# EDITORIAL

Hopefully today will see me attending my first First Team fixture since October, which was the away fixture at Rayners Lane. Seems a long time ago now!

It was good to catch a Reserve Team game here at Rylands the other Saturday and it was pleasing to see so many young players performing for the Town. It was particularly pleasing to see Phil Tearle, George Drewitt and Steve Groom, all of whom used to play for my youth side, in action. Following the win last Saturday at Kidlington the Reserves are now unbeaten in three, which Simon Paish told me on the phone this was the first time they had done that since he took over the running of the side. Hopefully this good run will continue and it was certainly pleasing to see some of the enthusiastic Facebook comments following the win at Kidlington.

Last weeks First Team game against Thame was, by all accounts, a very close affair and we went close to equalising in the closing stages but it was not to be. Game by game we are now getting drawn closer and closer to the relegation dogfight and it is important that we start picking up points again if the threat of a relegation battle is to be avoided. After such a bright start by all accounts the confidence appears to have gone a little from our game but the two home fixtures against Carterton and Fairford looked games that provided an opportunity to put some points on the board. 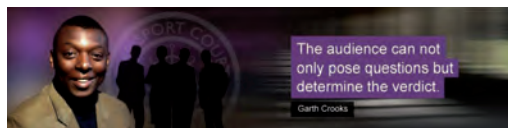

# WORLD OF SOCCER

## THIS WEEK FEATURING... MARK SMEDLEY & THE SPORT COURT

I had an enjoyable evening out last week attending something called *The Sport Court*. Hosted by Garth Crooks it is a bit like a debating society where a motion

is discussed, with two celebrities arguing in favour of the motion and two against. The Sport Court concept began with two old colleagues who have been passionately debating sporting issues for 18 years. Despite many disagreements, they have always remained friends and given the passions aroused in their own conversations, they felt there was potential for public sporting debate in a traditional format with a touch of Question Time. The Sport Court launch took place in September 2008 attended by Martin Keown, Les Ferdinand, Paul Elliot and Ray Stubbs among others. The debate format was revealed to the guests and a lively Q & A chaired by Garth Crooks followed. In January 2009 the first debate took place at the offices of Sony Music Entertainment. The motion *'The overseas influence in the Premier League is harmful to the English game'* was proposed by Richard Bevan and Henry Winter and opposed by David Dein and Steve Norris.

At last weeks event the motion debated was *'The behaviour of professional sportsmen is now out of control'*. Going into the function a poll was taken of attendees with over 60% in favour of the motion. The motion itself was proposed by Lord Peter Snape, Chairman of Stockport County Football Club, and also former World Cup referee Clive 'The Book' Thomas. The motion was opposed by Rugby player Martin Offiah and Times journalist, and former English table tennis player, Matthew Syed. The function was also attended by former BBC football commentator Barry Davies amongst others. Each speaker had eight minutes to make their presentation either for or against the motion. Clive Thomas somehow missed the word 'now' in the title of the motion and proceeded to take up most of his eight minutes saying how badly behaved the players of Leeds United in the 1970s, particularly Jack Charlton, had been! By far the two most passionate and eloquent speakers were Offiah and Syed and it was no surprise when the final vote was taken that the verdict had been over turned with over 60% voting against the motion. The thrust of the successful argument being that the behaviour over the years had not changed (e.g. George Best etc); the majority of professional sportsmen are well behaved; that professional sportsmen were just a reflection of society as a whole and that the press just covered the behaviour of sportsmen much more than in the past and liked to report on the misdemeanours. There had been an opportunity for the audience to ask questions ahead of the vote and there were some good questions and answers, with Offiah and Syed again proving the more astute pair in their answers. Whilst the vote was being counted each of the speakers were also asked questions about their careers by Garth Crooks. Thomas was asked about the famous incident in the 1978 World Cup where he disallowed Zicos goal against Sweden, blowing the final whistle as the ball was on its way into the net. The decision probably cost him the World Cup final with Brazilian Joao Havelange then the FIFA President. All in all a great nights entertainment and a concept that could easily be taken by amateur clubs and replicated as a fund raiser. # OPPONENTS HISTORY

## Fairford Town FC • Club History

Fairford Town Football Club was formed in 1891 and for many years played in the Cirencester & District League against local teams with varying degrees of Success.

After the Second World War, the club joined the Swindon & District League, winning the Premier Division in both 1963-64 and 1968-69, also winning the Advertiser Cup in the same years and in 1962-63 won the Gloucestershire F.A. Junior Cup.



Success in this league was followed by election to the Hellenic League in 1970, only missing out on promotion from the First Division on goal average at the first attempt. The club also reached the Division One Challenge Cup Final, only to lose 5-1 against Hungerford Town in a match played at Wantage. The following year, 1971-72, saw Fairford win the Hellenic League First Division & Division One Challenge Cup, beating Chipping Norton Town in the Final whilst the reserves won the Gloucestershire F.A. Minor Cup, the Advertiser Cup, and finished as runners-up in the Swindon & District Division One. The successful run continued and the Town were beaten finalists of the 1972-73 Premier Division Cup losing to Witney Town, only to then be relegated back to Division One in season 1973-74.

Fairford Town were then promoted again in 1975-76 and steady progress led to the Premier Division runners-up spot in season 1978-79 and in 1979-80, also winning the Premier Division Cup in 1978-79 beating Thame United 3-1 in a Final played again at Wantage Town's Alfredian Park ground.

The club were also winners of the Gloucestershire F. A. Trophy in 1979-80 beating Shortwood United 1-0, 1998-99 defeating Patchway Town, also 1-0 and again in 2002-03 when they defeated Yate Town 2-0 in the Final. They were also runners-up in 1982-83 losing to Old Georgians 2-1 and 1994-95 when defeated 2-1 by Shortwood United, giving their Hellenic League rivals revenge for the earlier defeat. The most recent success in the league came in 1990-91 and 1994-95 when the club again finished in the runners-up position.

Fairford Town also won the Norman Matthews Floodlit Cup in 2001-02, beating Gloucester United over a two-legged Final. In the First Leg Fairford recorded a 3-2 victory at Meadow Park, home of Gloucester City Football Club and then a 3-1 win back at Cinder Lane to take the trophy 6-3 on aggregate.

The club made a second appearance in the Floodlit Cup Final in 2003-04, unfortunately this time finished as runners-up to Slimbridge. The First Leg played at Slimbridge finished 1-0 and after a goal less first half at Cinder Lane in the Second, Slimbridge scored three times to win the Cup 4-0 on aggregate.

Whilst silverware has been elusive over the past few seasons; the club was pleased to be awarded the Fair Play award at the end of the 2007/08 campaign, the award following what was a traumatic season for the club off the pitch.

## Season 1985-86 The Sun Always Shines on TV

### What was going on in the world

The season commences with Madonna at the top of the charts with *Into The Groove* and ends with the *Spitting Image* puppets at number one with *The Chicken Song*. The wreck of the *Titanic* is finally located. November sees Microsoft finally launch their Windows 1.0 product to the computer world to an unsuspecting audience that had little idea how the product would influence their lives in years to come. The UK and France announce plans to construct a tunnel under the channel and journalist John MacCarthy is kidnapped in Beirut. Moments after watching his side snatch a late equaliser at Ninian Park in a World Cup qualifier, Scottish manager Jock Stein suffers a heart attack and dies. Rangers appoint their first catholic manager as Graeme Souness takes charge. Liverpool do the double finishing two points ahead of neighbours Everton in the league and then defeating them 3-1 in the FA Cup Final. Oxford United win the League Cup defeating QPR 3-0 at Wembley and Swindon Town win the Division Four championship. The season ends with the World Cup being held in Mexico for the second time. .

Wootton Bassett Town were hoping that their stay in Division One of the Wiltshire County League would last longer than their previous spell in the division when they were there for just a year. Much though had changed at Rylands Way in the five years since that fateful campaign, and with Mick Woolford being appointed as manager in the summer of 1985, a new chapter in the clubs history was just beginning.

Prior to the opening weekend of the season, the withdrawals of Tisbury and Meadowcroft, both having haemorrhaged players over the summer, threw Division One into disarray as the number of teams was reduced from sixteen to a paltry fourteen. But Bassett made sure there would be a bright spot on the seasons first day, showing their credentials by thumping Amesbury Town 4-0 at Rylands Way. Goals from Roger Williamson and Mitch John put the home side two up at the break before a Nathan Walker double completed the rout. The fine start continued in midweek with the visit of Chippenham Town Reserves as the August 22<sup>nd</sup> edition of the Evening Advertiser described with the following report under the headline, *Bassetts fine start continues:*

*Wootton Bassett, newly promoted to Division One of the Wiltshire County League, continued with their good start to the season last night with a 2-0 home win over Chippenham Reserves. They led with a first half goal by Nathan Walker and sealed the issue with another from Steve Ackrill in the second session.*

Bemerton Athletic would then bring Bassett back down to earth though, but the Salisbury-based side, one of the favourites for the title, were given a run for their money as they prevailed by the odd goal in five, with Walker and Steve Thomas netting for the hosts. August finished with Calne Town, another side tipped to do well, salvaging a point at Rylands Way as they cancelled out a first half Danny Groom goal late on in the second period.

**Lee Clatworthy** Goal Keeper  
Former Cheltenham Town youth 'keeper who arrived at Cinder Lane several years ago and has waited patiently for a regular run of first team football. He will look to seize his opportunity this season.



**Adam Clatworthy** Goal Keeper  
Young goalkeeper currently with Cirencester Academy. Younger brother of fellow custodian Lee, and is spending time at Cinder Lane to get valuable match experience.



**Colin Curtis** Defence  
Great tackler, a number of appearances for the first team after stepping up from the reserves last season. Gives 100%, has proved his talent as a back-up goalkeeper on occasions when called upon.



**Jack Nicholls** Defence  
Back in the game after three years away at University and will be hoping to establish himself in the side this term. A strong, courageous player who never backs out of a challenge.



**Dan Bailey** Defence  
A strong defender who is going into his third season at Cinder Lane. He successfully made the transition from striker to the backline.



**Adam Corcoran** Defence  
Young right-back who is a product of the Cirencester Academy. A player who is strong in the tackle and is fully committed to his game.



**Richard Stubbs** Defence  
A dominant centre-back who is a local lad who has risen through the ranks from youth football to be in regular contention for a first team starting berth.



**Matt Boucher** Midfield  
Respected a long-serving member of the squad, named Captain for the 2010/11 season. With an excellent delivery from the set-piece and good engine, he will hope to lead the side through a progressive season.



**Jake Lloyd** Midfield  
An industrious midfielder who never stops running and joined the ranks at Cinder Lane earlier in the season from Cricklade Town.



**James Eddy** Midfield  
Back in football after a year in Australia and should be a useful addition to the squad this term.



**Shannon Pocock** Midfield  
A member of the Cirencester Academy set-up, Shannon joined the club at the start of the season and is a member of the Pocock footballing dynasty with his Dad, Sean, a former Fairford player



**James Skinner** Midfield  
A young prospect who made a first team place his own last season and he will look to improve and learn throughout the coming campaign.



**Duncan Scrivens** Midfield  
Another local youngster who has a great engine with superb vision to match. Appearances maybe limited due to University.

A tricky yet direct winger who is a great crosser of the ball. A hard working wide man who joined from Wootton Bassett Town in October 2010.



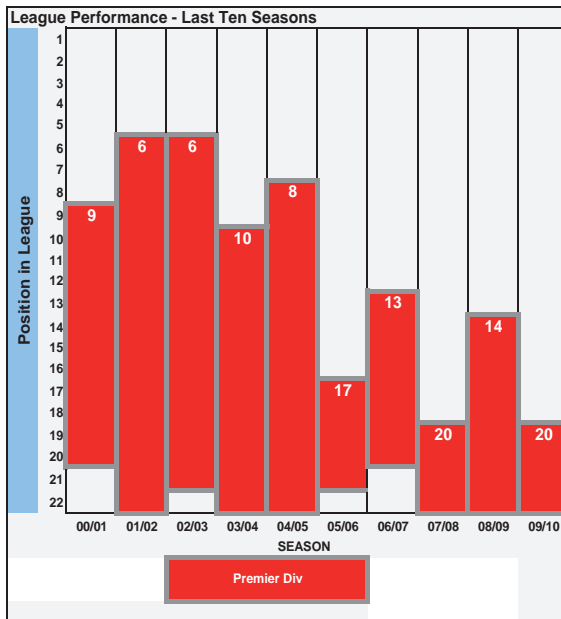
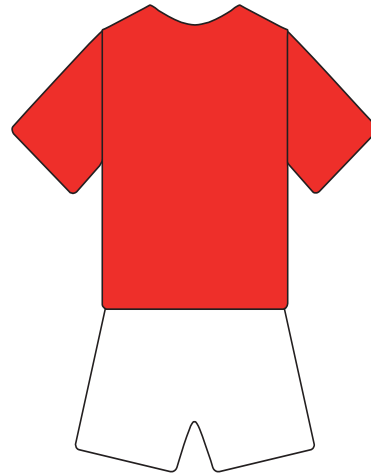
**Pete Griffiths** Forward

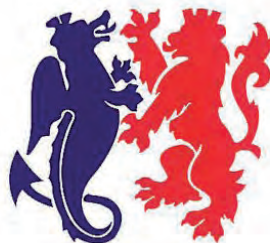

September was not to be Bassetts month though. It began with consecutive 1-1 draws, the first coming at home against Sanford courtesy of Nick Johns goal, before a point was gained from the visit to Pewsey Vale thanks to Nathan Walker, who could have claimed both points for his side but unfortunately missed from the penalty spot. The eagerly anticipated resumption of acquaintances with Purton came next, with Woolfords team making the trip to the Red House. However, those with high hopes of an even contest being played out would be disappointed as the hosts strolled to a 3-0 victory. Things then got much worse to close out the month when Bemerton Athletic came to visit for a Ghia Senior Cup first round clash. Bassetts first division rivals came into the game in fine form, and continued that in some style, romping to a 9-0 victory; it was the third time already that season they had notched one short of double figures on the road.

Bassett rebounded quickly though, with goals from Nathan Walker and Don McLeod securing victory at Aldbourne in a game which the visitors had to come from behind in after scoring an own goal in the first minute. A late equaliser then cancelled out Danny Grooms goal when Park visited Rylands Way before Woolfords side produced their best performance of the season so far at home against fellow newly promoted side Pinehurst. Neil Timbrell and Peter Ward both struck braces, whilst Walker and Steve Thomas completed the hosts half dozen. The only blot on Bassetts copy book that afternoon was the single they conceded. Ward again found the back of the net twice a week later, with Walker notching once as the team moved up to fourth thanks to a convincing 3-0 victory at Wroughton.

November began on a low note as Purton completed the double over their nearest rivals, edging out a win by a solitary goal at Rylands Way. But two wins from three ensured Bassett reclaimed fourth spot. They began with a 4-2 win away to Melksham Town Reserves, with Thomas scoring twice alongside Gary Dixon and Paul Gadsden. Making the victory even more impressive was the fact the visitors came back from 2-0 down after 15 year old Mark Demkiv had seemingly put Melksham in control. A point was then earned at Chippenham Town Reserves thanks to Mitch Johns goal before debutant Dave Terry provided the only goal of the game at home against Wills. The month finished how it began, however, with Calne Town edging Bassett 2-0 at Bremhill View.

This time Woolfords side failed to bounce back quickly from that defeat, falling to a 4-0 defeat at bogey side Bemerton in the first round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup, before a 2-0 home defeat described by the Evening Advertiser as a *surprise* against Wroughton. Then, with Christmas looming, Bassett got into the festive spirit early, shipping four in a heavy loss at Park, whose scorers that day included a certain Paul Harrison, a figure who would in the coming years go onto make his mark both as a player and chairman at Rylands Way.

The New Year began with Bassetts streak of losses increasing to five as a depleted Aldbourne gained revenge for their early season defeat. The January 13<sup>th</sup> edition of the Evening Advertiser carried the following report of what was an unordinary match:

*Wootton Bassett lost at home to Aldbourne by 4-2 in a game where they were twice in front. Aldbourne had striker Mark Perrett in goal, but he sustained a cut eye when*



*Paul Gadsden opened Wootton Bassetts account and changed to a position in the field with Steve Harris going in goal. Mark Baker equalised in time for the interval but Wootton Bassett went in front again with a second half goal by Gary Dixon. Mark Malham, playing his last game before flying to the West Indies to fulfil his engagements as a jockey brought Aldbourne level again and then went on their win with goals by Gary McKay and Perrett.* □

A week later a Kevin Flavell strike secured a point at Pinehurst to keep Bassett in sixth, but they would undoubtedly have been disappointed with this result given the convincing nature of their victory against their opponents earlier in the campaign. The draw though had finally stopped the rot that had seen Bassett slip out of contention for one of the top spots.

Six weeks of harsh weather meant this was to be the last game played before March began. The prolonged break though seemed to have done Woolfords side a whole world of good as they returned with a win by the odd goal in three over Melksham, with Mitchell John doing all the damage for the home side. However, this was to be the beginning of a lengthy, inconsistent stretch. Bassett then fell 3-2 at Sanford, as the hosts came from behind after Walker had put the visitors ahead. They then won by that score at Amesbury, the game being described in the Monday 24<sup>th</sup> March edition of the Evening Advertiser as follows:

*Wootton Bassett thought they were nicely on the way to a win at Amesbury when goals by Steve Thomas and Nick John gave them a 2-0 lead. But Amesbury hit back with first half goals by Ricky Hibbs and brother Mick, and it took Bassett until the 88<sup>th</sup> minute for Nick John to score his second and winning goal.*

Another thrashing at the hands of title challengers Bemerton followed, with Bassett coming back from their trip to south Wiltshire with their tails firmly between the legs after a 5-1 defeat. It could have been all so different though had Walkers goal, which put the visitors ahead, been built on. The penultimate game of the year at Wills saw the strugglers record only their third win of the year as Bassett fell to a disappointing 2-0 defeat.

But the season did finish on a high, albeit staggeringly early as the final match took place on April 19th, with visitors Pewsey being dispatched by four goals to two. A Thomas brace and first goal of the year for Gary Brown gave Bassett a commanding 3-0 lead at half time, before their final goal of the campaign came courtesy of a Pewsey defender.

This secured a respectable sixth place finish and meant Bassett avoided the ignominy they had suffered during the 1979/80 season when they were immediately relegated back to Division Two. Finally the club was on a sound footing to press on and search for a way out of County League football.

## Derby day disaster

The Elms, 3rd January 2011

What should have been a day to enjoy for Wootton Bassett Town quickly turned into a nightmare as they suffered a 5-1 hammering at the hands of local rivals Highworth Town. Dave Turners side were buried underneath an avalanche of first half pressure, which culminated in an unassailable 3-0 half time lead for the Worthians, who never looked back.

After 39 days inactive due to the December chill, Bassett appeared as though they desired to have one more day off on account of their inability to keep possession and laggard pace. Their hosts on the other hand were much the fitter and sharper unit. And that told from the off. Just over sixty seconds after play had got under way, TJ Bohane was afforded far too much room down the right flank and he burst into the Bassett box where he was upended by a trailing Liam Edmondson. It appeared though that lady luck was set to be on the visitors side when the tricky forward struck the post with the resulting spot kick. However, it was merely a prelude to what was to come, with Bohane running the show. The forward, who in his youth featured for Bassetts Under 18 Floodlit League side, had demonstrated his creativity when the two sides met earlier in the season. But that day he was unable to find the back of the net despite being presented with a myriad of chances. As demonstrated by his penalty miss, that wasteful side of Bohane was on show again, but he was that much of a thorn in the visitors side that he was able to net a hat-trick. With play camped inside Bassetts half it was not long until Highworth eventually made their pressure takes its toll.

On 18 minutes an unmarked Richie Saunders stooped low at the near post and guided a header home from a seemingly mishit Bohane corner kick. Bassett then had a couple brief forays into opposition territory, but were unable to restore parity. Firstly, a Lee Moulton free kick had home keeper Kurtis Sharkey at full stretch, before Alex Green had the ball in the back of the net after Sharkey failed to hold onto a low Sam Collier effort, however he had strayed offside meaning it was ruled out. From then until half time, the Bassett box was under siege. Only a deflection prevented a 20-yard Tony Joyce drive from roaring into the back of the net after, once again, a Bohane set piece had only been half cleared. Stewart Thompson, the games unfortunate victim, then prevented the lead from being doubled with a string of fine saves. Firstly, a timely switch out to James Guthrie on the left had the Bassett defence stretched, and after breezing past Shaun Carter the winger fired low from the edge of the box only to see his effort acrobatically tipped wide. Minutes later, Guthrie ghosted between debutant Matt Boucher and Craig Bowden to latch onto Steve Yeardeleys weighted cross at the left hand post, but he failed to beat the veteran custodian with a well executed volley. From the resulting corner, he did well to keep out Dan Hilders close range effort after the ball had again found its way through the defence to the far post. However, he was unable to prevent Bohane from finally getting on the score sheet six minutes from half time. He was given little help from those in front of him, who allowed the home sides leading scorer too much space, and Bohane duly punished that mistake, expertly guiding his header into the far right corner for a Guthrie delivery. Before Bassett knew it, the game was then wrapped up with yet more disappointing defending playing a starring role in the build up. From the left wing, Guthrie squared easily inside to a free Bohane, and following a neat turn that set his sights on goal, he slotted the ball in at the near post with his weaker right foot.

His hat-trick should have been completed moments after the restart when he poked wide from ten yards with just Thompson to beat after latching onto Joyces defence splitting through pass. For a few minutes at least his failure to score, and a goal for Bassett out of nothing, made events a little more interesting. Green provided the only moment to celebrate for Turners team just before the hour when he raced onto Craig Bowdens long ball over the top before slotting past Sharkey for his first since September. It should really have been his second of the afternoon though, but he dragged an effort from ten yards across the face of goal and wide a couple minutes before following a Lee Moulton cut back. Normal service was quickly resumed, however. With twenty minutes remaining, Kevin Tates cross from the deep fell perfectly for Bohane, who headed home from twelve yards to finally secure himself the match ball. The rout was completed with five minutes left when a Highworth break opened up space for Tom Dingle. The substitute powerfully drove forward before squaring back from the by-line, and the ball was bundled in by ex-Bassett defender Jonny Aitkenhead, who narrowly beat Shaun Terry in a foot race.

**Scoops Man of the Match: Stewart Thompson** - it was a sad indictment of Bassetts performance that a keeper who had to pluck the ball from his net a handful of times be rewarded man of the match, but Thompson ensured a heavy defeat did not become even more embarrassing with some fine saves.

**Scoop Rating: 4/10** - not once during the entire ninety minutes did Bassett string together a meaningful number of passes, and their profligacy when in possession only invited trouble.



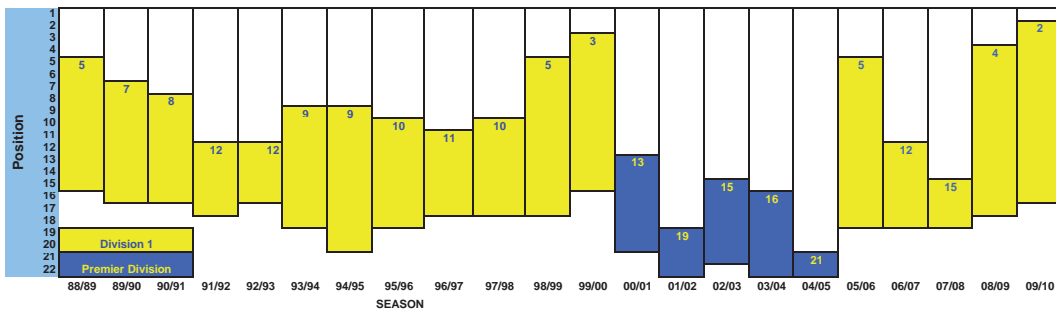

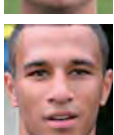

**Senior teams:** Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground grading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival.

Well rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1<sup>st</sup> team, reserves, and under 18s, Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Bassett, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide.

**Youth teams:** Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/ finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators, managers, assistants and players....yes even the first team!). Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and playing pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBFC just short of £19,000 in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees, insurance, playing / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some £35,000 per season! Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined **membership/ training fee** in the form of a standing order payment. To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for **12 months** (not just the playing season!) The current charge is **£18 per month** (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is **vital** that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process of updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne. The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions please do not hesitate to contact either Gill or myself.
