CHAIRMAN'S CHAT

Good afternoon, welcome to you all and to our near neighbours (and of course rivals), Purton.

I write this article on the Wednesday following the League Cup tie between West Ham and Millwall, and the awful scenes of violence seen at it. Having watched football through the late seventies and early eighties, and seen such hooliganism the first time round, it's really disappointing to see it return. However, it's probably unsurprising, and as I heard one commentator say, just as it will decades to completely eradicate racialism, so it will with this tribal violence. The key is not to become complacent that the issue has gone away, but keep doing the things that have proven to work, and keep reinforcing the message that society and the clubs will not tolerate these sort of actions.

Of course West Ham and Millwall are near neighbours just like ourselves and Purton. Every club has rivalry, and used positively it can often inspire teams to greater performance, simply because of the desire to win out. However, being inspired and driven to win should not mean resorting to foul play and winning at all costs. I'm personally a great believer that the moment you let your mind become dominated by winning as opposed to the quality of your performance you lose focus on the simple things you need to do well in order to be effective for the 90 minutes. Don't get me wrong I absolutely loved derby's as a player, and was as gutted as anyone if we didn't win. It was always entertaining playing at Purton, where my London accent and vocal style of playing was of course met by a barrage of comments from the Purton faithful on the touchline, making for a great atmosphere.

So here's to a great, competitive game, between two close rivals. I know I should finish that with "and may the best team win", but will end it with my normal wish for a Bassett win, though I trust whoever wins both teams, officials and spectators can enjoy a social in the bar after.

OPPONENTS HISTORY

PURTON FC • CLUB HISTORY

Purton Football club began in 1924 and ran until 1968 when it was disbanded for a few seasons. During its existence the club have won many honours at Senior, Junior and Youth levels.

Besides winning league titles the club have won the Wiltshire Senior Cup seven times and the Wiltshire Youth Cup three times. They have also won the Fairford Hospital Cup three times and the Arthur Shipway Cup three times.

In season 2001/2002 the club won the Hellenic Supplementary Cup defeating Old Woodstock Town 3-1 at Abingdon. In 1995/1996 the club were champions of the Hellenic League Div 1 and in 2003/2004 were champions of the Hellenic League Div 1 (West) in which they went the whole season undefeated. On both occasions the club were denied promotion to the Premier Division because of ground criteria rulings.

Last season the club finished 6th in the Hellenic Div 1 West league a big improvement on the previous two seasons standings.

President & Chairman of the Club is former player Alan Eastwood who has been with the club since 1972 and is also the club's programme editor and also the press officer & Hellenic league match Secretary. Janice Kuczynski is the Club's Hon Secretary and Wendy Phillips is the Club's Hon Treasurer and also runs the match-day tea-bar at the club. Chris Pethick is the Hellenic team Manager and Stef Kuczynski is the Reserve team's Manager that play in the Wilts Premier League.

The club also runs youth and minor teams at under 17/18s, 15s, 14s, 13s, 12s, 10s & 9s and play their games at the Red House, Bradon Forest School and St Mary's School all grounds in the village. The club receives excellent support and raises funds through an Easter Raffle, player subscriptions, matchday sponsorships, programme advertising and programme sales, football card sales, a football pontoon and from time to time six a side competitions and sporting dinners.

5 Star Bassett Stroll past Pedestrian Purton

Rylands Way, 30th December 2006 v Purton (Won 5-1)

In an extremely one-sided local derby, Wootton Bassett Town thrashed Purton 5-1 with goals coming from 5 different scorers and if it wasn't for some sloppy defending in the last minute, it would have been a clean sheet as well.

The first goal should have come after four minutes after great link up play down the right between Matty Bennett and Stu Hemsley set up an unmarked John Magani six yards out. However Magani forced an acrobatic save from Aaron Dickinson when it was easier to score. Dickinson almost gifted Mark King a goal in the 27th minute when he spilled a Jon Davis corner but managed to block King's effort. King put Bassett ahead two minutes later though, latching onto a Stu Hemsley through ball before riding a tackle and comfortably slotting home from 15 yards. Two minutes later it should have been 1-1 as Warren Fuller slid in at the far post and connected with a brilliantly placed cross but could only knock the ball across the face of goal and wide. Magani doubled the advantage eight minutes before half time with a super solo effort. After rolling his man 30 yards out, Magani rode a challenge before rounding Dickinson and then tapped home from 12 yards. The forward was so excited with his goal that he slipped over in the mud whilst celebrating. James Domm then pulled off a brilliant save to deny James Richards two minutes before the break. Richards turned Yeardley on the edge of the box and his looping effort forced the Bassett 'keeper to acrobatically tip the ball over the bar whilst on the backpedal.

Seven minutes into the second half a poorly struck clearance fell perfectly for Marcus Neale on the edge of the area but his shot was deflected wide. The lead was extended a minute later as a deep cross from ex-Purton midfielder Scott Large was knocked into the back of the net by a visiting defender. The final half hour of the match was pedestrian stuff as Bassett waltzed past their opponents. Andy White replaced Magani just before the hour and got his name on the scoresheet five minutes later just after Purton defender Pete Temple was booked for dissent. On 62 minutes Dickinson scuffed a clearance, playing it straight to Hemsley who shot at the open goal from 25 yards. However the ball was slowed by the extremely boggy pitch and the 'keeper was able to get across to the ball and parry it. White was there to tap in the rebound after Dickinson had had plenty of time to get two hands on the ball but failed to do so. Bennett was replaced by Lee Beavis after White's goal and with Purton going down to ten men after using all three subs and picking up a further injury, Bassett eased themselves through the final quarter of an hour.

A second Dickinson howler got Bassett their fifth as Jon Davis' free kick from the left touchline sailed over the 'keeper's head and into the top corner despite Davis intending to cross the ball rather than shoot due to the angle. Sloppy defending ruined what would have been a perfect day for Bassett as Vince McMackin was able to tap home from 10 yards after Fuller had cut the ball back to him much to the dislike of Paul Burke.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Jon Davis – put himself about, winning numerous tackles in the middle of the park whilst spreading the ball around and scored the fifth, albeit unintentionally.

Scoop Rating: 8/10 – The conditions made it hard for both teams but Bassett dominated despite not being at their best. Bassett should have kept a clean sheet and also had chances to put more than five past their opponents.

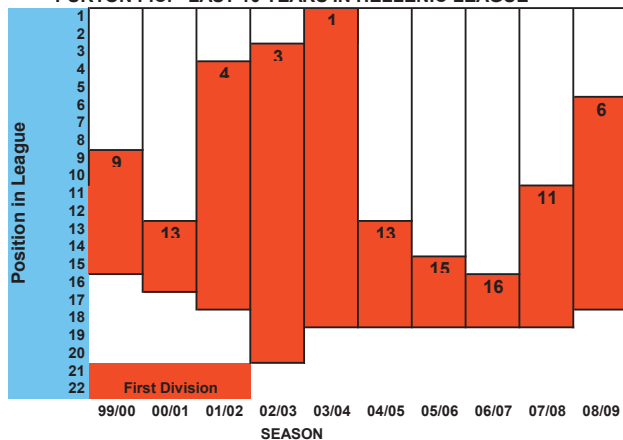

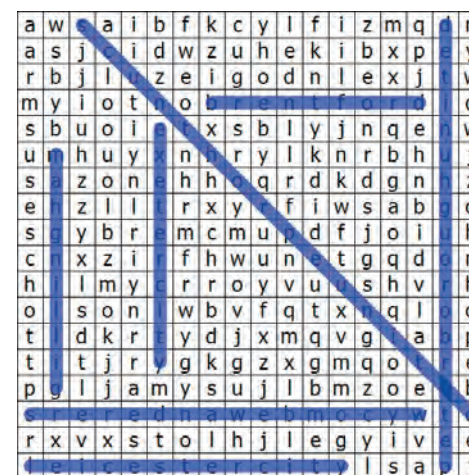

Scored two in Ghia Cup Semi-final

Season 1936-37

Wootton Bassett Town 2 Purton 3

The Football Pink of 21st November 1936 carried the following match report:

Wootton Bassett Town lost by an odd goal for the fourth time this season when they entertained Purton last Saturday. Purton won the toss and chose to kick with the wind and sun in their favour. The exchanges were fairly even at the start but Purton took the lead after fifteen minutes, Weaving scoring with a cross shot. Soon afterwards Titcombe, the Purton centre-forward, received a pass in midfield and ran through to score a second goal. Wootton Bassett then took up the running and their efforts were rewarded when Perry sent Childs away on the right and the winger cut in to beat the Purton goalkeeper with the best shot of the match. The Town continued to do well and were unfortunate to lose the services of Gleed, their inside left who was injured about ten minutes from the interval. After the interval Gleed was a passenger on the left wing. Both sides fought hard to gain further success and Pratt eventually headed a third goal for Purton following good work by Barrett. The Town despite their handicap came again and just before the end Beazley cut in from the left to reduce the arrears. Although the match was in the nature of a "local derby", play was clean throughout and Purton could consider themselves fortunate to take full points.

Season 1937-38

On New Years Day Wootton Bassett played Purton at home losing the match 1-2, Weaving scoring the Wootton Bassett consolation goal. Given that Purton were one of the top teams in the County at the time the result itself was not unexpected but it was interesting to note that in the Football Pink the Purton reporter was required to put a few minds at rest ahead of their big FA Amateur Cup 1st Round Proper tie with Lowestoft as their star player H. Dixon had been injured in the game against Wootton Bassett. An extract from the report ran as follows:

"During the week I have heard it stated that H. Dixon's injury was the result of foul play. I should like to correct this erroneous impression, as I was standing quite near and had a clear view of the incident. It was easy to observe that it was a pure accident. Dixon himself held the same view. I understand he will be doubtful starter for the Lowestoft match next Saturday. If so it will be a big blow for Purton, as he has been a brilliant performer at outside right."

Purton lost the Lowestoft match 2-0 in front of a crowd of 1,500 that drew record gate receipts of £35. By a quirk of fate Wootton Bassett played Purton again immediately after the Lowestoft fixture and returned from Purton with a point following an excellent 2-2 draw. The headline ran "Gunter of Wootton Bassett distinguishes himself" and the report contained the following write-up:

"Wootton Bassett Town who occupy a lowly position in the Wilts League table, did well last Saturday to gain a point at Purton. Purton were fully expected to win but Wootton Bassett gave them a good run and played better than their lowly position in the League would indicate. Purton had to make several changes and the Town were not at full strength so the division of the points was considered a fitting result. Each side scored two goals, the Bassett marksmen were S. Pratt and A. Embling. Wootton Bassett gave a trial to G. Gunter, a young goalkeeper, and he gave a good account of himself. He saved a penalty. C. Dunford who figured at centre forward also played a fine game. Dr Broadfoot returned to the Purton side and was easily their best forward."

WOOTTON BASSETT TOWN 4 – 2 PENHILL

From The Evening Advertiser, Thursday May 3rd 1984

HISTORIC GHIA CUP GLORY FOR BASSETT!

Wootton Bassett won the Wiltshire County League's Ghia Senior Cup on Saturday by defeating Sanford 4-0 in the final at Avebury and so became the first Division Two team to win it.

Sanford impressed in midfield with some clever play, but over-elaborated in front of goal and lacked penetrative power.

Against this, Bassett were dangerous on the break and caught Sanford out with well placed through balls.

They went ahead in the 18th minute when Neil Timbrell dispossessed Mich Bohane and, spotting goalkeeper Mark McKinley was well off his line, sent a 30-yard shot over his head into the empty net.

McKinley was in trouble again in the 42nd minute when he threw the ball out, only for Steve Thomas to gain possession and score before the keeper could recover.

INJURED

Just before half-time Bassett lost Kevin Flavell through injury and replaced him with Kevin Bishop.

It was Bishop who increased his side's lead to three in the 68th minute after fastening onto a long through ball.

Six minutes later another through ball caught Sanford out for Graham Smedley to complete his side's big win.

The man of the match award went to Sanford's Brian Faragher.

Wiltshire County League Ghia Senior Cup Winners 1983/84

Wootton Bassett Town created history in 1983/84, becoming the first Division Two side to lift the Wiltshire County League Ghia Senior Cup. And they did so the hard way, overcoming four Division One sides along the way, including champions Penhill in a semi-final replay.

Bassett began their journey with a 2-0 away victory at St. Joseph's thanks to goals from Roger Smith and Doug Gee. Gee and Smith were again on the scoresheet in the 2-1 second round victory at Devizes Town, before Bassett really hit their stride from the quarter final stage onwards. They were paired with Division Two rivals Burbage Sports in the last eight and – despite being on the road for the game – thrashed their opposition 4-0. The scores remained deadlocked at half time, but Graham Large ignited a second half flurry of goals from the penalty spot. Smith and Gee grabbed the second and third respectively before Craig Smith rounded off the rout with the goal of the game.

This set up an extremely tricky semi-final tie with Penhill. The two sides had met earlier in the season in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, but the eventual Division One champions showed their strength, sealing victory in a replay. After seeing Large's strike cancelled out late on, the teams once again were forced to go it again. This time though, an under-strength Bassett were to have the last laugh. In what was described by the Evening Advertiser as “the sensation of the season”, Bassett raced into a four goal lead, before eventually conceding two late on. On target in the first half were Gee and Steve Thomas, who bagged a brace. Graham Smedley then put the icing on the cake with a fourth. Bassett's magic number appeared to be four, and once again they produced that number of goals to make history in the final against Sanford, which was held at Avebury. Neil Timbrell opened the scoring in the opening stages with a long range effort, before Thomas doubled the advantaged before half time. In the second period, substitute Kevin Bishop made it three, before Smedley once again finished off the scoring.

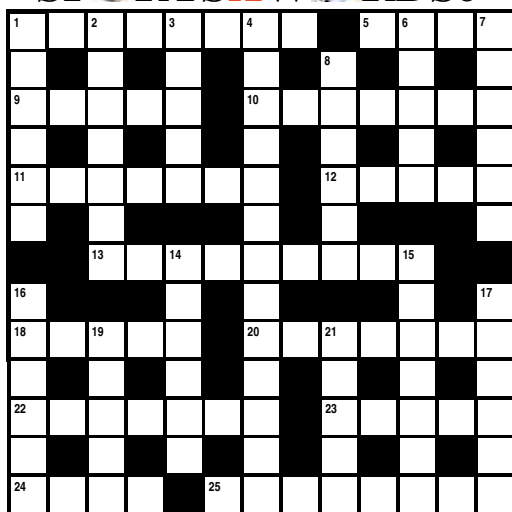

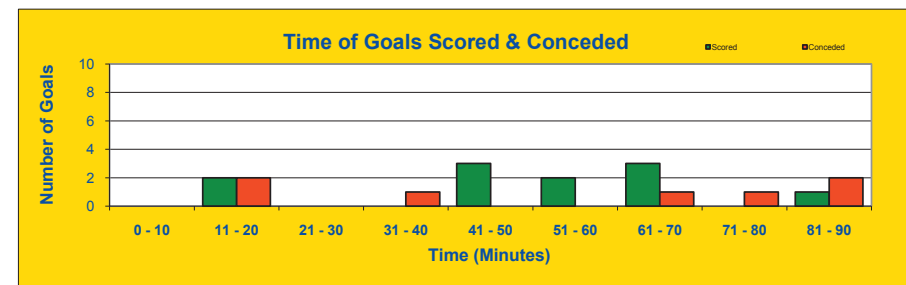
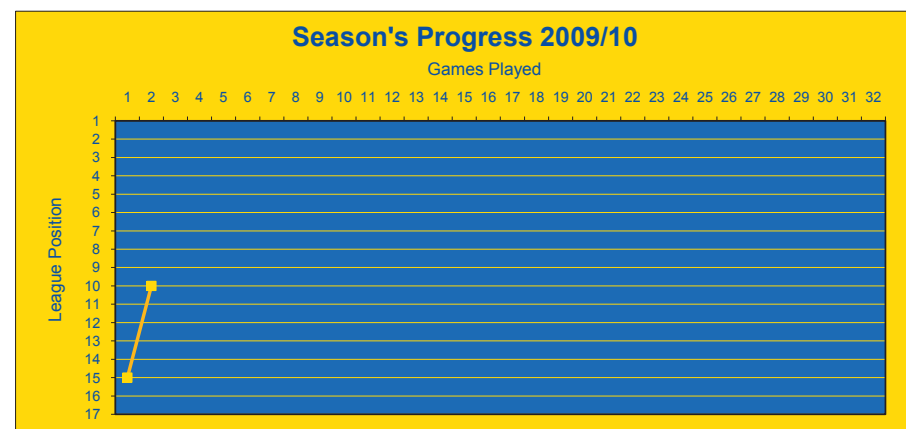
