The Wiltshire FA have re-introduced the Wiltshire Premier Shield for Season 2019-20 after a break of 7 seasons. Whilst previously the competition involved just the 4 sides playing at Step 4 and above, the re-introduced Shield will now include the clubs playing at Step 5. This means there will be 10 teams entering this season's Shield and we will be one of the lowest level teams in the cup competition. The 10 teams will be Swindon Town, Chippenham Town, Salisbury, Swindon Supermarine, Melksham Town, Highworth Town, Westbury United, Bradford Town, Amesbury and Royal Wootton Bassett Town. The one and only season we have played in this competition before was Season 2001-2 when we defeated Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the First Round 1-0 before knocking out Swindon Supermarine 2-0 in the Second Round. We eventually went out at the Semi-Final stage losing 2-0 to Swindon Town. We have been drawn to play in one of two First Round matches and travel to Westbury on Wednesday 9th October. The other First Round tie sees Salisbury travel to Amesbury Town on Tuesday 8th October.

Welcome to Virginia Water

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Virginia Water for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. I hope all from Virginia Water enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home back along the M4.

Last season the two games between the sides were both played in midweek with each side winning their respective home fixtures. The first ever meeting between the two clubs saw Virginia Water win 2-0 and then we won the reverse fixture at the Gerard Buxton Ground thanks to goals from TJ Bohane and Stephen Yeardley in a 2-1 success. On the subject of TJ it is good to see him return to the Gerard Buxton Ground after starting the season with Highworth Town, we have certainly missed his goals.

Going back to today's visitors, given my Surrey base, I had sought to have a look at Virginia Water for Sam in their game against Yateley United in the Banbury Litho Floodlit Cup on Tuesday 10th September. I got into the ground just in time for the kick-off, put something on Facebook about being at the game, and then started watching the match only for the floodlights to fail at Stag Meadow, Windsor after just five minutes. I hadn't even got round to working out what formation they were playing! Attempts to re-boot the lights failed and the game was abandoned by the referee and was re-scheduled for last Thursday. Unfortunately due to Speedway I could not go to the re-scheduling. I felt very sorry for Virginia Water for the original postponement. My understanding is that they pay Windsor a large amount of money to hire the Stag Meadow facility, they had also paid for all the programmes to be printed and had to pay the match officials on the night, as well as arranging food etc, only for the landlord's facilities to fail them on the night. I hope that Windsor didn't charge them for that night's five minutes.

Reading City, Malvern Town & Tadley Calleva

An excellent second half performance against Reading City helped secure a point against our visitors in the last league encounter here at the Gerard Buxton. We also had chances to win it late on but in the end had to settle for the draw. Unfortunately we couldn't take the momentum into the midweek Floodlit Cup tie with Division One West side Malvern Town, losing 3-1 to side who could well be in the Premier Division this time next season. Saturday saw us make the trip down the M4 to take on Tadley Calleva in the FA Vase. In a tight contest the game was ultimately decided by a harsh penalty decision in favour of the home side, whereas our appeals for a penalty fell on deaf ears and we exited the last remaining national competition for this season, going down 1-0 to the Sydenhams Wessex League side. We are certainly not having the luck so far this season but hopefully the return of a couple of familiar faces in TJ Bohane and Carl Evans will turn our season around.

Introduction to Longlevens

Longlevens, originally Longleavens, is a suburb of Gloucester.

Gloucester owes its name, strategic location and much of its layout to many centuries of Roman occupation. The first settlement was a military fortress at Kingsholm established in the late 40s or early 50s AD. It developed into one of the chief settlements in Roman Britain. After the Fall of Rome, Gloucester was captured by the Anglo-Saxons following the decisive battle Dyrham in 577. The Mercian king, Osric of Hwicce, founded an abbey dedicated to St Peter on the site of today's Cathedral. By the 10th century, Gloucester continued to be an important centre in the Kingdom of Mercia, and was famously re-planned and re-fortified by Queen Aethelflaed (daughter of Alfred the Great) as a defence against the marauding Danes.

Gloucester Cathedral was used as a location for Hogwarts in the Harry Potter film Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone. Longlevens was severely affected by the July 2007 floods, which caused Horsbere Brook, which runs through the village, to flood many homes and roads.

Famous Residents

Former England cricket captain Alastair Cook, whilst associated with Essex, was actually born in Gloucester. Another cricketer from Gloucester is David Lawrence who played in five Tests and one ODI for England from 1988 to 1992. Former England rugby player Mike Teague was born and raised on a farm a few miles outside Gloucester and attended Churchdown School.

Nearest railway station

Nearest Railway station is Gloucester Railway station which is 3.1 miles from the ground.

Nearest Pubs to Ground

The nearest pub to the ground appears to be the Wheatsone Inn which is on the A417 road, described as no-nonsense chain pub with a menu of traditional British dishes and a family-friendly vibe. Heading into town then the next nearest pub is the Great Western which is described on the internet as a friendly little pub, with nice pub food and good atmosphere.

Things to Do in Gloucester

There is plenty to do in the city of Gloucester itself. The top tourist attraction in the city is the spectacular Gloucester Cathedral. Another place to visit is the Jet Age Museum. Dedicated to the preservation of Gloucestershire's rich aviation heritage, the museum tells the story of the Gloster Aircraft Company, focussing on the first Allied jet flight. If military history is more your thing then the place to visit is the Soldiers of Gloucestershire Museum which tells the 300 year history of the Gloucestershire Regiment who have been present at many of the turning points in British History; battles in the American Revolutionary War, defeating Napoleon, the defence of Dunkirk and fighting the spread of communism in Korea.

Match Reports v Malvern (H)

Floodlit Cup offers no salvation as struggles continue

The Floodlit Cup is often seen by managers within the Hellenic League as something of an unwelcome distraction. After the disappointing start Royal Wootton Bassett Town have endured to their 2019-20 season, the competition arguably took on a different edge, a possible route to salvage some confidence with a league win still elusive. However, that was not to be as Sam Collier's side were eliminated by Malvern Town, the Division One West newcomers - who, unlike Bassett, have hit the ground running - running out deserved 3-1 winners.

They made a quick start, going ahead after six minutes as George Hayes curled a left footed shot from outside the area beyond the reach of Declan Lehmann. Bassett levelled shortly before half time though, Melksham Town loanee Andy Sandell producing a cool turn before producing a composed side-foot finish. Malvern almost restored their lead in the opening minute of the second half, but Matthew Turner was denied by Lehmann before the resulting corner led to a chance that was cleared off the line. However, Ethan Moran eventually put them ahead with a fine individual effort, twisting his way through the Bassett defence before finding the far corner. Youngster Morgan Skidmore then made certain of the outcome in the game's final minute.



Ladies

The Ladies safely made it through to the quarter finals of the Women's Wiltshire Cup as they started the defence of the trophy they won last season with a hard fought 4-0 win over Laverstock & Ford on Sunday. A report on that game is included in today's programme. Tomorrow they are up against Torquay United in the Women's FA Cup First Qualifying Round. The tie is Bassett's reward for their convincing 7-0 Preliminary Round victory against Chipping Sodbury Town. Torquay, who this season will be opponents of Bassett in the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division, advanced courtesy of a 3-0 home triumph against RNAS Culdrose. Bassett will be hoping to win through to the Second Qualifying Round for the first time in the club's history. They did feature at that stage in 2016-17, however it was the round at which the team entered. To do so, they'll need to defeat a Gulls side who have an impressive recent record in the Women's FA Cup, having reached the third qualifying round in three of the past five years. Kick-off tomorrow is 2PM. A programme is being produced for all our Ladies fixtures this season and I must say how refreshing it is to deal with the Ladies management team where you don't have to chase content for the programme. After years of dealing with First Team managers, the Ladies management team are a dream to deal with, although that said Sam is probably the best manager during my tenure as programme editor for providing me with notes since Pete Yeardley was in charge.

After drawing with Kintbury Rangers two weeks ago they pushed current champions Wroughton all the way last Saturday as they eventually went down 3-2 to a side who maintained their 100% record in defeating our young side. Both our goals were scored by Charlie McCuish who is looking a useful proposition after making the step up from Under 18 football.

The U18 side have got their season under way, winning 3-1 away at Radstock Town in their opening fixture and then going down 4-3 away at FC Chippenham, after leading 3-1.

Next Up At The Gerard Buxton Ground

Next up here is that Ladies FA Cup game tomorrow. Then on Thursday the Under 18's are at home for the first time in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League Under 18 Division. Next Saturday it is First Team action again when Hereford Lads Club, the current leaders of Division One West, who are our visitors in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup 3rd Round. Enjoy today's game and hopefully see you in the bar after the game to celebrate what hopefully will be our first league win of the season.

Hellenic Premier Round-up

FA Vase and Premier Division

With most of the Premier Division in FA Vase action just one game took place in the Premier Division and it was decided by a solitary goal in the 71st minute scored by **Lydney Town's** Keelan Hamblett against visitors **Brackley Town Saints**. The win lifted Lydney into third place in the table as their excellent start to the season continued.

In the Vase, whilst we were going down to that 1-0 penalty defeat at Tadley Calleva, **Binfield's** great start to the season continued as they came away from Division One East side AFC Aldermaston with a 3-1 win. Trailing 1-0 at the break three unanswered second half goals from Sean Moore (2) and Josh Helmore saw Binfield through to the next round.

There was something of a shock in another all Hellenic tie as Abingdon United, relegated from the Premier Division last season, defeated current Premier side **Reading City** 3-1, Mo Davies with the Reading goal.

A cast of former Bassett players were again on the score sheet with Ben Lodge (20), Connor Thompson, Nathan Hawkins, Harvey Scholes and Dan Bailey scoring for Fairford.

Premier Division **Longlevens** were another winner over Division One West opponents, defeating Newent Town 2-1 courtesy of goals from Tommy Callinan and Craig Martin.

Extra time was needed at **Shrivenham** and even then there was no winner as the home side shared four goals with visitors Clanfield 85 and a replay will be needed to decide this tie, Jack Allen and Luke Cordery with the Shrivenham goals.

Flackwell Heath were 2-1 home winners over United Counties League side Raunds Town, Khalid Simmo and Jack Taylor with the Flackwell goals.

On Monday night **Binfield** and **Burnham** met in the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup and penalties were needed to decide the winners after it had finished 1-1 after extra time. Binfield won the shoot out 3-1 to make it through to the next round. On Tuesday night more cup action saw Abingdon United knock **Holmer Green** out of a cup for the second time this season as they repeated their Floodlit Cup success with a 2-0 win in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup. In the same competition **Ardley United** won 4-2 away at Buckingham Athletic Dev. Meanwhile in the Floodlit Cup **Windsor** had a comfortable 5-1 home win over Thame Rangers.

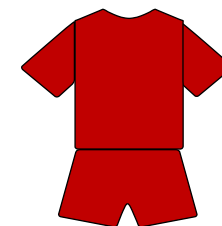
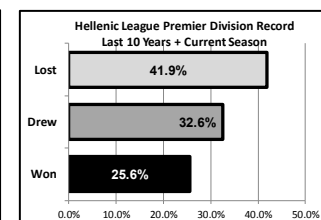
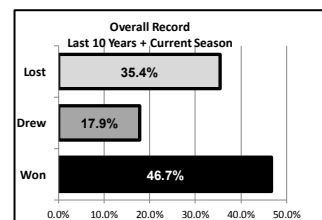

Bohane heads Bassett to victory

TJ Bohane's powerful 54th minute header proved to be the difference as Royal Wootton Bassett Town recorded a narrow 2-1 victory against Virginia Water. The forward rose highest to connect perfectly with Dale Richards' cross and deliver a header that was not going to be kept out. And ultimately it would provide three valuable points for Sam Collier's team, who move up to fourth in the Hellenic League Premier Division table.

The game itself was a tight, entertaining affair. Early on both teams cancelled each other out - a far cry from their meeting in Berkshire in September when Bassett flew out of the gates only to spurn a number of fantastic chances on their way to a frustrating 2-0 defeat. Bassett would eventually have the first great opportunity of this meeting too when Steve Yeardley's header crashed off the post. Almost immediately, the Waters came close at the other end only to be kept out by Charlie McCready's fantastic one-handed save.

The hosts then took the lead seven minutes before the break. The ever-dangerous Rob Lincoln passed inside for an onrushing Yeardley, and the experienced campaigner - now two games off 500 appearances for Bassett - produced a great finish for his second goal of the season, and 77th overall for the club. Virginia Water were level two minutes later though. McCready did well to keep out the initial effort following a dangerous corner, but the 'keeper could do little to prevent Adam McNamara firing home the rebound.

With the game finely poised at half time, Bassett would make the decisive break early after the restart as Bohane reached nine goals for the season with his pin-point headed effort. There were chances to extend the lead too. Lincoln blazed over with an open goal at his mercy before Bohane came within inches of scoring a second header. Surviving a late scare when the visitors put over a free kick from the edge of the box, Bassett would secure the points - and set up a chance to finish their five game homestand with three wins should they triumph against struggling Abingdon United on Saturday.

Opponents History

Virginia Water • Club History

Virginia Water Football Club was formed during the 1919-1920 season and during the 1930's, during the reign of King Edward VIII, gained financial support (patronage) from the crown to the sum of £2 per annum and this was continued after his abdication by King George VI and continued through his reign. Waters were a part of the Woking & District league during this time until 1964 when they joined the Surrey Intermediate league, and then the Spartan League.



In 1969 the clubhouse at the Timbers was opened by Sir Stanley Rous CBE who was the then President of FIFA. The Timbers, on Crown Road was named after the late Harry Timbers, one of the founder members of the club. In the 1970's Waters gained promotion to the Combined Counties League from the Spartan League.

1972 saw VWFC reach the first round of the FA Vase losing 3-1 to Egham Town FC and in 1979 Waters re-joined the Combined Counties League.

The 1980's were disappointing with relegation in successive seasons from the Combined Counties and Surrey Premier league's seeing Waters drop into the Surrey South Eastern Combination Intermediate League.

The 1990/1991 season saw a change in fortunes with Virginia Water winning the Surrey Intermediate Cup beating Coney Hall 3-0 in the final. This was followed with promotion back to the Surrey Premier League at the end of the 1991/1992 season and then back again to the Combined Counties League the following season. However, Waters only stayed in the CCL for one season due to a league ruling. Although returning to the Surrey Premier League, Waters continued to be successful and won three Surrey County Premier Cups in 1995, 1996 and 1997, the latter as part of a historic treble, not only winning the County Cup, but also the League and League Cup.

In 2000 the Surrey Premier League became the Surrey Senior League where Waters stayed until 2002 Waters then joined the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) playing in the Premier Division for three seasons, before relegation in 2005, but gained immediate promotion the following season. Waters remained in the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) until 2010, when they won promotion to the Surrey Elite League. Waters continued to progress and despite winning the league cup and County cup on occasion, promotion out of the Surrey Elite League proved elusive, resulting in many managerial changes during that time.

The present manager Ceri Jones, was appointed in the summer for the 2015/2016 season, and in his second full season in charge and following the appointment of Richard Banks as First Team Coach, Waters completed an historic league and league cup double and won promotion into the Hellenic League. 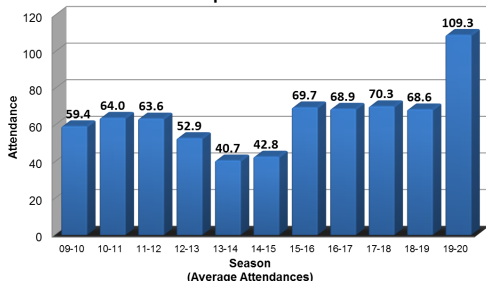

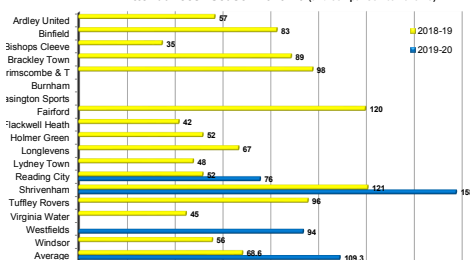

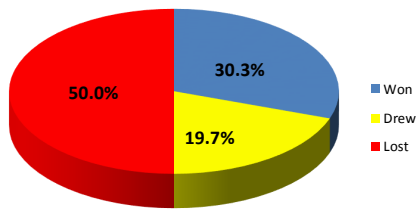

Danny Langford

Langford is an energetic forward who joins Bassett this season on a full-time basis, having briefly featured for the club in 2017-18 while serving as player-manager for Thames Valley Premier League Newbury. He boasts a great engine, plenty of skill and is an unselfish forward, whose control and aerial ability allow him to also

operate effectively as a target man.

Langford's first taste of Hellenic League football came in 2011-12 when he scored six times in 35 matches for Division One East Lambourn Sports. He remained with Lambourn the following season as they switched to Division One West, netting three goals in fifteen matches, while also featuring sparingly for Thatcham Town in the Southern League.

After starting the 2013-14 season with Abingdon United, he spent the majority of the campaign with Newbury in the Hellenic League Premier Division, playing 25 times for them a season later. He remained with Newbury after they dropped out of the Hellenic League, scoring 27 times for them in the Thames Valley Premier League in 2016-17 as they finished third.

A brief spell with Binfield followed a season later, netting once in eight matches while also bagging a goal a game in eighteen matches for Newbury. As player-manager last season he guided Newbury to the Thames Valley League Division One title, scoring twenty goals along the way, while also featuring four times for Bassett.

Bassett pay late penalty in Vase exit

Any hopes Royal Wootton Bassett Town had of a length run in the Buildbase FA Vase were extinguished as a late penalty saw Sam Collier's side defeated 1-0 by Tadley Calleva in the competition's second qualifying round.

Big winners away against New College in the previous round, their visit to the Wessex League Premier Division outfit's Barlows Park ground was always going to be a much more tricky affair. But Bassett matched their opponents, who like their visitors had so far failed to find form in the league.

A tight contest ensued with chances at a premium for both sides. However, the tie was eventually settled in the closing minutes when the hosts were awarded a penalty, which Connor Thorne dispatched. For the fifteenth time in nineteen seasons, Bassett's participation in the national competition therefore disappointingly ended in the qualifying stages.



Last week while frantically working towards yet another print deadline, I came across a story which certainly made me smile. As they jubilantly travelled back from their FA Vase victory at Bacup Borough two weekends ago, the players and staff at Grimsby Borough found themselves in a scenario fit for a Hollywood thriller as their coach ended up perched on the edge of a 45 foot ravine! They had only just set off on the journey from The Borough's West View home when their coach driver suddenly took a rather perilous wrong turn.

"When it crashed we started singing 'you're getting sacked in the morning!' to the driver," said Grimsby boss Daniel Barrett.

"Then the bus tilted and we started to realise that things may be a bit more serious!

"We had stayed in the bar after the match for a little bit and were still very much at the beginning of the trip home."

Nevertheless the group was determined to make the best of the situation and set out in search of a pub. However, in deepest rural Lancashire, this proved more difficult than expected. Barrett continued: "We ended up walking about five miles!

"We stopped off at a petrol station and bought some drinks. We had our portable speakers and were singing all the way, I don't really know what the local residents were thinking.

"When we eventually found a pub the people running it were so helpful and said that we could stay there for the night.

"It was a pretty surreal evening but we certainly made sure that we made the most of the situation.

"Thankfully we are at home in the next round so there won't be a repeat!"

While this represents a rather funny tale which will certainly be remembered by those involved for a long time, I think it also demonstrates one of the best things about playing football at this level. In an age of over protected and out of touch professionals, this kind of story would never have happened in the higher divisions. A huge part of Non-League football is about enjoyment and about getting away from the rigours of another working week to play the game for the love of it with people that you get along with. Of course, everyone wants success and to move up the pyramid but Non-League football also has that lovely human element of regular people enjoying their weekends while also trying to fulfil their dreams in the game. It is for these quirky tales why people like myself have come to love Non-League football and everything that it represents.

On This Date

Looking back over the history of the club we appear to have played 12 times on **21 September** with 4 of those being played this century. It is not a particularly lucky date as only 3 of the 12 have been won and we have suffered 8 defeats. Back in 2002-3 we played Shortwood in the FA Vase losing 5-1, a Nick Tooley consolation goal for us that day. Two years later it was a much happier occasion as we won 1-0 at Henley Town, Matty Bennett with the only goal of the game. In 2010 we went down 3-1 at home to Kidlington but it was even worse the last game played on this date when we were thrashed 7-0 away at Odd Down in the FA Vase. Looking back to the previous century things on this date started so well as we won our very first game defeating Melksham Town 4-1. The Gazette & Herald carried the following report on the game:

“Wootton Bassett was at home to Melksham in the presence of a good crowd on Saturday. Play opened and soon Melksham was seen pressing. Rogers tested Rouse in the first few minutes but the shot was cleverly cleared. Boland looked like getting through, but Rogers robbed him, and passed onto Deverall, who got away, swinging across a splendid centre. Sheppard beat Rouse with a good shot. This seemed to ‘rouse’ the home team, and it soon settled down to retrieve the reverse. Boland gave nicely to Pinfield, who took the ball, and in turn centred. Coates dashed between the backs, beating Park all the way. Melksham then took up the attack, but the home defence kept it at bay. Eventually Leighfield gave to Coates, who drew out the defence, and then giving to Iles, the latter went through and gave Bassett the lead. The visitors were not to be shaken off easily, their forwards well backed up by Rogers and Co. forced Rouse to concede a corner, which was well taken, the Bassett custodian fisting out and Tylee clearing. Suter, the old Swindon amateur, got possession, and passing to Coates, that player scored No. 3 and a half-time the score stood: Wootton Bassett, 3; Melksham 1. The second half opened even, both sides attacking in turn. Melksham came very near scoring, Boulter heading away. The visitors came again through Deverall, but Major clearing well. Coates got away, passed to Pinfield, who sent over a ripping centre, and Fry headed past Park. The home side, with this substantial lead, slowed down, and when the whistle blew the home side retired winners by 4 to 1. “

Given we folded for a period the next game on this date was in 1933 when we drew 1-1 with Warminster based side A.L. Jefferies. The next game on this date was just after the Second World War in the FA Cup when we were Swindon Town’s nursery side but we went down 5-1 to Swindon GWR Corinthians that day. In 1963 we defeated Trowbridge Town Res 2-0 but the other 4 games on this date all resulted in defeats against Swindon BR in 1966 (2-4), Amesbury in 1974 (0-2), Purton in 1991 (0-2) and Clanfield in 1996 (1-2).

FC 's-Gravenzande Cup Exploits

Dutch friends into KNVB Cup first round

Undoubtedly the highlight of the youth section calendar, each year the club's under 12, 13 and 14 teams go on tour to Holland for five days during the spring school holiday. Over the past decade the club have forged fantastic links with the likes of SV Loosduinen, EBOH (Dordrecht) and current sister club s'-Gravenzandse SV (who changed their name in the summer of 2010 to FC s'Gravenzande after a merger), as well as professional side FC Dordrecht. It is huge congratulations to our friends FC 's-Gravenzande this season on having qualified for the first round proper of the KNVB Beker, the equivalent of the FA Cup in the Netherlands.

's-Gravenzande had defeated RKS V Heeze in the opening qualifying round in August and, after four Eredivisie sides made it through to the group stages of the UEFA Champions League and Europa League, were selected as one of four amateur teams to receive a bye through the second qualifying round and into the main draw. When the draw was made it pitted FC 's-Gravenzande at home against SteDoCo, a side who play one level higher in the Derde Divisie, with the game scheduled to take place on Tuesday 29th October. While they may have missed out on a meeting with an Eredivisie side, their tie is very much a winnable one and it will be a historic contest for the club. And, if they win, maybe Ajax, Feyenoord or PSV Eindhoven could await in the second round!
