EDITORIAL

Good evening and welcome back to Rylands Way for our opening game of the season which is now an FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round Replay against **Bradford Town** following the one all draw on Saturday. Our scheduled opening **Uhlsport Hellenic Premier League** Season 2010-11 home fixture against Carterton will now have to be played later in the season. After five seasons down in Division One West, how nice that sounds as we finally return to the promised land of the Premier Division. Tonight we wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from Bradford Town who have made the short journey from Bradford-on-Avon for the game. We hope they will join us in the bar after the game for some food and drink.

Those who travelled down to Bradford-on-Avon on Saturday witnessed a very tight encounter, with little to choose between the two sides. Both sides missed chances late on to secure a Preliminary Round tie against Almondsbury UWE but the chances went begging hence the need for tonight's replay. The prize money to the victor tonight is a very nice £750 and, with Bradford already having defeated Almondsbury UWE in the league, the chance for further prize money exists for whoever wins the replay tonight.

We made a fantastic start with our Uhlsport Hellenic Premier League campaign with a 2-0 midweek away win against Hereford side Pegasus Juniors thanks to goals from Ryan Banks and Alex Green. Pegasus is not the easiest place to visit, and I do not just mean given the geography as they won over half their league fixtures last season. It was also pleasing to gain revenge for that last league visit when we lost a 3-0 lead to go down 4-3 in our relegation season.

You will notice that this seasons programme has a similar feel to last seasons. This is partly due to time constraints but also a feeling that the content was just about right. I hope you agree but any new ideas and contributions would be welcomed as the games will come thick and fast this season. The **From the Archives** series will be continued and tonight looks back to 1993-94 when **Scott Vincent** and **Kenny Regan** were banging in the goals for Wootton Bassett as they achieved a mid-table finish in Hellenic League Division One. The ever popular **Player Profile** continues, with a few less questions, but now including a write-up on each player from Scoop. The first player featured is **Shaun Terry**. The Clubs newsletter **Touchline** will continue to feature in the programme throughout the season. Tonight we have the end of season one from May which many of you will not have seen and the next edition is due to be published in the near future. Whilst contract discussions continue to once again secure the services of local football legend Haler (aka **Footy Nut**) (to be honest I forgot to ask him and he is now in Korea with a Swindon Town Youth side!), **Moonraker** takes a look at the local football in Wiltshire, from the Zamaretto Premier to the Wiltshire County League. The **Dream Team** feature has been retained but is currently in intensive care as requests for new teams from people have fallen on deaf ears. Consequently for now I will re-cycle those featured last season with a hope that others will come forward and allow this page to continue. One new feature is the Clubs own **Fantasy Football League** that currently includes 17 sides, including two from Bassett legend Mark Vaughan. This season the Chairman cannot commit to writing a piece in each programme so Chairmans Chat has become **World of Soccer** and will feature articles from other key personnel within the club throughout the season as well as Paul. There will be the usual contributions from Manager Dave Turner in his **From The Dugout** page and tonight he introduces the new signings. **Under 18** Manager Danny Groom will also regular contribute to the Match Day programme and tonight looks back at a controversial end to a successful season in 2009-10 but also looks forward to the new season. With costs of officials continuing to rise, after many seasons we have increased the price from £1 to £1.50 but hope that you still feel this is value for money.

Next up at Rylands Way will be Old Woodstock Town who visit next Tuesday evening in a Uhlsport Hellenic League fixture. Thank you for your support tonight, enjoy the game and heres to seeing Wootton Bassett Town in the next round of this prestigious competition.

It may also be that the works undertaken by our landlord, the Sports Association, in the clubhouse is new to you, with the windows, furnishings and decoration being completed post seasons end. The game was a competitive fixture played in absolutely the right spirit, with a crowd of some 200 attending and donating over £500 for Help for Heroes and the 1st Rifles own care fund. We hope to have this doubled through company sponsorship, and I would like to thank all those that attended and those that made the day possible including management and players.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind us all of the FAs Respect campaign, aimed at addressing unacceptable behaviour in football, both on and off the pitch. It covers all involved in the game – players, managers/coaches, club officials, and spectators including parents of youth players. Two new additions that I am looking forward to working with are John Beedon and Ethan Delaney. Both are young teenagers who have a tremendous amount of potential. John is a tough tackling left back who is very comfortable on the ball and Ethan brings the one thing that we have been missing over the last few seasons and that is blistering pace.

This is going to be a very tough season for everyone at the club and our aim is to survive this season and then establish ourselves as a Hellenic Premier club. I have every confidence in this group of players and I believe we will surprise a few clubs this year. OPPONENTS HISTORY



Bradford Town F.C. was formed by the present Chairman and his wife in 1992. They started playing at St. Laurence School in Bradford on Avon, in the Wiltshire County League where the pitch had to be roped off before every home game, and the half time tea made in the boot of a car.

In the 1993-1994 season they gained promotion to the Wilts County Premier League. They then started to ground share with Trowbridge Town at the old Frome Road ground in Trowbridge until moving to their present ground in Bradford on Avon in 1996. They gained promotion to the Western League in 2005-2006 season after finishing runners up in the Wilts County Premier League the previous season.

In their first season they finished 10th but slipped to 17th & 13th in the following two years. For the 2008 -2009 season they had a new management team of Paul Shanley and his assistant Mark Edwards □ both ex players, who were team members when the club was formed, indeed Paul was the first club captain. They join other ex players Andy O'Pray (Club Coach) Rob Coombes (goal keeping coach).

2008/2009 the installations of the Club's floodlights-officially switched-on by Steve Phillips of Bristol Rovers under the watchful eye of everyone's favourite □ the Toolstation Western Leagues George Fowler. Bradford Town had their best season ever finishing 3rd in the league after challenging for promotion.

2009/2010 saw the team go from strength to strength finishing 4th in the league and reaching the second round proper of the F A Vase. The new stand was installed with 100 seats for spectators. They also saw some of the reserves and Under 18 team members play for the first team, which suggests the future is bright for the club. Manager Paul Shanley is also hoping for good runs in the FA Cup and the F A Vase this season.

Jon Philips remains as Reserves Manager (now playing as AFC Bradford Town) with Stewart Powell as his assistant. Both are ex Bradford Town players, the team play in the Wilts Plaister Auto League. The Ladies Team continues to progress in the Somerset County Ladies League in the coming season, they have a new manager Paul King and coach Hesh Brown remains.

Last season was the first for the Under 18 team in the Wiltshire County Youth Floodlit League. They finished as runners-up in this league, Rob Houkes Vernon Giles and Ade Hiscocks will continue as their management team. They also have strong youth sides at all ages up to and including the under 18s, which augers well for the future of the club.

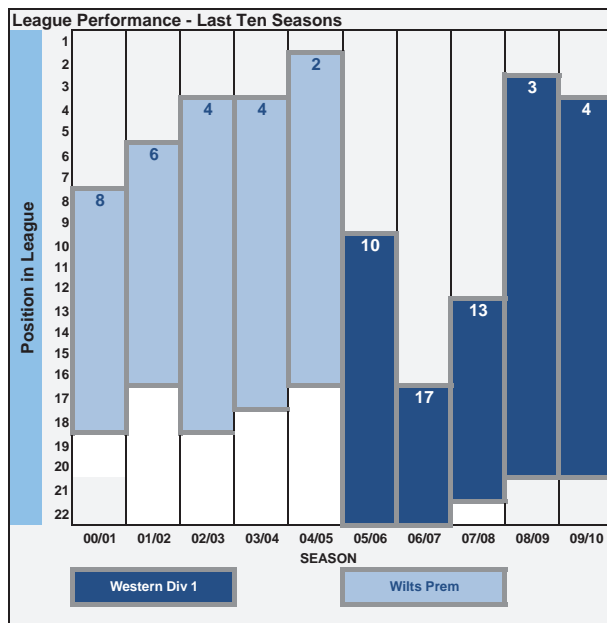
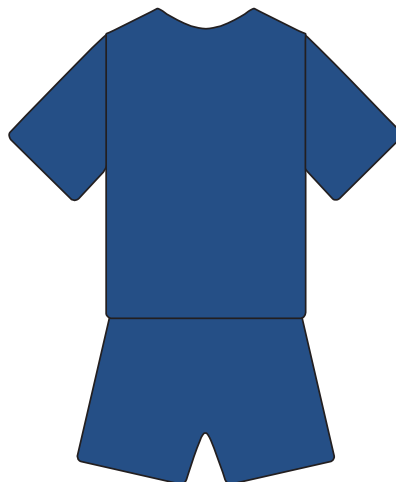

Wootton Bassett pulled of an exciting victory at Carterton in the Division One Cup beating the league leaders 3-2 after extra time. Darren Robinson put the home side in front after four minutes and Durrington added a second with 20 minutes to go. Bassett then staged a fighting comeback drawing level with goals by Wayne Glastonbury and Scott Vincent to force the tie into extra time. Bassett then had the better of the exchanges in extra time and Wayne Glastonbury scored the winner.

The win gave Wootton Bassett a place in the last four and a two legged semi final against Easington Sports. Another quarter final cup tie took place the following week also, this time in the Wiltshire Senior Cup against Burmah Castrol from the Wiltshire League. There was not, however, to be a second semi final as Bassett went down 2-1, Scott Vincent with the consolation goal. Ahead of their cup semi final encounter, Wootton Bassett Town had to travel to Easington for a league encounter. Easington sat fourth in the table, five places ahead of Bassett before the game. In an excellent performance, which bode well for the upcoming cup semi-finals, goals from Kenny Regan (2), Wayne Glastonbury and a Lawrence Smith penalty gave Wootton Bassett a 4-1 win. Mick Woolford in his net programme notes commented that the Kenny Regan goal just after the restart must have been the longest one-two in football. The win came despite Wootton Bassett having to do without the services of both Paul Davis and Scott Vincent. Paul Davis, the youngest player in the squad, was missing due to keyhole surgery on his knee due to cartilage problems, having been an ever present until the Carterton game. Scott Vincent was expected to be out for a couple of weeks.

The signing of Darren Jell, who replaced the injured Scott Vincent, certainly looked an inspired piece of work by manager Mick Woolford after the home game with Didcot Town. The Advertiser referred to it as the "performance of the day" further noting that "Wootton Bassett kept up their impressive run of league results with a 3-1 victory over Didcot Town and moved up into fifth spot in the table." New signing Jell scored all three of the Wootton Bassett goals with the Advertiser containing the following report:

Didcot opened brightly and Bassett had a let off when a good effort struck a post and Bassett keeper Matt Robinson was called upon to make a good save. Jell put his side into the lead on the half hour with a near post header and then added a second after springing the Didcot offside trap just before the break. Didcot launched a series of fierce attacks on the Bassett goal after the interval and three times the home defenders were called upon to clear off the goal line. Eventually the pressure paid off and they reduced the arrears. The visitors' offside trap let them down again late in the game and Jell completed his hat-trick to give the home side the points.

March opened with a tough away game at Wallingford Town and Wootton Bassett went down 2-0. Wootton Bassett quickly bounced back from this defeat winning by a solitary goal away at Yamton to complete another double for the season. Just ahead of the first leg of the cup semi-final with Easington, Bassett lost the second league game of the month, going down 2-1 away at Kidlington. The first leg of the cup semi-final was away at Easington. Wootton Bassett took the lead with a superb volley from Barry Giles. Darren Jell and Kevin Moloney then combined well to enable Kenny Regan to add a second ten minutes later. Easington pulled one back mid-way through the second half but it was advantage Wootton Bassett at the half way stage. Before the second leg Wootton Bassett had two league fixtures to squeeze in, both at Rylands Way. A surprise 1-0 defeat to lowly Clanfield was followed by another similar result on Easter Monday against Lambourn Sports. The second leg of the cup semi final against Easington at Rylands Way was another close game. Kevin Moloney put Wootton Bassett in front on twenty minutes and substitute Scott Vincent then netted a second with almost his first touch of the game. Easington scored a consolation near the end of the game to make the aggregate score 4-2 in Wootton Bassett's favour and a cup final appearance against Pegasus Juniors.

The cup win seemed to have taken a lot out of the Wootton Bassett side as they lost their next game 3-0 away at Ardley but bounced back four days later to win 2-1 away at Carterton. With the fixtures coming thick and fast, this was followed three days later by a 3-1 win at Cirencester United courtesy of goals from Wayne Glastonbury, Kenny Regan and Barry Giles. The cup final was played at Cirencester Town and in a real tight contest neither side could find the goal in both normal time and extra time meaning that a replay was required. The replay would take place at Shortwood United's ground in Nailsworth.

It has not been possible to trace a report of the final nor scorer details of the final league games of the season. The final home game saw the heaviest defeat of the season as Cheltenham Saracens left Rylands Way with all three points following a 6-0 win. The final two away games saw a 2-2 draw at Hallen and a 1-0 win at Highworth Town to provide Wootton Bassett Town with a ninth place finish, just in the top half of the table. The cup final replay at Shortwood United Pegasus was won 3-2 to bring the Division One Cup back to Wootton Bassett for the second time in four years.

Given Wootton Bassett Towns recent FA Cup history, their extra preliminary round tie with Bradford Town seemed destined for a replay. After all, for three seasons running nothing has separated Bassett and their opponents at this stage of the worlds greatest cup competition after the initial ninety minutes.

Now, you can make that four years on the trot. However, Dave Turners side were denied progress in the cruellest of fashions as an uncharacteristic mistake from Stewart Thompson gifted the hosts a late equaliser at a time when the visitors appeared comfortable. The veteran keeper □ whose performances have themselves singlehandedly won games for his side over the past couple of seasons □ failed to hold on to a routine Liam Milburn free kick, allowing substitute Andre Brookes to tap into an empty net with just seven minutes remaining. In fairness to Bradford, a goal was perhaps what they deserved after they had constantly pressured Bassett throughout the majority of the first half. Against the run of play though, they fell behind. On the stroke of half time, the visitors broke from a corner through Matty Bown and his precise pass split the home defence, before Sam Collier shrugged off the attentions of his marker and fired the ball beneath Ed Baldy from twenty yards. It was a composed finish from last seasons top scorer, but his teams combined efforts in the opening stanza were nothing of the sort. The monsoon like conditions did not help, but too often Bassett conceded possession cheaply. And on a couple of occasions they were fortunate not to concede. Just five minutes in Milburn whipped in testing free kick that was not dealt with. The ball fell to an unmarked Steve Hulbert at the far post, but all he could do was fire over from close range. Then six minutes before the break, Thompson flapped at a Dave Percival corner, with Hulbert again being the beneficiary of seeing the loose ball fall to him. A snap header was sent towards goal, but Bown found himself in the right place at the right time to head clear off the line.

Colliers strike seemed to settle the nerves as Turners side began to impose their authority on proceedings after the restart. Although a Ricky Trott free kick tested Thompson on the hour, the majority of the action took place at the other end. Bassett though failed to make their dominance count. Jon Beeden and Collier both saw half chances go begging before substitute Ethan Delaney fluffed his lines in front of goal. A Bown through ball set him free down the right, the youngster having beaten the offside trap, and with just Baldy to beat it appeared easier to score. However, with arguably too much time to think, he scuffed his effort with the outside of his boot into the side netting from a tight angle. Following Bradfords equaliser and another scare when □ after Thompson failed to fist away a corner □ both Dan Shanley and Percival saw efforts blocked on the line, Terry Adams was presented with a golden opportunity to steal victory for his side. Richie Carters through ball set him free in the left corner, and after Adams easily sidestepped Trott, he was left with just Baldy to beat. The keeper parried his first effort straight back at the midfielder, but Adams could do no better with the follow up, blazing over from close range.

Another replay it is then.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Jon Beeden □ the all action full back once again impressed. He never shirked a challenge and was extremely positive when coming forward.

Terry is a forward who has been there, done that and bought the t-shirt when it comes to local football ☐ not least because the Bassett-born goal-getter has done the rounds when it comes to whom he has featured for. The shirts of Devizes Town, Calne Town, Cirencester Town, Swindon Supermarine, Highworth Town and Hungerford Town have all been worn by the talismanic left-footer during his career. In 2004/05 he won the Hellenic League Premier Division crown under the guidance of John Fisher with Highworth. Despite scoring only three league goals that year, he provided plentiful assists from the left-side of midfield for the division's top scorers. Two seasons later he moved to Hungerford, scoring 20 goals in 2006/07. He was also instrumental in the Berkshire side's journey to the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup that season, scoring three goals in that run including a 90th minute winner against Conference South side Weston-super-Mare. A year later he notched the same amount, whilst also scoring six times during an eventful five game loan spell at Rylands Way that saw him sent off in his final match against Old Woodstock Town. He made his move to Bassett permanent in 2008, and was top scorer with 29 goals in 30 matches. However, his season was cut short after suffering a horrific knee injury against Easington Sports.

the same set of notes that Wootton Bassett had never beaten Wallingford but hoped that the game that day would change that record. Mick got his wish when goals from Scott Vincent (2) and Barry Giles secured a 3-1 win. The League Cup replay with Kidlington was scheduled for the following week and once again the two sides could not be separated after ninety minutes and once again extra time was required with the score at 1-1. In the extra thirty minutes Wootton Bassett scored again through Kevin Moloney two minutes from time to progress into the next round, the other Bassett goal being scored by Neil Timbrell. October ended with a visit to Letcombe, never an easy place to get a result as it proved as Wootton Bassett went down 2-0 with both goals coming in the last ten minutes. The Reserves also lost 2-1 away at leaders Bradford Town in the Wiltshire County League Division 2, with Pete Greaves being harshly sent off for two bookable offences.

Having has two tough cup encounters with Kidlington it will come as no surprise that the two sides could not be separated when they met in the league. Goals from Gary Cook and Kenny Regan gave Wootton Bassett their point in a 2-2 draw. Another draw seven days later, this time a creditable 0-0 draw away at second placed Lambourn Sports managed by Don Rogers. November ended with a Wiltshire Senior Cup away game at Pinehurst which Wootton Bassett won 3-1. Scott Vincent, with his tenth goal of the season, put Bassett in front after eight minutes before having to go off injured. Pinehurst equalised just after the break but Wayne Glastonbury put Bassett back in front after some good work by Steve Thomas and Neil Timbrell. In the closing stages the loudest cheer of the afternoon was reserved for the classiest finish seen that season when Roger Frost curled the ball into the far corner as the keeper came out, this being Frost's first goal of the season. This was enough for Frost to retain his place up front the following week for the visit of Ardley, where a goal from Wayne Glastonbury ensured a share of the spoils.

The next opponents in the league cup were Didcot Town and an excellent 3-1 away win saw Wootton Bassett safely into the next round and still fighting on all three fronts. Two more goals in this one for Scott Vincent plus one from Wayne Glastonbury. The last game before Christmas saw Bishops Cleeve visit Wootton Bassett with a repeat score of the game earlier in the season with Wootton Bassett triumphing 4-1. In a game played in blustery conditions, Scott Vincent chipped the keeper on twenty minutes to give Wootton Bassett the lead. Five minutes before the break however slack marking in the home defence allowed the visitors to equalise but right on half time a Scott Vincent cross was converted by Steve Thomas to regain Bassett's lead. After the break sub Kenny Regan came on for the injured Scott Vincent and immediately provided the cross for midfielder Wayne Glastonbury to head into the net. Regan also had a hand in Bassett's fourth goal combining with Roger Frost whose cross was turned into the net by a visiting defender. Over Christmas it is traditional to have a local derby and this season was no different with Wootton Bassett Town visiting big rivals Purton on Tuesday 28th December. Wootton Bassett clearly over did the turkey and booze over the festive period as they went down 4-0 by a Purton side that included Paul Burke. On a bad day for Wootton Bassett the programme editor for the next home game against Cirencester United noted that Bassett also had Steve Thomas, along with a Purton player, sent off for "swinging their handbags at each other".

The Cirencester fixture, played on the Bank Holiday Monday, was the first game of the new calendar year which saw Wootton Bassett sat in eighth place in the table, some sixteen points behind leaders Highworth Town who had played three games more. The programme for the match with Cirencester also reported that Reserve Team Manager Paul Fishlock had stepped down after three seasons, Dave Warren took over. Bassett, and Kenny Regan in particular, certainly got the year off to a good start. Regan scoring four time in a 8-1 win. Scott Vincent added another two and there was one for Neil Timbrell and Wayne Glastonbury in the best win of the season. The only black spot on a good day for the Club was the injury to Roger Frost which resulted in him being taken to hospital with a severe gash to his right shin. Five days later and it was the traditional County Cup fixture with Bromham the visitors. The Wiltshire League side were seen off comfortably with Kenny Regan again amongst the goals, scoring two as did Wayne Glastonbury, Scott Vincent with the fifth. Back to league action the following week and the long trip to Hereford for the game with Pegasus Juniors. Having been amongst the goals in the first two games of the New Year Wootton Bassett found themselves on the receiving end, going down 4-2. Steve Thomas put Wootton Bassett a goal up after four minutes with a twenty-five yarder but the home side equalised two minutes later. Two further goals before half time saw the home side lead 3-1. Kevin Moloney pulled a goal back to put Bassett back into the game but Pegasus scored again to secure the three points. The defeat, coupled with the injury to Roger Frost, prompted manager Mick Woolford to obtain the transfer of Darren Jell from Wollen Sports.

Having lost to Letcombe earlier in the season, Wootton Bassett were keen to extract revenge over the Berkshire side when they made their first ever visit to Rylands Way. In a much improved performance, two goals from Steve Thomas plus one a piece for Scott Vincent and Wayne Glastonbury did the damage for Bassett in a 4-1 win. This win provided confidence ahead of a tough quarter final league cup tie away at league leaders Carterton. At Carterton Darren Jell played for the first time in the season, coming on as a substitute, as Wootton Bassett made it through to the next round after extra time. The Advertiser carried the following report on the game:

What was going on in the world

The season starts with Freddie Mercury at the top of the charts with Living On My Own and ends with the Manchester United Football Club at number one with Come On You Reds. Manchester United are Premier League champions, finishing eight points ahead of Blackburn. The FA Cup is also won by Manchester United who defeat Chelsea 4-0 in the final. Kurt Cobain, lead singer of Nirvana commits suicide and the first women priests are ordained by the Church of England. Swindon Town make their first ever appearance in the English top division but finish bottom of the league some ten points adrift from second bottom Oldham.

In the county of Wiltshire Season 1993-94 will mainly be remembered as the season Swindon Town made it up into the Premier League. Whilst the stay in the top flight was to last but a season it was certainly exciting times for the people living in and around Swindon. Mick Woolford continued at the helm of Wootton Bassett Town and had retained many of his side from the previous season and signed one or two new additions. During the summer the Club had concreted the path to the stand from the clubhouse. Three pre-season games were played against Swindon Town Youths (lost 1-5), Premier League Champions Woolen Sports (drew 0-0) and Aldbourne Park (won 2-0).

The league season kicked off on the 14th of August with the visit of Carterton to Rylands Way in a start to the season that saw Wootton Bassett Town commence with five home games out of the first six matches. Two goals from Steve Thomas and one from Kenny Regan gave Wootton Bassett the three points as they won by the odd goal in five. Three days later Bristol side Hallen were the visitors to Rylands and the two sides shared four goals and the points, Lawrence Smith with a penalty and Kenny Regan on target for Bassett. The first away game of the season was a trip to Cheltenham Saracens and another 2-2 draw resulted, Scott Vincent and substitute Neil Timbrell with the Bassett goals. Another midweek fixture saw the visit of Highworth Town to Rylands Way, with a solitary goal from Scott Vincent securing the three points for Wootton Bassett Town. Bank Holiday Monday saw the last fixture in August with near neighbours Purton the visitors to Rylands Way. A disappointing result saw Wootton Bassett go down to their first defeat of the season against their keenest rivals. Scott Vincent scored the Wootton Bassett consolation goal.

September started with a disappointing heavy defeat at Didcot Town, despite scoring three times through Scott Vincent (2) and Kenny Regan, the Bassett defence shipped six goals much to the disappointment of manager Mick Woolford. Writing in his programme notes for the game against Yamton two weeks later Woolford expressed his disappointment:

In over twenty years in management, things just don't change. We started the season very well, commitment and some good football being played. Then two weeks ago we travelled to Didcot, quite confident of getting something from the game, but the display was one of the poorest I have witnessed from a Bassett side for a long time, in view of the players we had playing for us. It took me until Tuesday the following week to pick myself up and start thinking about the next game, which was Bishop Cleeve away. What a contrast, we came away winning 4-1 and full credit to the players for an excellent performance. Everyone, did their jobs, but one player, Wayne Glastonbury playing his first senior game of the season did a splendid job in midfield.

The win against Bishops Cleeve had come about thanks to goals from Steve Thomas, Neil Timbrell, Scott Vincent and Kenny Regan and left Wootton Bassett just five points off top spot. The game against Yamton, with manager Mick Woolford away sunning himself in Minorca, saw Wootton Bassett trail 1-0 at the interval but to second half goals from Lawrence Smith, one a penalty, and another from Scott Vincent gave Bassett all three points in a 3-1 win. Bassett sat in seventh spot in the table, still five points adrift of leaders Hallen.

September ended with a league cup tie at home to Kidlington. The two sides shared four goals and could not be separated after extra time meaning a replay would be required, this in the days before penalties were used to decide such matches. On target for Bassett were Kenny Regan and Neil Timbrell. When Wootton Bassett returned to league action the relatively short trip to a struggling Clanfield side saw a scrappy encounter. Lawrence Smith missed a penalty for Bassett in the 20th minute but from a Kevin Moloney free kick shortly after, Neil Timbrell put Bassett in front. The home side had the better of the second half but fell further behind when Kenny Regan scored after good work by Scott Vincent. The win lifted Bassett a place in the table. The next visitors to Rylands Way were Hereford based Pegasus Juniors who sat one place above Wootton Bassett in the table. A close encounter was expected and so it proved as the two sides fought out a 1-1 draw, Barry Giles scoring his first goal of the season for Bassett four minutes from time. As a result Wootton Bassett slipped two places in the table. In his programme notes for the next game against Wallingford, manager Mick Woolford lamented the loss of Roger Frost and Graham Large to knee injuries, the latter not having played at all this season. He also noted that close season signing Mark Embling should be available soon after work commitments and holiday had made him unavailable to date. Mick also pointed out in

Fate sees the top sides in Wiltshire meet in a series of local derbies this coming season in the Zamaretto Premier Division. This follows **Salisbury City's** two league demotion from the Blue Square Premier, coupled with **Chippenham Town's** failure to secure promotion to the Blue Square South in last seasons play-offs. The two sides are joined in the Premier by another Wiltshire side in **Swindon Supermarine**.

Salisbury City are currently under caretaker boss Darrell Clarke after the departure of both Nick Holmes and Tommy Widdrington. Despite saying farewell to top striker Matthew Tubbs and midfielder Chris Flood, Salisbury will be hoping to regain one step back up the Pyramid at the first attempt. **Chippenham Town**, under Adi Mings, will be looking to avoid the need for the play-offs after last seasons heartbreak at the hands of Nuneaton. **Swindon Supermarine** will once again be under the stewardship of Mark Collier, father to our own Sam, and will be pleased that they are still playing at Step 3 in the Pyramid after all the drama over the summer break. For them, in the circumstances, avoiding relegation and financial stability will be an achievement, whilst the other two sides will be expecting to compete for honours. With Cirencester Town just over the border, there will be plenty of "derby" interest for the Wiltshire football fans. The prospect of visits from former non-league giants Weymouth will also add interest to the Zamaretto Premier this season.

There is no Wiltshire interest at Step 4 in the Pyramid, with five Wiltshire sides playing at Step 5. There is ourselves and **Highworth Town** in the Hellenic Premier Division, **Bemerton Heath Harlequins** and **Laverstock & Ford** in the Wessex Premier and just **Corsham Town** in the Western League Premier Division.

Thirteen Wiltshire sides will be playing at Step 6 during Season 2010-11, including a number of sides relegated from Step 5 at the end of last season. In the Hellenic League, **Cricklade Town**, **Purton** and **Trowbridge Town** are joined by relegated **Malmesbury Vics**. It will be interesting to see how Malmesbury Vics compete under former Wootton Bassett Town Reserves manager, Ken Turner. Ken has already made a bold prediction that he expects promotion but, having the side fielded pre-season, my tip would be that they are more likely to be at the other end of the table but perhaps Ken and his side will prove me wrong. It will also be interesting to see how **Purton** get on without Warren Fullers goals this season. Graham Jackson appears to have strengthened his **Cricklade Town** side and my tip would be for them to finish as the highest placed Wiltshire side in Division One West this season. The Wessex First Division sees four Wiltshire sides in **Amesbury Town**, **Downton**, **Warminster Town** and **Pewsey Vale**, the latter having accepted promotion out of the Wiltshire League, unlike **New College** who prefer to be the big fish in the small pond and show no ambition. Five sides compete in Division One of the Western League, Wiltshire Cup holders **Calne Town** being joined by **Devizes Town**, **Melksham Town**, **Shrewton** and **Westbury**.

The Wiltshire League sees just two divisions next season and a host of new names in the Premier Division. A nineteen team Premier Division looks a good league. However, in terms of team strength do not be misled, many are the Reserve sides of existing senior clubs (e.g. Purton Reserves have become **Purton Redhouse**, Pewsey Vale Reserves have become **Vale of Pewsey**, Shrewton Reserves are now **RGV Shrewton**) but all now with separate affiliations as the leagues clubs takes innovative action to retain the leagues status in the Football Pyramid at Step 7. Presumably all Premier teams will be entering the Wiltshire Senior Cup which could see **Purton** play their own Reserve side but I could be wrong on this one. **KCs Club** and **New College** are likely to be the leading sides in the Premier Division. The First Division also looks to be a good interesting league with eighteen sides and plenty of games for all the sides. For me it is sad to hear that reigning champions and County Junior Cup holders **Minety** have pulled out of the County League after many years.

Despite doing all that they had to by defeating Easington Sports 2-1 thanks to Sam Collier's late winner, the Hellenic League Division One West title ultimately eluded Wootton Bassett Town as Slimbridge secured a 1-0 win over Headington Amateurs to pip Dave Turner's side on goal difference.

However that news did not dampen the celebrations for the second place finish secured a return to the Hellenic Premier after a five year hiatus that until this season was characterised by a mixture of heartache, frustration and underachievement.

And promotion was secured in some style. A month and a half ago, such an achievement - let alone finishing level on points with the eventual winners - seemed improbable after a draw with Trowbridge Town brought to an end a turgid three game homestand that saw just two points earned.

But seven successive wins later - a streak including triumphs over the eventual champions and Purton as well as the victory at in form Easington - Bassett are up.

It was another outstanding battling display that ended the campaign in fitting fashion.

There were nerves early on - most notably when Collier scuffed a close range effort straight at Kurt Fox whilst unmarked, but other than that it was a cool, calm and collected performance.

Only once in the first half did the hosts' threatening duo up front of Ricky Johnson and Lewis Travers - both of whom normally ply their trade with Southern League Woodford United - combine to breach the visiting defence. But even when they did Stewart Thompson was there to parry away superbly when the latter let loose.

The game appeared destined to go into the break deadlocked before a finish of some class from Matty Bown put Bassett in front.

Craig Shand's cross was not cleared and Bown pounced, firing left footed into the bottom right corner from 20 yards.

However, ten minutes after the restart an unstoppable 25 yard free kick from Dan Reeves pegged Bassett back.

But with the clock winding down a howler from Fox gifted Collier the winner. The keeper fluffed a kick outside his area and even tried batting the ball away with his hand which would surely have seen him sent off for the second time this season against Turner's side - in desperation.

The Bassett front man was first to the ball and coolly rolled it into an empty net despite the attentions of two defenders. It was his 20th of the season - a fine achievement for someone who began the campaign at left back.

In injury time Ryan Thomas could have made it three, but his miss mattered little as Easington had no further chances.

The sound of the final whistle sparked scenes of jubilation. And deservedly so for a group of players who have arguably defied expectations.

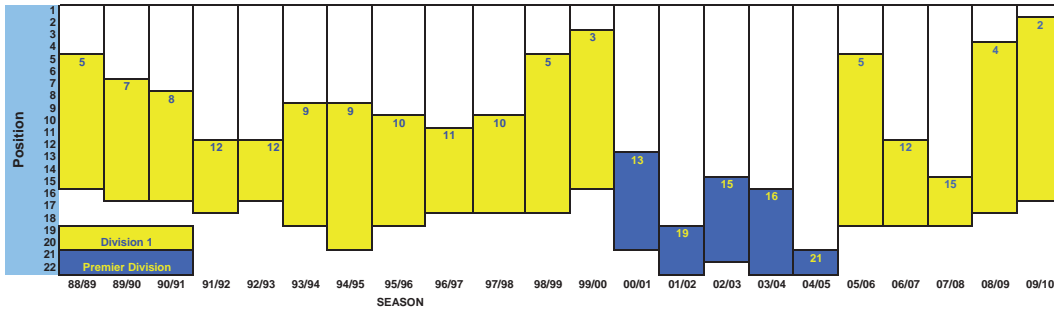

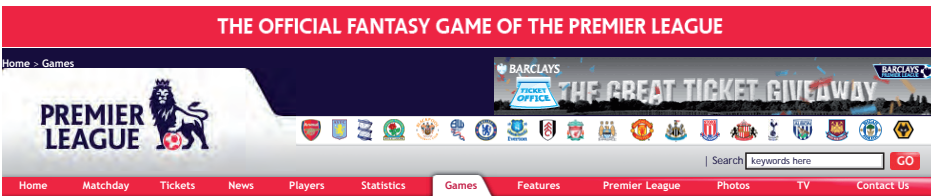

At the moment clubs in promotion positions, and having spent the money to get their ground graded correctly are often not actually promoted, because of decisions taken by Leagues above. The net effect is that promotion and relegation of clubs are kept to a minimum in favour of the 'old pals' act. I raised this at a BBC Radio London Non-League Show. The conclusion from the panel was that change is needed. I will be writing to the FA.

Reflecting back on last season's performance by the U18 Floodlit side I would have to say overall it has been a tremendous success resulting in the highest ever finish for the Basset Floodlit side (3rd) since the competition started although the way that the season ended was very disappointing due to mismanagement by the Competition Secretary meaning games remained unplayed which ultimately affected the final positions.

As mentioned in previous programme notes my brief from Chris Jones was to concentrate on development and I believe to achieve 3rd place with a team made up of predominately U16s at the start of the season is a fantastic effort by all involved. One of the most pleasing aspects for me was that the whole season was completed by using lads who had signed for Basset youth teams which showed that the talent is there within the club and there is no need to trawl around Wiltshire to get the so called 'superstars' as some managers are prone to do (as was the case under the previous floodlit management team).

With a completely new side from last seasons team starting the season I expected it would take a while for the team to gel together and this was reflected in three narrow defeats during the first month. However I was not unduly worried as the signs were encouraging and I believed that when all the players were fit and available we would be a strong outfit and our final position proves that this belief was right. 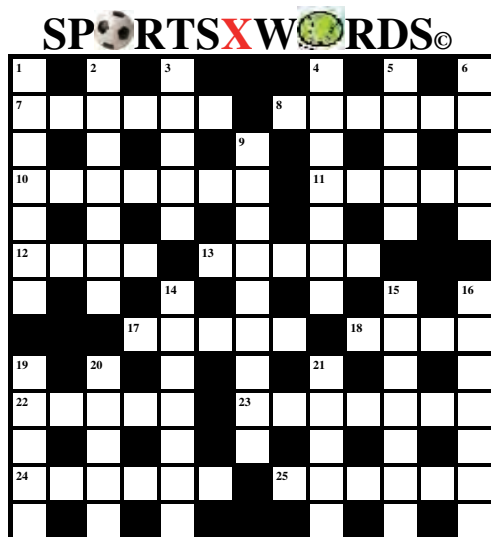

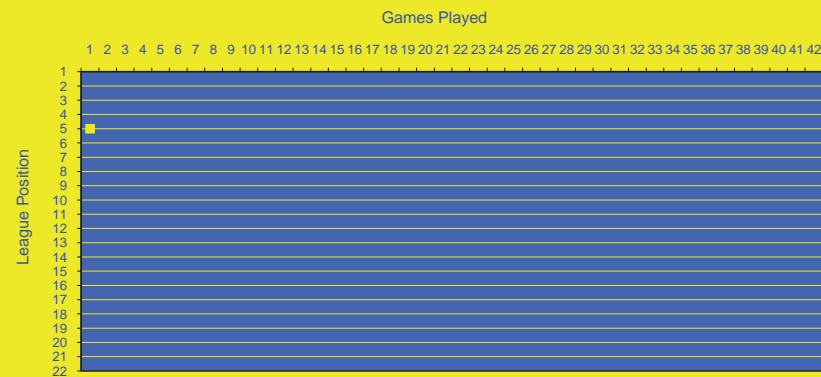

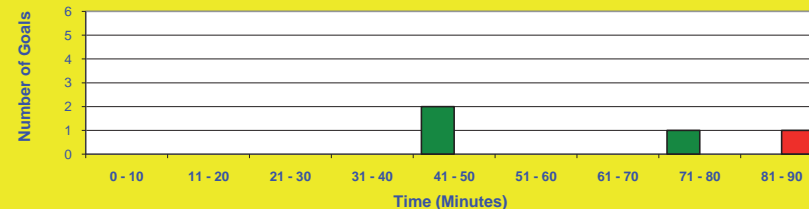

PRE-SEASON ROUND-UP

Seeking to survive

Consolidation, consolidation, consolidation. That alone will be the priority for Wootton Bassett Town this coming season as they ply their trade in the Hellenic Premier Division for the first time in five years. Half a decade of having great expectations going into a campaign has finally given way to more modest ambitions, and now Dave Turner's team can focus on establishing themselves at step five of the non-league pyramid – a level a club of this size should really be aiming to play in year in and year out. But for all the talk of belonging this must be backed up on the pitch. There is no doubt some pressure on Bassett to secure survival. After all, the performances of newly promoted sides to the Hellenic Premier in recent years has been fantastic; last year Binfield, Oxford City Nomads and Ascot United all made their mark in their maiden seasons in the division, whilst Old Woodstock Town can now be considered a part of the furniture following two solid seasons.

In order to repeat their results Turner has entrusted faith in the same set of players that helped achieve promotion, having limited his additions to the squad. And why not? Together, they performed consistently well last year, and by finishing level on points with champions Slimbridge have earned the chance to try their luck at a higher level. Furthermore, too many new faces would arguably have threatened the fantastic chemistry that has developed amongst the players. New to Rylands Way this year will be youngsters Jon Beeden – an energetic full back – and Ethan Delaney – a tricky forward with plenty of pace, both of whom add more than just competition for places. Returning to the side is a trio of players who featured for Shrivenham last year. Forward Alex Green has a history of scoring plenty of goals in the Hellenic Premier, whilst the Carter twins, Richie and Shaun, have re-signed, having both played a major part of the Bassett side who narrowly missed out on promotion two seasons ago. Furthermore, the recovery of Shaun Terry – scorer of 29 goals two seasons ago – from a knee ligament injury that has kept him sidelined for the past year and a half will feel like a new signing too and he provides yet another threat in front of goal.

On the pitch, the preseason for Bassett has been a relatively successful one. Although the clubs front-men have struggled to find the back of the net, there has been little to worry about at the opposite end of the pitch. In their first friendly Bassett came up against Wiltshire Senior Cup holders Calne Town and prevailed by the odd goal in three thanks to a Sam Collier penalty and Matty Bown strike. A Swindon Town XI – mainly comprised of their youth team – were then held to a 1-1 draw courtesy of a Terry Adams goal before Southern League Swindon Supermarine were made to work extremely hard for their 2-0 victory; a missed penalty from Terry ensured the visitors kept a clean sheet. Following a 2-1 victory over Wiltshire League Wroughton – Delaney and Mitch Wyatt the scorers, Bassett fell to their second defeat of the preseason away against reigning County League champions New College Academy prevailed 2-1, Craig Bowden on target for the visitors. Bassett then dominated proceedings away at Letcombe but could only score the once through Liam Edmondson on the way to another win. Defender Bowden was once again on target at newly promoted Wessex League outfit Pewsey Vale, and a further goal from Alex Green secured another win by the odd goal in three. The penultimate friendly saw a mixed first and reserve team take on 1st Battalion the Rifles in a charity match at Rylands Way. The hosts won 2-0 thanks to a first half Edmondson header and an own goal early in the second half. More importantly though over £400 was raised for Help for Heroes and Care for Casualties – the Rifles own fund, money for which the club would like to thank all those who attended for helping raise it.

The final tune up fixture saw Bassett travel to a second Western League opponent, this time Melksham Town, who like Calne were relegated to Division One of that competition last season. And once again only a single goal separated the sides, with a Bowden penalty – the defender's fourth of the preseason – ensuring victory for the visitors.

The Hellenic League is a Senior Football Competition. The Rules by which we operate are standardised at this level across the country by the FA. Every year we welcome new Officers and Match Officials. Being a Club Secretary is often a thankless task. Everyone expects you to have all of the information at your fingertips. Having been a Club Official previously we fully understand. Our advice is:-

- Do read the hand book or appropriate Competition Rules. Most answers are contained there.
- If the answer is not there, contact someone who can help regarding that Competition.
- If the matter concerns the Hellenic League contact the League Office. Please don't guess, and hope.

Things do not always go as well as can be expected, and your club may receive a Breach of Rule notification. Please reply. If the Breach did occur, let the league know what is happening to prevent a repeat. If your feel that there are circumstances that need to be considered, do please respond with the details. Do not do nothing - This is the worst response and will cause a fine to be administered.

As a result of confirmed breaches there is a tariff of fines fixed by the FA. Once an invoice has been received do please pay within the correct timescale as a £10 per day levy will be added for late payments.
