

# **Welcome To Today's Game**

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Hallen

A special warm welcome to all of the management players, committee members and supporters from Hallen who have made the journey along the M4 from Bristol for this league game.

Although Hallen moved across from the Western League in the summer as part of the FA's restructuring of the National League System we have played them on eight occasions previously when they were in the Hellenic League before moving to the Western League. Those eight games took place between 1993-94 and 1996-97 and the bad news is we are vet to defeat Hallen in a league game, drawing five times and losing the other three. Hallen currently sit bottom of the table with just one win from their opening 16 games. That one win was an impressive one though, a 5-2 away success at third in the table Brimscombe & Thrupp! It is now just about a month since the last competitive game and they are home tomorrow afternoon to bottom of the table Bideford. Hopefully Graham Fletcher's side can continue where they left off a month ago and record another league win to stay in touch with the leading sides in the South West Women's Regional League Premier Division. In the Women's County Cup Bassett have been drawn away Warminster Town in the Quarter Final with the game scheduled for Sunday 21st November 2021.

# **Club News**

#### **FA Vase Second Round Proper**

Royal Wootton Bassett Town will have the benefit of being at home in the Buildbase FA Vase second round. However, they will face an extremely tough test having been paired with Cornish-side Torpoint Athletic in a tie that is due to take place at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on Saturday 20 November.

Bassett have already recorded home wins against Knaphill (1-0) and Downton (4-0) - as well an away victory against Portishead Town (3-1) - on their journey to the second round of this year's competition. And Sam Collier's side - who will make club history if they are able to advance to the third round - will no doubt be pleased that it is Torpoint having to travel to Wiltshire rather than Bassett having to make the journey to the Cornwall coast.

Yet there is no doubt that the second round draw represents the toughest challenge Bassett have faced in the Vase so far this season. At present Torpoint sit fifth in the South West Peninsula League Premier Division East. However, that is something of a false position given that the Windmills have at least five games in hand over three of the teams above them. Most impressively, they are still unbeaten in the league, having won eight and drawn one of the nine fixtures they have played so far.

Torpoint's eyes are no doubt set on gaining promotion to the Western League at the end of the campaign. But they will also be equally intent on a deep run in the Vase, which their early season form suggests they are more than capable of. Their current Vase exploits have seen them play all three of their ties so far on home soil. They began with a narrow 1-0 first qualifying round win against Callington Town before a much more straightforward 6-1 triumph against Stoke Gabriel and Torbay Police in the second qualifying round. The first round then saw Torpoint

granted their first encounter with a side outside of the South West Peninsula League - and they were more than up to that test as they impressively beat Bassett's Hellenic League Premier Division rivals Chipping Sodbury Town 4-1.

Torpoint have plenty of Vase pedigree too. They first entered the competition in 1991-92 and two seasons later advanced to the fourth round before going a stage further in 1995-96. While not competing in the Vase between the 1997-98 and 2009-10 seasons, the past decade has seen them advance beyond the second round on two further occasions. Torpoint reached the quarter final stage in 2010-11, where they were narrowly beaten by Poole Town, and advanced to the third round in 2016-17 before losing at Bradford Town.

Despite that rich history in the competition though, their visit to face Bassett will only be their third ever Vase encounter against a Hellenic side. In addition to their recent win against Chipping Sodbury, Torpoint visited Brimscombe and Thrupp in the 2015-16 second round and were beaten 3-2. It will be an equally unique experience for their hosts too as Bassett have only ever faced South West Peninsula League opponents twice before in the Vase. And - like Torpoint against Hellenic League sides -Bassett hold a 1-1 record, having lost 2-0 to St Blazev in 2001-02 before beating Camelford 4-0 last season. The impending contest - a rare, challenging matchup that would not happen outside of a national cup competition - therefore represents what would be widely considered an ideal Vase tie. Bassett will also be hoping that it is a fixture in which they are able to make club history. Regardless of the outcome though. it will be an afternoon to look forward to at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground.

# **Opponents History**

The club was formed by members of a new community living at Lawrence Weston on the outskirts of Bristol, which had been developed shortly after World War Two. The club was named Lawrence Weston Athletic and played in the Bristol & District League, and it has moved forward steadily since moving to the village of Hallen in 1979, to conform with League Ground grading. Much of the credit for the progress of this club can be accredited to the late Frank Fairman and his family. His son Francis, and grandson Lee continue the link with the club. In fact Lee played a major part in our fight for survival during the summer of 2015, when the club was in danger of losing its home. So it was no surprise when long serving Chairman Barrie Phillips nominated Lee to take over the chair from himself, at the next AGM. The club became known as Lawrence Weston Hallen when it moved to Moorhouse Lane. joining the Gloucestershire County League in 1982, and under that title were runners up 1987-88, and Champions 1988- 89, after which the club dropped Lawrence Weston from its title to become known as simply Hallen. The club completed the double in 1992-93, when winning the Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy and the League title. Promotion was achieved, joining the Hellenic League Division One, and after further improvements to the facilities (particularly the erection of floodlights and a 200-seater stand), a runner -up position in 1996-97 led to another step up, to the Hellenic League Premier Division. The club had always considered the Western League as its goal, as this League was more familiar with Bristolians than the Hellenic League. Their wish to transfer over was granted at the second time of asking but it was insisted that the club join the First Division for season 2000-01. The club finished fourth in its first season in the Western League and reached the last sixteen of the F.A.Vase losing to Brigg Town 6-5 in extra time. Further progress was made when new manager Gary Damone led the team to the Division One title in Season 2003-4, and fourth place in the Premier Division at the first attempt. The club also reached the final of the GFA Trophy and were denied a place in the first round of the F.A. Cup when losing to Nationwide Conference side Canvey Island in the fourth and final qualifying round. This success saw Southern League side Taunton Town tempt Gary Damone to try his hand at a higher level, which in turn saw Hallen have a dip in form, as players were also tempted away. It is however well known that a high percentage of players are happy to return to Hallen, and for season 2009-10 the club welcomed back Gary Damone as manager and many former players too. The club finished in a disappointing twelth position in 2009-10, but a crop of long term injuries did not help. The club however were to lift the Western League (Les Phillips) Cup for the first time. The club had experienced a bad start to the 2010-11 season, which saw the departure of manager Gary Damone who chose to take charge of his own town club Wellington. Club stalwart Paul Owen was given the task of steering the team to safety. With just one win prior to taking over in November, he and his assistant John Tierney changed fortunes around and we were safe from relegation with six games left. Paul Owen's first full season as manager saw the club challenging for the title, but a dip in form saw the club slip to fourth. Off the field, the club had ensured q

promotion would not be denied, had the club won the title by obtaining the ground grading for Southern League football.

Season 2012-13 saw no repeat of a challenge for promotion, but the season was kept alive by reaching the final of the Les Phillips League Cup for a second time. In the final Willand Rovers won 1-0 before a crowd of 400 at Cribbs Friends Life FC. As Paul Owen had already decided to step down at the end of the campaign, it was unfortunate that he could not see his side lift the cup. By mid May the club announced that Hengrove Athletic manager Jamie Hillman was to take over as manager, He had been at the helm for eight years at Hengrove, and had just guided them to the Premier Division as runners up in April. The 2013-14 season under Jamie and his assistant Grantley Dicks, was a mixture of highs and lows. The highs being success in lifting the GFA Trophy for a third time and reaching the fifth round of the FA Vase losing away to West Auckland Town. In contrast we finished the League campaign without a win in fifteen games.

Manager Jamie Hillman announced that he would be leaving, and previous manager Paul Owen agreed to return for the 2014-15 season. By November the League form was yet again cause for concern and Paul decided it would be best to bring in a new face, rather than wait to the end of the season. Steve Winter a former Walsall and Torquay player was appointed with a view, of him settling in, prior to the coming season. He was to resign in December 2015, and long serving player Tom Collett took on the role as player manager assisted by Rayan Wilson for the 2016-17 season. Following another poor run of results. Tom Collett made way for former player Ben Willshire to return as the new manager. Ben guided the club away from relegation, but when fortunes did not change in the next campaign, it was decided his assistant Rob Sage should take over the helm prior to Christmas 2017, with Ben remaining as a player. The resignation of Rob Sage forced the club to seek another manager in February.

Former manager Gary Damone returned as interim manager, whilst the club decided on a replacement from a record number of applicants. The successful candidate being former player Ray Johnstone, who had guided Odd Down to the title in 2016. Ray recruited another former Hallen player Tony Davis as his assistant for the 2018-19 season, unfortunately Tony had to step down during the course of the season. It was a season which saw a more settled side, finishing in twelfth place the best for several years. 





Stourbridge did something a little unusual last week.

The Southern League Premier Central club appointed Leon Broadhurst and Stuart Pierpoint as joint-managers – something seldom seen in English football.

The pair are no strangers at the War Memorial Athletic ground. Broadhurst is the Glassboys' leading appearance holder with 780 in total while Pierpoint has four fruitful seasons at the club.

They've been playing Non-League football for 20 years and were both still turning out this season — Broadhurst with Bromsgrove Sporting and Pierpoint at Coalville Town.

The popular duo had always said they would go into management together and once Stourbridge approached them it was near impossible to turn down.

Their return to the club has brought excitement added to by a 3-0 victory over Lowestoft Town last weekend in their first game in charge, but how will the uncommon approach of being joint-managers work in the long-term?

"We've been close friends and played together for many years so we know our skillsets," Broadhurst told The NLP. "The first training session it fell into place without our different skills. It was brilliant to see how Stu concentrated on one area and I concentrated on another."

Pierpoint added: "We didn't really verbalise how it was going to work because it's a learning curve for both of us. There will be different elements we're probably not aware of at the moment that will come up.

"But, as Leon said, we do have different skillsets which will benefit us. We have a very similar outlook and similar approach with regards to our expectations and how we see the future.

"However, in terms of how we undertake the role we have different traits that we can bounce off each other. It's all about open communication. We're not going to agree on everything but that's great as well." In the Premier League and Football League there aren't any managerial partnerships with only Danny and Nicky Cowley coming closest, having worked their way through Non-League, although older brother Danny is officially 'manager'.


Doug Livermore and Ray Clemence were once first-team bosses at Tottenham Hotspur but both were soon axed before Gerard Houlier and Roy Evans took charge of Liverpool in 1998, and Evans quickly resigned.

There are plenty of successful examples outside of the EFL. Chester bosses Anthony Johnson and Bernard Morley have won five promotions together at Ramsbottom United and Salford City while Neil Baker and Jon Underwood have taken Slough Town from Step 4 to National League South.

Carl Withers and Jamie McClurg led Binfield to last season's FA Vase final and promotion from Step 5. Rick Andrews and Angelo Harrop, in their short time in charge of AFC Sudbury this year, reached the FA Cup first round proper and are going well in the Isthmian League North.

Broadhurst and Pierpoint have the makings of another successful duo as more Non-League clubs will be asking themselves, is two better than one?

# **First Team Match Report**

#### Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> October 2021 Fairford 0 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 2 Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division

Royal Wootton Bassett Town ended their winless run in the Hellenic League Premier Division with a well deserved 2-0 victory away against local rivals Fairford Town.

Taking full advantage of the extra man they had following Danny Gudger's controversial red card five minutes before the break, secodn half goals from Gio Wrona and Matt Bennett proved enough to allow Sam Collier's side to register three points for the first time since September 4. Fairford will argue - somewhat justifiably - that the outcome hinged heavily on referee Haydn Lavender's decision to show Gudger red for what seemed to all to be an innocuous challenge. But Bassett will care little about their opponents' claimants. During their nine game winless streak, Bassett have frequently found themselves out of luck. This time though fortune was on their side

Up until Gudger's dismissal, the opening period had been a nondescript affair. In a game pitting two underachieving sides against one another, it was perhaps little surprise that play was cagey. While it was certainly a derby that both sides wanted to win, given their positions in the table it was also a contest that neither was interested in losing. Action in front of goal was consequently limited. Indeed, the closest either team came to threatening to score was when Ross Langworthy headed narrowly over from Ian Herring's teasing free kick. The red card finally sparked things into life. It did seem rather harsh. Gudger misjudged the flight of the ball and, when adjusting to try and knock it past Wrona with a backheel, he caught the Bassett midfielder on the shin. Lavender saw malice in his actions though and sent Gudger off.

Even though the score was still deadlocked, that decision meant it was advantage Bassett. And Collier's side proceeded to produce a professional second half performance in which they dominated possession and, importantly, found the net twice. After producing a few shots that failed to find the target, the visitors eventually found their range.

Bailey Gallagher threaded a pass into the left channel for John Mills who cut a pass back to Wrona on the edge of the area and he squeezed a side foot shot past Sam Avres with the help of a slight deflection. After taking the lead, Bassett upped their control of the game. They felt they should have been awarded a penalty when Gallagher was upended on the left edge of the box, though Lavender proceeded to award a free kick, judging the offence not to have taken place inside. But a second soon arrived. Patient build up play saw the ball worked from the right side out to Mills on the left. The experienced forward then produced a feint that had Ant Brown fooled before weighting a delicate cross into the area, which Bennett headed past a wrong-footed Avres into the bottom left corner.

There was an opening for George Peare at the other end which he blazed over. But being a man down, Fairford produced little else. And if any side was going to add to the score further, it was to be Bassett. Bennett had three bites at the cherry. However he first sliced wide after a Tommy Ouldridge effort was deflected into his path before forcing a fine diving save from Ayres with a left foot curler. The Development side's leading scorer then raced onto a long ball over the top from 'keeper Eddie Cavanagh only to see Ayres snatch the ball at his feet when trying to round the Fairford shotstopper.

The best opportunity to extend Bassett's lead further fell to Mills. But he blazed over from the spot after Matty Shaun, believing he had been fouled by Scott Chilcott, fell on the ball and handled in the area. While somewhat disappointing not to have added a third, an extra goal would have served only to add a little additional gloss to what for Bassett was a fine afternoon. A league win has been a long time coming. Here's hoping this derby triumph can serve as the start of a decent run that can help Bassett climb back into the top half.

# **Wiltshire Premier Shield**

It was goals galore in Royal Wootton Bassett Town's Wiltshire Premier Shield first round encounter with Melksham Town. But, unfortunately for Sam Collier's side, the contest ended in a lopsided 9-3 defeat as Melksham registered six unanswered second half goals.

Luke Ballinger was the star of the show for the hosts as the England futsal international racked up five goals, while Jake Mawford was not far behind his strike partner as he bagged a hat trick.

For Bassett it ended as a night to quickly forget, particularly for those in defence. But for an hour the visitors had matched their Southern League opponents, having first taken the lead and then restored parity after falling 3-1 behind. But Melksham proceeded to go through the gears in the final half hour to storm to victory and inflict a heavy loss on Bassett.

In contrast to the way that it finished, Bassett's evening could not have started any better. On his return to the club, Brad Pagliaroli took all of five minutes to find the net as he received a pass from Bailey Gallagher before curling a trademark finish into the bottom left corner.

While it took twenty minutes until the game's second goal arrived, the period in between served as an appetiser for what was to come as both sides generated multiple chances. Eventually though it was Melksham who landed the game's second blow as Mawford guided a header following a Will Christopher cross beyond Eddie Cavanagh.

Eight minutes later - and after Bassett had been forced into a change to replace defender Will Davidson, who had suffered a gash to the head - the home side were in front. Confusion reigned in the Bassett defence as a Melksham short corner caught them out and Mawford produced a weighted finish that sailed into the net, seemingly with the help of a deflection off the head of Davidson's replacement Jon Beeden.

It was then quickly 3-1 as Ballinger got in on the act, curling a low free kick from 25 yards beyond the grasp of Cavanagh and into the net via the left post. To Bassett's credit, at this stage they didn't buckle. Instead, they rose to the challenge of being two goals behind and Gallagher produced outstanding solo goal after collecting possession on the halfway line, spinning past his marker and slotting beyond Sam Jepson. Melksham had two further opportunities to restore their two-goal advantage before the break but Cavanagh denied both Mawford and Ballinger.

Then, on 52 minutes, Bassett were back on terms as Pagliaroli played in Gallagher, who arrowed a fine shot into the bottom corner. Parity lasted all of three minutes though. Macauley Dodson brought down Mawford in the box, and the forward dusted himself down before sealing his hat trick from the spot.

On 66 minutes Albie Hopkins crossed for Ballinger to head home his side's fifth before then coming close to grabbing a goal of his own. The sixth - and Ballinger's third - soon arrived, coming courtesy of another penalty awarded somewhat harshly for a soft foul by Adam Corcoran. Melksham weren't finished either. Jay Malshanskyj headed narrowly wide while Cavanagh did well to keep out another Ballinger free kick. Then in the 83rd minute Melksham added their seventh as Ballinger headed in from a Hopkins corner. Hopkins provided the eighth with a neat finish before Ballinger finally wrapped up the scoring in the 90th minute with a powerful drive following a mazy run.




