






Patient Bassett bide their time to beat Bideford

While controlling the game for long periods, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies were forced to be patient before sealing what was a deserved 2-1 triumph at home against Bideford. Bassett went behind before Lauren Kayll levelled on the half hour mark. An attacking second half display then helped seal the win as Hayley Huckin struck the decisive goal on 58 minutes. The hosts enjoyed the better of the opening exchanges, but a goal was not forthcoming. On six minutes an outstanding Laura Jefferies corner was headed onto the bar before, five minutes later, Huckin had an effort blocked following good build up play between Hannah Gulliver and Lily Withers. Bideford then found the back of the net with their first opportunity as Kate McKane's firm 20-yard strike proved too powerful for Alice Farnell. Ten minutes later it could have been two for the visitors but Rebecca McMullin fired wide. Bassett soon got back on the front front and Kayll should have equalised when a defensive slip put her through but she placed over. However she made no mistake a couple of minutes later, combining well with strike partner Huckin before finding the bottom corner. Bassett subsequently had the better opportunities prior to the interval but were unable to go ahead, Huckin having the best opportunity when she headed over.

They suffered a scare shortly after the restart though when Gulliver was forced to clear off the line following Farnell's slight fumble. Bideford were claiming for a penalty, which the referee turned down. And Bassett broke to the other end where Huckin shot against the post. The hosts themselves had appeals for a spot kick waved awaywhen Huckin headed a Kayll cross onto the arms of a defender. Bassett continued to create the better openings as Kayll shot straight at Zoe Stock and Withers found the side netting. The deserved breakthrough eventually arrived just before the hour. Amber Egerton took on her marker before fizzing in a low cross, which Huckin controlled before firing in on the turn. The latter stages then saw both sides trade blows. Farnell recovered well after initially seeing a cross squirm between her legs. Meanwhile, at the other end Egerton came close with two headers from set piece deliveries. Then with three minutes remaining Farnell saved from a free kick in a dangerous area.

In the end it was a deserved win for Bassett - their fourth in a row in the league and one which pulls them to within three points of leaders Callington Town with two games in hand to play. Their winning run will be tested next week, however, with the return fixture away at Bideford.

The men's club was formed as Melksham F.C. in 1876 and played at Challymead Common, before moving to The Old Bear Field in 1883 where it stayed until a move to The Conigre ground in 1920. In 1894 Melksham became founding members of the Wiltshire League. They then spent the next eighty years in the Wiltshire league, during which time they won the league once in the 1903–04 Season and then went on to win the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup in the following season. The club has since gone on to win the Wiltshire Senior Cup on seven more occasions although they had to wait until 1969-70 to win it for a second time. Melksham Town established a reserve side early on in the club's existence and this reserve team also quickly achieved league title success winning Division 2 of the Wiltshire League in Season 1905-06.

The ground at The Conigre was part of the Melksham House estate which was purchased by The Avon Rubber Company in 1920. The house was turned into a social club for company employees and the grounds, including The Conigre were to be used for sporting activities. The only condition imposed on the football club for the use of The Conigre was that it be renamed Melksham & Avon Utd F.C. During the first season at The Conigre the Avon Rubber Company spent £1,000 on providing a stand and fencing around the ground. In 1926-27 the club reverted back to the name Melksham Town.

When football recommenced after the end of the Second World War Melksham remained in the Wiltshire League with the first team in Division One and the reserve side in Division 2 until Season 1953 -54 when the league established a dedicated reserve team division. Both sides had limited success in the early 1950's but, following a 3rd place finish in 1956-57, the first team finished as runners-up in Season 1959-60 behind champions Westbury United. A change in set-up in Senior football in the county ahead of Season 1956-57 saw the reserve side, along with a number of other reserve sides from Senior clubs in the county, move across to the Trowbridge & District League where they were to have great success. In the late 1960s The Conigre was further developed with the erection of the covering standing enclosures on two sides. A clubhouse followed in 1976 and then the erection of floodlights in 1986. In the early 1990s the old wooden stands had to be dismantled, a legacy of Health & Safety measures following the Bradford fire in 1985. A new stand was erected in 1994.

Melksham first team had left the Wiltshire League for the first time in the 1974-75 season when the club entered the Western League. They won Division One in 1979-80, gaining promotion to the Premier Division. They stayed in the division until they were relegated in 1988. The club left the Western League in 1993, when they were relegated back to the Wiltshire County League after finishing in bottom position. However, they returned to the Western league after just one season when they won the Wiltshire County League. Back in the Western League a successful 1996-97 campaign saw Melksham promoted to the Premier Division, as champions. The club then spent the next thirteen seasons in the top division of the Western League before being relegated to Division One again at the end of the 2009-10 campaign. At the end of the 2011-12 season the club gained promotion back to the Premier Division when they finished as runners-up in Division One. In the 2014-15 season Melksham won the Western Football League Premier Division but could not be promoted to the Southern League due to not being able to meet ground rules on time. That dream of Southern League football was finally achieved at the end of Season 2017-18 when they finished runner-up and gained promotion, the club having moved to Oakfields, a stunning new £7.3 million facility shared with Melksham Rugby Club on the eastern edge of the town that more than met any ground grading regulations.

It has not been possible to ascertain when the Ladies side at Melksham was established. In recent times they finished in 3rd place in the Wiltshire County Women's League in Season 2017-18 and last season Melksham won the County League as they finished seven points clear of runners-up Salisbury.
