# WORLD OF SOCCER THIS WEEK FEATURING...... FORMER CHAIRMAN MARK SMEDLEY

With the Transfer Deadline having now come and gone there seemed to be a lot less activity than in previous seasons but even so the old trusted fax machine at Football League headquarters seems to have struggled. It seems ridiculous in this day and age with email and other forms of quick communication that the League still rely on the old fax machine to handle the 30 odd pages of paperwork that are required to register each transfer. Not only was there the uncertainty over the Van der Vaart transfer to Tottenham (pictured along with a photo of his Mrs), it was also a couple of days before my own team, Queens Park Rangers could confirm that the signings of Rob Hulse and Tommy Smith had gone through. Far from satisfactory and the authorities certainly need to look at improving the speed of the registration process in the future.

Also far from satisfactory in my opinion is the lending of players by Premiership teams to teams in the Championship and then paying part of their wages. This is particularly galling with regard to Cardiff, who have picked up both Craig Bellamy and Andy Keogh, despite being on their financial knees. In the case of Bellamy Manchester City are alleged to still be paying £64,000 of his £85,000 a week salary, whilst Wolves are alleged to be paying half of Keoghs £21,000 a week salary. If these players are to be loaned for me their whole wages need to be paid by the loanee club for there to be a level playing field.

This is only set to get worse given the new rules which limit premiership squads to a named 25. Clubs must submit a squad of up to 25 players aged 21 or over. Simply put, this new rule means that clubs risk having to leave some players on the sidelines, or ship them out on loan. The likes of Manchester City have a huge squad, meaning City boss Roberto Mancini will be forced to either leave some of his players on the sidelines until the transfer window opens again in January. Eight of the 25-man squad submitted by clubs to the Premier League must include eight home-grown players. These do not have to be English-born players, but rather players who have spent a minimum of three years registered with an English club before the age of 21. Clubs can supplement their squad with an unlimited number of players under the age of 21. Changes to the 25-man squad can only be made during the transfer window, meaning clubs who submit their first squad by September 1st will not be allowed to make changes again until January 1st, 2011. However, the Premier League may allow for changes in exceptional circumstances, such as a goalkeeper injury crisis. Players loaned out to clubs in the Football League cannot be replaced, but those players can regain their place in the 25man squad upon their return to their parent club. The above rules only apply to Premier League matches and not domestic Cup or European competition, which could lead to some larger clubs opting to use players who miss out on the Premier League squad for the likes of the Carling Cup. It will be interesting to see how many more players are loaned out to Championship sides in the coming weeks. Perhaps Man City will lend Wootton Bassett a player but they would need to pick up 100% of his salary, now maybe it is not such a bad thing after all.

# **OPPONENTS HISTORY**

### **WOKINGHAM & EMMBROOK FC • CLUB HISTORY**

Wokingham & Emmbrook Football Club was formed in the summer of 2004 by the merger of 2 long established clubs from Wokingham. We are looking to re-establish senior football back in Wokingham after an absence of 5 years, since Wokingham Town moved from their Finchampstead Road ground in 1999. Ideally situated just a short distance from Wokingham town centre, the Lowther Road ground is a pleasant setting, also used for cricket during the summer.



Formed in 1875, Wokingham Town is the 4th oldest club in Berkshire. Starting off in the Ascot & District League they progressed over the years through the local leagues before joining the Metropolitan League, and subsequently transferred to the Delphian League. In 1959 Wokingham were admitted to the Corinthian League, in 1962 the switch was made to the Athenian League, and then to the Isthmian League in 1973. Highlights of their achievements include 4 Berks & Bucks Senior Cup wins, Isthmian League Division One Champions in 1981/2, Premier Division runners up 1989/90, FA Trophy Semi-Finalists in 1987/8, FA Cup 1st Round 1982/3. Wokingham moved from their Finchampstead Road ground in 1999 after more than 90 years there and have spent the last 5 years ground sharing at Windsor, Flackwell Heath & Egham. It was felt that the time was right to come home.

Formed in 1936, Emmbrook Sports are one of the oldest clubs in local football. Entering the Reading & District League they remained there until the Reading Football League was formed in 1989. Starting in Division One Kennet, they gained promotion to the Premier Division in 1994/5 and 2 seasons later took the runners up spot and promotion to the Senior Division.

In our first season as Wokingham and Emmbrook, as the merger 'bedded-in' and the re-structuring took shape, under the guidance of Glenn Duggleby as Manager and Dave Evans as his coach, the 1st team finished in 11th position in the Hellenic League, Division One East.

In the season 2005/06 we finished in 3rd place, out highest ever placing in the league, having been in contention for the championship for most of the season, under the experienced guidance of Tony Calvert, as 1st team player-Manager and Dave Evans as his coach.

Tony added, the experienced Mark Tallentire to his management team for season 2006/2007, however during the pre-season preparations for the new season Tony and his management team left the club and we quickly appointed a new Management team for the season, in ex-Finchampstead players, Jez Lynch as Manager and Danny Humphreys as his Player-Assistant Manager. The 1st team's quickly constructed squad, under the first-time management pairing struggled for the majority of the season, but a strong finish to the season saw them finish the season in a creditable 10th place.

Season 2007/2008, started with Jez and Danny still at the helm of the first team, however after a string of indifferent results, the decision was taken to replace them with our very successful and experienced Allied Counties Manager, Wayne Wanklyn, in November 2007. Wayne, a former professional player with Reading F.C. and former Wokingham town 1st team Manager, quickly appointed existing Reserve Team Boss, Roger Herridge as his assistant and Sam Page from the Allied Counties set-up as his coach. Wayne's strategy from the on-set was to develop his talented youth team into the first team squad. The remainder of the season saw a crop of exciting young talent blend in with the more experienced squad and with a little more fortune and experience they could have easily finished a lot higher than their final 13th position.

Season 2008/2009 starts a new era for the club as we move location a 'stones throw' down the road to Cantley Park. We will almost certainly be starting the season at Lowther Road or on a temporary pitch, while our 'new premier pitch and enclosed ground' is built on the Cantley site, with FA and Local Authority funding, we will be adding to our facilities at Lowther Road with Cantley hosting a stand for 250 people and floodlights, which should be constructed during this season, ready for completion late 2007/early 2008. We are also looking forward to Wayne and his management team continuing the exciting development of his young squad as they mount a challenge for honours, with many of his squad now having benefited from last season's experiences, both in the first team and the championship winning Allied Counties team.



had lost both their county players. A 3-0 defeat at home to Ferndale was the first of five consecutive home defeats in 1976. Wootton Bassett did however secure a point in their final game in January a goal from John Parsons ensuring a share of the spoils from the trip to Bromham.

The first February fixture saw high flying St Josephs visit Rylands Way and Wootton Bassett slipped to their heaviest home defeat of the season conceding five and only scoring two in reply through John Parsons and Alan Turner. St Josephs would eventually finish third, three points behind champions Vickers. Bassett did manage a point from a visit to Marlborough, Alan Turner scoring both Wootton Bassett goals in the 2-2 draw. The next home game saw another top side, Park, as the visitors to Rylands and Wootton Bassett put up a much better performance but it still ultimately ended in defeat, as Park won by the odd goal in five. Graham Reid and Mick May scored the Wootton Bassett goals. May was again amongst the scorers in the next game at Westbury where Bassett went down 4-2 against a fellow struggling side, Alan Turner scoring the other Bassett goal.

The poor run of home form extended into March with both games being lost. A 3-1 defeat against Salisbury City in which veteran Phil Keep again found the back of the net was followed by a 2-1 defeat to Bemerton Athletic, Mick May with the consolation goal. In between Wootton Bassett picked up a useful point away at second placed Amesbury, Graham Reid scoring in the 1-1 draw. Again this result illustrated the point that on their day Wootton Bassett could compete with the best sides in the division.

Finally a win was secured as Spring arrived and it was one of their youngsters that Wootton Bassett Town had to thank for the win. New goalkeeper Paul Comer was the star of the show in a 4-0 win at Highworth Town Mick May opened the scoring with a spectacular overhead kick to set them on their way to their first win of 1976 after some eleven games without such a victory. John Goodwin also scored with a header from a free kick. The following week Wootton Bassett lost 3-1 to eventual champions Vickers, a credible result with Mick May scoring the Wootton Bassett goal.

### Bassett edge FA Cup thriller

Almondsbury Sports & Social Club, 28th August 2010

Please do not let the headline fool you. In all honesty, watching the traffic whizz by on the nearby M5 would probably have been more entertaining than witnessing Wootton Bassett Towns titanic FA Cup struggle with Almondsbury UWE.

Yet saying that, for only the second time in the clubs history, Bassett find themselves in the First Qualifying Round of the worlds greatest cup competition where they will travel to face Wessex Premier Division outfit Hamble ASSC, who last year knocked Dave Turners side out of the FA Vase at the first attempt. And that is the most important news to come from the afternoon.

However they come, wins in the FA Cup are always something to be proud of. The chance at progressing further than ever before and potentially set up a date with a Conference South outfit is something you would trade the ugliest of ugly 1-0 wins for. But to get that opportunity, Turners team will have to step up their game against their Hampshire opponents in a fortnights time.

From the first whistle, neither side looked as though they were going to turn in a performance that was fitting for the occasion. Almondsbury, who in the early stages forced corner after corner, looked well drilled with their numerous short set-pieces, but they could not convert any into meaningful chances. Bassett, on the other hand, failed to get a grip on the game, squandering possession at ease, leaving inform forwards Sam Collier and Alex Green to cast frustrated figures up front.

The latter had the first chance of the match fall to him just after the quarter hour mark following some pinball in the home penalty area. But Green could only poke wide from ten yards when presented with just home custodian Chris Coles to beat.

Out of nothing with half an hour gone though, Bassett fathomed a goal. Ryan Banks switch of play found Matty Bown on the right wing, although the cross-field ball seemed to be hit with more hope than intent. Bown then outmuscled his marker before feeding the heavily marked Collier, who had gained the attention of a trio of defenders, with an inch perfect pass.

After fashioning an opening on the edge of the box, the forward struck an effort with his right foot that looked as though it would leave Coles with a comfortable save. However, a wicked deflection left the keeper wrong-footed and diverted the ball into the bottom right corner.

It was a not a classic goal by any stretch of the imagination, but on an afternoon as turgid and sloppy as this it was more than fitting that it wound up deciding the game.

The blustery conditions, which were to be expected given the exposed nature of the Western League Division One sides ground, and ropey pitch, something of a surprise given how flat it seemed on arrival, did not help, but the excuses could only go so far.

In the second period things were not much better, although chances were slightly more frequent.

Five minutes after the restart, a woefully under-hit backpass was pounced upon by Collier, but with only Coles to beat the forward could only find the right hand post with a somewhat hurried effort.

Moments later, a Bown through ball cut open the Almondsbury defence, allowing Banks to bare down on goal. However, the winger opened fired too early and Coles was able to parry his effort from the edge of the area.

On the hour, smart play down the left-hand channel involving full-back Jon Beeden and Banks opened up space for the latter to dink a weighted cross into the area. It was perfectly placed for the unmarked Collier to power home a header, but he once again found the woodwork, this time seeing his effort smash the crossbar and drift out of play.

Fortunately though, Bassetts wastefulness in front of goal did not come back to haunt them. Keeper Stewart Thompson was virtually a spectator throughout the game and was only really called into question once, but he dealt more than easily with a half chance created by Simon McElroy in the early stages of the second period.

He will not get an easier day again this season in both the league and FA Cup though, that is for sure.

Scoops Man of the Match: Richie Carter, dictated the game the best he could from his position at the heart of the Bassett midfield and his solid tackling helped snuff out any semblance of a threat the hosts posed.

Scoop Rating: 4/10, it was the worst Bassett had played in a very long time, possession was wasted too much and too often the team were too slow getting forward. Thankfully though they were able to grind out a result and seal a place in the first qualifying round. Manager Dave Turner will be expecting much better however, starting with Mondays derby with Highworth Town.

The more laid back of the Carter twins, Richie is a classy holding central midfield, who possesses a fine passing range and is extremely comfortable when in possession. Following a year with Shrivenham, he is in his second spell at Rylands Way, having previously featured for the club during the 2008/09 season. Following a spell with Fairford Town, he joined Dave Turner at Pewsey Vale in 2006/07, making 29 appearances and scoring four times. He failed to register a goal a season later, but was once again a regular at the heart of the Vale midfield before his move to Bassett. Beginning the season at full back, Carter eventually moved to his preferred spot in the centre of midfield and registered 45 appearances ② only one of which came from the bench, meaning he played in more games than any other outfield player. His only goal of the campaign came in a wild 5-3 away win against Cricklade Town, but ③ as the number of matches he played in shows ③ he was an integral part of the Bassett side that finished fourth in Division One West, narrowly missing out on promotion. Along with his brother, he left to join Shrivenham last year. For a side who struggled mightily, he played 38 games, once again scoring only a single goal, that coming in a 3-1 away win for Shrivy at Ascot United in September.

This dropped point was clearly a set-back and few would have therefore predicted that the same side would then the following week take a point off then leaders and eventual champions, Vickers but this is precisely what Wootton Bassett Town achieved. Graham Reid scored in his own net to put the visitors ahead but made up for his mistake by scoring at the correct end with a fine header. It could actually have been even better as a blinding save right at the end from a shot by Bob Thomas denied Wootton Bassett both points.

November commenced with a home game against title chasing Amesbury. Just like on the opening day of the season against Sanford, Wootton Bassett demonstrated that when they raise their game they were capable of beating anyone in the division but just not on a regular basis. On this occasion goalkeeper Gordon Baverstock inspired a victory over one of the top sides in the county. This included five stunning saves in the first ten minutes. Don Courtney put Wootton Bassett in front and Mick Parsons scored a second as Wootton Bassett secured a surprise 2-0 win. In a tough run of fixtures it did not get any easier the following week with a trip to Park. Unfortunately Wootton Bassett were unable to take points off one of the title contenders this time, going down 4-2, Graham Reid and Mick Parsons with the Wootton Bassett goals. Wootton Bassett did secure two points the following week thanks to a second half hat-trick from 16 year old Gary Dixon in a 3-1 home win over Highworth Town, Steve Slattery scoring Highworth's consolation. A week later it was struggling Avon Bradford who were the visitors to Rylands Way and a trend whereby Wootton Bassett took points off the top sides but lost to the sides near the bottom was emerging. A 2-1 defeat ensued, Mick Parsons netting for Wootton Bassett goal. A 1-1 draw away at Ferndale Athletic followed, Dave Clark with the Wootton Bassett goal.

As usual December kicked off with Wiltshire County Cup action and Wootton Bassett's opponents were near neighbours Purton and it took two attempts to decide the tie. In the first game played at Rylands Way the two sides shared four goals, Gary Dixon and Don Courtney on target for Wootton Bassett. In the return game at the Red House the match went into extra time with Purton eventually edging the game 2-1, Mick Parsons getting the Wootton Bassett goal. The return to league action saw the visit of Marlborough Town, who were struggling near the foot of the table, to Rylands Way. It was the visitors who scored the only goal of the game to go home with both points. Two days after Christmas Day Wootton Bassett Town bounced back to win 1-0 at home against Malmesbury Vics, John Parsons with the solitary goal.

Just as the new season had started with a game against Sanford so did the New Year. However, the result was nowhere near as good from a Wootton Bassett Town perspective as Sanford romped to a 5-0 win. Wootton Bassett were without a game in the second week of January but when they returned to league action it was against near neighbours Calne Town. In what appears to have been an exciting game the two sides shared six goals and the points, John Parsons (2) and Phil Keep scoring for Wootton Bassett. Having lost star player Tony Vines to Andover at the start of the season, Wootton Bassett were to lose another one at the start of 1976 as Mick Parsons departed to join Vickers. ### Season 1975-76 - Bohemian Rhapsody

### What was going on in the world

The season started with Can't Give You Anything (But My Love) by The Stylistics at number one and ended with Fernando by Abba. The biggest selling record of the season was Queen's Bohemian Rhapsody which spent nine weeks at the top of the charts. Brotherhood of Man win the Eurovision Song Contest and US punk group The Ramones release their first album. Muhammad Ali defeats Joe Frazier in the Thrilla in Manila and Juan Carlos is declared King of Spain following Francos death. US President Ford is the victim of two failed assassination attempts whilst in the UK Harold Wilson resigns and is replaced by James Callaghan. The push though stay-tab for drinks cans is invented. In the world of football Czechoslovakia win the European Championships, defeating West Germany on penalties. Liverpool wins Division One by one point from QPR, a final game win at Wolves, ten days after QPR had completed their fixtures, thanks to two goals in the last fifteen minutes securing the title, whilst second division Southampton surprise everyone to defeat Manchester United in the FA Cup final. Football in England is suffering badly from hooliganism in a season which includes seeing 100 Chelsea fans arrested after trouble at Luton. Swindon Town finish 19<sup>th</sup> in Division Three.

Wootton Bassett Town made the headlines on the opening day of the 1975-76 Season, which was to be the last season of the Wiltshire Combination, with the Football Pink running the headline \[ \] Wootton Bassett earn top rating on opening day \[ \] Opponents Sanford had only lost four games all season the previous season in finishing second in the league and Wootton Bassett Town managed to inflict their heaviest defeat for half a decade. This result was achieved despite having lost star player Tony Vines to Western League football, Vines having joined Andover. Mick Parsons fired a hat-trick and Derek Chambers added a fourth in a 4-0 win in which Graham Reid played a starring role. Sanford \[ \] top striker Tony Pike missed a penalty in a bad day for the previous season \[ \] runners-up. However, it was very much downhill from here for Wootton Bassett.

September commenced with a heavy 5-1 away defeat at Salisbury City Reserves and a 2-2 draw at home to Chippenham Town Reserves, Graham Reid and Mick Parsons scoring against Chippenham. This was followed by a 4-0 defeat at St Josephs. Yet another away defeat arose at Avon Bradford as Wootton Bassett Town managed somehow to throw away the points having led 2-1 with two minutes to go, again through goals from Graham Reid and Mick Parsons. In an amazing finish Avon Bradford drew level on 88 minutes and then scored the winner a minute later. The month ended with another defeat by the odd goal in five, as Westbury left Rylands Way with both points, Mick May and Alan Turner with the Bassett goals.

Wootton Bassett Town had to wait until the 4<sup>th</sup> of October for their next victory, this a 4-1 away win at Bemerton Athletic. Star of the show was Mick Parsons who fired a hat-trick with Don Courtney adding a fourth. The good run only lasted a week as the following week Wootton Bassett Town managed to allow Bromham to gain their first point of the season in a 2-2 draw at Rylands Way, Don Courtney and Graham Reid with the goals. Bromham had



### No happy returns

A stirring, resolute performance from Dave Turners men ensured the return of former Bassett trio Steve Yeardley, Jonny Aitkenhead and Richie Saunders to Rylands Way was not a happy one, as the hosts prevailed 2-0 in a fascinating derby encounter.

The victory means that Bassett remain unbeaten in all competitions at the end of the first month of the season, whilst the Worthians dropped their third league game so far, a situation opposite to what most would have anticipated given the different ambitions the two clubs had prior to the commencement of the Hellenic Premier Division campaign. The turning point of what was an action-packed derby played in front of a bumper crowd came with 66 minutes gone. Sam Collier was twice the guilty party, firstly scuffing an effort after a superb one-two between Tearle and Delaney before he blasted from close range whilst unmarked following a Bown cross. Delaney too should have done better when set free by Collier, but his touch failed him when attempting to round Sharkey.

Bown sent in a poorly struck corner from the right, but Shaun Carter was fortunately on the edge of the box to redirect the ball into the danger area. # **SCOOPS AUG 2010 REVIEW**



### An August to Remember

Given the modest ambitions going into their first season back in the Hellenic Premier Division following a five year exile, Wootton Bassett Town manager Dave Turner will be overjoyed with the fantastic start his side have made to the season.

His side currently have the best defensive record in the division, having conceded just twice in their opening four leagues games, whilst they also possess the best goal difference, and, most importantly, are unbeaten in all competitions, a feat only title favourites Shortwood United can match.

Finishing August in a healthy seventh place has very much been a pleasant surprise, although boss Turner, as shown by his comments to the Swindon Advertiser following Mondays Bank Holiday win over local rivals Highworth Town, is of the opinion that they are deservedly there, and rightly so.

The month began with a workmanlike 2-0 win at Pegasus Juniors, who, despite their early season struggles, are a tough nut to crack at home.

From there Bassett were held to a 1-1 draw by Western League Division One Bradford Town in their opening FA Cup fixture. In the replay they appeared to be on the brink of elimination, until youngster Jon Beedens late header made it 3-3, thus forcing penalties from which Turners side prevailed, demonstrating the character and resolve possessed by the youthful squad the manager has forged.

Bassetts second league encounter saw them travel to Oxford City Nomads, where they triumphed 8-0. The Nomads may be rooted to the bottom of the table, but it says something that only one other team, Bracknell Town, have so far kept a clean sheet against them.

Then came the first dropped points of the season at home against Old Woodstock Town, a team with their sights set on a top ten finish. Twice Bassett surrendered leads in a game that wound up finishing 2-2, but once again the teams tremendous character was on show as they refused to buckle after the visitors second equaliser.

Against Western League Almondsbury UWE in the FA Cup Preliminary round, Turners team showed they can win ugly as well as they secured a place in the First Qualifying round for only the second time in the clubs history with a 1-0 victory.

Two days later they finished the month in style against Highworth. And it was a complete performance that earned a deserved three points to push the number in the points column next to Bassetts name into double figures. From the back to the front, every player put in a shift as the Worthians were defeated and blanked 2-0.

What has been most pleasing though is the way the whole squad have not been fazed by the step up in quality. Both Sam Collier and Alex Green have found their scoring boots once again, while youngsters Beeden, Craig Bowden, Ethan Delaney and Liam Edmondson have all demonstrated a maturity beyond their years.

Heading back to last season, Bassett have now gone 13 games unbeaten in competitive fixtures. That streak will undoubtedly come to an end, but it is one to savour.




