# **Welcome To Todays Game**

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Hereford Lads Club. We have met on just the one occasion previously, that game coming in the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup back in Season 2019-20, Hereford Lads Club leaving the Gerard Buxton Ground that day with a 3-1 win.

Welcome back to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground to the management, players, committee members and spectators who have travelled from Hereford for this fixture.

Hereford Lads Club have been on something of an upward trajectory for a number of seasons now having progressed through the West Midlands Regional League from Division Two to Division One and then to its Premier Division which previously sat at Step 6 of the Pyramid. Hereford Lads Club were then moved laterally to the Hellenic League ahead of the 2019-20 Season.

Hereford Lads Club are yet to complete a full season in the Hellenic League but have done well in both the two curtailed seasons. In that Season 2019-20 when they beat us in the Bluefin Cup they sat third in the table when the season was brought to a premature end. Similarly in the following season, 2020-21 they were in fourth place in the table when the powers that be were forced to curtail a second consecutive season. This form in these two curtailed seasons was enough for Hereford Lads Club to achieve promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division when the FA undertook their reorganisation of the National League System which saw the Hellenic move westwards.

Well the FA Cup dream is now over for another season and unfortunately we were not able to reproduce last season's fantastic run. In the end we were beaten over two games by a very good Ardley United side who have assembled a strong looking side for their first venture in the Spartan South Midland League after departing the Hellenic as part of the aforementioned FA reorganisation of the National League System. After drawing at the Gerard Buxton last Saturday thanks to a late Gio Wrona goal, we went down 3-1 in the replay on Tuesday night. Brief match reports on both games are include in today's programme.

Whilst a good FA Cup run brings in much needed funds to the club, it is the league programme that should be our main priority. No doubt Sam and the lads will be disappointed to go out of the cup on Tuesday but now is the time to concentrate on getting more points on the board in the league starting with this game against Hereford Lads Club. They sit three places below us in the league table having won one, drawn one and lost two of their opening league games to date. That one win game in midweek against bottom of the table Hallen. The one draw was against a good Brimscombe & Thrupp side and they have so far lost to Malvern and Cribbs. These are the type of games we need to be winning and hopefully we can bounce back from the cup disappointment in midweek.

We are back in action again on Monday when we make the short trip to Shrivenham for an encounter which will see a number of players from both sides in action against their former clubs.

Just a reminder that tomorrow also sees the annual fund raising set of matches against the RAF Veterans'. Normally held at the end of the season this year it is being held over the August Bank Holiday weekend. For more details see elsewhere in today's programme.

Enjoy the game and hopefully for the Bassett fans you will get to see a first home league win of the season.

On Thursday 2 September, Bassett's Under 18s host Paulton Rovers in the FA Youth Cup Preliminary Round with a 7.30pm kick off. This will therefore be the first time we have played in the competition at our new facility.

Our record in the FA Youth Cup is not a great one. # **Hellenic Premier Division 21-22**

It was a bit of grim Preliminary Round in the FA Cup for the Hellenic League Clubs with just two of the ten sides who had made it through to the Preliminary Round stage progressing to the First Qualifying Round. The two sides to progress are league leaders Bishops Cleeve and Longlevens AFC. Cleeve were 2-0 winners against Spartans South Midland side Tring Athletic whilst Longlevens edged a close encounter with Chalfont St Peter from the Isthmian League South Central, 3-2 the score in this one.

Three sides took their ties to replays but all three Hellenic sides went down in those replays in midweek, Bradford Town drew 1 -1 with Wessex Premier side Alton but were easily beaten 3-0 in the replay. Tuffley Rovers met former Hellenic League side Flackwell Heath and the sides shared four goals in the first encounter on Saturday. The replay in midweek saw six goals scored but this time round there was no sharing as Flackwell bit all six to progress to the First Qualifying Round. The other replay involved ourselves after we drew 2-2 here at the Gerard Buxton Ground last Saturday. The replay on Tuesday though saw Ardley progress after their 3-1 win (see elsewhere in programme for the match report on this game).

The other five Hellenic sides all crashed out on Saturday. Westfields pushed Coventry United all the way but went out to a solitary goal to the United Counties South side. Westbury United lost 2-0 at home to Wessex Premeir League side Hamworthy United.

Brimscombe and Thrupp played their game on Sunday and had an afternoon they will want to forget quickly, being hammered 8-0 by Aylesbury United from the Southern League. Corsham Town did not fare much better losing 5-1 at home to Combined Counties Premier South side Fleet Town.

The final Hellenic side in action were Roman Glass St George who found Southern League Division One South side Cirencester Town too strong, Cirencester progressing following a 2-0 win.

One league game was played on Saturday and Fairford Town completed a quickfire double over Jeff Roberts Chipping Sodbury Town, winning 3-2 having beaten them 4-1 at the beginning of the month.

There were four more games on Tuesday night in the league and Bishops Cleeve are now a point clear at the top after a 2-1 win over Roman Glass St George. Just behind them in the table are Cribbs, 3-0 winners over Thornbury Town. Tuesday night saw Corsham edge a close game with Lydney Town, 1-0 the score here, Lydney's cause not being helped by having a man sent off. The other league game saw Hallen lose for the fifth time this season, going down 2-1 at home to today's visitors Hereford Lads Club.

# **Opponents History**



The Hereford Lads Club was founded in 1925 for under privileged boys by Mr J Mackay with the aim of providing Young boys with the means to

become men through sport emphasising gentlemanly conduct and good sportsmanship and originally catered for gymnastics and boxing before developing cricket & junior football teams.

In January 1940 Hereford Lads Club was destroyed by fire and sadly all early records were lost. Thankfully the club was rebuilt on its present site overlooking Widemarsh Common after the land was generously donated by Mr W R Bufton together with donations from many local businessmen. In the 1960's & 1970's Hereford Lads Club blossomed and was attended by as many as 170 young people per night creating a great community spirit.

Today we have a thriving junior football section with boys & girls from u8 up to u17. Our football development centre has boys & girls up to the age of 8. We currently have 24 Boys & girls teams ranging from u9's to u17's in the Herefordshire Junior football League. We also have 3 senior men's teams, the first team Play in the Uhlsport Hellenic Premier Division, the Reserves play in the Premier Division of the Herefordshire Football League & the Colts play in Division 2.

All our managers, coaches & officials are Volunteers who are fully trained & CRB checked. We work hard to provide opportunities for young people to develop their skills in sport.

Our first team joined the West Midland Regional League Division 2 from the Herefordshire Premier League in 2011/12 season, when Manager Danny Moon & his assistant Rich Jones decided to try and push the club up through the football pyramid. That season saw the team finish as runners-up in Division Two and also make the league cup final. The following season they secured a third place finish and this time were promoted to Division One of the West Midlands Regional League.

Thereafter it was a period of steady improvement. They finished in 10th place in their first season in Division One in 2013-14. The following season in 2014-15 they improved achieving a fifth place finish.

That continuous improvement was to carry on as the following season in 2015-16 they finished as runners-up in Division One of the West Midland Regional League. They were to go one better the following season finishing as champions of Division One and achieving promotion to the Premier Division. They also made the final of the Herefordshire County Cup Final but were defeated by Hereford in the final.

Season 2017-18 saw them in the Premier Division for the first time achieving a respectable 12th place finish. They once again made the Herefordshire County Cup Final but again fell at the final hurdle losing heavily to Hereford in the final.

A seventh place finish in Season 2018-19 in the West Midlands Regional League Premier Division saw them moved across to the Hellenic League for Season 2019-20. At the time that season was curtailed they sat in 3rd place in the table.

They were going well again in 2020-21 when that season was also curtailed and were in 4th place. Herefordshire were one of the few counties to complete their County Cup and Hereford Lads club ended their run of defeats in the final by defeating fellow Hellenic side Westfields 4-2 in the final. Those two top four finishes in the two curtailed seasons were also enough to see them promoted to the Hellenic Premier Division.

#### Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup 3rd Round

Royal Wootton Bassett Town fell to a 3-1 Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup third round defeat against Division One West side Hereford Lads Club.

Injuries and unavailability forced Bassett boss Sam Collier into making a number of changes, and he used the occasion to offer first team debuts to promising Under 18 players Morgan Francis and Jed Phillips. While they both showed promise, the former starting and latter coming on a substitute, the game represented a steep learning curve against physical opponents.

Bassett were forced to chase things early on as they fell behind on the quarter hour mark. James Hancocks raced onto a long ball over the top, and after outmuscling Caine Bradbury, he curled a left foot strike into the top corner.

The hosts levelled in style shortly after the restart. Alfie Presley threaded a pass through to TJ Bohane (pictured right) in the left channel and the forward thrashed a stunning, unstoppable drive into the top corner from the edge of the area.

Partiy did not last long though. Bassett failed to clear from a corner and, after the ball was recycled, it fell to Jay Cuthbertson to steer in from close range.

In an evenly matched contest, Bassett thought they had equalised again shortly after. Bohane rose highest at the far post to redirect a Presley corner back across goal and Danny Langford was extremely unlucky to flick a header onto the crossbar from a matter of metres. The hosts then found themselves playing with a man advantage

for the final quarter of an hour as Adam Newbury was dismissed for a lunge on Bohane.

And that almost paid immediate dividends. However, the woodwork came to deny Bassett again as a Bradbury free kick was headed onto the bar by Chris Jackson, with the rebound falling to Dale Richards, whose deflected effort trickled onto the post.

Having survived that let off, the visitors sealed victory. With Bassett committing men forward, a headed clearance left Adam Hockey alone against Callum Wright and the Hereford forward fashioned a yard of space before firing clinically into the bottom corner. The Division One West side therefore advanced.



# THE COLLEGE ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

The FA's restructure at Steps 4-6 this summer solved some problems but not all. Clubs who had performed consistently over the curtailed seasons of 2019-20 and 2020-21 were awarded promotion on points-pergame.

In total, 110 clubs were upwardly moved as a new Northern Premier League Midlands division was formed at Step 4, two new Step 5 divisions administered by the Combined Counties League and the United Counties League and the Step 6 structure reduced to 17 divisions.

But vacancies across Steps 1-4, due to the resignations of clubs over the past two years, still remained although it was never the FA's intention to fill them as part of the restructure. Instead, the vacancies will be filled ahead of the 2022-23 season via reprieves as laid down in the FA rules.

Providing no club goes under or fails its ground grading during this season, this is what should happen:

At Step 2, each champion and play-off winner is promoted (four clubs in total). The bottom clubs in National League North and South will be relegated (two clubs in total). Step 2 is increasing to 24 teams in each league from the 2022-23 season.



AtStep 3. each champion and play-off promoted winner is (eight clubs in total). Of the 16 clubs finishing in relegation positions. seven will be reprieved, comprising the clubs finishing 4th bottom in each Step 3 division plus three of the four clubs that finish 3rd bottom with the best unweighted points-per-game record. The 3rd bottom club with the worst PPG record across the Step, plus all 2nd bottom and bottom placed clubs will be relegated.

At Step 4, each champion and play-off winner is promoted (16 clubs in total). Sixteen Step 5 champion clubs are automatically promoted and replace the bottom and 2nd bottom clubs at Step 4. Nine clubs with the best points-per-game are reprieved due to the vacancies at Steps 1-4 and the number of clubs at Step 2 increasing. This will leave seven Step 4 clubs playing off against seven Step 5 runners-up with the remaining eligible Step 5 clubs promoted.

Although reprieves are usually awarded to clubs with the best PPG records, the FA Alliance Committee has the power to vary that model.

# **First Team Match Report**

#### Tuesday 24th August 2021 Ardley United 3 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round Replay

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's hopes of an extended run in this season's Emirates FA Cup were extinguished as Ardley United triumphed 3-1 in their Preliminary round replay.

The Oxfordshire side were worthy winners across the two games as they set up a First Qualifying round derby visit to near neighbours Banbury United.

Unlike in Saturday's original tie, they took the lead, doing so midway through the opening period courtesy of Anaclet Odhiambo's deft lob over an advancing Eddie Cavanagh.

But Bassett restored parity early after the restart when Alan Griffin powerfully headed home from a Sam Ockwell set piece delivery.

While the visitors may have hoped that the equaliser would have shifted momentum in their favour, it failed to do so. Griffin was quickly needed at the other end, keeping the scores level courtesy of a goalline clearance. And it was not long before Ardley restored their advantage as Odhiambo capitalised on a defensive slip to add his second of the game.






