Welcome To Tonight's Game

Good evening and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Bishops Cleeve.

A special warm welcome to all of the management players, committee members and supporters from Bishops Cleeve who have made the journey from Cheltenham for tonight's league encounter. The two sides met on the opening evening of the season at Bishops Cleeve in a thoroughly entertaining game that saw us go 2-0 to the good thanks to goals from Bailey Gallagher and Alan Griffin, before being pegged back by two second half goals from Cleeve to share the points. It was a game played at a ferocious pace and a high level of intensity and hopefully the two sides can deliver another entertaining fixture here tonight. The two sides did not meet in last season's curtailed season and the last encounter before the game at the beginning of this season was back in Season 2019-20 when we won 3-0 here at the Gerard Buxton Ground. A report from the website on that game is included in tonight's programme.

The two sides have met 32 times in competitive fixtures over the years and it is currently all square with both sides having won eleven times with ten games having been drawn over the years, including that opening game this season. Cleeve were probably the best side we have played so far this season and have lost just once so far, that defeat coming against Malvern Town, all their other eight games in all competitions have been won apart from that game against ourselves and they are still in both the FA Cup and the FA Vase. Their Second Round Qualifying FA Cup tie is this coming Saturday when they travel to Aylesbury United and hopefully they will have their minds on that cup game tonight as we look to take more points off them in the league.

On the subject of the FA Vase we are through to the Second Round Qualifying after our narrow 1-0 win over Knaphill on Saturday. It was a tight game on Saturday with both sides missing their main striker and, whilst there was lots of good football played, the game seemed to lack the intensity of a normal game in this prestigious national competition. Our reward for the victory on Saturday is a trip to Portishead Town from Division One of the Toolstation Western League a week on Saturday.

Before that we have a date with Bradford Town, a side we have traditionally played in pre-season games in recent times but for a change will now be playing them in a competitive league fixture. Bradford usually bring a large travelling support so hopefully we will see a big crowd for this Wiltshire derby.

The Development Teams' thumping 19-0 win over Purton last week did wonders for their goal difference but it was sad to see a one time powerhouse in Wiltshire football struggling so badly. Hopefully Purton will be able to find some new players quickly and stabilise the situation following the departure of Andy Ealey after his short tenure having joined from Marlborough in the summer. The team he had assembled was clearly not strong enough but the situation was not helped by the departure of the previous management team so close to the start of the season. Former Royal Wootton Bassett Town player Frank Hunt. who played a handful of games under Dave Turner, is the man currently tasked with steadying the ship. The Development Team followed that midweek win with excellent 4-1 away win against a decent Corsham Town Development side Saturday and currently have a 100% winning record from the seven games played so far.

Enjoy the game and hopefully three more points for Sam and the boys. It will be difficult though against one of the favourites for promotion this season so make sure there is plenty of noise tonight.

Hellenic Premier Division 21-22

With most of the Premier Division sides involved in FA Vase action there were just two league games in the Premier Division on Saturday, Second placed Brimscombe & Thrupp after their midweek win over Bassett had the chance to move within two points of league leaders Cribbs but had to settle for a point away at Westfields following a 1-1 draw, both sides scoring in the first half. Joe Davies for Westfield and Oliver Barnes for Brimscombe. The win left Brimscombe four points behind Cribbs with a game in hand. Malvern Town are hot on their heels after inflicting more misery on Jeff Roberts and his Chipping Sodbury side, Malvern winning 2-1 thanks to goals from Joe Bates and Adam Saunston to move within a point of Brimscombe with a game in hand.

In the FA Vase Longlevens join Royal Wootton Bassett Town in the next round following a 3-2 home win over fellow Hellenic Premier Division side Fairford Town, Rudi McKinnon, Ethan Dunbar and Joe Steery with the Longlevens goals. An own goal by Tom Bradley set todays' visitors Bishops Cleeve on their way to a 4-1 win over another Hellenic Premier side Thornbury Town, with Eliot Kennedy, Jack Watts and Jake Rhodes scoring the others.

George Box, Jake Brown and Tyson Pollard netted for Bradford Town in their 3-0 home win over Wincanton Town from the Western League.

Whilst the solitary goal from Joe Selman was seeing us into the next round against Knaphill, near neighbours Calne Town were having a bad afternoon going down 4-1 at home to Whitchurch United from Division One of the Wessex League.

Fellow Wiltshire side Westbury United also crashed out losing 4-1 at home to another Wessex League side Alresford Town. Lydney Town were surprisingly beaten by fellow Premier Division side Hallen who dismissed their manager in the week, Hallen winning 5-4 on penalties after it had finished 3-3 at the end of 90 minutes. Hereford Lads Club also lost on penalties against Bewdley Town, this after it had finished 2-2 at the end of normal time, 7-6 the penalty result in Bewdley's favour.

Corsham Town join Royal Wootton Bassett Town in flying the flag for Wiltshire after they secured a narrow 1-0 win away at Folland Sports. No such joy for another Wiltshire club, Division One side Malmesbury Victoria going down 4-2 against Premier Division opponents Tuffley Royers.

League leaders Cribbs progressed to the next round with a 2-1 away win at former Hellenic Premier Division side Reading City.

Roman Glass St George's advantage of having an artificial pitch did not help them on their trip to Woking to play on Sheerwater's 3G pitch just a stones throw from the programme editors back garden, Sheerwater winning 4-1 meaning there is a Woking based side in the competition after we had knocked out Knaphill.

Opponents History

In their long history Bishops Cleeve have led a much more nomadic existence than many clubs, but have now been settled in the impressive Kayte Lane ground since 1997. For many years the club played on a ground in Stoke Road — with facilities rebuilt and reopened in 1971 by the then secretary of the Football Association, Ted Croker. The enforced move to Kayte Lane came about due to the old ground being sold by the landlord

The club enjoyed a brief period of success in the late 60s - gaining promotion from the Cheltenham League and winning Championships in their six seasons in the Glos. Northern Senior League. After dropping back to Cheltenham League, Cleeve promotion into the Hellenic League in 1983, quickly becoming a force in that division, finishing fourth in their first two seasons in Div. One. This great start was followed up with a place finish, then winning Championship and gaining promotion to the Premier Division at the fourth attempt, and winning the 'double' by adding the Glos. Amateur Cup. A fantastic achievement.

The five seasons in the Premier Division proved to be a struggle for the Club, although the team followed up their Cup success by adding another trophy to their collection, winning the Premier Cup at the first attempt. The return to Division One proved the catalyst for a period of rebuilding, on and off the pitch.

The Club needed to enter into a number of ground share agreements to preserve their League status – Forest Green Rovers, Moreton Town, Wollen Sports and Highworth all allowed us to use their grounds. This difficult period galvanised our club members, and the club was kept running by the dedicated efforts of a few stalwarts – notably Cheltenham Town legend, Dave Lewis, whose efforts were recognised by Carling Brewery, awarding him their 'Clubman of the Year' accolade (and a year's supply of beer!)

After approval for the Kayte Lane site was given in 1997, club members started the building of the clubhouse and changing rooms — using materials kindly donated by Smiths Aerospace (now GE Aviation) There followed a great transformation in the team's fortunes, and they duly secured another promotion in 2001 back to the Hellenic Premier Division. In order to take this opportunity the club entered into another

ground share at Evesham United!

2003 & 2004 proved to be a landmark period for the club – returning to 'The Lane' after the new Stand and floodlights were approved, achieving FA Charter Standard for Football in the Community, and the completion of the building and facilities.

In 2006 the team gained promotion to the Sothern League, joining the Midland Division before being moved to the South & West Division a few seasons later, where the club currently reside. The club has enjoyed mixed fortunes in their Southern League time. generally enjoying mid-table security, with the highlight being season 2011/12 when the club finished with their best ever points haul (in a creditable 11th) and reached the Gloucestershire Senior Cup final, played at Bristol City's Ashton ground. where we unfortunately succumbed to a Bristol City side featuring two Full Welsh Internationals!

With the departure of Alex Sykes to County rivals Shortwood United, the ex-Cheltenham Town professional John Brough took the helm but left towards the end of the season to join Cinderford Town.

2013/14 saw local lad Stephen Cleal take charge with Derek Lightstone, as his assistant, both had a long history with the club and they forged a close link with our Second and Third teams—as well a community tie to Bishops Cleeve Colts Youth section—the future of the club seemed much more secure on and off the field of play. After surviving relegation in their first season they put together a competitive team finishing 12th in the league and losing 1-0 to Forest Green Rovers in the County FA Senior Cup. 2016/17 saw another first for Steve winning the club's first FA Trophy game.

2017/18 saw the arrival of Matt Jeynes to the management team another who had played for the club in recent years and they later joined by Alex Lumsden Unfortunately a number of players left the club and the season didn't get off to a good start. The team did rally towards the latter part of the Season but were relegated after losing the last game. So after 12 years the club looked for a speedy return to Step 4 of the NLS. However, having retained most the players, the team had a few slip ups on the run in to the end of the season and finished, they also were runners-up in the County Trophy.

Royal W. Bassett Town 3 Bishops Cleeve 0

A trio of excellent second half goals and a resolute defensive display saw Royal Wootton Bassett Town end their two-game losing streak as they recorded a convincing 3-0 victory at home against Bishops Cleeve. In contrast to last week's losing effort away against Lydney Town, Bassett made the better of the difficult conditions at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground than their opponents. With the early stages of Storm Ciara brewing, a stiff breeze was present throughout the match. But, with the wind behind them in the opening period, the visitors failed to take advantage, creating just one chance of note from open play despite putting the hosts under significant pressure.

The second half then belonged to Bassett. Cleeve defended anxiously throughout. And after an error presented Mark Francis with the chance to score a well-taken opener, Bassett slowly but surely twisted the knife, with Anaclet Odhiambo and Dan Warre ensuring an emphatic final score line. Such an outcome would not necessarily have been expected at half time with the score still deadlocked

The visitors had appeared the better of the two teams. However, that was aided by the advantages offered by the conditions. Further, despite enjoying much of the play they only posed any real danger from set pieces. Leun Crowe headed a Luke Payne free kick into the side netting on nineteen minutes before Bassett should have been ahead when Carl Evans contrived to miss from close range after a mishit Alfie Presley free kick found the centre half unmarked at the near post. Bishops Cleeve then had their lone opportunity from open play but debutant 'keeper Eddie Cavanagh was equal to Lucas Price's well struck shot on the turn.

Two further chances came their way from set plays before the break, Lee Llewelyn whipping a left wing free kick across the face of goal and narrowly wide before Richard Thwaite headed just outside the far post from a towering Adam Mace free kick delivery. The game therefore entered the interval knotted up at 0-0. Much credit should be given to the Bassett defence that this was the case. Rather than play through the middle, Cleeve sought to utilise the dangerous Lucas Price and Stephen Davies out on the wing. But they were contained by impressive young full backs George Ford and

Alfie Presley, while sharpshooting forward Jack Watts and his strike partner Leun Crowe were kept under wraps by centre halves Jon Beeden and Carl Evans. Bassett's solidity at the back stood in stark contrast to that shown by Cleeve following the restart.

The hosts almost found the opener ten minutes into the period when Ford clipped a fine through ball for Rhys Talmash in the right channel, but Francis could on scuff his effort from the wide man's cut back. Two minutes later though he found the net. A slice of fortune finally fell Bassett's way in the build-up as Thwaite and 'keeper Matuesz Wieczorek misjudged a long ball forward. After the ball bounced off the head of the former, it fell to Francis who steered a finely judged left-foot lob over the stranded Wieczorek and into the net from the best part of 25-yards.

A pair of good saves from Wieczorek then kept his side in the game. The first was simply stunning as at full stretch he tipped a curling Francis strike, which had taken a deflection, onto the crossbar. His second save from Francis. this time from a header following a Ford cross, was more routine but still forced him to stoop low on the dive. There was little he could to deny Odhiambo though with twelve remaining. Another pass over the top caught out the Cleeve defence, and Odhiambo raced onto the loose ball before delicately lifting a shot over an onrushing Wieczorek and into the roof of the net. The veteran's goal seemed to settle any potential jitters Bassett were experiencing as they were now able to play with the comfort of a two-goal lead. And that was extended further in stunning style with eight minutes to go. Patient build-up involving Francis, Harrison Lea and Kai Robinson eventually created space in the middle for Warre and the youngster produced a sublime long-range effort that a despairing Wieczorek could do little about as his shot sailed into the top left corner.

With the win in the bag and a clean sheet to boot, it was shaping up to be a perfect day for Bassett. There would be one dampener though as Talmash, playing his first game for Bassett since September, received a needless red card for his aggressive retaliation to a foul by Harry Burns. But that aside it was a hugely impressive afternoon for Bassett, who after not winning a home league game until November have now recorded five on the bounce.

Like many of our volunteers Mari first started out as a parent with children playing in the Youth Section, her



daughter Lucia playing for the club, soon to be joined by son Carlos. Mari, who is a teacher at Royal Wootton Bassett Academy, has had a love of football since she herself was a child and has been a season ticket holder at Wolverhampton Wanderers since a very young age. When Lucia started playing for the club Mari sought to get involved and went on the Level 1 coaching course in order that she could help with the running of Lucia's team. When the Head of the Youth Section, Pete Yeardley moved across to be Head of the Senior Section in 2017, Mari saw the advert for a new Head of Youth Section and volunteered to take on the role and has now successfully held the position for over four vears.

Whilst Club Secretary Ian Thomas deals with the leagues in which the children play. Mari undertakes all of the internal club activity, acting as the interface between the club and the parents of the children representing Royal Wootton Bassett Town. Any issues that parents may have relating to the club Mari is the go-to person. Each evening when training sessions are taking place at the club, Mari will make herself available for people to discuss anything of concern by stationing herself in the club shop cabin, dealing at the same time with any requirements for playing and training kit and merchandise. Mari is responsible for ordering and procuring all of

that kit and equipment, which predominately sourced via Swindon Town ambassador and legend Don Rogers, who has provided superb service to the club for many vears now, and who Mari has on speed dial on her phone.

Mari appoints all the managers of the Youth Section teams, of which we currently have 17 teams and chairs all the monthly meetings with the Youth Section managers, not an easy task at the best at times and was once described by a former Chairman who will remain nameless as like "herding cats".

Mari oversees the club's internal registration system, working with the clubs' website designer to make sure that the system does what is required and that data protection issues are properly managed. Mari also works with the club's treasurer to make sure all subs are paid correctly and that any joiners and leavers are properly managed. Come the end of season Mari arranges for all of the trophies to be purchased for the annual end-of-season awards and plans and co-ordinates the actual presentation event. Mari also arranges the Youth Section Player of the Month awards and also ensures each team gets a team photo done for inclusion on the club's website.

In recent times Mari has also taken on some of the social media activity, looking after the club's Instagram account and being the producer of the infamous first team and ladies team management and player interviews by the children which have greatly assisted with the integration of the Senior and Youth Sections, as has the arranging of the children as mascots for the First Team which was an innovation that came from Mari. This season Mari, along with Club Secretary Ian Thomas, has also taken on the role of Club Welfare Officer, a mandatory required position imposed by the FA that in recent times has been difficult to fill.

With son Carlos, as well as playing for the club, now heading up the Bassett Ultras, who the First Team manager has named the "Carlos' Barmy Army", the family are very heavily invested in Royal Wootton Bassett Town, but it probably will need Sam Collier to lead the team to the Premiership title and then the Champions League crown before we dislodge Wolves as Mari's number one team.



First Team Match Report

Saturday 11th September 2021 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Knaphill 0

FA Vase

It may not have been much of a spectacle, but Royal Wootton Bassett Town made sure they did just enough to make it through in the Buildbase FA Vase as Sam Collier's side saw off Knaphill 1-0 in their First Qualifying round tie.

Joe Selman's 29th minute goal ultimately proved the difference in a game which. although evenly contested, was short on goalmouth action. While their passing was pleasing on the eye, neither team offered much threat in front of goal, with Bassett 'keeper Eddie Cavanagh and his Knaphill equivalent Chris Harris both enjoying relatively quiet afternoons. And when the 'keepers were tested, it was largely from efforts that where the odds were largely in their favour. Indeed, Harris arguably pulled off the safe of the afternoon in the build-up to Bassett's goal. Neat interplay between Macauley Dodson, Dave Bampton and Selman on the right edge of the area opened up a gap in the Knaphill defence and the ball was worked to Bailev Gallagher whose shot Harris parried with a save at point-blank range. But the danger was not cleared, Tom Moore recycled the ball into the box and - with the Knaphill defence not recovered Selman made no mistake, placing into the right corner from twelve yards out. It was a goal that did not really appear to be coming.

Bassett had started somewhat flat and yielded two half decent opportunities to their visitors within the opening quarter of an hour. Dropping off into the large amount of space between Bassett's defensive and midfielder lines, the lively

Harrison Livingstone received a pass from Drew Matthews, turned towards goal and fired a low drive from 25 yards out which Cavanagh was forced to save with his feet. Then four minutes later, Jake Rumble's left wing cross picked out Connor Holland at the far post but he snatched at a shot that Cavanagh comfortably had covered.

The hosts eventually livened up though and Bassett began to set about trying to exploit Knaphill's rather shaky looking backline. Initially, Knaphill's defence proved they were capable of bending without breaking. On the quarter hour mark, right back Dodson squared inside to Kai Robinson who let rip from the edge of the area, finding Harris equal to his effort. Ten minutes later, Tommy Ouldridge seized upon miscommunication between centre half Lloyd Connelly and left back Rumble and played in Bailey Gallagher with a precise through ball. Gallagher had just the 'keeper to beat but the best he could muster was a weak left foot shot that went straight into Harris' hands. The Knaphill 'keeper would pull off another save the next time he was called into action. But there was little he could do about Selman's shot after his defence failed to clear. And that meant Bassett were able to get to the interval in front.



Given the lack of cutting edge on show, a second goal would likely have been enough to kill off the tie. With the tie also due to head straight to penalties if it ended all square at the end of 90 minutes, there should have been plenty of motivation for Bassett to raise their game a notch further and try to double their advantage. Yet for whatever reason that did not occur. Instead, the hosts largely sat on their slender one goal lead — a situation that led to a couple of anxious moments in the second half.



A five —minute spell around the hour mark saw the game threaten to spring into life. It brought three decent chances — two for Knaphill, one for Bassett — while the hosts also saw a penalty appeal turn down. The first opportunity saw Rumble fizz in a low left wing cross that Matthews connected with but skewed wide from twelve yards out.

At the other end, Gallagher initiated and almost finished off a counter attack. After stealing possession inside Knaphill territory, he raced to get on the end of Selman's ball into the box but was narrowly beaten to the punch by Harris. Bassett then quickly reverted to being on the back foot and were fortunate that Joe Waight was unable to find the target as he curled inches wide of the right post from 15 vards.

Having survived that scare, Gallagher again threatened. Latching onto Selman's defence splitting pass, he advanced on goal and when looking to cut inside Dan Udanoh appeared to be tripped. However, referee Andrew Lincoln waved away Bassett's demands for a spot kick.



The game soon settled back into a familiar pattern though with neither team fashioning much. Chasing the game, it was Knaphill who produced the only chances as the game wound down. But even these failed to really test Cavanagh as he was more than equal to shots from outside the area from Livingstone and Holland.

Man of the Match: Kai Robinson — the central midfielder worked hard throughout the entire 90 minutes and made strong, positive contributions to his side's play at both ends of the pitch.

Wilts FA—Rod Wirdnam Recognition

Rod Wirdnam's long refereeing career was recently recognised by the presentation of a Long Service Award and the following article posted on the Wiltshire FA website:

"Everyone at Wilshire County FA would like to congratulate Mr Rod Wirdnam on his Long Service award to refereeing. We would like to thank him for his service to officiating the game in Wiltshire, and other counties, for many years.

Mr Wirdnam has given an overview of his long refereeing career:

Having completed and passed my examination during December 1976, I then eagerly awaited my first ever official fixture. I had previously run 'lines' as a Club linesman, for a couple of friends who ran the Croft team and was encouraged to take up officiating by some of their Match Referees.

Following a very wet early 1977 during which few games were played, my first game was on 20th February 1977, an appointment by Bunny Uzzell; a Swindon Sunday League game between P.O. Supplies and Isis, played on a pitch (now built on) opposite the Rat Trap Pub in Stratton. This ended in an innocuous 0-0 draw, but I felt that I had done well enough for my first game.

Subsequently I have officiated in a total of 1645 games – designated games not including tournaments etc - on the following Leagues:

- Wiltshire County
- Swindon & District
- Wiltshire FA's Women's and Girls
- North Wiltshire Youth
- Swindon Sunday
- North Berkshire

Throughout my 44 years, there have been, I am glad to say, very few 'lows' but many 'highs'; the undoubted highlight being when in May 2006, a group of us travelled to and officiated at the famous old ground of Highbury, the former home of Arsenal FC. I had seen very many games there when living in London, the most notable being Arsenal's 4-5 defeat to the 'Busby Babes' on 2nd February 1958 – some newspapers of the day

calling it the greatest match ever - before so many of the Manchester United Club tragically lost their lives the following week in Munich.

I have also been lucky enough to have officiated in 6 Finals at Swindon Town's County Ground.; also, being given two engraved trophies from the North Wilts Youth Football League to mark my 30 years and 1500 games respectively and a commemorative medal from the Wiltshire F.A. upon my retirement.

My last game was on 30th May 2021, a North Wiltshire Youth League match between Abbey Meads and Hungerford Town Under 12's, a 3-3 draw at the age of 85 ½ years.



Note from Editor

Refereeing at the age of 85 that is impressive. I have known Rod for many years, not only from his refereeing, but also the fact that he held the position of Registration Secretary on the Wiltshire County League (now the Wiltshire Senior League) from 1981 to 2014. I would always get Rod to referee my preseason friendlies when I was manager and then club secretary at Wootton Bassett Sports. When it came to registering players, my cars knew the way to Rod's house on their own, for many a time I had to go round to register a player for Bassett Sports at short notice in the days before the internet, FA Full -Time and the Whole Game System (some would say much better days). If you ended up having a chat with Rod when registering a player it was never a short one! Rod is a true gentlemen and a great servant to football in Wiltshire and he still takes an active interest in the league he served on for so many years.






