Whilst Wootton Bassett Town were going down to a last minute defeat in the FA Vase yours truly was enjoying another fantastic game of football down at Selhurst Park watching my beloved Queens Park Rangers. After an end to end game, just as it looked as we had the three points wrapped up, we allowed Crystal Palace back into the game with a goal a minute from time. Now a lot of teams would have settled for that one point but such is the confidence of Neil Warnocks side rather than settle for a useful away point the Rangers immediately attacked to try and regain the lead and were rewarded with all three points with an injury time headed winner from Heider Helguson. Cue mass celebrations as the six point lead at the top of the Championship was maintained. With eight clean sheets in ten games and a goal difference of plus twenty one it certainly is a good time to be a QPR fan at the moment. The tremendous form cannot go on forever but I am certainly enjoying the moment.

What the start to the season has highlighted what a good man manger Neil Warnock is and the team spirit amongst the players is the best I have ever seen, even better than the high spots of Ian Holloways reign. Seeing players go out of the way to give substituted players a high-five as they leave the pitch; all the players congratulating each other at the end of the game and all players making sure they go and applaud the fans demonstrates the great spirit of togetherness amongst fans and players alike. The appointment of first Fitz Hall and then Adel Taarabt as captain was a master stroke of man management seeing how both have performed when fit and playing. The talking up in the press of Heider Helguson by Warnock has also resulted in another player finally showing what a good player he really is, with Helguson currently one of six QPR players in the top eleven performers in the Championship (per the ACTIM index). The team as a whole work so hard and it is certainly paying off in terms of results and long may it continue but shows more than anything what you can do with a bit .

Now here at Wootton Bassett Town manager Dave Turner has also been successful in generating a good team spirit amongst the players. Firstly this was rewarded with last seasons promotion following a top two finish and has been carried over to the good start made this season. Many of the pundits on the mass debating forum that is the Hellenic League Chat room had Wootton Bassett Town down as strong relegation candidates due to the lack of any budget and, whilst there is a long way to go, the start has certainly been encouraging and we continue to hold our own at this level. As long as the team spirit can be maintained, this Bassett team will, in my view, finish at least midway in the table.

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Witney United FC • Club History

Witney in Oxfordshire, made world famous for its production of blankets, is a thriving market town and with over 22,000 residents it is the largest town in West Oxfordshire. The town of Witney dates back to AD969 and gained its name from the Saxon term 'Witan' that meant King. Witney United FC (WUFC) was formed by a group of Witney Town supporters following the demise of their beloved club. Intent on bring senior football back to the town the group registered Witney United FC with the Oxfordshire Football Association in 2001.



For almost a year they had little else other than the name! There was no ground, team or manager. That year was all about raising funds and the profile of the club. The club set itself a challenging business plan that targeted a return to Southern League football within 5 seasons. Finally after much hard work it all came together.

In 2002 WUFC gained a lease on the original Witney Town stadium and were accepted into Division One (West) of the Hellenic League. In it's first year the Club struggled to attract local players and finally finished 15th in the Division.

The second season saw the club move forward finally finishing the season in 4th place and gaining a surprise, last minute, offer of promotion to the Premier Division.

The challenge of promotion was compounded by the fact that the Club would start it's third ever season with it's third ever manager! But under the management team of Alan Clark, Steve Paish and Spencer Keyes the team proved it could hold it's own - finally finishing a creditable 11th out of 22. The Club also competed, for the first time, in the F.A. Vase winning through the first three rounds - eventually losing to Deal Town away. Further success was achieved in the Oxfordshire Senior Cup where Witney finally fell to Oxford City in the semi-finals.

The 2005/06 season saw United enter the FA Cup for the first time and were very unlucky to bow out after a replay against Southern League high-fliers Clevedon Town. The FA Vase brought similar disappointment as they went out to Truro City at the second hurdle.

In October 2005 Alan Clark resigned as 1st Team Manager and Spencer Keyes stepped up from Assistant Manager to replace him. Spencer's first management move was to recruit Pete Lamont as his No2. The side went from strength to strength and a top 6 finish was claimed on the very last day of the season to round off an excellent season.

United entered 2006/07 with a certain amount of optimism as the bid to bring Southern League football back to West Oxfordshire. A lack of consistency and too many draws saw them slip away from the leading pack and eventually finish 6th for the second season running. The club did however reach the Challenge Cup Final before losing 2-1 to Hungerford Town.

In the close season Keyes stood down as Manager and United moved quickly to appoint Andy Lyne. Lyner had two spells as manager at Witney Town in the nineties and his homecoming was well received by the fans who hoped he could work his magic for a third time at Marriotts Stadium. This saw United have their best ever season since formation finishing an excellent 4th place in the league and pushing the promotion contenders for long periods of the season. The 2008-09 season saw United go one better finishing in 3rd place in one of the tightest title run ins for years whilst also reaching the last 32 of the FA Vase.

 Another player to progress from the clubs successful title winning youth team. Clever player with a terrific appetite for the game.



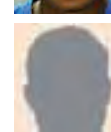
John Rixon Midfield

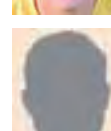
Cameron Lagan Forward

 Former youth team player who has returned to the club this season looking to make the step up from Oxfordshire Senior League Side Chadlington.

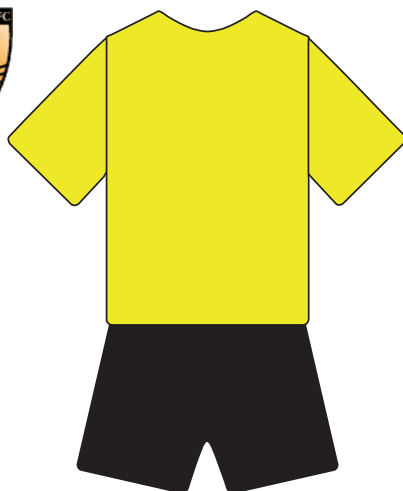


Mell Dean Physio

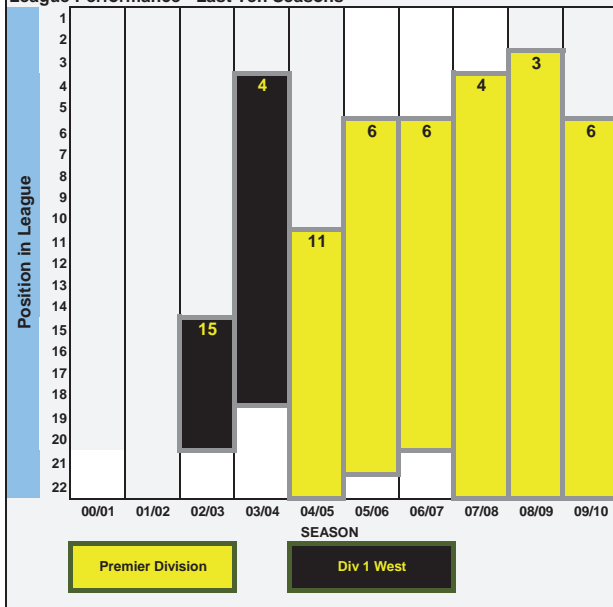

defence. Their best chance of the half came when a Harry Burnley shot was not dealt with, but luckily for Bassett, it sped past the far post. Bassett were let off again on 34 minutes when North Leigh captain Gary Murphy hit wide. Bassett had two further chances before the half time whistle. On forty minutes a Dave Jones free kick dipped just over from 30 yards and a minute later Geoff Swatton hit over again following a good Justin Hyde run. Bassett were the better team in the first half and had numerous chances to take the lead, most falling to Swatton and Dave Jones but the game remained without a goal at the break.

Bassett, again, were the team who got off to the best start in the second half. Two minutes after the restart, Gascoyne had a good chance but missed following a Swatton cross. On fifty minutes, another Swatton ball led to the best chance of the game at that point, as Danny Clayton hit both the bar and post. Bassett continued to press and in the 53rd minute Gascoyne was felled in the box and a penalty awarded. The spot-kick though, was missed as Stu Lamont failed to convert with Kevin Alder saving the weak kick. Bassett were still searching for an opening and were given a scare on the hour mark when Darren Maisey put through Matty Ellis who was just beaten to the ball by oncoming keeper Rich Stevens. Bassett were lucky not to go down to ten men a minute later when Hyde was booked for raising his hands at an opposition player. Bassett were on the back foot at this point and were let off once again due to excellent defending by Steve Yeardley and Stevens, who pressured Nick Hughes, who placed his shot wide. Jones put Swatton through in the 69th minute but unfortunately he hit the post. The game was getting aggressive by this stage and referee Tony Sharkey was having trouble controlling the players. January Player of the Month Stevens saved Bassett again in the 71st minute by pulling off an awesome save to deny Nick Hughes a certain goal. At the other end Swatton was denied again when Alder pulled off another great save to thwart the lively striker. Substitute Gary Ashford then had an immediate impact as he headed Swatton clear of the North Leigh defence and the forward scored a superb goal following a twenty yard run and powerful shot. North Leigh threw everything but the kitchen sink at Bassett in the closing stages but were unsuccessful due to more brilliant defending.

Victory lifted Bassett into 15th, a relatively comfortable six points clear of the drop zone, but a six game winless skid followed, beginning with a 2-0 home loss to local rivals Highworth Town. Didcot Town were run close in a 2-1 loss, but, after elimination by Calne Town in the County Cup, Bassett hit another low when they were thumped 6-0 at Yate Town. Five were then conceded without reply at Didcot, but this was something of a blessing in disguise given that it signalled elimination from the Supplementary Cup.

With concentration now firmly squared on the league, an upturn in form followed that would lift Bassett into a position of relative safety. It began with a valiant defensive display that earned a point at home to Yate in a goalless draw before a Dave Jones brace capped off a fine display at Bicester that saw the hosts downed by three goals to one. A single goal defeat at Highworth followed before a 2-1 home win over Bishops Cleeve avenged for the earlier season embarrassment. Tony Macek and Gascoyne, against his future employers, were Bassetts protagonists. The latter was on target twice, alongside fellow young prospect Ben Jarrett, four days later in a vital 3-1 win at Gloucester United.

This was to be the last win of the season, but with ten games left Bassett were comfortably above being drafted into a relegation dogfight in 13th place. An emphatic 5-1 reverse at Southall brought the run to its end, before relegation-bound Wantage Town won by a single goal at Rylands Way. A point was then earned in a goalless draw at Abingdon on a day notable for the return of CJ O'Connell to first team action after a devastating car crash a year and a half earlier. Following the draw, four games were lost on the spin, including back-to-back games against near neighbours Fairford Town. The season petered out with consecutive 1-1 draws, the first at Tuffley before a late goal from April Player of the Month O'Connell held visitors Almondsbury, and a 3-2 defeat at Henley.

The ten game winless streak was a disappointing way to end what had been a promising season, but with relegation out of the question come the business end of the season, it mattered little.

Bassett Beaten Again by Late Saunders Strike

Marriots Stadium, 13th November 2004

Ritchie Saunders dealt Bassett another big blow as he struck with five minutes left to go to give Witney United a 2-1 victory.

A weakened Bassett side took the lead inside three minutes when John Magani finished off a great run, smashing the ball into the top corner past Sean Purcell after great work down the left by Geoff Swatton.

Stu Hemsley was then booked for Bassett on the quarter hour mark for a late foul on Tom Dingle.

Tom Messenger nearly gifted the equaliser to Witney in the 23rd minute as he sent a looping ball back to Ian Gill and Gill tipped wide.

A mistake by Steve Yeardley three minutes later gave Tom Smith a chance but his shot went just wide.

Bassett however had the better of the chances leading up to half time. In the 29th minute, Matt Bennett struck over from a Geoff Swatton reverse pass before Witney levelled up.

John McMahon connected with a deep free kick from Toby Fowler and McMahon's header looped over Gill who was caught off his line.

Six minutes before half time ex-Witney midfielder Steve Bunting beat Purcell but his shot rattled off the bar after Bunting received a cross from Chris Mills on the edge of the area which was meant to find the box.

On 44 minutes, a long punt from Ian Gill found Matt Bennett racing through but Purcell parried away Bennetts powerful strike.

Purcell was booked in stoppage time for dissent, and the Witney keeper was lucky not to receive his marching orders.

Things got physical in the second half with referee Robert Dunn making a meal of some decisions.

Bassett scorer John Magani should have received red for throwing a punch at Mitch Wyatt but both received yellows and then Tom Messenger was elbowed in the face and the referee failed to reach for his pocket.

Messenger was brought off injured because of this as Dave Tyler replaced him.

In the 73rd minute, McMahon was booked for Witney after pushing Steve Yeardley to the floor by his throat, another obvious red card offence.

A minute later, Mark King replaced Steve Bunting before Gill made a double save to deny Witney.

Gill parried a shot from Gary Wright only for Wyatt to head the ball towards goal and Gill brilliantly turned the ball over the crossbar.

Dunns day in the middle went from bad to worse as he booked Andy Hallett for a challenge in which the Bassett defender won the ball before Ash Bradshaw replaced Magani.

Bassett paid the price for some poor defending five minutes from time as substitute Saunders struck, driving the ball into the bottom corner from fifteen yards out after Bassett failed to clear from a Witney corner.

Scoops Man of the Match: Chris Mills - did a brilliant job at the back, looked comfortable on the ball and solid in the tackle all the while playing out of position.

Scoop Rating: 7/10 - A great performance but two more goals from set pieces cost Bassett. Were the better side on the day and should have beat poor opponents.

Twice caretaker manager, firstly alongside Barry Giles during the 2004/05 season that saw Bassett relegated from the Hellenic Premier Division, before being in charge for the final month of the 2007/08 campaign, Chris originally joined the club as manager of the Under 18 Floodlit League team. In 2005 he led that side to the final of the Wiltshire Youth Cup, and during his spell in charge groomed a number of youngsters who have stepped up to play for the first team. He is currently Head of the Senior Section at Rylands Way.

At the start of the second half Shortwood brought on Craig Cole. Why he didn't start I do not know, as he made a huge difference. However, Bassett scored, at last, in the 52nd minute; a Bassett corner was not cleared and Swatton shot on the turn and beat Thomas low down to the keeper's left. Shortwood now came back at Bassett, with Cole at the forefront. He was causing Bassett no end of trouble, Shortwood were playing through him. Stevens was called on more and more but proved sound. On 82 minutes Shortwoods pressure paid off as that man Cole lay on a perfect ball for Rich Evans to beat Stevens. In the 84th minute Bassett brought on Ben Gascoyne for Gary Ashford, and what a substitution it proved to be as he scored Bassett's winner in the 87th minute. A blistering shot by Swatton was only parried by Thomas and young Gascoyne was on hand to knock the ball in. The last seconds saw Adam Thomas bring off a superb save from Swatton to deny Bassett a third goal. All in all it was an excellent Bassett performance; a good, exciting game for the spectators and three points for Pete and Mike.

Following defeat at North Leigh (0-4) and a gritty 1-1 draw at home to Pewsey, Bassett returned to cup action with their Floodlit Cup quarter final against Division One East title chasers Finchampstead. And following a stunning 6-0 win, highlighted by a superb hat-trick from Geoff Swatton, Yeardeleys side began to sniff the possibility of success. The first leg of the semi final against Brackley was scheduled for a week later, but before that Bassett returned to league action, and in a controversial match held on for a point at Carterton thanks to a Swatton brace, despite being reduced to ten men. Referee Bert Barry was the centre of attention that afternoon at Kilkenny Lane, something which would happen again a couple of seasons later. There was to be no such luck in Northamptonshire though, Rob Days goal proving scant consolation as Bassett gave themselves a mountain to climb in the second leg following a 5-1 defeat. Clanfield were then defeated 2-0 in the Supplementary Cup, a competition which was being used by the manager to blood youngsters such as Gascoyne, Steve Yeardley, who would both become pivotal figures in the coming seasons. In a brief return to league action, a late equaliser was conceded against Henley Town to cancel out a Day goal. Then it was time for Bassett to attempt mission impossible and overhaul a four goal deficit against Brackley. Although, this was not accomplished, Bassett did bow out in style, winning thanks to a solitary Swatton goal four minutes in.

Disappointment was to come in the shape of a 4-2 home defeat to Hook Norton before Wantage Town were edged out by a single goal to herald a return to winning ways. This did not last though, and 2002 finished on a losing note as Shortwood narrowly outlasted Bassett to win by a single goal scored just before the hour.

Bassett would have to wait until the middle of January to get back into action, and that showed against County League Cricklade Town in the opening round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup. Paul Clegg may have scored a brace in a 3-0 win, but the performance was sluggish to say the least. Another average performance followed against lesser opposition, but a Lamont goal proved enough to see off Cheltenham Saracens and book Bassett a place in the Supplementary Cup quarter finals.

The long trip to Hereford to reassume league commitments against fellow strugglers Pegasus proved fruitless. On top in the opening period, the side failed to take advantage of a number of decent openings and were made to pay as the hosts scored twice without reply after half time. Bassett responded brilliantly though to knock off North Leigh for the second time of the year at Rylands Way. Again, the game was decided by a single goal, but it could have been more had Lamont not missed a penalty. Stuart Smedley, reporting on the game for the Club noted the following:

Bassett shrugged off the challenge of top of the table visitors North Leigh in a thrilling encounter at Rylands Way to win 1-0 thanks to a late Geoff Swatton goal and some brilliant defending. Bassett were the most dangerous of the two sides in the first few minutes with Geoff Swatton having three good opportunities. North Leighs first chance came after twelve minutes when Nick Hughes had a shot blocked in the six yard box from a corner kick. Bassett created another good chance three minutes later when Ben Gascoyne had a shot saved by Kevin Alder after what Barry Giles described as magic work by Nick Tooley. North Leigh picked up the pace halfway through the first half and started putting pressure on the Bassett

Season 2002-03 The Tide Is High (Get The Feeling)

What was going on in the world

The season kicked off with Pop Idol contestant Darius at the top of the charts with Colourblind and ends with Room 5 and Make Luv at number one. In March George Bush and Tony Blair launch war against Iraq. British people are voted the worlds worst tourists in a survey of tourist boards across the globe. Arsenal win the FA Cup by defeating Southampton in the final whilst Manchester United win the Premier League from Arsenal, with Newcastle in third place.

Having narrowly survived the dreaded second year syndrome, it was with much relief that Wootton Bassett Town began their third season at Hellenic Premier League level with a victory by the odd goal in three against Gloucester United. Despite a midweek defeat at Pewsey Vale, Pete Yeardleys sides early good season form continued as much fancied Brackley Town were comfortably seen off thanks to goals from Mark Simpkins and Nick Tooley. The win was made ever more impressive given the fact goalkeeper Rich Stevens was sent off just six minutes in, as a combination of forward Justin Hyde and defender Luke Sharps making cameo appearances between the sticks helped keep a clean sheet. A week later, Sharps was again forced to don the gloves as Stevens was again sent off in a Challenge Cup match at Pewsey. However, this time he had little time to perform any heroics as Bassett were downed 3-0.

A second defeat to their Wiltshire rivals in as many weeks helped initiate a barren spell for Bassett that would see them win twice in ten contests, with just one of those coming in the league. After a 3-1 reverse at home to Tuffley Rovers, there followed consecutive goalless draws against Southall Town and Hook Norton respectively. A 3-1 triumph in the Floodlit Cup over New College Academy offered some respite, but Bassett came crashing back down to earth again a week later in the FA Vase at league rivals Shortwood United. The game seemed brilliantly poised at half time after a Tooley strike cancelled out an early goal for the hosts, but the visitors completely capitulated, conceding four goals without reply to lose 5-1. The defence continued to leak goals in the next pair of games, with Abingdon United (0-4) and Didcot Town (0-2) both leaving Rylands Way with all three points. A fine come from behind win at Almondsbury Town thanks to a Paul Garbutt penalty and Stuart Lamont strike suggested the rot had been stopped, but the worst was yet to come. On a miserable afternoon just outside Cheltenham, Bassett produced a performance to match the weather as they were slaughtered 8-0 by Bishops Cleeve, a team below Bassett going into the game!

Something of a renaissance followed though, beginning with a fantastic performance to beat league leaders North Leigh by a single goal in the Floodlit Cup thanks to a stunning Dave Jones strike. Lamont and Nathan Hall goals then secured a valuable league point in a home draw with Pegasus Juniors before Simpkins and Ashford scored either side of half time to ensure a 2-0 home win over Bicester Town. After seeing off Division One West side Adderbury Park by a single goal in the Supplementary Cup, a 2-1 victory over Shortwood gained sweet revenge for the early season Vase defeat. All three goals came in the second half, Bassetts winner being supplied by youngster Ben Gascoyne with just three minutes to go. Reporting on the match, John Reynolds wrote:

What a difference a few days makes, and a few returned players. This was one of the better Bassett performances seen this season, but there was, again, a shortage of goals, particularly in the first half. Bassett started the game a lot sharper than Shortwood, putting them under pressure with some good football. Adam Thomas, in the Shortwood goal, dealt with two shots on target in the first 5 minutes, yes, but the range had been found. On 16 minutes a lovely through ball found Geoff Swatton free; he beat Thomas only to see his effort kicked off the line. Four minutes later, Ashford cut in from the right and, with Swatton free in the box; he went alone on the keeper only to have his shot blocked. On 25 minutes a snap shot by Swatton beat Thomas but scrapped the post. At the other end Rich Stevens was not bothered in goal, thanks to Bassetts solid defence; Lamont and Pluckrose were outstanding. A lot of effort but no rewards at half time.

Step 3

Zamaretto Premier

Chippenham Town held onto second spot in the table and remain unbeaten after their opening ten fixtures thanks to a 90th minute goal from Edenborough that secured all three points away at league leaders Cambridge City on Saturday. This follows last weeks exit from the FA Cup at the hands of Farnborough. Salisbury City and Swindon Supermarine are still in the FA Cup and will meet Weston SuperMare and Hungerford Town respectively in next weeks Third Qualifying Round. Both were at home in the league on Saturday. Salisbury City won 4-1 at home against Bedford Town to consolidate 5th spot and with a game in hand can go within two points of leaders Cambridge City. Swindon Supermarine drew 1-1 with Windsor & Eton and are currently 12th in the table.

Step 5

Hellenic Premier

Wootton Bassett Town remain 11th in the Hellenic Premier League with games in hand but went out of the FA Vase on Saturday following a last minute goal away at Cadbury Heath. Highworth meanwhile dropped two points at home when they were held to a 1-1 draw by Thame and occupy 14th place in the table, three points behind Bassett and having played one more game.

Wessex Premier

Bemerton Heath Harlequins dropped to second in the table as Poole Town won 1-0 at home whilst Bemerton were winning in the FA Vase. It took extra time for Bemerton to overcome Hellenic Division One West side Lydney Town, Bemerton eventually winning 5-2. Laverstock and Ford went out of the Vase, losing 3-1 at Melksham Town and sit 4th from bottom in the table.

Western League Premier

The top two in the league met on Saturday and unfortunately for the Wiltshire side CorshamTown lost 2-0 at Larkhall Athletic and now trail the leaders by three points but held onto second spot.

Step 6

Hellenic Division One West

Headington Amateurs are running away with the league with a 100% record from their opening eight games and a ten point lead at the top of the table. Wiltshire side Cricklade Town are second with just one defeat in their opening seven games. Purton are one point behind in 4th spot after a 1-0 away win at Bicester Town. The only unbeaten side in the Premier Division remain Wilts Calne Town although they did lose in the Cup on Saturday. Purton Redhouse lead the table with 29 points from their opening 13 league fixtures but Wilts Calne Town are just two points behind with two games in hand. FC Sanford continue to dominate Division One with a 100% record from their opening twelve games and are 5 points ahead of 2nd placed Ludgershall Sports.

Krafty Cadbury Heath strike it lucky late

Springfield, October 2nd 2010

A poor start and a gut-wrenching finish combined to terminate Wootton Bassett Town's interest in the FA Vase as Western League Division One outfit Cadbury Heath won the first round tie between the two sides by two goals to one.

The afternoon started terribly for Dave Turner's side as the hosts took the lead within the opening three minutes following some abject defending. After possession was conceded cheaply, Sasha Tong squared inside from the right wing to Liam Planter, who, despite lurking around the penalty spot, was under no real pressure. Unselfishly, he shifted the ball to left winger George Boon, who had made a darting run into the box unchecked, and he made no mistake, coolly slotting past Stewart Thompson at the Bassett keepers near post.

Going behind so early should really have served as a wakeup call for the visitors, but that proved not to be the case as Bassett appeared intent on reverting to type when it came to the FA Vase. The Heathens were able to apply a huge amount of early pressure and the game could well have been over as a contest by half time. Less than 180 seconds after conceding, Boons in swinging corner was met by an unmarked Billy Fletcher. However, the towering centre back, despite placing his header on target, could not beat Thompson, who made a firm save on the dive to his right. On the quarter hour a testing Leon Maloney cross was spilled by the keeper on the edge of the area, the ball squirming loose into Boons feet. After fashioning an opening, he attempted a delicate chip from the edge of the area to try and beat the two visiting defenders between him and the goal. Fortunately though, his effort sailed just over. It was not just the hosts fluid passing that was catching Bassett at sixes and sevens either. Minutes later a long ball over the top was not dealt with, and Planter easily beat make shift centre-half Richie Carter for pace, leaving him with just Thompson to beat. The keeper spared his captains blushes though, as he was able to divert the forward's well struck effort wide.

Lucky to be just the single goal down at the break, Turners side came out for the second period with a sense of vigour and purpose and were duly rewarded, albeit somewhat fortuitously, for their much improved play in the 53rd minute. After a period of patient build up play, Terry Adams threaded a ball through for Alex Green, who shot on the turn from the edge of the area. In a desperate attempt to prevent his keeper from having to make a save, home defender Dwayne James then got a foot to the ball, but served only to wrong-foot Simon Crawford and divert the ball into his own net. With the teams back on level terms, the match opened up hugely with both sides committing men forward in numbers. Midway through the half, a give-and-go between Matty Bown and Adams opened up a shooting lane for the former on the edge of the box, yet Crawford was equal to the wingers powerful shot, which was taken on the bounce. Sixty seconds and a fast break later, Tong came narrowly close for Cadbury Heath but saw his shot on the turn deflected inches wide after an incisive pass from Boon. From the ensuing corner, the ball fell to the prolific forward, and only desperate defending kept his double effort from going in. The danger was not entirely averted though, and from another perfectly placed Boon corner, Fletcher headed just over. With seven minutes remaining it was Bassett's turn to apply the pressure when Jon Beeden broke decisively with pace down the left hand side. After shrugging the attentions of a defender off, he whipped the ball into the danger area. Just as it appeared destined to fall perfectly for Ethan Delaney to head home though, the faintest of flicks from Maloney denied the substitute his chance. Despite the flurry of chances, the game by now appeared destined for an extra half hour, until the cruellest of blows was delivered in the third minute of stoppage time. A couple minutes prior, a swift counter down the right flank saw Luke Cornish force a save from Thompson. This time though he beat the keeper, albeit with the aid of a deflection. William de Witts low cross was diverted towards the bottom left corner by the forward, although it appeared the Bassett keeper had it covered. However, a late deflection changed the direction of the ball and despite a despairing dive, Thompson was unable to prevent it from nestling in the back of the net.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Jon Beeden – the only player in a blue and yellow shirt who could really claim to have put in a performance of a consistent standard. He was strong in the tackle and a force in the air, and once again was positive and looking to take players on whenever he had the opportunity to get forward.

Scoop Rating: 5/10 – Bassett's first half performance was abject; however they were much improved following the restart and were unfortunate to have lost the game in the manner they did. Cadbury Heath certainly edged proceedings over the course of the ninety minutes though.



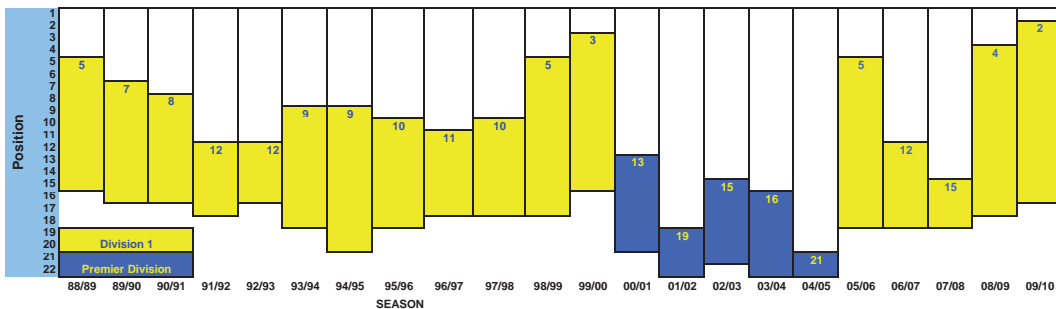
