EDITORIAL

Good evening and welcome back to Rylands Way for this UhlSport Hellenic Football League Premier Division fixture against Kidlington. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from Kidlington who have made the journey from Oxfordshire for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home.

Tonights fixture sees us return to league action after a couple of weeks of cup action in the FA national competitions. The FA Cup dream finally came to an end after we took Hamble ASSC to a replay. Eventually we lost out to the Hampshire side for the second season running in a national cup competition, the 2-0 FA Cup defeat joining last seasons FA Vase loss here at Rylands. Despite the loss the £2,250 prize money from the competition will come in very handy given the need to fund a new stand by the season end. On the subject of prize money the 4-0 away win at Devizes Town on Saturday brought in another £900 and a trip to meet Bristol side Cadbury Heath in the next round of the competition. The date for the next round of the Vase is Saturday 2nd October. One impact of all these cup games and in particular the couple of replays we have had to endure in the FA Cup is that we are now up to four games behind other sides in the division with our league fixtures and have dropped a few places in the table. Please note that last weeks postponed trip to Ascot has now been rescheduled to 20th October.

Looking at what is in tonights programme, the From the Archives feature this week has a slightly different look as, rather than focusing on a particular season, looks back on the First Team managers of the Club over the last thirty odd years. A big thank you to Scoop for this feature and also to young Luke Walduck for the Youth Section round-up. If only we could get more content from those in key positions at the Club to include in the programme. Once again the only official contribution for the programme from those in positions at the Club has come from First Team Manager Dave Turner in his From The Dugout Section (thanks again Dave for finding the time each week).

The Player Profile this week features Sean Bailey. The August edition of the Clubs newsletter Touchline is once again featured and Moonraker again looks at the local football in Wiltshire. There is no Dream Team feature this week as I have run out of submissions and instead have added a Word Search. The Dream Team feature will return if I receive some more submissions from either fans, players or officials. There is the usual updated league table of the Clubs own Fantasy Football League, whilst World of Soccer includes a letter from one of our spectators to the FA (do not worry Rod the letter was intercepted before it could be sent!).

The Reserves are next up at Rylands Way when they entertain Cheltenham Saracens Reserves this coming Saturday. A week on Thursday and the Under 18 Floodlit side play their first home game of the season when they entertain Pewsey Vale. The Under 18s will be looking to continue their good start to the season which sees them at the top of the league. No game on the Saturday at Rylands with, as noted above, the First Team away at Cadbury Heath but on the Sunday the Ladies side play host to Tetbury Town. The next home First Team fixture is on Tuesday 5th October when Witney United are the visitors in the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup. It will be interesting to see our attitude to this competition this season as we are capable of winning it and it brings with it some further potential prize money. We clearly will not win the Premier League this season so perhaps this is a competition we will target this year. Over to the management team. Enjoy the game and heres to three more league points for Wootton Bassett Town.

A SUPPORTERS LETTER TO THE FA

Dear The Football Association,

While your flagship cup competition is the oldest, greatest and noblest football contest on the planet, it has come to my attention that the FA Cup, as well as the FA Vase, appears to be fixed so as to deny the club I support, Wootton Bassett Town, from progressing too far.

You may think this is an outlandish, ridiculous claim. However, the body of evidence that supports it continues to grow year upon year. While there have been occasions on which Bassett have been eliminated from both competitions by Hellenic and Western League sides, it is the frequency with which the clubs cup runs have been terminated by teams belonging to the Wessex League that give large reason for suspicion.

Beginning with our crushing 4-1 FA Vase defeat to Bemerton Heath Harlequins during the 2003/04 season, on no fewer than *eight* occasions have sides from this league put Bassett out. In addition to the Salisbury-based side, Christchurch (FA Vase, 2005/06), Brockenhurst (FA Cup 2007/08 and 2009/10), Bournemouth Poppies (FA Vase, 2007/08), Wimborne Town (FA Vase 2008/09) and Hamble ASSC (FA Vase 2009/10 and FA Cup 2010/11) have all ended our dreams of an extended cup run, let alone a trip to the magnificent stadium of yours at Wembley.

On three occasions, versus Christchurch, Brockenhurst and Hamble ASSC, Bassett have been knocked out in replays, but this does nothing to deter me from believing there is something untoward occurring whenever the draws are being made. In fact, I have great reason to believe that your association and those clubs are ensuring a draw occurs now and again in an attempt to cover up what you are together conspiring to achieve (i.e. the elimination of the club which I support by constantly having to play rich Wessex League sides).

Unlike these clubs, Bassett are in fact in need of the prize money such competitions offer. While not being the English version of Beirut, the standard of living in our town (except for the Big House that our Head Of Youth Section lives in) pales in comparison to that in the towns and villages in which these sides play. Evidence of this are the yachts on the marinas in both Christchurch and Hamble and the large country houses situated in and around Brockenhurst. Compare these to our humble abode in Rylands Way.

Therefore, we demand that in future on no occasion will Wootton Bassett Town be paired with a side from the Wessex League, and that this hideous crime being perpetrated against us be stopped. Instead, we insist on being matched up with a team from either the Hellenic or Western Leagues, preferably the former because the sense of occasion is not as big when a team plays one from its own league in a national competition. Heck, in the FA Cup we as a club would be more than happy with playing a Southern League club, after all, we have a 100% winning record against them!

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Kidlington FC • Club History

Kidlington FC was founded in 1909 and played local village football up to WW2. Success was slow in coming, records show their first trophy was achieved in 1929 in the Lord Jersey Cup Final against Fritwell. The Lord Jersey Cup was a competition highly prized among the villages in the Cherwell Valley; rivalry was so keen that players had to prove they were residents of the village for whom they played



In 1945, Kidlington moved from village football to play in the Oxford City Junior League, with a good deal of success in both league and cup. By 1951 the Oxfordshire Senior League was entered, where stronger competition was provided by the likes of Witney Town; Morris Motors; Pressed Steel & Thame United.

In 1953 The Hellenic League formed, the Oxon Senior League immediately lost some of its stronger clubs to the new league. Kidlington won the Senior League title that next season, joining the new league in 1954. Early days in the Hellenic League showed quite clearly the difference in standard. Kidlington maintained a Premier Division place for a time, but spent most of the 60's in Division One. The 70's started with winning the County Intermediate Cup Final, along with two further County final places in the decade. Both epic battles against a very talented Peppard side, who won on both occasions.

A squad of good young players produced Kidlington's best ever run in an F.A. competition, when in 1976-77. Having played every round but one away from home, Kidlington reached the last 16 in the FA Vase, bowing out to Gosport Borough. The nucleus of this side eventually gained promotion back to the Premier Division in 1979-80.

The 80's saw Kidlington return to Division One, the County Cup produced few consistent performances, other than in 1983-84 when Kidlington were 5 minutes away from a place in the final. The early 90's were steady. Season 94-95 brought silverware at last, Martin Bakers' Reserves side did the League/Cup double. An upturn in the first team fortunes occurred when Karl Grossmann assembled a formidable tough tackling side, finishing in the top 6 of Division One in four successive seasons.

The new millennium brought with it a major overhaul to the committee and a new Chairman in Geoff Talboys. In 2004-05, under the guidance of Kevin Walton the first team finish in third place, with it promotion back into the Hellenic Premier Division. With promotion came a struggle with the considerable difference in the standard of football compared to Division One, losing the first twelve games. The season petered out in frustration as the team finished in a relegation position ... however a national non-league re-structure saved them from the dreaded drop.

In 2007 - 2008, first team silverware arrived at Yarnton Road for the 1st time in over 30 years, winning the Floodlit Trophy under the guidance of manager Paul Lee. With additional honours this year from the Reserves, who won Reserve Division One for a second consecutive season, The Youth winning the Oxfordshire U18 Youth Cup, and to cap the season Kidlington Vet's retained their Veteran League crown.

In season 2009-10 we have a new Chairman, Lloyd Wray, and new team management, ex-player Gordon Geary has been recruited to look after 1st team affairs and Barry Hiles will be running our Reserve team.

For this season 2010-11 ex-player Gordon Geary will be in his second season as manager of our 1st team and again Barry Hiles will be running the Reserves.

Bakes missed the last few months of last season with injury, but now fully fit and as fast as ever, he's raring to go again. A superb competitor & example to his team mates.



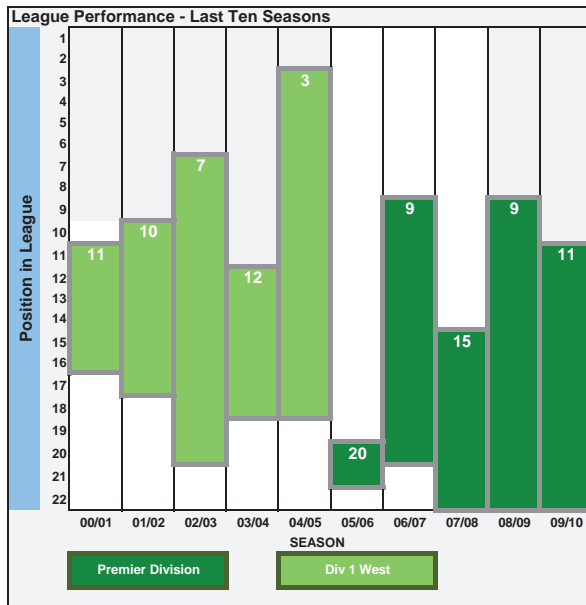
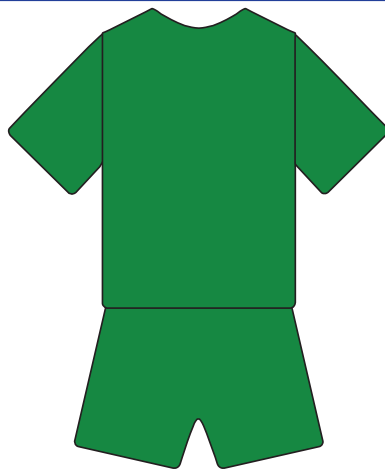
Luke Holden Forward

Mick Woolford	1985-1995	<p>Undoubtedly the most decorated manager in Wootton Bassett Town history, Woolford spent a decade in charge at Rylands Way. Taking over after the club's promotion to Division One of the Wiltshire County League, the former Swindon Town player delivered Hellenic League football in 1987/88 in his third season in charge as Bassett stormed to the County League title. That season Bassett also finished as Wiltshire Senior Cup runners-up after losing to Purton in the final. In Hellenic League Division One, Woolford's side made an immediate impact, finishing 5th in their first year before beating Milton United 2-1 in the 1989/90 Division One Cup final. Under his guidance, Bassett successfully established themselves at a level they had never before reached, and in 1993/94 they once triumphed in the Division One Cup, beating Pegasus Juniors in a replay. A year later in his final season, he guided the team to the final of that competition again, but lost 4-1 to Ardley United. Upon standing down, Woolford was immediately appointed a life member of the club</p>

That same season Bassett became the first Division Two side to win the Ghia Senior Cup as they thrashed Sanford 4-0 in the final. However, a year later the club narrowly missed out on promotion to the Hellenic Premier, ultimately finishing 5th. Triumph in the Wiltshire Senior Cup for the first time more than made up for this though, as Pewsey Vale were beaten 3-2 after extra time in a dramatic final at the County Ground.</p>

Tearle Wonder goal and Thompson Wonder save give Bassett Historical Win

Rylands Way, Saturday 4th October v Kidlington

An exquisite chip from Phil Tearle to beat the Kidlington keeper in the second period of extra-time followed by a Stewart Thompson penalty save saw Wootton Bassett Town through to the Second Round Proper of the F.A. Vase for the first time in the Club's history. It was fitting that, in the week that the move to the new ground came closer to reality, it was a product of the Club's expanding Youth Section who scored the winning goal in this important money spinning match. Tearle has played for the Club since he was an Under 10 and is seen by the many youngsters who currently play for the Club's youth set-up as an inspirational figure who has shown that if you are good enough the door to the First Team is open to you.

In front of a healthy Rylands Way crowd Bassett started the game well and went in front courtesy of a well taken goal from another youngster, Lee Moulton on 19 minutes. Following a flowing passing move the ball came to Moulton on the left of the box, he cut inside and put the ball into the far corner of the net giving the Kidlington keeper no chance. A cool finish for a youngster who continues to impress down the left hand side of Bassett's midfield. Bassett extended the lead on a minute later when a penalty was awarded for a foul on Ryan Banks. With regular penalty taker Steve Yeardley away running the Great North Run it fell to top scorer Shaun Terry to take the kick. Memories of the missed penalty in the earlier round at Buckingham came flooding back but this time Terry made no mistake and fired the kick into the net. Missing match reporter Scoop was duly sent a text advising of the second goal and it took two more such texts to convince him; yes Shaun had scored a penalty! 2-0 to Bassett at the break and in reality Bassett had dominated play with the back three of Chris Oram, Shaun Carter and Luke Sharps giving the Kidlington strikers little opportunity in front of goal and the midfield, particularly Tom Richie and Richie Carter in the centre, working tirelessly to close down the Kidlington players, including former Wycombe Wanderers and Doncaster Rovers pro Jermaine McSpornan.

The second half saw Kidlington come out all guns blazing but despite a lot of possession and neat passing football Bassett held onto the two goal lead. However, a harshly awarded free-kick on the edge of the 18 yard box allowed Morgan Williams to fire a free kick into the back of Stewart Thompson's net to make it 2-1 on 50 minutes. Chris Oram and Shaun Carter continued to deny the lively Kidlington strikers but Bassett were to suffer a setback on 79 minutes just as they thought they were going to get the win. Bassett were slow to react to a ball down the left which allowed Mark Flanagan to get away and bear down on the Bassett goal and Flanagan fired a powerful low drive past Stewart Thomson to send the game into extra-time.

Just when thoughts were turning to a replay on Tuesday up stepped substitute Tearle and that cheeky wonder goal. A ball over the top saw Tearle race away from the Kidlington defence and as the Kidlington keeper came out he deftly chipped the ball over him and into the empty net, cue celebrations not seen at Rylands Way for many a year. However, within a minute the euphoria had gone as Shaun Carter handled the ball in the Bassett box and the referee pointed to the spot. Time for a second hero of the day to come forward. Kidlington's striker fired the penalty low to the left of keeper Stewart Thomson, but Thompson had guessed the right way and pulled off a magnificent save. In the second period of extra time Kidlington pushed forward in search of an equaliser but left themselves vulnerable to the break. One such occasion saw Shaun Terry do the difficult bit of turning his defender on the edge of the box and with the keeper way off his line the opportunity was there to put the result beyond doubt but his curled shot just went the wrong side of the post. Bassett survived a late scare but clung on for the history making win that sends them into the last 128 in this prestigious national competition. The £1,000 prize money will have gone down well in the Committee Room.

Man of the Match: Tom Richie / Richie Carter – tremendous work rate in centre midfield and difficult to pick one out.

Rating (using the famous Scoop scale): 9/10 – a great team effort from start to finish. Bassett dominated first half but in second half it was the visitors led by Jermaine McSpornan who put Bassett under pressure in the second half but the work levels never dropped and a deserved win in an excellent game of football.

Cricklade were 6-0 winners on Saturday a result which lifted them up into 3rd spot in the table. The three remaining Wiltshire sides all reside in the bottom five. Malmesbury Vics, predicting promotion at the start of the season have just one point from their opening five games, hardly promotion form Ken. The bottom three have already been cut adrift with a six point gap to Trowbridge Town and Purton, both of whom have seven points.

Wessex Division One

Downton and Pewsey Vale occupy the top two positions in the table. Whilst Downton were drawing with Hallen in the FA Vase, Pewsey Vale missed the chance to really close the gap on the leaders when they were held to a 0-0 draw at home to Ringwood Town. Warminster Town and Amesbury Town are still both struggling at the bottom end of the table, with one win a piece to their name.

The only unbeaten side in the Premier Division are Wilts Calne Town with eight wins and two draws from their opening ten fixtures. Two points were dropped on Saturday as they drew with lowly Wilton Town. This allowed Purton Redhouse to move within a point of the leaders following a 2-1 win at Marlborough Town. FC Sanford continue to dominate Division One with a 100% record from their opening ten games.

Clinical Hamble curtail cup hopes

Rylands Way, 14th September 2010

Wootton Bassett Town's hopes of an inaugural place in the second qualifying round of the FA Cup were extinguished by Hamble ASSC, whose clinical finishing proved the difference in an extremely tight replay which the Wessex Premier Division outfit edged by two goals to nil.

Over the two games that determined who Old Woodstock Town would face, the Hampshire outfit were undoubtedly the better of the two sides, but Dave Turner's side turned in a valiant, improved display at Rylands Way, and – had it not been for their lack of end product – could well have taken the game.

Indeed, they were the first of the two sides to pose a threat, with Liam Edmondson seeing a glancing header hooked off the line in the second minute following a well worked short corner between Matty Bown and Jon Beeden. Then, the latter's left-wing cross was only half cleared to Bown, who cut inside onto his left foot and saw his half volley from the edge of the area go agonizingly wide.

The visitors' potency in attack – evident in abundance during the drawn contest on Saturday – first reared its head just before the quarter hour mark when a sudden burst of pace from Jamie Barron enabled him to fly past Richie Carter and fashion an opening. However, his curling effort took a deflection before being gloved wide by Adam Miles.

Ten minutes later though they had the lead. Sean Bailey failed to deal with a switch of play, the ball skidding beneath his foot on the slick surface, affording Richard Gregory a free run at Beeden down the right.

Whilst the young defender is by no means slow, the electrifying pace of the Hamble winger was too much for him, and Gregory swung in a ball that fell perfectly for an unmarked James Musselwhite to head in at the far post.

The lead should have lasted for all of seven minutes when Alex Green, narrowly beating the visitors' offside trap, latched onto a Ryan Banks flick on, leaving the forward with just John Webb to beat. But the 'keeper kept his composure and was able to parry Green's effort away for a corner.

Bassett continued to threaten after the restart, but couldn't find the magic touch. Twice in the space of a minute Bailey came close after his clever movement created openings. Firstly, Green cut the ball back to the winger, who had drifted away from his marker and into a prime position ten yards out. However, he failed to keep the ball down and sent his first time effort over.

He then found himself on the end of a cross from the deep from Edmondson, and after taking a touch struck at goal on the bounce from twelve yards but could only drag the ball wide.

On the hour, Hamble made Bassett pay for their missed opportunities, scoring what was a sloppy second. A testing free kick from the deep was not properly cleared, and Beeden skewed a header back into the danger area where Barron was lurking, and the tricky attacking midfielder prodded home from close range to double his side's advantage.

Demonstrating the team's character, Bassett did not fall apart and continued to press for the goal that would open the game back up. With fifteen minutes remaining, a looping header from Green sailed narrowly over before a low effort on the turn from Collier forced an outstretched Webb to tip wide.

With seven minutes remaining the visitors were inexplicably reduced to ten men when substitute Chris Morris was dismissed for headbutting Ryan Banks in an off-the-ball incident. He then proceeded to take his frustrations out on the away team dressing room door after he had to be restrained from confronting a fan positioned behind the goal his side were defending.

His was the only Hamble head to be lost though, and they were able to see out the rest of the game without any further trouble thanks to their well organised, stingy defence.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Liam Edmondson – was a figure of force along the Bassett backline and dealt well with what Hamble threw at him.

Scoop Rating: 6/10 – the difference between the two sides come full time was the standard of their finishing. The two goal margin of defeat was not as emphatic as it may sound and Hamble were certainly given a good run for their money.



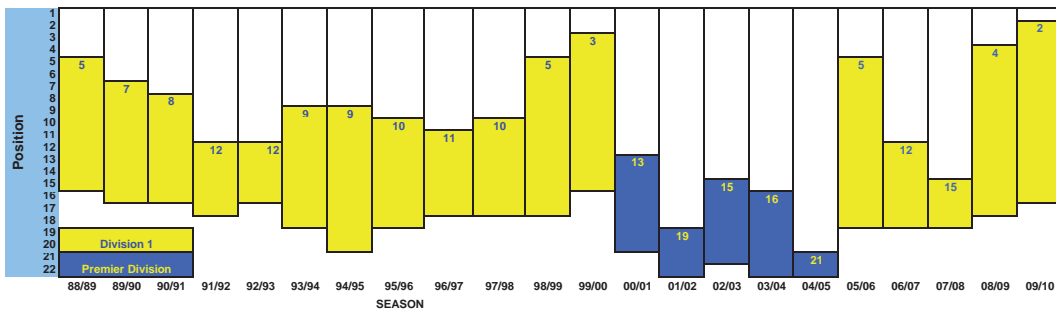
