

EDITORIAL

Good afternoon, Happy New Year and welcome back at long last to Rylands Way for this **Uhlsport Hellenic Premier League** fixture against **Thame United**. Hopefully the cold and then wet weather that has gripped the country will have subsided allowing this fixture to go ahead. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Thame** who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home back to Oxfordshire. Thame are a club that have played at a much higher level in the Pyramid but, like Bracknell, have fallen on hard times. However, with a brand new stadium most pundits will be expecting them to match their off field hard work with promotions back up the football pyramid in the not too distant future. A tough fixture on our return to Rylands Way is certainly on the cards today.

Todays fixture is the first home fixture for the First Team since November 2nd and follows five consecutive away games. Dave may have to introduce the home players to the crowd as it is so long since the First Team played here in anger. The good news (or not so good news depending on how you look at it) we now have six home games in the next month! Regarding all the postponements over the last month or so, I cannot recall games being called off in November before for snow and frozen pitches, waterlogged pitches yes but frozen grounds at that time of the year is not a regular occurrence. Hopefully January and February will be kinder than usual else we are really going to struggle to complete the fixture list. Prior to today we have played 18 out of 42 fixtures. When I was Fixture Secretary of the North Wilts League my rule of thumb was that clubs should look to have played half their league games by Christmas and we were 3 short of that target and in a division of some 22 teams.

That game way back on 2nd November saw Wootton Bassett lose 5-2 at home against a rejuvenated Oxford City Nomads. We followed this with a narrow 2-1 away win at Shrivenham courtesy of a late Sam Collier strike. There is a report from Scoop on this match in tonights programme. Another good performance followed away at title chasing Slimbridge where we held out until four minutes from time. After two good showings I know Dave was then very disappointed by the draw against bottom side Fairford and, despite not securing any points, was encouraged by the better showing midweek away at Old Woodstock Town. The Fairford game just showed that you have to be at your best for each and every game in this league, with anyone capable of beating anyone on their day. We then went 40 days before playing again, the New Year Bank Holiday fixture away at Highworth on 3rd January being our first game since 24th November. We were understandably rusty on our return to action going down 5-1 in a disappointing performance against a side we beat here at Rylands earlier in the season. Manager Dave Turner comments on the Highworth game in his **From The Dugout** column.

Looking at what else is in tonights programme, the **From the Archives** feature this week goes back to **1996-97** and a frustrating season in the Hellenic League Division One under Kevin Maloney. Unfortunately we do not have a **Player Profile** this week as I do not have any more unused profiles. If any player has not been featured in the programme yet it would be appreciated if they could email either myself or the website editor answers to the standard questions (email addresses are on the inside front cover). The **Moonraker** feature again includes recent articles from the Gazette & Heralds excellent coverage of Wiltshire football. There is the usual updated league table of the Clubs own **Fantasy Football League** which sees Bryan Wood still leading the way. The **Youth Section** page includes a round-up from young Luke Walduck from games played last Sunday. There is also a **New Year Mr Men competition** with a case of Peroni to the winner. All you need to do is match the Mr Men character to the Wootton Bassett Town player, manager, committee member, league official or ex-players, managers and committee members. The entry which most closely matches mine wins the case of beer (please note competition is only open to over 18s).

Finally the next First Team home game is next Saturday when **Carterton** are the visitors to Rylands Way. Enjoy the game and cheer the lads on to three more points. Best Wishes.

World of Soccer This week FEATURING...... Former Chairman Mark Smedley

Whilst results have not being going our way of late it could be worse for Coach Turner, he could be manager of Cornish side Madron. Madron play in the top division of the Mining League which feeds into the Cornwall Combination. Madron were promoted to the top division of the Mining Football League last season but lost a number of first-team players and have been forced to assemble a brand new, and evidently struggling, squad. The Penzance based team arrived for a game in mid-November against Illogan Reserves with just seven players and Illogan seized on their numerical advantage by racing into a 24-0 half time lead. It was to get worse for Madron in the second half as they conceded another 31 goals to go own 55-0. The result of the match made the national dailies as it eclipsed the previous British record set in 1885 by Arbroath who thumped Bon Accord 36-0. However, it was still someway short of the world record which belongs to Madagascan side AS Adema, who watched on as Stade Olympique players repeatedly knocked in own goals in protest at a refereeing decision in their match in 2002. No doubt the new official British record has also been beaten by a kids game somewhere in the UK, even if it was just one with jumpers for goal posts.

What about Wootton Bassett Towns worst defeat? The Non-League Club Directory has for many years shown our record defeat as being 0-9 but this information is not correct. Although there are still many results to trace the record defeat that I have found so far in researching the history of the club is a 2-13 away defeat to Melksham Town in Season 1937-38, Pearce and Gleed on target for Bassett in this humiliation. The second highest number of goals conceded appears to be the 12 shipped at Paulton Rovers on 11th March 1967, however, in a remarkable game, Wootton Bassett scored five of their own through Michael Izquierdo (2), Dave Challis (2) and Mike Beale. The record win for the First Team appears to be the 16-0 win over Clyffe Pypard in Season 1932-33; this after Bassett put 14 past the same opponents in the previous season. This is not a Club record as I recall the U18 side that I played in during the late 1970s/ early 1980s scoring something like 17 against Sherston and the clubs youth side put 20 without reply past the Labour Party in Season 1934-35 in the Swindon & District League. A player named Gleed scoring seven times in this big win. No doubt again there will be a youth game that exceeds this score somewhere in the clubs history.

As a footnote Madron sacked their goalkeeper for not trying in the game against Illogan.

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Thame United FC • Club History

Thame was formed in 1883 making it one of Oxfordshires' oldest clubs. Its early years were spent in Oxfordshire Leagues and in 1906, 1909 and 1910 Thame won the Oxfordshire Senior Cup and the Senior League in 1907, 1908, 1910, 1930 and 1931. A switch to the Hellenic League then brought further success culminating in the Hellenic League title in 1961-62 and 1969-70, as well as being runners up in 1960-61, 1976-77 and 1980-81. The Oxfordshire Senior Cup was won in both 1976 and 1981 but a poor spell in the mid eighties preceded a crossing of the pyramid in 1988-89 to join the South Midlands League. The Club finished runners up in both 1988-89 and 1989-90 before eventually winning the title in 1990-91.



Thame received the green light to join the Diadora League in 1991/92. 1994-95 saw the Club win the Division 2 Championship with 93 points - an 11 point margin. In 1995/96 the Club reached the 3rd Round Qualifying in the FA Cup and the FA Trophy. In the league we finished a creditable 13th in our first ever season in the Isthmian League Division One. Andy Sinnott was appointed first team manager in June 1997 and, with a dramatically reduced operating budget, the side were relegated into Ryman Division Two. The Club bounced straight back into Ryman Division One and reached the semi-finals of the FA Vase. 1999/2000 saw the Club come within two points of achieving promotion to the Premier Division.

2000/2001 season the team lead the way for most of the season, putting together a club record of 12 consecutive league wins but a slump in form in the latter part of the season resulted in a 5th place. A mid-table finish followed in 2001/2002 season but the Oxfordshire Senior Cup was retained. Mark West was appointed player/manager when Andy left United during the Summer of 2003. In October 2003 the club reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup for the first time in its history, before being beaten 1-2 by Conference side Farnborough Town. After a mid-table finish the Club moved to the newly formed Southern League, Division 1 West. In October 2004 the Club again reached the FA Cup 4th qualifying round and finished the season 11th in the league. Mark West left to join Slough and defender Tony Joyce was appointed player /manager.

By July 2005 the Club were in financial trouble and, following a visit from Bailiffs acting on behalf of HMRC, the landlord enforced a clause in the tenancy agreement and evicted the club from Windmill Road. A ground share agreement was reached with neighbours Aylesbury United and, with the side struggling at the foot of the Southern League Division 1 West, Tony Joyce resigned in December 2005, with a new joint managerial partnership of Richard Searl and Alan Thorne appointed. Relegation to the Hellenic League was confirmed later in the season. A ground share agreement was reached with AFC Wallingford for the 2006/07. Mark West returned to the Club mid-way through the season but could not save the Club from relegation to the Hellenic League Division 1 East. The 2007/08 season provided greater stability for the Club, with Mark West and new assistant, Frank Thompson, looking after first team affairs. A mid-table finish resulted, which was followed by a ninth placed finish in 2008/09. 2009/10 saw the Club win the Division 1 East title by six points and reclaim their place in the Premier Division.

Off the field, significant progress has been made with respect to returning Thame United to Thame. Planning permission was secured for a new ground in 2008, comprising a main stadium pitch, seven additional pitches and a 3G training pitch for use by Thame United and Thame Boys, Youth and Girls FC under a new umbrella organisation, the Thame Football Partnership. Funding was ultimately secured for the £3.1m project and works commenced at Meadow View Park in March 2010, with a view to the ground being completed in Autumn 2010, at which time Thame United will return to Thame.

and Peter Dearlove. With the aggregate score level the tie went into extra time during which neither side was able to find the back of the net meaning that penalties were needed to decide who would progress to the final. Unfortunately for Wootton Bassett they lost the penalty shoot out 4-3 to crash out at the semi-final stage for the second consecutive season. On the return to league action a point was secured as Wootton Bassett shared four goals with Cirencester United, Scott Vincent and Peter Dearlove with the Bassett goals. Having already met Harrow Hill twice in the month Wootton Bassett again had to make the long journey to the Forest of Dean as the two sides met in the league. A disappointing 3-0 reverse saw Bassett return with no reward and were no doubt pleased to see the back of Harrow Hill who had done the league double over Bassett as well as knocking them out the league cup. March ended with another long away trip, this time to Hereford to play Pegasus Juniors. Bassett went down 3-1 to continue a poor run of league form, Simon Green with the Bassett consolation goal.

April was to be a very busy month as Wootton Bassett played catch-up with their league fixtures with nine games being squeezed into the month. The month opened with another defeat, Kidlington winning 3-0 on their own patch. After four league games without a win in the league the poor run was finally ended with a narrow 2-1 away win at Ross Town, Gary Ashford and Peter Dearlove with the important goals. Two 1-1 draws at home followed against Bishops Cleeve and local rivals Purton, Dominic Franklin netting against Cleeve and Peter Dearlove scoring in the local derby game. With the games coming thick and fast it was not surprising that during this spell Wootton Bassett put in a poor performance and crashed to their biggest defeat of the season, a 5-0 reverse at home at the hands of Kidlington. Goalkeeper Steve Hale again conceded five in the next fixture away two days later at Hallen but at least Wootton Bassett did manage a goal this time, Scott Vincent scoring in the 5-1 defeat. Just another two day break before the next fixture but Wootton Bassett were able to end the bad spell with a 2-0 away win at Clanfield, Scott Vincent and an own goal giving Bassett all three points. The season ended with three consecutive defeats at home, three games in which Wootton Bassett failed to score. A 4-0 home defeat to Milton was followed by a 3-0 loss at Purton and the season ended with a 1-0 defeat at home to champions Ardley United. These three defeats ensured Wootton Bassett did not improve on the previous seasons tenth spot, slipping one place in the table to eleventh. Goals had been the problem with just 37 scored in the league, with just three sides registering a lower tally. The joint top scorers were Ian Curtis and Gary Ashford, both netting just six times in the league and twice in cup competitions to head the goal scoring charts with the relatively low total of eight goals. Despite the lack of goals and a lower league position there was to be some consolation for the Club though as they won the Hellenic League Division One sportsmanship award. Kevin Maloney stepped down as manager after two seasons to be replaced by Dave Warren.

Curtis and Dominic Franklin. Next up was the Third Round of the League Cup and a visit to Clanfield where Bassett gained revenge for the league defeat in September with another excellent four goal performance, Harrison, Curtis and Ashford again on the score sheet along with Peter Dearlove in the 4-1 win. The victory gave Wootton Bassett Town a semi-final place for the fifth consecutive season. The cup win was to be the last time Bassett tasted victory in November as just one point was secured in the three league games that followed. A 1-0 defeat away at Cirencester United was followed a 2-1 home defeat to Cheltenham Saracens, Peter Dearlove with the consolation goal. The run of defeats was ended when Wootton Bassett shared the points in a 1-1 home draw with Pegasus Juniors, Ian Curtis netting for Bassett. The game saw Steve Hale play his first game of the season in goal for Bassett.

If November was a disappointing one in the League for Bassett, December 1996 saw the side remain undefeated in the month. A comprehensive 3-0 win over Easington Sports was most welcome, the win coming courtesy of goals from Gary Ashford, Ian Curtis and Jeremy Newton. The calendar year ended with two drawn games. Ian Curtis scored in the 1-1 draw against Hallen at Rylands Way and neither side found the net when Wootton Bassett visited Milton United. Little did those at Wootton Bassett know that it would be 15th February, nearly two months, before another league game would be played.

The New Year always brings with it the County Cup and 1997 was no different. Wootton Bassett had been given a bye in the First Round and the Second Round opponents were GPS Plessey. Due to bad weather the game was postponed until 18th January and when the game was finally played, goals from Gary Ashford, Justin Hyde and Dominic Franklin ensured a 3-1 win and a passage into the next round where the opponents would be another Wilts League side, Marlborough. Again due to bad weather this was in fact the next game with Marlborough visiting Rylands Way. In a tight game neither side could find the next meaning a replay the following week at Marlborough. A week later Wootton Bassett found themselves on the end of a shock County Cup exit as they lost 2-0 to their Wiltshire League opponents.

When Wootton Bassett Town returned to league action they put the disappointing cup exit behind them. Two goals from a returning Scott Vincent and one from Gary Ashford helped Wootton Bassett to a 3-1 away win at high flying Cheltenham Saracens. This was followed up with three more points at home the following week against Headington Amateurs as Wootton Bassett matched their best win of the season, scoring four goals through Gary Ashford (2), Newnham and an own goal.

It was at the beginning of November that Wootton Bassett Town had qualified for the League Cup semi-final and the tie, which was to be played over two legs, was eventually scheduled for the first two weeks of March. Of the fourteen man squad who had defeated Clanfield, only Paul Harrison, Barry Giles, Gary Ashford, Dominic Franklin and Peter Dearlove played in the First Leg at Harrow Hill which saw a disappointing 2-0 defeat. For the return leg at Rylands Way, Simon Green, Justin Hyde and Paul Parsons all returned and a much improved performance saw Wootton Bassett get back level on aggregate terms with Harrow Hill, leading 3-1 at the end of ninety minutes courtesy of goals from Barry Giles, Scott Vincent

The season starts with the Olympics taking place in Atlanta, USA. The season ends with Michael Jackson at the top with Blood on the Dance Floor and a new government in the UK, the Labour Party ending eighteen years of Conservative government, with Tony Blair the new Prime Minister. Britain is also about to hand Hong Kong back to China. In the world of football Manchester United win the Premier League, seven points ahead of second placed Newcastle United. Immaculate Deflection Provides Timely Victory

Cometh the hour, cometh the man (and the timeliest of wicked deflections). A pair of second half goals from Wootton Bassett Town talisman Sam Collier, the second of which decided the outcome of the game in the final minute, gave his side all three points in their derby encounter with Shrivenham.

Colliers contribution was made all the more significant considering the fact Bracknell Town, Thame United, Oxford City Nomads and Abingdon Town all triumphed, meaning Dave Turners side maintain the degree of separation between themselves and those below. For Shrivenham though it was a result they arguably could ill afford, even at this stage of the season. The 2-1 loss seemed slightly harsh on the early season strugglers, who put up a hearty battle, but nonetheless defeat leaves them ten points adrift of Bassett, and six behind fifth from bottom Bracknell. John Fishers side certainly deserved their lead though after edging what had been a tight opening. They were, however, aided by vet more carelessness in possession from Bassett, Having committed men forward, the blocking of Sean Baileys free kick afforded the hosts the perfect chance to counter. And they did so through the impressive Rory Sproule, who after a surging run which saw him breeze past Chris Oram, squared for veteran Steve Avenall to supply the easiest of finishes half an hour in. Following their wake up call, Bassett began to get a firmer footing in the game and could well have been on level terms at the break after forging a string of decent chances. Shortly after conceding, Terry Adams tested Luke Alford from distance, but his failure to get enough power behind his shot afforded the home custodian a comfortable save. Alex Green then directed a header from a pin-point Mark McMeeking cross narrowly over before Sam Collier rose highest to connect with a Matt Bown delivery, but his header was, fortuitously for the hosts, hacked off the line.

Following the restart, Turners side assumed the ascendancy and began causing a Shrivenham defence that had performed stoutly for the majority of the opening half problems. Bown was typically the source of Bassetts chances, with his deliveries from the right wing and corner kicks especially troubling. In the 58th minute, his perfectly placed cross should have been rewarded by Green, but the front man failed to stick one past his former team, glancing his header way wide when it appeared easier to score. Moments later Collier succeeded where his strike partner did not. Amongst a congested pack of players, he once again rose highest to divert a teasing Bown corner towards goal. And after what seemed an eternity the ball eventually nestled in the top right corner beyond the flailing grasp of Alford He then almost grabbed a second within ten minutes of equalising, but his low curling effort went narrowly wide following a perfectly weighted set down from Bailey. The final twenty minutes of the contest were frantic, with both sides showing daring for reasons outlined earlier. First, Bown raced onto a Collier flick on and flashed a shot from the edge of the area across goal, forcing an outstretched Alford to awkwardly parry the ball away to safety. At the other end, a low drive from Craig Whitbread had Stewart Thompson at full stretch, the ball squirming from his clutches. Only a snap clearance from a fortunately positioned Oram prevented the hosts from firing the ball into the back of the net. With the game seemingly headed for a draw, the match was settled in dramatic fashion in the final minute. Shrivenham were given a taste of their own medicine as well, with a quick counter initiated by Thompson creating the goal. The keeper, after assuredly handling a firmly struck Shane Davies effort, reversed the direction of play instantaneously. His punt was then expertly controlled by Collier, who shrugged off the attentions of his marker before firing towards goal from 25 yards. Alford seemed set to deal with the effort, but a wicked deflection wrong-footed him and the keeper was helpless from preventing the ball nestling in the bottom left corner. The bragging rights Fisher had commented were on the line prior to proceedings belonged to Bassett.

Scoops Man of the Match: Sam Collier, once again his goal scoring exploits inspired Bassett to three valuable points. Despite the physical, yet fair approach of the home defence, Collier persisted for the entire ninety minutes and was duly rewarded.

Scoop Rating: 6/10, it was not the greatest of performances, but the sense of relief amongst the Bassett management once the final whistle blew was tangible. This was one of the biggest games of the season so far, with Dave Turners side, after a period of indifferent league form, looking to prevent themselves being dragged into the mire at the bottom end of the table. And his troops delivered the three points, which is all that matters, no matter how.






Senior teams: Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBTFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground frading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival. Well rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1st team, reserves, and under18s, Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Bassett, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide

Youth teams: Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/ finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators. managers, assistants and players...,ves even the first team!). Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and plaving pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBTFC just short of £19,000 in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees. insurance, plaving / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some £35,000 per season! Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined membership/ training fee in the form of a standing order payment. To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for 12 months (not just the playing season!) The current charge is £18 per month (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is vital that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process in updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne. The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions




