For me there are alternative ways that the participation of reserve sides could be facilitated in Senior football in counties like Wiltshire but, a bit like Brexit, there are massive challenges with each of them which is perhaps why there is no current FA initiative that I am aware of looking at these alternatives. The first alternative that could be considered is to have a reserve and development team only division. With hindsight, when there were sufficient clubs in the Wiltshire League to do it, a "reserve team only" division should have been established but hindsight is a wonderful thing. It would have dealt with the facilities issue and would have dramatically reduced travel for certain reserve sides in the country who are currently travelling to neighbouring counties in other leagues. Unfortunately, now it would be hard to establish given the Premier Division of the Wiltshire League needs reserve and development sides to get to its full complement of teams and the Premier Division should and must remain the league's priority. To form a viable reserve/development side division there would also need to be an influx of reserve sides now playing in other leagues which would have a knock-on effect to those other leagues such as the Swindon & District and Trowbridge & District League, long standing well run leagues dating back to the 1890's who are also struggling for numbers. It is not always clear what the FA reticence about reserve sides in the National League System relates to but presumably it is about having first team players potentially distorting outcomes over the season. With the growing number of "dual registrations" happening across the National League System these days, in my view that issue is certainly not just confined to reserve teams any more. For the second alternative then, and perhaps somewhat more controversial, how about a system whereby "dual registration" is outlawed across the whole NLS, players either having to transfer or go on short-term loans of a certain minimum length, during which they cannot also go back to their parent club? Special rules would probably be needed for goalkeepers but if these rules applied I then don't see the problem having reserve sides within the NLS. The same rules could apply to them and a formal transfer required to move players between the sides. Given how many first teams at Steps 4, 5 & 6 operate these days, with a squad of players who only play at the first team level as a result of the high level of midweek games and volume of matches, I would not have thought such a rule would have that much of an impact on the first teams of these clubs, although others might argue differently but it would be nice to have the debate.

Other issues I would have commented on would have included so called "academies" who think they can Hoover up players from clubs who have had the said players from U7 through to U16 and then stop them playing for the clubs who have invested up to 10 years+ in their development. If I had started on that issue in this week's programme it would probably have been twice the size! The rules regarding "notice of approach" of non-contract players also belong in another century as invariably clubs contact you saying can you waive the 7-days because we already spoken to the player and he says he wants to join us!! If nothing else, at least change the name of the rule. It would have been nice to have shared these personal thoughts with the FA and perhaps debated them further but unfortunately it was not possible this time round.




Despite my initial comments about being frustrated by the FA survey I would however recommend that anyone with any interest in grassroots football should definitely complete the FA's survey. The more people who complete it the more accurate the reading on the FA's barometer on the areas they are seeking feedback on. Welcome to Binfield

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Binfield for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. We hope all from Binfield enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home back along the M4.

Binfield have had a great start to the season and Roger Herridge's side look like they are going to be heavily involved in this season's promotion race. To date they have won five of their opening eight league fixtures and are still in the FA Vase. The only two defeats in the league have come at the hands of Tuffley Rovers and league leaders Westfields, who as we witnessed when they inflicted our heaviest defeat of the season, are probably the best side in the league. I understand Roger was here that night watching the game so he will also come into today's game with a bit of insight about our side but Sam will also know a bit about Binfield's team. The two teams have met on sixteen previous occasions with Binfield having much the better of things with ten wins to our four, two games have been drawn.

Tuffley Rovers

After Tuesday night's 1-1 draw with Tuffley we are still searching for that first league win at home but shouldn't get too despondent as we are the only side, other than league leaders Westfields, to be unbeaten away from home. Tuesday night saw me at Loftus Road but by all accounts from those who fed back we probably should have won on Tuesday, having most of the possession and creating the better chances. We are now unbeaten in two league games so it would be great to keep that unbeaten run going to enable to climb the table.

Fixtures

The programme for last season's fixture against Binfield included an article regarding fixtures and it is pleasing to report that the fixture scheduling has been much better this season. There have been no quick reverse fixtures this season and games have not been moved around/brought forward like they were last season. So well done and a big thank you to the Hellenic League on these improvements. There are still a few long sequences of home/away games and including last Tuesday's game we will play 7 of 10 league games between 22nd October and the end of November at home. By the end of November we will then have played twice as many home games as away games which still does not feel right but overall the fixture scheduling in the Premier Division has been a lot better than last season. The way the cups have been scheduled on fixed dates has also worked well. One consolation of having played so many home games in the Hellenic League, with just one home game in both December and January, and knowing how well the pitch drains, it at least means the Development side should be well up with their league fixtures as long we don't have lots of snow in December and January.

The initiatives to improve standards at clubs, such as the FA's Charter Standard accreditation and ground grading regulations, have gone a long way to making football a much safer environment for its participants and spectators. Coaching standards have been improved dramatically, in Wiltshire there is probably not a team in the county who have not been helped by the FA's brilliant coach Mick Byrne. However, by definition raising standards makes it harder to operate a side and for me one reason why there are now a lot less teams operating in adult football. All us older guys can all recall playing for sides where the same guy was the club secretary, team manager, coach, pitch marker, the person who put the nets up and took them down and somewhat frighteningly the team "physio", with just a wet sponge and a bucket and no first aid training. Some of us were perhaps that person! Now to be able to operate, that same unpaid volunteer has to have attended all manner of formal training initiatives in the areas of first aid, coaching, finance and child protection, be able to operate various computer software, and look after a ground that in all likelihood has to be continually developed to meet the increasing quality standards being imposed. All sensible initiatives but falling on an unpaid volunteer base that has always been small. One of the biggest issues for non-league clubs is maintaining and growing that volunteer base. If I was to do the "10 Year Challenge" for all the clubs I have visited at Step 5 and Step 6 over the last decade one clear observation I would have to make is that it is the same people running these clubs and they are now all getting on a bit. This season senior football secretaries have had to contend with getting email addresses of all players and, in some leagues, individual player photos. Knowing how painful that has been over the years to be able to do the Pen Pics for the Hellenic Programme is this really necessary in order to stage a game at grassroots level? It would be great if the FA, having now lived with Charter Standard and the FA Full Time system for a number of years, could do a review of the elements of the programme to see what is really critical and essential. Rather than adding more requirements on clubs next season, how about removing some which are deemed to be non-essential following a review?

Next on my list of issues in grassroots football that I wanted to comment on is what I call the "reserves conundrum". Many clubs no longer run a reserve side due to the massive drop off in participation levels in the adult game. Those that remain tend to be at the larger clubs who own their own grounds and play in the National League System. At the end of last season, the Wiltshire Senior League was advised by the FA that the league should be made up of a maximum of 16 teams and that the league needed to reduce the number of 'reserve' and 'development' teams to a figure of 25% of the total teams. In the end, with withdrawals one development side was reprieved. However, the league lost one of its longest-standing members, Devizes Town Reserves who had been in the constitution since the league was formed in 1976. They are now playing in the Trowbridge & District League. Restrictions on the number of reserve/development sides in senior leagues means some clubs with the better facilities in the county will be forced to have their reserve sides visiting clubs whose facilities may currently not be up to standard for Senior football, which may not be the best environment to develop young players who in all likelihood will go elsewhere. The outcome could well be that the larger clubs, forced out in such circumstances will fold their reserve sides and the cycle of losing teams that has been going on for a number of years now will continue. The good news is that Devizes are carrying on and could be promoted back to the Wiltshire League by winning the T&DFL. The ironic thing is in all of this is that the FA, as part of the Charter Standard initiative, have encouraged such clubs to expand the number of sides but at the same time seem to be against their participation in the National League System.

FA Grassroots Football Survey



I must confess to have got all excited earlier in the week as I got round to doing the FA Grassroots Football Survey, with the FA having promoted it as your chance to “Have Your Say” and stating it allows you to highlight areas that “require support and improvement”. It even tempts you in with a picture of a referee.

Having started the survey I very quickly came to the conclusion, whilst it was definitely seeking feedback, it was only in a limited number of areas that in my view the FA already seem to be heavily focussed on. It was not really addressing the issues I have with grassroots football. Given the “tick box” and “give a rating” approach, which gave no room for additional constructive comments, it was clearly designed by some consultants who did not want to spend time and money going through the in depth views of people who actually live and breath grassroots football. It also limited itself to your own main area of involvement in the grassroots game. Having said I was involved in a club, a league and as a supporter, it then only allowed me to give feedback as a club because I ticked that box as the one that takes up the most time (only because of the programme these days but I have done just about every other role over the years—still miss putting up the nets and marking the pitch at Minety which was a great way to get rid of the stress of work in the week). I tried going in to the survey again to try and give a second perspective as a league official but it cleverly picked up that I had already submitted a survey so I was not allowed to do it again. Obviously designed to avoid disenfranchised people submitting 100's of identical responses that distort the outcome.

I really wanted to be able to make some comments about a few bugbears I have with the grassroots game and the FA focus, but unfortunately it was not possible this time round but overall it is good that the FA have engaged in a feedback exercise and hopefully there will be a chance for more detailed engagement in subsequent exercises. I desperately wanted to make the comment that how come youngsters who are 19-20 can play for the first team of their professional clubs, even play for England in World Cups and European Championships playing in front of thousands of spectators (millions if it in TV). However, to be a referee in the middle of Senior grassroots football game you seem to need to have gone past your prime fitness wise, possibly now be overweight, but having accumulated years of experience and wisdom in order that only then are you deemed capable to officiate a Senior football match at grassroots level. Why is that? If we trust the youngsters to play for our country why not trust them to officiate a grassroots football match? The youngsters will certainly keep up with play and not try to referee the game from the centre circle as I have seen on occasions this season, as well as in previous seasons. Closer to the action you will see more accurate decisions, more accurate decisions will mean less dissent. Support them with experienced assistants on the line, who can mentor the youngsters. The older assistants will also find it is easier for them to run in a straight line over half a pitch rather than trying to cover the whole pitch and the players should be rewarded with a much more enjoyable game. Sin bins appear to have done what they were meant to do and with their introduction and embedding in the grassroots game now, are the FA now in a better position to allow the younger referees to officiate in the middle rather than sticking them on the line whilst the older guy in the middle try's to keep up with play? It is important to stress that the subject of referees is not the only one I wished to comment on, there are other bugbears.

Ladies Team & Development Team

Tomorrow the Ladies are at home against Keynsham Town Development in the South West Regional Women's League Premier Division looking to build on last week's excellent 7-0 win away at Torquay United. After their fine 3-1 win at Purton last Saturday the Development team are today are at Westbury when they visit Holt in a Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division fixture. Hopefully Stephen Yeardley's side will extend their unbeaten run to six games against one of the new sides to the league.

U18 Floodlit Side

These notes are being prepared ahead of last Thursday night's fixture away at New College. Hopefully by the time you read these notes Shane Saunders side have picked up their fifth win in six league fixtures. In Tuesday night's programme I said I would comment a little more about the abandoned game against Chippenham. Having read the Chippenham Town match report on their website and an independent groundhoppers' report on the Tony Kempster forum it seems, other than the match officials, no one thought the game should have been stopped. I am sure the referee, who is the sole arbitrator regarding playing conditions, will have quoted health and safety concerns, especially given that it involves U18's. However, with professional clubs watering their pitches just before kick-off and again at half-time it does seem bizarre that a game can be stopped on the best pitch in the county for being “too slippery” due to dew, which is just like watering the pitch. It costs close to £200 to put on one of these games under lights, and one hopes officials will take that into account when making these sort of decisions. On the health and safety theme, I had to laugh at the Chippenham Town twitter feed suggestion of putting up one of those yellow warning signs you see in toilets about slippery surfaces by the pitch entrance. We might also want to think about putting a sign up in the officials and the two dressing rooms like the ones we have for the right footwear to use of the AGP, but this time for the main pitch, specifically saying no astroturf boots and screw studs are more suitable than mouldeds when wet.

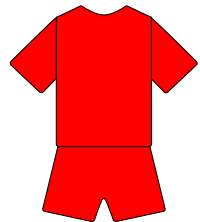
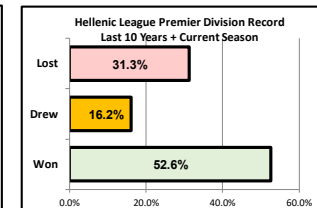
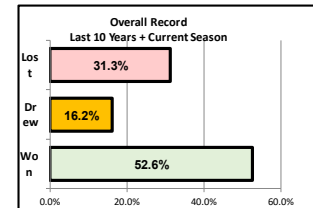

The Under 15 Yellow squad matched Under 13 Yellows as they were also beaten 8-2 away from home. Stratton Juniors FC Jaguars were under no threat from the Bassett team. Two goals from Bassett were the only thing to cushion the blow of Stratton's eight goals.

Well, that is that from this weekend's action. As always, every team has played their hearts out and scored lots of goals. However we're yet to have a flood of wins in the competitive youth section.



Binfield started this season with a trip to deepest Gloucestershire and a meeting with a side everyone expected to be challenging for the title, Brimscombe & Thrupp. A solitary strike from Asa Povey gave Binfield all three points, a result Brimscombe have struggled to recover from, although they will probably start to climb the table soon. Another goal for Povey and another from Danny Horscroft gave Binfield a 2-0 home win over near neighbours Windsor in their second outing. A 3-2 home win in the

FA Cup against United Services Portsmouth came courtesy of goals from Eddie Lee, Josh Howell and Josh Helmore. Back in league action it was another midweek local derby with Virginia Water the visitors this time. Goals from Povey and Helmore maintained Binfield's 100% start to the season in a 2-0 win. Bluefin Insurance cup opponents Chalfont Wasps were blown away at stubbs Lane as Binfield hit nine unanswered goals against their Division Two South opponents, four goals for Sean Moore in this one with two for Eddie Lee and Josh Helmore, Matt Deadfield with the other goal. .

Late goals from Jamie McClurg and Joel Valentin gave Binfield a 2-0 away win at Burnham as they maintained that 100% start to the season. That form continued in the FA Cup where two goals from Josh Helmore and one from Sean Moore secured a 3-2 win over Sydenhams Wessex League side Lymington Town. The first dropped league points of the season happened when Reading City left Stubbs Lane with a point following a 1-1 draw, Josh Helmore with the Binfield goal. Another close game against near neighbours Virginia Water followed, this time in the FA Vase, the tie being settled by another Josh Helmore goal. The first defeat of the season when it came was painful, Binfield crashing out of the FA Cup at Harrow Borough, going down 5-0 to their higher league opponents. Binfield bounced back immediately with a 3-1 away win in the FA Vase at AFC Aldermaston, two goals from Sean Moore and one from Josh Helmore seeing Binfield through to the next round.

Four home games in a row followed started with a 1-1 draw with Burnham in the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup, Binfield progressing to the next round thanks to winning the penalty shoot out 3-1. The first league defeat of the season followed as Westfields left Stubbs Lane with the three points following a close fought 3-2 win. Josh Helmore and Asa Povey once again with the Binfield goals. Binfield bounced back from this reverse winning 4-2 at home against Ardley United. They also progressed in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup thanks to a convincing 6-1 home win over Chalvey Sports. The second defeat in the league resulted from the trip to Gloucester to play Tuffley Rovers, Binfield surprisingly going down 4-1 on an off day for the team. They continue to fly the flag for the Hellenic League in the FA Vase, winning 4-0 at Combined Counties side Egham Town, Josh Howell smashing a hat-trick. Josh Helmore with the other goal. The following week saw another cup win as they progressed in the Bluefin Insurance Cup with a third win of the season over Burnham, 4-2 the score line with Sean Moore this time being the player with the hat-trick. Tuesday night, however, saw them bow out of the Floodlit Cup, losing 2-1 at Flackwell Heath. Binfield's three strikers come to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground today having scored 32 goals between them. Sean Moore is on 13, Josh Helmore on 11 and Josh Howell has 8 to his name and the trio will take some stopping here this afternoon.

Opponents History

Binfield • Club History

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fleiden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.



During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chillonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt – a feat we repeated in 1996 – and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend – this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013. We're also in our fourth season of a partnership scheme with Reading FC where some of our younger players have the opportunity to train with Reading. In 2003 we added an Allied Counties Youth team which is now providing a steady stream of talented young players ready for Senior football for the Reserves and 1st Team. Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our 'continuous improvement' plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team and Veterans. We won the Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHSport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup – and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the Hellenic Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

Seasons 2017/18 saw great progress at the club. With the successful building of new dressing rooms, disabled access paths and fencing together with a clubhouse refurbishment. On the pitch the 1st team finished 7th in the Premier Division and won the Floodlit cup with a 2-1 win over all conquering Thatcham Town, whilst the reserves finished 4th in the Suburban Premier and the Youth team won the Allied Counties South Division. 2018/2019 saw the 1st team finish 9th in the Premier Division and losing finalists in the Floodlit Cup, whilst the Development Side won the Suburban League Cup.

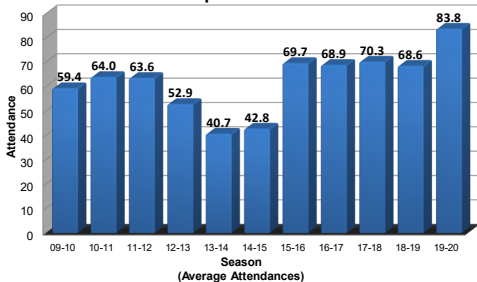

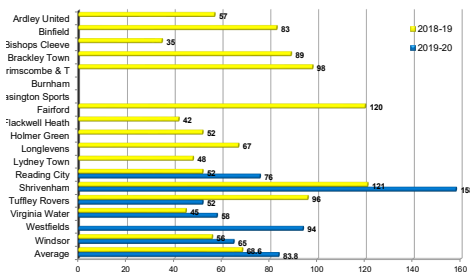

Cover Guy Profile - Matt Bennett



Fast, skilful and possessing an eye for goal, Bennett is an experienced attacking player who has this season re-joined the club where he began his senior career over a decade and a half ago. In total, prior to this season he has spent eight seasons with Bassett previously, split across three spells. And during that period he established himself as a dangerous attacking force, scoring 55 goals in 185 appearances whilst providing countless assists. His excellent performances for the under 18 Floodlit League team earned him a first team call-up in a March 2003 fixture against Fairford Town. He would make two further appearances prior to the end of the year before becoming a regular in the 2003-04 campaign. That season he made 27 appearances and scored six goals. His first strike came in some style too, hitting Bassett's third in a shock 3-1 victory away against title contenders Didcot Town. His first brace came in a fine 3-0 away win at Shortwood United, while he scored the opening goal in a crucial 2-1 victory at Gloucester United that went a long way towards preserving Bassett's Hellenic League Premier Division status. Bennett continued to feature for the under 18s and hit five goals in their run to the Second Qualifying Round of the FA Youth Cup, including four in a 5-1 stuffing of Bournemouth. He top scored a season later with 10 goals in 31 games during Bassett's ultimately failed attempt to avoid the drop. But he continued to be a shining light in a struggling side, scoring a memorable last minute winner away at Henley Town. He would also be selected to represent Wiltshire at under 18 level for the second consecutive season.

Despite dropping to Division One West, Bennett remained with the team and again topped the scoring chart for Bassett in 2005-06 with 12 goals in 30 matches. In an FA Vase clash with Christchurch his rasping 20-yard strike in the 90th minute forced extra time and a replay. The majority of his goals that year, including his first senior hat-trick away at Ross Town, came in the second half of the season as Bassett came agonisingly close to securing an immediate return to the Hellenic Premier Division. A season later he was joint-top scorer with Steve Yeardeley, firing eleven in 33 appearances, his most notable strike being the late equaliser in a 3-3 thriller against Malmesbury Victoria. 2007-08 began well for Bennett as he notched in three of the first four games, scoring before setting up the winner in the FA Cup replay victory over Highworth Town. A frustrating spell in front of goal ensued and after hitting five goals in 18 matches he left to join Shrivenham. Despite playing only ten games for Shrivy that season, he finished third top scorer with an impressive haul of seven goals in ten games, having formed an impressive partnership up front with TJ Bohane. Bennett joined Highworth for the 2008-09 campaign, hitting eight goals in 30 appearances. His best season followed in 2009-10 when he hit 16 goals for the Worthians, including hat-tricks against Old Woodstock Town and Shrivenham. Bennett then split the 2010-11 season between Cricklade Town, Highworth and FC Sanford. For Cricklade he featured four times scoring once before finishing the season at The Elms with six goals in 23 matches as Dave Webb's team challenged for the title. After the briefest of stints with Devizes Town at the start of 2011-12, he re-joined Highworth and struck six goals in 15 games, scoring once in their 6-0 demolition of Binfield in the Challenge Cup final.

Bennett returned to Bassett in 2012-13, scoring two goals in twenty appearances. He moved back to the Elms a year later before beginning the 2014-15 campaign with Shrivenham where he hit six goals in a brief seven game spell. Two seasons ago Bennett featured eighteen times for Purton in Division One West and proved he still was a force in front of goal at Hellenic League level, scoring fifteen times. Meanwhile, in Season 2017-18 he played in the Wiltshire League for Cricklade, firing 21 goals in twenty appearances. After those successful seasons with Purton and Cricklade Town, he returned to Bassett last season, scoring nine times in 22 games.

Bassett Tuff out a draw

Royal Wootton Bassett Town were forced to settle for a point by Tuffley Rovers after a Callum Parsons opener was cancelled out by Lewis Bainbridge's cross-cum-shot in a scrappy midweek contest at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. The result means Sam Collier's side remain in single figures in terms of points collected in the Hellenic League Premier Division this season. However, they continue to head in the right direction and are slowly edging their way back towards a congested mid-table.

They started brightly against Tuffley and took the lead on twelve minutes. Gio Wrona whipped in a low free kick and, among a crowd of bodies, the veteran Parsons was there to head home from close range for his tenth of the season. However, Bassett's lead would not last particularly long. Tuffley's equaliser did arrive in rather fortuitous circumstances for the visitors, but it would prove enough for a point as, midway through the period Bainbridge swung in a delivery that evaded everyone in the box, including 'keeper Declan Lehmann and into the top corner.

After being pegged back, the hosts sought to restore their lead before the break but spurned a fine opportunity when TJ Bohane struck wide with a first time effort after latching onto Aaron Oakley's weighted pass in behind the Tuffley defence. They had an early opening shortly after the restart as visiting defender Isaac Lawrence was forced to get his body in the way of a Callum Parsons shot to keep it off target. At the other end, Jake Rhodes curled narrowly over from a free kick. Bassett then had the ball in the net after the visitors conceded possession sloppily deep inside their own half. However, the assistant referee had raised his flag to rule out a Bohane goal. With time winding down, substitute Brad Pagliaroli, making his return after a frustrating injury layoff, forced a timely block from Luke Merchant after wriggling free and opening up a shooting opportunity. A late chance fell Tuffley's way too, a scramble in the box seeing Jeremiah Idowu, Adam Bloomfield and Dominik Kent all having a bite at the cherry but failing to convert. In the end, neither side was capable of finding the decisive breakthrough.

With six of their next nine games on home turf, Bassett will be hoping that this draw, on the back of victory at Ardley ten days ago, is the beginning of a positive run of results. A good performance will be needed to maintain that though when Binfield visit on Saturday.

Last Sunday's front page of The Non-League Paper was going to be about the first round proper of the FA Cup. About the excitement of the upcoming draw at Maldon & Tiptree as Non-League clubs eagerly awaited those life-changing ties to come out of the hat – and what a draw it turned out to be. It was going to be about those clubs daring to dream. Isthmian Premier club Carshalton Athletic after they upset National League side Dagenham & Redbridge. Or Nantwich Town, who beat National League North high-fliers King's Lynn Town. Then there was the story of Kingstonian beating higher league opposition in Dartford. There was also the drama at Potters Bar Town, who scored an equaliser against neighbours Barnet in the 11th minute of stoppage time to set up a replay. And there was the excitement of goalkeeper Alan Julian heading an injury-time equaliser at Sutton United to keep Billericay Town's FA Cup dream alive.

The front page was supposed to carry pictures capturing all the emotion of this great competition on another action-packed day in Non-League football. Instead, for the second time in a month, it carried a story about allegations of racism. Once again, the ugly side of society has reared its head in Non-League, and English, football. On the back of the shameful scenes in Bulgaria when England players were racially abused and the game was twice suspended, Haringey Borough walked off the pitch following alleged racism towards goalkeeper Valery Douglas Pajetat. Two men, aged 23 and 26, have since been arrested on suspicion of racially aggravated common assault. The incident came in the 65th minute following a Yeovil penalty where he claims he was spat at and verbally abused by fans. The match didn't restart and was abandoned. Boss Tom Loizou also said defender Coby Rowe was targeted. English football was appalled when the men's senior team was on the end of horrific abuse and there have been calls for strong action against Bulgaria and their authorities. We are equally appalled at these allegations. FA chairman Greg Clarke spoke in the immediate aftermath of the Bulgaria game. He rightly pointed out that we must also look at the game in this country because there are issues that clearly need addressing. There is no hiding from that fact. The conversation must include what we are doing about our game.

It's four weeks since allegations were made during the National League game between Hartlepool United and Dover Athletic. Dover players Inih Effiong and Ricky Modeste were subjected to racist abuse and gestures. Pools players heard it and were upset at what they saw coming from some of their home fans. While they considered walking off the pitch, in the end the game was played to a conclusion. Hartlepool were rightly praised for their response to the situation and it looks like Yeovil have reacted in a similar way. Boss Darren Sarll says they stand alongside Haringey and the club say they will be cooperating with the investigation which The FA say is ongoing. The tie is to be replayed on Tuesday, October 29. If proven, the two supporters should never watch a game of football in this country again. Of course, 99.9 per cent of Yeovil fans will be ashamed of what has allegedly happened. Hopefully anyone who has seen or heard anything comes forward to ensure the investigation can be as thorough as is needed. As we've said before, we all have a responsibility to drive this abhorrent behaviour out of our game and out of our society. No footballer, no person, should be attacked just because of their skin colour. In a high-profile competition, Haringey's actions will be seen far and wide. Hopefully this can be a stepping stone towards a better future. Their stand is to be applauded. In times gone past, the incident may not have come to light until after the game. By stopping an FA Cup game in its tracks, the message will be louder. Racists are not welcome in our football grounds at any level. Only then can we get back to talking about the football. **By Matt Badcock**

On This Date

Looking back over the history of the club we appear to have played only ten times on this date, **26 October**. The good news from Sam, Matt and the guys 26 October is certainly a lucky date for us. Of those ten games, seven have been won whilst only three have been lost. We have never drawn on this date. Another good omen is that it is a good day for Bassett players to score hat-tricks, Brad and TJ take note, with the first three games after the Second World War all seeing Bassett players hit three in a game.

The first game traced on this date was back in 1901 when we played Swindon Workmen's club in a friendly, going down 5-2. As this was a friendly, our record in games that mattered on this date is even more impressive. The first official league game on this date was not until 1935, due mainly to the period just before the First World War seeing us fold until the early 1930's. A 5-3 win against Westbury United Reserves in the Wiltshire League saw Arthur Embling bag a brace, the other goals being scored by Perry, Compton and Beazley. The next game on this date was just after the Second World War when we picked up an impressive 4-3 win over Chippenham Town in the FA Amateur Cup, Eric Pearce firing a hat-trick and Harold Hunt adding a fourth.

There was just the one game in the 1957's when in 1957 we smashed Calne Corinthians on this date. This time it was Graham Tyler who hit a hat-trick, Stan Embling got two and there was one a piece for Chris Simpkins and Pete Teetgen. The 1960's saw two games played on 26th October and the first of the two, in 1963, saw another hat-trick, as Dave Lamb smashed all three goals in a 3-2 win over Peasedown. Five years later we won again on this date, two goals from Brian "Toby" Ewan and one from Tommy Gardiner giving us a 3-2 win over Spencer Moulton.

Just one game was played in the 1970's and it was the same score and result as Graham Reid bagged a brace and Tony Vines added a third in 1974's 3-2 win at home against Bromham at Rylands Way. Probably as a result of a waterlogged pitch there were no games on this date in the 1980's and just one in the 1990's. Unfortunately, the 1991 game away at Wollen Sport saw our first ever league defeat on this date, as we went down 2-1 in the Hellenic league Division One fixture, Tony Malone with our consolation goal that day.

The new century has seen us play just twice on this date with one win and one draw to our name. The win came in the Supplementary Cup, Gary Ashford scoring the only goal of the game against Adderbury Park in 2002. The last game played on this date was back in 2013 when we lost 2-1 away at Reading Town, our goal that day being scored by Jason Milhench. Despite that defeat, as you can see, our record on this date is very good and hopefully it will be eight wins on 26th October come the end of ninety minutes today.
