Welcome To Tonight's Game

Good evening and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for our first home game of the 2021-22 Season. After two league seasons that have now been curtailed, fingers crossed that the current season will go the full duration. Hopefully lessons have been learned and the league will organise things so at least there can be a league champion crowned, even if there is once again some form of interruption. Unfortunately, looking at the first draft fixtures it seems little thought may initially have been given to this as once again there are too many 'double-headers' early on which will not fit well with the FA's contingency planning for Covid (see Non-League Paper article in tonight's programme for more detail). Whilst restrictions have been lifted by the Government I hope everyone involved in grass roots football is sensible and does all they can to optimise the chances of having an uninterrupted 2021-22 Season.

A warm welcome to the management, players, committee members and spectators from our visitors Roman Glass St George, the oldest club in Bristol, who have made the journey along the M4 for this Uhlsport Hellenic League fixture. We hope they enjoy their short stay with us this evening and wish them a safe journey home after the game. Today's game will be the first ever meeting between the two clubs after Roman Glass St George were transferred across from the Western League. With the Western league not running any sort of cup competition at the end of last season it will be hard to judge current form but Roman Glass St George were going well at the time their league season was curtailed with 7 wins from their 12 league fixtures, drew their opening league fixture and like ourselves also won in the FA Cup on Saturday.

The cup competition run by the Uhlsport Hellenic League at the end of last season was a success, even though it had to be played behind closed doors for much of the competition. I am sure all the players were glad of the opportunity to play the game they love after such a long break and the Hellenic League Committee should be congratulated for offering the opportunity to play competitive games again when other Step 5/6 leagues, such as the Western League, did not. Like with the FA Cup and FA Vase, we had a reasonably successful competition, reaching the semi-final having progressed from a group that had included Brimscombe & Thrupp. We then defeated Clanfield 85 and Bourton Rovers to reach the

semi-final where we met Kidlington Res, although it was not really their reserve side as they played most of their Southern League side in the competition. That said, we can't really moan about it too much as Sam also took the opportunity to bring in players from the Southern League and higher to bolster our side. We lost a tight semi-final 2-1 but it was a good performance and on another day with a bit more luck we would have won. The match report from the semi-final is included in today's programme.

Well it is all change this year in the Hellenic League Premier Division following the FA's restructuring of the National League System with the Hellenic moving westwards. Just 8 of our scheduled league opponents from last season remain in the Hellenic Premier this season. More details of the changes for this season are included on the 'Hellenic Premier' page of tonight's programme.

Our league season got underway last Tuesday with a hard fought point away at Bishops Cleeve. It was a very good performance against one of the fancied sides and we led 2-0 at half time. Unfortunately Bishops Cleeve came out second half and got themselves back on level terms. They had the better of the half but we had some guilt edge chances to have extended our lead before they got their goals. We then did well to hold on and come away with a point from a ground that historically has not been a happy place for us. After a good start to the league season we then once again put in an excellent FA Cup appearance to defeat Thornbury Town 4-0 to progress to the Preliminary Round of the UK's most prestigious cup competition, where we will meet familiar opponent's Ardley United who now ply their trade in the Spartan South Midlands League. Hopefully Sam and the lads can continue their good start to the season here tonight.

A big thank you to Ben Gould and his team at Interprint for stepping in and agreeing to become our new programme printer after a change of business strategy meant Cats were no longer able to print our programme after 20 years of superb service. I look forward to a similar successful partnership going forward with Interprint, who incidentally are the company that produced our excellent "History Wall" in the clubhouse. Enjoy the game and hopefully a first home game league win for Sam and the lads.

Dave Thomas Appointed a Life Member

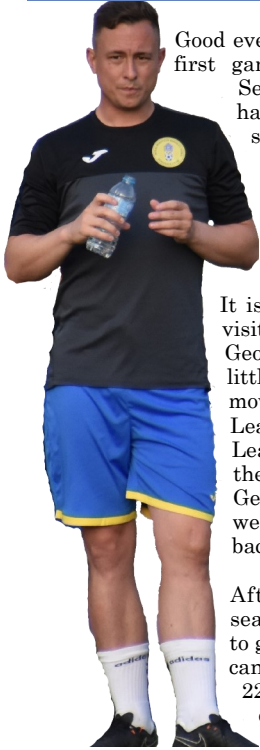
Congratulations to Dave Thomas, who was appointed as a Life Member at the Royal Wootton Bassett Town Annual General Meeting.

Good evening and welcome to our first game of the new 2021-22 Season. I hope all of you have had an enjoyable summer break and managed to get some sun from your staycation or you were one of the lucky ones, from a holiday abroad.

It is a warm welcome to our visitors Roman Glass St George, a side we know very little about, as they have moved across to the Hellenic League from the Western League. We hope they enjoy their first visit to the Gerard Buxton Ground and we wish them a safe journey back down the M4.

After two interrupted seasons we are really keen to get on with it and hope we can have a Covid free 2021-22 Season. Last season we did really well in the cups, matching the clubs best ever runs in both

the FA Cup and the FA Vase. In the FA Cup we gave Oxford City from National League South a really tough game and given how well they then did in the competition it reflects on how good we had been on that day in front of an excellent crowd. Hopefully, some of those that came to the Oxford City game for the first time will return this season now that crowds are once again permitted into grounds. The atmosphere at that game was fantastic and definitely helped the players up their game to be competitive with a team that played three levels above us in the National League System.

With some cracking Wiltshire derbies this season against the likes of Calne Town, Corsham Town and Bradford Town there should be plenty of games to entertain the fans.

Whilst we had done well in both the two FA competitions last season we never really got going in the league, with a couple of poor performances at home to Reading City and away at Easington Sports. Our league position when the league season came to a early end was a

very false one in my opinion and was not a reflection of the quality of the side we had put together. This was highlighted when we did well in the Bluefin Insurance Cup competition run by the league, progressing from our mini-group and making it to the semi-final.

Bully, Tom and I are determined to have a better start in the league competitions this season whilst again looking to have extended runs in both the FA Cup and the FA Vase. Most of the key players have been retained and we have added both experience and quality to the squad in the shape of Alan Griffin, Michael Miller and Macauley Dodson. It is also great to have Tommy Ouldrige back. Youngsters Bailey Gallagher and Tom Moore have both done well in pre-season and in our opening two games and both look like they are going to be key players this season.

We opened the season with a tough game against Bishops Cleeve and put in an excellent performance. We drew 2-2 in the end having been 2-0 up and had a few glorious chances to have extended the lead before they got their goals. Then last Saturday we had what looked to be a tough looking trip to Thornbury Town in the FA Cup. Thornbury Town are also in the Hellenic Prem this season after being promoted as part of the FA's restructuring. They lost just once in the league last season, that defeat coming in their final game before lockdown against Stonehouse Town. On Saturday we were quick out of the traps quickly building up a 3-0 lead after which the result was never in doubt and we added a fourth at the end. We will now play Ardley United in the next round a week on Saturday. In the other national cup competition, the FA Vase, we have drawn Woking based side Knaphill in the First Qualifying Road.

The games are certainly going to come quickly at the start of the season with our next opponents on Saturday being Jeff Roberts Chipping Sodbury Town before a trip across the Severn Bridge to play Lydney Town.

Enjoy the game and hopefully see you in the bar for an enjoyable drink celebrating an opening home game league win.

Hellenic Premier Division 21-22

The constitution for the 2021-22 Hellenic League Premier Division season sees a significant change in opponents Bassett will face this season - as well as in years to come – as a result of the FA implementing its previously postponed restructure of steps four to six of the National League System. This includes the creation of additional divisions at steps four and five, resulting in a large number of promotions. Bassett were not eligible to move upwards and will remain within the Hellenic League Premier Division.

The full provisional constitution for the 2021-22 Hellenic League Premier Division, featuring 22 sides, is as follows: Bishop's Cleeve, Bradford Town, Brimscombe and Thrupp, Calne Town, Chipping Sodbury Town, Corsham Town, Cribbs, Fairford Town, Hallen, Hereford Lads Club, Longlevens, Lydney Town, Malvern Town, Roman Glass St. George, Royal Wootton Bassett Town, Shrivenham, Thornbury Town, Tuffley Rovers, Westbury United and Westfields.

A breakdown of changes taking place is below:

Teams remaining in the Hellenic League Premier Division

Remaining as opponents will be eight teams. These are local rivals Fairford Town and Shrivenham, the contingent of sides from Gloucestershire – Bishop's Cleeve Brimscombe and Thrupp, Longlevens, Lydney Town and Tuffley Rovers – and Herefordshire-based Westfields.

Changes: teams moving into the Hellenic League Premier Division

Three sides – Hereford Lads Club, Malvern Town and Thornbury Town – will be elevated to the Hellenic League Premier Division having finished with the best points-per-game record in Division One West across the curtailed 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons. Bassett will be facing all three of these sides in league action for the first time in the club's history. They have met both Hereford Lads Club and Malvern once in cup competition, with both games occurring in the 2019-20 season. Bassett lost 3-1 at home to the former in the Hellenic League Challenge Cup and by the same score to the latter in the Floodlit Cup.

Moving into the division alongside them are eight sides who previously plied their trade in the Western League. Among those, four are Wiltshire-based sides, meaning Bassett will be involved in plenty of derby action next season. Bradford Town and Westbury United both move across from the

Western League Premier Division. Meanwhile, Calne Town and Corsham Town have been elevated to step five having finished in the top three of Western League Division One on a points-per-game basis.

While Bassett have faced that quartet of sides across various cup competitions in recent seasons, it will be the first time in decades that they have been in the same league as Calne, Corsham and Westbury. Bassett last faced Calne and Corsham in the Wiltshire County League Division One in 1987-88 and Westbury in Wiltshire County League Division Two in 1980-81. Meanwhile, never have Bassett's first team been in the same division as Bradford Town.

Also arriving from the Western League are Chipping Sodbury Town, Cribbs, Hallen and Roman Glass St George. Cribbs and Roman Glass St George represent new opponents. Bassett have one competitive meeting in their history against Chipping Sodbury – a win on penalties in the FA Cup Extra Preliminary round last season. Meanwhile, Bassett spent four seasons from 1993-94 to 1996-97 in Hellenic League Division One alongside Hallen. Eight games between the sides saw Bassett unable to record a victory, with five draws and three defeats.

Changes: teams moving out of the Hellenic League Premier Division

As evidenced from the teams outlined above, the Hellenic League's boundaries have been shifted westwards. Indeed, Shrivenham are the only remaining side from either Berkshire or Buckinghamshire who will remain in the division.

From a sporting perspective, Bassett might be relieved that is the case. In league encounters, Bassett have always found the going tough against the likes of Binfield, Flackwell Heath and Reading City. In limited meetings, Bassett have losing records against Windsor, Virginia Water and Burnham too. And, of the Berkshire and Buckinghamshire contingent moving out of the Hellenic family, only against Holmer Green do Bassett have a winning record. Nevertheless, these teams will certainly be missed. Though the Buckinghamshire- and Berkshire-based teams are all relatively new opponents, they have proven to be excellent hosts whenever Bassett have visited and are examples of how clubs at this level should be run. They are sure to be a credit to the leagues they join and we wish them all the best for the future.

Opponents History

The football club we know today as Roman Glass St George has its roots in St George Cricket Club, founded in 1868 around the now demolished St George Parish Church. They quickly moved to the sports ground now known as Bell Hill just off Whiteway Road in St George. Like many cricket clubs of the era, St George set up an association football team to keep players fit over the winter months. An inter-club match was played on Saturday 21st of October 1882 which is taken to be the founding date of St George FC.

What we believe to be the first association football match between two clubs in Bristol took place on the 2nd of December 1882. It finished St George 2 Warmley 0 at a ground 'just below' the Lord Rodney public house at Two Mile Hill, this was the football club's ground until 1894. The return match at Warmley was played on the 10th of January 1883 and our local rivals exacted revenge with a 2-1 victory. For a while Warmley were the only other club in the area and many a friendly was played between the two clubs.

Eventually the club began acquiring more and more players and in 1885 were able to issue a full fixture list including matches against Swindon Town, Street, Warmley, Clifton and Eastville Rovers amongst others. The game was beginning to get more popular around the City and this was when organised football really began in Bristol, albeit with no formalised league.

On the 7th of September 1886 the Gloucestershire Football Association was established with St George a founding member along with Eastville Rovers, Clifton and Warmley. The GFA's first president was the famous cricketer Dr W G Grace who also played football for Wanderers FC. In 1887 it was decided that the cricket club and football club should amalgamate. An arrangement that stood until the football club turned professional in 1896.

The club were among the founder members of the original Bristol & District League (since 1895 known as the Western League) in 1892, playing in that league with the exception of 1899-1901 until 1903. During that period, the team also played in the Birmingham & District League and won the Gloucestershire FA Senior Challenge Cup on two occasions 1894 and 1895.

After dropping back to local football, they did not re-appear in the Western League until 1928, for a seven-season period in Division Two, when they only finished in the top half of the table once. After finishing bottom in 1934-35, they once again left the Western League for the Bristol and District League. They won the first division in 1949-50 and became founder members of the Bristol Premier Combination in 1957.

During the 1960s, the club while playing in the Bristol Premier Combination, won the Division One title five seasons in a row from 1963-68. In 1968, the Gloucestershire County League was formed, with St George among the founder members. They were runners-up in the first season, winning the title in 1969-70 and finished as runners-up again in 1972-73. Despite staying in the league for a further fourteen seasons (including three when known as Immediate Bristol St George), they did not finish in the top two again until being expelled from the league in 1987 due to sub-standard facilities. The club played in the County of Avon Premier Combination, winning Division One in 1988-90, finishing as Premier Division runners-up on 1990-91 and eventually won the Premier Division two years later. However, despite winning the Premier Division the club was not promoted and over the next few seasons were in danger of folding.

In 1995 St George amalgamated with local side Roman Glass, forming Roman Glass St George F.C. Roman Glass originated as a street team called Wyndham Wanderers in 1960 and played in the Bristol Church of England League until joining the Bristol and District League in 1974. The club enjoyed moderate success gradually climbing the leagues and in 1980 changed its name to Roman Glass. The club began to decline until in 1990 they won the Division 4 title and then gaining successive promotions until the amalgamation with Bristol St George.

The amalgamation enjoyed instant success with the club achieving promotion back to the Premier Division in the 1995-96 season. They then joined the Gloucestershire County League in 1999, and within three seasons had won that league as well. Another County League triumph in 2006-07 earned them a further promotion to the Western League Division One for 2007-08, where in their first season, the club finished safely in mid-table. They remained in Division One for 11 seasons and during that time the club moved to their current ground, the home of the Gloucestershire FA, for the 2011-12 season, leaving their old ground on Whiteway Road. A successful 2017-18 Season, which saw them finish as runners-up behind Westbury United, resulted in them being promoted to the Premier Division of the Western League. The first season saw them struggle to adapt to the higher level but they avoided relegation, finishing in 17th place. The two subsequent seasons, both of which were curtailed due to Covid, saw them achieve top half positions by the time the two seasons were brought to a premature end as Roman Glass St George established themselves as a Premier Division side. They were moved across to the Hellenic League in the summer as part of the FA's reorganisation of the National League System.

Pre-Season Round-up

While finding the going tough when facing higher level opposition as they prepare for the 2021-22 Hellenic League Premier Division season, Royal Wootton Bassett Town have recorded impressive wins during their pre-season campaign.

Sam Collier's side opened with a heavy 7-1 defeat away against Swindon Supermarine. In a hastily arranged fixture, Bassett were without a number of players, a factor that clear contributed to the scale of their defeat. Caine Bradbury scored a first half consolation with his side already 3-0 down after goals from Conor McDonagh, David Pratt and Jack Stanley. Two goals from Pablo Haysham a further strike from Zack Kotwica and an own goal then completed the rout.

Bassett bounced back though, recording an impressive 3-0 win against Wessex League outfit Downton as Bailey Gallagher, Alan Griffin and Tom Moore were all on target.

There then followed a 6-3 triumph against the Development team. TJ Bohane netted a

hat trick with Gallagher, Gabi Fernandes and Tommy Ouldrige also scoring. Replying for the Development team were Tom Warren (2) and Matt Bennett.

In their penultimate fixture Bassett hosted Combined Counties League Premier Division North Tadley Calleva. And another solid performance yielded a 2-1 win. After a goalless opening period, Gio Wrona and Dave Bampton rounded off flowing moves with neat finishes. While Jordan Goater pulled one back with a fine free kick, Collier's side saw out the win.

In their final friendly Bassett gave a good account of themselves in a 3-2 defeat against Southern League North Leigh. Callum Crook's stunning free kick gave the visitors the lead before Chris Taylor rounded off a slick move involving Tommy Ouldrige and Alan Griffin to equalise. Roger James and Jenson Wright struck further goals for the visitors. Tom Moore then scored with an outstanding strike to pull one back for Bassett.

Not only were both ever-present last season, but both stood with their consistently excellent

Centre back Ockwell, whose three goals in the 24 matches he played all came in Bassett's record-matching FA Cup run, claimed both the Manager's and Players' Player of the Year prizes.

Ellis, meanwhile, claimed the Supporters' Player of the Year prize courtesy of a number of stellar performances in goal - none more so than in Bassett's penalty shootout FA Cup



wins against Chipping Sodbury Town and Cinderford Town.

Head of Senior Section Report



As presented at the Club AGM on 22nd July 2021

Another very strange year!!! The season for both First and Development Teams kicked off in August as normal, fixtures continued through to December when the second

lockdown kicked in and fixtures were once again suspended. A decision was then undertaken by both Hellenic and Wiltshire Leagues to void the seasons once again.

Off the pitch Sam and Matt added Tom Jones to their coaching staff which had an immediate impact on training and the way the teams were set up on match days.

The First Team started the season with two FA Cup matches overcoming Chipping Sodbury and Didcot Town, both with very impressive performances and with a huge level of support. The next game in the FA Cup was away to Cinderford Town and again a well supported team went on to win 6-5 in a penalty shoot out. We then met Oxford City, from who finished third in their league, 3 leagues above us in the pyramid. We pushed them all the way but lost out to a very late goal and equalled the best ever run in the FA Cup. We also achieved a really good run in the FA Vase progressing to the 2nd Round where we were very unlucky to lose to a good Bridgewater side.

The form didn't continue into the league unfortunately and due to the number of cup games/postponements we only completed 8 games, winning 1 and drawing 4. We were positioned 15th when the league was voided.

The Development Team assembled a very strong squad last season and expectations were set for a good finishing position in the Wiltshire Senior League. The management team was also strengthened with the addition of Mark Simpkins as coach and again this had an immediate impact on the team. Hard fought wins over Wroughton and Corsham were two of the standout fixtures from the season but the overall effort and team spirit within this team was a real credit. The Development team were on or around the top of the league all season and if the season had not been curtailed we would have finished in the top 2 positions.

Once the lockdown restrictions were eased, both leagues offered mini cup competitions to enable clubs to get back to football, we entered the Hellenic but declined the Wiltshire League competition. We lost in the semi final of the Hellenic competition to a strong Kidlington side but the cup gave the lads some much needed football at the end of this strange season.

Moving on to next season, we have the same management teams in place, they have assembled good squads, pre season training is going well and we are setting objectives for both teams on what we want to achieve. We are looking to integrate more players from the U18 teams into the senior teams and also see more progression between the Development and First teams.

Finally, a huge thank you to the committee, the volunteers and the supporters from getting us through last season. The players and management teams appreciate all that you do to enable them to play football at this amazing facility you continue to provide for them.

Club Volunteers In Focus

Roger moved to Wootton Bassett in June 1978 and joined the club in the July pre-season as a player. Prior to joining Bassett he had played in the West Riding County Amateur League for Bradford Rovers. Previous to that he had a spell as an associated schoolboy with Blackpool who at the time were in the old Division 2 of the Football League, having also had trials for Leeds United and Bradford City. Unfortunately his potential professional career ambitions were ended with a broken ankle at 17 years of age.



Rogers' first season with Wootton Bassett Town saw him made First Team captain in his first season with the club. It was to be a very successful season as the club won promotion to a strong Wiltshire County League after finishing a point behind champions Ferndale Athletic.

As well as his playing career it was not long before Roger was also helping from a committee perspective. The club were looking for a Treasurer and the then Chairman Bob Thomas approached Roger and he was to hold the role for over 25 years.

As well as looking after the precious club funds for a sustained period of time Roger also played an active role in generating funds by being a key helper at the club's main fund raiser at the time which was the weekly bingo nights. The bingo evenings at the Memorial Hall were a key event in the community attracting large audiences with the takings from these events averaging about £100 a week in the early days. Unfortunately, with the Gala bingo opening in Swindon takings declined and in the end the bingo was no longer economic to run.

Whilst still Treasurer Roger also became a key member of the trio of unpaid groundsmen who looked after the notorious playing surface at Rylands Way. Working with Club Secretary Rod Carter and Dave Dodds (when not away on secret missions), Roger would spend Saturday mornings unwinding from the stresses of business life by helping to prepare a decent surface as possible for the players to play on.

Roger was also the club's programme editor in the early years when the club progressed to the Hellenic League and was required to prepare a match day programme.

Having moved to the new ground Roger continues to be heavily involved in the role of kit manager for the Senior Section, a role very much appreciated by the players from the First Team, Ladies Team and Under 18 team. This involves looking after all the playing kit, washing the kit after games and making sure it is put out for the players on match days. Roger was made a Life Member in 2008, both he and Rod Carter being the first to join Mick Woolford with that honour. His daughter Kara is also heavily involved in the club being in charge of the medical section of the club as the Club Therapist.

You will not find anyone who cares so much about this club as Roger Williamson who has now clocked up an impressive 44 years as a volunteer helping out at what is now Royal Wootton Bassett Town football club.

The previous 18 months in Non-League has been tough to say the least for all involved. The 2019-20 and the 2020-21 seasons proved fruitless for many although the FA's restructure did at least provide some upward movement for clubs at Steps 4-6.

It's why the FA's Alliance Committee has been formulating contingency plans, with the feedback of clubs, to try and prevent any more 'null and void' seasons.

There are three approaches to the contingency plans:

Approach 1 – if the season successfully starts between August 14, 2021 and October 31, 2021, but it becomes clear that a division cannot complete 100 per cent of its fixtures, league tables would still be finalised providing the division has completed at least 75 per cent of its fixtures. Final league standings would be determined by using unweighted points per game and promotion and relegation would take place based on those standings.

Approach 2 – if the 2021-22 season cannot commence on or before October 31, an alternate competition would be implemented, with several potential formats under consideration determining promotion and relegation.

Approach 3 – if there is insufficient time for the regular season to achieve 75 per cent of fixtures, or an alternate competition to be completed, a supplementary competition would utilise results from completed fixtures in the 2021-22 season to avoid clubs playing opponents more than twice and ensure there is sufficient data to determine league standings.

The objective is to ensure promotion/relegation but, of course, this cannot be guaranteed. Who knows which way the pandemic will turn next. Such was the extent of the disruption last season, any number of contingency plans wouldn't have prevented the curtailment of Steps 3-6.

Hopefully, these plans will never see the light of day, but at least they are there if needed. Eventually, we will have all stopped talking about Covid! Until then, we wish you a safe return to football and a successful season following your team. One thing is for sure, win or lose, we must cherish standing on the terraces at 3pm on a Saturday!

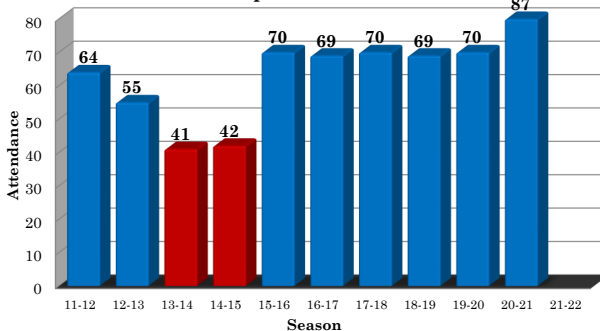

Two goals to the good and with their hosts appearing somewhat rattled, after 45 minutes Royal Wootton Bassett Town appeared on course to make a perfect start to their 2021-22 Hellenic League Premier Division campaign away against Bishop's Cleeve.

In the end though, Sam Collier's side had to settle merely for a very good start to their season as a pair of goals in quick succession at the start of the second half saw the Mitres claw their way back into a helter-skelter game and ultimately claim a point.

In fairness, Bassett were hanging on towards the end as the home side found space in behind the visitors' defence courtesy of their rather direct approach. But, littered with chances throughout a captivating 90 minutes, this was a match that could have gone either way. And Bassett themselves had plenty of reasons to believe they could have been taking three points back to Wiltshire with them.

While having to settle for a solitary point, there were multiple positives that Bassett can take from the match. Bailey Gallagher, Alan Griffin and Tommy Ouldrige made life tough for Bishop's Cleeve's rather exposed back three. Chris Taylor and Dave Bampton offered continuous energy in the heart of midfield. And, despite a handful of nervous moments, Bassett's back four coped well enough with the stern test that the hosts' lively strikeforce posed.

There are aspects that need to be improved as well. Indeed, the first goal Bassett conceded came from that old Achilles' heel – a set piece – while the second stemmed from a poor choice of pass played out from the back that initiated a decisive counter-attack. But with a point on the board from a tough fixture, it's wise to focus more on the positives.

Both sides played with attacking intent from the off. In the opening twenty minutes, they had

created two good chances apiece. Headers from Leroy Odiero and Jack Watts forced Harrison Ellis into early saves, while at the other end Sam Ockwell saw headed narrowly over and Alan Griffin found the side netting.

A mix up between Ockwell and Ellis then generated the best opening of the game so far, but Watts poked wide from an angle before Mark Pritchett's glancing header from a Jake Parrott corner grazed the bar on its way over.

It would be Bassett who ultimately struck first though. And they did so in style. Opening up the home defence, the ball was worked from Ouldrige on the left through Taylor to Gallagher on the right edge of the box. The youngster then proceeded to cut inside Odiero and curl a delicate left foot effort into the far corner with the help of the upright.

The scores were almost immediately levelled though when Watts somehow steered wide from six yards.

But, surviving that scare, the visitors soon doubled their lead. Gallagher was again involved, this time causing problems for Parrott who clumsily strongarmed the midfielder to the floor in the penalty area. There was little doubt it was a penalty, which Griffin confidently swept home, sending Sam Gilder the wrong way.

At this moment, Cleeve were asking questions of themselves, though they almost reduced their arrears just before the interval when Watts looped a header over Ellis only for Ockwell to acrobatically hack clear off the line.

The hosts eventually provided the reaction their deficit demanded with two goals in a five-minute second half spell.

Yet by that point Bassett could well have been out of sight. Five minutes after the restart Bampton steered a ball into the box, which, after Griffin was unable to connect on the turn, fell to a wide open Gio Wrona. However, the midfielder skewed well wide from ten yards out.

Odiero then headed in at the far post from Harrison Reeves' right wing free kick to get Cleeve on the board.

That injected life back into the hosts. But they were fortunate not to find themselves two goals down again. Wrona had two further excellent chances, the first resulting in a shanked effort again from a promising position before he forced



Gilder to save with his feet from an angle.

Where he lacked composure, Reeves did not. At the other end, Ockwell lost possession cheaply, allowing Cleeve to break down the right. With the defence stretched, Blaine Waugh cut a pass across the Bassett box, which Watts dummied, allowing Reeves the time on the ball he needed to confidently pick a way past Ellis.

All square, it was now anybody's game – though it was the hosts who appeared most likely to grab a go ahead goal as the second half progressed. Balls played quickly over the top got the Bassett defence turned, while tired legs meant Collier's side were unable to maintain possession for any meaningful spell at the other end of the pitch. That invited pressure.

Reeves flashed a low ball across the face of goal, which an outstretched Watts narrowly avoided getting on the end of. Substitute Jake Rhodes narrowly headed over from a Reeves corner. Then, with ten minutes left, Watts beat the offside trap and bore down on goal. Seeking to sidestep an onrushing Ellis, a solid glove from the Bassett 'keeper broke the forward's momentum. However, the loose ball dropped for Archie Haskayne, whose precise sidefoot shot appeared goalbound only for Ockwell to get a block that guided it onto the post. Watts' subsequent rebound effort was then deflected over.

Bassett did enough to see out the danger though – and they can certainly feel content enough to get off the mark with a well-earned point.

Man of the Match: Bailey Gallagher – although he tired towards the end, the youngster produced a quality display capped off by his excellent goal and the penalty he earned his side.

Bluefin Insurance Cup Semi Final

A shot at silverware would have been a fitting way for Royal Wootton Bassett Town to finish a season that has delivered much cup success. And after convincing Bluefin Sports Hellenic League Challenge Cup knockout victories against Clanfield and Bourton Rovers that appeared firmly within sight. Alas, it was not meant to be as Sam Collier's side suffered an agonising 2-1 semi-final defeat away against Kidlington Reserves.

In the strangest of years (at least the strangest since the previous one), Bassett had been reduced primarily to cup action. And by virtually all measures they succeeded. Early in the campaign they enjoyed a record equalling run in the FA Cup, which was followed by a similar journey in the FA Vase. While they may have stuttered a bit in the Challenge Cup group stages after lockdown was lifted, Bassett did enough to progress before advancing in emphatic fashion to the final four. But that was to be where their journey – and season – was finally brought to an end.

The outcome of the game against Kidlington ultimately hinged on ten decisive second half minutes. The Division One East hosts - whose side was littered with players from Kidlington's Southern League first team - took the lead on 57 minutes as ex-Bassett sharpshooter Steve Robertson produced a trademark fine, poacher's finish following good set up play from Liam Gilbert. Two minutes later Bassett's task was made tougher as TJ Bohane was dismissed for kicking out after he felt he had been pushed. And Bassett were then almost instantly reduced to nine men - albeit temporarily - as Matt Berry-Hargreaves was sent to the sin bin. His time in the reflection room coincided with Kidlington doubling their advantage as an unfortunate Jon Beeden headed into his own net.

At 2-0 down Bassett's task seemed impossible. But the visitors grabbed a lifeline when, still with just nine men on the field, George Smith burst into the box and earned a penalty. The midfielder duly dusted himself down and made

no mistake from the spot to halve the deficit his side faced. With that offering hope, Bassett desperately pressed on in the game's closing stages. Kidlington – with their full complement of players – were forced into a rear-guard action. They managed to weather the pressure they were put under though, Zac Skinner coming closest for Bassett in the final ten minutes of an eventful second half.

It had been an eventful contest throughout. Even though the first half finished goalless, it was not without incident and offered a preview of the twists and turns that were to come following the restart. Early on, Sam Ockwell placed a free kick narrowly over after Bohane had drawn a foul on the edge of the box. Robertson then went close at the other end before Ralph Graham fed a neat pass through to Smith in a favourable position, but the midfielder's powerful shot went way wide of the Kidlington goal.

Bassett then came the closest they had got so far in the game as Beeden rose to meet a free kick and saw his header graze the bar.

Midway through the half the hosts thought they had gone ahead when a cross was whipped into the box and, after eluding those waiting to get on the end of it, appeared to have crossed the line. 'Keeper Harrison Ellis hacked clear though and neither official indicated that a goal had in fact been scored.

Ellis was soon forced into a couple of good saves, while at the other end Smith forced a stop from home custodian Christian Lawrence after being played in by Bohane.

There was more action in the opening stages of the second half. Smith unlocked the Kidlington defence, creating a one-on-one opportunity for Bohane, whose shot was blocked by a great Lawrence save. Meanwhile, a slip from defender Adam Corcoran fashioned what seemed a simple chance for the hosts, but which was wasted.

The deadlock would eventually be broken though – and for Bassett it would usher in a pivotal ten minute period that ultimately spelled the end of their season. It was a fine semi-final effort from Collier's side. But in the end, it was a case of so near, yet so far. Time now to regroup as the 2021 -22 season fast approaches. Here's hoping for some more cup success – and a welcome return to a full slate of league action too.

After last season's Emirates FA Cup heroics, Royal Wootton Bassett Town had the taste for more success in the oldest knockout competition of them all. And, in its 150th edition, Sam Collier's side made certain of at least one victory with a thumping 4-0 triumph away against Thornbury Town.

With Thornbury playing their first ever home fixture in the competition, Bassett made it an afternoon their hosts would rather forget.

A rampant first half performance saw the visitors stake out a 3-0 lead after 25 minutes. And it was smooth sailing from there onwards, with a final goal late in the match time meaning Bassett matched their biggest margin of victory in the FA Cup (the club's only previous win by four goals coming in a 5-1 triumph against Dilton Rovers in the 1946-47 Extra Preliminary round).

Tommy Ouldrige set Bassett on their way after quarter of an hour, scoring with a fine finish with the outside of his left foot from the edge of the area that sailed in over Thornbury 'keeper McKenzie Welsh.

The lead was doubled three minutes later when Gio Wrona whipped in a free kick from the left side and veteran Alan Griffin headed home.

Dave Bampton - another experienced campaigner - then made it 3-0 as he fizzed a low drive from 25 yards into the bottom left corner. Even though the outcome proved more or less beyond doubt at the interval, Thornbury were offered little as they strived to at least grab a consolation goal.

Bassett showed no mercy either. With four minutes remaining, Tom Moore cut in from the left hand side and struck a right-footed shot beyond Welsh to make it 4-0.

With that victory Bassett move onto the Preliminary round where they will host former Hellenic League foes Ardley United, who saw off Ashton and Backwell United 2-0 in their Extra Preliminary tie.

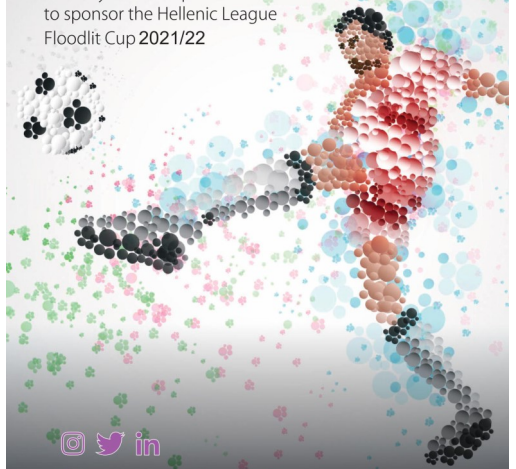
