## Welcome To Today's Game

**GOOD AFTERNOON** and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round tie against Windsor.

A warm welcome to our visitors from Windsor who have made the journey down the M4 for what is their first game of the season with the Combined Counties League not having yet started their league fixtures. Until last season Windsor were part of the UHlsport Hellenic League and regular opponents and it is nice to see them return after such a short absence in the most prestigious of cup competitions. Hopefully, like Tuesday night, we will attract another bumper crowd here this afternoon.

Windsor will have a couple of familiar faces in the dugout today as Mick Woodham, the manager who oversaw a victory for Windsor on their last visit is back in charge. He has also brought back former Fulham striker Barry Hayles as part of his management team and, despite being 50 now, he has been playing in pre-season games and it will be interesting to see if he takes any part in the action here today.

The reward for the winner of today's fixture will be a home game against either Highworth Town or Reading City in the next round. A few rumours are doing the rounds that Highworth are currently finding it hard to attract players willing to do the travelling involved in the Central Division of the Southern League and, if true, is another example of how some of the lateral moves imposed on teams under the NLS can impact clubs in a negative way. Hopefully Highworth will be competitive in that division this season and both they and ourselves can win today and set up a tasty looking local derby in the next round. I am sure today's opponents will also be hoping that they can set up a game against Reading City which would also be a local affair that would attract a sizeable crowd. For both sides a win today would not only be remunerative from the perspective of

the prize money on offer but also in terms of the potential gate in the next round of the competition.

### WINNING START

Congratulations to Sam and the lads for getting off to a winning start in front of what was a bumper crowd of 192. Not only three points but a clean sheet and no bookings as well, a good night all round. A brief match report from Tuesday's game is included in today's programme.

Our next league game is next Tuesday night when we travel to Roman Glass St George. Roman Glass did the double over us last season, including a 4-1 defeat on our last visit to Bristol and we will be looking to put on much better performance this season. Next Saturday we are away at Jeff Roberts Chipping Sodbury Town and their will no doubt be a few familiar faces playing for our former manager.

### OTHER SIDES FIXTURES

The Development Side start their defence of the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division title next Saturday with the visit of Frome Collegians, looking to avenge a narrow defeat in pre-season. They follow up with a midweek trip to play newly promoted Blunston, winners of the Swindon & District League Premier Division last season.

Fixtures for the first month of the season for both the Under 18 Floodlit side and the Veterans' team are also now out and are included in today's programme for the first time. The only fixtures still to come out at the time of going to press are those for the Women's side but I note FA Full-Time has now been set up for Season 2022-23 for the league so they should be imminent.

Enjoy the game and hopefully progress for Bassett to the Preliminary Round of this famous competition and a possible big local derby clash with Highworth Town.

Windsor Wins

There have been eight 'Royal Rumbles' against Windsor with Windsor having much the better record with five wins to just two for Royal Wootton Bassett Town. All eight fixtures have taken place in the past six seasons with the first meeting coming in the FA Vase in Season 2015-16 when we lost 2-1 at Windsor's Stagg Meadow ground, record appearance maker Steve Yeardeley with the solitary Bassett goal.

Two seasons later saw the two teams playing in the same division as Windsor moved into the UHlsport Hellenic League from the Combined Counties League. The first meeting was here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground and it finished honours even at one goal apiece, Chris Jackson with the Bassett goal, this despite Windsor having to play the game with ten men for 50 minutes after the dismissal of Joash Nembhard.

The return fixture at the beginning of October was to see Royal Wootton Bassett Town's one and only victory at Stagg Meadow. Bassett were on a good run at the time and Ben Lodge's goal twelve minutes from time delivered Royal Wootton Bassett Town's eighth straight victory as they edged out ten man Windsor 1-0. Windsor once again had a player sent-off, this time it was former Fulham player Barry Hayles who saw red.

Season 2018-19 was to see three meetings between the two sides, the clubs also meeting in the Floodlit Cup as well as the two league encounters. The two league games were close affairs and the first game at Stagg Meadow was certainly good for the neutrals if not the Bassett management! Royal Wootton Bassett Town saw a three-goal advantage slip as a stunning comeback from Windsor saw the hosts strike four times in a frenzied second half to claim the points in a thrilling advert for Hellenic League football. Bassett avenged that defeat in the return at the Gerard Buxton Ground but it was a backs to the wall defensive performance in the second half on this occasion as Bassett defended a 2-0 half time lead. Windsor once again came out second half strongly but this time could only get the one goal. It was a different story in the Floodlit Cup though as Windsor were comfortable 4-0 winners on a cold December evening.

The final two meetings came in Season 2019-20 when Windsor did the double over Bassett, winning 4-2 at the Gerard Buxton Ground and 3-1 in the return at Stagg Meadow. By the following season Windsor had departed from the Hellenic League and were back in the Combined Counties League with much less travelling to do.

### Familiar theme as set piece struggles again haunt Bassett

But Windsor pulled away in the second half.

First, Andrew Ingham headed in from a Dylan Ive corner.

The visitors then struck twice in quick succession.

Kingsley Etefia bundled in after Rae had initially denied Ive before Ive swung in another corner, which fell to Luke Brooks-Smith to drive home.

Bohane scored a simple tap in late on, but that was nothing more than a consolation goal as Bassett were well beaten..





# Opponents History

## WINDSOR FC

Summer 2011 and it's rather ironic that 100 years of senior football at Stag Meadow should be celebrated by the birth of a brand new club, Windsor FC, which came to be following the sad demise after 118 years of Windsor & Eton FC. During the final death throes of the previous club it became apparent, following several well attended supporters' meetings, that the will was there to continue to host a senior football club in Windsor for the community to embrace and, therefore, on February 4th 2011 WFC Football Community Development Ltd was registered with Companies House with the aim of achieving that objective. Founding Director Kevin Stott and a newly-appointed management committee then set about the long and sometimes arduous task of turning that dream into a reality.

Windsor's founding season turned out to be a very exciting one, eventually finishing as runners-up to worthy Champions Guildford City in the league and they also made it to the semi-finals of the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy so it was close but no silverware to show for it, although that is not entirely true as Ryan O'Toole won the Golden Boot as top scorer in the Premier Division and Hayden Wheelers' efforts in editing their programme led to it being voted best programme in the Premier Division.

Several weeks into season 2012/2013 a major decision to operate without a budget was taken to free up funds for the regeneration plans at the ground and the management team and all but three of the playing squad left immediately. Mick Woodham was appointed as the new manager and had two days to get together a squad before Windsor's next league game. Despite some heavy defeats early in his tenure as he built a squad of local youngsters the club never lost faith and Mick eventually put together a squad that was to finish a very creditable 6th in the league as well as another appearance in the semi-finals of the county Senior Trophy competition whilst Windsor's Under 18's side made it all the way to the CCL's Grant McLellan Youth Cup Final eventually losing to a very strong Camberley Town side.

Recognition from the league away from football

itself was achieved with a Groundsman of the Year award for the CCL and this was added to in August 2013 when Windsor groundsman Lewis Clements won the FA Groundsman of the Year Award for the whole of Step 5 and 6 football nationally, something both he and the club are justifiably proud of whilst also giving some extra publicity to the CCL.

This building process continued in 2013/14, and it was in this season that Mick Woodham guided Windsor to their first ever trophy. A resounding 3-0 victory over Reading Town in the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy Final. The success was repeated the following season when Woodham's young guns defeated a talented Flackwell Heath side 3-2 in the final at Burnham FC's Gore ground.

The football club experimented with a Senior Reserve side for one season before committing to a long-term link up with the Cox Green Academy and the re-focusing on an Under 18 team. The aim to offer a clear path to all youngsters to the Senior First team.

Over the next few seasons this approach paid huge dividends. In 2017/18 Windsor FC made it through seven rounds of the FA Vase before losing to eventual runners-up Stockton Town in the Quarter Finals.

In 2018-2019 Windsor improved finished 6th in the UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, and reached the Final of the League Cup, went out early in the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup but had another run in the FA Vase before losing at a very strong Biggleswade in Round 5.

They remained in the Hellenic Premier Division for the two Covid impacted seasons but were in the bottom half of the table in both seasons at the time matters were brought to a premature end and manager Mick Woodham departed.

Season 2021-22 saw them back to the Combined Counties League, forming part of the new Premier Division North finishing in 7th spot. Season 2022-23 sees the return of Mick Woodham as manager looking to achieve the same success as in his first spell in charge.

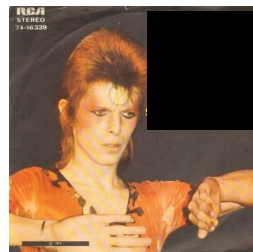

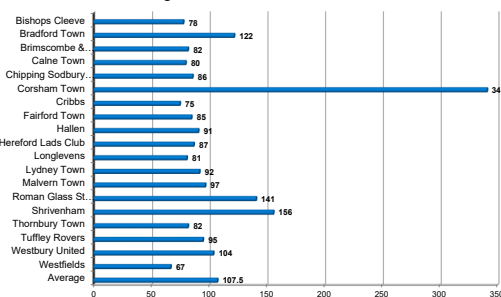

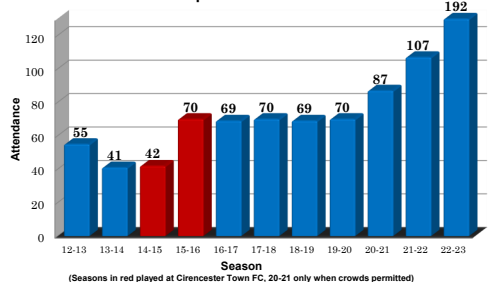

## MEN'S FIRST TEAM

### Fruitful start as Bassett squeeze past Mangos

Opening day success has been rare for Royal Wootton Bassett Town in recent seasons. But Sam Collier's side made sure they were quick off the mark to start the 2022-23 Hellenic League Premier Division campaign as an impressive performance helped Bassett to a narrow 1-0 victory against Mangotsfield United.

hour mark when Presley skewed wide as Bassett countered following a defensive lapse.

By this point though it was Mangotsfield who were in the ascendancy, with the visitors having already seen a deflected effort graze the woodwork. Moments after Presley's miss, they were almost ahead too as a stunning volleyed effort seemed as though it was destined to open the scoring, but Bassett 'keeper Matt Crowther pulled off an outstanding acrobatic save to tip the ball around the post.

Going into half time goalless with both teams having enjoyed spells of pressure, the game was finely poised.

And it's outcome would soon be decided.

Ten minutes after the restart, an incisive Bassett break had the Mangotsfield backline on their heels. It did initially appear as though the attack would be snuffed out as imposing centre half Michael Grist went to ground to challenge Bailey Gallagher inside the visitors' penalty area. However, fortunately for Bassett, the ball fell back into Gallagher's feet and, with Clarke drawn from his line, he squared for Presley to slot home.

Bassett now had the wind in their sails, but a second goal was not forthcoming. That made for a somewhat nervy finish to the match. However, with Collier's side defensively sound, Mangotsfield were unable to fashion anything of note despite the extra men they were throwing forward.





# Random Thoughts

## SEASON PREVIEW MAGS

One of the main things I look forward to at the start of each football season is the season preview magazines and not just for the English Premier League/ Championship. For many years now, as well as FourFourTwo's UK season preview, I have been collecting the season previews for the German Bundesliga and the Dutch Eredivisie.



By far the best of the lot is the one that Kicker produce for the Bundesliga in Germany, well in fact it is more than just the Bundesliga it is all the divisions below down to some of the regional leagues (our equivalent of the top tiers of non-league football). Even if your German skills are not up to it there is still plenty of interest with statistics and pictures

galore. This includes lots of details on all the players in the Bundesliga and Bundesliga 2, record appearances and goal scorers for each club, managers over the years, all-time league tables going back to the formation of the two leagues and much more. There also full squad pictures for each team in the top two divisions. There are also team pictures for all the third division teams, although these only take up 1/3 of a page with the rest of the page taken up with squad details for the coming season and other useful bits of information. There are a few pages at the back dedicated to Women's football which I am sure when I buy this season's edition will have increased in number as the Women's game increases in popularity (but there is also a separate Women's edition produced of similar size to the Men's). As I say, by far the best of the season preview magazines. Last season the magazine contained 272 pages and cost just a bargain €6.20 if bought in Germany but can be obtained for around £14 in the UK from Soccer Books Limited ([www.soccer-books.co.uk](http://www.soccer-books.co.uk)).

Not far behind Kicker's German season preview is the one produced by Voetbal International for the Dutch game. Last season's edition was even bigger than the Kicker one was, running to a massive 276 pages and costing €12.99. Again, it can be bought from Soccer Books Limited and last season cost £12 plus postage. I started collecting this particular pre-season magazine when we started doing the Dutch tours with the Youth

Section and is an invaluable source of information for preparing the Tour Programme. As with the German equivalent there are masses of statistics, individual player pictures (although the 2021-22 Edition did not have the normal team pictures) meaning even if you cannot speak Dutch there is plenty of material to look through. Again, as well as the top division (Eredivisie) there is also a similar amount of information on the second tier of the Dutch league (Eerste Divisie), and I always go straight to the FC Dordrecht page given our links with that club. There is also a limited amount of information on divisions below that level and the women's game. The reason it runs to more pages than the German magazine is that it also covers the top divisions in England, Germany, Spain, Italy, and Belgium. I highly recommend both magazines and I am looking forward to getting my hands on this season's editions shortly.



FourFourTwo's effort on the English and Scottish game is nowhere near as substantial running to just 100 pages and lacks the statistics and picture content of its continental rivals. Nevertheless, it is a good read with fans from each club commenting on their sides. It is even better when they get Clive Whittingham (this season's choice) or Dave Thomas to write the bit on QPR (both proper football journalists) rather than the guy known to QPR fans of my generation as Terry Cinzano who is unfortunately back writing for the club programme as well as the Non-League Paper. FourFourTwo's edition comes with the August edition of the normal magazine which costs £6.99 from all good newsagents.

# The Non-League Paper

## LIONESSES STOLE HEARTS OF A NATION



FROM the very moment Leah Williamson proudly held aloft the Euro 2022 trophy for England in front of a packed-out Wembley crowd on Sunday, the 'L' word has captured the imagination of young people throughout the grass roots game. The 'Lionesses' stole the hearts of a nation after their nerve-jangling 2-1 victory over Germany ended England's 56-year wait for a major trophy, watched by an estimated TV audience of 20 million. But it's another 'L' word, Legacy, which has taken the euphoria of victory to a whole new level and ignited interest in the women's game like never before.

Just hours after England's victory parade at London's Trafalgar Square on Monday, in front of thousands of joyous fans, new figures revealed unprecedented increases in young Brits looking to get involved. Analysis of Google search data revealed that searches for 'football lessons' exploded by 665% in the United Kingdom, while searches for 'Girl's football team' rose by 3.167%.

"The Lionesses' historic win has undoubtedly uplifted and inspired the nation, which is only further confirmed by these findings," said a spokesman for sports and fitness experts BarBend.

"The sport, which is beloved by the British public, not only improves our technical capabilities but is also one of the most enjoyable sports to play, reliant on team bonding and communication. With support and admiration for the Lionesses appearing to not die down any time soon, it will be incredibly interesting to see if these figures translate into sign-ups for football lessons up and down the country."

With the growth of the women's game escalated to these new heights, all eyes will naturally be on local non-League clubs to help provide the platform for this new legacy to take hold. Undoubtedly, Non-League football's most successful women's team is Lewes, whose first team currently play in the Women's

Championship. The women's affiliate of the Isthmian League club, which prides itself on its 100% fan and community ownership, was established in 2002 and is growing by the year, thanks to their Elite Pathway schemes.

Lewes hit the headlines nationally in 2017 when they became the first professional or semi-professional football club to pay its women's team the same as its men's team as part of their Equality FC initiative. To this day, they remain the only club to issue equal pay.

In last week's NLP, we told how National League club Bromley were leading the support for the Lionesses with their extensive community programme. Including the youth section and academy, the Ravens have around 200 women and girls playing each week, starting from the 4-11 year-olds Wildcats, the 12-16 year olds in The Squad, and the Bromley Belles, a fun recreational women's side which has seen a growth in participants from 12 to 50.

"I hope it has given people the taste and changed attitudes towards women playing football," said the club's a full-time women and girls' development officer, Andrea Ellis.

"You've got to see it to believe it. Now we know young girls are seeing it. There are men wearing shirts with women's names on the back – Williamson on the back, or [Millie] Bright. That fills my heart with joy, it's amazing.

"The Euros has ignited something. I'd like to think people will be actively seeking to get on the pitch. That has a knock-on effect – more women get involved, become coaches, more teams. It has a massive domino effect on the whole game."

It's clear the 'L' word is the driving force behind a new community phenomenon about to sweep the nation. 'Love', 'Lionesses' or 'Legacy', take your pick, but one thing's for sure it's provided the perfect fillip to the start 2022-23 season at all levels of the game – and Non-League clubs can take full advantage.

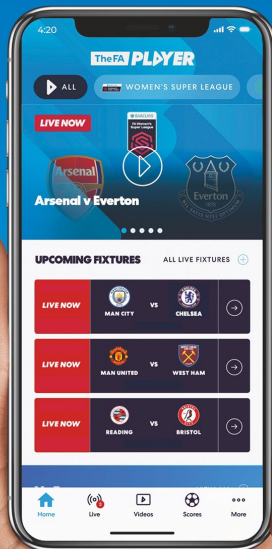

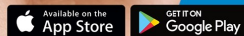

# Season 2021-22 Final Analysis

## WSL PREMIER DIVISION WINNERS 2021/22

Finishing with the league's best attacking and defensive records and dropping just twelve points from their 32 games, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development were deserved winners of the Wiltshire Senior League Premier Division in 2021/22 as they edged out Pewsey Vale in a thrilling title race.

Bassett secured the crown – the first league title for either of the club's two senior men's sides since the First Team claimed County League honours in 1987/88 – courtesy of a 1-0 win away against Pewsey in their penultimate match of the season. In a winner-takes-all contest, Dale Richards' first half goal proved enough as a valiant defensive effort kept Pewsey at bay.

Finishing as champions was just reward for a fantastic season from start to finish for Steve Yeardley's team.

Bassett had made something of a tentative start, edging out Devizes Town Reserves 2-1 in their season opener. Tyler Sheppard and Nick Mason had given the Development side a 2-0 lead, but the visitors halved their deficit late on before coming close to snatch a point.

However, after that narrow win, Bassett reeled off seven further consecutive wins – all by at least a three goal margin. Bassett kept a hat-trick of clean sheets in comfortable wins against Wroughton (5-0), Marlborough Town (7-0) and Malmesbury Victoria Development (4-0). Then, after defeating Shrewton United 4-1 on the road in what was a statement victory, they made it five wins on the bounce by thrashing near neighbour Purton 19-0 at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground. Their winning streak reached seven games with a 4-1 triumph at Corsham Town Development before five unanswered second half goals away at Frome Collegians made it maximum points from eight matches.

Both Bassett's stingy defence and prolific attack stood out in those opening eight contests, with six clean sheets as well as

twelve goals for Matt Bennett and ten for Richards.

The next four weeks then threw up the biggest challenge Bassett had so far faced. The first points of the season were dropped when Bassett shared four goals with Calne Town Reserves in a midweek thriller. Yeardley's team then came from behind to beat Salisbury Development 2-1 courtesy of a Bennett brace – a result that took Bassett top. They wouldn't last long in first place though as, after a hard-fought 4-0 win at Stratton Juniors, Bassett fell to a 3-1 home loss against fellow front-runners Pewsey.

Revenge would eventually come – but not after Bassett had been forced to play catch up as a result of postponements over the coming weeks.

Indeed, between 23 October and 29 January, Bassett were able to play just seven games. All of those resulted in victory as Odd Down Reserves (3-1), Shrewton (4-0), Melksham Town Reserves (2-0), Ludgershall Sports (6-1), Purton (10-0), Trowbridge Town (1-0) and Devizes Town Reserves (2-0) were all seen off. Most important among that string of victories was that at home against Trowbridge – a side battling for a top three finish, with the points being earned by Jon Beeden's second half header.

Despite that run, Bassett still entered February with three games in hand to play on Pewsey, who held a seven-point lead.

There was therefore little room for error – and that seemingly got even slimmer after Bassett were held to a 1-1 home draw by ten-man Malmesbury under the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground lights on a Friday night.

Yeardley's side bounced back with a trio of home wins against Calne (3-0), Corsham (3-1) and Odd Down (1-0) though, and received a lift when Pewsey fell to a 3-2 loss away at Corsham.



Bassett's winning run then continued as Josh Connolly and Bailey Gallagher scored in a nervy 2-0 triumph at Wroughton before a pair of comfortable wins at Melksham (8-2) and home against Marlborough (8-0) to begin the final month of the campaign.

A dramatic late 3-2 victory at home against Frome Collegians, earned courtesy of a Beeden winner, coupled with a Pewsey draw against Malmesbury then took Bassett back to the top, with a two point lead and a game in hand to play.

Bassett were thus now in control of their own destiny. But after hitting twelve without reply in the return fixture at home against Stratton, Bassett came unstuck away at Trowbridge, a late Bennett penalty not being enough to prevent a 2-1 loss.

That result, combined with a win for Pewsey against Stratton, meant the coming meeting between the teams would likely be a championship decider. Going into the match at Pewsey, the hosts led by a point having played a game more. Therefore, if either side won the title race would be over, while a draw would put pressure on Bassett to get a result in their final match.

Richards' goal ensured that would not be required though as Bassett dug deep to claim victory and be confirmed as champions.

The trophy would then be presented at Salisbury – after Bassett twice came from behind to salvage a draw, with Bennett and Richards (pictured middle & bottom below) scoring their 42nd and 35th goals of the campaign respectively.
