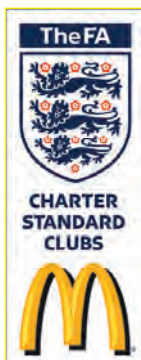

CHAIRMAN'S CHAT



Good afternoon, welcome to you all and to our visitors for this League fixture, Easington Sports.

I must firstly write on behalf of our Town to thank the officials, players and supporters of Easington for their open letter that was read out by Keith Hudson at the August meeting of the League, in which they expressed their thanks to our Town for the honour and respect we display to our fallen servicemen as the sad repatriations pass through, and which observed that many of those returning in this tragic way are the same age and generation as those playing in the League every week. I passed a copy of the letter to our Town's mayor and local MP who both replied with their thanks for the expression of support. The mayor in his reply commented "every one of the repatriations is a sad event which reinforces the pride and gratitude we feel for our armed services personnel. It is especially reassuring to know that throughout the country, and even the world, people like yourselves feel the same as we do. I would be most grateful if you would convey my thanks, on behalf of the people of Wootton Bassett, to all members, players and your colleagues in the Hellenic League for this expression of support".

Just as we pause for reflection as repatriations pass through and then return to our daily lives, so I now return to the matters of football. With the start of the European Champions League and Europa League group fixtures, it once again highlights the dilemma for many clubs of the price of success. Whilst success in the League is a desire for all involved with a club, the extra fixtures are difficult for smaller clubs to absorb. Both Everton and Fulham faced 4 games prior to getting through the group stages, and now 6 in the group stages, all before xmas. Add in the travel to Eastern Europe for some fixtures and it is no surprise that the success of qualification is tempered by concern regards the potential impact on League performance. This same dilemma exists at our level of football, where success in FA and/or FA Vase cups, whilst lucrative and prestigious, leaves clubs well behind in fixtures and unless the winter weather is kind, likely to face too many games at the end of the season when the squad is already tired. That's not to say that anyone involved with those clubs would want to miss out on the success that causes the problem, and of course those with the mindset to take on a challenge will in fact be energised by the issue and it can potentially lead to improvement of the club. However, where the environment in which the club operates can never realistically support a club the size of United or Liverpool, it really can lead to a difficult and long season. Specific to our own position, let's hope the missed League fixtures can be rearranged as soon as possible to prevent the late season problem.

Anyway, back to this match, here's to a good competitive fixture, and of course a Bassett win!

OPPONENTS HISTORY

EASINGTON SPORTS FC • CLUB HISTORY

The Club was formed in the immediate post-war period of 1945/46 to fulfil the sporting and social needs of the young people of the Easington housing estate in Banbury, many of who were returning from war service.

The Club, then known as 'The Clan', soon prospered, as there was an obvious need for such a facility, and formed a cricket, tennis and a ladies section. Football was, however, the main branch of the Club's activity, and they began playing in the local Junior Leagues as Easington Sports F.C.

The football was played on pastureland to the west of Wykham Lane, and for a few years endured the lack of facilities enjoyed today by almost all clubs. (No water available on site, no real changing facilities to name but two of the privations to be met on a cold winter's afternoon). Fortunately, this situation was soon to change, for as a result of tireless fund raising by all concerned and some dedicated work by stalwarts such as Gordon Vivash, Tim Fountain and many other committed club members, the prospect of a new ground owned by the Club became a reality. The purchase of the Addison Road ground and the building of a clubroom, together with the Club's entry to the Oxfordshire Senior League was the beginning of senior football for Sports, and to their credit they proved to be a formidable force at that level. (Becoming winners and finalists in the Senior Cup and heading the Premier League table on two occasions in the early and mid-fifties).

In view of their success at county level the Club sought entry, and was accepted into the old Warwickshire Combination, which at that time counted professional and semi-professional teams. (Aston Villa 'A', West Bromwich Albion 'B' and teams which now grace the Conference as members). Although having moderate success in this competition, as with many amateur clubs, finance played its part in the decision to return to the Oxfordshire Senior League where the expenses, particularly travelling, were much more in line with the Club's limited income.

Looking to raise their standards once more, the Club sought entry to the Hellenic League. Subject to certain ground improvements they were readily accepted, and have remained as members of Division One ever since. With some 'ups and downs', Sports have almost always been mid-table at the end of each season, which, considering their amateur status against mostly professional or well-sponsored opponents has not been too bad a record.

The Club has always sought to give the youngsters of Banbury and district an opportunity to get into senior football, and indeed beyond, and has continually run youth teams at various age levels wishing those whose ability took them to higher levels good luck, and feeling grateful that the Club gave them the start to their careers. It has sometimes been said that Easington Sports have not been ambitious or forward looking enough in their fifty-five years, but shrewd and cautious stewardship by series of committees over the years have ensured that the Club has never overreached itself financially, and has remained faithful to its original ideals to provide football of a good standard for local youth.

An 11 goal thriller was in store on this first away trip, not the nicest changing facilities less said the better. The pitch was flat but open to the elements and on this occasion a stiff breeze blowing diagonally from corner to corner with the sun trying to warm the afternoon up.

The game started with Gloucester only having 10 players but as last week very tidy and composed on the ball. Even with ten players they were a threat going forward and were very much on top, after ten minutes panic in the Bassett defence when Leah Blanchard called and came for a cross but missed. She was let off when the Gloucester city forward failed to connect, no such luck 5 minutes later a good sharp turn on the edge of the box leaving the Bassett defence flat footed followed with a thumping a shot into the net, 1-0 Gloucester.

The lead only lasted 7 minutes a little bit of fortune in the build up, against the run of play a corner from Kate Bonser was only half cleared inside the box the ball fell to Joni Warner whose snap shot got deflected off a defender and looped over the keeper and was tapped into the net on the goal line by Alyson Lyons to make it one all.

Bassett had grown in confidence with the goal and went looking for another, a strong run up field by Amy Longo where she forced another corner, from the resulting corner Jenna McFadzean found herself unmarked on the edge of the six yard box and was able to stab the ball home to make it 2-1 Bassett.

Bassett ahead but not for long, Gloucester taking centre and four passes later Leah Blanchard was picking the ball out of the net after being left 1 on 1 with a Gloucester forward Almost on half time Bassett gained the lead again this time Katie Bonser letting fly from twenty yards a speculative shot that the keeper could only palm into her own net. 3-2 Bassett half time

Second half started with both sides having players caring knocks, Gwen Hopkins replaced Joni Warner in the centre of midfield. The game was still in the balance with no side having total control, the game was starting to get stretch, when on 55 minutes Gloucester won a free kick on the edge of the Bassett box, the result a powerful shot which took a slight deflection of a defender taking it past Leah Blanchard into the Bassett net to make it 3-3.

Game on again all to play for the next goal went to Bassett again on 59 minutes more luck than judgement a cross from Amy Longo found Alyson Lyons on the edge of the box who's missed timed pass caught the wind and looped over the keeper dropping into the net to make it 4-3 Bassett Could Bassett hold the lead, the answer only for five minutes the Bassett defence were caught high and flat as a Gloucester forward broke away a calm finish giving Leah Blanchard no chance. 25 minutes left of the game both sides were looking tired Gloucester were pushing forward looking to take the lead but got caught when Gwen Hopkins won the ball in midfield releasing Jenna McFadzean who raced down field rounded the keeper to score from close range. This goal was the turning point of the game Gloucester's 10 players had run out of legs, and Jenna McFadzean went on a mini rampage scoring 2 more goals on 84 & 89 minutes to wrap up a pulsating game

Fantastic player with great ability to score goals and create them, also a good keeper if needed.

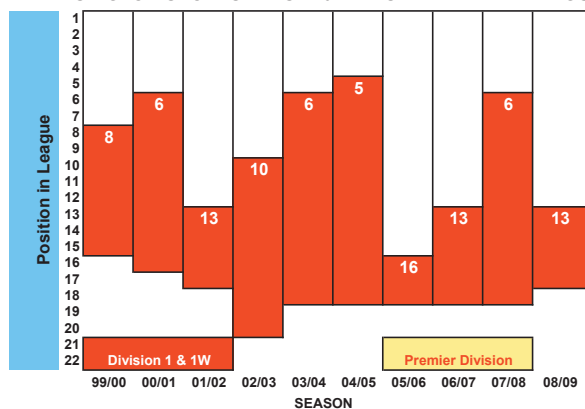

Wiltshire County League Ghia Junior Cup Runners-up 1988/89

Four years after first reaching the Ghia Junior Cup final, Wootton Bassett Town Reserves negotiated their way there again during the 1988/89 season. However, like their earlier counterparts, they were to come up short in the showpiece, this time falling to a strong Walcot side in an agonising extra time defeat.

Bassett were given an almighty fright in their First Round tie at Division Four outfit Oaksey, but eventually ran out 3-2 winners. From there on in, Bassett were to face Division Three counterparts, beginning with a trip to Pewsey Vale in the Second Round. Yet again they were made to work hard for victory, recording a narrow 2-1 win to progress to the quarter finals, where they were to face Bemerton on home soil. The Salisbury-based outfit had beaten Bassett in the league earlier in the year, but struggled mightily at Rylands Way as Bassett showed no mercy, gaining revenge for their previous loss.

By now in strong league form, the team carried this over, knocking five past their opponents. Barry Speirs led the way with a brace, whilst Steve Thomas and Paul Burke chipped in with a goal each, the other goal coming courtesy of a Bemerton defender. In a strange twist Bassett were paired yet again with West Swindon in the semi final. Again a solitary goal ended up deciding the tie, with Gerry McKay supplying the extra time winner.

Walcot were to prove too strong though – just as they had done to their other Division Three rivals during their successful league campaign. Wootton Bassett gave them a hard game and had much the better of the first half play with Mick Karn, Barry Speirs, and Frank Serratore all going close.

Rob Langham, who was later named as man of the match, was safe in Walcot's goal and one of his saves to deny Greg Smith in the 32nd minute was outstanding.

Walcot's first shot at goal did not come until the 35th minute with Norman Clark just wide but, after Langham had saved a Karn header, Walcot broke away to take the lead with a 42nd minute header by Stuart Morse.

Even then Bassett almost equalised two minutes later when Speirs headed Paul Harper's free kick against Walcot's crossbar.

Twine was again in action to save from Morse in the 65th minute but the ball went straight to the other end for Chappell to equalise with a header from a 66th minute free kick.

Another save by Langham from Speirs and a miss from only two yards out by Gary Hogg for Walcot brought full time with the scores still level.

Extra time saw Speirs shoot wide from eight yards range before, in the 106th minute Jo McIlherren put Walcot in front with a ten yard shot that gave Twine no chance.

After seeing the First Team lift the Ghia Senior Cup a year earlier, Wootton Bassett Town Reserves came up agonisingly short in their quest to emulate them in the Wiltshire County League Junior Cup in the 1984/85 season.

Thanks to a dreadful winter, the competition was spread out across the year, with the First Round taking place at the end of the September and the majority of the games in the following round being held in March! This had little adverse effect on Bassett though.

They began their journey to the final with what proved to be a simple First Round tie at home to Division Four side Marlborough Town. Bassett thrashed their visitors 7-1, with Craig Smith dispatching four of those goals. A tricky Second Round tie at Division Four leaders Blunson was then negotiated with minimal effort as a Smith brace and a Chris Brady strike guided the visitors to a 3-0 victory. Fellow Division Three side Amesbury were to be visitors to Rylands Way for the Quarter Final, and Bassett edged a seven goal thriller by the narrowest of margins to book a semi-final date with West Swindon. That game, held at Blunson, was an extremely tight affair, and a coolly dispatched Roger Williamson penalty was all that separated the sides after ninety minutes.

The Reserve side met their match in the final at Aldbourne though, as Oldacre took the lead just before half time, and – with the momentum gained from taking the lead – finished Bassett off with a further goal just after the hour mark.

Birthday Boy Miller Denied Perfect Day

Rylands Way, 30th September 2006 v Easington Sports, Drew 1-1

Despite taking the lead through Dwayne Quinn only six minutes in and a superb performance from freshly turned 16-year old debutant 'keeper Adam Miller, Wootton Bassett Town – who lacked conviction the entire 90 minutes - contrived to throw away two points as they were held to a 1-1 at home by fifth from bottom Easington Sports.

Ricky Johnson denied Bassett the victory twelve minutes from time, as he drove in after Adam Daley had pulled the ball back to the edge of the area where Johnson was waiting unmarked. Henry Rose gave Bassett an early scare as he drilled just wide in the first 60 seconds. Three minutes later Sean Keogh almost stuck one past his own 'keeper but Tom Willshere managed to brilliantly parry wide. Quinn found the back of the net with 6 minutes gone as he cut inside his marker and fired just inside Willshere's near post from eighteen yards. A great run down the right from Matty Bennett should have led to a second in the 21st minute but after he cut the ball back from the byline, Steve Yeardley failed to get the ball out of his own feet and Easington were able to break. A Rich Gee foul broke up the attack and the Bassett defender was cautioned for his actions. Four minutes later Bennett crossed from the right and, after the ball bounced around at the far post, Quinn headed goalwards from eight yards but Willshere was able to hold on. Miller was forced into a great save on the half hour mark after Daley had beaten the offside trap. After bearing down on goal, Daley struck from just inside the box but Miller kept his composure and parried the ball to safety. A late trip on Steve Bunting brought out the second yellow card of the day four minutes later with Russell Wilkins getting his name in the book. With two minutes to go before the break, Rose almost tied the game up as he beat an oncoming Miller to a loose ball but his shot rolled just wide of the far post. A minute later a Bennett cross was met by Yeardley 12 yards out but Willshere was able to keep it out with a diving save.

Bassett continued to create but lack finish after the restart – six minutes into the second half John Magani struck wide a low Yeardley cross from ten yards before Bunting was booked for a tackle in which the ball was won. Scott Large replaced Rich Gee in the 55th minute as Yeardley moved into the back three. Just before the hour Magani drilled a low cross across the face of goal, which an outstretched Mills missed connecting with by an inch whilst unmarked at the far post. Large thought he had a goal in the 63rd minute when his cross from the left was fumbled and looked as though it had hit the back of the net. However it was ruled not to have crossed the line although Mark King could have made sure of the goal but didn't poke the ball home from a yard. Paul Burke then made a double change as Jon Davis and Nathan Hall replaced Bunting and King. With 66 minutes gone a left footed drive from Gavin Conner flew just over after Rose had pulled the ball back across the box. At the other end a Quinn cross picked out Bennett at the far post but his effort from close range was saved with difficulty by Willshere. With twenty minutes to go Bassett failed to clear from a free kick and a Rose shot was blocked by Yeardley but only in the direction of Johnson. However, with it looking easier to score, Johnson volleyed over from six yards. Seven minutes later though he made amends for his earlier miss as he scored the equaliser. After the goal Bassett heads dropped and they clutched at straws for the remainder of the game. A minute after Yeardley had been booked for a trip on the edge of the area, substitute Perry Hawkins unleashed a volley from 20-yards after Bassett once again failed to clear. Miller was beaten but luckily Hawkins' effort found the crossbar. With three minutes to go Bassett gave the ball away from their own throw in allowing Daley to run to the byline before cutting back across the box to an unmarked Hawkins. Once again Hawkins missed though as he sliced his effort well wide. Quinn was booked in the final minute as Bassett failed to win at home for the fourth time this year.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Adam Miller – did brilliantly and his performance between the sticks deserved better. He showed great composure, pulling off some tricky saves and was also superb coming off his line, ending multiple Easington attacks.

Scoop Rating: 4/10 – Bassett lacked punch and desire all game and Paul Burke's frustration wasn't surprising. Despite having numerous opportunities to extend their lead in the first half, Bassett allowed Easington back into the game and were thankful the final whistle came when it did.

Wiltshire County League Division Four Runners-up 1982/83

Wootton Bassett Town Reserves scored freely on their way to runners-up spot in the Wiltshire County League Division Four during the 1982/83 season and, if it wasn't for an indifferent spell at the turn of the year, would surely have beaten newcomers Kington Langley to the league title.

Bassett began the season in imperious form, and held the longest unbeaten streak in all four County League divisions. However, this 15-game run was brought to an end in mid-December by a Ramsbury side who would battle all year for a promotion spot, and this in turn set in motion that poor run, which would ultimately cost them top spot. Although they bounced back from this first defeat with a 5-1 thrashing of Highworth Town – a game which had been rearranged after the initial fixture was cancelled due to fog, defeat followed at home to Bromham before a goalless draw was ground out at Sarsen.

The season had begun with a string of convincing victories, and it took Bassett's stingy defence four games to concede a goal, that coming in a 3-1 home win against Oaksey. Bassett dropped their first points in their sixth game at home to Wroughton, as they failed to protect the lead Alan Hamilton had given them. Nine consecutive wins followed though, beginning with a 5-0 hammering of Corsham and a 4-1 win at home to Box Rovers, in which Chris Meagan netted a hat trick. The biggest win during this spell came at Shrewton as the visitors came away with a 7-1 triumph. In this game Danny Groom bagged a brace, but the day belonged to Craig Smith, who found the back of the net four times; Roger Smith provided the other finish.

Goals from Steve Thomas and Roger Smith were enough for victory at Aldbourne, and the two points put Bassett top. However, then came the loss at Ramsbury and that miserable January. However, a solitary Ian Hamilton strike stopped the rot in an away trip to Terry Warner Pinehurst, but at the end of January Bassett now trailed Kington Langley by four points. Two weeks later – Craig Smith hit four again, this time in a 6-1 mauling of the hapless Corsham. An Alan Hamilton hat trick then inspired Bassett to a 6-0 crushing of Dorcan and, after Cricklade were turned over by four goals without a reply, Smith again netted a three-timer at home to Durrington Sports in a 5-0 win. Defeat followed though as a single goal separated Bassett and the leaders, putting even more pressure on Bassett as Purton hit their stride.

It seemed as though Bassett would not let the pressure being put on them by their local rivals get to them as two big wins followed, but in mid-April Bassett travelled to Box but could only draw. A Purton victory ensured the smallest of margins separated the two sides and this result ended any hopes of the title. A 5-1 win over Highworth followed though, and a Purton draw meant the gap went up to two points again. Promotion was secured without having to play with Ramsbury losing to the leaders, and things got better as Bassett thrashed Pewsey 5-0 on the same day Purton fell heavily to Wroughton to all but secure second spot. They drew 2-2 in their next match with their near neighbours, thus ensuring Purton of third. In the penultimate game, Craig Smith's goal was not enough, as the champions Kington Langley won by the odd goal in three, but the season ended on a high with a 3-1 win at Rylands Way over Shrewton, with Meagan, Mark Lewis and Kevin Bishop supplying the goals to cap off what was a wonderful campaign.

Down at Hunts Copse things aren't looking good with Supermarine having only 4 points from 8 games and sitting third bottom of the league and having been knocked out of the FA Cup at the first hurdle. Mark Collier has done an excellent job there but rumours are that he is considering his position. Having put so much work in there to get them where they are I'm sure it would be a hard decision to walk away (that's if the board don't decide they will end his stay) but Mark has been there 3-4 years and sometimes as a manager there is only so much time you can stay at a club before either you get stale or the players do and with the limitations on budget there compared to others in that league perhaps he just can't get the right players in to change things around much. He has made some astute signings over the years but I think the one to sign former Swindon Town player Adi Williams wasn't a good one. He was injury plagued when he was at Swindon, then at Weston-Super-Mare I'm not even sure he played a game and after one game at Supermarine he is injured again. If he had still had a good level of fitness I could see how he would help bring the younger players on with his experience but he just doesn't play enough to make him a worthwhile signing. It's important for local football in this area that Supermarine stay in the highest division they can so I hope they sort things out with or without Mark.

In the FA Cup recently Hellenic Premier side Pegasus Juniors had a fantastic result against a big non league club in Hednesford Town and the money and glory is something Pegasus deserve. They have been plodding away for a number of years now, an unfashionable club stuck up in deepest darkest Herefordshire but who have worked hard to get a ground and have a nice facility and develop themselves so fair play to them. Closer to home on Saturday Highworth Town slipped out of the FA Vase to Wessex side Laverstock & Ford which is a disappointing result for Webby and they recently suffered defeat to Malmesbury Vics and currently sit only 5 places off the bottom of the table so they need a turnaround in fortune or it could quickly become another disappointing season at the Elms. Shrivensham had a great start to the season then have recently hit a poor patch but bounced back with a good FA Vase win at the weekend so maybe that may kick start them again. In Division One Slimbridge look like the side for the title already and that might sound a silly thing to say so early on but with a record of played 10 won 9 drawn 1 lost 0 and scored 28 and only let in 3, I just can't see anyone catching them. Purton have had a good start also and recently signed Paul Day to go with Warren Fuller and Justin Miller so their forward line has a lot of experience which I think will stand them in good stead.

Further momentum will be gained from the fact the clean sheet was, belatedly, the first of the season for a defensive unit that was the second best in the division last year.



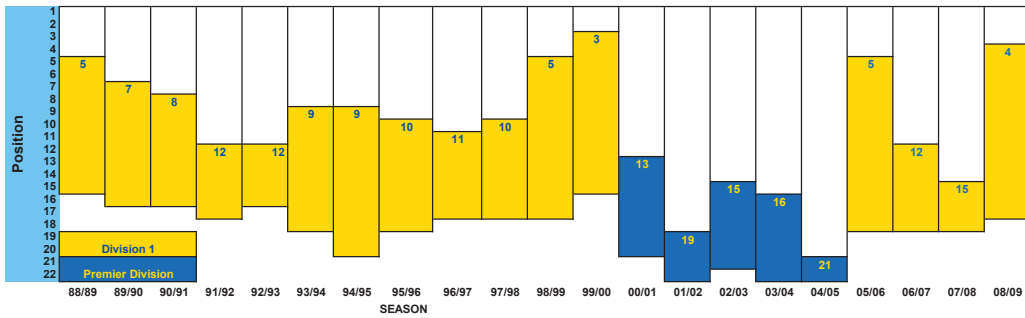

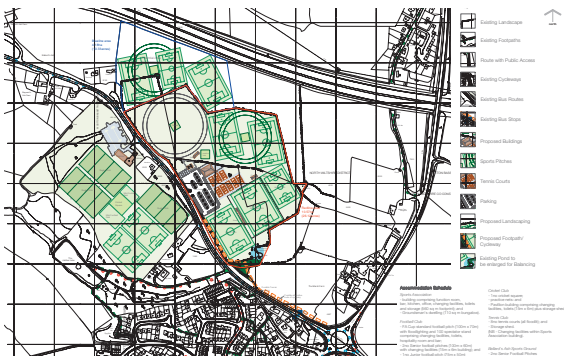

Are you 14 – 18 years of age and want to learn new skills that will enable you to assist with football coaching and the running of a football team at your club, or local school? WBTFC are looking for boys and girls who would be interested in attend a Junior Football Organisers (JFO) training program. The FA JFO course is designed to support young people aged 14 to 18 with the skills to lead groups of young people aged between 6 and 11 years in safe football activities under the supervision of an FA qualified coach. 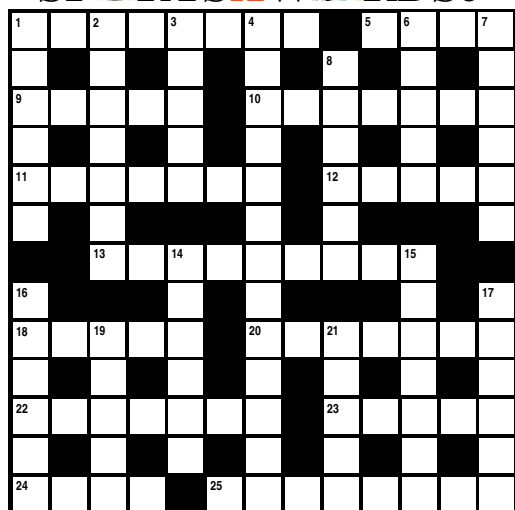

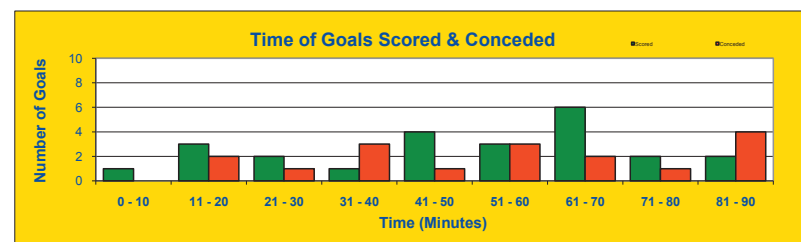
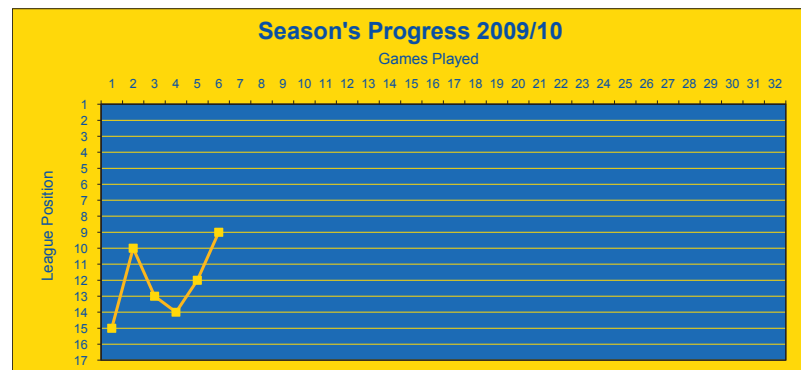
