The structure is now there for continued growth, and it seems the community appetite is responding. Thanks go to Matt and Pete Yeardley for driving this all so effectively.

# OPPONENTS HISTORY

## CLANFIELD 85 FC • CLUB HISTORY

The club was founded way back in 1890 and for many years played in the Witney & District League, with a particularly successful period in the late 1920's and 1930's. Two years were spent in the North Berks League in the 1960's and for 1967/8 the club joined the Hellenic League.

Clanfield's first game in the Hellenic was on 19th August 1967 against Hungerford Town, winning 4-0 in front of an attendance of 146. In 1969/70 they won the Hellenic Division One Championship and were promoted to the Premier Division.

In 1971/2 they missed out on the runners up spot only on goal average, but went on to secure the runners up place for the next two seasons, also winning the Premier Division Challenge Cup in 1973/4.

In 1974/5 the club reached the final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup for the first time, and faced Pressed Steel at Oxford City's old White House ground. The first game ended in a 2-2 draw after extra time, but Pressed Steel disappointingly won the replay 3-2, that game also being played at the White House. The following season saw a repeat of the cup run to the final but again Clanfield ended up as losing finalists. After a great period through the 60's and 70's, they were relegated to Division One at the end of the 1979/80 season.

However they soon bounced back finishing in 2nd place the following season missing out on the title by goal difference. At the end of the 1984/5 season they were once again relegated back to Division One where they have remained ever since – although there have been some scrapes at either end of the table. The only Hellenic League success in that time was the lifting of the Division One Cup back in 1985/6 although the club have won the Jim Newman Memorial Cup in 1978/79 and the Faringdon Thursday Memorial Cup in 1996/7

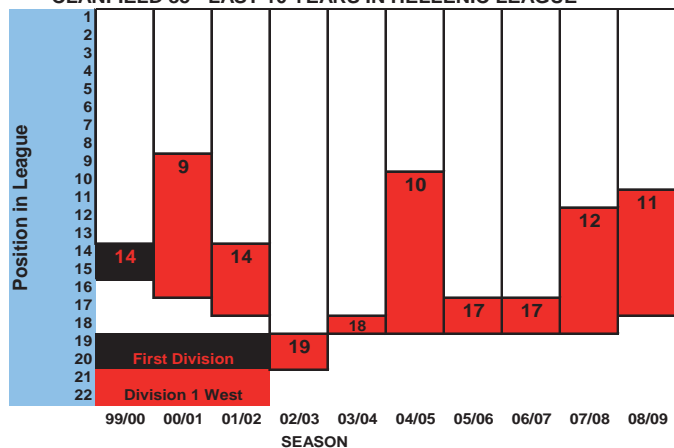

Reserves, Roy Blackburn being the star of the show with four of the goals, Derek Powell completing the scoring. The season ended with a 2-0 defeat at runners-up Radstock Town. In the end the 7<sup>th</sup> place finish was a good achievement but it could have been so much better as Wootton Bassett finished just two points behind 3<sup>rd</sup> placed side Gorse Hill as just three points separated the six sides below the top two. Sanford were champions for the third consecutive season and were to remain the top Swindon side until the mid-1970's.

The following week saw the Second Round of the County Cup. With so many top Wiltshire Combination sides already knocked out Wootton Bassett Town must have fancied their chances of going the distance and perhaps under estimated their Wiltshire League opponents St Josephs as a result. The 4-1 defeat was certainly a shock although Wootton Bassett were handicapped by the absence of regular keeper Ron Ward who had sustained a broken arm in a car accident. Dave Clark scored the consolation goal for Bassett. The defeat was quickly forgotten the following week when, back in league action, Wootton Bassett Town defeated Bemerton 2-1 at Rylands Way. In what was described in the Football Pink as an *exceedingly good performance*, Bassett came back from 1-0 through a 36<sup>th</sup> minute Derek Powell goal and then Dave Clark popped up to score the winner. Presumably due to the bad weather it was to be another month before Wootton Bassett played again, the team making the short journey into Swindon to meet Ferndale Athletic. The two sides shared six goals and the points, on target for Wootton Bassett were Sammy Rose, Derek Powell and Ian Sinfield who scored with a header from a Dave Clark cross. The long break had certainly knocked Wootton Bassett out of their stride as the next two games away against Bemerton (1-2) and Calne Town (0-1) were both lost. The Football Pink carried the story that the slump was being blamed on the lack of match play and inadequate training facilities.

The first Saturday in March saw Wootton Bassett playing their first home game for seven weeks and two welcome points from a 5-0 win over Devizes Town Reserves. Dave Challis had a hand in all five Bassett goals scored by Sammy Rose 2, Tommy Gardiner, Derek Powell and an own goal. The following week Westcott were the visitors to Rylands Way. An Ian Sinfield shot put Bassett one up at the break but Westcott equalised in the second half as the two sides shared the points. Another home game a fortnight later saw Larkhall visit Rylands and during the first half Wootton Bassett had keeper Ron Ward to thank for turning round level in a half dominated by the visitors. A major turnaround after the break saw Tommy Gardiner score midway through the half then in the last minute Sammy Rose put Gardiner through again to score the second to give Wootton Bassett both points. A disappointing 1-0 home defeat to Westbury then followed. Wootton Bassett bounced back with an Easter Monday 4-0 win over West Lavington, Roy Blackburn breaking the deadlock before Tommy Gardiner fired a hat-trick. However, there then followed a very poor midweek result when they could only get a point against bottom club Wroughton courtesy of a last minute Derek Powell goal. The Football Pink of 17<sup>th</sup> April 1971 commented as follows:

*It is surprising how season after season Wootton Bassett fail to stay the pace. For months this term, just as in previous campaigns, they have been amongst the best placed clubs but once again they have faded. Besides only snatching that last minute equaliser against the bottom club Wroughton, they also lost at home over the Easter period to Westbury whom Ferndale defeated three days later. Their only consolation was a win 4-0 over West Lavington despite Derek Powell missing two penalties. West Lavington took Wootton Bassett well into the first half before Roy Blackburn gave them the lead. Tommy Gardiner then took a hand when the second half commenced to score a hat-trick of splendid goals.*

In what was the fourth game in the space of a week Wootton Bassett then lost heavily at home against Highworth Town, Brian Ewen with the consolation goal. The team finally returned to winning ways when Bromham visited Rylands. Goals from Graham Reid and Steve Tooze giving Wootton Bassett a 2-0 win in what was the final home game of the season. Despite completing the home fixtures there were still a number of away games to fit in to conclude the season. A heavy midweek defeat at Vickers followed the Bromham result, Brian Ewen scoring the only goal in a 5-1 defeat against one of the struggling sides. Three days later Wootton Bassett did pick up two points from the visit to long time rivals Swindon Victoria, always a pleasing place to return with two points, Dave Challis and Derek Powell scoring the goals in a 2-1 win. An identical score followed in the next game away to Westbury and the good run continued with a handsome 5-0 win at Trowbridge Town

## Super Sub Shaw Fires Sluggish Bassett to Win

**Radcot Road, 27<sup>th</sup> January 2007 v Clanfield (Won 2-0)**

**A second half brace from substitute Steve Shaw was enough for a sluggish Wootton Bassett Town to secure an away win at struggling Clanfield.**

Bassett's performance was in stark contrast to the one produced in the Challenge Cup tie against Premier Division side Slimbridge in the week as they often looked tired and made hard work of the game. In the eighth minute, the hosts would have taken the lead if it wasn't for a great save from James Domm, who tipped away a hard hit John Andrews shot at the forward's feet after the defence failed to deal with Jason Court's set piece.

Bassett struggled to hold onto possession as their tendency to overplay and go for the deft little flicks meant they never had the ball long enough to open up the Clanfield defence. Matty Bennett did after a Mark King through ball in the 26<sup>th</sup> minute but Bennett's effort from 15-yards lacked accuracy and failed to trouble Dan Harding. Steve Yeardley came close with a bicycle kick following a Chris Mills free kick nine minutes before half time but his shot was headed away with Harding caught off of his line.

Another Mills set piece was met with Andy White's head two minutes after the restart but the ball looped just over before King was replaced by Shaw. Bassett should have been one down two minutes after his introduction though as Andrews beat the offside trap only just and bore down on Domm. The 'keeper kept his cool and clawed the ball out of the striker's feet. Andrews regained possession though but Domm's save allowed Yeardley enough time to get back and block the second effort. Bennett was provider for Shaw's first in the 58<sup>th</sup> minute, intercepting a poor clearance from the Clanfield defence before skipping past Court in the right corner. He cut the ball back across goal and an unmarked Shaw easily tapped in at the far post at a time when a goal didn't seem imminent from either side despite the earlier chances. Adam Little saw his header loop just over two minutes later following a quickly taken free kick from Court. Adam Lock was booked in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute for a foul on Nathan Hall. With 16 minutes to go, Scott Large set Bennett free down the right. The winger cut inside and found himself one-on-one with Harding but shot straight at him and his shot was easily tipped away. A goalmouth scramble at the other end almost brought an equaliser as Mark Connelly's corner wasn't cleared before eventually getting scrambled off the line. After clearing the danger, Bassett countered and a switch of play from Shaw set Bennett free. He once again found himself with only Harding to beat but forced an easy save with a 15-yard effort. After Neil Barrett was booked for dissent, Bassett wrapped up the win in injury time after another move initiated by Bennett. White chased down his ball into the right corner and whipped in a first time cross. Shaw, unmarked at the far post, stuck out a foot and directed the ball into the top right corner. Bassett successfully dealt with the five plus minutes of injury time which saw a yellow card for Lee Cook and the introductions of Danny Heath and Marcus Neale to help slow the game down. It worked as Clanfield weren't able to create any more chances.

**Scoop's Man of the Match: Steve Shaw – made the biggest impact of any player on the pitch despite playing just less than 45 minutes. He linked up well with the midfield, scored the two crucial goals and his overall work rate caused trouble for the Clanfield defence.**

**Scoop Rating: 6/10 – Bassett never really got going in the first half and their tendency to overplay created problems. However, great goalkeeping from James Domm and a solid offside trap ensured a clean sheet allowing Shaw's goal to be all that was required from the front men.**

*made all the difference to Wootton Bassett's play. He initiated raid after raid, saw Graham Reid equalise, supplied passes for goals by Derek Powell and Roy Blackburn, cheered Russell's goal and then up the fifth goal for Blackburn to score.*

A midweek trip to Trowbridge Town saw Wootton Bassett return with a point following a two all draw, Tommy Gardiner getting the first and Alan Thomas scoring an equaliser for Wootton Bassett late on. This was followed a few days later by an excellent 2-1 home win over long time rivals Swindon Victoria, Roy Blackburn and Dave Clark with the goals, the latter coming from the penalty spot. A trip to Gorse Hill, a side who finished runners-up in their first season in the Wiltshire Combination, was always going to be tough and so it proved as Wootton Bassett went down 2-1, Roy Blackburn again on the score sheet. October finished with the visit of a Melksham Town side that had only lost once in the season prior to their visit to Rylands Way. Melksham went one up but Dave Clark equalised, both goals coming in the first two minutes of the game. Derek Powell scored the winner for Wootton Bassett ten minutes from time to inflict the second defeat of the season on Melksham.

November kicked off with another tough looking fixture against title chasing Somerset side, Radstock Town. The visitors scored the only goal of the game to inflict the first home defeat since the September defeat at the hands of Sanford. It was no surprise that these two sides were to eventually battle it out for the title. Wootton Bassett returned to winning ways when they defeated Bromham 2-1 on their own patch, Ian Sinfield and Derek Powell doing the damage for Bassett. The game will be remembered for the ten minute delay that took place after eighty minutes had elapsed, a heavy rain storm forcing the players off. As soon as the game restarted Wootton Bassett scored the winner through Powell. A quirk of the fixture planning saw Gorse Hill as the next opponents, just a month after the two sides had met in Swindon. In a storming performance, goals from Derek Powell, Tommy Gardiner and Dave Clark put Wootton Bassett three up. Ian Sinfield then missed an open goal which would have made it four. Two goals for Gorse Hill in the closing five minutes meant a nervous end to the game but Wootton Bassett prevailed to defeat one of the leading teams in what was the best result of the season. If only Wootton Bassett had won the first encounter it would have meant a third place finish come the season end.

December traditionally sees the Senior clubs in the country embark on the Senior County Cup and Wootton Bassett's opponents were Wiltshire League side Devizes Rangers. On a day of shocks, Wootton Bassett were the only team from the top seven of the Wilts Combination to get through to the next round, this after a 9-1 rout of their opponents. Sammy Rose, Ian Sinfield and Derek Powell all bagged a brace and there was one a piece for Tommy Gardiner, Dave Clark and Bob Thomas. Melksham Town were the opponents when Wootton Bassett returned to league action and goals from Sammy Rose and Tommy Gardiner gave Wootton Bassett the double over Melksham and also lifted the side up into fourth place in the table. The weather meant that this match was to be the last in calendar year 1970.

At the turn of the year, with others losing, Wootton Bassett found themselves in third place in the table in only their third season in the top division in the county. The Football Pink of 2<sup>nd</sup> January 1971 passed comment on the achievement:

*As we turn into the New Year it is Wootton Bassett who present the greatest challenge to Sanford. They have one game in hand on the leaders to offset the three points they are behind whereas Gorse Hill and Highworth have equalled Sanford in the number of games played.*

The same paper noted that Swindon Town were building the North Stand at a cost of £320,000.



## Season 1970-71 - I Hear You Knockin

### What was going on in the world

*Elvis Presley topped the charts with The Wonder of You as the season kicked off and ended with Dawn at the top of the pile with Knock Three Times. All the former members of the Beatles release solo albums before 1970 ends. A military junta led by Idi Amin seizes power in Uganda and Fiji gains independence from Britain. Talking of Britain the government launched a new decimal currency in February. The space hopper is in vogue with all the kids and in the world of TV The Partridge Family premieres on US television. In the world of football Fourth Division Colchester knock Don Revies Leeds United out of the FA Cup. Arsenal go on to win the trophy thanks to a Charlie George goal against Liverpool clinching the league and cup double in the process. Chelsea win the Cup Winners Cup defeating Real Madrid in the final whilst Swindon Town finish 12<sup>th</sup> in the Second Division*

The first season of the new decade saw the building of a new stand at Rylands Way. The Football Pink of 15<sup>th</sup> August 1970 carried the following eve of season report:

*They are not short of enthusiasm at Wootton Bassett where they have been building a stand to seat 200 by voluntary labour and expect to have it completed in time for their opening match against Vickers next Wednesday. As it has not cost much more than £1 per head of seating capacity the club has done splendidly and now they have plans with the council for added dressing rooms. When these are completed Wootton Bassett will have made a really trim little ground well up to the county standard.*

Wootton Bassett duly won the match against Vickers, Sammy Rose scoring the only goal of the game. Three days later Wootton Bassett returned from Larkhall with both points following a terrific 5-2 win against one of the sides who would challenge for honours by the season end. Brian Ewen led the way with two goals and there was one a piece for Roy Blackburn, Dave Challis and Sammy Rose. Wootton Bassett then shared six goals and the points with Calne Town, Roy Blackburn bagging a brace and Sammy Rose maintaining his fine goal scoring start to the season. The month ended on low though as reigning champions Sanford left Rylands Way with both points following a resounding 6-0 win, the prolific Tony Pike netting four of the Sanford goals.

The match against Devizes Town Reserves on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> September kicked off in the evening as Devizes Town First Team were also at home in the Western League on the day. Despite the late kick-off Wootton Bassett had a good day defeating the home side 3-1 courtesy of goals from Sammy Rose, Roy Blackburn and an own goal. Rose could just not stop scoring and bagged another two in the 5-0 home win over Wroughton a week later, also on target were Roy Blackburn, Brian Ewen and Graham Reid. The good start to the season was interrupted when Wootton Bassett visited local neighbours Highworth Town, Wootton Bassett going down 2-1 at The Rec, Brian Ewen with the consolation goal from the penalty spot. The month ended with a trip to struggling West Lavington and Two more points to Wootton Bassett as they edged it by the odd goal in five, Roy Blackburn scoring twice and Tony Russell getting the other.

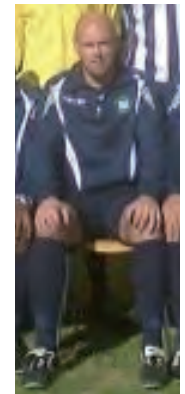
Struggling Ferndale Athletic were the next visitors to Rylands Way and a shock looked on the cards when the visitors led 1-0 at the break, the Football Pink of 10<sup>th</sup> October carrying the following report of proceedings:

*What a commotion there was at Wootton Bassett when the interval arrived and Ferndale were leading 1-0 after Dave Woods scored his 12<sup>th</sup> minute goal. Ferndale deserved their lead. They had been playing good football. But understandably they seemed to lose heart a little once Wootton Bassett went in front in the second half and finally lost 1-5. It was bringing on Tommy Gardiner on for the second half that*

In the Zamaretto Premier Division Chippenham Town are struggling to make the playoff spots as it stands and although there are a number of games to go I think they have left themselves too much to do to as they are currently 9 points off the fifth placed team with two games in hand. Of course it is still possible but the games will come thick and fast and injuries and suspensions will kick in and I do not think they have the squad size or quality in depth to keep churning our results to really break into that play off pack. Down at the bottom end unfortunately Swindon Supermarine have been dragged into a relegation battle but they are only 3 points from safety with 3 games in hand so although things could be tight I do think they will get enough wins to secure their status and I certainly hope they do as I have said before the more clubs in the area at the highest possible level the better as far as I am concerned.

In the South & West Division at the Corinium we are on the edge of the play offs and are 5 points behind Frome with 3 games in hand on Frome but there is a batch of teams around us and the teams above who are all scrapping for the chance to keep their promotion dreams alive. I can guarantee you that there will be teams who suddenly go on a bad run and teams that have a sudden surge of wins so places will change over the next couple of months without doubt. The pitches are not conducive to getting it down and playing and most teams tend to knock the ball over the top, turn defences round and force mistakes to get their goals and I must admit it is not pretty to watch at times but the reality is it is about getting results and getting out of the division. Hungerford have found this season hard so far and are towards the bottom end of the table but I would say have enough points already not to get dragged into a relegation fight and this season really was always about finding their feet in this new division for them and then trying to use their experiences to move forwards next time around.

As I said last week Almondsbury I still feel will see the job through this season in the Hellenic Premier and they are rapidly making ground and now sit 4 points off Reading Town with 3 games in hand and still to play them twice in 7 days in the last week of the season (you could not write that script!) Down at the bottom Fairford Town have been dragged into the bottom four but I hope they get out of that. It has been a couple of seasons now since they had their financial troubles but all credit to them as they have got themselves on an even footing and manager John Paget has gone about his business quietly not bleating about it, bringing on young players and holding their own in the league so I hope they stay up. In Division One of the Hellenic West one point now covers the top four teams and Cricklade put an end to Wootton Bassett's good run and Cheltenham Saracens overturned Purtons good run and it certainly keeps it exciting for the run in. Looking at the remaining fixtures all four clubs have a similar run in, in terms of the strength of teams they will be facing so if I am honest I am going to sit on the fence and say I do not know who will come out on top yet!



## Bassett crush Clanfield to go joint top

Radcot Road, 17<sup>th</sup> February 2010

**Wootton Bassett Town made it a three-way tie atop Hellenic League Division One West with an emphatic 3-0 away victory against Clanfield.**

All three goals came in the first half, and once again it was Sam Collier who led the way, as Bassett's jack-of-all-trades scored a brace to move into double figures and put him at the head of the scoring charts.

Both his strikes came after Jon Holloway had given the visitors the lead early on from the penalty spot.

Manager Dave Turner would probably have bitten the proverbial hand off had he been offered six points from the three away trips in a row that his team have now completed. Alongside what on paper was a tough contest against Clanfield, it included visits to Letcombe and North Leigh, both of which are never easy places to go.

## Cricklade deliver another reality check

**Wootton Bassett Towns unbeaten run in Hellenic League Division One West was always going to come to an end. Yet, boss Dave Turner will have undoubtedly have been extremely unhappy at the manner in which their 16 game streak was curtailed, and equally irked at the fact it came against neighbours Cricklade Town, the last team to have inflicted defeat upon Bassett in the league way back in September.**

There can be no denying that the hosts' shabby performance – following an impressive 3-0 midweek victory over Clanfield – was primarily to blame, although in fairness Cricklade deserve much credit for a near faultless performance.

Proceedings got off to an ignominious start for Bassett as they fell behind with less than a minute on the clock. And it was a real comedy of errors that gifted Cricklade the advantage. Winger Adam O' Bree brushed aside the attentions of both Steve Groom and Fraser Joyce far too easily in the left corner before shooting timidly from a tight angle. However, Stewart Thompson allowed the ball to seep through his legs to afford ex-Bassett man Sam Reason the simplest of tap-ins.

Sturdy defending from the visitors – led magnificently by assured youngster Dane Moulden – ensured Bassett failed to muster an opening of their own until the final ten minutes of the half.

But even then, Liam Byfield could only drag his shot across the face of goal after a neat inside pass from Joyce, before a Ryan Banks effort from a tight angle was batted wide by Ben Goodey. From the resulting corner, Liam Edmundson rose highest to meet the ball, but his far post sailed agonizingly wide.

A double change at half time appeared to have reaped dividends for the home side, when Andy Philpott bundled the ball home after a perfectly weighted Luke Sharps free kick had been redirected across goal.

But in switching to a five man midfield, Turner's side proved to be far too susceptible to the counter attack. And with the centre of the pitch cut up, affording the visitor's wide men more freedom proved a recipe for disaster.

Twice before taking the lead for good, Aaron Maximen had wasted opportunities when clean through on goal.

But he made amends for these misses with 69 minutes on the clock. A counter initiated by 'keeper Goodey quickly saw the ball at the other end, and a right wing cross could only be punched away by Thompson. The ball fell invitingly to the unmarked Maximen and he fired into the bottom corner from eighteen yards.

Moments later, a through ball to Steve Winchcombe put the forward one-on-one with Thompson. However, after rounding the 'keeper, he created too much of a tight angle to be able slide the ball into the back of the net, and his cut back was hacked away by a despairing Sharps.

At the other end, little was being produced, with the best opportunity falling to Philpott. He could only guide a header from Sam Collier's left wing cross narrowly off target though.

Instead, it could have been more for the visitors. Winchcombe once again raced clear of the defence and rounded Thompson, but lost his footing with an empty goal at his mercy, before a superb save kept out O' Bree's powerful volley after another decisive break.

The loss – coupled with Cheltenham Saracens' convincing 2-0 victory over Purton – means Bassett missed out on the opportunity to go into first, and instead they slip back down into fourth.

With a final total of at least 60 points – if not more given the favourable nature of their fellow frontrunners' run-ins - a must if a return to the Hellenic Premier is to be achieved, Bassett's final nine fixtures should all be of the cup final nature.
