EDITORIAL

Good afternoon and welcome back to Rylands Way for this UHlsport Hellenic Premier League fixture against **Flackwell Heath**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Flackwell Heath** who have made the long journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home.

It is with great sadness that I have to report the death of our former Chairman **John Reynolds**. John was Chairman for three seasons from 1994-95 through to 1996-97 having joined the Club in the early 1980s when son Marcus was playing for our Youth Team (the Club had just one youth side at that time), a side managed by myself. When I went to University a month or so into the season, John and my father took over the running of the Youth side that was at the time playing in the Mid Wilts League. The side included some very good players including Danny Groom, Steve Thomas, Paul Gerrish, Dave Alstowe and Gavin Russ, as well as Johns son Marcus. The side did well in the league and also made the Cup final at Devizes Town where they met Devizes Saints in the final back May 1981, a game which I still hold a copy of the match day programme. Following this initial involvement in the Youth set up John remained involved in the Club and, as noted above, eventually took over the helm as Chairman. After stepping down as Chairman John continued writing match reports for the programme and was still writing the reports when the Clubs website first came into existence. Our thoughts are with his family and friends at this sad time.

Having not made a First Team game for some time it was good to catch two games last week played down my neck of the woods. On a cold Wednesday night it was disappointing to see the side go down 3-0 at **Ascot** after such an excellent first half. It was an eventful game and Scoops match report on the disappointing evening at **Ascot** Racecourse is included in tonights programme. The 3-0 score certainly flattered the home side who played the whole of the second half with just ten men and the last couple of minutes with just nine. Once we went behind you could see the confidence visibly drain from the side and this was carried over into the first half on Saturday away at **Rayners Lane** in the cup. In what was probably the worst half I have seen from the side all season, there was a total lack of confidence on the ball and a lot of arguing amongst the players and we really did not get much of a look in against what was a mid-table Division One side. A stern talk at half time from coach Turner seemed to do the trick though, as a much improved second half saw us through to the next round courtesy of another two goals from Sam Collier, taking his total in all competitions to 16 for the season.

Looking at what is in tonights programme, the **From the Archives** feature this week looks back to **1960-1** when Mickey Jefferies was banging in the goals for Wootton Bassett Town in the Wiltshire League Premier Division. The **Player Profile** this week features **Craig Bowden**. Please note that the First Team are again at home on Tuesday night when a much improved **Oxford City Nomads** are the visitors to Rylands Way fresh from an excellent win in midweek against Reading Town We can certainly expect a much tougher encounter than the last time the two sides met and your support would be very much appreciated from Dave and the team again on Tuesday night, 7.45pm kick-off for this one.

WORLD OF SOCCER

THIS WEEK FEATURING.....

Recent article by Stuart Smedley for the LSE Newspaper

It was quite fitting that less than 24 hours after Gary Lineker asked the poignant question whether England could win the next World Cup in a true tear-jerker of a documentary that current Three Lions boss Fabio Capello called up uncapped, 33-year-old forward Kevin Davies. That is after attempting, unsuccessfully it must be added, to lure Emile Heskey out of international retirement.

Surely that answered the question posed by the jug-eared face of Walkers Crisps and Match of the Day there and then, by demonstrating how bare the cupboard the Italian has to choose from actually is. When you're considering giving debuts to players closer to the end, rather than the beginning, of their careers it suggests the future is rather bleak.

Merely to float that particular question though, after the shower of s**t produced during the summer in South Africa, was ludicrous. Particularly so given Lineker witnessed firsthand the tragicomedy enacted by Capello's merry men, most of whom comprised what was billed as English football's *Golden Generation*.

Having failed miserably to live up to that hype not just this year, but at every tournament since 2002, failure to qualify for the 2008 European Championships in Austria and Switzerland being the nadir, a less precious metal should really prefix the term *generation* used to describe the era Gerrard, Lampard, Owen, Terry et al have been a part of. Tinfoil, with its shiny exterior but culpability for crumbling under the slightest of pressure, perhaps?

Strangely though the lingering post-World Cup malaise, demonstrated by Lineker's forty minute autopsy that didn't really delve deeply into the multitude of problems holding the national team back and only really offered the one solution: copy Spain, has been mixed with a faint but noticeable rekindling of optimism.

And all because of a pair of positive results against middleweights Bulgaria and Switzerland to begin the Euro 2012 qualifying campaign, and the promotion of a couple of talented, albeit highly inexperienced, youngsters to the main squad. Whether or not they become permanent fixtures, something which will go hand-in-hand with whether they can become permanent fixtures at club level, is another question. Currently, the list of young English players who are appearing in the Premier League on a regular basis is miniscule. And it is an environment in which young talent can flourish that is, above all else, needed in this country. But that is just not going to be compatible with the ethos of clubs in the top flight, particularly that of those at the top.

By all means, Capello could have plumped for 21-year-old Newcastle United forward Andy Carroll, who has so far transferred the form he showed last season in The Championship to the highest level of English football, instead of Davies; indeed, the last time the Italian overlooked the ponytailed Geordie he was branded as a jackass by the bastion of serious journalism that is *The Sun*.

In addition to him Marc Albrighton, Phil Jones and current media darling Jack Wilshere have all been receiving extensive playing time so far this season. But the spotlight being placed on the latter's young shoulders through comparisons with the likes of teammate Cesc Fabregas so early into his career is worrying. During their formative years, players need to be given the chance to grow without such lofty expectations hanging over them. Yet the majority of their peers, including the likes of Kieran Gibbs, Daniel Sturridge and Chris Smalling, all highly touted and at a critical period in their development, continue to see their opportunities limited. Unless given the chance to do more than just perfect the art of bench warming, no doubt more introspective documentaries will be available for Lineker to front.

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Flackwell Heath FC • Club History

Flackwell Heath FC was founded in 1907 and the club joined the High Wycombe and District League for its inaugural season. The Heathens proved to be a major force in local football, having won twelve Wycombe League championship titles and the High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup on a record twelve occasions.

In the 1950's Flackwell joined the Great Western Combination League and won this league twice before returning to the Wycombe League.



In the 1970's they continued their success and the clubhouse was built as the first stage of their rise into senior football. The clubhouse was opened in 1974. In 1975 The Heathens won the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup and the Reading Senior Cup. In 1977 the club achieved Senior status and moved up into the Hellenic League Division One. Promotion to the Premier Division was achieved at the first attempt. After five seasons in this league, during which time floodlights were installed at Wilks Park, Flackwell were elected into the Athenian League. In 1984 they joined the expanding Isthmian League. The club's first season in this competition saw them playing in Division Two (North) and against some tough opposition they finished in a respectable eighth position. The following season Flackwell was switched to Division Two (South) where life turned out to be even tougher. At the end of season 1990-91, after finishing below mid-table, The Heathens found themselves placed in the newly formed Ryman League Division Three.

In 2002/03 Flackwell reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup, losing 4-1 at home against Crawley and finished third in the newly formed Ryman League Division Two the highest position achieved to date. The Youth team also won the Allied Counties League Southern Division in this year. The High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup for a record twelfth time in 2003/04, beating Prestwood 4-0 in the final at Adams Park, the home of Wycombe Wanderers.

In season 2004/05 The Heathens reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the second time in three years, this time losing 3-0 at Ryman Premier Division Billericay Town and were runners-up in the Ryman League Associate Members Cup, losing 2-1 after extra time to Division Two champions Ilford on their own ground.

The veterans team won the FA Umbro Sunday Cup, a feat which was repeated in 2006 and 2007. After winning the first final the lads went to The Bernabeu Stadium and played against Real Madrid veterans for the European Cup and lost by 3-1.

Flackwell finished fourth in Ryman League Division Two in 2005/06, narrowly missing out on promotion. After the end of 2006/07 the FA reorganised the non-league pyramid and we were due to be relegated into the South Midlands Spartan League until Barking and East Ham United went out of business and we were given the opportunity to take their place in the Ryman Division One (North). Unfortunately we finished bottom of the league and were relegated into the Hellenic Premier Division for season 2007/08.

The first season back in the Hellenic League saw the Heathens finish in 9th position and also reach the final of the High Wycombe Senior Challenge Cup where they were beaten 2-1 by Chalfont Wasps. Season 2008/09 was another one of inconsistency and Terry Glynn resigned at the end of October 2008 and was replaced by one of our former club captains, Matt Flint. Matt brought in ex-Marlow and Slough Town midfielder James Pritchard and in their first full season they led the team to a creditable fourth place in the Hellenic League Premier Division and to the final of the Reading Senior Cup, whilst the under 18's Youth team won the Allied Counties League Central Division for the second time.

In his fourth season at Wilks Park, Riccardo is a prolific goalscorer. Scored over 70 league goals thus far and over 100 in all competitions.



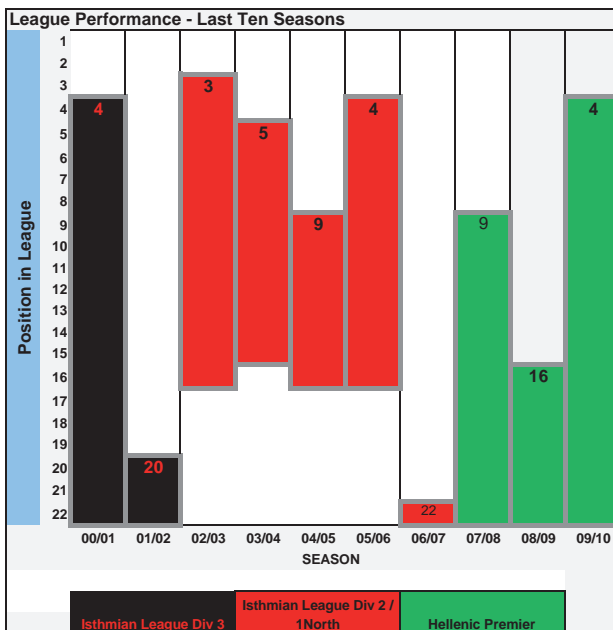
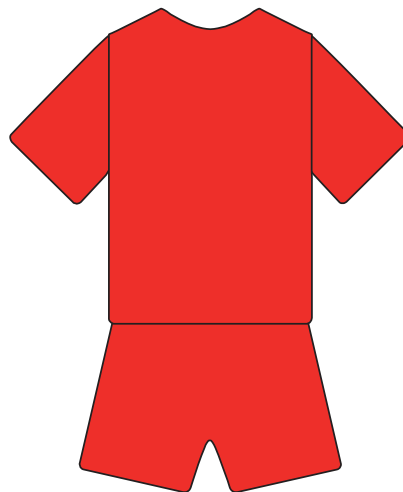
Adam Harman Forward

in their three games and have lost five points. First came a 4-0 defeat at Devizes, then one of the same magnitude from Swindon BR, and then a no-core draw with Frome. Frome were actual League leaders over Easter.

As a consequence Wootton Bassett had slipped down to seventh place in the table. Things did improve with a 2-0 away win at Radstock courtesy of goals from Hamilton and Stan Embling and when Clandown were the visitors to Rylands Way as two goals from Mickey Jefferies and one from Pete Teetgen gave Wootton Bassett a 3-0 win. In between Bassett went down 3-0 in a midweek home fixture against Melksham. Two disappointing defeats followed a 4-1 defeat against Warminster and then a 2-1 away defeat at Frome accelerated the fall down the table. The defeat at Frome was not helped by a neck injury to keeper Dave Jones which resulted in a hospital visit. Lou Nash scored the consolation goal. Wootton Bassett returned to winning ways with the visit of Westbury, 3-1 the final score in this one. Two midweek defeats, one which was against Westbury (2-4) and the other being against Calne & Harris (1-3). A 4-0 away defeat at Pinehurst completed a disappointing end to the season which had seen Wootton Bassett Town slip down to a final tenth placed finish in the table.

Teetgen header. Jefferies completed his hat-trick in the second half and the win lifted Wootton Bassett into second place on 17 points, level on points with three other teams in a congested top of the table.

The first two weeks of December saw the players of Wootton Bassett kicking their heels, a scheduled fixture at Frome being postponed. When they returned to action the momentum was continued with a narrow 2-1 win at Rylands against Radstock Town, Jack Woods and Alan Slocombe the Wootton Bassett scorers. The two week break had seen them drop down to fourth place in the table. A disappointing Christmas Eve defeat at Clandown followed, with the home side scoring the only goal of the game.

The first game of the New Year witnessed the heaviest defeat of the season as Wootton Bassett went down 6-1 at Stonehouse. Wootton Town found themselves 3-1 down at the break with Mike Jefferies and Jack Woods having missed golden opportunities. Jefferies had scored for Bassett just before the break but they then conceded three goals in the second half. The Football Pink carried the following report on the game which included references to the notoriously heavy Rylands Way pitch:

Stonehouse who are hanging onto the leaders tails so grimly treated Wootton Bassett with exactly the same scant courtesy that they had extended to Pinehurst YC the week before a 6-1 defeat. This was a blow to Wootton Bassett's championship hopes but it was definitely Stonehouses day, a day when all their shots seemed fated to be on the target and the difficult ones to stop. Both sides were hampered by the condition of the ground which the Wootton Bassett folk described as awful and when Bassett, used as they are to one of the heaviest grounds in the league, says that it must have been in a pickle.

Struggling Peasedown were the next visitors to Rylands Way and Bassett trailed after six minutes having conceded a penalty. Bassett had much of the play and their pressure paid off when T.Taylor equalised in the second half. This was certainly a point dropped against a struggling side and left Wootton Bassett in seventh place but with five games in hand on teams above them in the table and only four points adrift of top spot. Next up was another home game with high flying Melksham Town the visitors. The two sides shared eight goals and the points with the visitors equalising a minute from time much to the disappointment of the Bassett faithful. Mickey Jefferies notched a hat-trick for Bassett with Jack Woods adding a fourth. The Club were without a First Team fixture the following week but it was interesting to read in the Football Pink of 28th January 1961 that the future of Cirencester Town Football Club was in the balance due to a lack of support. The next scheduled game against Pinehurst was postponed and when Wootton Bassett returned to action Chippenham Town Reserves were the visitors to Rylands Way. Bassett secured both points courtesy of a 3-2 win with another Mickey Jefferies hat-trick which included a penalty after Pete Teetgen was brought down. This took his total goals for the season to 20. Jefferies was again on the score sheet the following week as Wootton Bassett romped to their biggest win of the season, a 7-0 home win over Paulton Rovers. Pete Teetgen fired a hat-trick with Jefferies bagging a brace, including an overhead kick, with Lou Nash and Alex Stark adding the other goals.

February ended with an excellent away win at Peasedown that was played in very windy conditions. The two sides turned round at the break goalless but goals from Lou Nash, Mickey Jefferies, Granville Taylor and two long range efforts from Alex Stark secured a 5-1 victory which lifted Bassett up into fifth place. A 1-1 draw with another leading side in Warminster Town, Pete Teetgen with the Bassett goal, kept the momentum going and was followed by a good 3-1 away win at Chippenham United, Johnny *Sandy* Rose, Granville Taylor and Pete Teetgen with the goals. Rose, like Alex Stark, was a RAF lad who hailed from Dundee. At this stage Wootton Bassett remained in fifth place in the table, eight points behind the leaders but with seven games in hand, and had dropped the fewest points. The Football Pink commented that *if it were not for the lee-way they have to make up Wootton Bassett would be prime favourites for the championship.*

The paper had talked them up too soon as the next outing saw a disappointing and surprising heavy 4-0 defeat at Devizes Town on a day when all the leading contenders who were playing lost with the exception of Pinehurst. The first game in April saw Wootton Bassett draw 0-0 with leaders Frome Town. Easter Monday, however, was a day to forget as Bassett again lost 4-0 away, this time to Swindon BR. This was quickly followed by a 2-1 home defeat at the hands of Devizes Town, Lou Nash with the first goal for Wootton Bassett in four games. The Football Pink of 8th April 1961 highlighted the bleak Easter period for Bassett:

There is no doubt Easter has been an upsetting time for some of the contenders for the league championship, particularly Wootton Bassett and Warminster. Wootton Bassett have not scored a goal

Frustrated Flackwell forced into replay

Wilks Park, 16th August 2008

The FA Cup continued its trend of bringing the best out of Wootton Bassett Town as they forced Hellenic Premier side Flackwell Heath into a replay after a 1-1 draw.

It could have been a shock win though, but Matt Rolfe pooped that party with a last minute equaliser, powerfully heading home from a perfectly placed Adam Morris free kick.

On the balance of play, Rolfe's goal was a deserved one as his side dominated in terms of possession and played some sublime football, knocking the ball about with much confidence.

However, they endured a frustrating day as their visitors more than rose to the challenge and limited their chances with some brilliant defending; Stewart Thompson was certainly thankful as he had a quieter day than he would have expected to have.

Inside the opening ten minutes, both sides had come close to breaking the deadlock. Nathan Jack flashed a powerful left footed drive just past the right post before a delightful chipped Shaun Terry through ball set Ryan Banks free at the other end. However, his first time drive sailed wide when he had the chance to bear down on goal.

Bassett were slightly wasteful when they possessed the ball in the opening 45 minutes, but having to adjust to the frenetic pace Flackwell were setting, that was no surprise.

They were very nearly made to pay for squandering the ball with just under 20 minutes gone when Jack was able to advance with the midfield caught out and he eventually teed up Riccardo Cannon, but his weak effort was easily collected by Thompson.

The Bassett 'keeper was then beaten just before the break, however he had the left upright to thank as Cannon's glancing header rebounded off it after Richie Glynn had redirected a Leigh Mason corner back into the danger area.

The visitors settled well after the restart and began looking like the more dangerous of the two sides.

Debutant Adam Field forced a fine save from Carl Dennison with a shot from a tight angle, following another incisive pass from Banks. A heavy first touch cost Field though as it allowed the ball to run away from him, but still the Flackwell 'keeper was made to work to keep the score deadlocked.

At the other end, it continued to be a frustrating day in front of goal for the home side. Bassett's centre back pairing of Chris Oram and Shaun Carter were seemingly impregnable, whilst full backs Richie Carter – a half time replacement for captain Luke Sharps, who sustained a knock – and Luke Preston were giving their wide men little room to manoeuvre.

All Flackwell managed to muster from open play were wayward long range efforts or shots which were blocked. A rasping free kick from Jack forced a save out of Thompson, but that was basically it for the irritated hosts.

The score, therefore, looked as though it would remain how it started. But that was until Craig Shand found the back of the net for Bassett.

Banks again set things in motion with a lofted pass to Terry. The tricky front man brought the ball down and rode a strong challenge before poking the ball square to an unmarked Shand.

His fellow former Hungerford teammate sent a low effort towards goal, which Dennison got a glove too, but the 'keeper couldn't do enough to prevent from trickling over the line. A second seemed on the cards for Shand moments later as he went for glory from range with Dennison stranded, but he sent the ball agonizingly wide.

From this emerged fresh emergency within the Flackwell ranks and Rolfe spared their blushes with under 60 seconds of normal time to go. It was a delicious delivery from the deep by Morris, but an unstoppable header from the centre back.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Shaun Carter – was a commanding figure at the heart of defence for Bassett as he – along with partner Chris Oram – made life as miserable as possible for Flackwell's front two.

Scoop Rating: 8/10 – it was disappointing to concede the late equaliser, but in the end it was a fair result following great performances from both sides. Flackwell played the football, but Bassett answered back with a spirited display to thwart their opponents.

Craig Bowden (defender)

After drifting in and out of the starting eleven for a while last season, Bowden eventually made the right back position as his own as the youngster produced a number of mature, impressive performances to cement his place in the team. The defender is the son of Andy Bowden, a member of Bassetts 1987/88 Wiltshire League Division One championship winning side, who scored six goals, the majority from the penalty spot, during that campaign. And his composure and unflappability seem to have been passed down to his son judging by how he performed in his first season of senior football. Having played under Dave Turner as a youth, Bowden spent two years in the Forest Green Rovers youth side before following in his fathers footsteps and signing for the Rylands Way outfit. Committed in the tackle and more than comfortable when on the ball, his first appearance came as a substitute in the FA Cup Extra Preliminary round tie against Westbury United and he then made his first start ten days later in a 6-1 thumping of Headington Amateurs. In all he made 26 appearances last season.



involvement in the Extra Preliminary Round of the FA Amateur Cup. Wootton Bassett progressed to the next round courtesy of a 5-0 away win at Swindon Victoria. Under the headline *Shocks in Store for the Vics* the Football Pink of 17th September carried the following report:

There were shocks in store for unbeaten Swindon Victoria when they found themselves trailing 3-0 to Wootton Bassett at half time of their FA Amateur Cup Preliminary Round tie. The Vics were the first to make an attack of any consequence and only a fine save by Jones prevented left winger Wakely from scoring. Wootton Bassett should have opened the scoring in the 15th minute when Slocombe received a pass with only the goalkeeper to beat but the right wingers shot went right into goalkeeper Titcombes hands. However, Teetgen did manage to score two minutes later, Titcombe failing to reach the cannon-ball shot. Wootton Bassetts forwards were now constantly on the attack and ably supported by wing half Nash and Freegard had the Swindon defence worried. It was one of the wing halves Nash who put Wootton Bassett further ahead in the 25th minute. Wootton Bassetts right winger Slocombe made up for his earlier mistake in the 33rd minute when he nodded home a model Teetgen centre. Although Swindon Vics staged a comeback just before half time they could not find the necessary penetrating force to score. Wood and Jefferies scored for Wootton Bassett in the second half.

Wootton Bassett returned to league action with a 3-1 away win over Swindon Town A completing a quick double. Bassett came from one down to record the win courtesy of goals from Mike Jefferies (penalty), Peter Teetgen and Jack Woods. This win took Wootton Bassett back to the top of the table. Interest in the FA Amateur Cup was surprisingly ended by Bromham. One nil down at the break due to a penalty Peter Teetgen scored in the second half but Bromham also found the net to progress in the competition. The Football Pink noted that Chris Simpkins had left Wootton Bassett Town to join Swindon BR. The first league game in October saw Pinehurst visit Rylands Way. A Mike Jefferies hat-trick and a brace from Pete Teetgen gave Wootton Bassett a comfortable 5-0 win over fellow title challengers Pinehurst and took Wootton Bassett back to the top of the table. Secretary Percy Stone had been required to find a new goalkeeper for the game and had signed Sammy Golding, the ex-Swindon Victoria keeper in time for the match. The Football Pink noted that Golding had little to do on his debut. Despite the next league game with Westbury being postponed due to the scheduled opponents being in FA Amateur Cup action Wootton Bassett still held on to top spot.

Action returned on 22nd October with a long trip down to Somerset to first Paulton Rovers. Sammy Golding had somewhat more to do and made some outstanding saves in the first half as Wootton Bassett came back to Wiltshire with a point, Alan Slocombe and Pete Teetgen the scorers. However, the dropped point cost Wootton Bassett top spot as Warminster edged ahead on the basis of a better goal average. It was not the dropped point for which the game will be remembered but the circumstances surrounding Dave Jones appearance. With Alex Stark a no show Wootton Bassett were forced to employ regular keeper Dave Jones as an outfield player. Many sides will have played a keeper on the pitch due to player shortages but how often will they have performed in the normal day shoes and on a muddy pitch as well! Despite the footwear handicap, Jones set up the equaliser for Pete Teetgen. The Football Pink of 29th October 1960 carried the following at the end of its report on the game:

No praise is too high for Golding or for Jones for his most sporting effort in such conditions and in such footwear. After the match Mr Cooksey[Wootton Bassett Town Chairman] was much concerned at the state of Daves shoes, but when told that the club would do something about it Dave replied, *Oh no, I think they will be all right, you see they were brand new.* May Wootton Bassett long have such characters and sportsmen. □

November commenced with a County Cup fixture against Warminster Town. Two goals from Alex Stark and one from Pete Teetgen gave Wootton Bassett the win by the odd goal in five. There was a similar result the following week in the home league fixture with Chippenham United. Jefferies put Wootton Bassett in front before Alex Stark extended the lead making it 2-0 at the break. Jefferies scored a second after half time but Chippenham scored two of their own but Wootton Bassett held on to take both points. Interest in the County Cup was ended when Wootton Bassett lost 5-1 at home to Westbury United, E. Taylor with the consolation goal. November ended with a 4-2 away win at Chippenham Town Reserves. Wootton Bassett found themselves 3-0 up at the break in a game played in slippery conditions courtesy of two goals from Mike Jefferies and a Pete

Season 1960-61 Its Now or Never

What was going on in the world

The season started with *Please Dont Tease* by Cliff Richard and the *Shadows* at number one and ended with *Blue Moon* by *Marcel* at the top of the charts. *Elvis Presley* spent most weeks at number one with *Its Now Or Never*. A whole host of African nations were gaining independence including *Ivory Coast* and *Chad*. At the same time *Cyprus* gains its independence from Britain. The newly named *Beatles* begin a 48 night residency at a *Hamburg Club*. *Cassius Clay* wins the gold medal in the Olympic heavyweight boxing. *South Africa* withdraws from the *Commonwealth of Nations*. *Tottenham* become the first team in the 20th Century to win English league and cup double. *Jimmy Hill* and the *PFA* are successful in abolishing the maximum wage and the binding of players to clubs for life. *Swindon Town* finish 16th in *Division Three*.

The Wiltshire Premier League saw a host of new teams join from North Somerset and Gloucestershire following the demise of the Second Division of the Western League. New teams joining the Western League included the first teams of *Chippenham United* and *Frome Town*, as well as *Radstock Town*, *Clandown*, *Paulton Rovers* and *Peasedown* from North Somerset and *Stonehouse* from Gloucestershire.

The Football Pink of 20th August 1960 included the usual pre-season news which included a note about *Swindon Town A* (basically *Swindon Towns Youth* side who played in the Wiltshire League) and reference to a personality who would later feature heavily in *Wootton Bassett Towns* greatest successes. The paper noted the following:

Swindon Town might have won the league last season had they been able to keep their early season team together but youngsters like Bob Woodruffe, Ernie Hunt, Mick Summerbee and Micky Woolford played their way out of the team and into the seniors ranks.

Mick Woolford, who had played three times for *Swindon Town* the previous season against *Bournemouth*, *Bradford* and *Brentford*, was to play a big part in the history of *Wootton Bassett Town Football Club* but more on that later. The same article also noted that there were problems at *Wootton Bassett* on the eve of the season.

Another club to have to face a building process are Wootton Bassett. Ken Pewsey and Stan Embling have hung up their boots while county inside forward Ronnie Mair has left the district. This will be no new experience for Secretary Percy Stone. He has faced such a position more than once in the 30 unbroken years he has held office. This time his job has been made harder by Treasurer Mr Jack Hitchcock departing from the district without a successor being appointed as yet.

Such was the state of affairs that the Club were forced to make the decision to fold the Reserve Team, which had been in existence for many seasons, due to a lack of players. Percys search for new players saw *Alan Slocombe* join from *Westcott Youth Centre* as replacement for *Mair*, while *Chris Simpkins* was returning from military service just in time to replace *Stan Embling*. *Chris Freegard* was promoted from the Reserves to replace left half *Ken Pewsey*.

The season opened with the visit of *Swindon BR* to *Rylands Way*. *Lou Nash* celebrated his appointment as captain by putting *Wootton Bassett* in front and *Pete Teetgen* extended the lead. However, a penalty conceded just before the break brought the visitors back into the game and they secured a share of the points thanks to a second half equaliser. The following week new Gloucestershire side *Stonehouse* were the visitors to *Rylands Way* and they left with both points following a 2-1 win, *Pete Teetgen* with the consolation goal for *Wootton Bassett* in a game played in difficult windy conditions. A *Mike Jefferies* penalty gave *Wootton Bassett Town* a point in a 1-1 home draw with near neighbours *Purton*.

September commenced with an excellent 7-1 away win at *Calne & Harris United*. *Mervyn Jefferies*, new signing *Alan Slocombe* and *Alex Stark* all bagged a brace and *Pete Teetgen* had scored the third *Bassett* goal. This was followed by a quick return match with *Purton* which *Wootton Bassett* won 2-1. Three days later a four goal display from *Pete Teetgen* helped *Wootton Bassett* to a 5-0 home win over *Swindon Town A*, *Jefferies* with the other. Three wins in the space of a week and this latest win took *Wootton Bassett* back to the top of the table after six games. *Wootton Bassett Town* were dislodged from the top spot the following week due to

The one big story this week in Wiltshire Football concerns the tremendous performance by *Swindon Supermarine* in the FA Cup that sees them through to the First Round Proper, joining fellow Wiltshire side *Swindon Town FC* in the draw on ITV last Sunday lunchtime. The first game between *Supermarine* and *Bath City* resulted in a 0-0 draw and for many this was seen as a great achievement in itself, but that the general consensus was that *Bath* would easily win the replay. A source close to the Sports Desk of the local newspaper indicated to me on the night of the game that the local reporter assigned the match was not best pleased to have to go to *Bath* on a wet and miserable night to cover a game that *Supermarine* would lose heavily in any event. My same source did note to said reporter that he should have more faith and might actually witness some history being made and how prophetic that was to prove!

Supermarine kept their remarkable FA Cup story going with a late 4-3 win at *Blue Square Premier* outfit *Bath City*. *Nick Stanley*, *Matt Robinson*, *Leigh Henry* and *Kyle Lapham* scored the all-important goals as *Marine* came from 3-1 down to make the First Round proper of the FA Cup for the first time in their history. The drama went right to the end as a late wonder save from the *Supermarine* keeper denied the *Blue Square Premier* side a late equaliser. *Marine* can now look forward to the prospect of a home clash against *Eastwood* from the *Blue Square North*. It has certainly been the *Collier* familys year in the competition, with manager *Mark Colliers* son *Sam* having scored four during *Wootton Bassett Towns* run to the First Qualifying Round. *Swindon Town* will be away to *Plymouth* in the First Round so there is the possibility of *Supermarine* being the Wiltshire side that goes the furthest in this years competition which would be a fantastic achievement. *Salisbury City* failed to join the two *Swindon* sides in the First Round draw losing 3-0 away at *Corby Town*.

In the Hellenic League Cup both Wiltshire Premier League sides are through to the next round of the *Bluefin Insurance League Cup*. *Wootton Bassett* won 2-1 away at *Rayners Lane* thanks to two goals from *Sam Collier* whilst *Highworth* had a fine 3-1 away win at *Kidlington*, two goals for *TJ Bohane* and one for *Kevin Tate* doing the damage. *Highworth* followed this up on Tuesday night with another excellent result defeating high flying *Shortwood United* at the *Elms* by three goals to two. This win lifted them into 10th place in the table.

In the *Toolstation Western League* *Corsham Town* continue to tumble down the table. A 3-1 defeat at *Wellington* was followed by an identical result on Tuesday night away to *Brislington* when they conceded three goals in the second half before scoring a consolation late on. Wiltshire sides continue to lead the way in the *Wessex League Division One*. *Downton* maintained top spot with a hard fought 1-0 away win at *Hordean* whilst *Pewsey Vale* won 2-1 at *Petersfield* to remain second. Wootton Bassett Town, after a spirited performance, faded down the final stretch and in doing so lost by three lengths, albeit short ones, against early form side Ascot United. In a physical, and at times petulant, encounter, neither side finished the ninety minutes with its full complement of starters.

Neck and neck with twenty minutes to go after Bassetts rearguard stoically ensured any counters from the home side were kept in check, Ascot caught their visitors napping when Tim Standing drilled a first time effort from twenty yards into the bottom right corner to open the scoring. The classy midfielder was somewhat lucky to still have been on the pitch though after a crunching, needless challenge on Ethan Delaney had only merited him a yellow card minutes prior. After going a goal behind, Bassett ran out of breathe, unable to deliver a counterpunch. The gap was widened seven minutes later as Dave Turners side shot themselves in the foot. Substitute Elliot Knight had only been on the pitch a matter of minutes, and this showed as he played a wayward back pass straight to home forward Jon Bennett, who galloped past a helpless Stewart Thompson before slotting the ball comfortably home. Trying desperately to claw their way back, Bassett were then caught on the break with eleven minutes remaining following a clinical counter. A swift passing move saw the ball fall to a wide open Sam McIntyre on the left wing, and he cut inside before drilling the ball into opposite corner from the edge of the box.



The final score though certainly flattered the hosts, who were made to work extremely hard for the victory. Ascot narrowly edged an extremely tight first half, but were unable to convert their territorial advantage into a goal. The best chance of the opening period arguably fell to Bassett as a header from a Matt Bown corner was blocked on the line. However, Ascot must be credited not only for some of the football they played (Bassett equally got the ball on the deck and stroked it around, albeit unfortunately not to the same effect as the hosts), but also for the way they did not cave in after being reduced to ten men just before the break when Rob Saunders was dismissed for a foul mouthed tirade directed at Jon Beeden. On the other hand, some of Stuart Scammell's sides antics were disappointing. This is not to say Bassett were angels on the night, because they were not; the five bookings , two of which were received by Beeden, were testament to that. But the way in which the Ascot players constantly hounded the referee, and took it upon themselves to wind up their opponents left a poor taste. Two cases in the dying stages of the game highlight this. Firstly, the reaction of defender Paul McGrotty, who was also sent off for two bookable offences, to the kind of jostling you see at every corner kick was uncalled for. In needlessly squaring up to Beeden, the man the defender was marking, there is no doubt that McGrotty helped earn the Bassett full back a suspension. Then, after having been beaten by pace, substitute Simon Knight wrestled Delaney to the floor before copying the tactics of his teammate and going head-to-head with the young forward. By this point, three minutes into stoppage time and with almost a dozen cards already produced, the referee showed a modicum of common sense and only delivered a stern warning. Sadly the ugly side of their game took a shine of the beautiful side of it.



Scoops Man of the Match: James Turner, while Tim Standing pulled the strings effectively from the centre of midfield for the hosts, Turner impressively did the same for Bassett. He was effective in breaking up attacks with well timed tackles and his passes never went astray.

Scoop Rating: 7/10, two mistakes cost Bassett against opponents they matched up to extremely well for the majority of the game. Both sides played attractive football, although the game became farcical towards the end with a number of petty fouls being committed and bookings dished out at will.



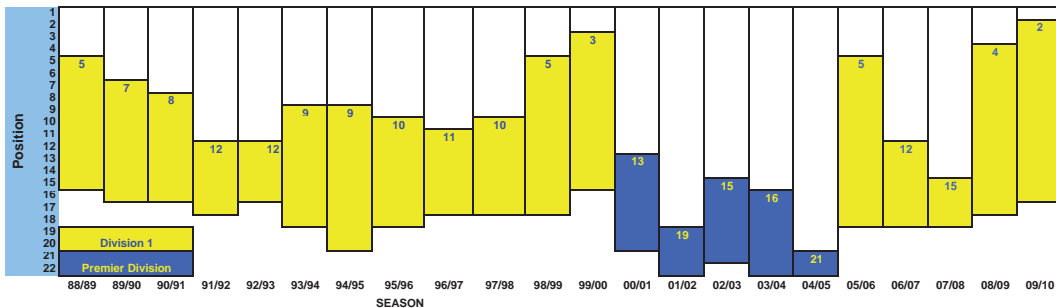

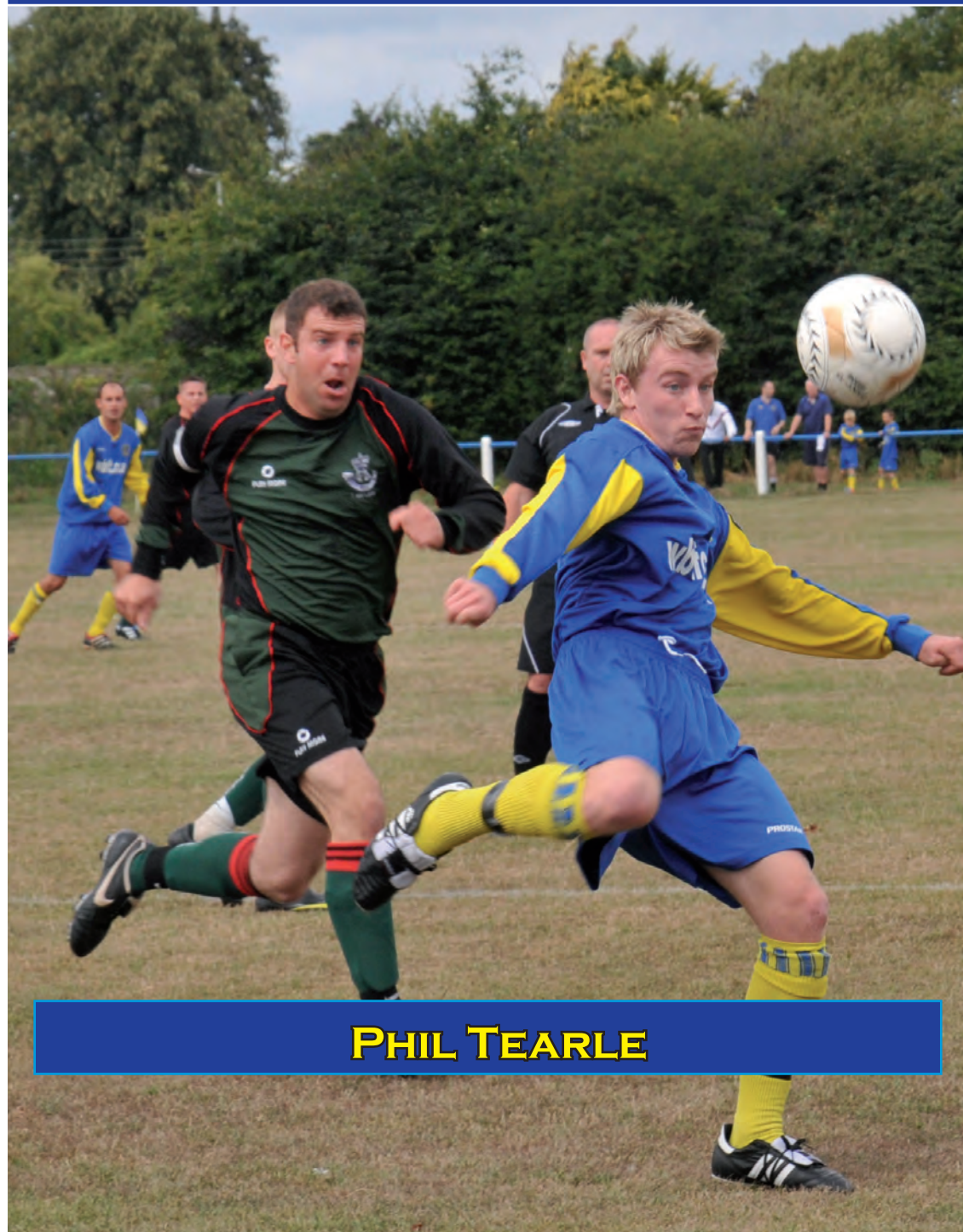

Most of our managers are a shy bunch (well apart from Burkey and Dave Terry!) so during the long season they would appreciate help, both practical and emotionally. They all undertake their roles free of charge and for the love of the game and without their commitment we would have no club. Sometimes a hand or a few words of encouragement go a long way and I know from personal experience how satisfying it can make it if you feel others are supportive of you. Enjoy the season ahead and remember... the referee is always right!

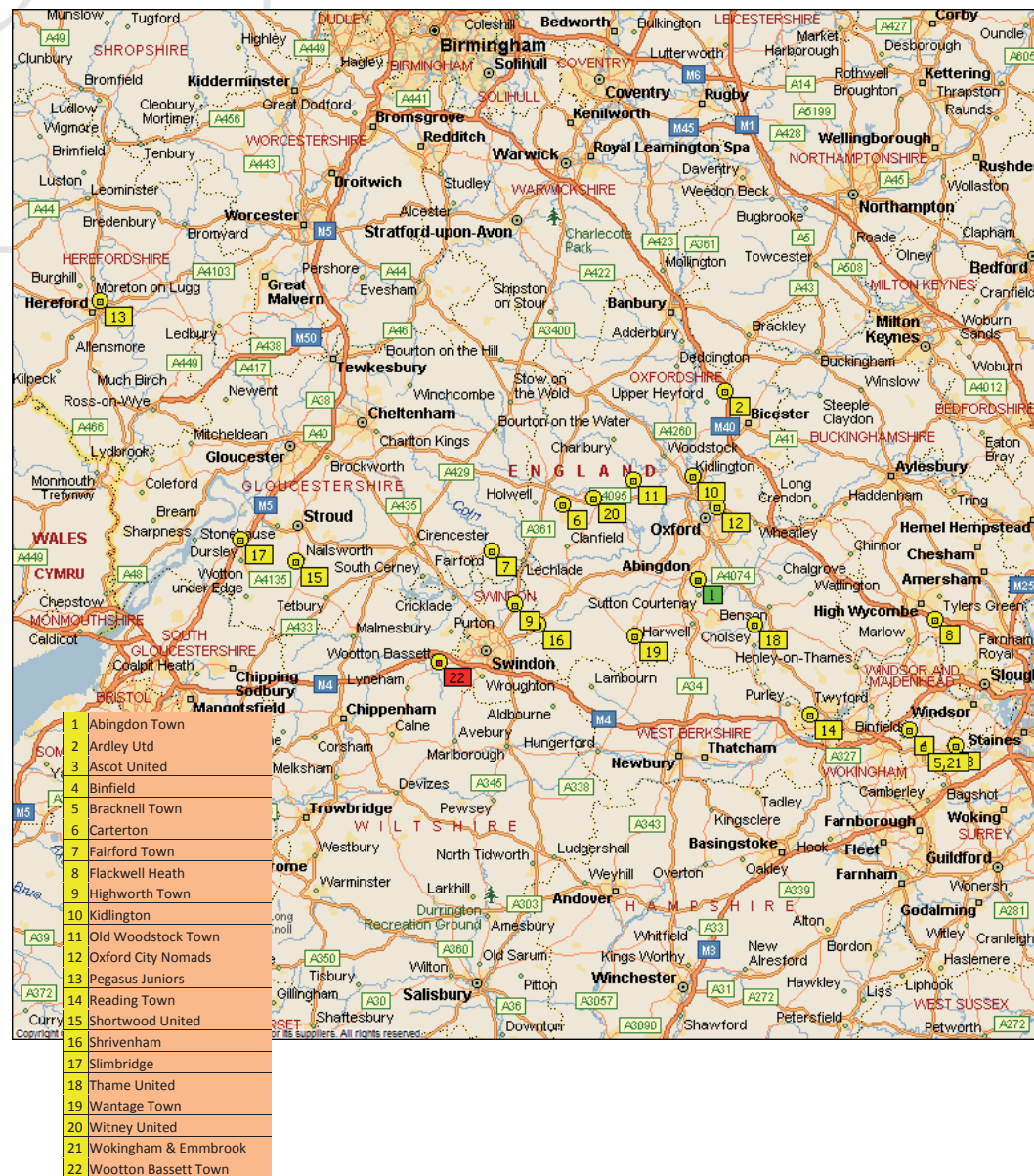
