The Wiltshire FA have re-introduced the Wiltshire Premier Shield for Season 2019-20 after a break of 7 seasons. Whilst previously the competition involved just the 4 sides playing at Step 4 and above, the re-introduced Shield will now include the clubs playing at Step 5. This means there will be 10 teams entering this season's Shield and we will be one of the lowest level teams in the cup competition. The 10 teams will be Swindon Town, Chippenham Town, Salisbury, Swindon Supermarine, Melksham Town, Highworth Town, Westbury United, Bradford Town, Amesbury and Royal Wootton Bassett Town. The one and only season we have played in this competition before was Season 2001-2 when we defeated Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the First Round 1-0 before knocking out Swindon Supermarine 2-0 in the Second Round. We eventually went out at the Semi-Final stage losing 2-0 to Swindon Town.

Late Parsons pair seals deserved win

Ardley Utd 1 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 3

Trips to north Oxfordshire to take on Ardley United have rarely been kind for Royal Wootton Bassett Town. Heading into their latest visit to the Nolan Oils Ground, Bassett had triumphed just once in fourteen previous meetings, that lone victory coming 21 years ago in October 1998. And an Ardley victory on this occasion would have made it five straight defeats at a rather unhappy hunting ground. But, injecting life back into their season, a resolute display from Sam Collier's side, which combined a solid shape with an outstanding workrate across the pitch, ultimately delivered a deserved 3-1 victory. Callum Parsons scored twice late on to seal the points, adding to Jonny Davoile's first half equaliser for the visitors.

Bassett demonstrated positive intent from the opening whistle, Gio Wrona, Alfie Presley and Davoile all having shots in the opening minutes, with the latter forcing an early save. A fine effort from Caine Bradbury then went narrowly wide as Bassett kept up the pressure. It helped the visitors that Ardley were sitting back, seemingly intent on trying to catch Bassett on the break. Yet that tactic was having little success and it said something that when the hosts went in front, it came from their first chance. Whether they should have had that opportunity is debatable though, considering it came as a result of Callum Rice fooling the referee to earn a free kick on the edge of the area which Twariq Yusuf fired beyond Declan Lehmann. Bassett almost grabbed an instant reply as Parsons headed over from a Bradbury free kick before a great save from Lehmann denied Yusuf a second. The visitors soon equalised and it came from a well-worked move. Tony Joyce brought the ball forward before feeding Bradbury, whose cross was met by a Parsons header that Jake Pritchard did well to keep out. But the 'keeper was unable to parry to safety and Davoile was on hand to tap in the rebound. The teams then traded chances before the break. Ryan Barney's shot grazed the bar for the hosts before Parsons hit the post and Presley forced a good save from Pritchard at the other end. Overall, it was a half that Bassett felt they dominated and it was with some misfortune that they weren't ahead at the break.

They began the second half on top again, Bradbury shooting wide and Parsons denied by an outstanding Pritchard stop. Slowly though the game descended into a scrappy affair and Bassett were forced to be on their guard, Yusuf flashing a shot narrowly wide following a counter. Eventually though, with less than ten minutes to go Bassett took their first lead of the day. The pivotal goal arrived in rather scrappy fashion, but that mattered little as Parsons forced the ball home following a corner. Within minutes, he added a second. Aaron Oakley embarked on a mazy run forward that opened up space for Parsons to seal three points that a quality performance more than merited.

Bassett exit Premier Shield

Westbury Utd 4 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1

Meadow Lane, 9th October 2019

Royal Wootton Bassett Town now have just league position to play for in their 2019-20 season after being eliminated in the opening round of the 1st Office Wiltshire Premier Shield. Sam Collier's side were beaten 4-1 away against Western League Premier Division outfit Westbury United as they bowed out of their final cup competition of the campaign. The Bassett boss was forced to ring the changes and the team had a rather unfamiliar feel to it: Callum Parsons returned after a number of weeks away, Development team manager Steve Yeardley started at centre half, while promising 16-year old George Ford made his debut as a substitute. Nevertheless, despite that much-changed side - and the final score, Bassett's performance was not that bad. However, they lacked the cutting edge to threaten Westbury. In contrast, the hosts' potency was on full display as they scored three well-worked team goals on their way to booking their place in the competition's quarter finals. Driving rain blighted the first half. And, after Declan Lehmann had made a pair of good saves to deny Mark Robinson, the first of which led to Callum Demkiv striking the rebound against the bar, it appeared as though the game was headed into half time goalless. But Matt Jones was on hand to ensure Westbury went in ahead, steering in at the far post after a corner was swung in.

Bassett had an early chance after the restart when Caine Bradbury curled a free kick narrowly wide. Westbury eventually doubled their advantage though. Catching Bassett on the break, a swift counter saw Demkiv release Joe Stradling, who produced a smart finish to make it 2-0. Demkiv then soon made it three as he took advantage of a lapse in defensive concentration before Sam Jordan made it four with an excellent finish. There was still time for Bassett to grab a consolation and Parsons did just that. Matching the quality of Jordan's goal, Parsons' 25-yard stunner found the net via the underside of the crossbar. It meant the visitors could finish the night with at least one highlight. Now all attentions turn to the league and edging away from the lower reaches of the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Meet they did . . . however meet was all that happened! A 9am pitch inspection confirmed the pitch playable, a 1pm inspection reported the same , just prior to kick off the referee decided to call the game off. A long and fruitless journey for Abingdon, and the game will be rearranged once more.

On Friday night **Binfield** took on **Burnham** at Stubbs Lane. Sean Moore scored a hat trick for the Moles, who were 4-2 victors over Burnham, the other coming courtesy of an own goal. Burnham's scorers were Kian Duncan and Gavin James. The other games were all on Saturday. A goal in each half took **Fairford Town** through to the next round in the fixture against travelling Hereford Lads Club at Cinder Lane. Former Bassett player Nathan Hawkins with the first and Connor Thompson with the second.

Despite the visitors scoring in the second minute of play **Flackwell Heath** won 2-1 at home against Virginia Water at Wilks Park. James Burrell and Leius Sinclair with the Flackwell goals, Louis Sanders getting the goal for Virginia Water. At their London Road ground Division One West Moreton Rangers caused an upset with a 2-1 win over Premier Division **Brimscombe & Thrupp**. Lee Brooks and Dougie Wallace for Moreton and Jack Smith replying five minutes from time for Brimscombe & Thrupp. An equaliser from Arthur Furness for **Reading City** in the third minute of injury time sent their game against **Ardley United** to penalties after Tobias London had put Ardley in front. The penalty shoot out saw Reading win that 6 to 5. Premier Division **Bishops Cleeve** were too strong for Division One West side Shortwood United as two goals from Jack Watts and a third from Luke Wright gave the Premier Division side a 3-0 win.

There was a cup upset, however, at Wellington. It was 1-1 at the end of 90 minutes in a close local derby against Premier Division leaders **Westfields**, with lots of action. In the penalty shoot out Wellington's keeper Matt Apperley saved a penalty and then scored the winning penalty to send the high flying Premier Division side crashing out of the cup.

In the Supplementary Cup, Premier Division **Shrivenham** were host to Division One West side Tytherington Rocks and were comfortable winners over the Bristol based side. 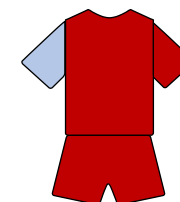
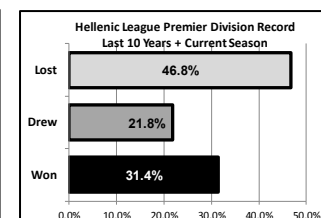
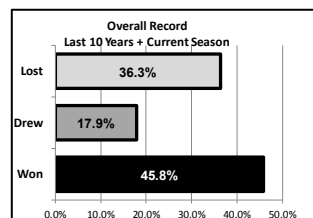

The Under 16 Blue team were scheduled to play in the North Wilts League Cup this weekend at home against local rivals Wroughton Youth White. Due to the away side not being able to play in this game, Bassett were given a home walkover which now sends them into the quarter finals where they will play either FC Chippenham Youth Blue or Castle Combe Colts. The Under 16 Yellows, who face Fairford Youth Revenants next week, will play Cirencester Town Youth in the last eight if they win. The very best of luck in those games to both teams!

The Under 18 Yellows were also scheduled for a League Cup game this weekend versus Wanborough Juniors and were awarded a walkover. They will play away against Fairford Town Development in the quarter finals – it's great to see them doing well in both competitions as they continue to try and retain their 100% win rate so far this season.

Elsewhere, the Under 12 Blues suffered defeat to FC Abbey Meads Youth Purple as they were beaten a great 7-1. Oliver Smith was on target for the Blues to ensure Abbey Meads did not keep a clean sheet this time around.

The Under 13 Yellows suffered defeat in their reverse fixture against South Cerney Youth on the back of their loss against them last week. They were beaten 10-1. Finley Lavender was on target for the Yellows as he bagged himself their only goal of the game.

Last season did not start too well for Tuffley Rovers but they improved over the season and eventually finished in 15th spot, a good nine points clear of the relegation position. This season they have made a much better start to the season and currently sit in 9th place having won 3, drawn 4 and lost 3. They opened the season with a useful 2-2 draw away at Virginia Water after being two goals behind at half time. Declan Earwalker pulled one back for Tuffley before substitute Luke Troke fired in an equaliser off the underside of the bar. A midweek trip to Bishops Cleeve followed which saw the first defeat of the season as Tuffley went down 4-0 to one of the title favourites. FA Cup action followed against North Greenford United. A 1-1 draw in the initial tie saw Tuffley then lose the replay 2-1 against the Middlesex based side. More cup action, this time in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup saw Tuffley make it through to Round 2 as goals from Lewis Bainbridge, Ellis Waugh and Jake Rhodes gave Tuffley a 3-1 win. Back in league action Tuffley fell to their second league defeat of the season as they lost by the odd goal in five against near neighbours Longlevens. Another all Gloucestershire affair followed as they picked up a good point in a 3-3 draw with Brimscombe & Thrupp who are a much better side than their early league position would suggest. Interest in the FA Vase this season was short lived as Tuffley lost 5-0 away at Shortwood United. Tuffley bounced back with a four game unbeaten run which saw them defeat Shrevenham 3-2 at Barrington Park, draw 3-3 with both Windsor and Ardley United and defeat Thornbury United 6-1 in the Floodlit Cup. That good run ended with a 3-1 home defeat against a much improved Fairford Town who are having a good season. However, Tuffley have responded well starting another unbeaten run which has seen them win their last three games. A 4-1 away win over Cheltenham Saracens in the Bluefin Insurance Cup was followed by their best result of the season, a 4-1 home win over Binfield. In their last outing they edged out Holmer Green 2-1 to come into today's game 5 points and 7 places above us in the table and they will certainly be tough opponents here today and there will certainly be no repeat of last season's opening day 6-1 win here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

Opponents History

Tuffley Rovers • Club History

Founded by the late Donald E Hall 1929, the club's Headquarters were in a former railway carriage, which served as Mr Hall's Boot and Shoe repair shop on the Stroud Road at Tuffley in the City of Gloucester. The Club started its playing life in the North Gloucestershire League, before a move across to the Stroud & District League, which eventually led to promotion to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League. Securing the Champions title in 1987/88 meant Rovers gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League for the first time. After two seasons of consolidation the Club won the County League Title in 1990/1991, their application to join the Hellenic League was successful and they were accepted into Hellenic Division One. Progress continued, as in 1992/1993 Rovers completed a League/Cup Double. After that promotion the club regularly finished in the top half of the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, and in 1998/1999 Rovers won the Norman Matthew's Floodlit Cup, defeating Carterton Town in the final.



The Club continued to thrive in the Hellenic League and managed to win the Floodlit Cup again in the 2002/2003 season, defeating Brackley Town over two legs in the final. However, the ever changing ground grading requirements, if the club was to remain in the Hellenic League, and the financial strain these improvements imposed on the club, forced Tuffley Rovers to make the decision to withdraw from the Hellenic League in 2005 and settle for local football in Gloucestershire, returning to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League. After a difficult start Rovers were crowned champions of Division Two of the Northern Senior League in the 2005/2006 season and were promoted to Division One. Another slow start followed in 2006/07, before the team put together a consistent run and managed to claim the league title, as well as win the GFA Senior Amateur Cup and reach the final of the Reg Davis Memorial League Cup.

A return to the Gloucestershire County League followed and the club finished a very creditable 4th place (2007/8) but the summer of 2008 saw a number of senior players retire. Over the next few years, the side secured several top six finishes, before the 2012/13 season marked a significant improvement for the club. After challenging for league championship honours all season, the club couldn't quite maintain the form to secure the title, ultimately finishing second. However, this was enough to gain promotion to the Hellenic League Division One (West) for the 2013/14 season.

On their return to the Hellenic League, The Rovers saw a season that witnessed some turmoil – including the departure of manager, Doug Foxwell – to record a decent sixth place finish and some good cup results. Warren Evans came in as manager in 2014 and secured a Runners-up spot which was enough to see the club promoted back into the Hellenic League

Premier Division, ten years after withdrawing from the division.

Evans departed after a difficult first season in the Premier Division and the club only avoided relegation on administrative grounds. The current Manager, Mark Pritchett, was then appointed in June 2016 and he took the club to a secure 10th place finish and an appearance in the Supplementary Cup Final. A second successive 10th place finish followed in 2017/18, before a 15th place in 2018/19.

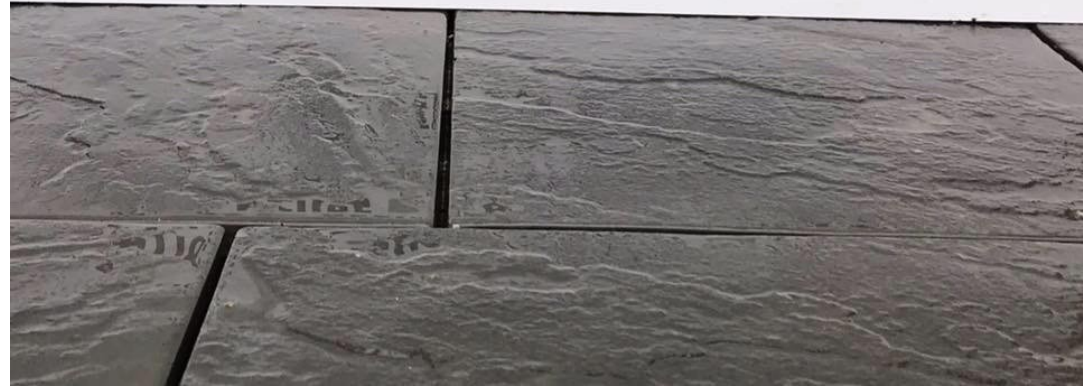

Lily Withers' mazy run was almost rewarded with another goal as the visitors continued to pile on the pressure, but she narrowly missed the target after receiving a slight nudge from behind. While that would have been some strike, Grace Eagles produced a fine solo effort to make it five, taking on four Torquay defenders before calmly placing beyond Gosling. Bassett's sixth then arrived in first half stoppage time. Kayll whipped in a cross that Gosling was unable to claim and Egerton took full advantage, beating teammate Huckin to the ball to smash into the empty net for her second.

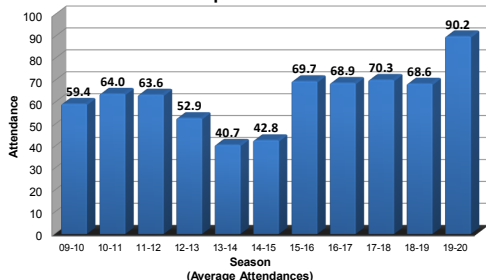

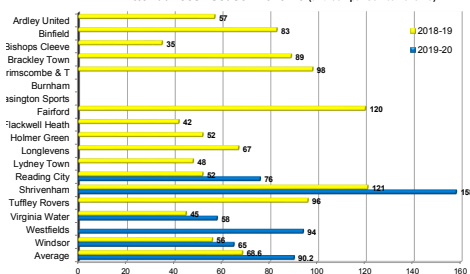

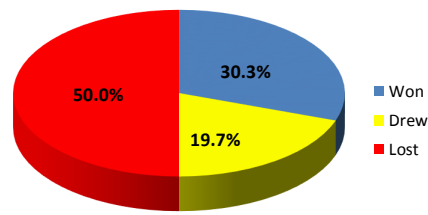

Familiar theme as set piece struggles again haunt Bassett

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's return to winning ways in the Hellenic League Premier Division proved to be an all too brief one as they succumbed to a 4-2 home loss against Windsor.

And it was a familiar theme – difficulties defending from set pieces – that proved costly as two of the visitors' three second half goals came from corners. Bassett's vulnerability in such moments has been a long-term issue and one that will continue to hurt their league position given the frequency with which corners and free kicks have been leading to goals conceded.

Against Windsor, Bassett did make a bright start, TJ Bohane curling onto the post. But it was to be the visitors who took the lead, Excellence Mahumba racing onto a ball over the top of the defence before calmly dinking over an onrushing James Rae. In-form Alfie Presley's stunning strike from the edge of the area drew Bassett level though and the game was finely poised at the break. But Windsor pulled away in the second half. First, Andrew Ingham headed in from a Dylan Ive corner. The visitors then struck twice in quick succession. Kingsley Etefia bundled in after Rae had initially denied Ive before Ive swung in another corner, which fell to Luke Brooks-Smith to drive home. Bohane scored a simple tap in late on, but that was nothing more than a consolation goal as Bassett were well beaten.



The tenth instalment of Non-League Day was a roaring success – now let's make sure the event's legacy continues! The annual occasion was celebrated up and down the country in soggy but high spirits last weekend. There was no shortage of media publicity or promotion by the country's top clubs to encourage their fans to turn out for their local clubs during the international break. Big names from the game led by Crystal Palace boss Roy Hodgson also lent their support with the former England manager recording a special video message to fans for Non-League Day's official charity Prostate Cancer UK. Premier League Aston Villa, Crystal Palace and Southampton were among the top flight clubs tweeting their support. Championship representatives included Preston North End as Saturday's downpours failed to dampen spirits. Of course there were plenty of fantastic schemes and offers delivered by Non-League clubs to draw in the crowds too. We must now encourage our friends and 'non-regulars' to come back again throughout the season after having a taste of the Non-League experience. Non-League Day doesn't have to be just once a year!

It's that time of year when chairmen and owners start getting a bit twitchy over the trigger. Last week we saw three National League managers axed within the same amount of days. First, Craig Hignett left Hartlepool United on Thursday and within a few hours Garry Hill was on his way at Ebbsfleet United. Managerial departures come with the territory these days and nothing surprises anyone in football. But many of us were caught off guard when Fylde made it a hat-trick on Saturday by parting company with Dave Challinor. It was only in May that the Coasters were celebrating FA Trophy glory at Wembley having missed out on promotion to the Football League in the play-off final the week before. It shows how quickly things can change in football following a bad start. Challinor can probably feel a bit hard done by that their game was called off last weekend because of Sutton's travel problems. As it happened he ended up out of a job. He'll have plenty of suitors. With most leagues having already played a healthy (or unhealthy depending on how you look at it!) amount of games, the picture of how a club's season might play out is starting to become clearer. Those in charge will be asking themselves, 'stick or twist?'

On This Date

Looking back over the history of the club we appear to have played 16 times on this date, **22 October** and the date is not too bad for us. Of those 16 games, 7 have been won, 2 drawn and 7 have been lost. In the period from just before the Second World War and the mid 1960's it seemed to be the date we played Spencer Moulton!

The first game traced was back in 1904 when we played at home to Chippenham Town, going down 3-0. With our period of inactivity following the First World War the next game on this date was in 1932 when we beat near neighbours Bushton United 3-1, F.Wilkins with two and W. Sandell with our other goal that Saturday. In the final season before the war in 1938 we lost 7-1 away at Spencer Moulton, an Arthur Embling goal being our sole consolation that day. Another defeat on this date came in 1949, when we went down 5-1 away at Pewsey Vale, Ricketts with our goal. Another meeting with Spencer Moulton in 1955 brought a better result as we won by the odd goal in five, Slater, Large and Stan Embling with our goals in the 3-2 win.

The 1960's kicked off with an away trip to Paulton Rovers in the first year of the decade and we came away with a point following a 2-2 draw, Alan Slocombe and Pete Teegan on target for Bassett that day. Spencer Moulton again in 1966 but this time at Rylands Way. Unfortunately it was a defeat despite two goals from Michael Izquierdo and one from Dave Challis in a 3-5 reverse.

Just one game was played in the 1970's and it was against those lot from up the road as we beat Malmesbury Victoria 3-1 at Rylands Way, Bob Burton scoring twice and Barry Spiers with the other goal. We remained unbeaten in our two games in the 1980's on this date. A 0-0 home draw against Burbage Sports in 1983 was followed by a 4-3 win over Kidlington after we had joined the Hellenic League, Damon York scoring twice with one a piece for Colin Valters and Paul Harper. Just the one game in the 1990's, a 5-3 defeat against Milton United, Scott Vincent with two and Gavin Barron the other.

The new century has seen us play five times on 22 October with three wins. It started with a 3-0 away win over Shortwood United in 2003 with current First Team player Matty Bennett in his youth netting twice, Geoff Swatton getting the other. Next up a cup win on penalties over Cirencester United in 2005 after it had finished 2-2 after extra time, Steve Howse and James Townsend with the Bassett goals. A solitary strike from Alex Green saw us win 1-0 over Brimscombe & Thrupp in 2011. Unfortunately the last two games on 22nd October have been lost. In 2014 we went down 3-0 away against Oxford City Nomads and in 2016 another away trip saw us lose 2-1 at Ardley United, current Development Team manager Stephen Yeardley with the goal in that one. So overall not a bad date for us but it would be nice to end that losing recent run on this date here tonight.
