The one and only season we have played in this competition before was Season 2001-2 when we defeated Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the First Round 1-0 before knocking out Swindon Supermarine 2-0 in the Second Round. We eventually went out at the Semi-Final stage losing 2-0 to Swindon Town. We have been drawn to play in one of two First Round matches and travel to Westbury on Wednesday 9th October. The other First Round tie sees Salisbury travel to Amesbury Town on Tuesday 8th October.

Editorial & Club News

Welcome to Windsor

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Windsor for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Windsor. We hope all from Windsor enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon, in what could be their last visit here unless we were to meet in one of the FA competitions in future seasons given the restructuring that will take place at the end of the current season and the different league that Windsor will play in. We wish them a safe journey home back along the M4.

The two sides have met six times with Windsor having the better record, winning three to our two, with one drawn game. Our record is better in the league though, as two of Windsor's victories have come in cup competitions. Last season we met three times. Here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground we won 2-1 but at Windsor in the league we threw away a 3-0 lead to somehow lose 4-3. Both league games took place within a two week period during the ridiculous back-to-back scheduling that took place last season. The good news is that feedback from clubs has been taken on board by the league and the scheduling has been much better this season, without such back-to-back games. After the league games, we then went back to Windsor in midweek in December in the Floodlit Cup. Fielding a weakened side, we put in a poor display which saw us go down 4-0. Hopefully we will put on a much better performance here today than the last meeting between the sides.

Hereford Lads Club Last Week

On the subject of cup competitions, after last week's 3rd round defeat in the Bluefin Insurance Cup against Hereford Lads Club, we now only have the league and the Wiltshire Premier Shield to focus on. With Swindon Town, Chippenham Town, Salisbury and Swindon Supermarine in the Premier Shield it certainly does not look like there will be any extension to our season this coming season. Last week we went down 3-1 to a team from Division One West in cup competitions for the second time this season, this despite our opponents being reduced to 10 men in the second half. We had trailed 1-0 before TJ put us back on level terms but this was to be short lived as Hereford went back in front and then wrapped it up with a third in the closing stages. We went close on a couple of occasions and it could have gone either way, but not a good result and ending any realistic chance of silverware this season. We also would have Fairford in the next round which would have been a nice local derby. Oh well maybe we can do something next year in the Hellenic cup competitions.

Harsh words must have been said in the visitors dressing room at half time as they were fast out of the blocks after the resumption. Within two minutes an open Malachi Thomas rushed a shot straight at McCready after Usman Lalustani's cross had evaded Carl Evans. Moments later, Roberts' powerful drive from the edge of the area was repelled by McCready before Yeardley blocked the follow up.

Bassett's resistance eventually slipped though with 51 minutes on the clock. Failing to clear after McCready denied Woods, Thomas was on hand to punish Bassett, drilling into the bottom right corner from twelve yards. They almost grabbed an equaliser before the hour too. After breaking from a Bassett free kick, Roberts found himself with room to shoot just outside the box and he produced a dipping strike that rattled the crossbar. The rebound fell to Matt Stockill following a rushed clearance, and his rasping strike was initially spilled by McCready before the 'keeper eventually smothered.

Windsor continued to have Bassett pinned deep for the vast majority of the thirty minutes that remained. But despite their domination in terms of both territory and possession they failed to trouble McCready again. It was nail-biting stuff at times, with Bassett frequently affording dangermen Panesar and Roberts too much time and space. However, the hosts dug as deep as they could, throwing bodies in the way of the ball and clearing their lines to wind down the clock and allow themselves vital time to recover. They did have a couple of opportunities to kill the game off too, but lacked a clinical edge on the counter.

With quarter of an hour to go, Pagliaroli raced onto a Bohane flick, but, cutting inside onto his less-favoured right foot, failed to find the target. Another break then saw Pagliaroli attempt to cut back for either Bohane or Sam Packer, but his pass was just out of their reach. Ultimately though a third goal was not required, while Windsor would be denied their comeback.

Royal revenge

It took a herculean defensive effort in the second half and, at times, it certainly was not pretty. But Royal Wootton Bassett Town dug deep to preserve a 2-1 victory over Windsor, helping avenge a 4-3 loss in Berkshire just a fortnight ago. As with the opening encounter, Sam Collier's side found themselves 2-0 in front at the break, a lead that was richly deserved courtesy of a professional performance during the opening 45 minutes.

The visitors quickly grabbed a goal following the restart though and had Bassett pinned deep for the majority of the period. Yet they were unable to find their way past debutant 'keeper Charlie McCready again as the Bassett backline did what they had to make sure that another two-goal advantage did not go to waste. Bassett led from the game's tenth minute, their early positive play being duly rewarded. Coming off his line to try and punch away a Tony Joyce free kick, visiting 'keeper Hugo Sobte instead flattened TJ Bohane. The shotstopper almost made immediate amends, diving low to his left to keep out Bohane's spot kick. But the loose ball was seized upon by Steve Yeardley, and he teed up Josh Shama to recycle a cross into the danger area which Bohane coolly headed home. That early goal certainly gave Bassett a boost, and within four minutes Brad Pagliaroli burst beyond right back Daniel Taylor. Doing well to keep the ball in play, he cut back to Bohane from the byline, but the pass was slightly behind the Bassett forward, who could only slice wide. Bohane was continuing to cause problems, and his knock down on the edge of the area set up Shama to cross to an unmarked Gio Wrona, who glanced his header wide from fifteen yards.

Windsor, playing tidy football, finally managed to eke out a chance on the half hour mark. It came from a free kick, awarded for a harsh handball against Shama in a dangerous position, but Matt Woods was unable to locate the target and blasted over. Bassett then punished Windsor, crafting a superb second goal from captain Wrona. Pagliaroli was picked out by a diagonal ball out from the back and set out on a bustling run that saw him twist his way past two defenders. When reaching the area, he squared for Wrona, who shuffled the ball onto his right foot before curling a beautiful arcing effort into the top right corner. Letting a three-goal lead slip against Windsor was still fresh in the memory for the hosts and so they knew such an advantage was not a comfortable one.

And they were reminded twice before the break of the threat the Royalists posed. Firstly, the dangerous Dan Roberts headed over from close range at the far post after drifting free of his marker to meet Woods' cross. Then, after Roberts had seen an effort block, the loose ball squirmed free to Jeevan Panesar, who unleashed a stunning, swerving drive from beyond thirty yards that clattered the left post and bounced out for a corner off the back of McCready.

Wait for a win over as Bassett deservedly down Levens



Royal Wootton Bassett Town's prolonged wait for a 2019-20 league win is finally over as Sam Collier's team deservedly triumphed 3-1 away against Longlevens. An impressive display, capped by goals from Alfie Presley, Danny Langford and a Gio Wrona penalty, delivered a victory that also lifts Bassett off the bottom of the Hellenic League Premier Division table.

After Saturday's disappointing reverse at home against Virginia Water, Collier required a response from his side. And that is what the Bassett boss got. They were bright from the first whistle. And while it was Longlevens who had the first real chances of the game, Declan Lehmann saving from James Barnett and Will Emery, Bassett were arguably the brighter of the two teams. On eleven minutes, Caine Bradbury's venomous free kick forced Ash Wintle to tip wide. The same player then forced another save from open play before Langford headed narrowly over from a left-wing cross. Soon enough the opening goal of the game arrived on the half hour mark – and it would be the first of three scored in the space of a frenzied six-minute period. Wintle was unable to handle a Wrona free kick and Presley pounced to prod home the loose ball for his third goal of the campaign. Isaac Johns saw a shot deflected over for the hosts. But they were level shortly after. Longlevens caught Bassett on the break, and after neat link up play, Johns played a through ball to Harry Emmett on the right, and he fired home a powerful left foot drive. Parity wouldn't last though. 'Keeper Lehmann sprayed a magnificent ball out to Presley on the right and he crossed for man of the match Langford, who was free in the box, to guide beyond Wintle.

Following the restart, both sides continued to push forward as they had done in the opening period. For Longlevens, Josh Watts volleyed wide, while Emmett failed to test Lehmann from the edge of the area. At the other end, Bassett were forcing numerous corners, though were unable to take advantage of them, the closest they came being when Bradbury saw a shot blocked. Even with the visitors performing well, the outcome still therefore hung in the balance. That was until Wintle brought down Presley with three minutes to go. And up stepped Wrona, who coolly put the penalty away to seal a long-awaited three points. With the wait for a league win finally over, the job now for Bassett is to put their early season struggles behind them and close the gap between themselves and the sides in mid-table. The talent is there in the squad to push for a top half finish. After a slow start, now is the time to knuckle down and deliver the points that will help them achieve what they are capable of.

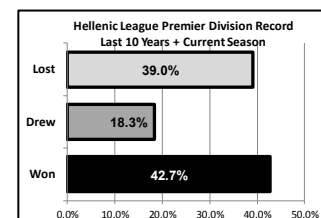
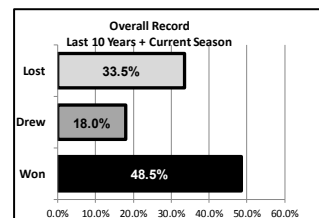

That run ended in their next league fixture when Ardley United left Stag Meadow with all three points courtesy of a 3-2 win.

A useful away point at Tuffley in a high scoring 3-3 draw was followed by the announcement that the search for a new manager had been successful, with Mark Cooper taking over in the dugout. Copper got off to a great start with a 5-0 win over Thame Rangers in the Banbury Litho Floodlit Cup. This was followed by an excellent 4-2 home win in the league over Shrivenham. Unfortunately for Windsor, back-to-back defeats have followed. A narrow 3-2 defeat at Flackwell Heath in the league being followed by a 2-0 away defeat at Burnham in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup.

Leading scorer so far this season is Dylan Ive who has hit 6 goals in just 4 appearances.

Opponents History

Windsor FC • Club History



Summer 2011 and it's rather ironic that 100 years of senior football at Stag Meadow should be celebrated by the birth of a brand new club, Windsor FC, which came to be following the sad demise after 118 years of Windsor & Eton FC. During the final death throes of the previous club it became apparent, following several well attended supporters' meetings, that the will was there to continue to host a senior football club in Windsor for the community to embrace and, therefore, on February 4th 2011 WFC Football Community Development Ltd was registered with Companies House with the aim of achieving that objective. Founding Director Kevin Stott and a newly-appointed management committee then set about the long and sometimes arduous task of turning that dream into a reality.

Our founding season turned out to be a very exciting one, eventually finishing as runners-up to worthy Champions Guildford City in the league and we also made it to the semi-finals of the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy so it was close but no silverware to show for it, although that is not entirely true as Ryan O'Toole won the Golden Boot as top scorer in the Premier Division and Hayden Wheelers' efforts in editing our programme led to it being voted best programme in the Premier Division.

Several weeks into season 2012/2013 a major decision to operate without a budget was taken to free up funds for the regeneration plans at the ground and the management team and all but three of the playing squad left immediately. Mick Woodham was appointed as our new manager and had two days to get together a squad before our next league game. Despite some heavy defeats early in his tenure as he built a squad of local youngsters the club never lost faith and Mick eventually put together a squad that was to finish a very creditable 8th in the league as well as another appearance in the semi-finals of the county Senior Trophy competition whilst our Under 18's side made it all the way to the CCL's Grant McLellan Youth Cup Final eventually losing to a very strong Camberley Town side.

Recognition from the league away from football itself was achieved with a Groundsman of the Year award for the CCL and this was added to in August 2013 when our groundsman Lewis Clements won the FA Groundsman of the Year Award for the whole of Step 5 and 6 football nationally, something both he and the club are justifiably proud of whilst also giving some extra publicity to the CCL.

This building process continued in 2013/14, and it was in this season that Mick Woodham guided us to our first ever trophy. A resounding 3-0 victory over Reading Town in the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy Final. The success was repeated the following season when Woodham's young guns defeated a talented Flackwell Heath side 3-2 in the final at Burnham FC's Gore ground.

The football club experimented with a Senior Reserve side for one season before committing to a long-term link up with the Cox Green Academy and the re-focusing on an Under 18 team. The aim to offer a clear path to all youngsters to the Senior First team.

Over the past two seasons this approach has paid huge dividends. In 2017/18 Windsor FC made it through seven rounds of the FA Vase before losing to eventual runners-up Stockton Town in the Quarter Finals.

In 2018-2019 we improved our finish in the u18sport Hellenic Premier Division by finishing 8th, we reached the Final of the League Cup, went out early in the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup and have another run in the FA Vase before losing at a very strong Biggleswade in Round 5.

We go into 2019-2020 with another league shake up looming at the end of the season but with high hopes of some silverware going into the trophy cabinet at Stag Meadow .

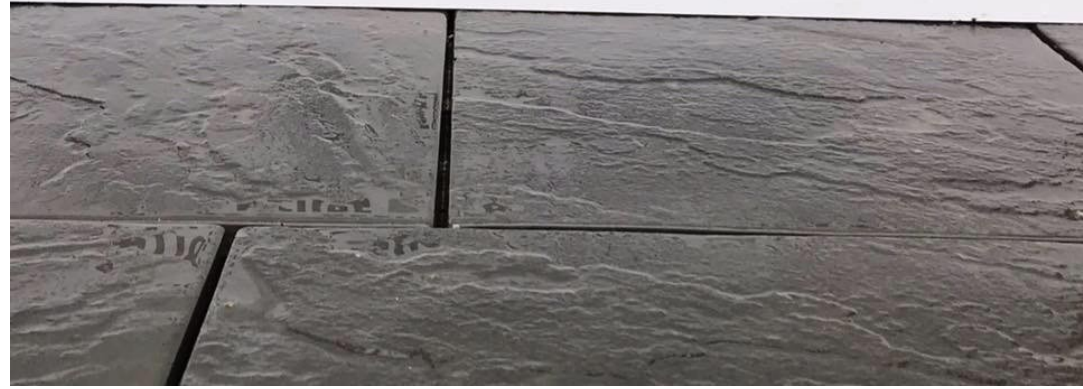

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies lost their first competitive fixture in almost a year as they fell to a 5-2 home defeat against Callington Town. After more or less matching their opponents – who, like Bassett, went into the game boasting a 100% record from their opening fixtures of the season without conceding – the home side fell away in the second half, their Cornish visitors scoring four times to seal the points and underline their quality. There were chances for both teams in an action-packed opening to the game. However, it would not be until midway through the opening period that the deadlock was broken. And it was Bassett who struck first blood, Lauren Kayll feeding Hayley Huckin, who was shown onto her stronger foot and proceeded to fire just past the Callington 'keeper Sara Rowe and into the top corner. Bassett's lead lasted all of five minutes though as a defensive lapse played into the hands of Rhi Bailey, who kept her cool to slot into the corner past Abi Footner. That equaliser seemed to dent Bassett's confidence. And it was Callington who finished the first half the stronger side, with Gabi Alphous looping a shot over and Footner reacting fast to narrow the angle and block Daisy Self's shot.

Callington were eventually rewarded with the lead shortly after the restart as Grace O'Leary was afforded too much time in midfield and beat Footner with a spectacular long-range effort. Footner was then called into action to deny Alphous. Bassett were temporarily reduced to ten players on the hour mark as Kayll was sent to the sin bin. And Callington took full advantage of the extra player, extending their lead as Alphous rose highest to head in from a fine cross. Bassett weren't done yet though, and Huckin offered a glimmer of hope as she headed in from player of the match Laura Jefferies' corner to reduce the deficit. However, the visitors quickly restored their two goal advantage, Alphous curling into the bottom corner. Then, with quarter of an hour remaining Footner brought down Self and Bailey calmly slotted home the resulting penalty to make it 5-2 and put the outcome of the game beyond doubt. The loss was Bassett's first in a league fixture since falling to a 2-1 reverse at home against Swindon Spitfires on October 7th last year. While not at their best, Bassett shouldn't be too disheartened, having given a reasonable account of themselves against a side who look set to be challenging at the top of the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division. Plus, they have an excellent opportunity to bounce back from defeat next week when they visit Portishead Town in the Women's FA Cup.

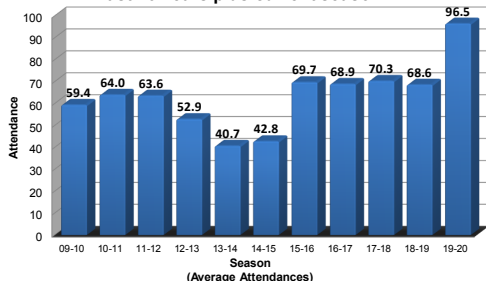

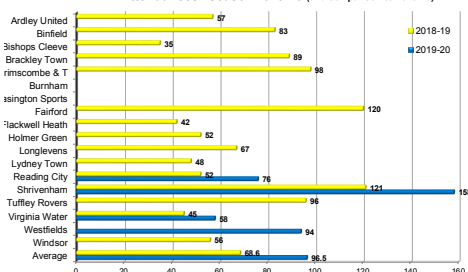

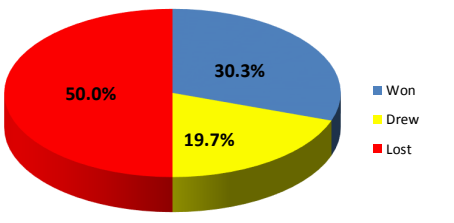

Tony Joyce

Joyce is a vastly experienced campaigner who joined the club from Highworth Town, where he played for the best part of a decade, midway through last season. Comfortable on the ball and possessing great technique and a strong footballing brain, Joyce is capable of playing in midfield and at full back. Joyce initially made his breakthrough with Swindon Supermarine, helping them to the Hellenic League Premier Division title in 2000-01, before making

the move to neighbours Highworth early the following season. He was a key member of the Worthians' side before switching back to Supermarine for the 2004-05 campaign, where he scored twice in 45 appearances as Marine successfully battled against the drop in the Southern League. He returned to Hellenic League football with Carterton a season later, scoring five times in 35 games for the Oxfordshire side as they secured a seventh-place finish in the Premier Division.

The 2006-07 season started with Joyce in fine goalscoring form for Carterton with a handful of goals in his first nine appearances of the campaign. He would transfer back to The Elms in December though, adding another three goals before season's end. The midfielder was then Highworth's second leading appearance maker a year later, contributing eight goals - enough to make him third top scorer as his team wound up sixth.

Joyce's goal tally slipped in 2008-09, but he quickly returned to scoring form, grabbing eight in each of the next two seasons as he remained an integral member of the Worthians' team under boss Dave Webb. Four goals followed in 2009-10, including a strike in Highworth's 6-0 Hellenic League Challenge Cup final victory against Binfield. After manager Webb's departure, Joyce moved to Premier Division rivals Wantage Town in the summer of 2012. He appeared 43 times for the Alredians in 2012-13, helping them to a runners-up finish before moving back to Highworth the following year.

Despite his advancing years, Joyce continued to rack up the appearances. Predominantly appearing at full back, he was Highworth's joint-leading outfield appearance maker in 2014-15, playing fifty times in all, while being an integral member of the Worthians side who reached the semi-finals of the FA Vase and triumphed in the Wiltshire Senior Cup. Joyce then racked up more than seventy further appearances for Highworth in 2016-17 and 2017-18, the majority of which were starts, before making the switch to Bassett. He fitted into his new team seamlessly and proved to be a helpful presence for the young players in the squad. Making his debut in a County Cup victory against Trowbridge Town, Joyce went on to play 19 times, with only 2 of those appearances coming from the bench. Last season he made 29 appearances, with again just 2 of those being from the bench. This season has seen him move past the 50 appearances mark for the club.

Bassett suffer Challenge Cup exit

Royal Wootton Bassett Town fell to a 3-1 Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup third round defeat against Division One West side Hereford Lads Club. Injuries and unavailability forced Bassett boss Sam Collier into making a number of changes, and he used the occasion to offer first team debuts to promising Under 18 players Morgan Francis and Jed Phillips. While they both showed promise, the former starting and latter coming on a substitute, the game represented a steep learning curve against physical opponents.

Bassett were forced to chase things early on as they fell behind on the quarter hour mark. James Hancocks raced onto a long ball over the top, and after outmuscling Caine Bradbury, he curled a left foot strike into the top corner. The hosts levelled in style shortly after the restart. Alfie Presley threaded a pass through to TJ Bohane in the left channel and the forward thrashed a stunning, unstoppable drive into the top corner from the edge of the area. Parity did not last long though. Bassett failed to clear from a corner and, after the ball was recycled, it fell to Jay Cuthbertson to steer in from close range.

In an evenly matched contest, Bassett thought they had equalised again shortly after. Bohane rose highest at the far post to redirect a Presley corner back across goal and Danny Langford was extremely unlucky to flick a header onto the crossbar from a matter of metres.

The hosts then found themselves playing with a man advantage for the final quarter of an hour as Adam Newbury was dismissed for a lunge on Bohane. And that almost paid immediate dividends. However, the woodwork came to deny Bassett again as a Bradbury free kick was headed onto the bar by Chris Jackson, with the rebound falling to Dale Richards, whose deflected effort trickled onto the post.

Having survived that let off, the visitors sealed victory. With Bassett committing men forward, a headed clearance left Adam Hockey alone against Callum Wright and the Hereford forward fashioned a yard of space before firing clinically into the bottom corner.

The Division One West side therefore advanced. However, the Lads Club's victory was marred by the incessant foul and abusive language employed by some of their supporters.

WE ALMOST had to check the calendar on Saturday night. Yes, it is 2019, but here we still are reporting on alleged incidents of racism in Non-League football. So often are we quick to jump on it when heard in other countries but time and again this horrible issue keeps rearing its head in England and Wales and it can't be brushed off anymore.

Last weekend, word quickly filtered through from Hartlepool United's National League game with Dover Athletic. Dover striker Inih Effiong had scored a penalty and in the aftermath of the celebrations, something had sparked up between the players and a section of the home support. When Pools players also took severe exception, it was clear something very untoward had happened. Whites boss Andy Hessenthaler later said he considered taking his players off – a move that would have been backed by Hartlepool manager Craig Hignett – but they chose to play on. Sadly, it wasn't the only reported incident of the week with other accusations made elsewhere. Hartlepool, to their credit, have been swift in response. They made an announcement at half-time of the game, have dedicated their programme front cover for their next home game with the Kick It Out message and have vowed to come down heavily on the culprit, who has also been arrested.

I've written in the past about how it is a difficult subject to write about – and one that feels ever common – because I've not been the subject of racist abuse. I don't know what that feels like to be vilified for the colour of my skin. But we must listen to the people who have. The people who know what it feels like to have someone spitting and snarling in your face or hidden by a keyboard and throwing out insults on social media. England star Raheem Sterling has been a fantastic advocate in recent times, speaking out against the injustices and asking society as a whole to look at itself in the mirror. Racism isn't just a football problem but the game is a reflection of wider society. And it's a game that has a platform to make a difference. It's high time the authorities came down harder than ever when racist or homophobic behaviour is proven. There is no justification for it. And we can all play our part. If you hear something said at a Non-League game you're watching, report it.

On This Date

Looking back over the history of the club we appear to have played 15 times on this date, **5 October** and unfortunately the date is probably the grimmest featured this season so far! Of those 15 games, just 3 have been won, 2 drawn and 10 have been lost. The defeats includes 5 in the last 6 fixtures on this date, the other game in that run being a 0-0 draw with Ross Town. Today would certainly be a good day to end the bad set of results on this particular date.

The first game traced was back in 1901 when we played away at Cirencester M&SWJR, losing 4-3. Our first win on this day came in 1907 when we returned from Chippenham United with both points following a 1-0 win. In 1935 we played away at Holt in the Wiltshire League, picking up a useful away point in a 1-1 draw in the days when drawn games were relatively more valuable than today. Our first fixture on this date after the Second World War saw Calne & Harris visit the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground and leave with both points following a 3-1 result.

The one game in the 1950's on this date was in the FA Amateur Cup replay away at Paulton Rovers when goals from Chris Simpkins and Graham Tyler gave us a 2-0 half time. However, Paulton pulled two back to send the tie into extra time. Two unanswered goals from the home side saw us crash out of this prestigious national competition. Our line-up that day was: R. Read, D. Gillett, K. Pewsey, J. Lawrence, D. Cook, B. Turner, G. Taylor, P. Teetgen, G. Tyler, G. Simpkins, S.V. Embling. Sub: C. Simpkins

Two games were played on this date in the 1960's. In 1963 we lost 4-8 away against Swindon Town A whilst in 1968 we had a good 4-0 home win over Warminster Town. Just one game in the 1970's saw us lose 2-1 against Vickers. Better news in the next decade as the one game on this date in 1985 saw goals from Nathan Walker and Don McLeod secure a 2-1 home win over Aldbourne. That was in fact the last time we won on this particular date, some 34 years ago!

Since then we have suffered a six game losing streak which started with a 4-1 League Cup defeat at home to North Leigh, Ken Regan with our consolation goal. We have scored just one more time on this date during the current century, Dave Tyler scoring in a 3-1 defeat at Slimbridge. Before that we had drawn that game with Ross Town in 1996 at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground before suffering our worst ever defeat on this date, going down 8-0 away at Bishops Cleeve in 2002, not Mr Yeardley and Mr Byrne's greatest night that one. The last two games on this date have both resulted in narrow 1-0 defeats at home against Witney United in 2010 and Oxford City Nomads in 2013. Time to get a win on this date I think! In looking back into this history it is rather sad to note that around half the opponents are no longer playing.
