Welcome To Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Westfields.

A special warm welcome to all of the management players, committee members and supporters from Westfields who have made the long journey from Hereford for this league game.

Westfields currently sit in seventh position in the table with five wins, two draws and two defeats from their opening nine fixtures. They have already played league leaders Malvern Town twice in those opening nine games and are expected to be up their challenging for honours come the end of the season.

After last Saturday's excellent win against Portishead we are now through to the First Round of the FA Vase where we will meet fellow Wiltshire based side Downton. A preview of that game is included on the next page.

After that win in the FA Vase we were brought back down to earth in midweek with a poor performance away to Roman Glass St George, losing 4-1 to a side who have now won three games so far this season, two of which have been against ourselves. I am sure the lads know they did not do themselves justice in midweek and will look to put things right here this afternoon against one of the leading sides in the Division. Back in Season 2019-20. when Covid first struck Westfields were clear favourites to lift the Uhlsport Hellenic League title, unbeaten in their opening 26 league games and some 13 points clear of second placed Binfield. However, a disappointing Season 2020-21 in comparison, saw them pipped on PPG for the promotion place to the Southern League by Binfield.

The Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division is shaping up to be an interesting title race this season with Malvern Town, Cribbs and today's visitors currently looking the sides that teams need to finish above if they are going to win the league. Those sides that have played Hallen early on, especially Corsham who have played them twice, will be grateful that they played them early on

judging by Hallen's excellent first win of the season against third placed Brimscombe & Thrupp. With Hallen now under new management they are likely to start climbing up the league table and it does look like everyone is capable of beating each other this season in what is an open Premier Division.

It is pleasing to report that our average league gate this season is currently 12 up on last season's figure, helped by the recent local derby against Bradford Town. With further local derbies still to come against Calne Town, Fairford Town, Shrivenham and Corsham Town, plus another Wiltshire based opponent in Westbury United, it does look like our crowds will be higher than in recent seasons.

This is the ninth First Team programme so far this season and we are only just into October. By the turn of the year that figure will have doubled to 18, with just four home games currently scheduled for the New Year. One day the fixture flow will be more kind and the month ahead looks to be a real nightmare with five home games thanks to the home draw in the Vase. Any contributions to help with the programme would be gratefully received particularly where we have a midweek game straight after a Saturday.

The Development Team continued their great start to the season last Saturday defeating Salisbury FC Development to go top of the table following a 2-1 win. This coming after an excellent 2-2 draw in midweek at Calne Town Reserves which, whilst ending our 100% winning start to the season, was nevertheless a good result against a decent Calne Town Reserves side. Today Steve Yeardley's side travel to the InfiLED Stadium to take on a Melksham Town Reserves side who lost heavily to Salisbury so hopefully the Development Team will still be top of the table this evening.

Tomorrow sees the Ladies open their FA Cup campaign with a visit form Uxbridge based side Denham United Ladies here at the Gerard Buxton Ground.

Enjoy the game and hopefully a return to winning ways. Mark



Club News



First Team FA Vase Draw

Royal Wootton Bassett Town have been handed a home tie against Downton in the Buildbase FA Vase first round. The tie is due to take place at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on Saturday 23 October.

Victories against Knaphill and Portishead Town have seen Bassett progress through the competition's qualifying rounds for the first time ever in consecutive seasons. And now Sam Collier's side have their eyes on (at the very least) equalling the club's record Vase run, which a win over Downton will achieve. However, to reach the second round – the stage at which they were eliminated last year – Bassett will have to again avoid being the victims of an upset against Step Six opposition.

Downton, who ply their trade in Wessex League Division One, reached the first round courtesy of a 2-1 away win against league rivals Ringwood Town. They previously had a bye in the first qualifying round.

So far, they have enjoyed a solid start to their season on all fronts. In the league they have registered four wins, two draws and two defeats from their opening eight fixtures, while, in addition to their Vase success, they have made it through to the Wiltshire Senior Cup quarter finals and the Wessex League Cup last sixteen.

In the Vase, Downton will now be aiming to reach the second round for the first time since 2012-13. That season the Robins advanced to the third round – their best performance in the competition, having also reached the second round in 2010-11 and 2011-12.

Although notionally county rivals, there have been very few previous competitive

meetings between Bassett and Downton. Indeed, the teams have met just twice before in the Wiltshire Senior Cup.

The first encounter was in 1973-74 when Bassett triumphed 3-0 in the Senior Cup opening round before Downton prevailed 1-0 in a second round tie in 1992-93. The teams should also have faced each other in the 1963-64 county competition. However, Bassett were unable to raise a side for that away fixture.

There will be no such issues this time around though as Bassett and Downton face off in a national competition. And it's set to be an entertaining Vase tie, which both clubs are looking forward to.

Ladies Team

The Ladies side won their second game of the season last Sunday with a 2-1 success away at Marine Academy Plymouth. Tomorrow they are set to be at home in the Second Qualifying round of the FA Cup with Denham United who play in the London & South-East Regional League Premier Division (same level as Bassett) the visitors to the Gerard Buxton Ground. Denham have been at Step Five since the 2019-20 season, having previously played in the Women's National League Division One South East. They have significant recent pedigree in the Women's FA Cup too. In the 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2013-14 editions they reached the second round. losing to Charlton Athletic. Tottenham Hotspur and Lewes respectively. More recently, in 2015-16 and 2016-17 they exited in the final Fourth Qualifying round. Last season Denham started in the Women's FA Cup Preliminary round, defeating Queens Park Rangers and Ascot United before falling to a 1-0 loss against Maidenhead United in the Second Qualifying round.

Youth Section Round-up

It was a successful weekend for Royal Wootton Bassett Town's youth sides as five out of eight teams in competitive action recorded victories.

The biggest winners were the Under 16 Blues who marched into the second round of the North Wilts League Cup with a 9-0 thrashing of Kingsdown Lions Vikings. Rhys Matthew Westlake led the way with a hat-trick in his side's convincing away triumph. Also on target were Evan Bexon-Shaw (2), Samuel Bounds, Josh Flay, Harvey Fulton and Jofrancis Rosario.

Bassett's four other wins all came in league action.

It is still very much the early stages of the season, but a 4-2 home victory against Bishops Cannings Youth Scorpions has the Under 12 Blues level on points with Croft Junior Red at the top of North Wilts League Division Three. The Blues (pictured below) won on Sunday courtesy of Alex Greenouff's hat trick and a further strike from Kyle Lillis.



In Division Five, the Under 12 Yellows recorded their second win in a row as they beat Hungerford Town Juniors Blue 9-3 away from home.

The Under 13 Yellows were also again amongst the goals as they saw off Hungerford Town Juniors 7-1. Having scored a brace a week ago, Fynn Crone went one better with a hat-trick, while Thomas Hyde and William Moreton both scored twice.

Meanwhile, six goals without reply against Stratton Youth maintained the Under 15 Blues' perfect start to their Division Two campaign. Five different scorers – Thomas Nicholls (2), Jamie Black, Finley Hyde, Finley Lavender and Finlay Marshall – got in on the act for Bassett.

Elsewhere, there was a narrow defeat for the Under 18 Yellows in their opening game of the season as they were beaten 3-2 by South Cerney.

The Under 16 Yellows scored four in their North Wilts League Cup round one match away against Wroughton Youth Panthers, but ultimately lost 8-4 in a high-scoring affair. Patrick Otoo-Mensah (2), Ewan Painter and Lewis Taylor scored for Bassett.

And the Under 14 Yellows lost by the same score in their league fixture against Wroughton Youth Blue. Despite the defeat, it was a great afternoon for Layton Stepp who found the net three times, with Bassett's other goal scored by Owen Kuklinski.

A second half brace from Neikell Plummer helped Roman Glass St George inflict a thumping 4-1 defeat on Royal Wootton Bassett Town as Sam Collier's side fell to a second league defeat of their season against their opponents.

However, a rampant second half display from Roman Glass - and Plummer in particular tore Bassett apart.

A diving header from Plummer doubled his side's lead on 53 minutes before the forward bundled home a low cross quarter of an hour later to make it 3-0. Lewis Ellington then completed the scoring with a fine effort from outside the area with thirteen minutes remaining.

Bassett were able to get one goal back, Alan Griffin heading in his tenth of the season.

However, that was mere consolation as Bassett slipped to a third loss in four league games with this being the heaviest so far.

Westfields enjoyed their first season in the league and were 13 points clear when it was curtailed due to the coronavirus and then last season, we only played 5 games and again the season was curtailed

Last season was a slight disappointment, not only in the fact that the league games were kept to a minimum of only 5 and we did not make the progress that we wanted in the FA Cup or the FA Vase.

Furthermore, we were beaten In the HFA County senior challenge cup final at Edgar Street by our near neighbors Hereford lads Club.

However, this season we are looking to have a full season with the programme set out by the Hellenic league and the management structure of Phil Glover along with assistant manager and coach Paul Willetts, assisted by our new club coach Tony James and Richard Thompson will I'm sure will be anxious with the players to gain a promotion place.

The management team are ambitious and enthusiastic as they wish to try and continue the historic rise of Westfields Football Club of 1966 when the club was formed to continue and progress hopefully into the Southern league South and West.

During the last 55 years Westfields have enjoyed a meteoric rise throughout the West Midland league to the Midland Football League and along the way have finished runners up twice in the Midland Football League and narrowly missed out on promotion to the Southern league South and West having finished runners up to Gresley Rovers and Stratford Town in previous seasons.

Westfields celebrated their 50th Anniversary season in the 2016/17 with an amazing giant killing run in the FA Cup which saw them go through to the first-round proper before

losing to Curzon Ashton following a Match Of The Day game at Allpay Park in the first round proper, which also featured Westfields appearance on Football Focus and prior to that Chief Executive Andy Morris had appeared live on the FA Cup first round draw as a studio panel guest in Manchester.

In fact 2016/17 also saw Westfields celebrate the 50th Anniversary with a celebratory dinner at the Three Counties Hotel Hereford, and Andy Morris was also a guest at the Nonleague paper luncheon at Chelsea Football Ground where he was given a lifetime achievement award for 50 years' service as secretary of Westfields Football club.

Other accolades were received during the season as presentations were made by the Herefordshire Football Association to the Midland Football League, Ladbrokes, and the Midlands FA Cup committee to celebrate the tremendous that Westfields had enjoyed in their FA Cup run which gave them wins over Stourport Swifts, Tividale, St Ives Town, Highgate United, Walton Casuals and Leiston before they drew Conference North side Curzon Ashton at home and then lost in the replay 3-1.

Westfields have enjoyed tremendous support financially by being sponsored firstly by their ground sponsor Allpay Ltd who for the first 15 years were the shirt sponsors at the club.

This has now been taken on by CJ insurance who have enjoyed fantastic support and coverage in the last 2 seasons during our period in the Hellenic Football League.

We are delighted that CJ Insurance have continued their support to Westfields Football Club again this season and along with Metclad of Nottingham and support from Life Member Ron Marshall who continues to support the club Westfields can go forward with a sound footing.

Westfields are a club geared up for success with a very strong committee which has been well established over many years and with a ground with an E certificate for higher-graded football and a recently re-furbished club room, bar, and dressing rooms.



Amongst the other information Mary provided us with was a team photograph of our team from 1897-98.

Mary was well known throughout the town and along with husband Arthur was deeply involved in the community of Royal Wootton Bassett. Not only was Mary renowned for her sporting endeavours, which involved running marathons as well as playing hockey, but she was also an accomplished artist and a key member of the town's Historical Society, also taking care of the historic Town Hall - a duty in which she succeeded her father. Mary was such a warm and friendly person who would often be seen cycling or running around Wootton Bassett, would always have a smile on her face and always have time for a chat.

Mary's funeral will be taking place at St Bartholomew's Church on Tuesday 12th October at 2.00pm. This will be followed by a private, family only committal. 

THE OULEAGUE PAPER ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

What would football look like if heading didn't exist? Last Sunday we found out at Spennymoor Town's Brewery Field. The National League North club hosted the first adult football match without heading to raise money and continue the conversation about the safety of players.

The fixture, organised by charity Head for Change, only allowed headers in the penalty area for the first half and then restricted all heading during the second.

Professor Willie Stewart from Glasgow University published research showing that footballers are up to five times more likely to suffer from dementia than the general population.

He believes that neurodegenerative brain disease is linked to heading after further studies showed that defenders were more at risk than goalkeepers, who rarely head the ball.

Dr Judith Gates, co-founder of Head for Change, set up the charity after her husband Bill, who played for Middlesbrough and Spennymoor, was diagnosed with dementia in 2014. Bill, 77, was forced to retire aged 29 after regularly suffering migraines.

"I want people to come away from today with knowledge and the facts that the dangers of heading in football is not a myth," said Judith, who saw her husband kick-off the special match. "We are not proposing to ban heading but there needs to be a discussion about how to protect people who are playing football.

"The time for action is now, the weight of evidence from the studies in this country and the USA means we can no longer ignore this. There are too many former players who are no longer with us because of neurodegenerative disease.

"My husband Bill is here today, but he will not remember it tomorrow. We have to protect the players of the future."

The unique match, which ended 5-5, featured ex-Spennymoor and Middlesbrough players and ex-professionals, some with Premier League and international experience, representing the two teams, Head for Change and The Solan Connor Fawcett Family Cancer Trust.

Team Solan won on penalties in front of 390 people, who witnessed potentially the start of the biggest change the game will have ever seen.

Heading is a fundamental part of football but it is without doubt damaging to the human brain and that's why options are being explored to lessen it. Being only allowed to head the ball in the penalty area, during the first-half of the fixture, meant there was still a goal threat from crosses and set pieces and long balls could be played forward. Ironically, James Marwood, the former Gateshead and Forest Green Rovers striker, scored the opener with his head after Gavin Cogdon had hit a post with a diving header at the other end.

There was just one incident when the rules were forgotten and a defender nodded down a long ball forward resulting in a free-kick awarded to the opposition.

When heading was removed entirely from the match in the second half, the change was evident, played more like a 5-a-side game with shorter passing and where aerial duels don't exist.

But this was why the match was an important practical experiment to discover how football would be affected and to keep the conversation going.

Two opportunities yielded two goals for the rampant visitors and a third straight league loss for Sam Collier's side seemed inevitable. But gradually Bassett fought back — and come full time goals from Tommy Ouldridge and Bailey Gallagher meant that they deservedly earned a share of the spoils.

Indeed Bassett could - and perhaps should - have emerged from the game victorious given the chances they enjoyed during the remaining 85 minutes of a thrilling, full throttle Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. However, thanks to the predicament they found themselves in early on, Bassett can be satisfied with the point that they ultimately came away with. Bassett's start to the fixture was the definition of a nightmare.

Less than three minutes in, they were a goal behind. Stealing possession from Kai Robinson inside Bassett's half, Bradford cut through the Bassett defence with impunity. Jake Brown advanced down the left, cut the ball back from the byline and Richard Dawley was on hand to fire home a first time finish from twelve yards out.

Still reeling from that goal, Bassett quickly fell into an even deeper hole. This time Bradford exploited the expanse of space the hosts left between their defence and midfield as George Box was granted far too much time on the ball, allowing him to spray a pass out to Brown on the left side. The winger then advanced towards and sold Macauley Dodson a dummy that left the full back on his backside before squeezing an effort into the roof of the net from a tight angle.

It was a chastening start to the game – and one that could potentially have got even worse midway through the opening period when Brown found room on the edge of the area. Fortunately for Bassett, a heavy touch prevented the winger from shooting with a clear sight on goal and the eventual effort that he could muster was dragged wide of the mark.

The hosts were beginning to find their footing though, and by half time they were back into the game. Having found Bradford confident when on the front foot, Bassett also discovered how nervous their visitors could be when forced to defend. That became apparent on 25 minutes when, seemingly out of nothing, Bassett crafted their first real opportunity of the match. The ball was worked out to Joe Selman in space on the right and he whipped in a cross which an unmarked Alan Griffin headed wide of the left post from ten yards

Their next chance then yielded a goal. Bassett were expecting a penalty when Gallagher appeared to be tripped just inside the area. Referee Roger Smith was non-committal, but Bassett had little time to complain. Bradford failed to clear and Selman squared to Ouldridge, whose rather tame sidefoot shot from the edge of the area crept by Bradford 'keeper Jonathan Hill and into the bottom corner.

Moments later Bassett had a great opportunity to pull level as Selman cut back for an unmarked Gallagher, but the winger rushed a weak shot straight at Hill. By pulling the game back to 2-1, not only did Bassett ensure they went into the break still very much in the game. But they also seemed to chip away at the visitors' confidence. Not all appeared cordial between the Bradford management and their players. Both in the dugout and on the pitch, things threatened to boil over. Bradford were fortunate to hold onto their lead as the game reached the hour mark. A fierce Robinson shot forced Hill to tip around the post. Then from the resulting Ouldridge corner, Griffin headed against the bar with Dodson guiding the awkward rebound narrowly over.

Soon enough Bassett were on terms — much to the disgust of Bradford manager Lee Davidson who, losing his cool, angrily sent a chair flying from his technical area. Why the equalising goal brought such a reaction was unclear given that it was the product of a piece of magic from Bassett's Gallagher rather than an error from Davidson's team.



Ouldridge curled a first time pass forward and, with his back to goal, Gallagher sold his marker a dummy before whipping a sumptuous strike from the right edge of the area into the opposite top corner. It was a goal of outstanding quality — and one that Bassett deserved for the nature of their response to falling into such an early hole.

More than twenty minutes remained though and both sides were of the belief that they could snatch a win. The remainder of the match was thus an open, end-to-end affair.

Bassett had their moments, with Ouldridge, Selman and substitute Zac Skinner proving particularly troublesome down the left flank. However, ever so slightly mistimed runs meant that the offside flag got in the way of the home side troubling Hill again.

At the other end, the visitors went close on two occasions. With eleven minutes left, an outstretched Harry Rutty guided Ethan Witchell's low cross into the box narrowly wide. Brown then cut inside from the right and rode two tackles before forcing Eddie Cavanagh to fist the ball away.

Ultimately though, neither side was able to find a winner on an afternoon that offered the neutral the perfect balance of excitement and tension.

Man of the Match: Adam Corcoran - it might seem strange to name a centre half man of the match in a game that saw his side concede twice in the opening six minutes. However, Corcoran was at fault with neither goal and, alongside partner Dave Bampton, he marshalled Bradford's dangerous attack expertly for the remainder of the contest. Corcoran's distribution was excellent throughout too as his early passes forward helped give Tommy Ouldridge, Joe Selman and Bailey Gallagher the space they needed to cause the visitors trouble.




