Welcome To Today's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Wiltshire Premier Shield fixture against Westbury United. A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey up from Westbury, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this evening and we wish you a safe journey home.

Westbury have certainly settled in well to life in the Southern League and currently sit in the top half of the table with five wins, five defeats and three draws in their opening 13 games at Step 4 in the National League System. Last season Westbury were in the UHlsport Hellenic League and did a league double over us but both games were tight affairs. A report from the last meeting here at the Sustain Stadium is included in tonight's programme. Just as I am writing these notes I see that Corsham Town have just announced that Gary Higdon has left them to join Westbury so he could well be making his debut for Westbury here tonight.

Saturday saw yet another fighting comeback in a season of fighting comebacks. Having drawn with high flying Cribbs and Westfields, Sam and the lads can now add Worcester Raiders to the list. As was the case against Westfields, it was a late goal from Matt Jones that ensured we once again secured a share of the points extending our unbeaten run to four games.

On Saturday we travel to Wellington for our Second Round tie in the Isuzu FA Vase. There is a preview of that game from Press Officer Stuart in tonight's programme and the Chairman also makes reference to it in his Chairman's Chat column. The prize money up for grabs on Saturday is £900 with £275 to the loser. Whilst Wellington are towards the bottom end of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division their results have picked up in recent weeks and include a 1-1 with top of the table Bridwater and a 5-0 win on Saturday against bottom of the table Keynsham Town. We will certainly need to be at our best if we are to extend our run in this

prestigious national competition.

In all honesty we could probably have done without tonight's game against Westbury in the Wiltshire Premier Shield with such a big game coming up on Saturday, especially with all the injuries and suspensions in the camp. The one consolation is that tonight's game means that Dave Bampton will have served his ban for the sending off after the game against Westfields, although Adam Corcoran will be forced to miss the Vase game having picked up a 3-game ban for his late challenge, a very harsh sentence for what could have only been a yellow card on another day. It will be interesting to see how many players from the Development side Sam is forced to call up tonight to cover for the enforced absentees.

On the subject of the Development side, new manager Mark Simpkins continues to weave his magic spell, the 2-0 win over Stratton Juniors on Saturday extended the unbeaten run since he took over to nine games, with seven cleansheets in the last eight games. The run has seen the Development side move from bottom of the table to seventh place in a division of 16 teams.

Not such good news as far as the Women's side are concerned as they continue to look for their first league win of the season having been beaten 4-2 by Bishops Lydeard on Sunday to remain bottom of the table after six games and are looking like they will be involved in a relegation battle this season. The division has already split into two mini divisions with the bottom four sides starting to be cut adrift from the top six. It will be important for Bassett to pick up points in the games against Warminster Town, Ilminster Town and Poole if they are to avoid relegation this season.

Hopefully tonight will see a win for Bassett so that we can continue to fight on four fronts (League, Vase, Challenge Cup and the Wiltshire Premier Shield). Enjoy the game.

Opponents History

WESTBURY UNITED

The club started in 1920 when two local sides amalgamated. Westbury Old Comrades FC had just won promotion to the First Division of the Wiltshire County League and to strengthen the side they joined forces with a local junior side, Westbury Great Western Railway XI, and together they became Westbury United Football Club.

In its first season, the Club finished third from bottom of the County league and in the 1920's they struggled, but in the 1930's they won everything possible in Wiltshire football. In 1936 the Club reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. They were led by a magnificent player called Billy Pearce, who captained the County throughout the decade. Also included in the side at the time was a prolific goal scorer called Bill Butler, who scored more than eighty senior goals in one season (including thirty in a month!).

The Club purchased and moved to its present ground in Meadow Lane in 1934, the cost of the four-acre site being £475. The very first game played on what was then the Jubilee Playing Field was against Bristol City and a crowd of around 4000 attended.

The Club has produced many players who have gone on to make the grade at professional football, two of them being centre forwards for Bristol City. The first was Reg Smith who played for City in the 1930s and was then transferred to Wolverhampton Wanderers for what was described in the Press as a 'considerable fee'.

The other was John Atyeo, who for his signature City played a presentation game against Westbury and made a donation of £100. It must have been the bargain of the century as John played over 600 games for City and scored 359 goals. He also played six times for England in which he netted five goals. He died suddenly in June 1993, aged 61, and now has a grandstand named after him at City's Ashton Gate ground as well as a street in his home village of Dilton Marsh (just a few miles from Meadow Lane).

The Club has strong family traditions. Wilf Alford left Westbury before the last War to play for then First Division Portsmouth. His son, Phil, managed the Reserve Team for many years as well as stints helping at First Team level, while his grandsons have also played for the Club.

Westbury joined the Western League in 1984 and initially struggled. In 1988 floodlights were erected and Southampton were the visitors for the official switch on. Season 1988-89 saw the Club win its first honour in the League, winning the Sportsmanship Trophy. In 1991, under the management of Ian Harris, they won the First Division Title to gain promotion to the Premier Division. The highest League placing to date came in the 1994-95 season when they finished fifth.

The Club has had its share of dedicated officials who have given a lifetime of service. Former Club President, Ernie Barber, who passed away in December 2012, used to carry

the team kit as a seven-year-old (1933) and after the war he started playing. When he finished playing he became Secretary and held the post until the end of the 1996-97 season when he decided to retire.

With the help of the Football Stadia Improvement Fund, been able to replace the drainage system on the pitch as well as erect fencing around the ground and a wall around the pitch.

Following several seasons in the 2000s where the aim of promotion to the Toolstation Premier League wasn't achieved, long standing manager Paul Brickley stood down and there was 6 seasons of struggle from 2010/11 till 2015/16 under various managers with the team finishing in the bottom 3 every time!

There were major changes behind the scenes with the aim of driving the Club forward. Although the team finished bottom of the league in 2014-2015 we were reprieved from relegation and made a minor improvement in 2015-2016.

The 2015/16 season had a similar theme, Westbury were facing down the barrel of another relegation battle and another manager was relieved of his position. This change brought in the current father/son management team Neil and Joe Kirkpatrick, a strong finish to the season meant Westbury finished with a satisfactory 58 points and a 12th position finish.

The Kirkpatrick's had attracted a strong group of players and Westbury started the season amongst the favourites to be promoted. They started the season well, staying unbeaten for the first 13 league games, winning 8 and drawing 5. Chairman Matt Bright stepped down in early October to spend more time with his family, and Secretary Greg Coulson was elected to become Chairman at a Special General Meeting in early November. The club won the First Division and secured promotion to the Premier Division. They managed to score more points (95, previous best 91), score more goals (97, previous best 95) and concede the least goals (29, previous best 39) in the clubs history.

2018/19 was Westbury's first season back in the Toolstation Western Premier League since relegation in 2002, they finished fifth with another record points haul for the club. The 2019/20 season was brought to a premature end due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the club took this opportunity to make changes in the management department, Lewis Porter and Ricky Hulbert took over to continue the great work that had been carried out by the Kirkpatrick's before them.

2020/21 was another season curtailed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the club concentrated on investment in the facilities, carrying out a lot of maintenance around the ground and investing in the pitch to make sure Meadow Lane looked better than it had done for many years, Ricky and Lewis were integral to this improvement driving the clubs standards to the next level ready for the start of the 2021/22 season.

FA reorganisation of the football pyramid saw Westbury moved laterally into the UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division for 2021/22, along with several other local clubs (Calne, Corsham and Bradford on Avon), which resulted in a large reduction in travel for league matches. The team had a superb season which resulted in finishing in runners up spot behind Bishops Cleeve and with it promotion to the Southern League, and the club now playing at their highest ever level.

Mark Bowden – A hugely experienced goalkeeper who is a leader amongst men in the changing room and on the pitch. A decorated member of the RAF, husband to Becky and proud father to Robson and Orla. Previous clubs include Elgin City, Thetford Town, Needham Market, Forres Mechanics and Icarus FC. Manchester United fan.

Jake Hutchings – Ricky and Lewis' first signing and he has been unbelievable for the club since joining. Moved from right back to centre back last season and has formed a formidable partnership with Pricey. A great guy and a dream to manage. Won player of the year in his first season and easily could have won it again last season. Works in recruitment. Is a young lad so is still enjoying life without his own family, although his Dad has become our most travelled supporter and is as equally popular with the lads! Previous clubs include Melksham Town and Odd Down. Liverpool fan.

Dan Jordan – What a man. Has been at the club for 5 years and has probably been fully fit for 2 of those years. DJ has had a terrible time with injuries, his back keeping him out for a season, followed by tearing and then snapping his achilles within 6 weeks. He has managed some game time since then and still oozes class from centre back. A brilliant footballer and an even better guy. A huge part of this club's success since he has been here, both on and off the pitch. Plumber by day, him and his partner Leah have 3 'kids'. Previous clubs include Bradford Town, Warminster Town and Chippenham Park. Bournemouth Fan. Up the Cherries.

Dan Price – Captain, leader, legend. Another one of the lads who have been back here since we started having our success and has been a massive part of it. A monster in the air, strong in the tackle and has a lovely clip on him. Is fines master and takes that just as seriously as his football. Cuts down massive trees for his day job. Has just got engaged to the lovely Jasmine and they are expecting their first child in November! Previous clubs include Bradford Town, Chippenham Park and Warminster. Manchester United fan.

Steve Hulbert – Ricky's brother, which is a good and bad thing for him. Mainly bad to be honest. Won managers player of the year last season and rightly so. Steve was absolutely immense playing either right or left back. After playing many years in midfield, has made the full back position his own. Bags of energy, very intelligent, loves to throw in a shimmy and can pop up with a goal. Never known a player be so different on the pitch to off it. Speaks really well in the changing room and is huge for the club. Works for a bank and lives with his partner, Gina. Has loads of cats. Previous clubs include Bradford Town and Frome Town. Kind of Manchester United fan, but not really.

Aaron Cockerill – A new addition to the club this season, Aaron is a tall, left footed defender who can play left back or centre half. Cool, calm and collected both on and off the pitch with a lovely left foot. A player we have been after for a couple of seasons so delighted to have him with us. Previous clubs include Shepton Mallet and Warminster Town.

Ryan Bole – Ryan is an attacking left back who is a strong runner and has a hammer of a left foot. Has scored some huge goals for the clubs since he has been with us. When he gets into his stride, anything can happen! A great guy off the pitch, very angry on it! Had a few injury problems last season so will be looking to get those behind him and have a full season this year. Is with the lovely Casey who is one of our best WAGs and comes to pretty much every game, has even been known to jump on a beer bus now and then! Previous clubs include Melksham Town and Devizes Town.

Kurt James – Kurt joined the club last season and stepped in at centre half when needed and performed well. An experienced left sided centre half who will go to war on the pitch. He has become a big personality around the club and even stepped into the commercial manager role in the summer. Kurt does a lot around the club, helping with organising all sorts of things and being a good source of support for the management team. Another good talker in the changing room and hopefully can get over his knee injury and get back on the pitch. Tells us he's an engineer by day but we're not convinced! Proud father and partner to Meg. Previous clubs include Trowbridge Town, Warminster Town, Lebeq and Bradford Town. Manchester United fan.

Ben Griffiths – Last year's vice-captain but had a horrible ACL injury that cut short his season. Ben is fully on the road to recovery, and we should get him back in the new year. A joy of a footballer, lovely on the ball, great passing range and has a really good footballing brain. Is predominately a central midfielder but has played at full back for us also. A lovely guy off the pitch, looks after himself and has been known to get into some bad ways after a few drinks. Occasionally brings his legend partner Jodie to games. Wants to be a full-time football coach but currently is working for a quarry company! Previous clubs include Aylesbury Town and Frome Town. Arsenal fan.

Emmanuel Adepitan – 'Manny' is a new signing for the club after impressing during pre-season. A tough tackling, all action midfielder, Manny brings a different quality and defensive balance to the midfield area. A quiet guy off the pitch but certainly likes a sing song on an away trip! Manny is a teaching assistant and runs his own online trainer company, Eakickz. He has recently moved to Melksham from Bath with his partner. Previous club is Odd Down.

Will Thomson – A glorious midfielder. Has been with the club for four seasons now and has grown into a brilliant player. Loads of work rate, drives with the ball better than most, clever with the ball and has started scoring some goals. Amazing in the changing room, just because he brings so much ammo for the lads to have a pop at him. Is apparently an accountant but he is terrible with numbers. A hell of a bloke off the pitch, massive for the club in all areas. Hopefully we can get him smiling this season! Lives in the west wing of the Shanley estate with his partner. Does go to work sometimes, depending how heavy his weekend was! Previous clubs Bradford Town, Warminster Town and Corsham Town. Bristol City fan.

Jack Biddiscombe – Biddy is a direct winger who has slotted in at full back for us on many occasions and always puts in a performance in either position. A hell of a strike on him, quite often rattles the crossbar with his strikes. Another brilliant bloke off the pitch, always laughing at someone, apart from Strads who is his best mate in the world. Has scored some huge goals for the club, including the goal that guaranteed our 2nd place finish last season. Biddy has just bought his first house with his partner Page. He fixes photocopiers as a job. Previous clubs include Mells and Vobster and Radstock Town. Massive Chelsea fan.

Conner McKay – Conner is another new signing this season, joining from Warminster Town. He is full of pace and hard work. Always keeps himself involved in the game and scores plenty of goals. Con will be a real asset for us this season. A live wire off the pitch, always cracking a joke and getting involved, a really good character to be in the squad. Conner is a mortgage advisor by day and lives with his partner, Ria. Former clubs Trowbridge Town, Bradford Town and Warminster Town. Liverpool fan.

Martin Johnson – 'Red hot' has re-signed for the club this season after spending a few years at Warminster. A brilliant player with the ball at his feet, links play, creates chances, works his socks off and gets goals. A massively popular member of the group for everything he brings on the pitch and the way he is off the pitch. Martin has recently got married to Alice. During the day he runs a stone mason company and Club 24 Fitness gym in Westbury. Busy guy! Previous clubs include Bradford Town and Warminster Town.

Harvey Flippance – What a guy this man is. Finally gave in and joined the club last season after a long time chasing him and hasn't looked back since. Finished as the clubs top scorer with 17 goals after joining in December. Strong, tenacious, great touch and loves scoring goals. Harvey has really come out of his shell off the pitch too, raves and bucket hats are his favourite things. A great lad in the changing rooms and in the bar. Harvey is a born goal scorer and along with a few other lads at the club will go on to do great things in non-league football. Is a carpenter in the making in his day job. Previous clubs include Melksham Town, Calne Town and Pewsey Vale.

Sammy Jordan – Local legend Sammy has been with us for a few seasons and has scored some massive goals for us. Bassett fall short after first half goal frenzy

Royal Wootton Bassett Town were unable to build on Saturday's FA Vase triumph as they fell to a narrow, arguably undeserved, 3-2 home defeat against Wiltshire rivals Westbury United in their return to league action.

The negative result stretched Bassett's winless Hellenic League Premier Division streak to nine games and, agonisingly, represented their third single goal defeat during that stretch.

All the goals came in a frenetic first half, with four coming in a dramatic fifteen minute spell.

Bassett had taken the lead after twenty minutes. Westbury 'keeper Mark Bowden's awkward punch from a Chris Taylor cross failed to clear the danger away. The ball was initially headed back into the danger area by Sam Morris before Tommy Ouldridge guided it into the path of John Mills. Mills then saw an acrobatic effort cleared off the line, with the rebound falling to Ouldridge who produced a smart, snap first-time finish.

Westbury equalised ten minutes later though when an unmarked Jake Hutchings headed in at the left post from an Ashton Shanley free kick.

Five minutes later the visitors were ahead. Ben Griffiths seized upon a loose pass from Scott Chilcott before squaring inside for Shanley, whose 25-yard effort crashed off the bar. Forward Francois Allen was on hand though to nod in the rebound from six yards out.

It was soon 3-1. For the second time a set piece was Bassett's undoing. This time, Shanley whipped in a low corner from the left side, which was helped on at the near post and turned in by Allen.

Facing a two goal deficit, it was imperative Bassett struck back before the interval. They came close when a powerful Mills drive was diverted over by Bowden's fingertip save.

From the resulting corner, swung in by Ouldridge, Bassett got the break they needed as Will Davidson was tripped in the box. Bowden managed to keep out Mills' powerful, low penalty, but the ball came straight back to the forward who made no mistake at the second time of asking.

Much to Bassett's frustration, that would prove to be the final goal of the game.

Sam Collier's side threw everything they had at Westbury, particularly in the closing stages of the contest. But, although having to endure a significant amount of pressure, the visitors' defence held out long enough to ensure Bassett once again wound up with nothing to show for their efforts.

Introduction to Westbury

Westbury is a town in the west of the English county of Wiltshire, most famous for the Westbury White Horse. Westbury is in the far west of Wiltshire, close to the border with Somerset. It lies at the northwestern edge of Salisbury Plain, 18 miles (29 km) southeast of the city of Bath, approximately 5 miles (8.0 km) south of the county town of Trowbridge and 4.5 miles (7.2 km) north of the garrison town of Warminster. Other nearby towns and cities include Frome, Devizes and Salisbury.

Interesting Facts About Westbury

The most famous landmark of the area is the vastly impressive Westbury White Horse which is both the oldest and largest White Horse in Wiltshire.

The 14th century All Saints Church in Westbury has the third heaviest peal of eight bells in the world and an Erasmus Bible.

Westbury has one of the oldest working Victorian swimming pools in the country, built in 1887 by William Laverton.

The main railway line from London to the west of England runs across Westbury from east to west, and the line between Westbury and Warminster, opened in 1851.

In 1890 W. G. Grace played in W. H. Laverton's XI in a cricket match against the Australians at Westbury.



Westbury FC made the Wiltshire Senior Cup final 3 consecutive seasons from 1931-32 to 1933-34 winning it twice.

Famous Residents

The most locally well known resident of Westbury is Abraham Laverton (1819-1889), a wealthy Victorian mill owner, local politician and social benefactor. His legacy lives on in The Laverton, a community centre for the use of the inhabitants of the Town of Westbury. The building is a fine structure, it was designed in the 'Venetian' style by the celebrated architect William Jarvis Stent and is a Grade II listed building.

Westbury United Football Club have a number of players who have gone on to play for

professional clubs over the years. The most famous is John Atyeo, for whom Bristol City played a presentation game against Westbury and made a donation of £100 when they signed him. Atyeo played over 600 games for Bristol City and scored 359 goals; he also played six times for England in which he netted five goals. He now has a grandstand named after him at City's Ashton Gate ground as well as a street in his home village of Dilton Marsh, a few miles from Westbury.

Another player to go on to play professionally was Reg Smith (Bristol City, Colchester, & Woves).

Nearest Railway Station

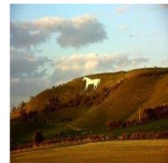

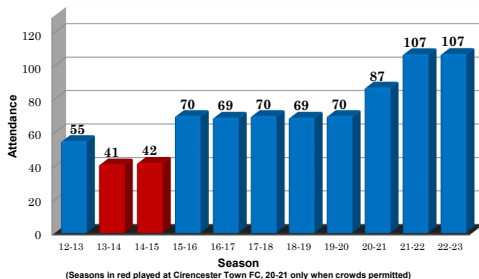

Resilient Bassett rattle Raiders late to claim point

Time and again this season, Royal Wootton Bassett Town's resilience has stood out as the team's defining characteristic. Unlike in previous years, so far this campaign there has never been a time when Sam Collier's side have been out of a game - even when they have fallen behind.

And that strength was again on show in Bassett's first ever meeting with Worcester Raiders.

After last week's clash with Westfields, this was another tough engagement with the Raiders opening the afternoon in third.

But Bassett - without centre halves Adam Corcoran and Dave Bampton through suspension as well as Matt Bennett, Scott Chilcott, Jack Hobson-McVeigh and Chris Taylor - dug deep, producing another solid display to earn a point.

They did so the hard way too, twice coming from behind in an entertaining 2-2 draw.

Bassett should arguably have been ahead though as Gio Wrona managed to rattle the bar with the goal at his mercy early on after great interplay between Tommy Ouldrige and Matt Jones.

Worcester soon capitalised on that miss, taking the lead through Jordan Murphy who slotted home from Jade Ferron's fizzing low cross.

While plugging away at the Worcester back line and dealing with what the dangerous Raiders threw at them, it took until midway through the second half for Bassett to draw level for the first time. After Ouldrige won a

free kick inside the visitors' half, Jones teased in a delivery which Landon Golding, having lost his marker, met with a glancing header into the corner of the net.



Raiders then made it 2-1 as Joe Billingham was on hand to tap in after Matt Crowther could only parry from Murphy's shot on the turn.

That meant Bassett were again forced to dig deep.

But, with time winding down, they snatched the equaliser and point they deserved in some style.

Veteran Alan Griffin drew a foul around 30 yards from goal, and Jones stepped over the ball. Catching Raiders 'keeper Ryan Young off guard, the left footer steered a delightful low curler around the wall and into the bottom left corner.

It was a fine strike - and one that earned another important, valuable result against one of the division's fancied sides.

FA VASE SECOND ROUND

BASSETT TO DUKE IT OUT WITH WELLINGTON IN FA VASE SECOND ROUND

Royal Wootton Bassett Town will travel to Somerset to take on Wellington in the Isuzu FA Vase second round.

The tie is scheduled to take place on Saturday 12 November.

The trip to Somerset is Bassett's reward for the eventful 5-3 first round victory away at Bridport and, on paper at least, is set to be a much trickier affair, with Wellington plying their trade at step five in the Western League Premier Division.

And Bassett's historic record away at Western League sides in the FA Vase is not a pretty one. While there have been wins against Portishead Town (2021-22) and Devizes Town (2010-11), Bassett have more often than not come unstuck against such opponents, losing at Bridgwater Town (2020-21), Odd Down (2013-14), Cadbury Heath (2010-11) and - back in 2004-05 - forthcoming opponents Wellington.

That loss at Wellington was a heavy one too as the Tangerines romped to a 4-0 first qualifying round win.

Bassett will be hopeful of a different outcome this time though as they aim to match last season's record-breaking run to the third round.

While not having the best of starts so far in the league after a 14th place finish last season, Wellington recorded an impressive 2-0 win at home against Barnstaple Town on Saturday as they, like Bassett, took their first steps in this year's Vase in the first round.

They earned such an exemption after advancing to last season's third round, picking up an away win on penalties against Bishops Lydeard before seeing off Millbrook 2-1 on their travels and beating Christchurch 5-2 on home territory.

That was Wellington's third appearance in the third round, having previously advanced to that stage in 2009-10 and 1990-91.

This year's tie will interestingly be Wellington's first against Hellenic League opposition since the year in which they previously hosted Bassett; their 4-0 win was subsequently followed two rounds later with a 2-1 loss against Chipping Norton Town.

The Tangerines have faced Hellenic League opponents more recently in the FA Cup though, losing 3-0 at Fairford Town in the 2011-12 extra preliminary round.

With both sides eager to have a shot at history a round later, the second round clash between Bassett and Wellington promises to be an entertaining tie - and all at the club look forward to the forthcoming trip to Somerset 18 years after our inaugural visit..

RESPECT CHECKED IN WILTSHIRE

Wiltshire FA is launching a campaign to tackle poor behaviour in football throughout Season 22/23.

With unprecedented levels of negative behaviour in the grassroots game, Wiltshire FA will shine a light on RESPECT this season with the "Respect Checked" campaign, with aim to reduce discipline incidents, retain both players and referees and improve the football experience in Wiltshire.

Oliver Selfe, Wiltshire FA CEO said, "We are aware of the detrimental impact that poor conduct has on the game. Behaviour and discipline are often the main concerns of our community, and these concerns lead to experienced officials leaving and players dropping out teams.

"In response we want to raise awareness about respect, gain understanding about why incidents are happening, challenge behaviour and change attitudes."

Cases of misconduct in Wiltshire have risen by 77% since Season 19/20, with 35% increase of cautions and 83% increase of red cards.

Oliver continues, "We are now watching. We are sending out RESPECT Ambassadors who will anonymously attend football fixtures throughout the season so we can gain first-hand understanding about why poor behaviour is occurring and be able to offer support to prevent further incidents."

RESPECT Ambassadors will take note of the environment, equipment, match day support, the RESPECT infrastructure and any incidents with reports being fed back to Wiltshire FA where they will be analysed, and invention offered.

Oliver concludes, "We believe that when there are good levels of respect players enjoy playing, referees enjoy refereeing, coaches enjoy coaching and supporters enjoy supporting. We must all check we are contributing to a positive environment for people to enjoy the nation's favourite sport."
