Farewell to a legend!

Pete Yeardley writes about the man who made the Clubs annual Youth Section tour to Holland possible, **Chris Kirkland**.

In 1988 Chris (then deputy head at Wootton Bassett Comprehensive School) organised his first football trip to Holland. In those days Chris organised the tours through the school and a mixture of all ages were able to experience the extraordinary hospitality and facilities offered by our Dutch hosts.

I still remember those earlier trips with fondness as on the long coach journey over, the pupils were selected into three teams of *ability* by the teachers and parents accompanying them. Many a player has been the subject of intense *haggling* in the twilight hours whilst traversing Belgium. Luckily for me Chris is always asleep in Belgium (in 23 years he has yet to see the country!!) and that is when I usually managed to con a hapless geography or maths teacher whilst assembling my superstar squad!

In 2002, after a few years *persuasion*, Chris organised the tours through the football club. The advantage of taking structured teams with their own kits, medical equipment and managers etc. became quickly apparent and these tours are now firmly fixed in the clubs calendar.

His attention to detail and meticulous planning has ensured that 23 successive tour parties have directly benefited both socially and football development wise through experiences gained in Holland. Several of those youngsters have indeed progressed into the professional game either as players or Youth Academy directors. Many of those have also made firm friends in Holland, and all will look back on their times with immense fondness.

Now based in Portsmouth, Chris has decided the time is right to take a step back and allow the tours to evolve through the football club. We must reluctantly respect that decision and **THANK HIM** on behalf of everyone who has travelled over the past 23 years.

He will be a hard act to follow and both Nigel Deane and I are under no illusions as to the difficulty of the task ahead. Rest assured our commitment is to continue with the legacy initiated by the legend, that is **Chris Kirkland**.

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Abingdon Town FC • Club History

Abingdon Town FC were formed in 1870 as Abingdon FC and are one of the oldest clubs in the country, being the second oldest in the Berks & Bucks FA.

In 1899 the club amalgamated with local side St. Michaels and were simply called Abingdon until 1928. During this period the leagues were changed quickly and in the early years the Berks & Bucks, West Berkshire, Reading Temperance and North Berks Leagues had all been entered. Following the Second World War Town returned to the Reading League before joining the Spartan League and in 1953 they were founder members of the Hellenic League. Clubs who joined this league could be no more than 30 miles from Abingdon Town Hall.



The late 1950's were a purple patch for the Town, claiming 3 titles in 4 years and winning the League Cup. But the crowning glory came on Easter Monday 1959 when Abingdon defeated Aylesbury United 2-1 to claim the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup for the first and only time to date.

Town remained in the Hellenic League for 35 years, in 1966 and 1975 they were relegated to the First Division but on both occasions won promotion back to the Premier Division at the first attempt. The 1980's saw Abingdon become one of the strongest sides in the area. After winning the Hellenic League in 1987 and finishing runners up a year later, Town switched to the opposite side of the pyramid and entered the Spartan League for the second time, which they subsequently won at the first attempt. They were then elected to the Isthmian League Division 2 South. The Town finished 3rd in their first season. A 200 seater grandstand was built along with other ground improvements.

The following year Abingdon were promoted to the 1st Division of the Isthmian League after finishing the season as Champions of the League and runners up in the Loctite Trophy. The next few seasons saw Town maintain their position in the league before they suffered relegation in 1997/98, this began a downward spiral for Town and they were relegated again the following season. The next few years saw mid-table finishes before at the end of 2004/05 ground owners Oracle Leisure exercised a right to take over the running of the football club and as a result an entirely new Management Team and Committee were brought in. Tom Larman Senior took over as Chairman and his first duty was to resign from the Isthmian League, switching back to the Hellenic League in an effort to boost attendances, Keith Stopps was appointed Manager and he steadied the ship, but Town still experienced a tough season, finishing just one place above thebottom three.

Season 2007/08 was another season of highs and lows - Town, boosted by a number of Summer signings, got off to a good start in the League and by November were in the top 6. Abingdon suffered a disastrous second half of the season, ending up in the final relegation place despite a superb end of season victory over Almondsbury Town, thus denying them the Championship. Season 2009/10 Town were reprieved and remained in the Hellenic Premier.

A new management team came in and saw Abingdon United stalwart Mark O'Hara appointed Manager. Town had a better season finishing 12th and losing in the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy and Floodlit Cup at the semi final stages.





there again. However, like their earlier counterparts, they were to come up short in the showpiece, this time falling to a strong Walcot side in an agonising extra time defeat. Bassett were given an almighty fright in their First Round tie at Division Four outfit Oaksey, but eventually ran out 3-2 winners. From there on in, Bassett were to face Division Three counterparts, beginning with a trip to Pewsey Vale in the second round. Yet again they were made to work hard for victory, recording a narrow 2-1 win to progress to the quarter finals, where they were to face Bemerton on home soil. The Salisbury-based outfit had beaten Bassett in the league earlier in the year, but struggled mightily at Rylands Way as Bassett showed no mercy, gaining revenge for their previous loss. By now in strong league form, the team carried this over, knocking five past their opponents. Barry Speirs led the way with a brace, whilst Steve Thomas and Paul Burke chipped in with a goal each, the other goal coming courtesy of a Bemerton defender. In a strange twist Bassett were paired yet again with West Swindon in the semi final. Again a solitary goal ended up deciding the tie, with Gerry McKay supplying the extra time winner. Walcot were to prove too prove strong though, just as they had done to their other Division Three rivals during their successful league campaign. However, Bassett made them work hard in order for them to complete the double. They had recorded convincing victories against Bassett in their two league encounters, and took the lead just before the break, despite Bassett having the majority of the first half chances. Chappell equalised to force extra time midway through the second half, but Bassett were to be undone by a 106th minute strike.

FROM THE ARCHIVES - 1988-89

Boxing Day saw a local derby played in front of a large crowd at Rylands Way and another defeat. The game was settled by a Peter York header into his own net. The only other noteworthy event reported by the Gazette and Herald was a brilliant penalty save by Mark Ayres from Highworths Glen Benson. The calendar year ended with a useful point in a 0-0 draw with Almondsbury Picksons at Rylands Way. It could have been even better if Colin Valters had done better with two one-on-ones with the Almondsbury keeper.

The advent of the New Year saw early exits from two cups. In the League Cup Wootton Bassett lost 1-0 away at Cheltenham Town. There was also then an exit from the Wiltshire Senior Cup, Wootton Bassett Town losing 2-0 at home to Wiltshire League side Aldbourne. On the return to league action the points were shared at Cheltenham Saracens. Roger Frost put Wootton Bassett in front from an Ian John free kick but Cheltenham equalised on 70 minutes with a powerful shot. A combination of fixture scheduling and bad weather meant that Wootton Bassett Town then went a month without a game returning to action on 18th of February with a visit to Chipping Norton Town. Finding themselves one down Colin Valters brought Bassett level following good approach work by Damien York and Ian Johns. Valters then missed two good scoring opportunities and Ian Johns hit the bar and it took until the 70th minute for Bassett to get the winner. A run down the right and cross from Valters was met by Roger Frost to secure the three points.

Once again there were a couple of weeks without a game but off the field there were some interesting developments. The Wiltshire Gazette and Herald of 9th March 1989 noted the following:

Wootton Bassett Football Club, whose first team competes in the Federated Homes League and reserves in the Wiltshire County League, are hoping to run a third team next season. An Under 12s side has already been established and the aim is to put forward a side to probably compete in the Swindon & District League. The hope is that the third side will offer a chance for local youth players to develop. However, this will only be achieved if a manager and assistant can be found to run this side. Anyone interested in either of these posts, or in playing, should contact the honorary secretary Paul Harrison....

The article went on to also advertise for general help with running the club. Wootton Bassett finally played again on the 11th March, defeating near neighbours Purton 1-0 at Rylands Way in a game that saw Purtons Paul Mutlow sent off. March ended with two away fixtures and two defeats. On a heavy pitch at Kilkenny Lane, Wootton Bassett went down 2-1 to Carterton, Damien York with the consolation goal from the penalty spot. This was followed by a defeat by the same score line in the local derby with Highworth Town. Roger Frost scored the goal for Wootton Bassett but Highworth goalkeeper Paul Haines prevented Wootton Bassett taking anything from the game. Highworths prolific Kevin Higgs got both goals for the home side.

The run of defeats was brought to an end with the first fixture in April as Wootton Bassett twice came from behind to draw with Easington Sports, Steve Ackrill and Damien York netting for Bassett. The penultimate home fixture saw Wootton Bassett return to winning ways as they defeated the Herd 3-2 with all five goals coming after the break. Wootton Bassett actually went 3-0 up with goals from Ian Johns, Steve Ackrill and a Damien York penalty. The Cirencester based side then hit two quick replies but the Gazette & Herald reported that Bassett held out comfortably and went closest to scoring again when Colin Valters hit a post. On the day that saw the tragic disaster at Hillsborough, Wootton Bassett lost 2-1 away at Clanfield in the final away game of the season. The season itself came to an end the following week with Carterton the visitors to Rylands Way. A Damien York have a neally good season commented manager Mick Woolford in the Wiltshire Gazette and Herald of 27^{th} April 1989. In reality a fifth place finish in the first season at this level was a very creditable performance.

Wootton Bassett Town Reserves also had a good season particularly in cup competitions. Four years after first reaching the Wiltshire County League Ghia Junior Cup final, they negotiated their way



FROM THE ARCHIVES - 1988-89

all three points were won at The Herd thanks to a hat-trick from the prolific Damien York. The Gazette and Herald of the 20^{th} October 1988 carried the following report on the match:

Wootton Bassetts recovery from the poor start in the Federated Homes League continued last weekend with a 3-0 away win over The Herd. It raised their current unbeaten run to six games, four wins and two draws. The Herd defended well and kept the first half goalless. But it all came good in the second half for Wootton Bassett starting with Damien York being put through by Ian Johns to score their opening goal. York then added a second goal before Bassett had to face a Herd penalty, but Mark Ayres saved it brilliantly. From the clearance Wootton Bassett went straight to the other end for York to put them three up and also complete his hat-trick. Injuries then hit them with Steve Ackrill and Tony Davis both having to retire leaving Bassett to play out the closing stages of the game with only ten men.

The fine run of form continued into the following week when Wootton Bassett found themselves 3-0 up in the first 25 minutes against Kidlington through Damien York (2) and Paul Harper. Kidlington got one back just after the break but Colin Valters then made it 4-1 with affine 25 yard shot from an angle. A Mitch John own goal and a penalty for the visitors led to some nervous moments but Bassett held on for the three points. This was the fourth consecutive win and stretched the unbeaten run to seven. October ended with a break from league action with the Preliminary Round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup and a trip to Pewsey Vale. Goals from Gerry McKay and Mitch John in a 2-1 win ensured progress against the Wilts League opponents. It was not such a good day for other Hellenic League sides as both Penhill and Supermarine were on the wrong end of shocks, losing to Wiltshire League sides Aldbourne Park and Sanford respectively.

November kicked off with Wootton Bassett suffering their first defeat for sometime as they lost 2-1 away at Headington Amateurs. It was a bad day at the office for goalkeeper Mark Ayres who was beaten by a 40 yard shot and then failed to hold a soft one to give leaders Headington a 2-0 lead. Wootton Bassett scored a minute from time when Damien York scored after Roger Frost headed on a long throw. A midweek fixture away to Cirencester Town under lights saw Wootton Bassett share four goals and the points, both Bassett goals coming courtesy of Colin Valters. Having played one top side the previous Saturday next up were the other side at the top of the table, Almondsbury Picksons. It was an injury ravaged Wootton Bassett that visited the Bristol side and added to their injury woes meaning that all four of their midfield players were now sidelined. They had to finish this game with just ten men when Mitchell John joined Tony Hoare in having to leave the field of play and there just being one substitute permitted at the time. Despite these setbacks Wootton Bassett ran the eventual champions close on their own patch going down by the odd goal in five. Roger Frost and Mick Karn with the Wootton Bassett goals. A quick return game against struggling Cirencester Town saw the squad stretched to the limit as Wootton Bassett had to make do without Nick Johns, Steve Ackrill, Tony Hoare, Greg Smith, Paul Harrison, Terry Davis and Gary McKay. The 2-1 win in the circumstances was a fine result. A Paul Harper penalty put Bassett in front but Circucester drew level with a lob over goalkeeper Mark Ayres after half an hour. Wootton Bassett finally secured all three points with a 71st minute goal by Colin Valters from a Damien York pass.

December opened with the next round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup and again the opposition were from the Wilshire County League, this time in the shape of Plessey Sports. Once again Wootton Bassett made hard work of overcoming lesser league opposition. Colin Valters put Wootton Bassett in front from a Peter York through ball and Bassett sealed a place in the next round when Roger Frost headed in a long throw from Paul Harper. On their return to league action Wootton Bassett moved up level on points with fourth placed Purton following a fine 2-1 home win over third placed Lambourn Sports. Trailing 1-0 at the break they equalised in the 61st minute through Paul Harrison who took a through ball from Tony Hoare and rounded the advancing Lambourn keeper before scoring. Then in the 75th minute Colin Valters took a centre from the left and made no mistake to put Bassett in front. Just before the end Wootton Bassett nearly made it 3-1 when Ian Johns hit the crossbar with a shot. After such a good result it was disappointing to then lose the following week at Cheltenham, despite two goals from Colin Valters. Bassett went down 3-2 to opponents at the wrong end of the table.

Season 1988-89 Like A Prayer

What was going on in the world

The Summer Olympics are held in Seoul. South Korea and in the prestigious 100m event Canadian Ben Johnson wins with a new world record but then tests positive for a banned substance. Benazir Bhutto is sworn in as the Prime Minister of Pakistan to become the first woman to head the government of an Islamic state. Pan Am Flight 103 is blown up over Lockerbie killing a total of 270 people. In a bad time for air disasters, a British Midland 737 crashes on approach to East Midlands Airport leaving 47 dead. Tim Berners-Lee invents the World Wide Web, probably not aware of the impact his invention was to have on the world. Arsenal win the Division One title by virtue of having scored 8 more goals than second placed Liverpool as both teams finish with identical points and goal difference. The title comes in a title deciding game at Anfield that Arsenal win by the needed 2-0, with the crucial second coming in injury time from Michael Thomas. Chelsea win Division Two with a massive 99 points ahead of Manchester City. Swindon Town under Lou Macari finish a creditable sixth and make the place-offs, losing in the semi-final to eventual winners Crystal Palace. Paul Gascoigne becomes the first £2 million footballer when he signed for Tottenham from Newcastle. In the FA Cup the season will be remembered for the horrendous disaster at Hillsborough in the semifinal tie between Liverpool and Nottingham Forest when 94 Liverpool fans are killed. Liverpool go on to win the FA Cup defeating neighbours Everton in the final 3-2 after extra time.

The first season in the Hellenic League could not have got off to a tougher start with Wootton Bassett Town having to face last seasons Division One champions Cheltenham Town Reserves in their opening game at Rylands Way. It was made all the more harder for them by having so many players unavailable, fifteen in all, and Bassett had to postpone their second team game. In the circumstances a 3-0 home defeat was not unexpected although Cheltenham Town were not to be the same strong side as the previous season as the season unfolded. Headington Amateurs visited Rylands a week later and left with all three points following a narrow one nil win. The first point of the season was secured in midweek when the big local derby with Purton resulted in the two sides sharing four goals and the points.

Septembers first fixture saw the other Cheltenham side visit Rylands Way in the shape of Cheltenham Saracens. A solitary 80th minute goal from the visitors was all that separated the two sides and the closest Bassett came to scoring an equaliser was a 25 yard Paul Harper drive which hit the post. The first win of the season came with yet another home fixture courtesy of a hat-trick from Damien York. Mick Karn added a fourth goal in the 4-1 win over Easington Sports. Next up was a trip to Lambourn Sports. The Wiltshire Gazette and Herald noted in its report on the game that Wootton Bassett had struggled with early season injuries and suspensions. A bad first half saw Bassett trailing 2-0 at the break thanks to an own goal from Steve Ackrill and an error from deputy goalkeeper Martin Rees. However, Wootton Bassett fought back in the second half with left back Tony Hoare reducing the deficit in the 64th minute with a 25 yard shot after good play between Gerry McKay and Roger Frost had created the chance. Then in the 76th minute Damien York got on the end of a Roger Frost flick on to equalise and ensure the points were shared. The points were again shared the following week when Chipping Norton Town visited Rylands, Damien York scoring in the 54th minute in the 1-1 draw. The visitors scored from a corner awarded in controversial circumstances. Bassett goalkeeper Mark Lewis claiming he had kept a back pass in. York had missed a couple of glorious chances in the opening stages and this was a game that should have been won.

October 1st saw the return to action of Paul Harrison who celebrated his return to football after a cartilage operation by scoring the goal for Wootton Bassett Reserves against West Swindon. Meanwhile the First Team had an excellent result, defeating Clanfield 6-2 at Ryland Way, in what turned out to be their best result of the season. Unfortunately we have not been able to trace details of the scorers in this game. Paul Harrison was back in First Team action the following week and the Gazette and Herald reported that he had a very good game in the 2-0 away win at Kidlington. Damien York and Colin Valters with the goals in this one. The good form continued the following week when

MATCH REPORTS

Saved at the death

Rylands Way, 12th February 2011

Manager Dave Turners prediction that his sides derby affair with Shrivenham would be a dreary affair proved correct. For 75 minutes.

The majority of the match was an insipid, uninspired, action-starved borefest, but Chris Coxs headed goal for the visitors with just under quarter of an hour left sparked a frenetic finish that saw Wootton Bassett Town equalise through youngster Ethan Delaney with seconds of stoppage time remaining.

It meant for the second time this season Bassett had denied John Fishers relegation battling outfit points with the earlier meeting between the two sides having been decided by a last minute winner from Sam Collier.

This rematch though was a contest which neither side deserved to win, with the majority of those present at Rylands Way likely wishing they too had taken Turners initiative and ventured off to a foreign land for the weekend instead.

In the opening exchanges both strike partnerships gave their defensive opponents an easy ride. Playing too far apart, both Bassetts pairing of Delaney and Sam Collier and Shrivenhams duo of Steve Robertson and Rory Sproule, demonstrated a lack of chemistry between one another that meant any flick-ons were swept up comfortably instead of causing any danger.

Therefore, the opening period was one of just half chances, the first of which fell to Robertson twenty minutes in. Ryan King weighted a cross from the deep to the forward perfectly, but Robertson snapped an effort on the turn from a tight angle wide of the upright.

Shrivenham then felt they should have had a penalty when Dan Thompson appeared to have been clipped just inside the box. However, his theatrical tumble failed to convince referee Payne to put whistle to mouth, much to the disgust of the visitors bench.

On the stroke of half time King raced on to a Robertson flick on and the right winger struck across goal from an angle, however his effort was a weak one, failing to trouble Stewart Thompson, and rolled timidly out of play.

These two openings did have Thompson on his toes though, unlike Ian Gill in the visitors goal, who was not once alerted in the first half, with the best the hosts could muster being speculative long range efforts from midfielders Sam Packer and Matty Bown that missed the target by a considerable distance, sailing over.

Early territorial advantage following the restart belonged to the visitors. However, they were unable to capitalise on this, meaning Thompsons quiet day between the sticks continued.

This early pressure also almost led to Bassett taking the lead following a quick break. Bown began the move, sending a long pass up field that Collier directed into the path of substitute Matty Boucher with a deft header. The former Fairford midfield then sent a precisely timed and weighted through ball into the path of Delaney, who had beat the offside trap. Against an onrushing Gill, the youngster was first to the ball and poked the ball beyond the keeper. Unfortunately however his shot crawled agonisingly wide of the left hand post.

Ten minutes later it appeared as though the hosts were going to be made to pay for that missed opportunity when Cox nodded home at the far post from a Martin Stratford corner that had been allowed to sail across the face of goal unchallenged by the Bassett defence.

Desperate for an equaliser, they sent a third man up front, which had the effect of pegging the visitors back into their own half. But it appeared as though this switch was going to bear no fruit as Gill was not forced into action thanks to some steadfast defending.

Yet, the game had one final twist in store as Delaney conjured up a goal out of nothing. He was the recipient of a deflected pass on the edge of the area, but a heavy first touch appeared as though it would kill any chance of him getting a shot off.

But, the Shrivenham back line failed to pounce on this mistake, allowing the youngster to regain his composure. And he made his second bite of the cherry count, firing a low effort on the turn towards goal that beat Gill and founds its way into the back of the net via the post.

With Reading Town, Bracknell Town and Witney United securing impressive victories that goal may come to have added significance as it meant the ground made up with Tuesdays win against Carterton was not entirely wiped out.

Scoops Man of the Match: Liam Edmondson \(\preceq\) nullified the impact the dangerous Rory Sproule was to have on the game, winning most aerial duels against the spirited Shrivenham front man. Shaun Carter was also composed, meaning Stewart Thompson could enjoy a relatively quiet afternoon.

Scoop Rating: 5/10 \square the heavy Rylands Way pitch did not help either team, but neither demonstrated much quality. The point was very much welcome, but much better performances will be needed if Bassett are to continue to add to their points tally in the seasons second half.








Senior teams: Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBTFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground frading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival. Well rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1st team, reserves, and under18s, Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Bassett, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide.

Youth teams: Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/ finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators, managers, assistants and players..., ves even the first team!). Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and plaving pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBTFC just short of £19,000 in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees. insurance, playing / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some £35,000 per season! Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined membership/ training fee in the form of a standing order payment. To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for 12 months (not just the playing season!) The current charge is £18 per month (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is vital that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process in updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne. The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions




