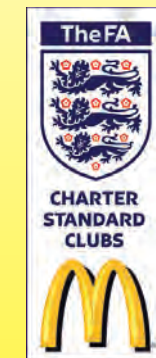

EDITORIAL

Good evening and welcome back to Rylands Way for this **Uhsport Hellenic Premier League** fixture against **Oxford City Nomads**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Oxford City** who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home.

Apologies if the Oxford City side tonight bears no resemblance to the list of names on the back of the programme but the visitors became the first side this season not to send the required information through to me ahead of the deadline for getting the programme to the printers. The squad list has been prepared from the pen pics on the league website and goal scorers on Mitoo.

What a fantastic result on Saturday against high flying **Flackwell Heath**. I understand it was one of our best performances of the season and to keep the prolific Flackwell strikers off the score sheet is no mean feat. **Ethan Delaney** grabbed the only goal of the game to deliver Wootton Bassett Town all three points against a free-scoring Flackwell Heath. The win ended our run of three straight league defeats and means we remain in touch with the sides in the top half of the Hellenic Premier Division table. The visitors, sixth at the beginning of play, came into the match as fourth top scorers in the division and had scored nine goals in their past two games, including half a dozen in a 6-5 Challenge Cup win against Headington Amateurs the previous Saturday. Given Bassetts recent defensive woes, ten conceded in our previous three league encounters, most would have expected Flackwell to have few difficulties finding the back of the net at Rylands Way. However, their arsenal of goal getters, including league leading scorer Danny Jordan, who has averaged a goal a game so far this campaign, were silenced thanks to a stoic defensive display from Daves troops. In fact, Flackwells only shot that threatened the hosts all afternoon came from an Adam Paget free kick which rattled the bar. Putting their recent troubles aside, Bassett more than matched their Buckinghamshire-based opponents, with neither side able to take the advantage in the opening half. The only goal of the game eventually came in the 75th minute as Ethan Delaney found the back of the net with a fantastic finish for only his second goal of the year. The defence then finished the job, holding out to preserve a valuable win.

Looking at what is in tonights programme, the **From the Archives** feature this week goes back over 100 years to **1907-08**. Nobody here tonight will remember this season which saw Wootton Bassett Town finish in third place in the Wiltshire League. The **Player Profile** this week features youngster **James Turner** (although his profile was I believe prepared by a consortium at a pre-season friendly). The August edition of the Clubs newsletter **Touchline** is once again featured and the **Moonraker** feature is replaced by a couple of articles from the Gazette & Heralds excellent coverage of Wiltshire football. Out on a Thursday, the paper has excellent coverage of football in the County including match reports on Wootton Bassett Town. There is the usual updated league table of the Clubs own **Fantasy Football League**. With the positions toght at the top and some high scores it looks like all participants are taking the competition seriously and actively using those transfers. **World of Soccer** tonight features an article prepared by Club Chairman Paul Harrison who reports on the exciting times at tonights opponents Oxford City and hints that our opposition tonight are a Club we should be looking to emulate. The **Youth Section** page includes latest league tables featuring a number of our young sides.

Next First Team home game is not until the end of the month when Binfield are the visitors to Rylands Way. There are however a couple of fixtures involving each of the Ladies side, the Reserves and the Under 18s during November and details can be found of the back cover.

Enjoy the game and cheer the lads on to three more points.

Good evening, welcome to you all and to our visitors from Oxford City.

As some of you may know I am currently supporting Oxford City in delivering their exciting project to develop a full size floodlit artificial grass pitch and six floodlit netball courts at their Court Place Farm site. We have been working hard for over 2 years now, securing the planning and funding for the project, and it is planned for building works to commence in the New Year. Through my involvement in the project I have been highly impressed with just how much this club is focused on providing football opportunities for its community, and their over 30 teams includes teams for those with learning difficulties and this season a deaf team also. Another simple community contribution is their requesting of a donation from spectators wishing to sit in the stand and the funds going to a local hospice. It is very useful to talk to other clubs about how they are run and operate, and certainly my work with Oxford City has introduced me to other ideas and thoughts on football club operation. This principle of discussing and sharing ideas with others is also being taken forward by our newly appointed Commercial Manager, Simon Baker, who plans to talk to a number of clubs at different levels in the football pyramid to see how they go about their commercial activities. Of course any club is only as good as its players, officials, and managers, and Oxford City is highly dependent on volunteers just as we are. Colin Taylor, their voluntary Managing Director, works tirelessly to operate and develop the club, and without him their project would not be so close to fruition as it is.

It is with much sadness that I report the recent death of John Reynolds, a stalwart volunteer of our club and the Sports Association, having served both as secretary, treasurer, chairman and vice chairman through the years. I particularly recall JR's willingness to step in as Chairman of our club following the sudden and immediate departure of a former chairman who had promised much, including funding for players, and left the club much weaker from his 3 months in charge. A keen Arsenal supporter, JR will be remembered for many a day by those who knew him, and I apologise to his family and friends that I could not make the funeral and that our club was not represented, this was no reflection of the respect held for him for his support of our club.

Heres to a great game, with the same result as earlier in the season so I can very much keep the bragging rights when meeting with Colin and others at the club!!

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Oxford City Nomads FC • Club History

Oxford City Nomads is the club's Hellenic League team formed to provide a strong standard of football to local youngsters and bridge the gap between the successful Oxford City youth structure and the club's Southern League team. The Nomads name is retained from the original association with neighbours Quarry Nomads FC in 2005 which competed for two seasons as Oxford Quarry Nomads in the Hellenic League Division One East playing at Court Place Farm Stadium. Upon the retirement of key officials Keith and Linda Dolton in 2007 it was decided to bring the team fully into the Oxford City structure yet ensure that the famous Nomads name lives on.



The Oxford City Nomads team won promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division in 2008/9 and last season finished in a creditable mid table position with a young team and scoring 100 goals. The focus is once again on youth development as the Nomads look to consolidate in season 2010/11 and keep a respectable league position. This will also be the first Oxford City Nomads team to play in the FA Vase – 15 years after Oxford City were beaten finalists at Wembley.

Quarry Nomads were founded in 1936, but football in Headington Quarry dates back to the latter part of the 19th century. The "Oxford Times" of 1893 reports that a football team has been formed in Quarry in direct opposition to the newly formed Headington United side, the paper also refers to them at the "semi-savages" from the Quarry. A suitable name was being considered for the team and someone suggested "The Nomads", everyone agreed.

In their first season the club lifted the Oxfordshire Youth Cup. Prior to the Second World War the team played in the Oxfordshire Youth League and when the war was over the club moved onto the Oxford City Football Association where the League Challenge Cup was won in 1950. Throughout the 1950's the club played in the Oxfordshire Junior League and then the Oxford Intermediate League before joining the Oxfordshire Senior League around 1960. Quarry Nomads continued playing in the Oxfordshire Senior League until the club hit rock bottom in 1981. The last season in the Senior League was 1984-85 when the club left the league and did not compete in competitive football for two years.

Quarry Nomads reformed at the start of the 1987-88 season under the guidance of Keith Dolton a former player who has been a member of the 1966 Oxfordshire Senior Cup winning side. The club entered the Oxford City FA Junior League. In season 1988-89 the club rejoined the Oxfordshire Senior League and ultimately returned to the Senior League Premier Division.

In 1994-95 the club was accepted into the Charrington Chiltonian League and finished runners-up to champions Denham United. The 1996-97 season saw them finish in 12th spot followed by 10th position for the next two seasons. It was back to 12th spot again in the last Chiltonian Premier Division when the club, along with the rest of the Chiltonian League joined Division One (East) of the enlarged Cherry Red Records Hellenic League for the season 2000-01. Season 2002-3 saw the team carry on from where they left off the previous term. All season the side were well up with the league leaders and a final good run of results saw the club take the league title by a clear seven points. The team enjoyed a good run in the Oxfordshire Charity Cup and got as far as the semi-finals before losing 1-0 to Oxfordshire Senior League side Eynsham Association. At the Hellenic Leagues A.G.M. the club was awarded the Hungerford Trophy – a fitting honour for Quarry Nomads.

In season 2005-06 the history of Quarry Nomads moved forward one more stage with the formal association with another famous local club, Oxford City.

This forward thinking partnership between two of Oxford's oldest clubs was a positive innovation for the development of players in the Oxford region and the renamed Oxford Quarry Nomads played all home 1st team matches at City's Court Place Farm Stadium and progressively adopted the Oxford City training and player development procedures.

afternoon, Devizes turned up with a much depleted squad, their captain and vice-captain both electing to play in a tournament at Lavington that had not been sanctioned by the County Association. Due to this, they were both stripped of their positions!

The six points earned in these games meant Bassett finished comfortably in third, albeit a good four points off runners-up Bradford Town and seven behind runaway winners Chippenham Town. Sadly for this season, results are missing from two fixtures, the away clashes with Bradford and Devizes, one of which, if the incomplete league table is correct, was drawn.

It has not been possible to trace the final league table but the substantially complete table and results and scorers (where known) for games played are shown below:

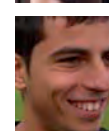

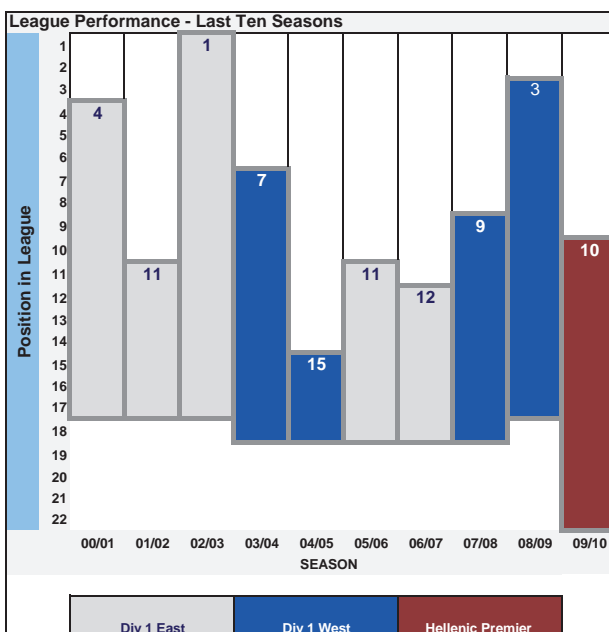
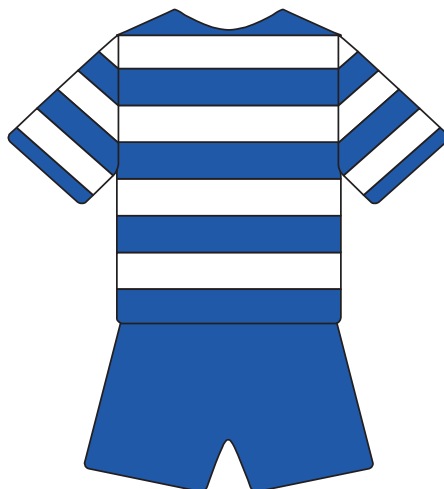

There was plenty of whistle in the second half: fouls, though not serious ones, were frequent. A few minutes after the restart there was a bit of a flare up between Suter and Tadd. Exactly what happened it was difficult to define in the moment. The ball was between the two and it eventually getting out of the scrum, Tadd kicked vigorously round Suters leg at the ball, which brought the latter down. The crowd roared for Tadds removal from the ground, claiming that it was a violent foul on Suter, but the referee was of the opinion that it was an accident, and allowed the game to proceed. Suter went off for a time, but returned later, and played a good game. Three players were winded by a ball striking them, and Tylee was stunned by a header. The game, which looked like a win for Wootton Bassett ended sensationally. Four minutes from the end Collar put in a run on the right, and sent in a shot. Tylee, one of the Bassett men, handled the ball, and the consequent penalty (it was within the area) was given to Duckett, and he scored a second time from the advantage, which made the scores level, and just pulled the game out of the fire.

Next up was the Senior Cup quarter final against Warminster, a game which the Gazette and Herald predicted Bassett to win, albeit by a small margin. One half of their prediction was proven right, but the final 6-1 scoreline was not what was expected. The surprise nature of the outcome paled in comparison though to other results as both Swindon Town Reserves and Salisbury City, billed as favourites for the contest, were eliminated by Chippenham Town and Devizes Town respectively.

A week later Bassett and Warminster met again, this time on the latters ground for the return league encounter. Despite their comfortable triumph a week earlier, Bassett continued to struggle to buy a win in the league as they went down by three goals to one. This form was then transferred to the cup as Bassett flopped dramatically with a berth in the final at stake. Playing Devizes at Melksham in front of a crowd estimated to have been between 1,000 and 1,500, the local press reported there had been a crush at the gate prior to the game, they lost 5-0, conceding four in the second half alone. There was no respite as Bassett then fell to Frome by the odd goal in seven, which sent the team hurtling down into sixth place.

However, an easy 4-0 win at home against Chippenham United reignited Bassetts season as March became April. Goalscorers for the hosts were Pinfield with two, Oakley and Boland. They then drew 1-1 at Chippenham Town in a controversial game despite only having ten men. Sweeper scored the visitors goal, but the referee, Mr. Preator, was the centre of attention in the Gazette and Herald, published on Thursday April 16th 1908:

In Mr. Preator, Bassett found an eleventh man. To their breaches of the several rules - fouls, charges, offsides etc - he adopted Nelsons policy of turning a blind eye, but with the other eye directed on the home players his vision was in magnitude equal to that of the famous Sam Weller [a character in The Pickwick Papers by Charles Dickens].

Bassett finished their season on a high with three straight home wins on Easter weekend. On Good Friday they easily dispatched of Calne, winning 4-1 despite playing without four key players, Boulter, Sweeper, Boland and Pinfield. That afternoon Fry netted a hat-trick, whilst Titcombe added the fourth. A day later Trowbridge were thumped 6-1, before Devizes were thrashed by the same scoreline on Easter Monday, in which Boland scored three. That

appearance last Saturday and scored two goals. Of the old players, George Hall has retired, but H. Boulter, F. Leighfield, Roland Pinfield, and Rouse are still donning the claret and blue jerseys.

Chippenham United were then seen off by a solitary goal at Hardenhuish Park. At home against reigning champions Bradford Town, a Coates goal helped secure a point, although the visitors late equaliser came in controversial fashion as there were doubts as to whether the ball crossed the line. By the middle of October Bassett were in second, a mere point behind early pacesetters Chippenham Town, but without a competitive game until the end of December they slowly drifted down the table. In November, Bassett played two friendly matches. The first came against the Haydon Street Workmen side, which was won 3-1 thanks to a double from Boland and a further goal from Coates. Then against Swindon Town Reserves, Bassett lost by the odd goal in three.

Bassetts league form took a dive when they did return to action. On December 28th they were held to a 2-2 home draw by Warminster Town, meaning they would start 1908 in fourth place, eight points off leaders Chippenham Town with three games in hand. Their first game of the New Year looked like an easy win as it was against bottom Calne Town. Played before the smallest gate of the season, Bassetts hosts, bereft of four of their strongest players, put in a resilient effort to claim a point in a 0-0 draw. It could have been worse for the visitors though had Calne not wasted what were described as two easy scoring chances in the opening half.

After two frustrating draws, the Wiltshire Senior Cup second round tie against the Haydon Street Workmen was therefore a timely distraction. And Bassett returned to winning ways with a comfortable 4-1 away victory. It was not the smallest margin of victory in the competition that weekend though, as the victorious sides combined notched more than 40 goals, whilst the losing teams could only muster 12 between them. That victory was arguably perfect preparation for the visit of leaders Chippenham Town a week later. The Thursday January 30th edition of the Gazette and Herald included the following summary under the headline [Chippenham Town]'s narrow escape of what was to be a topsy-turvy contest:

It has been the opinion for some time that Chippenham Town would meet with one of its sternest matches at Wootton Bassett, and that it would not be at all unlikely to "bite the dust" as a result of the visit. This materialised on Saturday, and its vigorous nature and close result justified anticipation. Two reports reach us of the match, but both agree as to the resolute stubbornness with which every phase of the situation was contested. Wootton Bassett appeared to be in the finest fighting fettle, and it was not long before it had three goals to its credit, Clifford conceding one point practically through applying his toe to the ball when he would have done better to have used his hands. Chippenham did not seem at home, but eventually got round to Rouse in the Bassett goal, and Duckett scored, a strong appeal for off-side being ignored by the referee. Wootton Bassett got a fourth before half-time, and Chippenham made its score up to three, with the aid of a penalty given for a foul against Duckett. Duckett negotiated the penalty successfully, and the scores were left in a most interesting position when the first half concluded.

Thompson heroics catalyst for comeback victory

Rylands Way, 16th December 2008

The moment Oxford City Nomads' tricky winger John Rixon was brought down and referee Hamilton believing the transgression occurred inside the penalty area pointed to the spot, it appeared as though things couldn't get much worse for Wootton Bassett Town.

With just under half an hour gone, and the Nomads in buoyant mood following Ben Moses' 21st minute headed opener, another goal would have likely put Bassett in a hole they would not be able to dig themselves out of.

However, Moses did not account for Stewart Thompson, who produced an outstanding save to his left to parry the spot kick away to safety. Thompson is by no means lacking in the height department, however even then he was stretched to his limits in order to get to a ball, which appeared to have been expertly placed in the right corner.

His save marked the turnaround in the game, and two goals from Shaun Terry at the end of the first half turned out to be enough to ensure Dave Turner's side jumped to fifth.

Bassett had started out the better of the two sides and in the opening ten minutes came close twice to taking the lead.

A Shaun Carter header beat 'keeper Milan Barisic two minutes in, but Kieron Lewis was there to head off the line before Tom Ritchie fluffed his lines when presented with a clear sight of goal following a Lee Moulton cut back.

The visitors had little trouble in front of goal though, converting their first chance thanks to Moses.

Following this, Turner's side found themselves under the cosh as a Nomads side with an abundance of pace really put the Bassett defence to the sword.

They were not able to capitalise on this pressure though with Shaw missing when he should have done better followed by Moses' penalty miss.

Granted a lifeline, Terry made quick work of turning the tables. Four minutes before the break he provided a simple tap in after Ryan Banks could only find the post from close range following Richie Carter's chipped ball.

Minutes later Carter provided another pinpoint diagonal pass, which the Nomads defence could do nothing about. And Terry was there at the left post to smash the ball home from 12 yards.

The goals came at a time when the Nomads were still in relative control of the game, and throughout the second half they continued to control possession. Yet stiffer resistance from the Bassett backline meant they were limited mostly to half chances.

One fine chance did come with just under twenty minutes to go as Shaw was set free by Moses. However, just as in the first half, he wasted a fantastic opportunity, dragging his shot across the face of goal and well wide of the left post.

Instead, it could well have been three for Bassett. Twice before Shaw's opportunity chances were had by the hosts to kill the game off.

Firstly, Terry was unlucky not to complete his hat trick, curling an effort from what seemed to be an impossible angle on the right inches wide of the post.

Moments on, the Nomads were caught outnumbered with Scott Ward surging forward, but he played his pass behind Terry and Ryan Banks, who were both unmarked.

Then in the dying minutes a surging run down the left by Banks opened things up for Terry, but he curled a shot across goal and wide.

An unfortunate Terry was sent off in the dying seconds for apparent foul and abusive language, putting a dampener on what was otherwise a fantastic night.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Richie Carter - creator of the two goals and dynamic in the centre of midfield. Both going forward and defensive, he performed his duties admirably.

Scoop Rating: 7/10 - following an uneasy first half performance - in spite of the fact Bassett ended up in the lead by the end of the half - things really tightened up in the second period as the Nomads' dynamic attack was shut out.

James Turner (midfielder)

A hard working centre-midfielder, Turner is a Cirencester Academy graduate and was an integral part of their youth side, along with Ryan Thomas and Steve Groom, who made it to the third round proper of the FA Youth Cup where they lost by a single goal to Sunderland at The Stadium of Light. At Ciren he featured once for their first team in a Southern League Cup match against Swindon Supermarine during the 2008/09 season; prior to that he had featured sparingly for Pewsey Vale whilst his dad Dave was manager. He also made eight appearances for Bassett in 2008/09, scoring the teams only goal of the game away to Winterbourne United, his first start for the club, to earn a point. Last season he was joint-leading appearance maker at Rylands Way, featuring in all but one match and formed one of the best central midfield partnerships in Division One West with Terry Adams. Generally the more defensive of the pair, Turner supplied just two goals, both coming against Purton, during the promotion winning season, but both were candidates for goal of the season.



fine shot. Bassett equalised and at the "breather" (which was most welcome) the score was one each. Not long after crossing over the homesters added two more, but the Somerset men did the same, and ten minutes from time the score was three all. From this point, however, Frome went to pieces, and making the most of this opportunity, the homesters put on three more, winning by six to three. Undoubtedly the better team won, but Frome gave one the impression that it will accomplish some good performances during the season. The homesters combined splendidly, and their backs played an especially sound game.

However, a week later Bassett suffered a 4-1 reverse at the hands of Melksham Town. A strange scheduling quirk meant though that the sides met again the following weekend. Even stranger was the fact this time Bassett, playing at home, were the team to triumph 4-1. The Thursday September 26th edition of the Gazette and Herald carried this summary of the game:

Wootton Bassett was at home to Melksham in the presence of a good crowd on Saturday. Play opened and soon Melksham was seen pressing. Rogers tested Rouse in the first few minutes but the shot was cleverly cleared. Boland looked like getting through, but Rogers robbed him, and passed onto Deverall, who got away, swinging across a splendid centre. Sheppard beat Rouse with a good shot. This seemed to "rouse" the home team, and it soon settled down to retrieve the reverse. Boland gave nicely to Pinfield, who took the ball, and in turn centred. Coates dashed between the backs, beating Park all the way. Melksham then took up the attack, but the home defence kept it at bay. Eventually Leighfield gave to Coates, who drew out the defence, and then giving to Iles, the latter went through and gave Bassett the lead.

The visitors were not to be shaken off easily, their forwards well backed up by Rogers and Co. forced Rouse to concede a corner, which was well taken, the Bassett custodian fisting out and Tylee clearing.

Suter, the old Swindon amateur, got possession, and passing to Coates, that player scored No. 3 and a half-time the score stood: Wootton Bassett, 3; Melksham 1. The second half opened even, both sides attacking in turn. Melksham came very near scoring, Boulter heading away. The visitors came again through Deverall, but Major clearing well. Coates got away, passed to Pinfield, who sent over a ripping centre, and Fry headed past Park. The home side, with this substantial lead, slowed down, and when the whistle blew the home side retired winners by 4 to 1. The Bassett team was:- Rouse; Major and Tylee; Boulter, Suter (captain), and Leighfield; Pinfield, Boland, Coates, Fry and Iles.

This victory set in motion a seven game unbeaten stretch in the league that extended well into the year. An own goal and mistake from the Trowbridge Town keeper helped gift the visitors a 3-0 win. The Saturday October 5th edition of The Borough Press included the following comment on the state of the side in its report on the game, which goes some way in demonstrating their reliance on Swindon-based players:

There is some new talent - W. Iles, late of the New Century and Tylee and Richens, late of Haydon Street. Richens was formerly an old Wootton Bassett player, he figured in the final for them in the Wilts Cup three seasons ago. Another young and promising player has been signed on in young Sweeper, who made his first

Season 1907-08 Any Old Port in a Storm

What was going on in the world

Robert Baden Powell begins the Boy Scout movement. Cellophane is invented by Swiss textile engineer Jacques E Brandenberger. Herbert Asquith becomes Liberal prime minister and as the season comes to a close the Summer Olympics begin in London. Britain and Russia agree an entente on "spheres of influence" in Asia. In the world of football Swindon Town, strengthened by the signing of Harold Fleming, finish 5th in Southern League Division One, Queens Park Rangers winning the title. In the top division in the country, Manchester United, in only their second season back in the top flight, win the title, nine points ahead of second placed Aston Villa. Wolves win the FA Cup final, defeating Newcastle United 3-1 at Crystal Palace. England and Scotland are joint winners of the Home International Championship and Celtic again achieve the double in Scotland.

The Wiltshire County League entered a new era for the 1907-08 season as it was to be the first full season since the passing of its Chairman and founding father Reverend W. N. Campbell Wheeler, who had died in January. Furthermore the landscape of the league had changed pretty dramatically. Gone were Somerset side Yeovil Casuals as well as Swindon Haydon Street Workmen, who had lasted just a year at county level, and 121st R.F.A., who had decamped elsewhere in the country. Stepping up to the top tier of football in Wiltshire though were Calne Town, who would geographically be Wootton Bassett Towns closest rivals for the coming season.

Going into the season, Bassett had improved off as well as on the pitch, although the future of the club was not secure, as the preview provided by the Gazette and Herald on Thursday September 5th 1907 explains:

Wootton Bassett has considerably improved its dressing room accommodation, and visitors to the Red Lion Hotel this season will find every modern convenience, and the luxury of a modern bath. The committee has been reorganised with Dr. Klumpp as President. Several new players will be seen in the team, including Tilley, late of the Haydon Street Workmens club team, and Suter, who was formerly with the Swindon Amateurs Club, and the Secretary [Mr E. R. Wallis] is hopeful that the team will improve its position this season. It is, of course, relying on the independence of the League to grant it permission to play a few unattached Swindon men, who cannot get any county football unless they play for Bassett. The first match is on Saturday at home, when the locals meet Frome Town. A Reserve team is being: it is entered in the Marlborough and District League. The Premier team is also competing for the Wilts Cup.

Against Frome, Bassett showed they had put their late season collapse from the previous season behind them with a convincing 6-3 victory. Under the headline "Wootton Bassett floors Frome" the Thursday September 12th 1907 edition of the Gazette and Herald carried the following report:

For its opening match at Wootton Bassett Frome took rather a weak side but nevertheless it put up a good fight, and it was only in the last few minutes that it was beaten. The visitors actually opened the scoring, Shackleton doing the trick with a

FOOTBALL: Double trouble for Calne as club suffers second sanction

NICK Vitale admits Calne Town's Toolstation League points deduction could cost them dearly.

Joint-boss Vitale is fuming after the Lilywhites were hit with a second set of sanctions for playing the ineligible Dan Lardner at the start of the season.

Lardner joined the Bremhill View club in the summer but was banned after failing to pay £24 in fines owed to the Wiltshire FA, for bookings picked up for Melksham Town last season.

Despite Calne beating Corsham Town in the extra preliminary round of the FA Cup in August, the club were subsequently booted out of the competition due to the midfielder's involvement.

The midfielder has since paid the fine, but Vitale's side have now been deducted four points for using the player in their opening two league games against Cadbury Heath and Keynsham Town.

"We've lost the points from the two games he played in and it's all a complete mess-up over £24 - that's what's pathetic," said Vitale.

"I'm frustrated with everybody because it could end up derailing our season.

"Our vice-chairman checked if he was eligible to play with the Western League, who said he was fine to play, but it looks like he should have checked with the Wilts FA.

"The committee do everything for us and there wouldn't be a club without them but this whole mess-up could really cost us - but the league have messed up too.

"If we miss out on getting promoted by four points then this will brought up again."

Toolstation League secretary Ken Clarke said of the deduction: "It's the standard rules and repercussions. Unfortunately, it's been a double-edged sword for them."

Bassetts October Blues End

If Ian Holloway was asked to describe Wootton Bassett Towns 2-1 victory against Rayners Lane in the Hellenic League Challenge Cup second round, he would undoubtedly have compared it to pulling not the best looking of birds. But having missed experiencing the sweet sensations of victory for the best part of a month, Dave Turners side would have taken whatever they could get. At times, it certainly was not pretty. Particularly so during the opening quarter of an hour when the home side took the lead, taking advantage of a Bassett side who seemed bereft of confidence and organisation. After seeing a long range effort of his deflected narrowly over by Shaun Carter, Ben Gill was gifted the easiest of the finishes from the ensuing corner. Paul Leslies set piece certainly was not the best ever as he failed to put any kind of height on his kick, but it seemed to do the trick as two Bassett defenders swung and missed the leather. Unmarked and six yards out, Gill could not miss and he duly steered the ball home much to Turners dismay. Moments later it could have been two as Rayners Lane broke quickly after Terry Adams had his pocket picked in the middle of the park. Dene Gardner was the one who came away with the ball, and after a give-and-go with Mark Wooley, he shot powerfully from the edge of the area, but could only manage to blaze over. Having taken some time to settle, Bassett eventually began to create chances of their own. Twelve minutes before the break, a neat pass from Adams presented Matt Bown with an opening on the edge of the area and his low drive travelled across the face of goal and inches wide of the left post. Then on the stroke of half time the visitors were level thanks to the prolific Sam Collier. Rayners Lane were guilty of failing to clear their lines and Bown delivered an inch-perfect cross from the right wing that Collier connected with, and the forwards looping header from eighteen yards sailed into the top right corner.

The equaliser seemed to buoy Bassett as they came out a much improved team during the second half. They were more comfortable and less wasteful in possession and began to assert a level of territorial dominance. However, they were not able to convert into meaningful chances, and on a huge pitch were extremely susceptible to being caught on the break. After a swift counter in the 55th minute, a Woolley cross was volleyed towards goal by Gill, but another timely deflection meant Stewart Thompson was not forced into action. Five minutes later, Woolley was once again in the thick of action as he pulled the ball back for full-back Damian Cruikshank, but the diminutive defender could only drive his effort into the side netting. Thompson was then called upon to make an assured save as he held firm from Dean Ryan's glancing header following a Gill corner. Bassetts bad habits returned for a brief period midway through the half. Having been introduced to the game a couple minutes earlier, Liam Edmondson was caught dithering on the ball inside his own box after a poor call from Thompson. This allowed Dene Gardner to dispossess him easily before quickly turning and shooting, but fortunately the Bassett custodian was able to parry wide. Soon after, with possession conceded cheaply again, the magnificent Cruikshank had the keeper beaten all ends up, as he blasted the ball towards goal from range. His thunderbolt though cannoned back out off the woodwork. That let off allowed Bassett to have the last laugh, and Collier supplied the winner with fifteen minutes remaining. Reminiscent of his first, it came from a perfectly weighted cross, this time from Craig Bowden, who had been brought on as a makeshift forward. After cutting inside from the right, Bowdens left foot delivery was sublime, and Collier produced a header to match from fifteen yards, redirecting the ball into the top right corner. The hosts, however, would not give up without a fight and they forced countless corners in the dying seconds. But Bassett showed their recent record late on aside and astutely saw out the remainder of the game to seal a timely victory. It may not have been the most aesthetically pleasing, but it is a first notch on the bedpost this month.

Scoops Man of the Match: Shaun Carter ☑ imperious at the back, winning almost every aerial battle and he displayed a composure that has in recent weeks been missing. Having Chris Oram back with him certainly seemed to have helped.

Scoop Rating: 6/10 ☑ it was not a vintage performance, with the display in the first half in particular being disjointed. However, Bassetts spirit showed as they not only came from behind, but also dealt brilliantly with a late onslaught from the hosts.



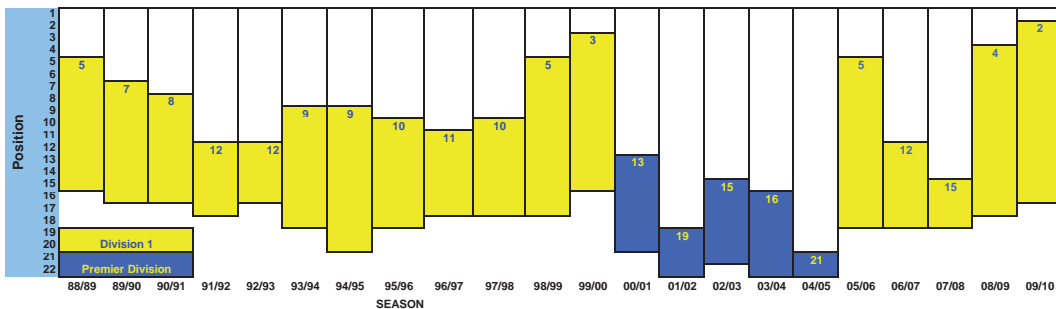
