

OPPONENTS HISTORY

TYTHERINGTON ROCKS FC • CLUB HISTORY

Tytherington Football Club was formed in 1896 by the local Headmaster Mr Emanuel and others including the Rev. John Bingley. Rev. Bingley stipulated that, to gain his support, the club should play in Amber & Black - his old college colours - Brasenose in Oxford.

In the early days the club played in the Wotton-Under-Edge League and travelled to away matches by Waggonetts, a four wheeled horse draw cart, with seats along both sides. The club played at many different grounds in the early days, one of which was Mill-Leaze Fields. This is the fields behind the village shop in Tytherington. They eventually found a permanent home at the Hardwicke Playing Fields. The club used the Swan Inn as their changing rooms until a new pavilion was erected by the Parish Council, on the Playing Fields in 1938.



In the 1920s Tytherington F.C. were suspended by the Gloucestershire Football Association for non payment of a fine. The fine followed a referee being jostled into an adjoining brook after what the home side felt were some dubious decisions! No Pay – no play, so Tytherington disbanded until 1932 when Tytherington Rocks F.C. was formed, joining The Bristol Suburban League. Ambrose Johnson was a Rocks player in the 30s and 40s and is still an ardent supporter today.

War disrupted the local leagues but not before the club won the League & Cup double in the Iron Acton & District League in 1944-45. Rocks rejoined the Bristol Suburban League Division 1 in 1947. The same year a youth team called the Pebbles were formed and played in the Gloucestershire Junior Boy's Association Football League. They were cup finalists in 1952-53 and League Champions in 1953-54.

In 1948-49 Rocks were drawn home to Thornbury Town in the G.F.A Senior Amateur Cup, there were 400 spectators at the game but Rocks were firmly beaten 4-0.

In the early 50s Tytherington ran a Reserve side in the Stroud League. This second attempt to run a reserve team soon failed due to player shortage. In 1956-57 Rocks were losing finalists in the GFA Minor Cup however; the team spent most of the 1960s between Division Three and Division Five.

A joint effort between the Club, Cricket Club and the Parish Council saw the facilities upgraded in 1979-80, with new showers and toilet block together with electricity! Candlelight and Rocks famous tin bath were consigned to history. Three enthusiasts were largely responsible for these improvements - Ron Holpin on the practical side, Tony Hennessy on the financial side and Dave Kemp for plumbing.

The Reserves reformed in Division 7 whilst under the manager Jack Parr the first team moved through the Divisions reaching Division 1 for the 1987-88 season. Two managers, Ron Holpin and Mike Lee led the Reserves to promotion and a Cup Final in three consecutive seasons between 1985 and 1987. In 1987-88 saw the formation of the third team joining Division 7 and at the same time Streamside Juniors were adopted as Tythering-nach Rocks Juniors. A floodlight training pitch, the result of hard voluntary work was opened by Ted Pitt, Ted Oakey and Ambrose Johnson. With Brian Lansdown as manager from 1988-89 Rocks entered Premier Division 2 and by 1993 arrived in Premier Division 1. Ground improvements continued with team dugouts and perimeter fencing

As Champions of the Bristol & Suburban Premier League In 1996-97, it was shock and disappointment when their Gloucestershire County League application was rejected. Undaunted, attention then turned to the clubhouse, a new bar, separate changing facilities, referee accommodation for both sexes and a spectator stand all raised the profile of the club and in 1997-98 this time the County League application was successful. With financial help from Nuclear Electric, Mother India Restaurant and Karly Kars the club had achieved County League Status. Stand seats arrived thanks to ex-player Keith Cameron's generosity.

Under manager Shaun Honour the team survived a difficult first season but during the next four years enjoyed top half finishes and were GFA Challenge Trophy Finalists, League Cup Finalists and in 2003-04 were County League Runners-up. Managers Mickey Jefferies and Andy Mathias had prepared Tytherington for Hellenic League football. Hellenic League status Division 1 (West) arrived in 2004-05 and a 4th place finish in the first season. A new management team of Jamie Burton and Barry Granger achieved top half places in the next 3 seasons, 3rd place the best ever in 2007. The reserves also moved up to Div 1 in the Bristol Suburban League under Andy Jarvis.Season 2008/09 was the first season with Barry Granger as Manager and Assistant Paul Staddon, the team established themselves in the top half of the League all season, finally finishing in ninth position. The Reserves under Andy Jarvis challenged for a promotion place all season finally finishing third and gained promotion to Prem 2 of the Bristol Suburban League.



FROM THE ARCHIVES

Saturday 28th November finally saw Wootton Bassett Town play another league game with Westbury United the visitors to Rylands Way. A solitary goal from Ray Young was Wootton Bassett's only response to four goals from the visitors. The first league point since September was secured in the first December fixture at home to Calne & Harris, Ray Young scoring in a 1-1 draw. The calendar year ended with an excellent result as Wootton Bassett returned from Frome Town Reserves with both points following a 6-1 win courtesy of goals from Ronnie Mair (2), Granville Taylor, Stan Embling, Lou Nash and Johnny Lawrence.

Wootton Bassett Town clearly over did the festivities as when they returned to action against Pinehurst, a side they had beaten three times and drawn twice with already during the season, they went down 6-0 at home. Clearly shocked by this poor result they then won three games on the bounce scoring fifteen goals in the process. A 5-2 win over Spencer Moulton included a first half hat-trick from Pete Teetgen. Teetgen was again amongst the goals as Wootton Bassett Town returned from Bulford with both points following a 6-1 win, the other goals coming from Johnny Lawrence (2), Ronnie Mair, Mervyn Jefferies and an own goal. The third victory was against Chippenham United Reserves, Wootton Bassett winning 4-0 courtesy of goals from Lou Nash (2), Mervyn Jefferies and an own goal.

The winning run came to an end when Frome Town Reserves shared four goals and the points at Rylands Way, Mervyn Jefferies and Stark with the Wootton Bassett goals, A 2-0 defeat at Warminster Town was then followed by a narrow 1-0 win over Melksham Town. Goals from Pete Teetgen and Stan Embling enabled the Town to share the points at Devizes Town, with Ronnie Mair missing a penalty for Wootton Bassett. This was followed by an excellent 3-0 home win over Swindon Town A, Stark, Mervyn Jefferies and an own goal doing the damage.

Wootton Bassett suffered two consecutive defeats at the end of March. A 4-3 defeat at Calne & Harris United where Stan Embling, Pete Teetgen and Mervyn Jefferies scored for Wootton Bassett was followed by a narrow 2-1 defeat at Westbury United, Mervyn Jefferies with the only goal. April saw a subsidiary cup competition run by the league and Wootton Bassett recorded their record win of the season, a massive 8-0 victory over Spencer Moulton. Ronnie Mair fired a first half hat-trick, Pete Teetgen scored twice and there was one a piece for Lou Nash, Stan Embling and Granville Taylor, Goals from Colin Taylor, Lou Nash and Stan Embling secured Wootton Bassett the double over Swindon Town A in less than a month. April saw a 2-2 draw with Chippenham United Reserves and a 2-1 defeat at Chippenham Town.







drive Wootton Bassett equalised in the 15th minute with a lovely shot from wing-half Pewsey. They kept up the pressure and in the 40th minute a long free-kick well placed by Curtis was deflected home by Teetgen. At the start of the second half Radstock pressed hard for the equaliser, but in a breakaway Wootton Bassett increased their lead and put the result beyond doubt. Embling whipped the ball across the goal from the left and Young dashed in to drive it home."

The next opponents in the third qualifying round of the FA Amateur Cup competition were Welton Rovers, leaders of Division Two of the Western League. Wootton Bassett once again went two goals ahead. Geoff Simpkins scored the first with a brilliant header from a Stan Embling centre. A minute later, with the goal-keeper well out, another Embling centre was entering the net when Collins, the Welton centre-half punched it out. Ronnie Mair scored from the penalty spot. Pete Teetgen then found the net but unfortunately the goal was disallowed for offside. Wootton Bassett were two nil up at the break and looking good for the next round. However, a second half hat-trick from Ray Barker for Welton Rovers put them in front, before Ronnie Mair scored a superb headed equaliser for Wootton Bassett which meant yet another drawn game in the competition and a replay. The Evening Advertiser noted in the Monday write-up that "Wootton Bassett Town have met four opponents in this season's FA Amateur Cup Competition but have already played for 13 hours. They have had to replay each of their ties – one of them twice – and in most games have been held after establishing clear-cut leads." The Football Pink the following week noted that the game had resulted in a record gate of £16.

With the draw for the next round already made, with Devizes Town the scheduled opponents for the replay winner in the 4th Qualifying Round, the 3rd Round Replay at Welton Rovers was a game too far for Wootton Bassett as their interest in the competition was ended after thirteen and a half hours. The Football Pink of 21st November carried the following report by "Senior" on the game:

"All Wiltshire football fans were doubly disappointed last week-end when the news came through that Wootton Bassett had been knocked out of the Amateur Cup at Welton. They had been looking forward to an all Wiltshire game today at Devizes which would have ensured the appearance of a representative of ours in the first round proper. Wootton Bassett's luck deserted them completely in their replay at Welton. Peter Teetgen had to forgo the game for a start, and then, before the match had been in progress any time Dave Gillett was injured and hobbled almost helplessly about on the right-wing for the rest of the game.

Into his place as full-back went Granville Taylor, who tried his best but Granville, who until recently has been the regular club right-winger has lost his form of late and only came into this game when Teetgen could not make it because of his injury. In spite of all this Wootton Bassett put up a fine fight and my Welton eye-witness tells me they had far more of the game than the score suggests, also that the Welton goal-keeper Webber, had to make several good saves particularly from Ray Young, Ronnie Mair and Geoff Simpkins. For Welton, the start was perfect – a goal in the second minute and so they went on steadily building up a useful lead at half-time. Then came half an hour of strenuous Wootton Bassett effort to retrieve the position but suddenly a scoring spell enveloped the exchanges with five goals coming in the last 15 minutes, four to the Rovers and one to Wootton Bassett. This shows up Welton to be the ideal cup team, good footballing champions allied to a killer instinct when the game swings their way; the shooting shows no mercy."

The return to league fixtures would have to wait one more week as when Wootton Bassett's interest in the FA Amateur Cup came to an end they then had a fixture in the Wiltshire Senior County Cup at home to Swindon BR. Perhaps tired from their Amateur Cup exploits, Wootton Bassett went down 1-0.

piled on the pressure, and Dave Jones in the Wootton Bassett goal was frequently in action. Pinehurst's effort were rewarded in the 46th minute when Jones failed to hold a terrific shot from Clifford and Prothero was there to hit the ball in to level the scores and force another replay in the competition. The Football Pink in its write up noted "any other result than a draw would have been an injustice to the clubs for whereas Pinehurst had perhaps a little the better of the midfield exchanges, Wootton Bassett were more direct in their final assaults".

Once again the replay took place seven days later meaning another postponed league game. The Football Pink of 24^{th} October 1959 carried the following report on the replay:

"Wootton Bassett go from triumph to triumph. Their latest was in the Amateur Cup when they put paid to Pinehurst's aspirations in that direction. This was the fifth meeting between the pair in the nine weeks the season has been open so one could say the Wootton Bassett boys have profited most by the experience and put the knowledge they have gained best into practice. Actually they have not lost a single one of those five games and have won three of them outright. The two have yet to meet again in the League and there is still the Wilts Cup. On Saturday Wootton Bassett held on grimly to survive a first half battle against the wind and the forwards gave thanks – and heart – to their hard-worked defence by snatching what was almost the only goal scoring chance in that half. Peter Teetgen was the scorer and in the easier second half he went on to complete his hat-trick. Jimmy Prothero, who has been among the goals regularly of late, kept his hand in by scoring Pinehurst's only reply. Wootton Bassett's reward for this win was to act as hosts to Radstock Town in the divisional semi-final this afternoon."

The fixture with Radstock made it the fifth consecutive Saturday of FA Amateur Cup action as Wootton Bassett got behind with their league fixtures. Wootton Bassett were without Frank Curtis and he was replaced by Johnny Lawrence. It did not take long for Lawrence to make his impact, twenty seconds to be exact when, from 40 yards out, his long lob was carried with the wind over the goal-keeper's head into the net. Ray Young was also back at centre forward and he added a second before half time and Wootton Bassett seemed set for a win in spite of having missed other chances. It was not to be though. Radstock had won their previous four games and a penalty by centre half Dave Tilley reduced their deficit and Tilley followed this with the equaliser and the game went to a replay making it six consecutive weeks playing in the FA Amateur Cup. In the replay at Radstock, Wootton Bassett were in brilliant form and were two goals up within twelve minutes, both goals coming from inside left Ronnie Mair. Wootton Bassett led 2-0 at the break but conceded two second half penalties, both converted by Dave Tilly to make it three goals from the spot in the two games and yet another replay, no penalties in those days.

The Evening Advertiser carried a report on the second replay which was played in midweek at Chippenham Town and this is reproduced below:

"Wootton Bassett Town surmounted another FA Amateur Cup hurdle yesterday. At the third attempt they defeated the Western League side Radstock Town 3-1 at Chippenham and so qualified to play Welton Rovers in the final qualifying round at Wootton Bassett on Saturday.

It has taken Wootton Bassett seven games to reach this stage – two to beat Clandown, two to defeat Pinehurst Y.C. and three to dispose of Radstock. Wootton Bassett's win yesterday was certainly well deserved. They always impressed on the more constructive and workmanlike side and their attacking movements were dangerous.

Radstock had the man-of-the-match in centre-half Tilley, who in the two earlier games had scored the goal to earn his side replays after Wootton Bassett had built up 2-0 leads. Radstock went into the lead in the tenth minute. Under pressure full back Gillett tried to pass back and he put the ball into his own net. After Young had gone near with a fierce

Three Points: A Near Perfect Present for Bassett

Hardwicke Playing Fields, 26th December 2006 v Tytherington Won 2-1

The Christmas period started brilliantly for Wootton Bassett Town, despite seeing Steve Bunting receive a red card on the hour mark, as two first half goals from unlikely sources earned a deserved 2-1 victory away at Tytherington Rocks.

After being reduced to ten men, Bassett rode their luck for the final thirty minutes as at least three Tytherington shots were cleared off the line but the better team won as a dominant opening 45 minutes was enough to ensure victory. Two minutes in Scott Large struck just wide after good work by John Magani opened up a good opportunity for the youngster. After quarter of an hour the two combined to give Bassett the lead. Magani rolled his marker down the left before Large powerfully headed home the forwards' cross from 10 yards for his first Bassett goal. Eight minutes later Magani was the creator once more for Bassett's second. The tricky forward turned his way past two defenders before crossing in from the right. Tytherington failed to clear and the ball fell to Stu Hemsley who struck home easily from ten yards. Errol Deans and Nathan Irwin were both booked for fouls before Dwayne Quinn came close to adding a third just before the break but his glancing header at the far post was headed off the line.

Tytherington stormed out of the blocks in the second period and could have been level even before they got a one man advantage. Four minutes after the restart Richard Evans forced a brilliant point blank save from James Domm who did well to turn Evans' powerful eight yard effort around the post. From the resulting corner an unmarked Phil Ward headed over from six yards as Bassett were let off the hook. Andy Hallett was cautioned in the 58th minute, two minutes before Bunting's dangerous challenge saw Bassett go a man down. The challenge was hard but not reckless but incited a melee which saw an injured Bunting, who had hurt his ankle, stamped on by Ward who received only a yellow; John Davis was also booked for his part in the events. Another Under 18, Danny Heath, replaced Mark King in the 66th minute as Paul Burke went with one up front to protect the lead with only ten men. The lead was halved on 70 minutes when an unmarked Ward easily headed home a Mark Totterdell corner to ignite an action packed final few minutes. Another Totterdell corner was connected with by Evans but the ball sailed across the face of goal before Quinn did well to deflect a Ward shot over after another set piece. The league's top scorer Jimmy Potts was booked with twelve minutes left for dissent after being caught offside. Potts was neutralised all game by the Bassett defence as Quinn played him especially well keeping the Rocks' biggest threat out of the game much to his displeasure. Totterdell continued to find himself heavily involved in the action: after seeing his shot deflected just wide his 81st minute corner was knocked around the area before Evans directed it goalwards only to see Large clear off the line. Heath almost wrapped the points up after Magani led a quick counter attack but after the forward's through ball put him through, Heath placed his effort the wrong side of the post. Peter Holbrook saw two of his efforts go wide, one with help of a deflection before a low effort from Totterdell beat Domm but Large was there to divert the ball around the post once more. The action didn't stop there as Deans saw a glancing header go just wide before Magani was booked for a foul. In the final minute Potts beat the offside trap for once and went down easily after Steve Yeardley had put him under pressure and referee Commander rightly waved play on to preserve a much needed and much deserved three

Scoop's Man of the Match: Scott Large – scored an emphatic goal before helping clear two off the line in the second half in what was by far his best display in a Bassett shirt. Technically he wasn't Bassett's best player but he was there when his team needed him most preserving the victory.

Scoop Rating: 8/10 – Outclassed their opponents for the first sixty minutes before the Bunting sending off shifted the momentum in Tytherington's favour but a great defensive display saw Bassett survive the barrage of chances the home team had.

First half goals from Granville and Colin Taylor gave Wootton Bassett their first win of the season at home to Pinehurst in the 1st Leg of the League Cup, 2-1 the final score. In the return leg the following week, Granville Taylor was again on target in a 3-2 win, Ken Pewsey and Peter Teetgen with the other goals. This sent Wootton Bassett Town through to the next round where their opponents would be Swindon BR. By a quirk of fate when Wootton Bassett returned to league action it was once again Pinehurst who were the opponents. By the end of the season the two sides were to have met some six times in competitive fixtures. In the first league encounter at Pinehurst it was honours even with the two sides sharing four goals, Pete Teetgen and Brian Turner with the Wootton Bassett goals. On the 19th of September Wootton Bassett then met Spencer Moulton in the league at Rylands Way and little did the team know that this would be the last league game until 29th November, but more on that later. Wootton Bassett defeated Spencer Moulton 5-1 with Lou Nash, Pete Teetgen and E.Campbell amongst the goals.

Following the league fixture with Spencer Moulton, Wootton Bassett then embarked on a FA Amateur Cup adventure which was to last some nine games and the Club still didn't make it through to the First Round Proper. First up were Clandown in the Preliminary Round. In a tight encounter, the Clandown forwards opened up well and fought hard to gain an early lead but failed to score. Wootton Bassett took the lead on ten minutes, Ken Pewsey putting in a low shot from a Stan Embling corner which the home goalkeeper Paget failed to hold. Cook, the Wootton Bassett centre-half, then headed away a well placed free-kick by Chedgy. Clandown continued to put on the pressure and Taylor neatly robbed the Bassett goalkeeper Dave Jones and shot for goal. In an effort to keep the ball out of the net Frank Curtis handled and from the resulting penalty Rogers gained an equaliser to force a replay. The Football Pink noted in its report that "no one, as a rule, gets away from that awkward ground on top of the hill above the Somerset miners' village without a stroke of luck, and Wootton Bassett's came late in the game when Bill Rogers shot wide from the penalty spot. Rogers, usually a sure kicker with a penalty, had scored the equaliser for Clandown one minute before the interval – from the penalty spot".

The replay at Rylands Way took place the following week and the Football Pink carried the following report on the game:

"Wootton Bassett have got off to a flying start in their first Wiltshire Premier League season. Up till this morning they had not been beaten in any competition, and they had played in three. Not only that, their gates have increased - Saturday's pulled in nearly £7 with Swindon Town at home - while the newly formed Supporters' Club is such a success that already they have handed £30 to the club. All this makes the debt of £80 from last season less and less menacing. A "slip up" in the travelling arrangements almost caused an upset. Stan Embling failed to turn up so Peter Teetgen had to be pressed into service. He played in his customary centre forward position. Geoff Simpkins going out to Embling's left-wing berth. Wootton Bassett were undoubtedly superior to Clandown, who were minus their four permit players. One of the reserves who took their places was Micky Lyke, the old Westbury player. Nevertheless, Wootton Bassett were not too pleased with their own forwards display. Considering that they fell below their normal game, so that it was defenders such as Dave Jones, Frank Curtis, Dave Gillett and Lou Nash who took the honours. Lou Nash scored the first Wootton Bassett goal with a shot deflected into the Clandown net off a defender, while Geoff Simpkins cracked in a beauty mid-way through the second half to make the issue more secure."

This victory set up a First Qualifying Round with; yes you have guessed it, Pinehurst YC. In this fourth meeting of the two clubs, Wootton Bassett took the lead after six minutes when from a corner the clearance was to Lou Nash, whose shot was only palmed down, and Geoff Simpkins had only to place the ball into the net with Packer on the ground. For the next few minutes Pinehurst

Season 1959-60 - Instant Replay

What was going on in the world

The season started with Cliff Richard topping the charts with Living Doll. It ended with the Everley Brothers on top of the pile with Cathy's Clown. Fidel Castro takes power in Cuba just before the season starts. Hawaii becomes the 50th US State and soft drinks start to be sold in the US in aluminium cans for the first time. Burnley win the title after not leading the table until their last game, finishing one point above Wolves. Wolves take consolation in winning the FA Cup defeating Blackburn Rovers 3-0. Swindon Town finish 16th in the third division.

The first season in the Premier League and what was in store for Wootton Bassett Town? The Football Pink carried its usual pre-season write-up noting the following with respect to Wootton Bassett Town:

"Newcomers Wootton Bassett are relying mainly on the winning Wilts League team and have their redoubtable defence intact. Missing, however, will be Bob Findley who has left the district, but in his place comes another RAF lad, Ronnie Mair. Doubtful too is prolific goal scorer, Ray Young, who seems to be toying with the idea of playing in junior football. I cannot see him being satisfied with that when he could be in with the best in the county. Good news for Wootton Bassett is the impending return from the forces of Chris Simpkins and Brian Turner."

The season kicked-off with a home fixture against Chippenham Town Reserves. This was a Chippenham Town side who had never been out of the first three since the league was formed, a real tough baptism for Wootton Bassett Town in the top flight of Wiltshire football. The Football Pink of 29th August 1959 carried the following report on the game and the pre-season trials and tribulations at Rylands Way.

"Wootton Bassett have had bad luck enough to dampen any new clubs spirit. Earlier in the week in their trial match full-back Len Curtis had broken his wrist while goalkeeper Ray Read had received a painful shoulder injury. McDonald, a left back from the Wroughton district, came in at left half, Ken Pewsey falling back to left back to make room for him, but the only reserve goalkeeper young Sansum, was cricketing, so Read just had to play. He soon received a knock which aggravated his injury and was obviously handicapped from then on. Many Wootton Bassett people felt that, but for this, the Town would have won. Read is now hors de combat and earlier this week, secretary Percy Stone was hunting for a goalkeeper for this afternoon's game with Pinehurst YC. Wootton Bassett excelled in pluck against Chippenham Town. Three to one down at one time they drew level before half time, quickly became a goal down after the restart but just as quickly equalised. New capture Ronnie Mair scored the last equaliser and a glorious goal it was. Mair – he scored two goals in this game – looks like being a decided acquisition. A Scot he replaces another Scot, Rob Findlay, who has left the town and is almost his double with his diminutive stature, cunning ball works and the mighty drive he packs."

A 4-4 draw in the opening Premier League fixture against such tough opponents was a credible result and set Wootton Bassett Town up for another good season under manager Fred Beasant.

With Ray Read out for some time Wootton Bassett signed a youngster by the name of Butler from Gorse Hill United but he was soon to be replaced by Dave Jones.

FOOTY NUT

In the Southern Premier Swindon Supermarine are having a hard time on the pitch with results not going their way and rumours of financial problems off the field can hardly be helping. Striker Alan Griffin left to go back to Chippenham for the financial reasons and two players this last week have also told me of problems they have encountered with unpaid wages. Hopefully they get this sorted and get back up the league as I think its important for Swindon as a town to have a high level non league team. Down the M4 at Hardenhuish Park, home of Chippenham Town I'm sure they will have been kicking themselves having been knocked out of the FA Cup by Paulton who then went on to net over 100K from their game with Norwich City but they have picked up a few decent results of late to take them back up the league table. The money continues to flow at the top end of that division though as having spoken to Keith Scott (former Swindon, Wycombe and Norwich striker) who is Windsor & Eton manager he told us how Marcus Richardson who he signed when Farnborough released him was on £340 a week at Farnborough....not bad for Zamaretto league football!!!!

In the Hellenic Premier Reading Town continue to lead the way and are still unbeaten after 16 games and have scored 45 and only let in 7 which is an excellent return. However Almondsbury Town under new manager Richard Thompson are also unbeaten in 15 games winning 11 and drawing 4 and are only 5 points behind with a game in hand and the two teams meet at Reading on the 5th December so that should prove a cracking game. Baffling Bassett just cling on to three valuable points

Rylands Way, 7th November 2009

Football is often described as a funny, old game, and that adage was exemplified by Wootton Bassett Town's battle with Easington Sports, in which Dave Turner's side ultimately prevailed by the odd goal in five.

A controversial Alex Green penalty just prior to the hour mark, which also resulted in the sending off of visiting shotstopper Kurt Fox, decided the destination of the three points, but the nature in which Bassett saw off the final half hour with a man advantage was certainly confusing.

Defender Michael Earle took over the gloves for the visitors, and his prowess between the stick was notable early on. He failed to dive for the penalty, before fumbling a routine catch moments later. Yet, he was hardly tested.

Instead, the action shifted to the other end, as the Bassett defence had to endure a huge amount of pressure in the final half hour. And they didn't make things any easier for themselves as possession was squandered far too easily – something which shouldn't be the case against ten men – and all signs of confidence evaporated.

Easington, thankfully for Dave Turner's side, only produced one chance of note during this spell though. With six minutes left, Dan Reeves – who assisted his side's two goals – sent in another dangerous cross from the right, and Greg Shawyer met the ball with a low first time effort, but an outstretched Stewart Thompson was able to prevent his side throwing away two points.

Excluding Craig Robinson being almost gifted a goal in the opening seconds of the game, the initial twenty minutes of the game suggested it would be a comfortable win for Bassett as they raced into a two goal lead.

On six minutes, a delicious in-swinging corner from debutant Shaun Wimble was headed home by an unmarked Liam Edmondson.

Then Terry Adams doubled the lead with a sublime finish. A Wimble cross was only half cleared, and Adams was given far too much time on the ball on the edge of the box. And he picked his spot perfectly, curling the ball into the top right corner past a despairing Fox.

But this lead was to be thrown away. A Reeves cross was headed in by an unmarked Steve Howkins at the left post midway through the first period.

Just before the break, a defence splitting long ball was latched onto by Craig Robinson, and he should have done better as his first touch took the ball away from him when one-on-one with Thompson.

After Adams dragged a shot narrowly wide to begin the second half, Howkins levelled things up at the other end on 52 minutes. Outstretched, he provided the deftest of touches to guide another expertly placed cross from Reeves into the bottom right corner.

There was still plenty of time for the game to change though, and that it did just over 120 seconds later. A headed back-pass from Shaun Lambourne fell woefully short and Green was first to the loose ball. Attempting to round Fox, he went to ground rather theatrically, and initially referee Ashman refused to reward a penalty.

However, his assistant felt there was contact to merit such a decision and led to the 'keeper's harsh dismissal.

Green nonchalantly slid home the penalty past the stand-in Earle, which in the end sealed victory and lifted Bassett above their opponents and into fourth.

MATCH REPORT

Collapse curtails County Cup hopes

Shrewton Recreation Ground, 14th November 2009

Leading 3-1 at half time against Shrewton United, undoubtedly hopes were high within the Wootton Bassett Town dressing room of a repetition of last year's brilliant run in the Wiltshire Senior Cup.

However, all thoughts of such a thing were ultimately vanquished thanks to a turgid second half performance that allowed the hosts not only to cancel out the deficit, but also go on and grab a winner, securing their progression to the quarter final stage by the odd goal in seven.

And it was a familiar name that proved to be Bassett's nemesis as Jesse Walters – who scored the winning extra time goal in the two side's FA Vase clash three seasons ago – bagged a decisive brace. He fired the hosts into the lead, but Bassett were the team who stamped their authority on the first half with goals from Alex Green, Mitch Wyatt and Terry Adams giving them what appeared to be a comfortable lead at the break.

But three goals without reply from Walters, Dean Foot and Darren Harding secured an improbable comeback victory and left Bassett with questions to ponder.

Having scored three goals courtesy of three different players, it shows that the current rich vein of form in front of goal does not look like ceasing anytime soon. The last six games have seen Dave Turner's side score at least two goals, with Letcombe being the only opponent against which they failed to find the net on at least three occasions.

While this offers optimism, Bassett's defensive record is cause for concern, with the four goals shipped in the defeat highlighting this. Worryingly only *one* clean sheet has been kept in the nineteen competitive games played so far this season. At the corresponding point last season that number was five.

It goes without saying that goals are necessary to earn points, but it is the performance of the defence that ultimately determines whether you go home with a win, lose or draw. And with the next four games pitting Bassett against teams close around them in the congested Division One West table, the defensive frailties will need to be ironed out if the team is to earn valuable points to enable them push on and press for one of the three promotion spots come season's end.

Life isn't made any easier given the contests against Headington Amateurs (a newly scheduled fixture), Lydney Town and Cheltenham Saracens are all on the road, with only next week's match with Tytherington Rocks being played at Rylands Way.

Thankfully, the 4-3 defeat to Shrewton was a County Cup tie. But it is imperative that it serves as a lesson for the remainder of the season.

Goalkeeper - Stewart Thompson

Defenders -

Left back: Paul Patel – a natural left-footer, who enjoyed two spells with the club. An astute defender, Patel was also a huge asset going forward, and is one of the best deliverers of the ball Bassett have possessed in the last decade.

Centre back – Stu Lamont – arguably the best 'foreign' import the club has had. Strong as an ox, the Scottish centre back led always by example and had a heart of gold. Dominant in the air and equally good in the tackle, he possessed all the characteristics of a prototypical centre back.

Centre forward – Geoff Swatton – a bullish striker with lightning pace, Swatton was extremely difficult to defend and was one of the shining lights of the Bassett teams that were constantly forced to battle against the drop from the Hellenic Premier. Had he not succumbed to injury in the 2004/05 season perhaps that year may not have ended in relegation, given that in previous seasons his goals had helped save Bassett.
