Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin Welcome To Today's Game

the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Longlevens. A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey from Gloucester, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this evening. This is the second attempt to stage this particular fixture after the initial fixture between the two sides was forced to be curtailed due to the serious injury suffered by Harry Pickering which has sidelined him every since. We hope our visitors enjoy what is their third trip of the season to the Sustain Stadium and we wish them all a safe journey home.

As was noted in the programme for that first abandoned league fixture, our record against today's visitors is a good one with now ten victories for us with just five for our visitors. Our recent record is even more impressive as three of Longlevens victories came in the first three fixtures between the two sides in Seasons 2014 -15 and 2015-16. Our ten victories include a league and cup double over Longlevens already this season with us winning 2-1 here at the Sustain Stadium in the FA Vase and then 2-0 away in the league. Match reports on both those games are included in tonight's programme.

Since the last set of programme notes we have had our worst run of results all season, starting with a defeat in the home league game against Westfields. Having won several games this season with very late goals, on this occasion it was our turn to suffer late heartache as we went down 2-1 to Westfields. That defeat was then followed by back-to-back games against Roman Glass St George, one in the Floodlit Cup, followed by an away league fixture. Unfortunately both games ended in 1-0 defeats with, I understand, a number of key decisions not going our way. The cup defeat was even more disappointing when the semi final draw was known which saw that we would have avoided both Worcester City and Brimscombe & Thrupp and been up against Jon Mill's Division One side Abingdon United in that semifinal.

There are now just ten games to go now in our quest for the play-offs, seven of which are at home where our record has been very good,

with just two defeats in the 12 league games played to date, including that recent loss to Westfields. There are some difficult fixtures to come though with Worcester City, Corsham Town and Fairford Town yet to visit the Sustain Stadium. It is important that we stay focused and seek to pick up as many points as possible focusing on one game at a time. Teams in and around us are taking points off each other, as was evidenced by Fairford Town's win over Roman Glass on Saturday, but we need to maintain the high standards we have set ourselves this season to make sure we get ourselves over the line.

Looking at our other sides, the Development side are, like the first team, having a bit of a blip at the moment having lost their last two games. A 1-0 away defeat at Blunsdon, where our former first team keeper Harrison Ellis had an outstanding game, was followed by a 6-0 defeat away to title chasing Amesbury Town. The Development side seems to be struggling at the moment with the transition from the 3G pitch to the heavy pitches that face sides in the winter months but will look to return to winning ways on Saturday when they make the short trip to Shrivenham.

Women's side. after securina impressive 6-1 away win at Stockwood Wanderers at the beginning of the month, could only draw 1-1 with Weymouth on Sunday. We are now reliant on local rivals Purton doing us a massive favour by defeating Poole for a second time this season in Poole's final fixture. We would then need to win all of our remaining four games to be able to pip Poole for the title and that one promotion place. Whilst a draw for Purton could in theory help, we would still need to make up a 23 goal difference deficit in those four games which is unlikely when they include games against Bath and Weymouth. On reflection it does seem a little harsh that just one promotion place is available when both Poole and ourselves had been relegated from the Premier Division at the end of last season.

Enjoy the game and hopefully a return to winning ways and three vital points in our quest to make the end of season play-offs.

The Gaffer Talks to Your Sport Swindon



"Absolutely ridiculous" was how Royal Wootton Bassett Town manager Sam Collier described the penalty decision given against his side in their 1-0 loss to Roman Glass on Saturday.

The Bristolbased outfit had beaten Collier's side the Wiseman Lighting Floodlit Cup by the same scoreline three days prior and their chances enacting revenge were dealt an early blow when Bassett goalkeeper Roh

meant Bassett had to play three quarters of the game with defender Luke Softlev between the sticks and matters were exacerbated on the stroke of half-time

when Roman Glass were awarded a spot kick after it was adjudged captain Adam Corcoran had committed a foul.

The hosts converted the penalty but yet more drama was to unfold in the second half.

Roman Glass then had a man sent off themselves when Mike Bryant was given his marching orders before Corcoran had a goal disallowed for offside.

While Collier had no complaints about his keeper's dismissal, his anger at the penalty decision was all too clear.

"It was a difficult one to take," he said.

"I haven't once this year moaned about an official but we lost the game simply due to the refereeing decisions.

"I have no arguments about the red card – it was a fair one. But the penalty was absolutely ridiculous.

"I've watched it back and if that's a penalty then there should be about ten penalties a game.

"We've then had a goal disallowed for absolutely no reason. I still don't quite understand what the linesman has seen."

"But I was really proud of how the lads reacted after going a man down and I think we definitely deserved to get something from the game."

Bassett host play-off-chasing Slimbridge on Saturday and Collier will be looking for his players to end a run of three straight defeats.

The Bassett boss added: "We know it will be a tough one but they are all going to be tough from now until the end of the season. It's not a must win but we need to get back to winning ways after losing the last two games.

"Knowing my players I'm sure they will bounce back."

Opponents History

Longlevens



The Club, in its current format, was formed in 1954, although we believe that a Longlevens team had been in existence before the Second World War, but that it folded in 1952, although we have never been able to confirm this through official records.

We graduated into the Gloucestershire Norther Senior League, but then spent the next forty years, or so, trying to progress from there. As Football evolved, with the adoption of the Pyramid System and the formal Grading of Clubs, we found our route to 'the next level' cut off, due to the facilities at our Club HQ. However, as a result of development, involving the Gloucester City Council, the Ibis Hotel was built, alongside a football facility which was capable of being developed to suit the requirements of the higher leagues and we were fortunate to be granted an annual lease, after applications from several local sides.

From there, given our previous progress, things took off at alarming pace, after we were elected to the Gloucestershire County League in season 2011/12. Our first season saw us finish fifth, but, we then surprised everyone, including ourselves, when we won it the following season, after completing a tremendous run that took us from the bottom four, in November, to the League Title, Due to our position, pre-Christmas, we had not contemplated any application to join the Hellenic League, but the following season we repeated our success, having made the relevant application and we were pleased to be accepted into the Hellenic League, in Division One West.

If we had surprised ourselves with our performances in the Gloucestershire County League, then I think that to win Division One West in our first season was beyond everyone's expectations and so, in Season 2015/16 we found ourselves playing in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, sponsored by Uhlsport. Therefore, in just five years, we have effectively been promoted four times and although our performances on the pitch have secured this rise, it is probably fair to say that the infra-structure of the Club has struggled a little to match the set-up of

well-established Clubs, such as we meet in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, but we are trying hard to improve on this side of things.

Having acknowledged that it was only due to our securing the lease at Sawmills that allowed to start this journey, it is only right to pay tribute to our major sponsors - E.G. Carter and Company Limited (probably better known simply as Carter Construction) because without their input - which is still ongoing - both financial and with the provision of man-power, we would not have been able to meet the ground improvements necessary for both the County and Hellenic Leagues. However, as Club President with over forty years at the Club, it was also gratifying to see the amount of work that was put in by Club members to make the necessary ground improvements, although we recognise there is still work to be completed.

Special mention has to be made to James French, our First Team Manager, who has transitioned from player, through player-manager, to manager and although this isn't the platform to name everyone individually, he has put together a strong support team and the Club is currently blessed with a really strong management team and dedicated back-up on the administration side.

We also run four other adult male sides, as well as an adult Ladies side and we are establishing a 'ladies' U12 side as well. Historically, our representation at youth level has been somewhat variable, we have had some very successful youth teams in the past, but these teams have tended to be been transitional and we have not been able to sustain teams at all levels. However, as part of our plans that saw us achieve Charter Development Status. implemented a structure that should see a steady influx of youth teams in future seasons, which can only be good for our future and it would seem that in future years. the major problem will be providing sufficient pitches for this rapidly growing section of the Club.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town advanced to the Isuzu FA Vase third round for a third consecutive year courtesy of a hard earned 2-1 victory over Hellenic League Premier Division rivals Longlevens.

Alfie Presley was the hero for Bassett, twice holding his nerve and converting from the penalty spot as Sam Collier and his side's recent love affair with this national competition continued.

After twenty years in which Bassett had never advanced beyond the second round, Collier has guided Basset to the last 64 three years running, enjoying unprecedented success given the club's previous Vase travails. As with last year's win on penalties away at Wellington, Bassett were forced to earn their place in third round with Longlevens pushing their hosts all the way.

Always tricky opponents, the Gloucester-based outfit were the last team to beat Bassett in competitive action at the Sustain Stadium back in February. And after a first half in which they were the better team, the visitors entered the interval with their tails up, perhaps confident of ending Bsssett's lengthy home unbeaten run.

Although neither side had broken the deadlock, Longlevens enjoyed much the better opportunities. A double chance fell to the visitors just after ten minutes with Cam Williams seeing an effort from the edge of the box blocked before Shaun O'Connor fizzed wide from the rebound. Presley soon had the ball in the net for Bassett though play had already been halted for offside.

Indeed that was the best the hosts could muster. Instead the visitors continued to be more creative, with Shiyak Sutherland shooting across the face of goal, Jack Beardsell firing over and Tyreece Briscoe forcing a save - albeit a comfortable one - from Rob Brown

Within five minutes of the restart Longlevens hit the post as Cam Williams stole possession deep inside Bassett territory, cut inside from the left and shot at goal. Soon enough though they were behind. A rare foray forward from Bassett ended with Scott Chilcott being bundled over by Ollie Long. And Presley stepped up to the spot, confidently firing into the bottom right corner as he sent Mateusz Wieczorek the wrong way. The goal finally ignited Bassett who finally started to find their groove. They still had to be wary of their opponents though.

On the hour the ever dangerous Brad Martin rising to meet a corner with a powerful header that fortunately was straight at Brown. Fifteen minutes later the same player shot on the turn from the edge of the area, with a deflection taking the ball narrowly wide. The resulting corner caused panic in the box and Jack Beardsell rattled the bar with an off balance effort.

A pair of chances then fell to Bailey Gallagher at the other end, with the tricky winger first forcing Wieczorek to parry the ball away for a corner before he struck narrowly wide from twenty yards.

The game remained on a knife edge - and it soon appeared as though a shootout was on the cards as Longlevens grabbed an equaliser with seven minutes remaining. It was something of a gift too, with Harrison Iddles taking advantage of careless play from Brown - who was seeking to kill time after a Martin effort - by putting a challenge in on the 'keeper and poking home.

Brown was rescued four minutes later though. Bassett earned a second penalty as Long was guilty of a stamp on Gallagher off the ball that rightly earned the defender a straight red card. Presley once again took the honours and again sent Wieczorek the wrong way, this time steering into the bottom left corner to seal victory. The man of the match's double sealed a hat trick of third round appearances. Now's the time for Bassett to finally overcome that hurdle and book a place in the last 32 of the Vase.

Spending the majority the season playing for the Development team, he scored three goals, while winning the Manager's Player of the Year award. His impressive displays were enough to earn a call-up to the first team towards the end of the campaign. In all he made five Photography appearances, winning man of the match on his debut against Abingdon United. A year later he scored six goals in 17 Development team appearances and was again named as Manager's Player of the Year. Staten briefly appeared for the Development side in 2022-23 too, playing three A high quality target man who enjoyed a distinguished playing career in non-league football. Now entering his 2nd season as Bassett's assistant manager. Initially joined for the 21-22 season as a player, scoring 16 times in 32 appearances before joining the coaching staff. While taking on his current role, Griffin has continued to play, featuring 38 times last season (34 appearances coming from the bench) and adding 5 goals. As a player, Griffin is an assured finisher, strong in the air and capable of effectively holding up the ball. He made a prolific start to his playing career with Corsham in the Western League, and soon moved onto Southern League football, plying his John & Kath Fellows Griffin trade with Cirencester, Chippenham, Gloucester City, Mangotsfield Utd, S.Supermarine and Bristol Manor Farm. He spent most of his career with Chippenham and was part of their 16-17 bissor mainor raim. In spent most or inscared with Chippennian and was part or unear John promotion winning squad that saw the Bluebirds earn National League South status. In 18-19 he hit 26 goals for Cirencester as they finished runners-up in Southern League Division One South, Joined Bassett after splitting the 19-20 season between Melksham Town and Malmebsury Victoria. Griffin also has prior managerial experience having spent time in charge of Malmesbury. Waldon is a well-travelled forward with professional experience who joins Bassett this season. A player who came through the ranks at Swindon Town, Waldon made eight appearances for the Robins - including three starts - between 2013 and 2015. He also had numerous loan spells during his time at Swindon, including in the National League with Tamworth, Gloucester City and Brackley Town. Following his release, Waldon joined Swindon Supermarine (where he had also been on loan), and over the course of three spells with Marine he scored 34 goals in 73 matches. Connor Phil Hall Waldon Waldon has also had spells with Mangotsfield United and North Leigh in the Southern League while he has featured for Highworth Town, Shrivenham and Chipping Sodbury Town in the Bassett manager since taking the role in January 2018. In 18-19, his first full season in charge, he guided the team to 10th in the Hellenic Premier Division - at that point, the club's highest ever finish. Bassett exceeded that record last season with a 5th place finish. Bassett have also set records in national cup competitions under his stewardship, with Collier's sides equalling the club's best FA Cup run in 20-21 and going further than ever before in the FA Wase, reaching the 3rd round in both 21-22 and 22-23. This is Collier's 2nd job in management after he served as Shrivenham player-manager from 2014 to 2015. As a player, he has made 159 appearances for Bassett, scoring 71, finishing as top scorer in 09-10, when Bassett earned promotion to the Sam Collier Phil Hall Manager) basset, sound Y, insigning as top source in toe-ro, when basset enter plottoilout or Hellenic Premier Division, and 10-11. Collier has played in almost every other position for Bassett including as goalkeeper, making a last minute penalty save in 22-23 to preserve a point against eventual champions Cribbs. During his playing career, he also featured for Purton, Abingdon Utd, Cirencester Town, Wantage T and Thatcham T among others.



Lee Beavis (Coach) Beavis is a new addition to joins Bassett's Men's First Team management team for this season. A strong defender in his playing days, Beavis featured for Bassett during the first half of the 2006-07 seam under ther-manager Paul Burke. He also played for Devizes Town, Calne Town, Melskham Town and Malmesbury Victoria among others.

Just as in the teams' earlier meeting this season, a last minute winner determined the outcome of Royal Wootton Bassett Town's home encounter with Westfields. This time, however, Sam Collier's side - who played a quarter of the match with ten men - finished the game empty-handed as Westfields came from behind to triumph 2-1.

That late suckerpunch did little to dent Bassett's strong position in the table though with results elsewhere meaning the team remain in third place in the Hellenic League Premier Division with a relatively comfortable advantage over those sides immediately below them.

Indeed, he was not callled upon to make a save and the first time he touched the ball was to pick it out of the net - a good 20 minutes after taking over between the sticks.

The only problem for Bassett was that Elliot Jones in the Roman Glass goal was not

troubled over the course of the 90 minutes.

Roman Glass were the more lively in the opening exchanges, but the best opportunity they could muster was a Lewis Leigh-Gilchrist effort that was blocked.

The home side were soon dealt a seemingly significant advantage when Brown was dismissed. But they failed to make the extra man - and the fact Bassett had an outfield player in goal - pay off. Although having a lot of the ball, Roman Glass were rather toothless in attack. But on the stroke of half time they got lucky. Corcoran was punished for not much at all and Leigh-Gilchrist - the match-winner in Wednesday's Floodlit Cup quarter final tie - made no mistake from the spot.

The numbers on each side were evened up on the hour as Bryant received his marching orders. Bassett were then in the ascendancy, albeit not making many clear cut chances. The one they did have saw Corcoran help the ball into the back of the net, only for the assistant referee's flag to rule it out.

Aside from that the visitors didn't appear likely to fashion a goal and at the end of a frustrating 90 minutes Bassett found themselves on the end of a third straight single goal defeat.

Bassett do remain in third - though that position could come under threat next week when Collier and his team visit fourth place Slimbridge.





IT'S FIFTH round weekend in both the Isuzu FA Trophy and FA Vase and those Wembley dreams are drawing ever closer to reality.

In the FA Trophy, five former winners remain, the most recent being Bromley, the 2021-22 winners. They take on National League South side Aveley, who will equal their best ever run in the competition with victory.

Kidderminster Harriers are enjoying a revival under new manager Phil Brown and they be looking to take the Trophy back to Aggborough for the first time since they beat Burton Albion after a replay at The Hawthorns in 1987. They take on National League North side Peterborough Sports, managed by their former striker Michael Gash.

Sports' league rivals Bishop's Stortford won the FA Trophy in 1980-81 and they face a Coalville Town side enjoying a club record run in the competition.

Arguably, the tie of the round sees Wealdstone, victors in 1984-85, take on local rivals Hendon in a crunch north-west London derby.

Hendon are three-times FA Amateur Cup winners in the FA Trophy's former guise, but have never lifted the silverware as we know it today.

Talking of guises, Macclesfield FC are competing in only their second ever FA Trophy since reforming, but have twice previously enjoyed success in the competition/ The Silkmen won the first ever FA Trophy, against Telford United, in 1969-70 and then again in 1995-96 when they beat Northwich Victoria.

They make the trip to National League South highfliers Hampton & Richmond Borough, who are already on a best ever run.

Gateshead missed out at the final hurdle to FC Halifax Town in last year's Wembley showdown, but they will be looking to go one better when they make the trip to Hereford FC, finalists themselves as recently as 2020-21.

Barnet were finalists in only the third ever FA Trophy final, going down to Stafford Rangers, and they will be looking to finally add the FA Trophy to their list of honours, starting with victory over two-time quarter-finalists Welling United, while 1995-96 semi-finalists Chorley host quarter-finalists of two years ago, Solihull Moors, in the final tie.

Clubs in the last 16 in the FA Vase have progressed through six rounds to get this far with the road to Wembley getting underway on August 26, 2023.

With holders Ascot United moving up to the Isthmian League and Newport Pagnell Town,

finalists for the past two seasons, having crashed out to Fakenham Town in the second round, two new teams will proudly walk out onto the hallowed turf on Saturday May 11.

Indeed, every one of the eight fifth round ties this afternoon involves at least one club for whom victory would mean a record run for the club in the competition. That includes Emley AFC, who claim to be a continuation of the original Emley club, so their tie against 1980-81 winners Whickham may be the exception.

Whickham - one of two former Vase winners left in this year's competition - will be looking to avenge a 2-0 defeat by the original Emley club in the fourth round 27 years ago.

The other club to have lifted the Vase still standing is Southern Counties East League side Deal Town, winners of the Vase in 1999-2000. They travel to Bridgwater United, who themselves have equalled their best Vase run for the second successive season

Jersey Bulls are also equalling their best run in the Vase this season, set just last year, and they host Falmouth Town for whom victory would mean equalling their club best Vase run. Jersey Bulls are one of three Combined Counties clubs still involved in this season's competition, the highest representation of any of the Step 5 leagues.

Another club also equalling their best run in the Vase this season is Great Wakering Rovers, although it is 22 years since the club last made it this far. However, the Essex Senior League side has only had four Vase campaigns in that time. They travel to Highworth Town, semi-finalists in 2014-15.

The Worcestershire derby between Stourport Swifts and Worcester City will result in one of those two clubs setting a new personal best run in the competition. This is also the case for Tilbury v North Greenford United, both already on club record-breaking Vase runs.

A third tie will also result in a club record Vase run as Hilltop FC host Romford. Hilltop had only ever gone as far as the first round in the past and have the least Vase experienced of the final 16.


The last of the eight ties is the only one that has happened before in the competition as Hallam FC host Lincoln United 34 years after the visitors won 2-1 in an extra preliminary round replay. A repeat win for Lincoln United would equal their best Vase run, whilst Hallam are already matching their best Vase run this season, last set 43 years ago.

Let the Road to Wembley commence.


