### Ladies net seven in Devon

#### Torguay Utd Ladies 0 Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies 7

Sunday 20th October 2019

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies got back to winning ways with a comprehensive 7-0 victory away against Torquay United in the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division. Dishing out yet more punishment to an opponent they had already thrashed in the Women's FA Cup earlier in the season, James Goddard and Jonny House's side picked up from where they had left off in that clash. They netted a half dozen times in a dominant first half display, while six different scorers were on target in all.

Long-serving midfielder Amber Egerton got the ball rolling on the quarter hour mark. Bassett's attack appeared to break down when Grace Eagles' through pass failed to find Lauren Kayll. But the ball came back to Laura Jefferies and she crossed for Egerton, who fired in from range. The lead was doubled three minutes later when Torquay 'keeper Neave Gosling's clearance picked out Bassett's Lisa Coe, and she smashed into the net from twenty yards. Coe turned provider for her team's third as she played a ball over the top of the defence that Lauren Kayll latched onto before coolly slotting into the bottom corner. And three quickly became four when Kayll crossed for Hayley Huckin to guide home her ninth of the campaign. Lily Withers' mazy run was almost rewarded with another goal as the visitors continued to pile on the pressure, but she narrowly missed the target after receiving a slight nudge from behind. While that would have been some strike, Grace Eagles produced a fine solo effort to make it five, taking on four Torquay defenders before calmly placing beyond Gosling. Bassett's sixth then arrived in first half stoppage time. Kayll whipped in a cross that Gosling was unable to claim and Egerton took full advantage, beating teammate Huckin to the ball to smash into the empty net for her second.

Given their comfortable advantage, Bassett did take their foot off the accelerator a little following the restart. And 'keeper Alice Farnell twice made great stops to preserve her side's clean sheet. On the hour, she brilliantly denied Amber Evans before saving low at her near post with fifteen minutes remaining to keep out Carmen Morison's tight-angled shot. In between, Bassett managed to extend their lead further. Huckin and Withers combined well, with the latter crossing into the box where Aly Lyons was on hand to slot into the back of the net.




The club was formed under the name Super Strikers Girls in 1993, as an U-11 six-a-side team, by pupils of Chandag Junior School. Over the next four years they were renamed Protel Super Strikers and adopted a green and white kit modelled on that of Celtic F.C.. In 1998 the club linked up with Keynsham Town, becoming Keynsham Town Ladies, and entered a senior team in the South West Women's Football League Division Two.

The team progressed through the league, winning promotion to Division One (South) in 1998–99, to the Premier Division in 2001–02, to the South West Combination Women's league in 2003–04 having won the Premier Division title, and eventually to the FA Women's Premier League Southern Division in 2005–06, having won the South West Combination Women's league.

Due to the club's proximity to universities in Bath and Bristol, Keynsham Town Ladies were able to attract a number of international players to an increasingly cosmopolitan squad. When the club reached the quarter-finals of the Premier League Cup for the first time in 2009–10, the squad named for the 4–0 defeat to Arsenal contained nine different nationalities.

The club's most successful league finish in the Southern Premier Division was when they finished third in Season 2009–10. The following season they slipped to 5th spot but still a good showing in one of the upper parts of the women's pyramid. Season 2011-12 was not such a good one though as they finished bottom of the table and were relegated. They bounced back immediately and returned to the Southern Premier Division in Season 2013-14, finishing in 9th spot. Unfortunately they were to be relegated to the South West Division 1 the following season after once again finishing bottom of the table. They were to spend four seasons back down in South West Division 1, impressively never finishing outside the top four. A 3rd place finish in Season 2015-16 was followed by a 4th place and then another 3rd place finish. Season 2018-19 was to be a triumphant one as they won the South West Division 1 title to return to the Southern Premier Division, joining the likes of Watford, Plymouth Argyle, Yeovil Town, Cardiff City and Portsmouth. They are, however, finding it tough going having lost all six league games to date this season.

Along the way the club formed a Reserves side which was subsequently re-branded, as is the way, as the Development side. Playing in the South West Regional Women's League. Statistics have been traced back to Season 2013-14 when they were in the Eastern Division 1. Season 2015-16 saw the Development side finish in second spot earning promotion to the Premier Division where they have remained ever since. The best position to date has been last season's runners-up spot behind Exeter City Ladies, winning 15 of their 20 league games to finish just six points behind the champions.



### Ladies suffer frustrating F.A. Cup exit

Portishead Ladies 1 Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies 0 Sunday 6th October 2019

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies exited the Women's FA Cup following a hugely frustrating 1-0 loss away against league rivals Portishead Town. Bassett dominated possession in Somerset, but failed to take the chances they created. Meanwhile, Portishead took full advantage of the one good opportunity they created just before the hour.

Bassett did put the ball in the back of the net, but on twelve minutes Haylen Huckin saw her strike ruled out for offside. Four minutes later, Grace Eagles saw her shot parried by Chloe-Joy Anderson in the Portishead goal before Lily Withers' follow-up was cleared off the line.

Anderson remained busy, saving from Kayll before smartly denying Huckin following a well -worked Bassett move. Bassett continued to create opportunities, but were unable to convert. Just after the half hour mark, Huckin headed over from a Lisa Coe cross, while Withers was unable to find a way past Anderson and Amber Egerton shot narrowly over the bar.

That them continued after the restart, Huckin seeing a deflected strike inch agonisingly wide of the post following a Laura Jefferies free kick. Portishead then took the lead. Bassett lost possession in midfielder, and the home side capitalised, Shannon Holloway being quickest to react after Emily Lindsey's effort came back out off the bar.

And Bassett ultimately were unable to get back on level terms despite continuing to press their hosts. A flowing Bassett move almost yielded an equaliser with twenty minutes remaining, but after opening up the Portishead defence Huckin scuffed her shot. Egerton was able to chase down the loose ball and squared to Kayll, who blazed over.

Kayll and Withers then both failed to find the target before late controversy saw a handball that appeared to take place in the Potishead box ruled a free kick.

### **Callington clip Ladies' wings**

### **Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies 2 Callington Town Ladies 5** Sunday 29th September 2019

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies lost their first competitive fixture in almost a year as they fell to a 5-2 home defeat against Callington Town. After more or less matching their opponents – who, like Bassett, went into the game boasting a 100% record from their opening fixtures of the season without conceding – the home side fell away in the second half, their Cornish visitors scoring four times to seal the points and underline their quality. There were chances for both teams in an action-packed opening to the game. However, it would not be until midway through the opening period that the deadlock was broken. And it was Bassett who struck first blood, Lauren Kayll feeding Hayley Huckin, who was shown onto her stronger foot and proceeded to fire just past the Callington 'keeper Sara Rowe and into the top corner. Bassett's lead lasted all of five minutes though as a defensive lapse played into the hands of Rhi Bailey, who kept her cool to slot into the corner past Abi Footner. That equaliser seemed to dent Bassett's confidence. And it was Callington who finished the first half the stronger side, with Gabi Alphous looping a shot over and Footner reacting fast to narrow the angle and block Daisy Self's shot.

Callington were eventually rewarded with the lead shortly after the restart as Grace O'Leary was afforded too much time in midfield and beat Footner with a spectacular long-range effort. Footner was then called into action to deny Alphous. Bassett were temporarily reduced to ten players on the hour mark as Kayll was sent to the sin bin. And Callington took full advantage of the extra player, extending their lead as Alphous rose highest to head in from a fine cross. Bassett weren't done yet though, and Huckin offered a glimmer of hope as she headed in from player of the match Laura Jefferies' corner to reduce the deficit. However, the visitors quickly restored their two goal advantage, Alphous curling into the bottom corner. Then, with quarter of an hour remaining Footner brought down Self and Bailey calmly slotted home the resulting penalty to make it 5-2 and put the outcome of the game beyond doubt. The loss was Bassett's first in a league fixture since falling to a 2-1 reverse at home against Swindon Spitfires on October 7th last year.

While not at their best, Bassett shouldn't be too disheartened, having given a reasonable account of themselves against a side who look set to be challenging at the top of the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division. Plus, they have an excellent opportunity to bounce back from defeat next week when they visit Portishead Town in the Women's FA Cup.
