quotations and interesting recollections from the past. Alan always enjoyed his local derby games with Wootton Bassett Town and the rivalry between the clubs was always cordial and there have been a number of players who over the years have played for both clubs.

All our thoughts are with Alan's family at this sad time. Alan will be deeply missed by all those in the Wiltshire football family but none more so than at Purton the club he served with such dignity and esteem for 47 years.

# Match Reports v Westfields (H)

## Classy Westfields hit Bassett for six

### Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Westfields 6

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's return to league action was a chastening experience as they were well beaten 6-1 by Westfields, the Hellenic League Premier Division newcomers demonstrating why they are considered one of the favourites for the title this season. The visitors were a class above and in control throughout. They went ahead early, Aidan Thomas beating the offside trap to latch onto a good through ball before slotting home. Richard Greaves then doubled their advantage from the spot after Tom Cole was caught out from a long ball and conceded a penalty. Their lead was further extended just before the hour mark when a well-worked move was finished off by Greaves drilling home a right wing cross from six yards out. Bassett did grab a goal back as Alfie Presley headed in from Gio Wrona's fine delivery. But any hopes of a possible comeback were quickly doused as Thomas seized upon sloppy defending to restore the visitors' three goal advantage. Their last two goals of the evening both arrived in outstanding style. Craig Jones grabbed the fifth before Keanu Cooper completed the rout.

### Away View

Westfields welcomed back Craig Jones and Matt Reeve to their line-up away at Royal Wootton Bassett last night and the changes made by manager Phil Glover made all the difference as the inspirational midfield pair produced tremendous performances to enable Westfields to take all their chances and come home with the 3 valuable points. Westfields played slick quick football on a beautifully prepared Wootton Bassett pitch that suited Westfields' attacking style and it only took Aidan Thomas a short while to put Westfields ahead when he got on the end of a Craig Jones pass to open the scoring. Midway through the half Richard Greaves was bundled over in the penalty area but he got up and took the penalty to put Westfields 2-0 ahead from the spot. Wootton Bassett briefly came back into the game and just before the break Harvey Rivers was forced to make an excellent save with his legs to prevent the home side pulling a goal back just before the interval.

After the break Thomas was again on the spot to put Westfields 3-0 ahead before Royal Wootton Bassett pulled a goal back through Alfie Presley to put the score at 3-1. However, within 60 seconds Westfields were back in front at 4-1 when Richard Greaves got on the end of an Aidan Thomas cross and then Craig Jones scored a 5th with a blistering shot from just inside the penalty area before substitute Keanu Cooper scored a spectacular 6th goal after being put through with a brilliant ball from Richard Greaves. Westfields really took their chances and hoisted themselves up into 4th position where on Saturday they meet 5th in the table Ardley at home at allpay.park, kick-off 3pm.

## Ladies FA Cup

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies have been handed a home tie against Torquay United in the Women's FA Cup first qualifying round. The tie, which will take place at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on Sunday 22nd September (2pm kick off), is Bassett's reward for their convincing 7-0 preliminary round victory against Chipping Sodbury Town on Sunday. Torquay, who this season will be opponents of Bassett in the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division, advanced courtesy of a 3-0 home triumph against RNAS Culdrose. After recording only their second ever win in the competition on Sunday, Bassett will now be hoping to win through to the second qualifying round for the first time in the club's history. They did feature at that stage in 2016-17, however it was the round at which the team entered. To do so, they'll need to defeat a Gulls side who have an impressive recent record in the Women's FA Cup, having reached the third qualifying round in three of the past five years. Tomorrow sees the Ladies start their league campaign away at Marine Academy Plymouth.

## FC 's-Gravenzande

On the subject of FA Cup competitions congratulations to our Dutch friends FC 's-Gravenzande, who have qualified for the first round proper of the KNVB Beker, the equivalent of the FA Cup in the Netherlands. 's-Gravenzande had defeated RKS V Heeze in the opening qualifying round in August and, after four Eredivisie sides made it through to the group stages of the UEFA Champions League and Europa League in the week, were selected as one of four amateur teams to receive a bye through the second qualifying round and into the main draw. The draw was made on Saturday night, and FC 's-Gravenzande will host SteDoCo, a side who play one level higher in the Derde Divisie, in the week commencing Monday 28th October. While they may have missed out on a meeting with an Eredivisie side their tie is very much a winnable one and it will be a historic contest for the club and, if they win, maybe Ajax, Feyenoord or PSV Eindhoven could await in the second round!

## Development Team

The Development side pushed one of the fancied sides Shrewton all the way in the Wiltshire Senior League last Saturday as they embarked on a tough run of fixtures that sees them travel to take on league leaders Kintbury Rangers today before games against reigning champions Wroughton and high flying Corsham Town Reserves. You couldn't have asked for a tougher set of fixtures as Steve Yeardley starts his management career!

Next up here is another tough looking First Team home game this coming Tuesday in the Floodlit Cup when we play a Malvern side who have yet to suffer defeat in a Hellenic fixture, their only defeat in six games this season coming in the FA Cup. Enjoy today's game.

"I thought we gifted them four of the goals. I'm massively disappointed.

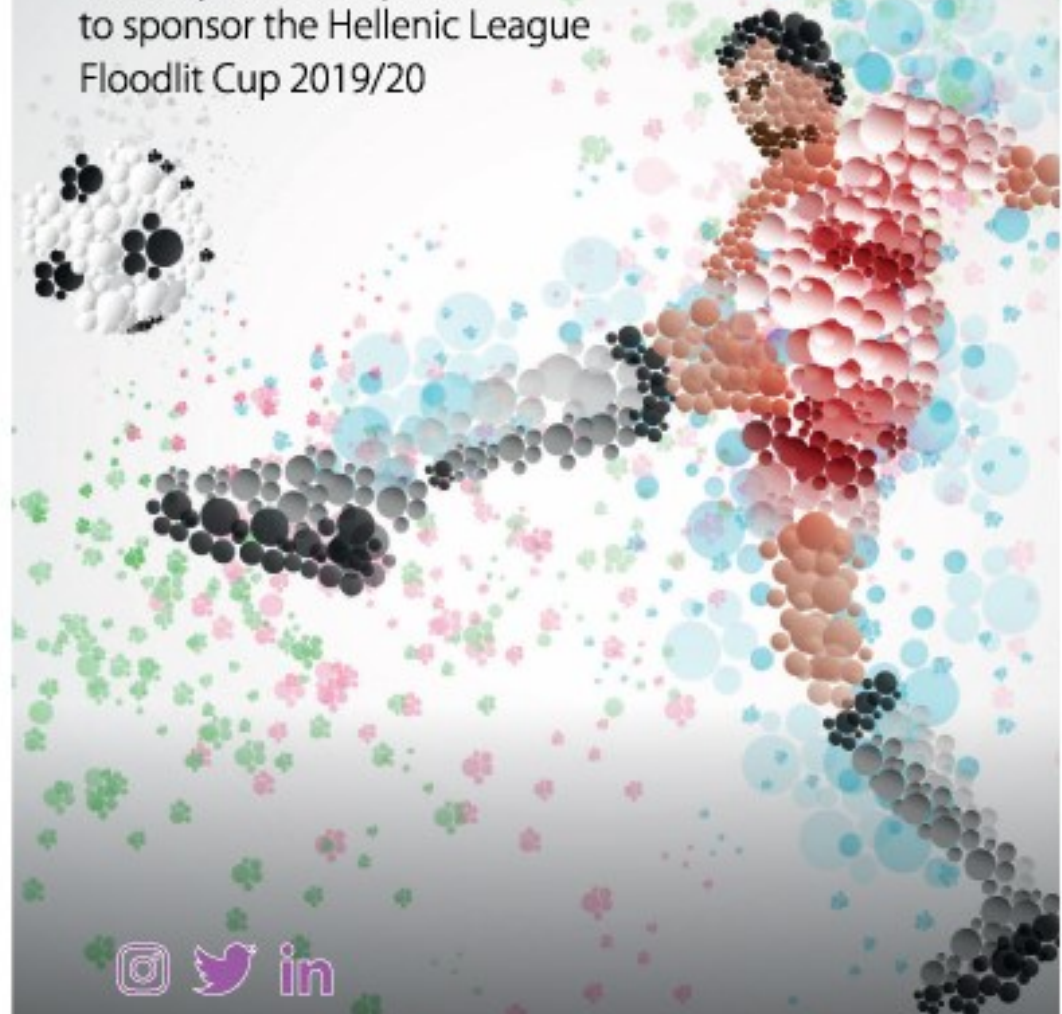
"We certainly need to bring in some people. We certainly need a refresh."

# Hellenic Premier Round-up

## Midweek Action in the Premier Division

Leaders Binfield were without a game and manager Roger Herridge took the opportunity to make the journey along the M4 to get a look at title favourites **Westfields** as they took on Royal Wootton Bassett Town. No doubt he left suitably impressed as Westfields ran out 6-1 winners, Aiden Thomas and Richard Greaves both bagging a brace with one a piece for Craig Jones and substitute Keanu Cooper, Alfie Presley with the consolation goal for Bassett. However, Westfields only moved up to fourth spot as wins for Bishops Cleeve and Fairford Town kept saw them hold onto second and third spot respectively. **Bishops Cleeve** had a 1-0 away win at **Brimscombe & Thrupp** who, like ourselves, have not had the best of starts. Luke Payne scored the only goal of the game midway through the first half. **Fairford** were 2-0 down at the break in their game with **Longlevens** thanks to goals from Harry Emmett and Brad Martin but a storming second half performance saw Jody Bevan's side record an impressive come from behind victory as they ran out 3-2 winners thanks to goals from Ellis Dunton, Callum Preece and Connor Thompson.

Today's visitors **Reading City** lost their first game of the season as they went down 3-1 away at **Flackwell Heath**, manager Marcus Richardson scoring what turned out to be a winning goal against his former club ten minutes from time. Josh Baines had put Flackwell in front with a long range effort but Reading City had got back on level terms before the break. It remained level until 10 minutes from time when Richardson headed his side in front. Last Season Reading City started well but then hit a bad run of form following the departure of a number of players and in the end just avoided relegation, finishing second from bottom three points ahead of Abingdon United who were the unfortunate side to be relegated. Reading will be keen to repeat of last season and have again started reasonably well with two wins and a draw from their opening league fixtures.

Last Saturday they picked up useful point away at league leaders Binfield, Fergus Burton scoring in the 1-1 draw. Tuesday night saw them fall to their first and only league defeat of the season when they lost 3-1 away at Flackwell Heath.

## Bassett cruise past College

### New College Swindon 0 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 7

Royal Wootton Bassett Town romped to a clinical 7-0 victory – their biggest ever in the competition – to see off a plucky, yet heavily overmatched New College side in the FA Vase First Qualifying round. Both Callum Parsons and Gio Wrona struck hat-tricks as Sam Collier's team advanced with great ease and – importantly from the manager's point-of-view – a clean sheet in the bag. There were moments in the second half where Bassett did get a little sloppy. But that's to be expected in a game that was only going to have one winner as soon as the first goal went in, while for the majority of the game the visitors were dominant and able to play some fluent, flowing football.

Initially it did require Bassett to show a degree of patience in their search for the opening goal. New College, who struggled to maintain any real, meaningful possession in the opening period, played with ten men behind the ball, with it often appearing as though they were playing a novel 7-2-1 formation. That made it somewhat difficult for Bassett to unpick their defence, though a handful of chances did fall their way early on, the best falling to Jonny Davoile, who shot straight at Adam McGill after racing onto Tony Joyce's ball over the top. It was ultimately a Joyce pass that set Bassett on their way. The hosts frequently tried to deploy a high line, leaving an expanse of space to play balls into. And the full back clipped a perfect pass into the right channel, which Wrona, playing on the right side of midfield, latched onto to before comfortably slotting home.

The floodgates appeared as though they were going to open as McGill was forced to save with his feet from Alfie Presley before Wrona soon doubled the lead, tapping home a rebound after Callum Parsons had rounded the 'keeper only to see his tight-angled shot kept out by a defensive block. The young home side started to look shorn of confidence. And they were guilty of giving the ball away cheaply to Wayne Turk, whose through ball set Parsons free only for the forward to shoot straight at McGill. Another case of New College cheaply losing possession soon led to Bassett's third. Turk won the ball back, Wrona steered a pass into the space behind the defence, and Parsons coolly lobbed the advancing McGill. Parsons then added his second four minutes before half time, receiving a weighted pass from Davoile before firing into the top corner from the edge of the area.

This season has heralded the news that yet another island team are hoping to enter the Non-League pyramid. Following in the footsteps of Guernsey, who play at Step 4 and the newly formed Jersey Bulls, who are currently competing in Step 6, a group from the Isle of Man have unveiled plans to create their very own football club, with ambitions to play in the Northwest Counties League in time for the start of next campaign. This is brilliant news both for the Non-League system and players and fans living on the Isle of Man.

Last year I went to visit Guernsey, where I thoroughly enjoyed watching a match and have subsequently interviewed their manager Tony Vance on a number of occasions. It was brilliant to see how the island's community had really embraced the team and the atmosphere on matchday was a superb thing to be a part of. When speaking to Vance it quickly becomes clear just how much pride he has taken in the project and the importance that it has had in developing young players on the island. Whereas before, making the jump into the professional ranks was extremely hard for young footballers on the island, they now have the opportunity to showcase their talents in England throughout the year.

One of the big drawbacks of starting an island team is the high costs involved, which include having to pay for the travel of both themselves and their opponents, however both Guernsey and Jersey Bulls have demonstrated how, with the support of their local communities, these steep financial commitments can be managed. The fact that Jersey Bulls were able to attract almost 1000 fans for their very first fixture at the start of the month shows both how island clubs can develop revenue and help to cultivate a special following across the community.

The Isle of Man bid is being led by National Team manager Paul Jones. When interviewing him last week I was immediately struck by his immense passion for football on the island and his determination to see the project through. There have been plans in the pipeline to start a team on the Isle of Man for almost 15 years but for one reason or another the project has never come to fruition, until now I wish Paul and his colleagues the absolute best of luck in creating a club because these island teams have the potential to unite their communities in such a unique way.

# On This Date



After gaining promotion in some style the season prior, season 2010-11 was meant to be a year in which Wootton Bassett Town consolidated their place in the Hellenic Premier Division. While performances on the pitch were more than good enough for this, in the end it would be off the field where the club's future would be decided.

After losing 3-0 against recently relegated Bracknell Town on the Saturday, an early penalty from defender Jon Beeden helped inspire Wootton Bassett Town back to winning ways as they saw off Wokingham & Emmbrook 2-1 at Rylands Way on Tuesday 7th September 2010.

By successfully converting his third spot kick of the year, the youngster arrested the insecurities manager Dave Turner was bound to have had after his side's early season penalty adventures; including the pre-season, four players - Shaun Terry, current First Team Manager Sam Collier, Craig Bowden (albeit during a shootout) and Richie Carter - had all been guilty of failing to score from twelve yards.

Stout defending then kept the visitors - under the joint guidance of current Binfield manager Roger Herridge and Dan Bateman following Wayne Wanklyn's resignation after their defeat at Pegasus Juniors on the previous Saturday - at bay until the final minute of the match when Chris Fower netted.

However, Sam Collier's strike a matter of moments earlier which doubled Bassett's advantage meant the Satsumas' goal mattered little.

Victory meant Dave Turner's side had dropped just a handful of points from their opening half dozen Hellenic Premier Division matches and lifted the team into the heady heights of third position in the league table. A good night in history this one.

The goals appeared as though they would keep flowing after the restart.

On 50 minutes, Bassett had their fifth as Wrona saw a shot on the turn saved by McGill only for the ball to rebound in off the leg of a fortunately positioned Presley. Three minutes later it was six as Danny Langford rolled his marker Matt Cosnett before unselfishly squaring for Parsons to tap home.

McGill then did well to keep out efforts from Presley and Parsons. But around the hour mark New College – much to their credit – kicked into life. And they served up a scare for Bassett, who had lost their shape a little and become susceptible to the counterattack. The impressive Jack Rockett – living up to his surname – raced clear of Joyce down the left and cut inside when nearing the box only to blaze over. Jack Hulbert then stung the palms of Declan Lehmann when he found himself with too much space inside the penalty area.

Yet the spell where Bassett faced any real pressure was only temporary. And as time wound down, they found themselves creating chances again. Langford, who toiled away all game without reward – except for a trip to the sin bin, brought out an excellent reflex save from McGill with a powerful shot on the bounce. While it may not have been his night, teammate Wrona had enjoyed himself. And the midfielder completed his hat-trick with the last action of the game. Presley swung in a cross from the right touchline and, narrowly beating the 'keeper to the punch, Wrona planted a firm header into the net to make it seven.

Tougher tests await – both in the league and Vase, where Bassett will travel to Wessex League Premier Division side Tadley Calleva.
