EDITORIAL

Good evening and welcome to Rylands Way for this **Uhlsport Hellenic Premier League** fixture against **Carterton**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Carterton** who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home back to Oxfordshire. This fixture was originally scheduled for the opening week of the season but was postponed due to the need for our FA Cup replay against Bradford Town. It was then re-scheduled for the 29th of January but then fell victim to the weather. A special warm welcome back to Rylands Way to **Carterton** goalkeeper **James Domm** who made 20 appearances for us back in 2006-07. A very good keeper and he will no doubt be looking to give a good performance on his return to Rylands Way.

On the subject of former players it was sad to see former Wootton Bassett Town striker **Paul Garbutt** making the headlines this week for all the wrong reasons. One of three servicemen who was charged with helping to smuggle seven million cigarettes into Britain on military flights to, presumably Lyneham and Brize Norton, from Afghanistan and Oman, Paul was jailed for three years and four months at Bristol Crown Court last week. Paul was signed by Manager Pete Yeardley through Mick Byrne and was a strong powerful striker making nine appearances in Season 2002-3, scoring once from the penalty spot in a 2-1 win at Almondsbury Town. Hopefully Paul will learn from this experience and we wish him well when he is finally released from prison and he looks to rebuild his life.

In preparing the programme one always has to be careful what one includes for fear of upsetting someone and action being taken by either the Football Association or the Hellenic Football League (remember the Malmesbury Chairman reported me to the FA following comments about their position in the disciplinary table). With this in mind it was somewhat surprising to read the official Hellenic League Bulletin issued last Sunday (see elsewhere in the programme) refer to Wootton Bassett Town as the *hapless Wiltshire outfit*. I am not sure this is appropriate use of language for an official league bulletin and if the same adjective had been used about the league in some way by ourselves I am sure we would be on the hook for a fine.

Looking at what else is in tonight's programme, the **From the Archives** feature this week goes back to **1969-70** and a relatively successful season in the history of Wootton Bassett Town Football Club. In his **From The Dugout** page Dave Turner again comments on fixture scheduling and tonight's opponents **Carterton**. There is a short report on the game against **Shortwood**. The **Moonraker** feature again includes recent articles from the Gazette & Herald's excellent coverage of Wiltshire football. There is the usual updated league table of the Clubs own **Fantasy Football League** which still sees Bryan Wood still leading the way. The **Youth Section** page includes a round-up from young Luke Walduck. The latest edition of **Touchline** is re-produced once again. The **World of Soccer** feature this week looks at **Tweeting** and the problems it has caused a few professional footballers in recent weeks.

Finally the next First Team home game is next Saturday when John Fisher brings his **Shrivenham** side to Rylands Way for another six-pointer. Enjoy the game and cheer the lads on to three more points for the *hapless side from Wiltshire*. Best Wishes.

TWEETING

The issue of footballers commenting on Twitter has hit the headlines in recent weeks with The FA Cup Third Round in particular seeing comments made by several players attracting the interest of the Football Association. Firstly FA chiefs decided Ryan Babels tweeted jibe that suggested World Cup final referee Howard Webb showed bias toward Man Utd in their FA Cup tie warranted investigation. Babel in the end was fined £10,000 and warned as to his future conduct for his hard work on Photoshop. The next time we need a special cover commissioned for the programme will get in touch with the Liverpool player who clearly has more creative talent in the publishing arena than he and his teammates are currently displaying on the football field! By the way I liked the joke my cousin David posted on Facebook this week which went along the lines of ...Kenny Dalglish has promised to bring the good times back to Liverpool, as long as he can find the flux capacitor and get the Delorian up to 88mph.

Back on the subject of Twitter and footballers there is then the fall-out from Jamie Mackies shocking leg-break during the Blackburn v QPR tie, with El-Hadji Diouf and QPRs Bradley Orr and Clint Hill (pictured) facing FA probes. The Rangers duo (whose misdemeanours were made on Twitter) seem most likely to wind up on an FA charge whereas the repulsive player that Neil Warnock christened a sewer-rat will probably get off as the referee took no action on the day. Diouf, never the most popular of men thanks to his penchant for spitting and fighting was accused of a shocking tirade of abuse at the prone Mackie, who lay injured on the Ewood Park turf after clashing with Gaël Givet.



The Rangers players used the internet on the evening of the match to blast Diouf, with Orr tweeting that he was a *repulsive human being* and Hill using a more succinct four-lettered term. However, the tweets, which have now been deleted, also contained references to the Blackburn striker getting *whats coming to him*, a move likely to trigger the wrath of those FA. The story shows that tweeted threats made in the heat of the moment can land you in seriously hot water. As England cricketers Kevin Pietersen and Azeem Rafiq can testify, an adrenaline-fuelled tweet just after a game about some perceived injustice is likely to upset those in power.

Closer to home last season there was the incident where a Purton player used Facebook to make comments about injuring one of our players, which then sparked some heated exchanges at the end of the game. Indeed, whilst not necessarily as a direct consequence of this incident which did get reported by the Adver, the Hellenic League on their website carried the following warning at the start of this season:

Social Networking Websites- 29th August

The Football Association has highlighted the potential problems concerning the use of Social Networking Websites. It is appropriate now to remind member clubs of their responsibilities. These sites have become a part of everyday life and are accessed by people from all walks of life. Whilst it is an individuals right to use such sites, as they wish, within the bounds of legal acceptability. However, the use of these sites to pass adverse or unacceptable comments on member clubs, match officials, players or League Management is considered wholly inappropriate. The FA or the management team of the League carries the same restrictions as any other printed or published matter. Please ensure that everyone in a position of responsibility within your club, including players, managers and match day helpers, is aware that any unacceptable postings will be treated as comment by the persons club. This could lead to disciplinary action taken against the club by the UHLSPORT Hellenic League. If any comments are seen to bring the League, club or football in general into disrepute The Football Association may also take action. Please ensure that your club members think carefully before posting on such sites. The Hellenic League has a proud reputation in ensuring fairness for all and it will not be tarnished by mindless acts.

So if you are thinking about Tweeting tonight or making derogatory comments on Facebook tonight be careful what you post, big brother could be watching.....

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Carterton FC • Club History

Originally formed in 1918 as, strangely enough, Carterton F.C., teams competed in the local Witney and District League with the home pitch being on the Alvescot Road Recreation Ground, During the Second World War there was no football played but on cessation of (military) hostilities Carterton F.C. was re-formed and played with limited success until 1983



Carterton Boys F.C. was formed in 1972 and amalgamated with the mens sides in 1982 and re-named the club Carterton Town F.C. Shortly afterwards a few teams broke away from Town and formed a new club called Carterton Rangers F.C. This highly competitive state of affairs continued until December 2003 when an approach was made to the Chairman of Carterton Rangers to become the Chairman of Town.

This led to the long held belief that the possibility of both clubs becoming one again was at last a realistic proposition. After great debate and many meetings the members of both clubs voted to an amalgamation with the new club being officially recognised as Carterton Football Club from the 1st August 2004.



This uniting of the clubs now offers the people of Carterton the opportunity to play football from 5 years old up until the legs can't take it any more!

The club has been awarded the prestigious F.A. Charter Standard Development Club and is also the first club in Oxfordshire to be awarded the F.A. Community Club Award this is due to the hard work of all of the committee and club members.

Season 2004/5 the first year of the new club saw many successes both on and off the field, with many of the boys, youth sides experiencing success as well as the senior sides. Our Goal is to continue to improve the facilities both for the players and the social members but most of all to improve the skill and understanding of the great game of football whilst learning to work as part of a team which in turn will improve every ones life skills whilst enjoying the game!

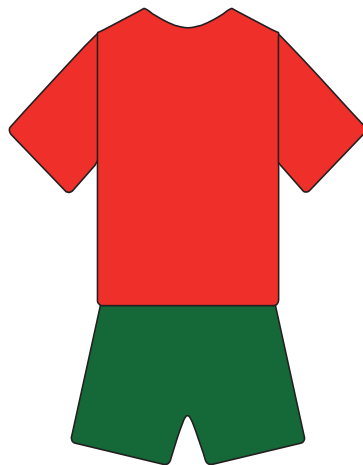
Kevin Lewis Forward

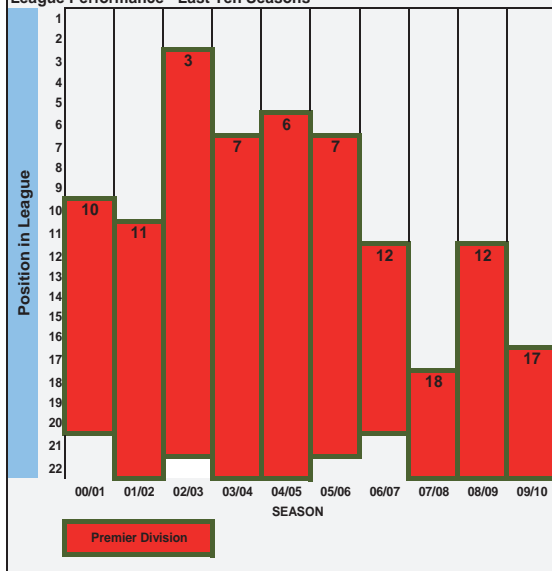

February opened with a trip to Devizes Town and in a tight affair neither side was able to find the net and the points were shared. A week later Wootton Bassett travelled to Melksham for a game against another side without both John Mole and Brian Ewen. Graham Reid and Tony Russell fired the goals that secured a 2-1 win and lifted Bassett back up into third spot, Russell's goal was his first senior goal for the club. The month ended with a game against Westbury who arrived at Rylands Way on the back of a nine game unbeaten run. However, two goals from Roy Blackburn secured both points for an inform Wootton Bassett Town.

The beginning of March saw Wootton Bassett visit the side just below them in the league, Radstock Town. Goals from Graham Reid and Tony Russell did the damage in a 2-0 win which increased the gap between Wootton Bassett and Radstock to five points, although Radstock still had four games in hand. The return match against near neighbours Wroughton was another tight affair that was settled by a 40th minute goal from Roy Blackburn who scored from a Colin Taylor headed pass. However, the two stars of the game were defenders Benny Lehane and Bob Pearce who were outstanding in preventing Wroughton from securing an equaliser. There was an identical result in the next game away at Bemerton with a solitary goal from Brian Ewen securing the two points for Wootton Bassett. March ended with a trip to Westbury and two more points were secured courtesy of goals from Roy Blackburn, Brian Ewen, Tommy Gardiner and Brian Ewen making it six wins on the bounce.

With such a large division the arrival of April saw Wootton Bassett Town with seven games still to play. The first of those was a visit to bottom of the table Warminster Town which was won comfortably, a brace for both Roy Blackburn and Tommy Gardiner and one a piece for Graham Reid and Brian Ewen in a 6-0 win. The excellent run of victories came to an end when title chasing Gorse Hill visited Rylands Way and left with both points following a 2-0 win to complete the double over Wootton Bassett, reflecting on what was a tremendous season for Bassett is that they were the one and only side to achieve such a feat. Wootton Bassett returned to winning ways with a 1-0 win over West Lavington, Graham Reid with the all important goal. The Swindon Advertiser carried the following brief report under the heading *Wootton Bassett Making Bold Bid for 3rd Place:*

Wootton Bassett Town making a strong fight to finish third in the Wiltshire Combination despite a midweek setback gained two more points on Saturday evening when Reed's [Graham Reid] 81st minute goal gave them a 1-0 win at West Lavington.

This win was followed by another narrow 1-0 win, this time over Bemerton at Rylands Way with Dave Challis the Bassett scorer. With some forty league fixtures the season's climax went well into May. On the 5th of May Wootton Bassett had their second 0-0 draw of the season and dropped a point in the process. Ironically the second goalless game was against the same opponents as the first one, Devizes Town Reserves. Next up was a trip to Trowbridge Town Reserves and the quest for third place was put back on track with a comprehensive 5-0 win, Tommy Gardiner (2), Roy Blackburn, Dave Clark and Dave Challis with the Bassett goals. Two days later defeat at Westcott was to prove costly as Wootton Bassett went down 3-6, a defeat that ended the hopes of that third place. Tommy Gardiner, Tony Wall and Dave Challis scored the consolation goals in the defeat against a side Wootton Bassett had beaten at Rylands. The final game of the season saw Spencer Mouton visit Rylands Way and ended with the biggest win of the season as Wootton Bassett ended the season in style. The seven goals scored without reply even included one from goalkeeper Stuart Ward, Tommy Gardiner fired a hat-trick and there was one a piece for Graham Reid, Dave Clark and top scorer Roy Blackburn.

In its end of season round-up on Tuesday May 26th the Swindon Advertiser noted the following:

For Wootton Bassett it has been their finest season since they won the Wiltshire League and changed horses to the old Premier League. For once they maintained their early promise to the end of the season without the customary falling off.

Given the number of seasons where an excellent first half of the season was followed by a collapse after Christmas this was an accurate comment from an observer of affairs at Rylands Way. The final league table for the season, showing a fifth placed finish, and results and scorers (where known) for games played are shown below:

break Wootton Bassett eventually ran out 5-0 winners. The Football Pink carried the following report on the game:

Benny Lehane and his Wootton Bassett mean are having a really good season so far, as their fourth position in the Combination table showed. They had gained 11 points from their last six games up to today and had been beaten only twice during the season so far. Their record is a tribute to the coaching of ex-Swindon player George Hunt. The first half, as in the Vics game, was interrupted by a hail storm which forced the players to take shelter for five minutes but Wootton Bassett soon settled down to business. Roy Blackburn opened up with a goal and followed with another. Tommy Gardiner scored one as well with Bob Pearce netting a fourth before the interval. Vickers could not curb Wootton Bassett's skills in this half but they did better in the second period when they limited their visitors to one goal □ the best of the match - by Dave Challis.

George Hunt had made 328 appearances for Swindon Town between 1949-49 and 1957-58, generally filling the right-back position.

The first defeat since mid September was suffered in the visit to reigning champions Sanford, a solitary strike from Bob Thomas being the only consolation in the 3-1 defeat, Thomas scoring the Bassett goal in the last minute. A surprise defeat at lowly West Lavington followed and a rather embarrassing one at that. The Football Pink noted that the opponents started the game with just seven men and never had more than ten in the whole match. When the additional three players turned up West Lavington went in front. Dave Challis equalised before the break but a second half strike gave West Lavington both points. At the end of its report on the game the Football Pink did note some good news for Wootton Bassett Town supporters despite the surprise defeat:

More agreeable news for Wootton Bassett supporters is that plans for a stand are before the appropriate authorities for approval. They should be able to watch their games soon with a cover over their heads.

On the same day as this report was published Wootton Bassett again lost at home, 3-0 against Westcott in the Wiltshire Senior Cup. This was followed by a 2-0 home defeat at the hands of Radstock Town who were also up amongst the leading pack. The game before Christmas saw a goal fest at Rylands Way with Wootton Bassett Town outscoring opponents Vickers by a ratio of 2:1 and with Vickers scoring four times Wootton Bassett managed to bag eight of their own. A new RAF centre-forward Mould made his debut but did not get onto the score sheet, Brian Ewen scoring four times, substitute Tony Nash twice and there was one a piece for Dave Clarke and Graham Reid. Two further goals from Tony Nash saw Wootton Bassett Town defeat Black Sports from Corsham 2-0 in the holiday period and put Bassett back on track.

The first game of the new decade away at Dursley contained just one goal. Brian Ewen was brought down in the area and picked himself up to fire the only goal of the game from the penalty spot. The win lifted Wootton Bassett Town up into the heady heights of third spot in the table. The following week saw Wiltshire County Cup action and having lost to Westcott Wootton Bassett were without a game. When they returned to action they travelled to another side challenging towards the top of the table in Bromham. Not the easiest of places to visit, Wootton Bassett Town returned with both points following a 3-1 win, Roy Blackburn, Dave Clark and John Mole scoring all three goals in the second half. Wootton Bassett had goalkeeper Stuart Ward and Benny Lehane to thank for keeping the game goalless at the break. The Football Pink carried the following report on the game:

Possibly the best win of the day went to Wootton Bassett who visited Bromham and won 3-1 in a re-arranged game. Bromham had most of the first half play but with Stuart Ward safe in goal and with his defenders giving him good cover, Wootton Bassett came through safely. Roy Blackburn eluded defenders appealing for offside to open the scoring for Wootton Bassett within five minutes of the start of the second half. Bromham surprisingly were uncertain in defence and, although Alan Pocock equalised, Dave Clarke romped through the home side to restore Wootton Bassett's lead. This was clinched with a goal from John Mole just before the end.

One week later, the opponents were the same with Bromham making the trip to Rylands and the result was another win for Wootton Bassett with Bassett hitting four goals without reply. Brian Ewen opened the scoring in the very first minute and Roy Blackburn, Graham Reid and John Mole added further goals. The win left Wootton Bassett in fourth place. January ended with a short trip to Wroughton and a solitary goal from Roy Blackburn secured a point for Bassett in a 1-1 draw.

Season 1969-70 Back Home

What was going on in the world

The Rolling Stones topped the charts with *Honky Tonk Women* as the season kicked off and ended with England World Cup squad at number one with their single *Back Home* which was top of the charts for three weeks in the run up to the Mexico World Cup. The season kicked off with Neil Armstrong having recently become the first man on the moon. The first edition of *Sesame Street* is broadcast. Everton win the top division in English football, whilst Swindon Town just miss out on promotion to the top division, finishing fifth just three points behind second place Blackpool. Chelsea win a memorable cup final defeating Leeds in the first replayed cup final since 1912. After a 2-2 draw Chelsea win the replay 2-1 after extra time, David Webb scoring the winner. Celtic are defeated by Feyenoord in the European Cup Final and Brazil win a fantastic world cup competition in Mexico, defeating Italy 4-1 in the final.

Season 1969-70 saw an expanded Wiltshire Combination with 21 clubs and there was also the formation of a second division. With such a large league it was a major challenge to get the games completed and the season started at the beginning of August with the last game being completed on 15th May.

In the opening game of the season Wootton Bassett Town found themselves trailing to visitors Black Sports and two missed open goals did not help the cause. However, goals from Dave Challis and Graham Reid secured both points. This was followed by a stunning midweek performance at home to Ferndale where a Brian Ewen hat-trick, two from Roy Blackburn and one from Tommy Gardiner gave Wootton Bassett a 6-1 success over their Swindon rivals. Wootton Bassett made it six points from their opening games when a solitary Brian Ewen penalty after Tommy Gardiner had been hauled down gave Wootton Bassett the win against Calne Town. The first point of the season was dropped away at Swindon Victoria where goals from Graham Reid and Roy Blackburn were not enough to secure both points in a 2-2 draw. A stunning first half performance at home to Dursley saw Wootton Bassett lead 5-0 at the break courtesy of goals from Brian Ewen (2), Dave Challis, Dave Clark and Roy Blackburn. Ewen's brace included yet another spot kick. In the second half Wootton Bassett keeper Ron Ward saved a penalty but no further goals were added to the tally. The win lifted Wootton Bassett up into third spot with a game in hand behind leaders Gorse Hill and Bromham. August ended with an entertaining game against a strong Sanford side. Dave Challis scored the goal in a 1-1 draw which saw Sanford score what the Pink described as a *fluky goal* the ball hitting Brian Taylor and going in without him knowing much about it. Ron Ward mad a couple of fine saves to keep the Sanford strikers out and at the other end Roy Blackburn had a goal disallowed. It was Blackburn who scored the solitary goal of the next game at home to Swindon Victoria. The win saw Wootton Bassett remain in third place in the table behind Gorse Hill who had won all nine of their opening fixtures and Melksham Town. Wootton Bassett were one of three unbeaten teams, Radstock Town being the other.

The unbeaten run came to an end when Wootton Bassett travelled to leaders Gorse Hill who maintained their 100% record with a 5-2 win. Tommy Gardiner put Wootton Bassett in front and Roy Blackburn scored the other. With Radstock Town also losing it meant Gorse Hill were now the only unbeaten side in the league. Another defeat followed when Melksham Town left Rylands Way with both points following a 3-1 win. The poor form was carried over into the game against a struggling Spencer Moulton side as Wootton Bassett trailed at the break. However, late goals from Dave Challis, Dave Clark and top scorer Roy Blackburn secured the points for Wootton Bassett, 3-1 the final score. Wootton Bassett continued their winning ways the following week when Trowbridge Town Reserves were the visitors to Rylands Way. All three goals in a 2-1 win came in the first half, Brian Ewen and Roy Blackburn netting for Wootton Bassett. It could have been a lot more but for the Trowbridge keeper.

The month of October saw just one more game with the visit of Westcott to Rylands Way on the 29th of the month. A Brian Ewen penalty and a second from Roy Blackburn ten minutes from time secured both points. The Football Pink noted that a magnificent defensive performance from Benny Lehané had kept Bassett in the game for the first hour. The win moved Wootton Bassett up into fifth place in the table. A week later bottom side Warminster Town were the visitors to Rylands Way and a wasteful Wootton Bassett had to make do with three second half goals to secure the points, two more for leading scorer Roy Blackburn and one for Tommy Gardiner. The win moved Bassett up one place into fourth spot. A fourth consecutive home fixture saw Wootton Bassett share the points with Calne Town, Ian Sinfield getting the goal in a 1-1 draw. Wootton Bassett were finally on their travels the following week making the short trip into Swindon to meet Vickers. Four nil up at the

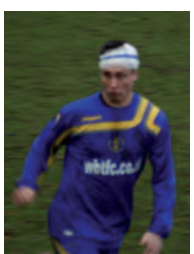
The visitors struck first following the restart when a free kick was left alone, gifting a free header at the far post.

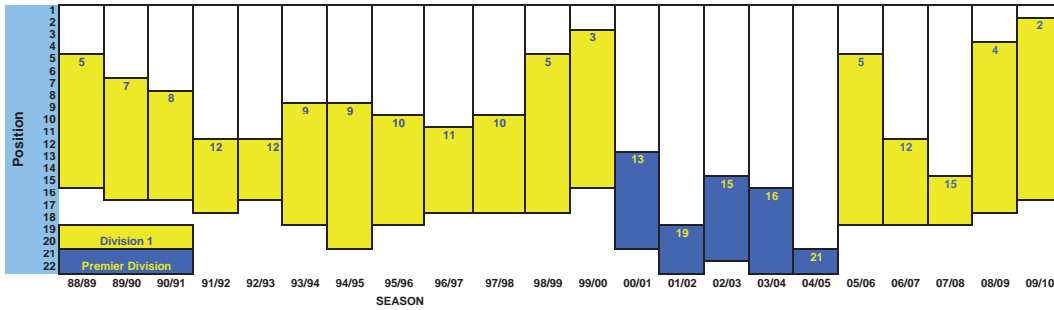

Roving Reporter visits Hardwicke Playing Field Tytherington Rocks 2 - 2 Cheltenham Saracens

This game took place on a hilltop swept by a strong wind. Tytherington opened determinedly with Justin Bishop prominent up front but now without Jim Potts who has moved to Winterbourne. Saracens gradually worked their way into the game, and after 15 minutes a kick by keeper Betteridge caught the wind and cleared the home sides defence. Senior teams: Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBTFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground grading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival.

Well rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1st team, reserves, and under 18s, Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Bassett, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide.

Chris Jones – Head of Senior Football

Youth teams: Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/ finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators, managers, assistants and players....yes even the first team!).

Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and playing pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBTFC just short of **£19,000** in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees, insurance, playing / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some **£35,000** per season!

Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined **membership/ training fee** in the form of a standing order payment.

To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for **12 months** (not just the playing season!) The current charge is **£18 per month** (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is **vital** that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process in updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne.

The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions please do not hesitate to contact either Gill or myself.

The commercial manager role is so important and will assist in supplying funding for the senior section. The club has recently reviewed the seasonal football development plan (FDP). The short-term objectives will see the club boast its age related coaching as well as detailing our commercial plans which will make use of our web space as well as general advertising boards around the football ground. Last season, as part of our School Sports Partnerships programme, Community Football delivered football coaching into 4 local schools, and this season will increase to 5 or 6.

The planning for the next trip to Holland has been completed (see above) and will see U12's, U14's A&B and the U15 travel to s'-Gravenzande SV in April 2011, we should not under estimate the effort it takes to organise such a tour, well done to all involved.

We know that our first team obtained promotion last season, great news and well done to all, the first round of ground grading work has been completed through the summer which allowed WBTF to play in the Hellenic League Premier Division this season. Further work though must be completed by June and is a challenge for the club to afford and implement, so if you or your company may be able to help in increasing our covered accommodation then please do get in contact. Of course it is difficult to justify expenditure at Rylands Way when we hope to relocate within a few years, yet maintaining our Premier Division status is important in providing possible funding opportunities to support our operation. Relocation is a major undertaking with little tangible progress to show for lots of work, but it is hoped we can report on positive progress in the next Touchline.

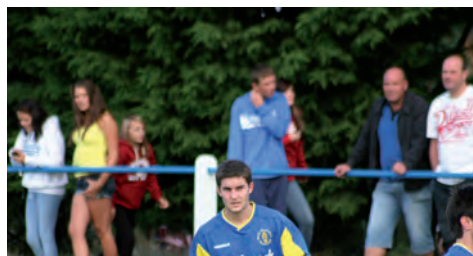

However, against the run of play, Bassett regained the lead just before the break when Paul Patel fed Geoff Swatton the ball and Swatton grabbed his fifth in two games with a perfect shot into the bottom corner of the net.

Carterton made a change during the break bringing ex-Pewsey Vale player Mark Jordan on. Both teams started the second half brightly having a couple of chances each - Geoff Swatton nearly grabbed his second hat trick in two games but he shot straight into the keepers hands in the 47th minute. Bassett were harshly reduced to ten men in the 63rd minute when Luke Sharps was judged to have pulled a Carterton strikers shirt on the edge of the area; the striker having fallen to the floor and Sharps was sent off by the referee after consulting his assistant. A gross injustice but a worse decision was to follow. More drama followed when in the 70th minute Mark Jordan fell to the floor in the box claiming Stu Lamont pushed him and the referee gave Carterton a penalty. Before the penalty was taken Steve Hale was booked by referee Barry for time wasting. The penalty was scored despite Hale going the right way. Bassett made their first and only change in the 76th minute when Paul Patel was brought off due to a pulled muscle and Justin Hyde replaced him.

Both teams looked for a winner but neither team managed to find the net again. Bassett came closest when Geoff Swatton was put clean through by a Dave Jones ball but, with tired legs, his shot was scuffed and went wide of the goal. Bassett were happy with the point after a spirited performance despite having ten men on the pitch for half an hour.
