

WORLD OF SOCCER THIS WEEK FEATURING...... Former chairman mark smedley

Back in the good old days (by this I mean the 1970s and 1980s), Wootton Bassett Town FC used to have a Sunday League side who generally played in either Division One or Division Two of the Swindon Sunday League. The side was generally made up of players who played for the Club on a Saturday in the Wilts League. I cannot recall when the Sunday League side was dropped, or why, but I suspect it was around the time that the Club entered the Hellenic League and things got a lot more serious on a Saturday. The pitch no doubt suffered from having two adult games played on it per weekend.

When the Club moves to the new ground personally I believe it would be a good idea to resurrect the adult Sunday League side. The new pitch will be designed to cope with more frequent heavy use, removing one of the issues that I believe led to the demise of the Sunday side. Players who turn out for the Club on a Saturday but who currently play for the Dog & Duck on a Sunday could play for the Club on both days. This removes an opportunity for the players to be poached by other Saturday sides and provides another opportunity to build a stronger team spirit. The side could be managed by, say, the First Team assistant manager or the Reserve Team Manager or jointly by both, to provide them with the opportunity to develop their managerial experience. The Club would have the facilities so that it could enter the prestigious FA Sunday Cup, a national competition involving the top Sunday sides in the country. We have allowed Greyhound to play games in this competition in the past here at Rylands and the games always drew large crowds.

The possibility of resurrecting the Sunday side is certainly something for the Committee to think about and perhaps include in the Development Plan. For the time being those followers of Sunday football will have to make do with a trip up to Ballards Ash to watch either The Five Bells or The Old Nick play.



OPPONENTS HISTORY

Hamble ASSC Football Club started its inaugural season in 1938 as Folland Aircraft FC and had a flurry of successes during the war years when players from Pompey and Saints worked in the factory, winning the **Hampshire Senior Cup** in 1941. 1942 proved to be an exceptional year, winning the **Hampshire League**, **Hampshire Senior Cup** and the **Russell Cotes Cup**.

Subsequently and up to the seventies the club were known as Folland Sports FC and experienced mixed fortunes, drifting between County and local football, collecting along the way minor trophy is on the odd occasion. In 1979/80 fortunes again began to smile on the club as the Hampshire League div 4 title and Hampshire Intermediate Cup double was achieved. The following season the club won the **Hampshire League div 3** title and for the years that followed consolidation in the second division was the club s main priority. With steady progress more honours were achieved in 1984/5 when the Southampton Senior Cup was won in a thrilling final, defeating Awbridge, and played at the Dell. The same season saw the Reserves winning the Southampton Premier Division title, which meant that the first team played the reserves in the Reg Mathieson Cup, won narrowly by it senior side. In 1986/7 the Southampton Senior Cup win was repeated also played at The Dell defeating Sholing Sports FC. The **Reg Mathesieson Cup** win was also repeated and promotion to Hampshire League Division One with a creditable third place finish that season was the icing on the cake. The club, however, leap-frogged Division One by successfully applying to join the Wessex League. During the summer of 1987, with a generous donation by the Sports and Social club and a lot of hard work by the club committee and players alike, floodlights and a pitch barrier were installed. This enabled the club to meet the higher standards required by the Wessex League.

In 1991/92 the club went through another metamorphosis re-naming itself Aerostructures S&SC and the team reached the semi-final of the Wessex League Cup, finishing in 9th place in the League, which remains the highest finish to date. The Reserves too were credited with success with a win over Braishfield in the final of the **Southampton Senior Cup**, once again played at The Dell. In 1997/98 season the first and last major honours as Aerostructures S&SC was with a win in the final of the **Jewson Wessex League Cup** over Bemerton Heath Harlequins at Ten Acres by 2 goals to 1.

The club was re-named again as **Hamble ASSC FC** for the 1998/99 season, which it has remained since. Dressing room improvements in 2004 saw FA Cup and Vase competitions entered into for the first time in over ten years. After a number of seasons near the bottom of the Premier Division, Hamble were relegated to Division One at the end of Season 2008/9. However, Hamble ASSC were able to bounce straight back as the Club secured its first honour under the Hamble ASSC name when it won Division One of the Wessex League last season.





PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Groom and Roger Smith were the Bassett marksmen with Colin Dable getting Shrewton s two.

And it was full steam ahead to finish the final month of the year, with seven from a possible eight points being earned in their next four matches. A come from behind victory by the odd goal in three at Burmah House thanks to a Dixon brace increased the lead at the top to four points, before a close game at third place Pewsey Vale resulted in a 1-1 draw courtesy of Smith[®] 87th minute equaliser. Corsham were then routed 4-0 at Rylands Way, with four different scorers □Flavell, Dixon, Steve Thomas and Greg Smith □netting. A victory by the same margin at home to Marlborough two days before the New Year □ Neil Timbrell, Thomas, Roger Smith and Flavell scoring. Coupled with Old Manor[®] 4-2 loss to Shrewton meant Bassett entered 1985 top of the pile, four points ahead of both Pinehurst and Pewsey, the latter though possessing a game in hand.

Bleak weather prevented Bassett from kicking a ball in anger in January. But they showed little rust when their season belatedly resumed two days into February, defeating Ferndale 2-1 at Rylands Way. Goals on the day from Dixon and Gee ensured a gap of two points remained between Clarkes side and the chasing pack.

There was a further delay in action, with a month coming before Bassett were back on the field. Their winning ways continued though with a 3-1 away win at Corsham, the goals coming from Dixon, Groom and Flavell. A draw between fellow title challengers Old Manor and Pinehurst meant they were now two points clear at the top with two games in hand. Both points were again earned a week later, as Bassett ventured to lowly Westbury United Reserves and won 2-0. A Dixon strike and a Thomas penalty sealed the win, and the day got even better as both Pinehurst and Old Manor dropped points. A fortnight later, a trip to Warminster garnered both points with Dixon and Thomas again on target. The state of play in Division Two now saw Bassett three points ahead of Pewsey and four clear of Pinehurst with a pair of games in hand over the latter.

April began with Bassett taking on Marlborough in their long awaited Ghia Senior Cup first round tie. The replay had initially been scheduled for November 24^{th} , but foul weather put paid to that game. And \Box despite entering extra time, the cup tie would have to be rearranged *again* as bad light cause its abandonment with Bassett 4-3 ahead. A comprehensive 4-1 defeat to Pinehurst, Tim Brogan grabbing the consolation, followed, but this did little damage to Bassetts title hopes despite Pinehurst temporarily taking top spot. Their lead was two points, but with three games in hand Clarkes side could afford to drop points.

Promotion was secured with a 2-0 home win against Dorcan on April 10th as strikes from Thomas and Roger Smith sealed a return to Division One. The title was then sealed in front of the Rylands Way faithful, but it was done so in little style as Pewsey held Bassett to a 0-0 draw. Two Ghia Senior Cup games in the space of three days immediately followed. A Kenny Regan goal finally settled the deal with Marlborough to set up a second round tie with Burmah House. Despite home advantage, Bassett were held to a 1-1 draw setting up an unwanted replay. After a home defeat by a solitary goal to lowly Westbury in the league, they

Hamble Deliver Late Hammer Blow

Rylands Way, 5th September 2009

After going further than ever before in last year's FA Vase Wootton Bassett Town reverted to type, crashing out at the first attempt, as they lost 3-2 at home against Wessex League outfit Hamble ASSC.

Three defensive errors proved costly for Dave Turners side, with the game being decided in the dying stages. Jamie Musslewhite seized upon a mishit 87th minute Liam Edmundson clearance, playing a through ball to the dangerous Richard Gregory, who rounded Stewart Thompson before slotting the ball home despite Steve Groom valiant attempt to clear the ball away. Bassett had earlier taken the lead, albeit arguably against the run of play when Adam Field lobbed the onrushing John Webb with a controlled finish following an Alex Green flick on. The goal seemed unlikely moments earlier as Luke Sharps scuffed his free kick. But with the ball being helped on by a fortuitously positioned Marcus Hall, the ball eventually ended up in the top right corner of the net. Before that, Hamble had twice come close from dangerous Gregory deliveries. Firstly, his right wing free kick was met with a powerful header by Ricky Rawlings, but the ball sailed agonizingly wide. Then on the quarter hour mark his testing cross was headed back across goal by Jimmy Bull, but timely intervention from Chris Oram allowed the defender to head wide. Eventually, the visitors found the back of the net. After Bassett failed to clear their lines twice, the ball eventually popped up to an unmarked Musslewhite and he headed the ball into an unguarded net on 24 minutes. Then, just after the half hour mark. Oram got the wrong side of his man, and in a desperate attempt to prevent Musslewhite adding a second he handled inside the area, with the nearside linesmen alerting the referee to his transgression. The penalty was comfortably dispatched by James Roden, who sent Thompson the wrong way. Just before the break, Gregory once again delivered an inch perfect cross 2 this time from by-line 2 and once again Musselwhite was there on the end of it, but his glancing header lacked the power and direction to put it out of reach of Thompson.

Following the break, an acrobatic save from Thompson brilliantly denied Gregory after he had again got in behind the defence courtesy of a lofted pass from left back Rawlings. Taking advantage of this let off, a moment of inspiration from James Turner set up Frankie Hunt[®] coolly taken equaliser. The central midfielder gained possession just inside the visitor[®] half before muscling his way past three men. A deft reverse pass then set Hunt free, and the substitute coolly slid the ball past Webb. Bassett struggled to gather any momentum after the goal though, with Thompson[®] goal coming under increased pressure. The hosts were not helped by both Hunt and Jon Holloway hobbling off, leaving them with just nine men, having used their allotted substitutes. Musselwhite curled an 18-yard effort just wide of the left post before Ashley Wilson should have done better when he volleyed Gregory[®] right wing cross over from all of ten yards. The visitors eventually ensured extra time was not to be required though, and it was fitting that Gregory was rewarded for his outstanding contribution.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Steve Groom – another mature display at right back from the youngster.

Scoop Rating: 6/10 – after bowing down to their Wessex League opponents last week, Bassett took the fight to them this time around, but again defensive frailties proved their undoing.

Shaun Carter (defender)

Athletic and strong, Carter is a dominating force at centre back and this year rejoins the club from Shrivenham. He first appeared for Bassett during the 2008/09 season \Box moving alongside manager Dave Turner from Pewsey Vale \Box and was a rock at the heart of the Bassett defence, which was the second stingiest in Division One West after champions Hardwicke. Never one to shy away from speaking his mind, Carter exudes passion and made 44 appearances in his only season so far with the club, scoring twice. After spending his formative years in senior football at Cirencester Academy, Carter briefly joined Highworth Town before moving to Fairford Town for the 2004/05 season, appearing in 30 games, scoring once. Two years later he joined Turner at Pewsey, scoring four goals in 38 appearances in his first season. It was there he formed a strong partnership with fellow centre back Chris Oram, and in 2007/08 he played 34 times, scoring thoe goal, for a team who possessed the second best defensive record in the league. After helping achieve that feat a year later with Bassett, he joined Shrivenham with his brother Richie, but niggling injuries limited his playing time.





FROM THE ARCHIVES 1984-85

The return to league action saw Bassett go top thanks to their 5-2 win at Dorcan and Pinehursts home defeat against a strong Pewsey Vale side. Bassetts goal-getters were Smith, who scored a hat-trick, and Dixon, who netted a brace. With Clarkes side back in the goals and a trip to bottom side Shrewton United next up, Bassett would have been forgiven for expecting another comfortable victory. Instead though, the heretofore winless south Wiltshire side produced the shock result of the weekend as they won 3-1. The Monday October 15th 1984 edition of the Evening Advertiser carried the following report of the match:

Shock result of Division 2 was bottom club Shrewton's first win of the season at the expense of the top club Wootton Bassett. They won 3-1 with goals by Dave Cox and, after Bassett had equalised, from Stuart Withers and Colin Dable. Bassett's defeat let Pinehurst catch them on points and go to the top on goal difference after their 5-0 away win over Ferndale.

The to-in and fro-in at the top between Bassett and Pinehurst continued a week later though. The latter side drew with Old Manor, whilst goals from Smith and Flavell ensured a win by the odd goal in three at home against Burmah House to put Clarke soutfit at the head of the table by a mere point. Their lead at the summit was extended to two points a week later when Pinehurst could only draw at Walcot, whilst a battling display from 10-man Bassett secured a 2-1 victory away to Ferndale Athletic. Under the headline, *Bassetts heroic ten men battle to win the day*, the Monday October 29th 1984 edition of the Evening Advertiser carried the following description of the game:

Leaders Wootton Bassett took the lead in their away game with Ferndale through Roger Smith in the first half and were reduced to ten men, Graham Large, sustaining a cracked rib after they had used their substitute. Ian Nelson equalised for Ferndale but Gary Dixon came up with a 76th minute goal for Bassett s winner. It increased their lead to two points when the second, third, fourth and fifth teams all drew.

A tricky Wiltshire Senior Cup Preliminary Round home tie against Hellenic League Supermarine was up next for Bassett, and - despite giving their visitors a tough time, they were given an early elimination from the competition, going down by two goals to nil. Defeat did not seem to dent their confidence though going into a crunch clash at Rylands Way with Pinehurst. Goals from Danny Groom and John Small separated the two sides, leaving Bassett still on top, albeit on goal difference with Old Manor, who had played a game more, now in second.

December began with the chance to take revenge on Shrewton in the return fixture between the two sides, and that they did, winning 4-2. The December 3rd 1984 edition of the Evening Advertiser carried the following round up of the match:

Wootton Bassett were leaders in Division Two only by virtue of superior goal difference over second placed Old Manor. But, by winning 4-2 at home against Shrewton, they gave themselves a two point lead at the top. Gary Dixon (2), Danny

Season 1984-85 Two Tribes

What was going on in the world

The season kicked off with Frankie Goes to Hollywood at the top of the charts with Two Tribes and ends with Paul Hardcastle at number one with 19. The Christmas number one is Band Aid's Do They Know It's Christmas. In a season that sees Chelsea fans run riot after they lose to Sunderland in the Milk Cup semi-final, Norwich defeat Sunderland in the final of the competition. This is the season that sees 56 fans killed in the Bradford City fire inferno in the game against Lincoln City. Eighteen days later 38 spectators are killed in rioting on the terraces during the European Cup Final between Liverpool and Juventus at Heysel Stadium, Brussels. Everton win the Division 1 title but will not be able to take part in the European Cup due to the misbehaviour of their neighbour's fans. Oxford United win Division Two and are promoted to the top flight of English football. Manchester United win the FA Cup defeating Everton 1-0 after extra time despite Kevin Moran becoming the first player sent off in a FA Cup final. In October the IRA bomb the Brighton hotel that Margaret Thatcher and her cabinet are staying in for their party conference. Mohammad Al Fayed buys Harrods. The miners were on strike.

A season after making the jump from mid-table mediocrity to promotion candidates, Wootton Bassett Town took the logical next step in the 1984/85 season as they secured a return to Division One of the Wiltshire County League. And after achieving promotion, which would be manager Pete Clarke is parting gift, they would never look back.

The campaign began in perfect fashion with a 3-0 victory away against Marlborough Town thanks to a Doug Gee brace and a further Ken Regan strike. But they were to be given a rude awakening a week later in the opening game of the season at Rylands Way against Division Two new boys Old Manor, who triumphed 3-0.

However, from September till mid-October, Clarkes side were absolutely rampant in the league, the Old Manor defeat seemingly serving as a wakeup call for a Bassett side who promised much given their league performance a year earlier. A 5-0 thumping of Walcot started their winning streak. Gary Dixon, who would finish third top scorer in the league, netted his first two of the season, whilst Brian Fingleton, Kevin Bishop and Roger Bishop completed the rout. Ken Regan scored the only goal of the game a week later at home against Warminster Town Reserves, but the opposition net bulged five times again in the following match away to Burbage Sports, who would eventually finish second from bottom. Despite going behind, Bassett triumphed 5-2 thanks to an inspired Kevin Flavell, who scored a hat trick and goals from Regan and Roger Smith. In a scheduling quirk, the two sides met again a week later at Rylands Way, and again Bassett found themselves a goal down. But Flavell would again be a nightmare for Burbage, scoring twice, whilst a further goal from Gee secured a 3-1 victory that put Bassett second, level on points with undefeated Pinehurst, who had a superior goal difference. September finished with the First Round of the Ghia Senior Cup, which pitted Bassett against Marlborough. A disappointing 0-0 draw was fought out, forcing a replay that would eventually take place in mid-April!

Zamaretto Premier

Salisbury City and Chippenham Town have continued their good start to the season and after seven games both sit in the play-off places, Salisbury in 5th place and Chippenham Town one place below in 6th spot. Both remained unbeaten in their opening seven games with Chippenham having drawn one more game than their South Wiltshire rivals. Swindon Supermarine meanwhile sat in 12th place in the table.

Step 5

Hellenic Premier

Wootton Bassett Town have had an excellent start to the season and after a midweek home win over Wokingham & Emmbrook sat in third spot in the table with four wins from their opening six games. The only blemish was a 3-0 away defeat at Bracknell Town. Highworth have not fared so well with just two wins from their opening five league games and have also excited the FA Vase and the Floodlit cup. Both Hellenic Premier sides had, however, made it through to the First Qualifying Round of the FA Cup.

Wessex Premier

Bemerton Heath Harlequins have made a great start to the season and also sat in 3rd spot after their opening six games, with four wins to their credit. Laverstock and Ford meanwhile were down in 12th spot with two wins, one draw and two defeats from their opening five fixtures.

Hamble held after Turner[®] tactical triumph

Folland Park, 11th September 2010

Dave Turner put his chips down on black and came out a winner. Well, almost.

His decision to withdraw defender Liam Edmondson and replace him with midfielder Terry Adams eight minutes before half time, thus shifting from 4-4-2 to 3-5-2, seemed slightly baffling at the time considering the constant pressure his side were being put under. However, it certainly paid dividends in Wootton Bassett Towns FA Cup first qualifying round tie with Hamble ASSC as the transition coincided with the visitors coming back into the game, allowing them to ultimately force a replay against the Wessex Premier side following a hard-fought 1-1 draw.

Prior to the change, Bassett had been decisively outplayed by Hamble and were fortunate to have found themselves just a goal down going into half time. Luckily, all but one of the hosts dangerous attacking quartet, containing James Musselwhite, Jamie Barron, Richard Gregory and James Roden, seemed to have forgotten their shooting boots. In the opening five minutes a long ball over the top caught the visitors out, and Musselwhite squared to an unmarked Roden, who scuffed wide from the edge of the area. On the quarter hour mark, he had another fantastic opportunity to break the deadlock, but saw his effort cannon off the bar following great link up play between Musselwhite and left winger Gregory. A goal seemed almost inevitable at this point and it finally came from Musselwhite, who bundled home after a Gregory corner had not been cleared properly. After the ball had been recycled, keeper Adam Miles was beaten to the ball, and despite a half hearted attempt to clear it off the line the forward was able to poke home. Barron was then denied by a point-blank save from Miles after being set free before Lloyd Webbers side-foot volley was hacked off the line by Matty Bown following a Gregory corner on the stroke of half time.

After soaking up so much pressure, Bassett finally got themselves into the match after the restart. Helping the cause was the fact that with the addition of Adams, they finally were able to enjoy possession in the centre of the park. But initially this was not converted into clear cut chances, the final ball being elusive, and Hamble continued to threaten at the other end. However, neither Roden, Musselwhite nor Ashley Jarvis could locate the target when presented with an opening.

On 65 minutes, Bassetts persistence was finally rewarded when Jon Beeden, leaping to try connect with a Ryan Banks cross, received a shove to the back, thus earning a penalty. Confident as you could be, he dusted himself off and emphatically drilled the ball home to equalise to bag his fourth goal of the season, the third of which has come from twelve vards. The introduction of Ethan Delanev then further sparked Bassett into life. Unable to cope with the young livewires pace, the home defence became increasingly suspect. Yet, indecisiveness with the ball in the final third meant Jon Webb was not tested as much as he could have been. Often, Delaney would be left with just defender Webber, by no means fleet of foot, between him and the home keeper, but instead of driving onwards he would cut inside or wait for support, allowing the hosts to recover. As the clock wound down though, and with both sides looking to avoid having to play an extra ninety minutes, chances to win the game emerged. For Hamble, Gregory side-footed wide from the edge of the area after Barron had rolled marker Craig Bowden and squared to the unmarked winger. Then, substitute Paul West cut inside from the left wing, before firing a low effort from 30 yards that had Miles beaten. Fortunately though the ball rattled the near upright and was swept to safety by Shaun Carter. It was Bassett who would have the final, and perhaps best chance, to seal a historic victory. In injury time, having rode a challenge, Banks split the defence with a through ball to Sean Bailey. With just Webb to beat, the odds seemed stack in favour of the midfielder scoring, but instead he struck straight at the keeper, who parried the ball away.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Adam Miles – a confident display between the sticks despite the barrage of chances the hosts had. In the first half, his day was not made easy thanks to the nervy performance of those in front of him and his point-blank save from James Roden was particularly impressive.

Scoop Rating: 7/10 – Bassett showed an immense amount of character and resolve in the second half after a poor showing in the opening period. Dave Tuner's gamble in withdrawing a defender so early turned out to be a shrewd move that stemmed the flow of Hamble chances and allowed his side to gain a foothold in the match.





It is understand this problem, which occurs on a regular basis, will be reviewed before next season. Failure to do so will result in clubs such as Holyport and Milton United who play in the same Hellenic Division and other clubs as they install facilities that comply with entry into the national competitions. Should such clubs gain promotion to the UHLSPORT Hellenic Premier Division the B&B FA recognises this achievement and would allow entry into the Senior Challenge Trophy which is under subscribed with clubs whereas the B&B Intermediate competition is very much over scribed with a club having to play at least SIX matches to obtain a place in the latter rounds. Something needs to be done to ensure that ALL clubs are able to play in the respective County FA Competition appropriate to their position in the football pyramid and National League System. Clubs such as Holyport deserve this recognition!


