The Wiltshire FA have re-introduced the Wiltshire Premier Shield for Season 2019-20 after a break of 7 seasons. Whilst previously the competition involved just the 4 sides playing at Step 4 and above, the re-introduced Shield will now include the clubs playing at Step 5. This means there will be 10 teams entering this season's Shield and we will be one of the lowest level teams in the cup competition. The 10 teams will be Swindon Town, Chippenham Town, Salisbury, Swindon Supermarine, Melksham Town, Highworth Town, Westbury United, Bradford Town, Amesbury and Royal Wootton Bassett Town. The one and only season we have played in this competition before was Season 2001-2 when we defeated Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the First Round 1-0 before knocking out Swindon Supermarine 2-0 in the Second Round. We eventually went out at the Semi-Final stage losing 2-0 to Swindon Town. We have been drawn to play in one of two First Round matches and travel to Westbury on Wednesday 9th October. The other First Round tie sees Salisbury travel to Amesbury Town on Tuesday 8th October.

Welcome to Hereford Lads Club

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Hereford Lads Club for this Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup 3rd Round fixture. I hope all from Hereford Lads Club enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home.

Last Season Hereford Lads Club finished in 7th place in the West Midlands (Regional) League Premier Division and moved across to the UHlsport Hellenic League as part of the FA's National League System restructuring during the summer. They are currently in second place in Division One West, a point behind leaders Wellington with a game in hand. More importantly they are unbeaten this season in all competitions in the 7 games they have played. Having already lost to one Division One West side in the Floodlit Cup we are going to have to be at our best if we are not to lose for the second time this season to Division One West opponents.

Virginia Water Last Week

After a good pre-season few would have predicted the start to the competitive season we have made. That pre-season thrashing of Cirencester Town now seems a long time ago now and perhaps led to a bit of complacency as we started the season. Last Saturday against Virginia Water I could see at first hand that a lack of confidence and an element of unnecessary tension seemed to have now set in. We certainly had loads of possession last week but could not convert it into clear cut goal scoring opportunities. In important areas in the attacking third players were dwelling on the ball when a first time shot was probably in order, then on other occasions shooting when there were better options open. This is what happens when things are not going your way and we desperately need to get some wins under our belts and restore confidence. Thankfully that first league win came on Wednesday night. To be honest I thought Virginia Water were not a strong side at all and in the closing 15 minutes had very little left in the tank and were there for the taking. However, we gave away another silly goal to make it 3-1 and end any chance we had of getting a result out of the game. Compared with last season we seem to be lacking pace throughout the side and were twice done on the break with our midfield looking like they were treading water trying to get back. I am not sure why we were unable to retain players like Rob Lincoln, Josh Shama and Matty Bennett but it is that type of player we seem to be missing at the moment. It was pleasing to hear Matty was back on Wednesday along with Danny Langford who also has pace. The one bright spot for me last Saturday was the performances of youngsters Caine Bradbury, Alfie Presley and Harrison Lea, who all had good games and didn't deserve to be on a losing side for their efforts alone. After scoring the stunning free kick the other week I am also still struggling to understand why Caine wasn't given the responsibility for a kick in the same position. In his defence, Gio was not playing that day so hadn't seen Caine's effort but in my opinion one of the more senior players who had been there should have told him to let Caine have it.

But, beginning with a penalty, Welton's Ray Barker scored a twelve-minute second half hat-trick to turn the tie around. Bassett dug deep though and Mair headed an equaliser to force another replay. That took place the following Saturday – 14th November – and, after having already played thirteen hours in the Amateur Cup, it proved a game too far for Bassett. Taking the lead in the second minute, Welton proceeded to go 3-0 up after half an hour. Bassett attempted to fight back valiantly. However, they were not helped by injuries – Teetgen was unable to start while Dave Gillett picked up an early knock that forced him to play ineffectively on the wing for the rest of the game while clearly hurt. Simpkins did score for the visitors, but Welton netted four more times to seal an emphatic 7-1 win and finally end Bassett's adventure. Rovers would go on to lose to Devizes Town in the final qualifying round.

Nine games over four rounds in a fifty-day period, comprising five draws (at least one in each round), three wins, one defeat, eighteen goals for and the same number against – it was some journey. It tied Bassett's record of reaching the third qualifying round in 1946-47 too. However, that was achieved in more straightforward circumstances - without the need for a single replay 0 as Dilton Rovers (3-1), Melksham Town (2-1) and Chippenham Town (4-3) were seen off before a 9-0 loss away against Cornish side St. Austell brought it to an end. After their Amateur Cup exploits in 1959-60 came to a conclusion, Bassett were finally able to get back to other engagements. Their cup exploits seemed to have taken a toll on the team though. A week after losing to Welton, Bassett were defeated 1-0 by Swindon BR in the Wiltshire Senior Cup second round before suffering a 4-1 loss in their first league action since September at home against Westbury United. Bassett would ultimately finish a credible sixth in the 1959-60 Wiltshire League Premier Division though – their first at that level having secured the Division One title a season before. That cup jaunt would be one of Bassett's last in the Amateur Cup too. It was certainly their final extensive run in a competition they had first entered in 1936-37. In 1960-61, Bassett defeated Swindon Victoria in the extra preliminary round before losing away against Bromham. Four years elapsed before the next – and final – entry for the club, which saw Highworth Town thrashed 8-1 away from home, only for Ferndale YC to triumph 2-1 in the subsequent preliminary round tie.

60 years on: Bassett's remarkable FA Amateur Cup run

Sixty years ago, on 26th September 1959, Wootton Bassett Town embarked on what would turn into a remarkable FA Amateur Cup journey. It would encompass nine ties across four different rounds over the course of a period lasting a month and a half, during which Bassett were unable to play a game in any other competition. And, still, it did not result in Bassett advancing beyond the Amateur Cup's qualifying rounds. Nevertheless, it represents one of the club's most successful participations in a national cup competition and one that deserves to be remembered – not least because few clubs across the country can surely claim to have experienced such a unique run.

It began with an away trip to Clandown in the preliminary round. Bassett had enjoyed an unbeaten start to their Wiltshire League Premier Division season and so travelled to Somerset confident of getting a positive result against their Western League Division Two opponents. An early goal from Ken Pewsey only added to that feeling. Clandown equalised with a penalty a minute before the break though and looked on course to win when awarded another spot kick late on. However, a stroke of luck fell Bassett's way as Clandown forward Bill Rogers missed. The same player then atoned for his error, clearing off the line at the other end to force a replay in Wiltshire a week later. And Bassett ensured they would advance at the second time of asking as Lou Nash's deflected shot and a Geoff Simpkins beauty secured a 2-0 victory. That set up a first qualifying round tie against Pinehurst YC. The Swindon-based side represented familiar opponents for Bassett as they had already met three times in the season's opening few weeks. Bassett had triumphed 2-1 and 3-2 over the course of two legs in the Wiltshire Senior Cup first round before the teams shared four goals in a league draw. A fifth meeting would soon be on the cards too as Simpkins' early goal was cancelled out by Prothero just before half time in an evenly contested match at Rylands Way. The return fixture seven days later on 17th October was played in the face of a strong wind. Bassett played into it in the first half and survived a number of Pinehurst attacks to go into half time a goal to the good thanks to Pete Teetgen's opener. Teetgen scored twice more in the second half to complete a hat-trick meaning Prothero's reply for Pinehurst proved academic in a 3-1 Bassett win. Another home tie, this time against Radstock Town, also of Western League Division Two side, was Bassett's reward in the second qualifying round, with the game played on 24th October. Again, the hosts made a fantastic start as Johnny Lawrence scored after twenty seconds with a forty-yard lob. Ray Young then doubled the advantage before half time to put Bassett on course to advance without the need for a replay. Alas, Radstock centre half Dave Tilley replied, scoring a second half penalty and a late free kick to necessitate a trip to Somerset. That was to be Bassett's sixth game in the competition. Come full time, a seventh would be required too. As in the initial tie, Bassett raced into a 2-0 lead, Ronnie Mair scoring twice in the opening twelve minutes. Once more though Tilley would prove Bassett's nemesis, netting twice from the spot to earn another 2-2 draw. A second replay was therefore required, with this played on neutral territory at Chippenham. It would be a midweek date too, on Wednesday 4th November – a novelty for games at that point of the season back then. Bassett made the most of this rare midweek engagement. They fell behind to an early own goal, but Pewsey quickly restored parity. Five minutes before the break Teetgen deflected in a free kick to put Bassett ahead, before Ray Young secured a place in the penultimate qualifying round, steering home a Stan Embling cross to make it 3-1. Bassett's opponents three days later would be Western League Division Two leaders – and eventual champions - Welton Rovers. Despite the strength of their opposition in what was their eighth game in the competition, Bassett held out hope given they had home advantage. And they had a healthy support behind them too, it being reported that the club broke their gate record with around £16 being earned from hosting the tie. Two goals in two minutes – courtesy of a Simpkins header and Mair penalty – had Bassett dreaming of the next round. It could have been three before the break too, however Teetgen had a goal disallowed for offside.

Longlevens

Well done to Sam and the lads for picking up that first league win of the season on Wednesday which saw us climb out of the bottom three. I understand it was an impressive team performance with Danny Langford and Alfie Presley in particular having good games. Both players scored with the other goal coming from Gio Wrona from the penalty spot to secure the three points in a 3-1 win. Hopefully this first win will give the lads great confidence going into today's cup game and we can get a winning run going.

Ladies

Congratulations to the Ladies side on their FA Cup win over Torquay United last Sunday. They have achieved a historic best FA Cup record for the club in the Ladies competition and have already won more prize money than the men's First Team despite the pay rates being only 11% of the men's competition. Hopefully with a draw against another side from their division in Portishead Ladies they will be able to put an even bigger smile on the Treasurers' face. The Portishead game is away from home and is scheduled for Sunday 6th October, replacing an away league fixture that had been scheduled against the same opponents.

Development Team

If it wasn't for the performances of the Ladies side Steve Yeardley would be in with a good shout for Club manager of the month for September. After drawing with last season's cup winners and runners-up Kintbury Rangers, losing narrowly to last season's champions, his side went one better last week defeating league leaders Corsham Town Reserves on their own ground, where last season Corsham had been unbeaten. Another goal in this one for Charlie McCuish who has clearly found his feet in men's football as he moved onto six goals for the season.

Next Up At The Gerard Buxton Sports Ground

Next up here at the Gerard Buxton Sports ground is a big match for the Ladies side when they host league leaders Callington Town here tomorrow. Callington have won all their league games without conceding a goal whilst Bassett have won twice in the FA Cup, once in the Wiltshire County Cup and once in the league, also without conceding a goal. I am sure tomorrow will not be a 0-0 draw though but it will be a big test for the Ladies in their first season at Step 5. The First Team are back in action here next week when they take on Windsor in the battle of the teams with Royal connections. At the time of writing I am not aware of Andy being advised of any special visitors gracing us with their presence.

Enjoy today's game and hopefully we can progress to the Fourth Round of this competition, which after the league start is probably now our best chance of silverware this season.

Wait for a win over as Bassett deservedly down Levens



Longlevens 1 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 3

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's prolonged wait for a 2019-20 league win is finally over as Sam Collier's team deservedly triumphed 3-1 away against Longlevens. An impressive display, capped by goals from Alfie Presley, Danny Langford and a Gio Wrona penalty, delivered a victory that also lifts Bassett off the bottom of the Hellenic League Premier Division table.

After Saturday's disappointing reverse at home against Virginia Water, Collier required a response from his side. And that is what the Bassett boss got. They were bright from the first whistle. And while it was Longlevens who had the first real chances of the game, Declan Lehmann saving from James Barnett and Will Emery, Bassett were arguably the brighter of the two teams. On eleven minutes, Caine Bradbury's venomous free kick forced Ash Wintle to tip wide. The same player then forced another save from open play before Langford headed narrowly over from a left-wing cross. Soon enough the opening goal of the game arrived on the half hour mark – and it would be the first of three scored in the space of a frenzied six-minute period. Wintle was unable to handle a Wrona free kick and Presley pounced to prod home the loose ball for his third goal of the campaign. Isaac Johns saw a shot deflected over for the hosts. But they were level shortly after. Longlevens caught Bassett on the break, and after neat link up play, Johns played a through ball to Harry Emmett on the right, and he fired home a powerful left foot drive. Parity wouldn't last though. 'Keeper Lehmann sprayed a magnificent ball out to Presley on the right and he crossed for man of the match Langford, who was free in the box, to guide beyond Wintle.

Following the restart, both sides continued to push forward as they had done in the opening period. For Longlevens, Josh Watts volleyed wide, while Emmett failed to test Lehmann from the edge of the area. At the other end, Bassett were forcing numerous corners, though were unable to take advantage of them, the closest they came being when Bradbury saw a shot blocked. Even with the visitors performing well, the outcome still therefore hung in the balance. That was until Wintle brought down Presley with three minutes to go. And up stepped Wrona, who coolly put the penalty away to seal a long-awaited three points. With the wait for a league win finally over, the job now for Bassett is to put their early season struggles behind them and close the gap between themselves and the sides in mid-table. The talent is there in the squad to push for a top half finish. After a slow start, now is the time to knuckle down and deliver the points that will help them achieve what they are capable of.

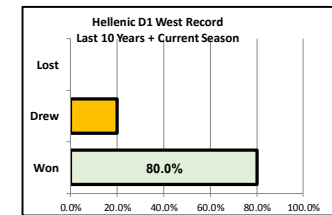
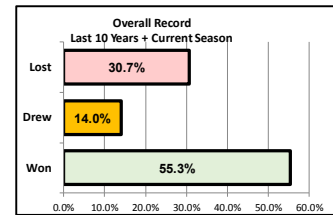

There were hat-tricks for both Thomas Bendall and James Hancocks, with further goals from Kiea Cowley-Hair, Jamie Cuthbertson, Adam Hockey and Adam Newbury. They remain in the Banbury Litho Floodlit Cup, winning 4-1 away at Newent Town thanks to goals from Thomas Bendall, Jamie Hancocks and subs Nick Britton and Adam Hockey. Last time out they smashed another seven goals in a 7-1 away win at Bourton Rovers with the goals being shared around seven different players so come into this game unbeaten in all competitions this season, with all seven of those games being away from home.

Hereford Lads Club • History

The Hereford Lads Club was founded in 1925 for under privileged boys by Mr J Mackay with the aim of providing Young boys with the means to become men through sport emphasising gentlemanly conduct and good sportsmanship and originally catered for gymnastics and boxing before developing cricket & junior football teams.

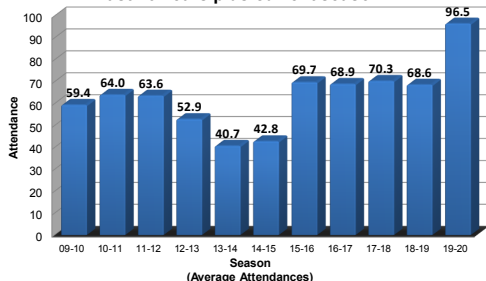

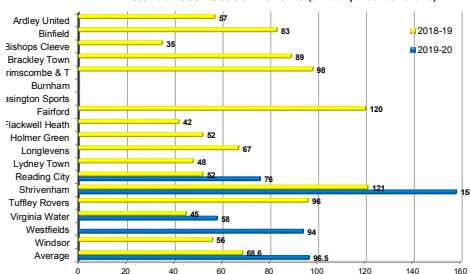

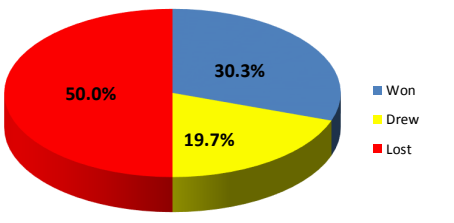

Waters easily outsmart pedestrian Bassett

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's search for a first win in the Hellenic League Premier Division season rolls on after they were humbled 3-1 on their own turf by Virginia Water.

The visiting Waters were fitter, better organised and far smarter than their pedestrian hosts. While Bassett had more of the ball throughout the game, they were ultimately far too easy to defend against.

Virginia Water's backline was rarely stretched and play was consistently in front of them as the lack of pace in Bassett's team was exposed. The visitors were patient enough to sit back and not chase the ball as Bassett circulated it around with no real intent. And often enough, attacks would fizz out with no serious questions being asked.

At the other end, a pair of mistakes gifted the visitors their opening two, well-taken goals before a third came late on the counter to kill any hopes Sam Collier's team had of staging a comeback following TJ Bohane's volleyed effort.

Though neither side gave that much of a positive impression early on, there were some signs of hope in the opening minutes for Bassett. And they almost went ahead midway through the first half when Caine Bradbury lost his marker to meet Harrison Lea's cross from the deep in the box, but he could only steer inches wide of the left post.

Declane Lehmann was called into action for Bassett when Adam McNamara turned veteran Wayne Turk, but the Bassett 'keeper was more than equal to the forward's shot. Alfie Presley then came close to Bassett as he stretched to get on the end of a Brad Pagliaroli cross, forcing a point-blank parry from Matt Jones.

The game appeared to be headed into half time goalless though. That was until a heavy touch from Turk allowed Josh Dillon to pounce on the ball and feed a pass through to Paul Burrows making an inside run from his position on the left wing. With just Lehmann to beat, the midfielder comfortably picked out the bottom right corner.

A great saving tackle from Adam Mills denied Presley a shot at goal following a break initiated by Tinashe Gwavava two minutes before the interval.

IT'S quite telling that Danny Cowley mentioned his and brother Nicky's Non-League roots in the opening press conference as Huddersfield Town manager. From the Essex Senior League to the Championship in a little over a decade is some rise – and they will never forget where they came from. The Cowley brothers have now been at every level of English football from tier two down to Non-League's Step 5. They even picked up back-to-back Manager of the Year honours at our annual National Game Awards!

Their recent success at Lincoln City, who they took to the National League title and then League Two winners, has seen them linked to a number of jobs higher up the ladder. For Imps fans, news of their departure would have been something they'd have known was eventually coming but would have done little to dampen the pain of seeing them leave Sincil Bank for pastures new last Monday. Of course, it all began at Concord Rangers with Danny as joint-manager to Danny Scopes – the man back in the Beachboys' hot-seat this season – and Nicky as a player. Since then they've gone on to form a formidable partnership, taking Concord to National League South football before a third-place finish with Braintree Town in Non-League's top tier and a subsequent move into the full-time management with Lincoln. Concord chairman Ant Smith told The NLP what stood them apart all those years ago and how a relentless quest to be as good as they possibly can has been the cornerstone of their success, which is why he thinks they'll go right to the very top.

"Danny would only ask for that extra one per cent to make things better for the players or the club," said Smith. "He wasn't asking for thousands of pounds, just little bits and pieces that would make a big difference.

"On a Thursday night after training we'd have 'Pizza Night'. I'd order them in, a few of the committee would go down there and we'd have a laugh and it just helped that comradery and the bonding between us all. Little things like that.

"Their desire to win games and their attention to detail was just incredible. For anybody in Non-League to watch what they've done gives everyone hope. I truly believe they will manage England one day."

It would be a remarkable story should they go on to lead the Three Lions but for now we wish them all the best in their new challenge and know they continue to be great ambassadors for Non-League football. Like Chris Wilder in the Premier League at Sheffield United, it is a boost to Non-League gaffers with big aspirations to see these examples. It shows there are sharp managerial minds outside of the Football League. Let's hope more get a shot because of them.

On This Date

Looking back over the history of the club we appear to have played 13 times on this date, **28 September**. Once again it is not a particularly lucky date as only 4 of the 13 have been won and we have suffered 8 defeats. The first recorded game on this date was back in 1907 when we defeated Trowbridge Town 3-0 in a season that saw us finish 3rd in the Wiltshire League. The next game on this date was not until the first season after the Second World War when we defeated Ditton Rovers 3-1 in an FA Cup game, goals that day from E. Pearce 2, E. Randell 2 and R. Arthurs. We remained unbeaten on this particular date after our next encounter in 1957, drawing 2-2 with Paulton Rovers in an FA Amateur Cup match.

There were two matches on this date in the 1960's, the decade which saw England win the World Cup. We suffered our first defeat on this date in 1963 when we lost 4-0 away at Stonehouse, a side we have played again this season after many years in the very competition that this programme has been produced for. Another 4-0 defeat was incurred in 1968 away at Trowbridge Town Reserves. Whilst it had been a good decade for England for Wootton Bassett Town the 1960's was not a particularly successful decade.

There was just one game played in each of the next two decades. In 1974 a solitary goal from Trevor Cook saw us win 1-0 away at Highworth Town and no doubt a few beers were sunk in the clubhouse that night. The only game played in the 1980's is one that is best forgotten as, playing in the Wiltshire League Cup, we lost 9-0 at Rylands Way to Bemerton. I suspect centre back Roger Williamson still wakes up in a cold sweat about that game.

Two matches in the 1990's which saw one win and one defeat. In 1991 Lambourn Sports came to Rylands Way in the first game the club played after the departure of manager Jeff Youd. The first game for manager Paul Mackie was not a successful one as we lost 3-1, Kenny Regan with the Bassett goal (the team lists from the programme for this game are included here). The win in this decade came in 1996 when we returned from Cirencester United with a 2-1 win, our goals coming from Ian Curtis and Simon Green.

Since the turn of the century this date has not been a good one as we have lost all four games played on the date. In 2002 we lost 2-0 at home to Didcot Town and two years later, again at Rylands Way, we lost 1-0 to visitors Chipping Norton. In what is not a good omen for today's game the other two defeats were in this very competition. In 2005 we lost 2-0 away at Slimbridge and in 2013 we travelled across the Severn Bridge to take on Lydney Town but progress in this cup was ended with Lydney running out 5-2 winners, Jordan Roberts scoring both our goals. So all in all today would be a good day to end the curse of 28 September this century.

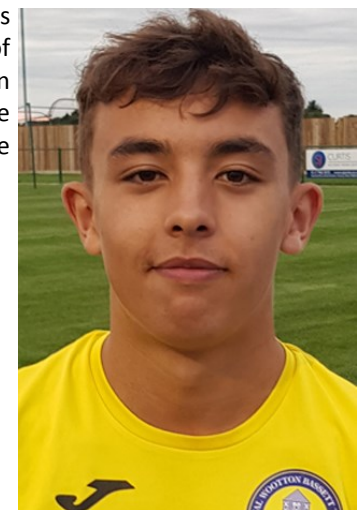
And, a goal down at half time, Bassett's woes were compounded on the hour mark when Burrows added his second. Possession was again carelessly conceded inside their own territory, and substitute Martin Peters fed a pass through the middle for Burrows, who was just able to stay onside. The midfielder had all the time in the world to steady himself to shoot, and while Lehmann got a hand to his effort, the ball crept in over the line.

In a desperate position, Bassett were unable to inject the necessary energy into the game. They had a couple of near misses, with Adam Corcoran's close range flick swatted away and Gio Wrona finding the post with a speculative drive. With twelve minutes remaining they did get on the board as TJ Bohane volleyed in Pagliaroli's sweet left wing cross.

That was the extent of the response Bassett could muster though. And the visitors restored their two-goal advance with three minutes of normal time remaining. No pressure was put on the ball as Virginia Water broke from deep. Play was then spread to McNamara on the right and his low cross into the box was met with a simple side foot finish from Peters.

This may only have been Bassett's fifth league contest of the season. But even then, October is just around the corner - and there's every chance they'll enter the third month of the season with a big round zero still in the win column. In normal circumstances it would be an extreme exaggeration to label Wednesday's visit to Longlevens a must-win encounter. But that's the territory Bassett find themselves in as they now sit bottom of the table.

Man of the Match: Caine Bradbury – the midfielder was the only Bassett player who really asked any questions of Virginia's Water defence, showing willing to make runs in behind. He was unlucky not to get on the scoresheet in the first half, his run into the box deserving better as he steered wide from Harrison Lea's delivery.
