Welcome To Todays Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this FA Vase First Qualifying Round tie against Knaphill from the Combined Counties Premier Division South, A warm welcome to all of management players. committee members and supporters of Knaphill who have made the one hour 15-minute journey (assuming no hold-ups at the M3 junction in Lightwater, in Bracknell or on the M4) that I know so well. Knaphill is a village on the outskirts of Woking and a couple of miles down the road from our place and I pass their excellent ground if we do the shopping in Sainsburys at Brookwood.

Knaphill have not made the best of starts in the Combined Counties Premier Division South this season and are vet to win a competitive game in open play. This after two very good starts to the two season's which were curtailed by Covid. Knaphill sat third in the league when Season 2019-20 was brought to an early end, and in seventh place when last season was also ended prematurely. Whilst Knaphill are without a win they have also only lost three of the ten competitive games they have played in the league and FA Cup this season, becoming something of a draw specialist, with seven games finishing level at the end of ninety minutes, including three games in the FA Cup. In the Extra Preliminary Round of the FA Cup they progressed to the next round courtesy of a penalty shoot-out win in a replay but one of the three defeats so far came in a replay in the Preliminary Round. In the league they have drawn four of the six games played and currently sit in 18th place in the early league table. Despite their lack of wins so far this season we will have to be at our best here this afternoon to progress to the next round as they are a very useful side who seem to be having a bad run of injuries. The winners of today's tie, which has to be decided this afternoon, will have a trip west of Bristol to play Portishead Town in the next round.

Last Saturday saw us complete a quick-fire double over Thornbury Town, having

already knocked them out of the FA Cup, we secured a 2-0 win thanks to two more goals from Alan Griffin, taking him on to eight goals for the season ahead of Wednesday night's game at Brimscombe. Unfortunately the game at Briscombe didn't go as we hoped as we went down 2-1 to the side that moved above us into second place in the table, Macauley Dodson with our goal. Reports from both Saturday and Wednesday are included in today's programme.

The Ladies start to the new season did not happen as planned last Sunday after we called off the game with Covid concerns in the team. Hopefully tomorrow's game will go ahead as ours was the only game in the South West Regional Women's Football League that was called off last week.

The Development side maintained their 100% winning start to the season in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League with wins last Saturday against Shrewton United (4-1) and Purton (19-0) in midweek here at the Gerard Buxton Ground. Steve Yeardley's side sit in second place in the table but can catch leaders Pewsey Vale, who have also won all their games to date if they win their games in hand. The Vets Team were also in action in midweek in the Wiltshire FA's Veterans' County Cup and made it through to the next round with a narrow 2-1 win

Unfortunately the Under 18's lost their FA Youth Cup tie against Paulton Rovers, a report on their 3-1 defeat is included later in the programme. Last weekend was the start of the season in the North Wilts Youth & Minors League and details of all the results are included in the club news page.

Enjoy the game and hopefully we will see progress in this national competition which, unlike the FA Cup, clubs in our league have a realistic chance of reaching the final as Binfield demonstrated last season.

Youth Section Round-up Start of North Wilts Youth League

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Under 13 Yellows got their 2021-22 season off to a flying start as they struck nine times in a thirteen goal North Wilts League Cup Preliminary round thriller away against Hungerford Town Juniors. Bassett booked their spot in the first round in style as Charlie Greaney and Yusuf Guloglu both bagged hat tricks. Fynn Crone, Jack McGeoch and William Moreton completed the scoring to set up a first round tie against Division One Ramsbury Youth.

Both Under 12 sides were also in cup action as they played their first ever competitive fixtures. There was heartbreak for the Blues as they lost 5-4 on penalties against Highworth Town Juniors J after the teams had shared eight goals between them during the course of the match. On target for Bassett were Alex Greenouff (2), Mason Brooks and Alfie-Jack McCarthy. It was a tough day at the office for the Yellows though as they were knocked out following a 10-4 defeat against FC Calne Youth Blue.

Elsewhere, three sides got their league campaigns underway. And there were winning starts for the Under 13 Blue and Under 16 Blue teams. Playing their first fixture in Division One after last season's title winning Division Two campaign, the Under 13 Blues (pictured below) recorded a convincing 4-1 triumph at home against FC Chippenham Youth Panthers.



They never looked in any danger, a stunning first half performance having put them 3-0 in front at the break. Scoring for Bassett were Liam Lye-Owens, Sonny Parmaku and William Smith. The Under 16 Blues' opening day Division One victory was a much tighter affair, but Samuel Bounds' first half brace proved enough to see off FC Calne Youth Black by the odd goal in three.

The Under 18s will be quickly looking to bounce back after a 6-2 reverse at the hands of Highworth Town Juniors J. Finley Smith was Bassett's scorer in their heavy loss. This defeat coming just a couple of days after the Under 18s had gone out of the FA Youth Cup at the first attempt, losing 3-1 to Paulton Rovers at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. U18 Floodlit League & County Youth Cup Draw

The Under 18s commenced their fixtures in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League U18 Floodlit Division on Thursday night with a trip to Melksham Town and the result from that game will be included in the next programme. In the Wiltshire FA County Youth Cup First Round the U18s have been given a really tough draw with an away trip to Chippenham Town Academy, with the game scheduled for this coming Sunday. As to why Chippenham are in the competition when they do not appear to have an U18 side playing in a Wiltshire or other County FA Sanctioned League, as required by the competition rules, is a good question. The draw on the Wilts FA website is a bit of a giveaway that something is not quite right when it says we are playing Chippenham Town U23 in an U18 competition!

Hellenic Premier Division 21-22

Longlevens made club history on Saturday by reaching the Second Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup for the first time beating Alresford Town from the Wessex League. James Sunley put them ahead on 13 minutes and the prolific Brad Martin added a second four minutes before the break. The visitors pulled one back in the 65th minute but Longlevens held out to secure the 2-1 win and their reward is a plum home tie against near neighbours Gloucester City from the National League. The other Uhlsport Hellenic League side through to the Second Qualifying Round are Bishops Cleeve who won 3-2 away at Southern League side Kidlington, all three Cleeve goals coming in the final 20 minutes through Elliot Kennedy, Jack Watts and Leroy Odiero.

Whilst the two goals from Alan Griffin ensured Bassett were 2-0 home winners over Thornbury Town, in the other Premier Division games that were played, early season leaders extended their lead at the top of the table with a 5-1 win away at Hereford Lads Club thanks to goals from Jacob Hodgson, Steve Murray, George Kellow, Lewis Hedges and Gerlando Parrinello, Levi Ellis replying for Hereford. Hereford also had Jordan Cuthbertson sent off. Under pressure Chipping Sodbury Town manager saw his side lose to a late winner from Brennan Denness-Barrett. Lewis Bainbridge had given Tuffley the lead but goals from Kye Simpson and Aysa Corrick had put Chipping Sodbury in front. Aaron Basford equalised for Tuffley and then that late goal, a minute from time secured a first win of the season for Tuffley. Former Bassett manager Roberts desperately do with a unfortunately his next opponents are Malvern Town who are currently unbeaten in the league. Their latest win was a 3-0 home success over Lydney Town, Nathan Chown-Higgs, Harry Clark and Lewis Platt with their goals. Westfield's home game against Bradford Town was called off after Bradford Town informed the league that there were Covid concerns within their squad.

In midweek on Tuesday night, Shrivenham caused a surprise by winning 2-1 away at Westbury United. Sam Jordan pulled a goal back for Westbury before the break but a combination of some determined defensive play and some good fortune Shrivenham held out for the win.

On Wednesday night whilst we were losing narrowly away at Brimscombe & Thrupp, Calne Town and Tuffley Rovers met at Bremhill View. Tuffley made it two wins on the bounce courtesy of a 2-1 score line. Brennan Denness-Barrett and Lewis Bainbridge once again on target for Tuffley.

Opponents History

The club was founded in 1924originally played its home Waterer's Park, Knaphill. They became members of the Surrey Intermediate League, winning the league title in Season 1935-36. However, by the 1970s the club were playing in the Woking & District League. They won the Woking league's Charity Cup in 1972-73 and went on to win the Premier Division, League Cup and Charity Cup treble in Season 1978–79. The club were Premier Division runners-up the following season, but retained the League Cup and Charity Cup, as well as winning the Challenge Cup.

Knaphill subsequently returned to the Surrey County Intermediate League (Western), joining Division Three. They were Division Three champions in their first season back in the league in Season 1980-81, earning promotion to Division Two. In 1981–82 the club were runners-up in Division Two, securing a third successive promotion. The following season saw them finish as runners-up in Division One

In 2005-06 Knaphill won Division One of the and were promoted to the Premier Division. They following that up with another championship winning season becoming Premier Division champions, earning promotion to Division One of the Combined Counties League. Step 6 of the National League System. A third-place finish in Division One in 2013-14 saw the club promoted to the Premier Division where they have remained ever since. In 2017-18 they won the Premier Division Challenge Cup, beating Worcester Park 3-2 in the final.

In 2004 the club moved to their present home of Redding Way, in Brookwood Country Park, Knaphill (pictured right). In addition to the First Team playing in the Premeir Division of the Combined Counties Football League the club also has an U23s side who compete in the Suburban League.



Knaphill are a FA Charter Standard Club (re-branded by the FA as "Accredited" this season). Accomplished on the field and professionally organised behind the scenes, the club are rightly proud of their highlyregarded set-up and football achievements down the years. The club's ambition is to compete successfully at the highest levels of the amateur game which is underpinned by a young and exciting squad, a talented and hard-working staff and the ceaseless efforts ofthe club's management committee through whose vision and dedicated service the club are constantly striving to improve every aspect of the club's operations.

While there is much that is contemporary and progressive about the club's set-up, the fiercely competitive spirit on the pitch and the warm and friendly welcome extended to all in the Knaphill ground are traditions which have been down fromgeneration generation through the best and worst of times since the club's earliest beginnings in 1924. Today, the club are proud to carry on these traditions.

Towards the end of the 2010/11 season the new floodlights and seated stand were installed which enabled Knaphill to continue in the Combined Counties League and to compete in the FA Cup, FA Vase, Surrey Senior Cup and FA Youth Cup.

The club have continued to develop the ground and have added a further 50 seater stand as well as additional covered standing areas. A small village club on the outskirts of Woking, Knaphill continue to grow from strength to strength.


Jack Williamson - Forward

Another quick and tricky striker in the Knaphill forward line. Scored the late equaliser to earn a useful away point at Cobham.



Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club have had just three club secretaries for the 34-year period we have spent in the

Hellenic League and one of those, Paul Harrison, was only secretary for one of those seasons. Rod Carter took over from Paul and held the position for 22 seasons before being succeeded by Ian Thomas who remains in the position to this day and his now in his 11th season in the post.

Whilst he has some way to go to matching Rod's tenure in the post, he has even longer to be doing the job if he wants the record for the longest serving club secretary, Percy Stone having held the position for 34 seasons from 1934-35 to 1967-68 and then again in 1981-82 after both Chris Davis (our Head of Senior Section's father) and Richard Smedley (our President's father) had a short tenure in the post.

Whilst Ian has someway to go to match Rod and Percy's length of service, the role Ian occupies is a much bigger one to that held by previous incumbents. Not only is Ian club secretary for the adults' men's section, he is also club secretary for the Ladies and all our youth teams. In total Ian is doing the secretarial duties for 27 teams and acting as the interface with six different leagues (the Hellenic League, South West Regional Women's League, Senior League. Oxfordshire Veterans' League, North Wilts & District Youth League and Wiltshire Women's League). When Rod was doing the role the secretarial duties resided with a separate Youth Section Secretary.

Just this season alone, at the time of writing these notes, Ian has registered a total of 450 players via the user un-friendly Whole Game System ('WGS') which this season has required additional information to be collected and provide to the FA marketing department. From being sold as technology to make it easier for club secretaries and league officials, currently it is anything but and if Ian seems in a bad mood on match days it is more likely to be the WGS that is the cause rather than the latest Leeds Utd result.

Ian's first dealings with Wootton Bassett Town was not as a club official but as a referee who Rod Carter or Williamson would call in to do the pitch inspection when the pitch at Rylands Way was waterlogged (quite a frequent event if we had any sustained rainfall). With the Hellenic League requiring an inspection by a referee to validate the postponement, with Ian living in Bassett, he was the go-to person to carry out the inspections for a number of years. That then eventually led to Ian getting involved as club secretary when Rod retired.

As well as the secretarial duties Ian will invariably be found on the gate on match days for both the First Team and the Development side and is probably the most important person in the club given the breadth of the role he currently undertakes

First Team Match Report

A 2-0 home triumph against Thornbury Town - Royal Wootton Bassett Town's fourth straight league win - saw Sam Collier's side reach the heady heights of second place in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

The season may still be in its embryonic stages, but the omens are so far proving very good for Bassett, who have now recorded 14 points from their opening seven league fixtures. Indeed, that points haul represents Bassett's best start to a Hellenic Premier campaign after seven matches.

The coming weeks are set to be a big test of Bassett's credentials though. The team's next three league fixtures pit them against sides - Brimscombe and Thrupp, Bishop's Cleeve and Bradford Town - who can all leapfrog Bassett if they win the games in hand which they possess. They then finish September with a visit to Roman Glass St George - who inflicted Bassett's sole league defeat so far.

But having points on the board ahead of such a tough run of games is an ideal position to be in. And the pressure will be on those teams to claim a result that will taken them back above Bassett and give them hope of staying in touch with current pacesetters Cribbs.

Bassett's latest triumph - their second against Thornbury so far this season after a 4-0 victory in the Emirates FA Cup - was a relatively comfortable one.

It was sealed courtesy of Alan Griffin's brace, with the in-form forward netting for the fifth consecutive game.

His first came from the penalty spot six minutes before half time as he coolly tucked the ball away into the bottom left corner, out of reach of Thornbury 'keeper Kurtis Parkin who did manage to guess correctly.

Griffin's second arrived a matter of minutes later. Having rattled the crossbar, he spun and finished decisively to give his side a commanding half time lead that they would not relinquish.

It may still be very early in the season. But a fourth straight win, another clean sheet and a record start all offer reasons for optimism.

The test now is to keep that streak going.



THE COLLEGE ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

THE BEAUTY of watching football is not knowing what's going to happen inside those 90 minutes. Unfortunately, for me, I was on the wrong end of that last weekend.

The National League went crazy with 50 goals flying in across 11 games. There were three 4-3s, two 3-2s, three 2-2s and a 3-3. There were comebacks galore, red cards, own-goals and more big attendances. The start of the National League season really has delivered a strong advert for Non-League football. However, on the same day in the division, there was also one 0-0, between Boreham Wood and Stockport County, which myself and 782 others attended. Groundhoppers especially will have had a moment like this, watching a drab stalemate as wild scores from around the country filter through. 'Why did I pick this game?". It could even be happening right now as you read this! Sods law!

There was a spell last season when, in consecutive weeks, the games I went to finished: 1-0, 0-0, 0-0, 1-1, 1-0, 0-1, 1-0 before Hartlepool United ended my torrid run with a 7-2 victory at Wealdstone. I'd put in the hard vards. I can't complain too much, though. A month or so later, I was at Ashton Gate, watching Torquay United goalkeeper Lucas Covolan score a 95th minute equaliser against, coincidently, Hartlepool in the National League play-off final. It's cliché but it was truly an unbelievable moment. My brain couldn't process what my eyes had just seen. It was the first time I'd attended a game in which a goalkeeper had scored and it made the arduous fixtures gone before worthwhile. For every goalkeeper scoring a goal, there's several dozen 0-0s waiting around the corner! Besides, if we knew how every game would finish, who would score

and in what way, then football wouldn't have made it this far. It's part of being a supporter too, each season different to the next, although usually with hopes of success often dashed as early as Christmas.

Football happiness is rare and short-lived. Here on Saturday, gone by Tuesday. Another fixture ready and waiting to deliver a dose of sporting reality. In a strange way, however, as Boreham Wood and Stockport toiled to a goalless draw, it felt good, it felt normal, as the world continues to heal. NLP reader Neil David wrote in our letters page last week how nice it was to be back in Non-League grounds after attending Mildenhall Town's FA Cup victory over Yaxley.

"The chatter among fans, having a beer watching the game, seeing how much the players are enjoying being back," he said, before delivering the crucial line, "I didn't think I'd miss live football as much I have." And that's exactly how I felt at Boreham Wood despite the outcome. I hope now we have learned not to take things, or football, for granted. Not even the 0-0s.

First Team Match Report

Wednesday 8th September 2021 Brimscombe & Thrupp 2 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Uhlsport Hellenic League

After winning four straight Hellenic League Premier Division games, Royal Wootton Bassett Town saw that streak come to an end as they fell to a narrow 2-1 defeat in an entertaining, yet ultimately frustrating contest away against Brimscombe and Thrupp.

A contest that pitted the teams riding high in second and third in the early stages of the season against one another, the action lived up to its billing.

A trio of early chances from outside the area for Tom Moore, Alan Griffin and Kai Robinson saw the trio fail to trouble the target. But Bassett made the most of their bright start as Tommy Ouldridge's low corner from the left side ran across the face of the six yard box and Macauley Dodson (pictured below) was on hand at the far post to confidently steer a first time shot beyond Gavin Jones and into the roof of the net.



The hosts were soon on terms though as Jack Smith seized upon an underhit pass, breached the Bassett back line and coolly stroked home into the bottom corner.

Bailey Gallagher, an early replacement for Griffin, then fired low into the hands of Jones after a short corner routine as Bassett strived to restore their advantage. However, it was Brimscombe who would move ahead. doing so in somewhat contentious circumstances as the hosts were awarded a penalty despite referee Roger Smith initially waving their appeals away. The intervention of Smith's assistant then led to a change of heart and to Smith pointing to the spot. In fairness, the referee should never have been in a position to have to make a decision. Rather than clearing his lines, Moore was guilty of dwelling on the ball inside his own area and Brimscombe forward Harlie Price caught him out. Snatching possession from an unaware Moore, the forward received a tap on the ankle that sent him tumbling. Ollie Pitt was then on hand to dispatch the penalty into the bottom left corner, beyond the reach of Eddie Cavanagh. That ultimately proved to be the winner, although the second half was not without intrigue.

After the restart Brimscombe had the better of play. Pitt fizzed a low cross from the left side across the face of goal that needed just a touch to guide it in.

Bassett still were firmly in the game though and after good hold up play from Gallagher, Dave Bampton's 20 yard drive brought Jones into action, the Brimscombe 'keeper needing both fists to guide the midfielder's effort over the bar.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies may be entering their third season in the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division. However, given the cancellation of their two previous campaigns as a result of the pandemic, it's safe to say that it's a division to which the team still aren't fully acclimatised.

And that's arguably even more the case heading into the 2021-22 season.

Of the ten sides they will come up against, Bassett have only ever met six in competitive action — with the most games Bassett have played against a single opponent being the four contests they have had against Ilminster Town.

Added to that, Bassett enter the new season yet to play a competitive contest under manager Graham Fletcher – appointed back in November. Meanwhile, the summer has seen their squad receive an injection of youth, with a number of players set to make their first steps in senior football.

Setting clear expectations for this season is therefore difficult to do. Nonetheless, Fletcher and his side will hope to be competitive.

A large proportion of last season's squad has been retained, although there have been some losses. Grace Eagles — who starred in the numerous friendly games played last season — and Beth Kelloway have departed to play higher level football with Swindon Town. Goalkeeper Abi Footner has joined Larkhall Athletic. Meanwhile, forward Lani Dickinson and midfielder Lois Beer are both studying in America.

But the backbone of the side remains familiar, with stalwarts Laura Jefferies, Amber Egerton, Holly Baker, Lisa Coe, Maddy Elliott, Hannah Gulliver, Hayley Huckin and Aly Lyons all staying with Bassett. Experienced shotstopper Sam Wood has also put pen to paper, returning to the club from Highworth Town.

At the back, in 'keeper Alice Farnell and defenders Mollie Smith, Lara Wilson and Rosie Kirk, Bassett also have a quartet of promising young players boasting experience at this level, with cultured midfielder Emma Sykes (pictured below) re-signing as well.



Added to that has been further young blood – and it is extremely pleasing to see a number of players who have progressed through the club's youth section set to take the step into senior women's football in this coming campaign.

Energetic forward Poppy Wannell has already shown what she is capable of with two goals in pre-season. Ellie O'Nions is a midfielder with a great left foot who first saw action in friendlies at the end of 2020-21 and, with the right coaching, has the ability to make the step up. Also coming through the club's youth ranks alongside them are forward Jorja Halden and defender Rakhi Patel.

They are joined by two further quality players who have most recently gained experience playing in the Wiltshire County Women's League. Striker Libby Davies, who scored six times on loan at Melksham Town last season, is an adventurous attacker who will be looking to cement a place as a Bassett regular. Olivia Owenson, a player who is confident in either defence or attack, joins from Ashton Keynes and will be aiming to do likewise.

It is hoped that the blend of youth and experience will be the right one for Bassett. There may be some growing pains. But there's bound to be plenty to celebrate throughout the season as well.




