Welcome To Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Bradford Town and our first all Wiltshire encounter this season.

A special warm welcome to all of the management players, committee members and supporters from Bradford Town who have made the journey from Bradford-on-Avon for this league game. Today will be the first ever league meeting between the two sides, as we have never been in the same division as Bradford Town until this season. Only formed as recently as 1992, we had left the Wiltshire County League for the Hellenic by the time Bradford came into being and when they worked their way up the leagues' they entered the Western League rather than the Hellenic. It took this summers reorganisation of the National League System for the two clubs to be placed in the same Step 5 league.

Whilst we have not met in the league before we have crossed swords in both the FA Cup and the Wiltshire Senior Cup, meeting three times in both competitions. We have won one game in each competition, defeating Bradford 4-1 in the Wiltshire Senior Cup back in November 1998 and then winning an FA Cup replay on penalties at Rylands Way in 2010-11. The last three meetings have all gone Bradford Town's way, they have defeated us twice in the Wiltshire Senior Cup and once in the FA Cup. In recent seasons Bradford Town have also been regular pre-season opponents, including last season when the sides drew 2-2 in an entertaining encounter.

Bradford Town have made a good start to life in the Uhlsport Hellenic League winning four of their six league fixtures so far. Tuesday night saw they win 4-2 away at Lydney avenging one of their two defeats, having lost 2-3 in the opening game of the season.

Tuesday saw us lose at home to Bishops Cleeve, this after an excellent first half performance. As in the first game against Bishops Cleeve we blew it and neded up losing 3-1, Joe Selman with our goal. The match report from the game is included in today's programme.

I had a brief conversation with someone from one of the new clubs to the Hellenic last week about how they were enjoying life in the Hellenic League. "Not happy" was the simple response. I was surprised as things appear to me to be better this season and the team in question are doing well. The reason for the unhappiness? The number of home league games they have had to play (6 out of 7 with all their last six being at home) and the playing of the same opponents twice so early on in the season. Sound familiar? Both are things we have given extensive feedback to the league on in recent seasons. I guess I have just got used to it now but with us having already played Bishops Cleeve twice and with second games against Roman Glass St George, Lydney and Brimscombe & Thrupp all to come in the next 3 weeks or so on reflection it does look like our feedback has been taken onboard. What we said back in 2018 still holds true in my view:

- Were an unsavoury incident to take place in the first fixture between two sides, playing the return so close to the first game runs the risk of that incident spilling over into the return game. Time is a great healer to allow matters to calm down
- Teams by definition change their personnel quite heavily over a season and playing the same side twice in such a short space of time has the potential to distort the competition.
- Playing a high home games in a row in such a short space of time places undue pressure on unpaid volunteers who have to ensure the fixtures take place and all required matters are dealt with (e.g. production of programmes, hospitality etc).

You can now also add to that list the fact playing teams twice and some not at all will also distort any PPG measure which might have to be used to decide promotion and relegation matters come the season end if the season has to be cut short again. Hopefully if new clubs to the league are making similar noises to what we have said before we might now see some change. Fingers crossed. Enjoy the game and hopefully a return to winning ways. Mark

First Team Match Report

Tuesday 14th September 2021 Royal W. Bassett Town 1 Bishops Cleeve 3 Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Div

It was a tale of two halves for Royal Wootton Bassett Town in their return fixture against a Bishop's Cleeve side who they had drawn 2-2 with on the opening night of the season. Meeting for the second time in this still young campaign, a vibrant first half display saw Bassett deservedly go into the break leading 1-0. However, come full time Sam Collier's side were left licking their wounds as a dominant second half performance from the visiting Mitres saw them storm back to claim a convincing 3-1 triumph.

A night that started with much promise therefore ultimately ended in deep frustration. Bassett were buoyant in the first half and were rewarded early on as Joe Selman's tidy finish gave them the lead on the quarter hour mark. That advantage was almost doubled ten minutes later too as a Scott Chilcott free kick was kept out by a fine save from Sam Gilder.

How good a first half performance it was from Bassett was demonstrated by the fact the visitors had only one chance of note prior to the interval. That arrived with ten minutes remaining, Eddie Cavanagh saving with his legs to deny Jack Watts after the Bishop's Cleeve forward received a cross from full back Linden Dovey.

Partly helped by the visitors' change in system and the introduction of Jake Rhodes in place of Matt Sysum, momentum shifted decisively after the restart though.

And within ten minutes half time substitute Rhodes had equalised. It was a goal that arrived in rather fortuitous circumstances as Cavanagh, in a moment the 'keeper will want to quickly forget, let slip a hopeful lob that found its way into the net.

Thereafter the Cleeve ramped up the pressure. Cavanagh bounced back from his error to prevent Rhodes adding a second, while Jack Watts narrowly missed the target. Another goal appeared inevitable though and it eventually arrived with thirteen minutes remaining as Watts fed through a pass for winger Blaine Waugh who produced a composed finish. Waugh then wrapped things up with a fine solo goal, his lung-bursting run culminating in an emphatic finish.

With the result, Bishop's Cleeve jump back above Bassett while still holding two games in hand. Results elsewhere also mean that Bassett slip behind both Corsham and Malvern Town, with upcoming opponents Bradford Town poised to make the leap if they triumph in Saturday's Wiltshire derby at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

It all could have been different though had Bassett managed a complete 90 minutes rather than just a fine 45. For the second time this season against Bishop's Cleeve, a promising position was squandered. This time though, the end result was that Bassett came away from the game empty-handed. The visitors' win was certainly deserved and there can be no disputing the outcome was a fair one. But if Bassett are to compete for a place in the upper reaches of the Hellenic League Premier Division this season, it's outcomes like this that they need to learn to avoid.

Opponents History

The Early Years

Bradford Town F.C. was founded in 1992 by Les and Pat Stevens, joining Division Two of the Wiltshire League. Home matches were initially played at St Laurence School in Bradford where the pitch was roped off before each game, dugouts were carried to the pitch and the half time tea was made in the boot of a car. Following a short spell at Trowbridge Town's old Frome Road ground the club came home to Bradford on Avon in 1996 moving into Trowbridge Road. The ground was established in 1912 as the home of rubber works team Spencer Moulton FC and latterly Avon Bradford FC before they folded in the early 1990s, enabling Town to become custodians.

Western League status achieved

Bradford achieved promotion to the Western League in the 2005-06 season under the leadership of Mark Hodkinson after finishing runners up in the Wiltshire League Premier Division. Former founding players Paul Shanley and his assistant Mark Edwards took over at the helm in 2008-09 season which saw a third place league finish and floodlights installed at the ground. The following season saw the installation of a 100seat main stand, a 4th place league finish and a creditable 2nd Round appearance in the FA Vase. Town then posted successive 6th, 5th place 4th league finishes embarking on a year to remember in 2013-14 when they won the Division One title by 13 points.

Progress in the Premier

The team's first season in the Premier Division concluded with a respectable 8th place finish but it was their exploits in the FA Vase which proved to be the highlight of the campaign. A gate of 621 at Trowbridge Road witnessed a 3-1 victory over Melksham Town in the 4th Round, their sixth scalp of the campaign, before bowing out in the next round. Another 8th place finish was recorded the following year whilst after three victories in the FA Cup the team were edged out 3-2 by Chippenham Town in the 2nd Qualifying Round. After eight years in charge, the 2016-17 season began with Paul Shanley stepping down, being replaced by ex- Forest Green

stalwart Danny Greaves, assisted by former fans favourite Aaron

Wilson. After 25 tireless years as Chairman Les Stevens handed over the reins to Mark Hodkinson with Jon Phillips as deputy, both of whom have long standing connections with the club. An impressive 5th place finish, was bettered in 2017-18 by 4th place after the side just came up short of promotion. This thrilling campaign also saw the club reach the FA Vase 5th Round again. The long trip to Redcar in the next round however proved a bridge too far as Town went down 2-0 to eventual Northern League champions Marske United on a weekend that will live long in the memory of the 100-plus travelling supporters.

Changes at the top

After two excellent seasons Danny Greaves left Bradford for Frome Town. Following Rob Mallet's short reign in the hot-seat in October 2018, former Larkhall Athletic boss Wayne Thorne was appointed manager along with his assistant Pete Maddison. The pair guided Town to a solid 7th place finish. 2019-20 saw a third FA Vase 5th Round appearance but were again eliminated in front of nearly 500 at Trowbridge Road. The season also saw Mark Hodkinson step down as Chairman with deputy Jon Phillips taking over at the helm. In the league, the team were lying 3rd in March with the best points per game ratio before the coronavirus struck resulting in the abandonment of the league. The management pair subsequently decided to move on with former team captain Lee Davidson appointed as manger and Jamie Lyons as his assistant.

Cup winners and a new league

The 2020-21 league campaign was cut short again due to Covid-19 but saw saw Town claim their first trophy since 2014. The decision to complete the previous year's Les Phillips League Cup culminated Bradford defeating a much fancied Bridgwater Town side 1-0 at Street FC. It was also announced that as part of the FA's league restructuring, Town would play the 2021-22 season in the Hellenic League Premier Division for the first time, a challenge the club is very much looking forward to

They had numerous chances and most of the play, particularly after Bradford Town were reduced to ten men, but despite this, Wootton Bassett Town's Wiltshire Senior Cup dreams were ended thanks to a pair of first half goals from Sam Jordan. Bradford's prolific marksmen grabbed his first with a fine finish conjured out of nothing from long range. He then added a second on the stroke of half time with a simple header as Bassett squandered possession from their own free kick and then confounded matters by failing to track Jordan's run.

While Jordan would be dismissed just after the hour for picking up a second yellow card for an embarrassing dive, his cameo was more than enough to settle an at times fraught quarter final tie 2-0 in the favour of last season's runners-up. That outcome was thoroughly disappointing for Bassett. Defeated by the West Wiltshire outfit earlier in the vear in the FA Cup, the chance for revenge was on offer, as well as a spot in the final preeminent County of the competition. They determinedly chased this goal. enjoying the better of the play in both periods. Yet missing was the necessary cutting edge to punish Bradford's paunchy and pedestrian back four. This was most evident when Steve Robertson opted for a wayward square pass rather than shoot when through one-on-one and when Nathan Gambling blazed over from close range. Bassett also suffered a bout of misfortune, seeing two chances from corners cleared off the line and Dan Bailey denied by the post. Not to take anything away from Jordan's finishing, but it didn't help either that the wounds Bassett suffered conceding both goals were largely self-inflicted

For the first on 18 minutes, Henry Traas was too slow in closing Jordan down after the ball had broke to the forward following a Nathan Hawkins tackle on Twaine Plummer. This allowed Jordan the room to get onto his right foot, and he picked out the bottom corner with a fine effort from 25 yards. The opener stung the hosts. It arguably came against the run of play too, as Robertson had come close on two occasions in the opening quarter hour. From a Gambling knock down, he fired into the side netting from an angle. Then he poked straight at Ed Baldy from directly in front of goal following a Callum Wright free kick that Bradford were unable to clear. Robertson's best chance of the game would come shortly after the visitors grabbed the lead though. Seizing on a woeful back pass. Robertson had just Baldy, coming off his line to close the angle, to beat. But eschewing the chance to shoot- admittedly the angle from the left edge of the box was not the easiest, the forward instead sought to square a pass to a teammate yet could only pick out a Bradford defender scrambling back.

Just after the half hour mark, Robertson guided a header from an inswinging Gambling corner towards goal from ten yards. This time he was denied by a headed clearance off the line though. The danger wasn't cleared, however, and Robertson wound up winning a free kick in the left corner, which Dan Bailey smashed towards goal, forcing an awkward parry from Baldy. While enjoying the better opportunities, the game was by no means one -way traffic, and the hosts were left to breathe a sigh of relief when Aaron Cornwall curled a free kick narrowly wide with the break looming.

Conceding another goal was something Bassett could not afford. In the end, they failed to prevent that before the half time whistle arrived. Looking to switch play to Steve Yeardley from a free kick inside his own half, Richie Carter saw his pass intercepted by Cornwall. It didn't take long for the left back to send a deep cross into the box where Jordan, untracked, glanced a header beyond the reach of Luke Kuczynski. Seeing the deficit doubled could have proved fatal, but to their credit Bassett did not emerge for the second period in a subdued manner and sought to chase the game from the off. In fact they had the opening chance of the half when Robertson cut in from the right wing and thrashed a strike towards the near post, which Baldy batted awkwardly. The loose ball dropped into a crowded six yard box, but was hacked clear before any Bassett forward could pounce.

Pushing forward meant that it was likely Bassett would be exposed more at the back and they were almost undone on 55 minutes when Plummer set Jordan free, with Kuczynski remaining composed to deny the forward his hat-trick. Most of the danger continued to come at the other end though and a low Bailey drive was tipped onto the post by Baldy as luck continued to favour Bradford. A minute later the visitors were down to ten men as Jordan, again free on goal, took a dramatic tumble when trying to round Kuczynski, earning a second yellow after being cautioned minutes earlier for a handball. With a man advantage, Bassett enjoyed a significant amount of possession for the remainder of the contest. Yet, frustratingly, this failed to translate into a goal. A Bailey corner was sliced towards goal by a visiting defender only to be cleared off the line before Gambling blazed over on the turn from ten yards after an inside pass from Richards with a quarter hour remaining. That would be the closest Paul Braithwaite's side came to causing Bradford any real anxiety. The final margin of victory could even have been greater for the visiting team, but Dan Shanley could only guide a Cornwall free kick wide after meeting it at the near post.



THE OULEAGUE PAPER ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

It's funny how things fall into place sometimes. As much as we plan The NLP's pages each week, occasionally you stumble into the perfect storm. Take last week's paper, where three of our FA Cup previews worked perfectly in tandem with a family theme.

In many ways, it shouldn't be a surprise. Non-League football in particular has always had the family feel. In this weekend's FA Cup, that's no different. But these feel-good stories only served two underline just how many strong links run through the game.

First stop is Nuneaton Borough, where dad and son are making waves in the FA Cup.

Carl Baker has had a fine career that took him from Non-League with Prescot Cables and Southport to the Football League where he won promotions with MK Dons and Portsmouth, after spending five seasons with Coventry City. At 38 he may be on the back nine of his career, but he's still going strong — although son Louis is now grabbing the headlines too. There can't have been a much better feeling for Carl to be on the same pitch as his 20-year-old son, and Boro team-mate, when he scored an excellent goal against Lichfield City.

"I probably celebrated his goal more than I've ever celebrated any of my own," he said. "The stats on my GPS probably showed I ran quicker then than at any other time in the game as I went to jump on his back. It was a fantastic feeling.

"We were leading 1-0 at the time with about five minutes to go. As he's striding up the pitch I'm on the opposite side thinking he should just go and hold it up in the corner.

"I could see what he was going to do so when he cut in and scored it was probably the best feeling I've ever had on a football pitch - you can see that from my reaction."

There will be a slightly different feel at Brackley Town's game with Coalville Town where Dean twins Gaz and Alex play each other in a competitive game for the first time.

At 31, they've had to wait for the chance — although mum Gill isn't thrilled about the showdown!

"Mum's not happy," Brackley defender Gaz told us. "I got a text saying, 'Be nice to your brother'. She says it's her worse nightmare come true because she's going to have one disappointed twin.

"But it's probably my dad's dream to see us go toe-to-toe with each other – it's opposite ends of the spectrum between the two parents, I think"

Alex added: "When we were little we were terrible — we used to fight all the time over any sport in the garden.

"We were blessed with where we lived because we had a good sized garden so we were forever playing football, cricket, badminton — anything like that. I am competitive. But he is ten times worse. He gets ever so grouchy."

Although Gaz has promised to buy his brother a pint in Brackley's bar after. And at Sutton Common Rovers it will be a proud day for manager Darren Salmon. The gaffer has been involved with the club for 35 years having played and become manager of the team, then playing in Sunday League, aged 21. His dad, Alan, founded the club in 1978 and is still chairman while his brother Justin is club secretary.

"I think that's been a real strength for us keeping that family feel and continuity," said Salmon, whose in-laws look after the matchday hospitality and stewarding, brother -in-law is youth club secretary and sister operates the tea bar on matchdays.

First Team Match Report

Saturday 11th September 2021 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Knaphill 0

FA Vase

It may not have been much of a spectacle, but Royal Wootton Bassett Town made sure they did just enough to make it through in the Buildbase FA Vase as Sam Collier's side saw off Knaphill 1-0 in their First Qualifying round tie.

Joe Selman's 29th minute goal ultimately proved the difference in a game which. although evenly contested, was short on goalmouth action. While their passing was pleasing on the eye, neither team offered much threat in front of goal, with Bassett 'keeper Eddie Cavanagh and his Knaphill equivalent Chris Harris both enjoying relatively quiet afternoons. And when the 'keepers were tested, it was largely from efforts that where the odds were largely in their favour. Indeed, Harris arguably pulled off the safe of the afternoon in the build-up to Bassett's goal. Neat interplay between Macauley Dodson, Dave Bampton and Selman on the right edge of the area opened up a gap in the Knaphill defence and the ball was worked to Bailev Gallagher whose shot Harris parried with a save at point-blank range. But the danger was not cleared, Tom Moore recycled the ball into the box and - with the Knaphill defence not recovered Selman made no mistake, placing into the right corner from twelve yards out. It was a goal that did not really appear to be coming.

Bassett had started somewhat flat and yielded two half decent opportunities to their visitors within the opening quarter of an hour. Dropping off into the large amount of space between Bassett's defensive and midfielder lines, the lively

Harrison Livingstone received a pass from Drew Matthews, turned towards goal and fired a low drive from 25 yards out which Cavanagh was forced to save with his feet. Then four minutes later, Jake Rumble's left wing cross picked out Connor Holland at the far post but he snatched at a shot that Cavanagh comfortably had covered.

The hosts eventually livened up though and Bassett began to set about trying to exploit Knaphill's rather shaky looking backline. Initially, Knaphill's defence proved they were capable of bending without breaking. On the quarter hour mark, right back Dodson squared inside to Kai Robinson who let rip from the edge of the area, finding Harris equal to his effort. Ten minutes later, Tommy Ouldridge seized upon miscommunication between centre half Lloyd Connelly and left back Rumble and played in Bailey Gallagher with a precise through ball. Gallagher had just the 'keeper to beat but the best he could muster was a weak left foot shot that went straight into Harris' hands. The Knaphill 'keeper would pull off another save the next time he was called into action. But there was little he could do about Selman's shot after his defence failed to clear. And that meant Bassett were able to get to the interval in front.



Given the lack of cutting edge on show, a second goal would likely have been enough to kill off the tie. With the tie also due to head straight to penalties if it ended all square at the end of 90 minutes, there should have been plenty of motivation for Bassett to raise their game a notch further and try to double their advantage. Yet for whatever reason that did not occur. Instead, the hosts largely sat on their slender one goal lead — a situation that led to a couple of anxious moments in the second half.



A five —minute spell around the hour mark saw the game threaten to spring into life. It brought three decent chances — two for Knaphill, one for Bassett — while the hosts also saw a penalty appeal turn down. The first opportunity saw Rumble fizz in a low left wing cross that Matthews connected with but skewed wide from twelve yards out.

At the other end, Gallagher initiated and almost finished off a counter attack. After stealing possession inside Knaphill territory, he raced to get on the end of Selman's ball into the box but was narrowly beaten to the punch by Harris. Bassett then quickly reverted to being on the back foot and were fortunate that Joe Waight was unable to find the target as he curled inches wide of the right post from 15 vards.

Having survived that scare, Gallagher again threatened. Latching onto Selman's defence splitting pass, he advanced on goal and when looking to cut inside Dan Udanoh appeared to be tripped. However, referee Andrew Lincoln waved away Bassett's demands for a spot kick.



The game soon settled back into a familiar pattern though with neither team fashioning much. Chasing the game, it was Knaphill who produced the only chances as the game wound down. But even these failed to really test Cavanagh as he was more than equal to shots from outside the area from Livingstone and Holland.

Man of the Match: Kai Robinson — the central midfielder worked hard throughout the entire 90 minutes and made strong, positive contributions to his side's play at both ends of the pitch.




