OPPONENTS HISTORY

LYDNEY TOWN FC • CLUB HISTORY

Although Lydney is one of the main towns of the Forest area the Severnsiders have always led a very nomadic existence. With the town very much a Rugby stronghold the football club has always found it difficult to exist and although the club can trace its roots back to 1911 it never has had a sound base. The club competed in the local leagues until 1952 when they were elected to the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League. In 1969 the club folded due to lack of committee. In 1971 the soccer lovers of the town pulled together and the club re-formed and in 1974 the appointment of Harold Elliott as player/coach saw many players from Lydney Juniors introduced with the resulting effect of promotion to Senior League Division One in 1976.



During this period the club switched from Bathurst Park onto the Recreation Ground using the changing facilities at the Cricket Club. In 1979-80 after twice finishing Runners-Up they finally lifted the Senior League Division One Championship.

Applications to the County League were unfruitful so the club turned to the Hellenic League, where the club held its own, but after 4 seasons the huge financial burden of the League forced the club to return to the Senior League. A dispute with the Cricket Club saw the club move back onto Bathurst Park and following this Secretary Roger Sansom, who had been elected in 1975 and who is still secretary to this day, investigated the possibility of building a clubhouse on the Recreation Ground. Unfortunately on the pitch the downward spiral continued and the club found itself back in the NGL. The players thankfully stayed together and they bounced back into the Senior League the following season. Ambitious plans to have our own clubhouse were still in the pipeline and a clubhouse was opened on Lydney Recreation Trust in 1990. In 1995 the club did the double by winning Division Two and the Forest Green Supporters Trophy, a feat they repeated in 1996-97.

In 2003-04 Manager Peter Elliott, who along with Roger Sansom is the oldest serving member of the club with 30 plus years service, guided the club to the Final of the League Cup and the Senior Amateur Cup but in 2004 due to work commitments Peter decided to step down. The club turned to Stuart Liddington to take the helm and with Peter being persuaded to assist him they forged a very successful partnership. The addition of Pete Macklin from Cinderford Town, Danny Clarke ex-Oxford United, Matthew Timmins from Whitecroft and the return of Mark Saunders from Australia gave the club a real boost. Pete, Danny and 'Matty' provided the missing link in the goalscoring department scoring over 70 goals between them, Danny leading the way with 32 goals. The Senior League title was secured with 4 games to go and they did the double by lifting the Senior Amateur Cup. The season was complete with the news of acceptance into the County League a prize denied to them some 25 years ago. The clubs County League campaign started in unconvincing fashion with only 4 points from 3 home games but a 20 game unbeaten run saw the club take over as league leaders at the start of 2006, a position they held for the remainder of the season. Scoring goals was very much the key to winning as 87 goals proved, 'Matty' Timmins finishing the leagues leading goal scorer with 28 goals. This success was beyond the clubs wildest dreams and gave the club the opportunity of a return to the Hellenic League after 22 years.

A steady start saw the club 12 points behind the leaders in October but a 6 game winning streak at the end of the year saw the club take over as leaders at the start of January. The critical game came in mid-April with fellow title contenders Trowbridge Town visiting 'The Rec'. In front of a crowd of 305 goals from Danny Clarke and Mark Crabbe secured victory and a 5 point cushion . With 3 games to go the Title was won at Malmesbury when Danny Bishop came off the subs bench to score 2 late goals and give the club an unprecedented 3rd title in as many seasons. The squad had certainly exceeded all expectations and can quite easily be classed as the best in the clubs history. Ambitious plans for the required improvements to gain promotion were put forward and accepted by the League allowing the club to play at the highest level in its history.

A steady start was overshadowed by events off the pitch when despite gaining planning permission for erection of floodlights the club became embroiled in a sea of red tape with their landlords. To continue playing in the Premier Division an agreement was reached to use Cinderford Town and Harrow Hill for home games. Despite these off the pitch issues an unbeaten league run of 11 games placed them in the top half of the table. Despite finishing in 10th position the club were unable to satisfy the April deadline imposed by the league and were forced to be relegated back into Division One (West).



LADIES MATCH REPORT

Wootton Bassett Ladies entertained Cirencester Town Reserves at Rylands in their first Gloucestershire league Division 3 game.

The game started with Cirencester passing the ball very well and looking the more composed on the ball. The first 20 minutes flew past with both defences holding firm with no shots for either keeper to worry about. The first real sight of goal came on 25 min's a long run from Amy Longo starting from just inside her own half, she was able to get a snap shot off inside the penalty area making the Cirencester keeper work to keep the score 0-0. Amy Longo had three more such run's and was causing problems for Cirencester with her pace. The pressure was now on the away teams defence's and from her next run; she was able to find the bottom corner of the net with a fine strike keeping the ball low past the keeper's dive: 1-0 Bassett.

Cirencester responded straight away, a fine through ball let in the Cirencester centre forward on goal with only Leah Blanchford to beat she pulled her shot just wide, it was a let off showing that Cirencester were not going to give up. The game was now end to end and stretched with Bassett looking to hit Cirencester on the break. From such a break a second Bassett goal came from some quick passing between Joni Warner and Amy Longo getting the ball to the by line where she managed to pull the ball back to Kate Bonser on the penalty spot who's crisp left foot shot hit the back of the net 2-0 Bassett. No more clear chances before half time in what had been a very tight first half.

The second half saw a change for Bassett Jenna McFadzeon replacing Aly Lyons up front, with the game started the same pattern of play as the first half had ended, with Bassett happy to hit Cirencester on the break. The away side were pushing hard, Bassett were having to work hard all over the pitch to keep the 2-0 lead. Cirencester managed to work a clear sight at goal a long range effort that looked goal bound all the way, until Leah Blanchford managed to get her finger tips and touch the ball round the post. This save gave bassett a lift and were able to force a corner minutes later, from the corner the ball floated into the box and was met full on the volley by Jenna McFadzeon finding the net giving the Cirencester keeper no chance. 3-0 Bassett.

This goal took the pace out of the game with both sides looking tied. The last effort at goal went to Cirencester a direct free kick on the edge of the box for a push, again Leah Blanchford was equal to a fierce shot beating it away to earn herself and the team a clean sheet.

Mike Robbins Forward


Age 26. Has been out with a knee injury for a couple of seasons but is now fully recovered. Strong running who never gives up a cause.

penalty win in the Supplementary Cup finally stopped the rot and was followed by a 1-1 away draw at Fairford at the turn of the year, Dave Tyler with the Wootton Bassett goal. The next side to visit Rylands were title chasing Didcot Town, who included former Swindon Town, Oxford United and West Ham United player Joey Beauchamp in their side, and left with a 5-0 win. A 2-0 away defeat at Devizes Town meant it was eighteen games since the Town had tasted victory at the end of ninety minutes. Under 18 Manager Chris Jones was appointed manager to the end of the season with Barry Giles continuing as his assistant. There was an immediate change in the team's fortunes as goals from Steve Yeardley and Matty Bennett secured a 2-1 away win at Milton United. This was followed up win a 2-1 Supplementary Cup win away at Fairford Town and then two league draws against Pegasus Juniors (1-1) and high flying North Leigh (2-2), Dave Tyler scoring in both fixtures and Mark King getting the second at North Leigh.

The Town made the long journey into London to meet lowly Division One East side Rayners Lane in the Second Round of the Supplementary Cup and following an inept performance went down 2-0. This was the worst performance of the season to date and ended what had been a relatively successful run of four games without defeat. A 3-0 away defeat at Ardley followed leaving Wootton Bassett second from bottom in the table and facing a relegation battle. Goals from Matty Bennett and Steve Yeardley helped Wootton Bassett to three vital points at home against fellow strugglers Hungerford Town in a 2-1 win. However, the team could not repeat the win against other fellow strugglers Chipping Norton the following week, drawing 0-0 in a result that did neither side much good in the relegation battle. This was followed two defeats against Fairford (0-2) and Slimbridge (0-5) to intensify the relegation concerns.

Almondsbury has traditionally been a reasonably happy hunting ground for Wootton Bassett Town and, despite the struggles of Season 2004/5, this was again to prove the case. A solitary strike from Tom Messenger gave renewed hope of salvation with four home fixtures to come. The fact that just one point was secured in these four games, a 1-1 draw with Almondsbury following defeats against Bicester Town (0-1), Tuffley Rovers (1-5) and Witney (0-2) meant relegation was now almost certain. Four away games followed and again yielded just one point. A 2-0 defeat at Bishops Cleeve was followed by a 4-1 defeat at Bicester Town before a point was gained from a 1-1 draw at Pewsey, Steve Yeardley with the goal. The final away fixture saw Wootton Bassett go down 1-0 at Carterton in the game re-arranged following a floodlit failure in the first fixture, a game and set of circumstances that had seen the author charged by firstly the Hellenic League and then the FA with improper behaviour, a charge that was found not proven following a personal hearing and the case dismissed.

The season ended with a home fixture against near neighbours Highworth Town. With Wootton Bassett Town already relegated the game was only really for local pride as far as Wootton Bassett Town were concerned, however for Highworth Town the Hellenic League championship was at stake and as a result the match drew a large crowd of 226. On a day of mixed emotions Wootton Bassett Town had to suffer the pain of seeing near rivals Highworth celebrate their first ever Hellenic League Premiership title whilst knowing their place at the top table had been lost. Highworth won the match 3-0 and once they got in front the result was never in doubt. Wootton Bassett Town had finished second from bottom, one point ahead of Pewsey Vale, one point behind Bicester but a massive 13 points below the 4th from bottom side, Chipping Norton Town. Just six games had been won and strangely four of these had come away from home. Eleven games had been lost by the odd goal demonstrating that at times Wootton Bassett Town were not that far away but with just 30 goals from 42 games, by far the lowest in the division, it is clear where the problem lay.

Crabbe Snaps Yet another Bassett Lead

Rylands Way, 16th December 2006 v Lydney (Lost 1-2)

It's been one of those seasons so far for Paul Burke's side: in seven league losses so far this year they have only really been truly outclassed twice. Against second placed Lydney Town – in the first ever meeting of the two sides – missed opportunities cost the home side yet again as the visitors scraped out a 2-1 victory in an open game.

In the first ten minutes Bassett could have taken a 3-0 lead but only one chance was converted and that was the first in the 3rd minute - Marcus Neale's effort from the edge of the area was headed out only as far as Nathan Hall and the forward got a foot to the ball to direct it in off the near post. Two minutes later a powerful Andy White volley whistled past the wrong side of the post from 20-yards after good work down the right flank from Hall and Matty Bennett. Bassett breached the league's second best defence yet again on 8 minutes when White set Hall through on goal to beat the offside trap. Despite having room in front of him to run into, Hall struck an effort from 25-yards that nearly doubled the lead but instead went just wide. A soft goal brought the visitors' level in the 9th minute with their first shot on goal all game. A cross from the left wasn't headed away by Lee Beavis and Daniel Clarke made him pay by firing into the bottom left corner from 18-yards. After a dominating spell in the opening ten minutes, Bassett were then pegged back by their opponents for the rest of the half. The defence were able to cope well though, combining a high line and trigger happy linesman to good effect as Lydney were caught the wrong side of the last but one defender numerous times. Midway through the half Jon Davis was booked for a foul and he was lucky to last the opening 45 minutes let alone most of the game when a late lunge by the touchline went unpunished. A minute before half time Mark Saunders whipped in a free kick from the right which Mark Crabbe got a head to ten yards but he could only direct the ball a couple inches over the bar. Hall then shot wide after a crossfield ball from Beavis after a quick goal kick.

Four minutes into the second half the ball fell kindly for an unmarked Bennett on the edge of the box. The usually clinical finisher scuffed his effort though and Richard Thomas was able to easily scoop up the ball. Neale was then replaced by Steve Shaw before Thomas was forced into a great save to deny White. The ball bounced around the danger area before Bennett was able to play a pass into the path of White and the in form striker shot on the slide, forcing the outstretched Lydney 'keeper to parry the ball wide. Bassett shot themselves in the foot just before the hour when Chris Mills was caught in possession allowing the visitors to break, outnumbering their hosts and a low, long range drive from Crabbe beat a diving James Domm. Two more changed followed as Andy Hallett replaced Beavis and Mark King was put on for Jon Davis as Burke went with three up front for the final quarter of an hour. This move allowed Lydney to apply more pressure on the Bassett defence and a quick counter attack opened up a shot for Clarke and his long range shot beat Domm but struck the left upright. With three minutes left Steve Yeardley squared to White on the edge but the forward didn't connect probably, sending the ball well wide when he should have done better. Lydney found the post once again inside the final two minutes as Domm gave the ball away and Adrian Neale found the post with an open goal.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Rich Gee – comfortable at the back and linked up well with the midfield. Never lost sight of his man and won a number of headers to break up attacks.

Scoop Rating: 6/10 – Two errors allowed Lydney to net two decisive goals. Bassett played some good football but the final pass was often missing and the finishing wasn't up to scratch as Lydney's defence didn't look like the one that had conceded just 14 goals prior to the game.

Spiller and Bennett had half chances early on in the second half but failed to convert. On the hour mark Rich Willis nearly scored an own goal as he connected with a deep ball from Steve Jenkins and Willis chipped just over the bar. Nine minutes later, Paul Pocock fired a 25-yard effort, which rebounded off the bar before, Pears fired in the follow up but Flynn made a great reflex save to shut it away. Dave Tyler replaced John Magani in the 71st minute to add more strength in the midfield, as Bassett weren't winning the majority of 50-50 balls. Pocock then tried a pot shot from forty yards, which went just over the bar thirteen minutes from time before, in the 81st minute young Mark King made his debut, replacing Steve Bunting. In the 89th minute – when the tie looked as though it was heading for a replay – Neil Saunders grabbed a late winner for the home side. He connected with a Spiller cross after Spiller and May had worked a quick free kick, catching the defence off guard and Saunders headed home."

The late winner denied Wootton Bassett from a potential money spinning replay and the chance of some welcome prize money. Three days later another cup defeat as Wootton Bassett Town lost on penalties to local rivals Malmesbury Vics in the Floodlit Cup following a dour 0-0 draw. The cup woe was to continue with a heavy defeat in the First Qualifying Round of the FA Vase away at Wellington. Wootton Bassett went down 4-0 and really did not compete in the most disappointing performance of the season to date, again losing the chance for any much needed prize money. The poor form then continued into the league fixtures as Bassett lost 3-0 away at Didcot and 2-1 at home against Wantage Town, Matty Bennett scoring the consolation goal for Bassett.

Things were to pick up in the next two fixtures as Wootton Bassett Town secured 1-0 away wins at both Henley Town and Tuffley Rovers, Matty Bennett getting the all important goal in both games. However, a disappointing performance at home to lowly Chipping Norton Town saw Wootton Bassett Town go down 1-0 against a poor side. This was followed by another home defeat by the same score against Ardley, A narrow 2-3 midweek defeat at high-flying Slimbridge indicated things may be improving and a win was secured in the next game, a Wiltshire County Cup fixture at Bromham. In reality the win was against a weak Wiltshire League side in a performance that left a lot to be desired and did nothing on a freezing cold day to cheer up the travelling Bassett support. The Wootton Bassett goals were scored by Andy Youngsam and coach Mick Byrne. The following week stand-in keeper Chris Mills was the star of the show in a 0-0 draw at home against Milton United. There then followed a desperate run of form as Wootton Bassett lost six games in a row against Slimbridge (2-3) in the Floodlit Cup, Highworth Town (1-4), Tuffley Royers (1-2) in cup. Bishops Cleeve (0-1), North Leigh (0-4) and Witney United (1-2), Saturday 20th November will go down as they day that probably led to manager Pete Yeardley finally calling it a day, although it was to be a two more weeks before he made that decision. Leading 3-0 with thirty minutes to go down in Hereford thanks to goals from Geoff Swatton (2) and Dave Tyler the points were as good as in the bag. Somehow in those final thirty minutes the Town side managed to ship four goals on a cold afternoon to make that long journey back a very depressing and seem even longer than normal. On the bus back Chairman Mark Smedley and sponsor Ken Locke talked Pete into continuing but knew that one more inept performance like that would probably see one of the best managers in Wootton Bassett Town's recent history step down. A 2-2 draw with Shortwood improved morale, Matty Bennett and Geoff Swatton finding the net but a 1-0 defeat at home to Henley Town made in no win in ten games.

Saturday 4th December saw Abingdon United visit Rylands Way and leave with all three points after inflicting a painful 5-1 result. After the game manager Pete Yeardley advised the Chairman he was stepping down and coach Mick Byrne also called it a day in what was a disappointing moment for the Club. The fact that Mick is now a coach at Conference Club Forest Green Rovers demonstrates the quality Pete had brought to the club but unfortunately the team had lost the ability to win games and Pete felt a change of voice was needed in the dressing room if the Club was to avoid defeat from the Premier Division. Former First Team manager Barry Giles was put in temporary charge but there was no immediate change in fortune as the team went down 1-3 at Wantage and 1-2 at home to Carterton. A

Season 2004-05 - Down Down

What was going on in the world

The season kicked off with 3 of a Kind at number one in the pop charts with Baby Cakes and ended with Tony Christie/Peter Kay at the top with the re-issued Is this the Way to Amarillo. You Tube was invented by Steve Chen, Chad Hurley and Jawed Karim from a garage as a destination to watch and share original videos worldwide through the Web. The Sims 2 was the leading video game of 2004. Arsenal and Manchester United met in the FA Cup Final and neither side managed a goal but Arsenal won on penalties. Meanwhile Chelsea were winning the Premiership, twelve points ahead of Arsenal. Liverpool won the Champions League in one of the most exciting finals of all time, coming back from 3-0 down at half time.

Pete Yeardley remained at the helm as the 2004-5 season kicked-off with an away visit to Abingdon United. On a hot summers day Wootton Bassett Town put up a spirited performance against a side that were to make a serious challenge for honours by the end of the season, going down by a solitary goal. Three days later the first win of the season was secured courtesy of a goal from new signing Andy Youngsam as Shortwood were sent home pointless. With this opening win optimism for a good season prevailed around Rylands Way. Next up saw Wootton Bassett Town take part in the Hellenic League's annual Ground hoppers weekend programme. This involved six games played over the Bank Holiday weekend at the end of August where kick-off times were staggered to allow "Ground hoppers" (a person who visits football grounds across the country) to attend each fixture in succession. In order to feed the large crowd anticipated the club arranged for an outside caterer to provide burgers and refreshments and additional programmes were ordered. The Club were rewarded with a large crowd of 268 for the local derby fixture against Pewsey Vale. Dave "Bonnie" Tyler scored the goal for Wootton Bassett Town in the one all draw in front of the largest crowd witnessed at Rylands Way since the preseason friendly against Swindon Town. Large crowds were the order of the day again in the Town's next two fixtures but both games were disappointing affairs. In front of a crowd of 117, Wootton Bassett Town went down 4-1 at Hungerford Town in the league. Ben Gascoyne with the Bassett goal. Four days later the team travelled by coach down to Exmouth Town for the Club's first fixture in the FA Cup since Season 1950-51. With a large travelling support swelling the crowd to 140, the day was to end in heartbreak for Wootton Bassett as Stuart "Scoop" Smedley reported on the Club's website.

"An 89th minute goal from Neil Saunders robbed Bassett Town of a replay as Exmouth Town won their Preliminary Round tie by three goals to two. Bassett were the better team for most of the game but failed to capitalise on this as poor defending led to three silly goals and some abysmal officiating also cost them dear. After five minutes, Exmouth nearly took the lead when Richard Pears got goalside of Rich Willis but headed over from a Steve May free kick. A minute later, Bassett were ahead when Andy Youngsam played through Matty Bennett who slotted under 'keeper Simon Harris and the ball went in off the post. It wasn't long until Exmouth drew level. In the 12th minute, Tom Gardner put a free header past Lee Flynn as May picked him out with another free kick. Lee Morse gave Bassett the lead again in the 15th minute when he delivered a perfect free kick which dipped over the wall and into the back of the net from twenty yards. Three minutes later, Richard Pears came close for the home side when he shot over from twenty vards whilst unmarked. Lee Flynn was called into action again after 20 minutes as he tipped over from May's free kick. May again nearly created a goal as Pears connected with his cross but he headed over from a free header. In the 32nd minute, the scores were again level; Richard Spiller ran through three Bassett defenders and fired home past Lee Flynn from ten yards out. Two minutes later Matt Bennett was booked for kicking the ball away after being adjudged offside when he was in his own half. He didn't hear a whistle so carried on and the referee decided to book him. Just before the break Paul Pocock volleyed over from the edge of the area and the scores were tied at the break.

FOOTY NUT

With the need for more referees I have noticed recently a scheme run in the area for young referees coming through. At the Centre of Excellence Swindon where I coach the goalkeepers, young referees just coming into the game work in threes and as the games are played in smaller sections (i.e. 4 x 20 min game or 2 x 25 and 1 x 20 min games) they take it in turns to referee and act as linesmen and at the end of each period the assessor gives them feedback on their good points and points that they need to work on. It's a great idea and one I'm all for if it helps bring more through and helps improve them. The whole "Respect" campaign is fine providing it works both ways as players and managers are supposed to talk sensibly to them but at times it seems officials can bark things at players and managers however they like. On Sunday just gone I watched as a more senior figure was refereeing although new to refereeing and it was clear as day he was new to it, very very hot on the rules but certainly lacked in understanding of the game and situations. The most disappointing moment for me was just as he blew for the end of a period he wanted to have a word with one of the Swindon players (we are talking 14 years of age here) about an incident that had just happened. Instead of going to him or taking him to a quiet area of the pitch and talking quietly and sensibly and calming a situation down, he ran away from the player and towards the side of the pitch where all the parents were and made the lad go to him and then talk in a loud enough voice that even I could hear on the far side of the pitch while wagging his finger at him in School Headmaster mode!! I hope that the assessor took him to one side and gave him a telling off for the manner in which he acted!! Nevertheless I do think the scheme is a worthwhile one and hope that it helps young referees develop.

On the matter of refereeing one of my gripes and one that I need to seek further advice on is when a referee wants to have words with a player but isn't going to book him he has to have the team captain come over and be there when he talks to that player???? Recently in a game in which we were chasing an equaliser with 5 minutes to go, one of our lads committed a foul, in our opponents half, called our player over then demanded that our captain who is our right back had to make his way all the way down the pitch, listen to his spiel then race back and get ready to defend the free kick!! As fit as our captain is, with 5 minutes to go of a gruelling Southern League encounter the last thing he needs is a wasted run......I shouted at him to stay where he was but being the good soul he is he still made his way to the ref. I keep meaning to find out, what happens if the captain refuses to go to the ref, surely he can't be booked for that????....Answers on a postcard to..........

Hamble Deliver Late Hammer Blow

Rylands Way, 5th September 2009

After going further than ever before in last year's FA Vase Wootton Bassett Town reverted to type, crashing out at the first attempt, as they lost 3-2 at home against Wessex League outfit Hamble ASSC.

Three defensive errors proved costly for Dave Turner's side, with the game being decided in the dying stages. Jamie Musslewhite seized upon a mishit 87th minute Liam Edmundson clearance. playing a through ball to the dangerous Richard Gregory, who rounded Stewart Thompson before slotting the ball home despite Steve Groom's valiant attempt to clear the ball away. Bassett had earlier taken the lead, albeit arguably against the run of play when Adam Field lobbed the onrushing John Webb with a controlled finish following an Alex Green flick on. The goal seemed unlikely moments earlier as Luke Sharps scuffed his free kick. But with the ball being helped on by a fortuitously positioned Marcus Hall, the ball eventually ended up in the top right corner of the net. Before that, Hamble had twice come close from dangerous Gregory deliveries. Firstly, his right wing free kick was met with a powerful header by Ricky Rawlings, but the ball sailed agonizingly wide. Then on the quarter hour mark his testing cross was headed back across goal by Jimmy Bull, but timely intervention from Chris Oram allowed the defender to head wide. Eventually, the visitors found the back of the net. After Bassett failed to clear their lines twice, the ball eventually popped up to an unmarked Musslewhite and he headed the ball into an unguarded net on 24 minutes. Then, just after the half hour mark, Oram got the wrong side of his man, and in a desperate attempt to prevent Musslewhite adding a second he handled inside the area, with the nearside linesmen alerting the referee to his transgression. The penalty was comfortably dispatched by James Roden, who sent Thompson the wrong way. Just before the break, Gregory once again delivered an inch perfect cross - this time from by-line - and once again Musselwhite was there on the end of it, but his glancing header lacked the power and direction to put it out of reach of Thompson.

Following the break, an acrobatic save from Thompson brilliantly denied Gregory after he had again got in behind the defence courtesy of a lofted pass from left back Rawlings. Taking advantage of this let off, a moment of inspiration from James Turner set up Frankie Hunt's coolly taken equaliser. The central midfielder gained possession just inside the visitor's half before muscling his way past three men. A deft reverse pass then set Hunt free, and the substitute coolly slid the ball past Webb. Bassett struggled to gather any momentum after the goal though, with Thompson's goal coming under increased pressure. The hosts were not helped by both Hunt and Jon Holloway hobbling off, leaving them with just nine men, having used their allotted substitutes. Musselwhite curled an 18-yard effort just wide of the left post before Ashley Wilson should have done better when he volleyed Gregory's right wing cross over from all of ten yards. The visitors eventually ensured extra time was not to be required though, and it was fitting that Gregory was rewarded for his outstanding contribution.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Steve Groom – another mature display at right back from the youngster.

Scoop Rating: 6/10 – after bowing down to their Wessex League opponents last week, Bassett took the fight to them this time around, but again defensive frailties proved their undoing.

FA Cup 1st Qualifying Rd






