Good afternoon and welcome to Rylands Way for this **Uhsport Hellenic Premier League** fixture against **Shrivenham**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Shrivenham** who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home. For a number of players today they will be playing against their former clubs. On our side Alex Green, Shaun Carter and Richie Carter will all be playing against a side they played for in the not too distant past. In the Shrivenham line up may possibly be Craig Shand and Paul Hunt, both of whom have played for Wootton Bassett Town in recent times. Local derby games are generally tight affairs as was the case earlier in the season when the two sides met. Both sides are at the wrong end of the table and in need of points so another tight encounter is to be expected. Shrivenham had an excellent result last time out against high flying Kidlington who they held to a 2-2 draw. How good a result that was became clear on Wednesday night when Kidlington won 5-0 away at Old Woodstock to go within three points of leaders Ardley United with a game in hand.

We go into this game today with two wins out of the last three games with Coach Turners target of at least four points from the games against Carterton and Fairford exceeded. This puts us in a good position to ensure we do not get dragged into the relegation battle and another three points today against a side in the bottom four would further enhance our position. It is important to keep picking points up at home with a run of four away games coming up after the Ascot game on Tuesday. Not quite a pattern but five away, six at home followed by four away is not ideal but has been caused to some extent by the weather and postponement of fixtures.

What has been disappointing of late is our attendance figures which has seen our average decline, although we are still above last seasons average in Division One West. Hopefully today will see a larger gate than in recent games given that this is a derby fixture. With the Reserves down my neck of the woods this weekend I will be taking the opportunity of making the shorter journey to watch them in action at Binfield but will hopefully be kept up to date with scores from either Chris or Scoop.

Looking at what is in tonights programme, the **From the Archives** feature this week goes back to **2003-04** and a relegation battle for Wootton Bassett Town which went down to the wire. In his **From The Dugout** page Dave Turner takes the rap for home defeat against Shortwood last Saturday. There is a short report on the game against **Carterton** and also the game against **Shrivenham** from earlier in the season. There is the usual updated league table of the Clubs own **Fantasy Football League** which still sees Bryan Wood leading the way. The **Youth Section** page includes a round-up from young Luke Walduck from last Sunday. The latest edition of **Touchline** is re-produced once again.

Finally the next First Team home game is next Tuesday when Ascot United visit Rylands Way. Those who witnessed the lively encounter on the Racecourse Ground earlier in the season will be no doubt be looking forward to the return encounter and hopefully a better result than last time when we lost to a side that played most of the second half with just ten men. Enjoy the game this afternoon and cheer the lads on to three more points. Best Wishes.

This week we look at what topics are keeping the participants excited on the Hellenic Football League Chat mass debating pages.

For those who have not gone on the site of late you will be interested to note there is a thread about the recent departure of Hellenic League managerial legend Pete Foley from Easington Sports. Most expected Easington to be one of the challengers for the title in Division One West under Pete but that has not proved to be the case. Perhaps the issue here was the facilities at Easington meant that the player contacts that Pete had were unwilling to join the club or possibly the reality is now that those contacts are now just too old. As a former manager at Wootton Bassett Town once said to me, the window for any manager is generally quite small before your pool of player contacts becomes quite small, especially if there is no budget.

There is also a thread on the Chat room site about who will be challenging for the Premier title which quickly develops into an interesting thread about the taxability of payments to players. Who would have thought that the Hellenic League Chat room posters would get into an analysis of ICTA S.198 and the interpretation of the wholly, exclusively and necessarily rule! I wonder if any of the posters are actually HMRC tax inspectors looking to see if they can catch clubs out over payments to players.

The issue of paying players clearly divides opinions as there is a separate thread about the subject further down that has attracted a fair old number of postings.

Again on the subject of money there is also a debate about who is the wealthiest club in the Hellenic League. No one was stupid enough to claim Wootton Bassett were in the running for that prize!

There is also an interesting debate about player attitudes and the issue of player movement but take a look back over the history of our own team and you will see that playing rosters have been changing from season to season for many a year now. I think you would need to go back to our Wilts League days under Mick Woolford to really see a team that stuck together for a number of seasons.

 Appointed manager in September 2010. Has a wealth of experience and success at Hellenic League level, previously taking Highworth Town to the League Championship in season 2004/5.

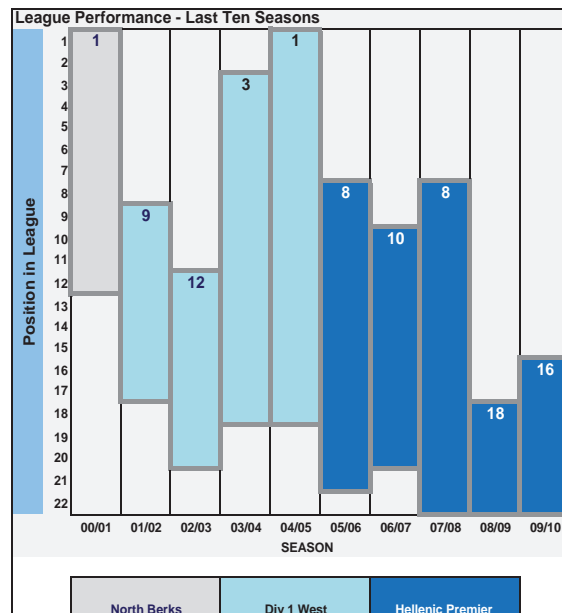
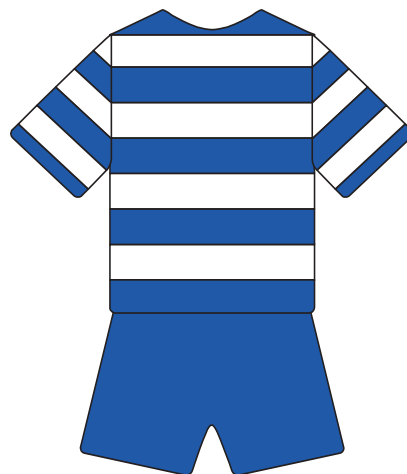

Cooper and Terry combined three minutes into the second half and again Cooper failed to convert as he headed over a Terry cross. Minutes later Bizley presented Giles with a golden chance but the Highworth forward hit well wide. Terry was then booked after a late lunge on Andy Hallett which could have seen him being sent off. Bizley was again tested on 59 minutes when he comfortably held a Giles effort. Twelve minutes after coming on Carl Taylor set up Mark Hammond with a great chance but at full stretch, Hammond hit over from ten yards after Swatton put a great ball across after linking up with Taylor. Giles physical presence sealed the game in the 73rd minute when he muscled his way through two Bassett defenders and struck in after latching onto a Jack ball. In the last few minutes, Highworth put defender McSherry up front and he could have done even more damage but on three occasions he failed to convert his chances. Bassett now face a big encounter at Almondsbury on Saturday followed by games against Brackley and Hook Norton and will look to gain wins at least against Almondsbury and Hook Norton to ensure safety.

True to Scoops word, that is exactly what Bassett did. In a crunch encounter in Bristol, Bassett came away 2-1 winners thanks to a stunning effort from Bunting and yet another goal from top scorer Swatton in a game that had it all. A 7-2 defeat to eventual champions Brackley followed, a result which helped the Northamptonshire side seal promotion to the Southern League because top spot was in the end determined by goal difference, but focus was by then firmly set on the far more winnable contest on the final day of the season. Everything was on the line going into the game, with Bassett sitting in 18th and just a point separating them from a second bottom finish. Hook Norton, though, had nothing to play for with their relegation already confirmed thanks to their ground share agreement with Southern League Banbury United due to come to an end, and they were duly thumped 5-1. Magani led the way with a brace and Bennett, Swatton and assistant manager Mick Byrne, scoring an absolute beauty in a rare outfield appearance, supplied the other three goals to ensure survival.

Somehow, somehow, safety had been secured. The final league table for the season and results and scorers for games played are shown below.

Immaculate Deflection Provides Timely Victory

The Recreation Ground, 6th November 2010

Cometh the hour, cometh the man (and the timeliest of wicked deflections). A pair of second half goals from Wootton Bassett Town talisman Sam Collier, the second of which decided the outcome of the game in the final minute, gave his side all three points in their derby encounter with Shrivenham.

Colliers contribution was made all the more significant considering the fact Bracknell Town, Thame United, Oxford City Nomads and Abingdon Town all triumphed, meaning Dave Turners side maintain the degree of separation between themselves and those below. For Shrivenham though it was a result they arguably could ill afford, even at this stage of the season. The 2-1 loss seemed slightly harsh on the early season strugglers, who put up a hearty battle, but nonetheless defeat leaves them ten points adrift of Bassett, and six behind fifth from bottom Bracknell. John Fishers side certainly deserved their lead though after edging what had been a tight opening. They were, however, aided by yet more carelessness in possession from Bassett. Having committed men forward, the blocking of Sean Baileys free kick afforded the hosts the perfect chance to counter. And they did so through the impressive Rory Sproule, who after a surging run which saw him breeze past Chris Oram, squared for veteran Steve Avenall to supply the easiest of finishes half an hour in. Following their wake up call, Bassett began to get a firmer footing in the game and could well have been on level terms at the break after forging a string of decent chances. Shortly after conceding, Terry Adams tested Luke Alford from distance, but his failure to get enough power behind his shot afforded the home custodian a comfortable save. Alex Green then directed a header from a pin-point Mark McMeeking cross narrowly over before Sam Collier rose highest to connect with a Matt Bown delivery, but his header was, fortuitously for the hosts, hacked off the line.

Following the restart, Turners side assumed the ascendancy and began causing a Shrivenham defence that had performed stoutly for the majority of the opening half problems. Bown was typically the source of Bassetts chances, with his deliveries from the right wing and corner kicks especially troubling. In the 58th minute, his perfectly placed cross should have been rewarded by Green, but the front man failed to stick one past his former team, glancing his header way wide when it appeared easier to score. Moments later Collier succeeded where his strike partner did not. Amongst a congested pack of players, he once again rose highest to divert a teasing Bown corner towards goal. And after what seemed an eternity the ball eventually nestled in the top right corner beyond the flailing grasp of Alford He then almost grabbed a second within ten minutes of equalising, but his low curling effort went narrowly wide following a perfectly weighted set down from Bailey. The final twenty minutes of the contest were frantic, with both sides showing daring for reasons outlined earlier. First, Bown raced onto a Collier flick on and flashed a shot from the edge of the area across goal, forcing an outstretched Alford to awkwardly parry the ball away to safety. At the other end, a low drive from Craig Whitbread had Stewart Thompson at full stretch, the ball squirming from his clutches. Only a snap clearance from a fortunately positioned Oram prevented the hosts from firing the ball into the back of the net. With the game seemingly headed for a draw, the match was settled in dramatic fashion in the final minute. Shrivenham were given a taste of their own medicine as well, with a quick counter initiated by Thompson creating the goal. The keeper, after assuredly handling a firmly struck Shane Davies effort, reversed the direction of play instantaneously. His punt was then expertly controlled by Collier, who shrugged off the attentions of his marker before firing towards goal from 25 yards. Alford seemed set to deal with the effort, but a wicked deflection wrong-footed him and the keeper was helpless from preventing the ball nestling in the bottom left corner. The bragging rights Fisher had commented were on the line prior to proceedings belonged to Bassett.

Scoops Man of the Match: Sam Collier, once again his goal scoring exploits inspired Bassett to three valuable points. Despite the physical, yet fair approach of the home defence, Collier persisted for the entire ninety minutes and was duly rewarded.

Scoop Rating: 6/10, it was not the greatest of performances, but the sense of relief amongst the Bassett management once the final whistle blew was tangible. This was one of the biggest games of the season so far, with Dave Turners side, after a period of indifferent league form, looking to prevent themselves being dragged into the mire at the bottom end of the table. And his troops delivered the three points, which is all that matters, no matter how.

things had got for Pete Yeardeleys side as the game also saw Steve Yeardley and Rob Hopkins both receive their marching orders.

Respite finally came with September winding down as a Swatton brace sealed an important away victory against Tuffley Rovers. The losing streak was finally over, but it was a mere taster of what was soon to come. After edging past Division One side Easington Sports in the opening round of the Challenge Cup, Bassett earned another valuable league point at home to Carterton Town. A rare goal from Neil Bridges put Bassett 2-1 ahead with just a minute to go, but an equaliser deep into stoppage time ensured the points were shared. A two goal defeat at Slimbridge followed before a Sam Reason goal earned a point at home to Tuffley. A convincing 3-0 away victory at Shortwood United thanks to a Bennett brace and a further strike from Swatton gave the impression that things were finally beginning to pick up once again, but another prolonged losing streak ensued.

Already sitting 18th, mid-table rivals Henley Town (0-1), Chipping Norton Town (0-3) and Pewsey Vale (0-2) as well as pacesetters Brackley Town (1-3) sent Bassett hurtling further towards the basement of the table, whilst Division One Cheltenham Saracens ensured there was to be an early exit from the Challenge Cup. With the team reeling in 19th place and Highworth Town set to visit, it seemed as though November would end miserably. However, a goal just after the break from Magani ensured triumph in a typically full-blooded derby affair.

However, this was to be the last time the sweet taste of victory was savoured until March, a period spanning 15 games, of which 13 were league contests, and during which a mere two points were picked up. What made things overly frustrating was the fact that these were generally not big defeats either, the majority of them seeing Bassett lose by the odd goal. After a 2-1 loss at Pegasus Juniors and a 1-1 home draw with Fairford, Bassett faced bottom side Gloucester United in what was unarguably a six-pointer at Rylands Way just two days after Christmas. And in true festive spirit, the visitors were gifted three points, the second of their three goals on a bitter afternoon coming straight from the second half kick-off as a shocked Mick Byrne was lobbed from the halfway line.

The New Year did not begin any better with two further narrow league defeats to Bishops Cleeve and struggling Pegasus, with a 4-1 County Cup thrashing courtesy of Pewsey sandwiched in between. An impressive point was then earned at Abingdon United in a goalless draw before four more consecutive defeats followed, all of them coming at Rylands Way. A late winner from ex-QPR and Wales forward Michael Meaker gave title-chasing Southall a win by the odd goal in three before a solitary strike just before the break was enough for Didcot to avenge for their loss earlier in the season. Bassett and Hungerford then combined for six goals in an entertaining contest, but despite a Swatton brace, the Berkshire side went home 4-2 victors. A lousy performance finished this run of home fixtures with Chipping Norton running out convincing 4-1 winners in another important contest. Two more single goal defeats followed in quick succession, the first coming at fellow strugglers Pewsey before North Leigh were given another run for their money, but this time the opponents prevailed. A 3-0 reverse at the hands of Carterton further imperilled Bassett, who by now had just ten games, seven of which were away contests, remaining and were staring relegation firmly in the face.

Yeardeley's side now lay second from bottom, eight points off Bicester and Shortwood, the two sides just above the relegation zone, with a single game in hand. What is more bottom side Gloucester were now a mere point behind with two games more to play! The rot was finally stopped in a tense game against the latter though. Bassett came from behind to win by the odd goal in three, courtesy of strikes from Swatton and recent signing Steve Bunting to secure a first win in near enough four months. More importantly, victory removed the first nail from the perceived relegation coffin. There were to be no miracles at title-chasing Slimbridge a few days later as the hosts prevailed by two goals but with three wins on the bounce following this game, the great escape looked on. Henley were first to be defeated with a single Swatton strike being enough for a side Bassett containing just one player over the age of 25 (Rob Hopkins) to return victorious. He then found the back of the net again, as did John Magani, to seal a 2-0 home win over Bicester. A huge win followed at Gloucester as goals from Matt Bennett and Mark Hammond secured a 2-1 triumph. However, a disastrous Easter weekend sent Bassett back into troubled waters. Fairford struck four times without a single reply to emphatically send Bassett crashing back down to earth, before more misery followed at Highworth where the home side reeled off a 2-0 victory in front of a bumper crowd, as Stuart Smedley reported:

Two goals from Adam Giles were enough for Highworth to avenge their earlier season defeat to Wootton Bassett Town as they sent their rivals back into the relegation dogfight. Coming off four wins in their last six games, Bassett's recent run of form has taken a slump over the Easter period and with only three games remaining, they need to pick up as many points as possible. Highworth had much of the early chances and on three minutes Shaun Terry found Paul Cooper whose shot went across the face of goal and wide. Matt Jack came close twice in quick succession but failed to hit the target on both occasions. An anxious Bassett fell behind in the 13th minute when Giles rose to head in after an Ian McSherry corner was headed back across the face of goal to the rising forward. Pete Macklin troubled Bassett a minute after the goal as he saw Steve Bizley off his line but could only hit wide. Giles came close again half way through the first period but he hit wide a Terry free kick on the turn. Geoff Swatton could have levelled on 21 minutes when John Magani played him through one-on-one with Elliott Jackson but the Highworth keeper brilliantly parried away Swatton's shot. Paul Patel was next to trouble Jackson but his long range effort was tipped away. Six minutes from the break Patel was at work at the other end when he had to clear a Ross Adams header off the line before Paul Cooper fired the rebound over. Bassett then had their best chance of the half when Swatton fired a ball across towards Matty Bennett whose powerful header was tipped onto the woodwork and cleared away by the Highworth defence.

Season 2003-04 Be Faithful

What was going on in the world

The season kicked off with Blu Cantrell at number one with Breathe and ends with Eamon at the top with I Dont Want You Back. England win the Rugby World Cup and Arsenal win the Premier League, a massive eleven points ahead of second placed Chelsea. Leeds United are relegated. Swindon Town finish 5th in Division Three and make the play-offs where they are defeated by Brighton who go onto defeat Bristol City in the final and join Plymouth and QPR in gaining promotion to Division Two. Saddam Hussein is captured by American Troops whilst Greece is preparing to host the summer Olympics.

After ensuring Hellenic Premier Division status for a fourth season, Wootton Bassett Town expected to push on during the 2003/04 campaign, and their initial form suggested that a decent year was going to be on the cards.

Although they started off with a single goal defeat at Hook Norton, Bassett made a huge impression in their next three fixtures, two of which came against a pair of pre-season favourites. An entertaining home opener against Almondsbury Town, a team who had struggled the season before, ended with Geoff Swattons second half header separating the two sides and got Bassett off the mark as they headed into a daunting Bank Holiday weekend double header. Reigning champions North Leigh were first up, a game which few expected Bassett to get anything from, even more so given the fact no recognised keeper was available. A chance meeting in a local supermarket with Kenny Regan, then managing and playing the odd game in goal for County League side Wootton Bassett United, helped fill the void. Yet, the expectation was still that he would have to pluck the ball from the back of the net more often than not. However, that was simply not the case. Regan belied his age, turning in an outstanding performance, along with the rest of the team, to hold the Oxfordshire side to a goalless draw. Better was to come two days later at free-spending and free-scoring Didcot Town, who boasted goal-machine Ian Concannon (scorer of 43 league goals the season before) amongst their ranks. Regular shot stopper Darren Curtis was back between the sticks for this game, and with little under a minute gone was picking the ball from the back of the net after Concannon, surprise, surprise, put the hosts ahead. But goals from a trio of youngsters, Ben Gascoyne, John Magani, who was majestic on the day, and Matty Bennett, helped spring one of the biggest upsets of the season. The Clubs website carried the following report on the game:

Ben Gascoyne, John Magani and Matt Bennett were on target as Bassett overcame Didcot 3-1 in a game Didcot were supposed to win. Magani was a potent force throughout as he played a part in all three of Bassetts goals in a tight and, at times, rough dogfight at the Loop Meadow Stadium. Bassett were one-nil down though inside the first three minutes as a short corner into the back post was played back across to the Didcot scoring machine that is Ian Concannon (118 goals in a 102 appearances for Didcot says it all) who fired home after the Bassett defence was outnumbered at the back. On nine minutes Concannon was involved in another Didcot chance as he received a ball from Damien Oglesby and put through Chris Dore. The shot from Dore though was too weak and Paul Davis was there to clear the ball away for Darren Curtis who had been rounded. After their slow start, Bassett came close as Matt Bennett, Lee Morse and Magani combined to put through Ben Gascoyne, but he could only hit his shot wide. Things began to get very physical though as Mark Vaughan was booked for kicking out at Chris Dore after Dore had already lashed out at Paul Davis after the defenders foul. On 28 minutes Dore had a shot easily saved by Darren Curtis before Davis got a caution for a mini fracas with the forward. Eight minutes from the break and Bassett were back in the game though as a great ball John Magani was latched onto by the pace of Gascoyne, who in turn put the ball home past a helpless Keith McLoughlin in the Didcot goal. Bassett had been threatening for the last ten minutes and the goal came as no surprise.

The start of the second half was exactly the opposite of the first with Bassett dominating. In the 48th minute, a deep Gascoyne throw was headed wide by Davis. A minute later and Bassett were ahead. Magani twisted and turned his way through the static Didcot defence and coolly slotted past McLoughlin to make it 2-1 to the underdogs. Dore was troubling Bassett again and in the 65th minute, Curtis was forced to pull off another great save tipping a great header wide. A minute later and Bassett were back on the attack when Gascoyne played Magani through but Andy Parrot deflected Maganis shot past the post. Curtis was forced to make another brilliant save to keep Bassetts lead intact when a Parrot header forced him into action after a Concannon corner. Concannon came close three minutes later when he headed the ball into the ground and the ball bounced over the crossbar. Keith McLoughlin denied Carl Taylor minutes later when he was one-on-one with the Didcot keeper but the ball was taken away from Taylors feet. Five minutes from time Concannon hit a volley just over after beating the offside trap. Didcot continued to threaten Bassett after this but were unable to get the important equaliser. Meanwhile, Bassett had two more chances before the defining point of the game. Two minutes after Concannon nearly scored for the home side, Bennett had his shot from the edge of the area saved after a surging run from the tricky midfielder. Then, right on ninety minutes Bennett put Dave Jones through but Jones shot was saved. Two minutes into stoppage time came the defining moment as Magani put Bennett through after another great run and the winger had just to tap home from ten yards to seal Bassetts unlikely victory. Four points out of six in two of the toughest games was well deserved after some encouraging performances from Pete Yeardleys boys.

However, the next month saw Bassett go into freefall as they scored just one goal in eight consecutive defeats in all competitions. There were narrow defeats to begin this streak, those coming against Bicester Town (0-1), Bishops Cleeve (0-2) and Abingdon United (0-2) in the league as well as against Fairford Town (0-1) in the Floodlit Cup. After slumping to a 3-0 loss away to Londoners Southall Town, things went from bad to worse as Hungerford Town then stuck four past Bassett with no reply. The 4-1 thumping received courtesy of Bemerton Heath Harlequins in the FA Vase summed up how bad

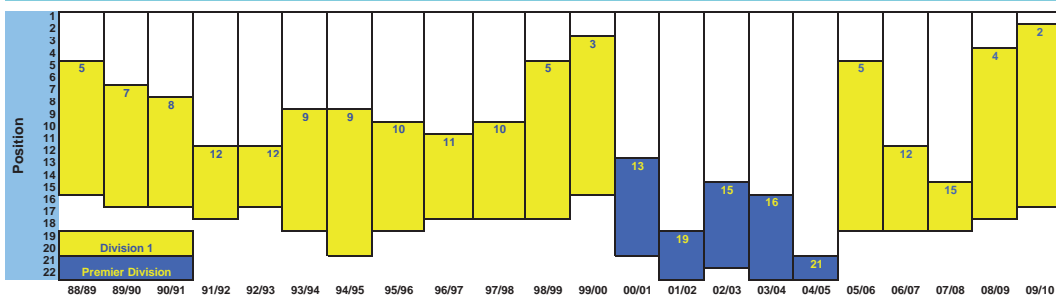

Senior teams: Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBTFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground grading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival. Well rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1st team, reserves, and under 18s. Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Bassett, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide.

Chris Jones – Head of Senior Football

Youth teams: Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/ finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators, managers, assistants and players...yes even the first team!). Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and playing pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBTFC just short of £19,000 in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees, insurance, playing / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some £35,000 per season! Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined **membership/ training fee** in the form of a standing order payment. To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for **12 months** (not just the playing season!) The current charge is **£18 per month** (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is **vital** that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process in updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne. The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions please do not hesitate to contact either Gill or myself.
