Welcome To Todays Game

Good afternoon and welcome to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this FA Cup Preliminary Round tie against a familiar opponent to us in Ardley United. A special warm welcome back to the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground to the management, players, committee members and spectators from Ardley. It is also a warm welcome to the Hellenic League Chairman Bob Dalling who we understand is also attending today's game. We hope they all enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home.

This season sees Ardley playing outside of the Uhlsport Hellenic League having successfully appealed the FA decision in the summer to leave them in the Hellenic after the league membership had shifted westward towards Bristol and South Ardley are now plying their Wiltshire. trade in the Premier Division of the Spartan South Midland League, So far this season they have played just two league games, beating another ex-Hellenic side Flackwell Heath 1-0 away in their opening game before losing 2-0 at home to Arlesey Town 2-0 in their second game. They reached this round of the FA Cup thanks to a 2-0 win over Ashton & Backwell from the Western League.

Over the years Ardley have been something of a bogey side to us and our record against them has historically been a poor one. The good news is that it has improved in the last four meetings and there is more information on the games between the two sides later in the programme on Page 13.

The most enjoyable part of the curtailed 2020-21 Season was our fantastic run in the FA Cup which this season is celebrating its 150th anniversary. For Royal Wootton Bassett Town this is our 23rd season of entering the most prestigious domestic club cup competition in the world and hopefully we can enjoy another extended run. Last season we equalled our best ever performance in the competition reaching the Second Qualifying Round for only the

second time in our history. The first occasion we made the Second Qualifying Round we were well beaten at Dorchester Town but last season we gave an impressive account of ourselves, losing narrowly to a late goal to National League South side Oxford City who went on to have an excellent run of their own in the competition. Hopefully we can emulate last season's cup run here today and the fans can play a big part in helping Sam and the lads by making lots of noise this afternoon.

Tuesday night I witnessed my first ever game in the Combined Counties Premier Division South and must say I was impressed by both the standard of football and also the pitch and facilities at Cobham where I went to have a look at our FA Vase opponents Knaphill. It is also not every non -league game that you go to that you can say that you sat just along from an ex-England Assistant Manager, but that happened to me on Tuesday with Ray Lewington at the game watching one of his sons Craig play for Cobham. I will be reporting back to Sam on my thoughts about Knaphill but I hope to get along to watch them one more time before we meet in the Vase on the 11th of September.

The same night Sam and the lads were picking up their first league win of the season, a 3-1 win over Lydney Town, never an easy place to visit. This followed the dramatic late equaliser last Saturday that denied Jeff Roberts his first win in over 12 months for Chipping Sodbury. Match reports on both games are in today's programme. Hopefully we can maintain this mini unbeaten run here today.

Enjoy the game and hopefully we will be in the FA Cup draw on Monday, as it would be great to once again have a long run in this most prestigious of English competitions.

Women's FA Cup Draw

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies have been handed a home tie against Denham United in the Vitality Women's FA Cup Second Qualifying round. The game will take place at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on Sunday 3 October (2pm kick off).

After an Extra Preliminary round defeat against lower league Brentford in last season's edition of the competition, Bassett will be hoping to return to winning ways in the Women's FA Cup. And they will have the motivation of being just two wins away from the First Round proper given the structure of this year's competition. Indeed, Bassett will enter the tournament at the stage at which they were knocked out in their best ever run in the competition back in 2019-20 when they recorded a pair of victories against Chipping Sodbury Town and Torquay United before suffering a narrow defeat against Portishead Town.

They will face tough opposition in the form of Denham though. Based in Buckinghamshire, they are the largest all female club in the South East of England. Their senior team ply their trade in the London and South East Regional Women's League Premier Division - at step five of the women's football pyramid, the same level as Bassett. They have been at step five since the 2019-20 season, having previously played in the Women's National League Division One South East.

Denham have significant recent pedigree In the Women's FA Cup too. In the 2010-11, 2011-12 and 2013-14 editions they reached the second round, losing to Charlton Athletic, Tottenham Hotspur and Lewes respectively. More recently, in 2015-16 and 2016-17 they exited in the final Fourth Qualifying round. Last season Denham started in the Women's FA Cup Preliminary round, defeating Queens Park Rangers and Ascot United before falling to a 1-0 loss against Maidenhead United in the Second Qualifying round.

Coronavirus Update: Updated Risk Assessment and Method Statement

Royal Wootton Bassett Town have published an updated version of its Covid-19 Risk Assessment and Method Statement (RAMS). The updated document covers guidance issued in relation to the move into step four of the government's roadmap from Monday 19 July. While all legal restrictions that the government have previously imposed have now been lifted, it is vital that these procedures are adhered to for the sake of all our members, opposing teams, their families and the wider local community in order to limit the spread of the virus. Football activities will therefore continue to take place according to The FA and Government guidelines. The RAMS document can be found on the club website.

FA's Advice on Heading

Also on the website is The Football Association's new guidance for heading for the start of the 2021-22 season, which will apply to all levels of the game. The overall aim of the guidance is to reduce exposure to heading and protect player welfare, while - at least in adults football and older youth age groups - to still allow for the development of proper heading technique.

The changes that follow as a result of the guidance primarily impacts upon the amount of heading that is allowed within training sessions. The new guidance will be applied by all Royal Wootton Bassett Town teams. Coaches and parents are therefore advised to familiarise themselves with the new guidance.

Opponents History

Ardley United were formed in 1945 just after the end of the Second World War. In the early years, the club plied its trade in the Lord Jersey FA and played on a pitch which was situated close to the railway line on the Oxford Road. The 1950's and '60's were successful for the club as they won both league titles and cups; most notably the Oxfordshire Junior Shield on three occasions as well as many other trophies. The acquisition of the current Plaving Field site in the mid-60's enabled the club to move into the heart of the village, and a number of volunteers led by life-long supporter Doug Hodges built modest changing rooms.

Ardley continued to compete in the Jersey League throughout the 70's and early 80's without much success but this was to change in the mid-'80's with the arrival of Norman Stacev as chairman – a position that he graces to this day. In 1988 the club were promoted to the Oxfordshire Senior League and won the Division One title at the first attempt, following this up with the Premier Division title the following season. Accepting place in the а Hellenic League for the 1993/4season, Ardley spent six seasons in the 'old' Division One winning it in both 1996/7 and 97/8 as well as winning the Division 1 Cup for a record four consecutive seasons before it was merged with the Premier Division Cup to become the Challenge Cup that we know today. The manager during these years was ex-Oxford United leading scorer Peter Foley and he was to be the first in a line of managers to keep Ardley at the forefront who include Paul Spittle, Paul Berry, Dan Still and Kevin Brock among their number.

Major change was to come in the early 2000's as, along with the Ardley Playing Field Committee, Ardley United oversaw the construction of dedicated facilities along with a separate village hall which enabled the club to be independent of community activities. The new clubhouse, which had been awarded the Non-League Paper's Hungerford Cup for most-improved facilities, allowed the club to be promoted to the Hellenic Premier Division and so began the club's most successful years to date.

Kevin Brock took the reins for seven seasons which saw Ardley win several cups including the Oxfordshire Senior Cup in 2013/14, a season during which they narrowly lost out on the Premier Division title by just two points. Following Brock's departure, Paul Davis took over as manager for nearly two seasons until the resignation of long-time chairman Norman Stacev in June 2017 for personal reasons. Ian Feaver took over the role of Chairman and appointed Craig Adey as First Team Manager. A decision to be voluntarily relegated to Uhlsport Hellenic League Division One West gave everyone some breathing space to adjust to the new regime.

Craig brought with him a talented squad of players and they won the Division title gaining promotion back to the Premier Division at the first time of asking. The 2018/2019 season had its ups and downs but the team finished on a high winning the Hellenic League Floodlit Cup.

Lee Matthews was appointed manager for the 2020-21 season, after being joint manager with Danial (Elvis) Knight after Craig departed during the 2019-20 season. The club went through a restructure in the back office, leading to Eddie Nix being appointed as Director of Football and the creation of the Ardley United Development team, managed by Carl Reed.

At the end of the 2020-21 Season Ardley initially remained in the Uhlsport Hellenic League after the FA's restructuring of the National League System saw the Hellenic League move westwards. After an appeal to the FA which was ultimately successful, Ardley United are now in the Spartan South Midlands League and this season will be manged by Jules McCalmon.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town remain unbeaten at home since November. However, their five game winning streak at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground was brought to an end by visitors Ardley United, who clawed back a two goal deficit to claim a point.

Sam Collier's team had looked to be in a commanding position courtesy of well-taken goals from Anaclet Odhiambo and Mark Francis. But Bassett conceded cheaply just before the interval to restore hope for Ardley. And the visitors were then able to muster a fine equaliser to claim a share of the spoils.

Bassett had demonstrated their clinical edge in the opening period, grabbing their two goals with their opening pair of clear cut chances.

The veteran Odhiambo delivered the first, ending a fine move involving Alfie Presley and Brad Pagliaroli shortly after the quarter hour mark. It was quickly two. Robbing possession from the Ardley defence, Francis produced an emphatic finish to register his eighth goal of the season.

But just before half time a soft goal halved Bassett's advantage. An unfortunate slip from George Ford gave Owen James the room he needed and his shot squirmed beneath 'keeper Eddie Cavanagh.

Ardley's youthful side appeared the most lively following the restart and arguably got their just rewards when James expertly controlled a cross-field ball, wrong-footing Presley with his first touch, and rifling home to complete his brace.

The result leaves Bassett's position - 16th in the table - unchanged as they missed out on an opportunity to climb three places.

A top half finish is still within sight though, and is something Bassett will clearly be aiming for given just six points separate them from seventh place Burnham. With ten games to go, there is plenty still to play for in an exceptionally tight division.







Club Volunteers In Focus

Volunteers are the lifeblood of Grass Roots Football and Royal Wootton Bassett Town are lucky to have many fantastic helpers, some of whom have been with the club for a long period of time. This season the match day programme will may homage to some of these people without whom the club would be unable to maintain its current level of activity.

Today's featured volunteer is: $\mathbf{Rod} \ \mathbf{Carter}$

Rod Carter first got involved at Wootton Bassett Town when he was approached by Alan Blyth, who was assisting the first team manager Mick Woolford at the time. Rod used to go along to watch the games in the Wiltshire League and Alan thought that Rod might be interested in getting involved in helping out at the club. His involvement started with assisting the reserve team manager at the time Mal Baker. Rod's took on a much bigger role at the club when he succeeded Paul Harrison as club secretary at the start of the 1989-90 season, a position he was to hold well into the new century. All of Rod's time as club secretary saw the first team in the Hellenic League, with the reserves either in the Wiltshire County League (now renamed the Wiltshire Senior League) or in the reserve divisions within the Hellenic League.

Whilst still Club Secretary Rod also became a key member of the trio of unpaid groundsmen who looked after the notorious playing surface at Rylands Way. Working with Treasurer Roger Williamson and Dave Dodds (when Dave was not away on secret missions with the RAF), Rod would spend his Saturday mornings unwinding from the stresses of business life by helping prepare as decent a surface as possible for the players to play on at Bassett. No doubt the trio also had lots of lengthy discussions about the relative merits of the current crop of first team players and what the manager needed to do to improve results on the pitch.

In addition to his club duties Rod was also a club divisional representative on the committee of the Hellenic League for many years and got to work alongside League Secretary Brian King and others. Rod enjoyed his time on the committee and when interviewed a few seasons back he noted that it was good to be able to see things from both sides but any issues relating to our own club had to be dealt with via other club representatives.

Rod finally stepped down as Club Secretary at the end of the 2010-11 season having reached the age of 65, and after 22 years in the role. Those who are not familiar with the club history might be surprised to learn this is not the longest tenure as Club Secretary, that honour resides with Mr Wootton Bassett Town, Percy Stone who held the secretary position for 34 seasons from 1934-35.

When Rod stepped down as Club Secretary it was not the end of his football activities, he remained involved at Bassett, including the match announcer role he still does to this day, but he also went to work for the Wiltshire FA for six-years helping the Chairman and Secretary to bring the them into the 21st century with full time staff for the first time. Rod is certainly the most experienced member of our volunteer base and I doubt few, if any, clubs in the county will be able to match someone with his experience over the years. Rod was made a Life Member in 2008, the second person to receive that honour.

First Team Match Report

Royal Wootton Bassett Town principally rely on Adam Corcoran (pictured right) for his defensive qualities. But the powerful centre half is not averse to contributing at the opposite end of the pitch from time to time. And his brace away against Lydney Town proved decisive, ensuring Bassett were able to register their first Hellenic League Premier Division win of the season as they came from behind to deservedly triumph 3-1.

Corcoran's goals came in relatively similar fashion as he headed home from a pair of free kicks delivered by his defensive partner Sam Ockwell. It's certainly a rare occurrence that a defender scores twice in a game. Rarer still that both those goals be created by another member of the team's rear-guard.

But Sam Collier and his side will certainly take that, with the performance across the pitch being one more than worthy of victory against a Lydney side who always represent tough customers - particularly when playing at home.

Victory was earned the hard way too as Bassett, second best in the game's early exchanges, trailed courtesy of Lewis Thompson's opener as the half hour mark approached. Allowing their hosts to too easily take advantage of a throw in, the ball was worked into Thompson, who sidestepped 'keeper Eddie Cavanagh before finding the net.

But that sparked a spell in which Bassett were clearly the side on top. Tom Moore twice spurned chances to pull level, first putting past the post after good link up



play with B a i l e y G a l l a g h e r before then finding the crossbar.

E v e n t u a l l y though, parity was restored as Corcoran glanced in a header from an Ockwell set piece delivery with half time approaching.

If anything the interval arguably came at a time when Bassett least wanted it to arrive. Yet it seemed not to dent the side's momentum.

And soon after the restart they were in front. Ockwell again was involved in the build up, his headed clearance initiating an attack, which Moore eventually finished off with a fine finish for his third goal of the campaign.

Having continued to enjoy the better of proceedings, legs eventually began to tire and Bassett ceded control of the game to their hosts.

However, taking advantage of the respite offered by another set piece situation, Bassett extended their lead with just under twenty minutes remaining as Corcoran again guided an Ockwell delivery into the back of the net.

It was frenetic stuff in the game's closing minutes as play swung from end-to-end. But Bassett comfortably retained their lead to seal three points and that allimportant first league win of the campaign.



Every league has its fancied sides, the big spenders who 'should' be in the mix. But every league will have some who come from nowhere, where everything falls into place and it they really do have the season of their lives. Like Hornchurch last season celebrating FA Trophy glory under the arch. There can't have been anyone in the country who foresaw that happening.

This weekend the Step 1 clubs are getting underway to make it a full Non-League house. The FA Cup is in full swing, crowds are up, goals are flying in. It feels almost normal again. There may be some bumps in the road this season, Covid hasn't gone away and a glance across the fixture list shows the pandemic is still having an impact on postponements. But, after a long absence, it feels good to be inching back towards that routine. And the normality of all my predictions falling flat on their face by the end of September! Enjoy your game...


