Welcome To Today's Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Thornbury Town. Well if you are reading this it means that thankfully we are playing Thornbury Town at home here today. With both sides out of the FA Cup this game has been brought forward from 26th March 2022.

Initially we were scheduled to be away to Thornbury but the game was then switched to our place last Sunday for reasons unknown but with plenty of notice and work commenced on this programme. We all attended the Shrivenham game on Monday thinking we would be at home today against Thornbury but come Monday night there was conflicting messages on the Your Sport Swindon website. The player interviews all talked about a forthcoming home game against Thornbury but the Your Sport Swindon page in the narrative around the Shrivenham game said we would be travelling to Thornbury. The source of this confusion was the FA Full-Time website which indeed showed us as away to Thornbury and where YSS had picked this information up from! Ian made enquiries with the league as to what was going on and finally on Tuesday morning it was confirmed that the game would be here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground with an apology from the league for messing the teams around. Thankfully the four hours spent on the programme on a Bank Holiday weekend had not been wasted.

So it is a warm welcome to all the players, management, club official and spectators from Thornbury to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground and we hope they enjoy their first visit to our ground and we wish them a safe journey back along the M4 tonight.

The two sides met for the first time at the beginning of August in the FA Cup and we safely made it through to the next round thanks to a 4-0 win. The match report from that game has been included in today's

match day programme. No doubt Thornbury will be looking to avenge that earlier defeat here today and we will need to be at our best to ensure that we pick up the three points to build on the excellent Bank Holiday weekend which saw us take maximum points from the two games against Hereford Lads Club and Shrivenham. It was certainly a good weekend for veteran striker Alan Griffin, starring at both ends of the pitch in the 3-1 win over Hereford Lads Club, with a penalty save as a stand-in keeper and then a penalty scorer at the other end, and then scoring the late winner in the 1-0 derby win over a dogged Shrivenham side. Match reports from both games are included in today's match day programme.

The fixtures are certainly coming thick and fast at the moment. Next Wednesday we are away at Brimscombe & Thrupp, the away game that our FA Cup replay with Ardley United caused to be postponed. The following Saturday we are in FA Vase action here when we take on Combined Counties Premier South side Knaphill who have yet to win in the league this season having drawn three and lost two of their opening five league games ahead of today's match with Banstead Athletic, which is where I will be this afternoon having another look at our Vase opponents for Sam ahead of next week's game.

Last weekend's Super Sunday event was another successful day and a brief write-up of the event is included on the next page. Interesting to note there were few people watching at Shrivenham on Monday who were feeling either a bit stiff after the games (including our first team manager who allegedly had to have a treatment from our Therapist to be able to take his place in the dugout at Shrivy) or suffering with a headache after the post match beers.

Enjoy the game and hopefully for the Bassett fans another home league win to maintain the momentum and our winning run. *Mark*

Hellenic Premier Division 21-22

The Bank Holiday weekend saw games on both Saturday and Monday.

The Non-League Paper reported the following on Saturday's action:

Premier Division table toppers **Cribbs** beat visitors **Roman Glass St George** with goals from Ali Boyer, Jake Hodgson and Ryan Radford. Jack Smith hit a double and Ollie Pitt and Harlie Price one goal each as **Brimscombe & Thrupp** won 3-1 at **Corsham Town**. **Calne Town** returned from **Chipping Sodbury Town** with a 2-1 victory thanks to goals from John Bright and Matthew Jenkins. Goals from George Box and Tyson Pollard set **Bradford Town** on course for a 3-1 win at **Fairford Town**, with Charlie Wiles-Richards also netting. Cameron Peters gave **Hereford Lads Club** an early lead at **Royal Wootton Bassett Town** who levelled through Khedive McIntosh but had to wait until the last three minutes before goals from Alan Griffin and Matt Bennett sealed a 3-1 win. Elsewhere **Shrivenham** beat visitors **Tuffley Rovers** 3-2. **Thornbury Town** lost 6-2 at home to **Longlevens**.

Bank Holiday Monday saw league leaders **Cribbs** go five points clear at the top following a 3-0 away win at **Chipping Sodbury Town**. **Brimscombe & Thrupp** are one of four clubs sat on 13 points but are second on goal difference after a 3-1 home win over **Fairford Town** who have now lost five of their opening eight games. **Longlevens** are also on 13 points but lost ground when they were held 2-2 by **Tuffley Rovers** who picked up their first point of the season. **Corsham Town** joined them on 13 points with an impressive 4-0 win in their local derby against **Calne Town**. **Bishops Cleeve** lost their unbeaten record when they were beaten 5-3 by **Malvern** on their own patch, with Malvern and Brimscombe now the only unbeaten sides. **Royal W. Bassett Town** moved into sixth spot with a late winner away at **Shrivenham**. Elsewhere **Westbury Utd** won 2-0 at **Bradford Town**, **Roman Glass St George** won 3-1 at bottom of the table **Hallen**, **Westfields** were 2-1 winners at **Hereford Lads Club** and today's visitors **Thornbury Town** were 4-3 winners at home against **Lydney Town**.

Opponents History

It is understood that football has been played in Thornbury from around 1898 and formerly known as Thornbury Sports became Thornbury Town FC in the early 1970's.

1968-69 we became founder members of the Gloucestershire County League and spectator figures in excess of 500 were regularly recorded. In 1971 the club finished third in the Gloucestershire County League and was accepted into the Western League. However, due to difficulties in bringing the facilities up to the leagues required standards were unable to take the next step up. Relegation to the Bristol Premier Combination League unfortunately followed in 1976-77.

The following 20+ years saw Thornbury Town strive to regain their former status, never really threatening to take the Premier Combination title. The only success during these lean years was reaching the final of the GFA Senior Amateur Cup in 1985-86 and 1989-90 unfortunately on both occasions loser's medals were received.

During the late 1990's, the Club maintained its strong focus on developing local talent and this eventually bore fruit in 1999 when the final of the Stroud Charity Cup was reached, losing narrowly to Dursley Town. 2001-02 season saw the management team of Dave Wiffill and Steve Burbage take the reins, which brought instant success winning the Bristol Premier Combination title by 13 points and a return to the Gloucestershire County League. This followed a run of thirteen consecutive league wins a club record, which still stands to this day. The league and cup double eluded the club when they were defeated by Sea Mills in the League Cup Final.

In preparation for the return to County League football the summer of 2002 saw a lot of hard work undertaken on the Mundy facilities with the building of dug-outs, improved drainage and revamping of the dressing rooms. All this work appeared to have been worth while with the club establishing itself back in the Gloucestershire County league with a creditable 7th league position for the next three seasons. Silverware did come our way in 2003-04 when we defeated Taverners on penalties, after a 2-2 draw, to lift the Stroud Charity Cup. The 2003-04 season, also saw the formation of an Under-18's side in order to maintain Youth development within the club and they gained entry to the Gloucester County Youth League.

Following a number of indifferent seasons when relegation back to the Bristol Premier Combination league was only just averted in 2006-07, a new management committee and first team management were appointed. Dave Lippiatt took over as first team manager, coming to the club from Sea Mills Park bringing with him Carl Derosa as his assistant. With an initial three / four year strategy, which came to fruition during the 2009-10 season when after a steady first half to the season a tremendous winning run of ten league games saw the Surridge Gloucestershire County League title won for the first time in the clubs history. 2010 also saw the milestone achievement of the long awaited coming together of the two local football clubs "Thornbury Town FC" and "Thornbury Falcons FC" now under one club management umbrella of Thornbury Town FC without losing the heritage and identity of Thornbury Falcons. This will further enhance the long term development within the local community for junior, youth and senior football.

In the 2010-11 season the final of the Les James Cup Final was reached, which resulted in a penalty shoot-out disappointment against Henbury Town. 2013-14 saw the U18's in their highest league position in the Gloucestershire County Youth League finishing runners-up, which was a tremendous achievement for the team and managers Simon Pirie and Mark Franklin.

The 2014-15 season was a very successful season finishing 4th in the league and winning the Les James Cup for the first time in the Club's history. Andy Davies continued to produce a team of quality which resulted in a third 4th-place in a row in Season 2016-17. 2017-18 saw the club finally succeed in their quest win the Gloucestershire County League. After a lot of work behind the scenes to gain planning permission for the required ground improvements, the club were accepted into the Hellenic League for the first time in our history.

Our first season in the Hellenic League saw us finish a creditable 3rd in Div 1 West and win the Supplementary Cup. 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 seasons were ruled null and void due to the Coronavirus pandemic with the team poised to gain promotion. A restructuring of the football pyramid has placed us in the Hellenic Premier Division. With Jason Rees and Gary Kemp in place we look forward to the season ahead and wish all teams the best of luck in their endeavours.

Experienced centre midfielder and one of the leaders on the pitch. Good first touch and range passing, rarely gives the ball away.



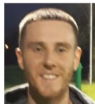
James DeRosa - MID

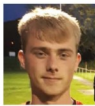

After last season's Emirates FA Cup heroics, Royal Wootton Bassett Town had the taste for more success in the oldest knockout competition of them all. And, in its 150th edition, Sam Collier's side made certain of at least one victory with a thumping 4-0 triumph away against Thornbury Town.

With Thornbury playing their first ever home fixture in the competition, Bassett made it an afternoon their hosts would rather forget.

A rampant first half performance saw the visitors stake out a 3-0 lead after 25 minutes. And it was smooth sailing from there onwards, with a final goal late in the match time meaning Bassett matched their biggest margin of victory in the FA Cup (the club's only previous win by four goals coming in a 5-1 triumph against Dilton Rovers in the 1946-47 Extra Preliminary round).

Tommy Ouldrige set Bassett on their way after quarter of an hour, scoring with a fine finish with the outside of his left foot from the edge of the area that sailed in over Thornbury 'keeper McKenzie Welsh.

The lead was doubled three minutes later when Gio Wrona whipped in a free kick from the left side and veteran Alan Griffin headed home.

Dave Bampton - another experienced campaigner - then made it 3-0 as he fizzed a low drive from 25 yards into the bottom left corner.

Even though the outcome proved more or less beyond doubt at the interval, Thornbury were offered little as they

strived to at least grab a consolation goal.

Bassett showed no mercy either. With four minutes remaining, Tom Moore cut in from the left hand side and struck a right-footed shot beyond Welsh to make it 4-0.

With that victory Bassett move onto the Preliminary round where they will host former Hellenic League foes Ardley United, who saw off Ashton and Backwell United 2-0 in their Extra Preliminary tie.

Alan Griffin scoring a match winning goal would not usually be that big of a story. Throughout the veteran forward's illustrious non-league career, he has delivered victory for his team on many an occasion. But his decisive goal in Royal Wootton Bassett Town's 3-1 triumph against Hereford Lads Club may just represent the most remarkable way in which he has determined the outcome of a game.

The goal itself was ordinary - Griffin confidently dispatching a penalty into the bottom left corner beyond the reach of Lads Club 'keeper Steve Bell. But it came with Griffin donning the gloves - a result of Eddie Cavanagh's earlier red card for handling outside the area. And it arrived quarter of an hour after Griffin had himself saved a penalty from the visitors' Cameron Peters.

Griffin was Bassett's hero at both ends of the pitch. It was some way to seal a second league win for Sam Collier's side - and one earned by coming from behind and having to play with ten men for a good 50 minutes of the match.

Bassett fell behind in the opening ten minutes as Peters picked out the bottom corner to put the visitors in front. An equaliser arrived soon after though as Khedive McIntosh beat the offside trap, nipped inside of a defender and coolly stroked home beyond Bell.

Both sides exchanged chances in an open first half before Lads Club were granted a huge advantage as half time earned as Cavanagh was somewhat harshly

dismissed. But while being a man short Bassett were still able to create. And they almost had the lead in the opening minute of the second half when Bell produced a fine goal line save to deny McIntosh.

It remained a tight affair. Yet Lads Club appeared on course to take the advantage when awarded a penalty with eighteen minutes left. However Griffin had other ideas, reaching low to his right to push away Peters' spot kick. He produced another fine stop with eight minutes to go before it was soon his turn to deliver at the other end.

Dave Bampton received a push as he went up to try and meet a corner and the referee pointed to the spot. The long trip to the opposite end of the pitch failed to unsettle Griffin and he made no mistake from twelve yards.



There was then still time for another goal to seal the three points as Matt Bennett ran through the Lads Club defence and picked out the bottom corner.

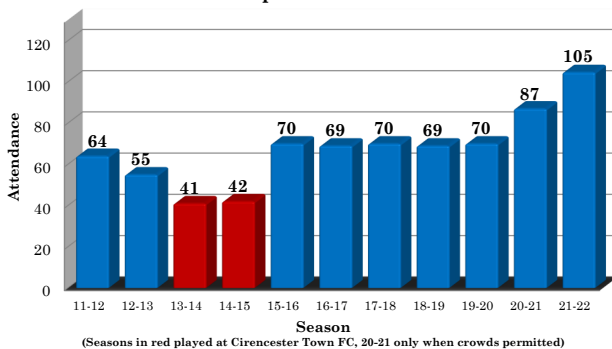

ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME



Pressure in football is supposedly reserved for managers, players and even referees – but there can't be anyone who has to perform when it really matters like the physio.

Most of the time we're used to seeing them dash on for minor knocks and strains. A bit

of treatment, a blast of the freeze spray, a dab of the magic sponge, a squirt of the water bottle and on we go (I'm sure it's roughly that easy!).

Yet nobody is in the bar after saying, "Physio had a great game today". It's probably how they prefer it. Unseen, just going about their business quietly and efficiently. But I'm here to argue physios – and other medical staff at games – are the most important people in a football ground. Because when something really goes wrong, they are front and centre – often with hundreds, if not thousands, of eyes staring right at them.

Anyone who has been in a ground when a bad injury occurs knows it can be quite a scary time – especially anything involving the head, neck or spine. I'll never forget hearing a striker's leg break in a challenge at the other end of a ground. Or seeing a player having a seizure on the ground. But the medical experts can't get caught up in all that. Keeping calm, assessing the situation, they go through their processes, using all their knowledge from years of studying and observing to give the best possible care to a player.

games abandoned because of really bad injuries. Last season Darlington's Nicky Hunt suffered a head injury in a National League North game against Boston United. Darlo therapist Danny O'Connor – who was helped by the Pilgrims' medical staff as well – spoke after about the situation that even saw Hunt stop breathing twice. The team stayed in position for hours waiting for an ambulance, keeping Hunt comfortable.

"You kind of go into robot mode when something like this happens," he told NE Sport News. "It's a bit strange because you're just dealing with the situation and everything else becomes irrelevant.

"It's quite interesting really because when I've spoken to people afterwards the majority say they wouldn't know what to do in that situation, whereas I felt quite comfortable knowing what to do and when to do it, but that just comes down to experience."

It's a remarkable responsibility to take on – I'd wager the majority of us couldn't do a job like that. Last month Hallam physio Shannon Brooks drew high praise for her expertise and care when assistant referee Andrew Jarvis fell in during a game. Her quick actions saved his life and has led Shannon to fundraise for defibrillators having seen the importance of one being available first-hand.

Thankfully, incidents like this tend to be few and far between. Hopefully at your game today you have no real need to notice any of the medical staff. But let's keep showing them the appreciation they deserve.

Given how they controlled most of the game, Sam Collier may have waited longer than he would have wanted to see his side finally break the deadlock in their derby visit to Shrivenham. But the Royal Wootton Bassett Town manager will be delighted that his team eventually did find the net as they secured a 1-0 win and completed a fine Bank Holiday double.

Alan Griffin was again the man who provided the goods when it mattered most, heading in from Tom Moore's cross with just minutes to spare for his sixth of the season and his second match-winning goal in the space of 48 hours.

In truth it gave Bassett a derby win that, on the balance of chances created, they more than deserved. But a lack of composure in front of goal as well as some fine last ditch defending from the hosts meant that the outcome remained uncertain right until the end.

It had been one way traffic during the first half with Shrivenham setting out a very defensive stall. Yet the visitors were unable to make their pressure count.

Midway through the period a pair of chances arrived in quick succession, with Griffin denied by a brilliant goalline block and Matt Bennett firing over from the edge of the area. Then on the half hour mark Griffin teed up Bennett but another last gap block cleared the danger.

It was more of the same early in the second period. Ten minutes after the restart Bennett's pace allowed him to accelerate in behind the Shrivenham defence but his ball across the face of goal had just a bit too much pace meaning Griffin was unable to get on the end of what would have been a tap in.

Eventually the hosts got a foothold into the game. And on the hour they came close to taking the lead but Eddie Cavanagh kept the scores deadlocked with a great save to guide the ball around the post. The resulting corner then saw Shrivenham go close again.

While those opportunities served as a wake up call, things soon got nervier for Bassett when they were temporarily reduced to ten men with Dave Bampton sent to the sin bin. But Bassett successfully saw out the ten minutes they were forced to play short-handed before reasserting the dominance they earlier enjoyed.

With time winding down, Griffin placed a header narrowly over from a Bennett cross when he should really have done better.

He quickly made amends for that miss though. The move that led to the goal was impressive too. 'Keeper Cavanagh caught Shrivenham off guard with a quick kick sprayed out to the wing. Moore was the recipient and he delivered a fine cross which Griffin, outmuscling his marker, climbed to meet and the veteran flicked a header home.

Better late than never, it was what Bassett deserved - and a goal that also brought to an end a run of four straight league losses against Shrivenham.
