Welcome To Today's Game

Good Afternoon & Welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for our second women's home league fixture of the season.

Today's visitors Forest Green Rovers are looking as strong a team as last season and we will need to perform at our very best to secure any points from today's game. I extend a warm welcome to our visitors from Forest Green who have made the shortest of trips from Gloucestershire to join us this afternoon.

The two fixtures last season, I classed as local derby, due to it being on paper our shortest journey all season. But not this season with Bristol Rovers being promoted they get the local derby tag instead. Last season fixtures against today's opponents had disappointments for two different reasons, the home game was purely on football played, they gave us a football lesson in how to keep the ball and build the play through the thirds and in Samantha Morris they had centre half who was not worried about committing fouls in the middle of the pitch to break up play and on the day fully deserved the 3-5 win.

The away fixture was a disappointment in that the pitch, dugouts and changing rooms were of a poor standard compared to the rest of the league teams we had visited that season. The game itself was a scrappy one in which Rovers took their chances in the game and ran out 3-1 winners on the day.

Last Sunday saw both teams progress safely into the third qualifying round of the Vitality Women's FA Cup. Both teams faced lower league opposition, Rovers winning at home 8-0 against Weston Super Mare, and us winning 6-0 away at Middlezoy. I was asked after the win who I wanted in the next round and I felt sure we would draw Warminster away and maybe have a chance to put right /

avenge after they put us out last season in the County Cup, in controversial circumstances but this was not to be. However I did get the 'away' bit right and we now head to Torquay United looking to make history with a win. The win in the last round brought prize money of £3,000 to the club and with a further £1,000 minimum guaranteed even if we were to lose in the next round, I am reliably informed that the Women's team have made more money for the club than the Men's First Team this season thanks to the FA uplifting the prize money in the Women's competition.

We are scheduled to be home again next Sunday in the other cup competition, the Wiltshire FA's County Cup when we entertain Salisbury here at the Sustain Stadium.

Enjoy the game today and hopefully a win for us to get our season up and running.

Today's Opponents History

FOREST GREEN ROVERS

1894 Like almost all women's sides the parent club was formed as a men's side and became founder members of the Mid Gloucestershire League (MGL), the first league in the county outside of the city of Bristol.

1902 When the MGL folded the club become members of the newly formed Stroud League and also the Dursley & District League.

1903 First piece of silverware was secured when the club won the Dursley and District League.

1912 Won the Stroud League under the name Nailsworth and Forest Green United, after the Nailsworth Club amalgamated with the club at the top of the hill above the town.

1921 After a break during WWI, the club enjoyed a period of great success winning two football leagues and three cups in both 1921 and 1922.

1926 The Lawn was created with the field where the team played officially enclosed.

1927 A crowd of over 5,000 saw the club lift the County Cup beating the Sharpness Sharks in nearby Dursley.

1936 Committee members bought the club's field at auction for the princely sum of £120.

1938 Won the Northern Senior League for the first time in 1938.

1968 Joined the newly formed County League.

1975 Were promoted to the Hellenic League.

1982 A successful few years culminate in a double winning season as the club clinched the Hellenic League title and won the FA Vase, defeating Rainworth Miners Welfare 3-0.

1989 In a bid to turn the club's fortunes around, the club were renamed Stroud FC but this near disastrous when many life-long fans & committee members turning their back on the club.

1992 The club name changed back to Forest Green Rovers.

1997 Frank Gregan arrived as manager in 1994, taking the club to the Southern League Southern Division title in 1997 and into the Southern League Premier Division for the first time.

1998 A showdown with Merthyr Tydfil in front of a record crowd of 2,962 at the newly upgraded Lawn saw the club through to the Conference.

1999 Despite being favourites for relegation the club went back to Wembley in the FA Trophy, becoming the first club to appear in both the Trophy and Vase finals. The Trophy final was lost to Kingstonian 1-0.

2001 Under Nigel Spink, the club returned to the Trophy Final at Villa Park, this time losing to Canvey Island again by a single goal.

2006 The New Lawn officially opened in September, 400m away from the old stadium. The ground was built to Football League standards and painted head to toe by the club's supporters, a tradition set back in the 1950s.

2010 With the club in financial difficulty, Ecotricity founder Dale Vince got involved with the club in August, to improve the club's social and environmental impact.

2015 The club went completely vegan as a football club, the first and still the only certified vegan team in the world.

2016 The club announce plans to move to a new 5,000 seat stadium to be built beside junction 13 of the M5, with plans for the stadium to be made almost entirely out of wood.

2017 Mark Cooper leads the club to the Football League for the first time in the club's history, following a 3-1 success over Tranmere Rovers in the National League play-off final at Wembley.

2019 In December, Stroud District Council approved plans to build Eco Park. The club aim to make their proposed new home the world's greenest football stadium, for the world's greenest football club.

2021 The FGR Women's team become part of the club, having previously been an independent organisation. The club also announced plans to launch a girl's academy.

The previously independent Women's team had been very successful playing in the The FA Women's National League Southern Division as recently as Season 2015-16. An exodus of players saw them drop back to the South West Regional League, winning the Eastern Division in 2016-17 and promotion to the Premier Division. However, the women's side were relegated back two seasons later. Leading the Eastern Division at the time Covid brought the 2020-21 Season to a premature close they were elevated back to the Premier for Season 2021-22. Last season saw Forest Green in 5th place but some eight points behind the side above them in the table.

Ladies Suffer Second Rovers Reverse

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies fell to a second league defeat of the season against Forest Green Rovers as they were beaten 3-1 away from home.

Rovers had triumphed 5-3 when the teams faced off at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground in November and, while half as many goals were scored in the return meeting, there was again plenty of goalmouth action. Unfortunately for Bassett though, it was the home side who made the most of the chances they created with Graham Fletcher's side left to rue a number of opportunities that they passed up.

It took just seven minutes for the game's opening goal to arrive as Hattie Jones controlled a low corner and fired in on the turn with a powerful drive from twelve yards.

Bassett were level shortly after as Libby Davies set a pass back to Lani Dickinson, who produced a fizzing first time strike from the edge of the area that flew past home custodian Rebecca Panniers.

Rovers then restored their advantage in the game's 20th minute with the third high quality goal of the afternoon. After receiving a pass from Louise Fensome, midfielder Zoe Boyd drove forward, weaving her way past three

Bassett defenders, before arriving an unstoppable left foot strike beyond Millie Powell and into the top corner.

The hosts extended their advantage further six minutes after the restart, earning a lead two-goal lead that would last until full time. A questionable handball decision went against Bassett. And from 25 yards Charlie Rowlands delivered a curling free kick that crashed in off the bar.

The result moves Forest Green to within three points of Bassett in the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division with a game in hand still to play.

Rovers Late Surge Sees Off Bassett

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies fell to their second league defeat of the season as they were beaten 5-3 by Forest Green Rovers in an enthralling, high-scoring affair. After the game was all square at 1-1 at the break, the second half produced six goals - with the visitors eventually sealing the points courtesy of two goals in the final five minutes.

The result means Bassett missed out on moving up from fourth position, with a visit to title favourites Ilminster Town up next.

And Graham Fletcher's side will certainly be rueing the opportunity not to have claimed at least a point against Forest Green in a see-saw contest.

It took less than five minutes for the deadlock to be broken as Ella Hitchcox broke into the box and produced a fine first time finish to put away Nynka Rucker's low cross into the box.

However, Bassett were on level terms shortly after. Laura Jefferies swung in a trademark towering free kick from the left side and leading scorer Libby Davies flicked home a header into the bottom right corner.

The opening period delivered no further goals. But after the restart it did not take long for the floodgates to open.

Bassett were the side to strike first. After

controlling a Jefferies free kick on the edge of the area, Davies twisted and turned as she sought to fashion space to shoot. As she did so, Rovers' captain Hattie Jones aimed to win the ball back but her tackle served only to find a gap in her side's defence, allowing Amber Egerton to run in to pounce on the loose ball and fire home.

The visitors were then gifted an equaliser. Bassett failed to clear their lines and the ball fell to Jones, whose 25 yard shot slipped through the hands of 'keeper Millie Powell.

Two minutes later the visitors were ahead as Rucker raced onto a hopeful punt upfield, outmuscled Olivia Owenson and coolly slotted into the corner.

Trailing for a second time, Bassett were able to make it 3-3 with 25 minutes to go as Davies met a Jefferies free kick with another fine glancing header that nestled into the corner.

That meant a grandstand finish was on the cards. Unfortunately for Bassett though, it was the visitors who would strike two decisive blows.

Jones restored her side's lead with her second of the afternoon, scoring with a snap shot after Charlie Rowlands' low corner broke to her.

Hitchcox then sealed the win. Rowlands' slide rule pass split the Bassett defence and her strike partner latched onto the through ball before rounding an onrushing Powell and calmly slotting into the net from a tight angle.

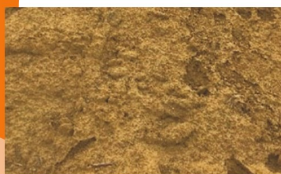

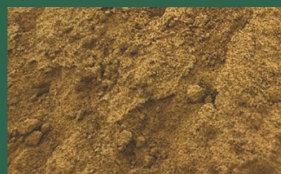



FEMALE BOSSES IN MEN'S GAME



I USED to have a teacher at school called Mrs Parker.

She was hardly your archetypal role model - in fact she'd be amazed to think that I suggested so - but she understood me and was ultimately the reason I ended up in my dream job.

It was the kind of mutual respect that has followed me around my working life – particularly with female influencers. I've worked under two female editors and countless superiors and took a little bit from each one on my career path.

Last week, Tony Incenzo dedicated his Non-League Paper column to Rosi Webb. In charge of Eastern Counties League Division One South side Stanway Pegasus, she is the first permanent female manager of any team playing in the National League System from Steps 1 to 6.

And a jolly good job she's doing too, having recently overseen the club's promotion from the Essex & Suffolk Border League.

Rosi's twitter bio reads "Making my way in the Male game" - and she's built up quite an impeccable CV. She has been coaching for 15 years and has held the UEFA B licence for the last six.

She's certainly put in the hard yards but her success is also built on that kind of mutual respect that she has from the players and officials at Pegasus.

"I knew it would be a big challenge but it was a prospect I simply couldn't down," she said when asked about her arrival at the club three years ago.

"With Ian [Booth, club owner] as my assistant, we make a good partnership and compliment each other on the management side.

"My experience within the men's game has been nothing but positive. Right through being given this opportunity by the club to the respect I receive from the players and every team we play against.

"But I feel that respect works both ways and there are numerous great people that help make this club what it is. We have created a family environment and everybody is equally important, from the Under 6s all the way to the first team. I am a small part of this."

Humble indeed, but Rosi's pioneering role in changing the face of women's involvement in football can not be understated.

With the media spotlight still very much on Sarina Weigman and her England's Euro 2022 heroines, here is someone who continues to break down barriers in the men's game too.

But Rosi won't be a lone trailblazer for long, I'm sure. Mary Phillip – England's first female black captain – is making a name for herself in charge of Kent County League side Peckham Town, at Step 7 and is destined for bigger things, while the number of women's coaches gaining their badges is increasing all the time.

Chelsea FC head coach Emma Hayes has won everything there is to win in the women's game and has previously been linked to a number of top jobs in the Football League. Surely it's only a matter of time before she, or perhaps the extremely highly rated Weigman, land a pioneering role in British football.

As the saying goes 'respect has to be earned' and it's clear to me that a women's role in football – whether it be as a player, coach or in the media – has made huge steps in doing just that.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Under 18s had the chance to move back top of the table above Radstock Town but knew they would have to win away at Melksham Town to do so. However, Bassett were back on level terms within a minute of the restart, de Paula getting on the end of a Joey Warren free-kick into the box for 1-1.

Both sides continued to play some good passing football, but it remained all square until ten minutes from time mainly due to the efforts of the two 'keepers Beard and Cranswick-Coates.

What turned out to be the winning goal came when Charlie Stammers finished off a flowing move, Stammers being found with an excellent defence splitting ball from Flynn Walters, and he finished in style for 2-1.

The visitors continued to press forward to make certain of the points. Leading scoring Jacob Rendell-Haines was presented with a couple of excellent chances to extend the lead but on both occasions, he was denied by Beard. The first came when he was put through by Noah Cranswick-Coates but Beard pulled off a great save to deny the striker.
