EDITORIAL

Good evening and welcome back to Rylands Way for this **Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup** fixture fixture against **Bicester Town**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Bicester** who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home.

Well done to Dave and the lads for the tremendous result on Saturday, the 4-1 win over **Abingdon Town** was a terrific result and will go a long way to securing Premier Division football again next season. Two goals from **Sam Collier** and one a piece for substitutes **Alex Green** and **Mitch Wyatt** doing the damage.

Tonight sees a break from league action as we look to make it through to the last eight of the League Cup competition. The previous round of this competition was way back in October when two goals from **Sam Collier** booked a place in this round of the competition at the expense of a spirited **Rayners Lane** side. That day our Division One opponents proved a tough nut to crack and a difficult tie can again be expected tonight. **Bicester Town** currently occupy fourth place in Division One West with 36 points from 20 games, 11 of which have been won, 3 drawn and they have suffered six defeats. They are currently battling with Clanfield and Purton for that third and possible promotion spot. With leaders Headington Amateurs not having lights third spot may be enough for Bicester to secure a return to the Premier Division. The last time the two sides met was back in 2004-5 when Bicester Town did the double over us, winning 1-0 at Rylands Way and 4-1 at Bicester, Rob Day scoring or consolation goal that day. In 2003-4 it was honours even as we won 2-0 at home courtesy of goals from John Magani and Geoff Swatton but lost 1-0 at Bicester. Prior to that in the previous three seasons Wootton Basset Town had won all six league games between the two sides when we were something of a bogey side for Bicester.

Looking at what is in tonights programme, Manager Dave Turner looks back at recent games in his **From The Dugout** column. The **From the Archives** feature this week goes back to **1997-98** and a disappointing season in Division One of the Hellenic League. There is the usual updated league table of the Clubs own **Fantasy Football League** which still sees Bryan Wood still leading the way although the lead at the top is being eroded week by week. The **Youth Section** page includes a round-up from young **Luke Walduck** from games played on Sunday 27th of February together with the results from Sunday 6th March. **Danny Groom** includes a write-up of recent excellent results for the **Under 18s** who are in the semi-finals of the County Youth Cup and top of the League having hammered nearest rivals Devizes Town 4-1 last week.

The next First Team game at Rylands Way is eleven days away when **Bracknell Town** come to Rylands Way. The last time they came to Rylands Way was in the FA Cup in September 2007 when Bracknell were in the Zamaretto League. Two goals that day from Steve Yeardeley saw Wootton Bassett progress through to the next round. The only other time the two sides have met was earlier this season when Bassett had a bad day at the office, going down 3-0 and also having Shaun Carter sent off. Before that there are games here at Rylands Way featuring the Womens side, the Under 18s and the Reserves. The Womens side are at home on Sunday when **Cirencester Ladies** are the visitors. The Ladies side will be looking to return to winning ways to try and secure that runners-up spot in the league. The following Tuesday the Reserves entertain high flying **Abingdon United Reserves** looking to continue the recent improved form. Two days later the Under 18s play host to **Amesbury Town** looking to secure three more points in the quest for the league title. Having defeated closest rivals Devizes Town 4-1 last week the destiny of the title is very much in Dannys sides hands now. Win the remaining games and they will be champions. The Bracknell game is then two days later.

Enjoy the game and cheer the lads onto the last eight of this League cup competition.

WORLD OF FOOTBALL

this week looking at ...fans clubs

Ten days ago, when the Wootton Bassett Town game at Binfield fell victim to a lunchtime postponement, the Smedley family had a decision to make. With Scott already in Woking and with Stuart already on the train out of Waterloo what were we going to do that afternoon? With wife Claire wanting to go shopping in Kingston the solution was easy, a trip to watch AFC Wimbledon play in the Blue Square Premier, AFC Wimbledon playing at the old Kingstonian ground in Kingston. With the car parked up near the shops Stuart, Scott and I set off on foot for the football ground. Now it did not look too far on the map but took us a good twenty five minutes. Not really knowing where we were going and not seeing too many fans heading in the direction of the ground we wondered whether we had gone in the right direction but in the end we had taken the most direct route, the ground is just a little way out of the town centre! The game did attract a crowd of just over 3,000 in a nice little stadium that Swindon Town may well be visiting next season. It seems most of the fans approach the ground from the other direction and not from the town centre. In an entertaining game, AFC Wimbledon defeated Altrincham 4-1 with a hat-trick for the very useful Danny Kedwell. It was interesting to see that the Wimbledon club include all the honours of the previous Wimbledon side, including the FA Cup in their honours list in the matchday programme. Their president is one Dickie Guy, the former goalkeeper who was the star of their giant killing FA cup days when the old Wimbledon club were still a non-league side. There are other old Wimbledon connections with Marcus Gayle as the Reserve Team manager.

AFC Wimbledon were the first of the various clubs formed by a supporters trust. After decades of success, the old Wimbledon FC was allowed by a supine FA Commission to relocate to Milton Keynes. The Dons fans were outraged and determined not to let a proud 104-year history die. Within just six weeks during the summer of 2002, AFC Wimbledon, a club the sports governing body had declared *would be not in the wider interests of football*, was born. The new Dons opening match in the Combined Counties League (same level in the pyramid as Wootton Bassett Town currently play at) attracted 2,449 fans to Sandhurst Towns basic Bottom Meadow ground, where bales of hay were brought in to form improvised terracing. After finishing third at the end of that first campaign, the Dons secured a league and cup double in 2004. The next season they won the Ryman League First Division South before twice failing in the Premier Division playoffs over the following 24 months.

The upward momentum was restored with the arrival of experienced manager Terry Brown in 2007. In his first year the new boss helped the team scramble out of the Ryman League via the playoffs, and followed that up by leading his side to the Conference South title at the first attempt. The Blue Square Premier proved a tougher nut to crack, and despite being in fourth place at the turn of the year the club finished outside the playoff places last April. They currently top the Blue Square Premier League this season but high spending Crawley are just one point behind with six games in hand due to their own FA Cup exploits and are favourites to achieve the one automatic place into the Football League. AFC Wimbledon will then be looking to make it back into the league via the play-offs if they are pipped by Crawley. From what we saw they will have a good chance of making it back into the Football League.

The rise of AFC Wimbledon has brought inevitable comparisons with their illustrious predecessors climb from the Southern League to the old First Division during the 1970s and 80s. That success culminated in victory over Liverpool in the 1988 FA Cup Final, prompting BBC commentator John Motson to deliver the immortal line, *The Crazy Gang have beaten the Culture Club*. That unique spirit lives on in the large numbers of fans who give up their time to run the present club. AFC Wimbledon is still wholly owned by its supporters via the one-fan, one-vote Dons Trust. It was conceived on 27 May 2002 by Ivor Heller, Kris Stewart, Trevor Williams and Marc Jones. While fellow campaigners were protesting in Londons Soho Square and waiting to hear whether the relocation of their club would be sanctioned, these four were looking at how they could start anew. *We all felt that if the vote went against us we would have to start another club*, Heller said.

Eight years on, he is the clubs commercial director. The new Dons have made steady progress. While making plans for a possible future return to Wimbledon, they are gradually redeveloping the ground in Kingston their fans bought, and the youth set-up is growing fast. Backed last year by average attendances of over 3,500, the club took the decision to go full time this season as the development continues.

AFC Wimbledon are not the only fans club to be doing well this season. AFC Telford, formed following Telfords demise are currently 3rd in the Blue Square North. FC Halifax, rising from the ashes of former Football League side Halifax Town are romping away with the Evo-Stik Premier League and look dead certs for promotion into the Conference North. FC United, the disillusioned Manchester United fans club, are currently in 6th spot in the same division, just outside the play-off places. Finally, Chester, formed out of the ashes of the old Chester City club, are running away with Division One North of the Evo-Stick League. It certainly looks like it is going to be a good season for the fans clubs in 2010-11.

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Bicester Town FC • Club History

Founded in 1873, joining the County Football Association on its inception on 26th January 1884, Bicester Town Football Club is one of the eldest and most respected clubs in Oxfordshire. For a number of seasons it competed at junior level, winning the County Junior Shield, for the only time, in season 1902-03.

The following year, in its first season as a senior club, Bicester Town won the Oxfordshire Senior League championship. But, for the following 20 or so years, until the late 1920s, the trophy cupboard collected nothing more, and then the Club won the Senior League once again, the County Senior and Charity Cups, the Banbury Charity Cup, and the Chipping Norton Charity Cup for three successive seasons.

It was one of the Founder Members of the Hellenic League on its formation in 1953. During its membership, it was league champions in 1960-61, relegated in 1976-77, but climbed back immediately the next season with the Division One championship and cup double, and then regained the league championship in 1979-80



More recently, the Premier Division Cup found its way to Bicester in 1985-86 and again in season 1990-91. The Town was also Bicester Charity Cup winners for seasons 1991-92, 1992-93 and 1995-96, and Launton Invitation Cup winners for seasons 1992-93 and 1993-94. The highlight for the Club in recent years was on 1st February 1994 for the inaugural switching-on of the floodlights at Oxford Road when the Town did themselves proud losing only 3-0 against a strong Portsmouth side in front of almost a thousand spectators.



Since the 2007/08 season, the Club has been under the control of a new Board of Directors, which has injected a greater degree of professionalism in the Club's affairs. Significant steps have been taken to re-build the Club's infrastructure in order to provide a solid foundation for a Club with its roots firmly in the local community, and which is accountable to its Members.

The last two seasons 2008/09 and 2009/10 have been ones of struggle not just on the field but off it as well. The 2008/09 season saw the club finish in the bottom four of the premier division but survive the fate of relegation because there wasn't enough clubs in the promotion places in division one east and west with the ground criteria for the standard of the premier division. Halfway through last season (2009/10) the club lost half of its committee and from that moment the whole future of the club was in serious doubt. But thanks to the sterling efforts of the few committee members that were left the club carried on and by the end of the season a new and more vibrant committee was in place. Unfortunately the off field problems affected the playing side of things and relegation wasn't survive this time around, but with a new committee, a new side and the financial future looking a lot healthy then two seasons ago the club is looking forward to this season with great deal of confidence.

A very good target man who works hard and holds the ball up well, bringing the midfield into the attack. Adam is destined for higher things!



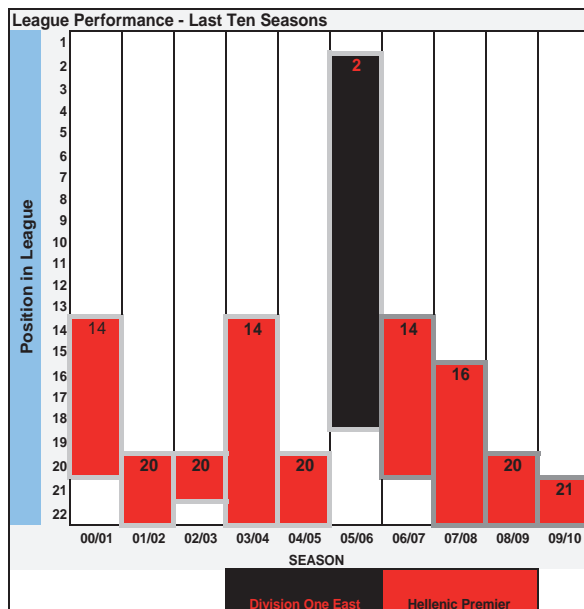
Chris Hurley Manager

Last Saturday saw Bassett travelling to Oxfordshire for the last of a long line of away games and a tough one at that for Kidlington has not been a favourite ground for the visitors in recent seasons. Now Bassett were now on top and causing an opposition, currently fourth in the table, no end of problems. On 66 minutes, came their best move of the game. Newton deliver[ed] a perfect cross from the left to Stoddart who met it on the volley five yards out. To Bassett's utmost despair, the Kidlington keeper pulled off a miraculous save. But worse followed when Stoddart put the rebound wide. Bassett laid siege to the Kidlington goal, but their just reward was not to be. In a rare Kidlington attack, Read - who had been a spectator for most of the second half, pulled off a great save from a point blank header. Although disappointed, Bassett could feel that, on this performance, the best side had come second on the day.

With a run of five home games Wootton Bassett Town were confident of turning this good form into points and move up the table but this unfortunately did not prove to be the case. We started the second half in the same vein and added a second with a well taken far post header by Simon Bilic Green, his first of the season. We then thought we had done the job and took our foot off the pedal, stopped doing all the good things that had put us in the driving seat, i.e. good shape, tight marking, good concentration and discipline. It seems that our players have to learn the hard way. At this standard of football you cannot give any team a sniff to get back into the game which is what happened with Saracens. But I must end on a positive note because over the past two weeks we have played the third and fourth placed team and shown that we can compete with them, played better football on both occasions and have taken them all the way, something that did not happen last season which goes to show that our confidence is growing. Sure we need to improve in a few areas, we are still a developing team. If we can play a full 90 minutes on a consistent basis like we did for 65 minutes last week then we need fear no one.

The Managers wish was not, however, granted; as the subsequent fixture with Pegasus Juniors on 28th March saw the visitors win 2-0.

The next scheduled fixture should have seen second placed Cirencester Academy visit Rylands Way but the game was postponed. The fixtures did not get any easier as next up were another leading side in the shape of near neighbours Purton. A solitary goal gave Purton all three points and the fourth consecutive defeat for Wootton Bassett. The bad run was finally ended when Milton visited Rylands Way as goals from Paul David and Justin Hyde gave Bassett a 2-0 win. Three days later the re-

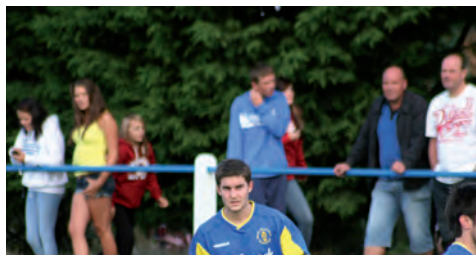

FROM THE ARCHIVES - 1997-98

November opened with an away fixture at Milton United, leading 2-1 thanks to one from Peter Dearlove and an own goal the game was abandoned on sixty minutes and would have to be replayed later in the season. This followed an incident where one of the Milton players attacked the referee in an unsavoury incident. Interest in the Division One Challenge Cup did not last beyond the First Round as Wootton Bassett went down 6-2 at home against the side who had won the competition for the previous three seasons, Ardley United. Kevin Read was making his debut in goal for Wootton Bassett Town, replacing Steve Hale, and it was a tough introduction. Ardley would go on to win the competition for the fourth consecutive season, defeating Pegasus Juniors in the final. A quick return fixture with Watlington Town saw the first double of the season secured as Wootton Bassett Town ran out 4-1 winners at Rylands Way, Lee Stoddart bagging a brace and one a piece for Jeremy Newton and Dominic Franklin. The final fixture in the month saw Wootton Bassett make the short journey to Purton for the local derby with a side challenging for honours. In this case it was honours even as the two sides shared two goals and the points, on target for Wootton Bassett Town was Lawrence Smith.

December opened with a visit from bottom of the table Yarnton. A second hat-trick of the season from Peter Dearlove did the damage in a 4-1 win, Lee Stoddart adding a fourth. However, the final fixture of the calendar year was to end in disappointment as Wootton Bassett went down 3-2 at Cirencester United, Lee Stoddart and Paul Harper with the consolation goals.

The beginning of January often sees the Wiltshire County Cup get into full swing and Season 1997-98 was no different. The draw had been unkind to Wootton Bassett with a home draw against fellow Hellenic Division One West side and near neighbours Purton. In the league Purton were amongst the front runners and the cup fixture between the two sides ran to form as Purton won 2-0. The next fixture saw the visit of struggling Letcombe in the league and it was to be two dropped points as the visitors held Bassett to a 2-2 draw, Peter Dearlove and Paul Harper scoring for Bassett. The points were again shared the following week when Wootton Bassett and Headington Amateurs both failed to find the net. The month ended on a positive note after goals from Jeremy Newton (2) and Dominic Machell secured a 3-2 win at home against Clanfield.

February kicked-off with a tough looking fixture away to league leaders Ardley United and so it proved as Wootton Bassett Town went down to their heaviest defeat of the season, a 5-1 reverse, Darren Cardus scoring what was to be his only goal of the season. In his programme notes for the subsequent fixture with Cheltenham Saracens, Manager Dave Warren noted that the score line flattered the league leaders with Bassett missing a number of chances. This defeat was followed by another in Cheltenham against Bishops Cleeve, Lee Stoddart having given Wootton Bassett the lead, only for lapses of concentration to allow the home side to score twice and take the points. The month did, however, end on a positive note with a comfortable 3-0 away win at Letcombe courtesy of two goals from Lee Stoddart and one from Jeremy Newton.

The first week in March saw the re-scheduling of the abandoned game with Milton and justice was done as Wootton Bassett, who had been leading the original game with their opponents already down to ten men when the Milton player attacked the referee, won the re-scheduled fixture by six goals to three. Gary Ashford certainly enjoyed the game as he fired a hat-trick with Justin Hyde, Jeremy Newton and Paul Harper adding the other goals. Prior to the next league fixture Wootton Bassett Towns Barry Giles had the honour of skipping the Hellenic League Division One Representative Side in a fixture at Abingdon United against The Chiltonian League. The Rep game finished 0-0 and was played in atrocious weather with Purtons Mark Collier winning a bottle of champagne for his man of the match performance. Four days later Giles returned to the Wootton Bassett side for the trip to Kidlington. Wootton Bassett went down to a solitary goal but Dave Warren noted in his programme notes that this was the sides best performance of the season to date and could easily have been won 3-1 if Bassett had taken their chances. The Wiltshire Gazette and Herald carried the following report on the match:

Season 1997-98 Its Like That

What was going on in the world

Just prior to the start of the season Britain hands Hong Kong back to China. The season opens with Will Smith at number one with the theme tune from his on film Men In Black. The song spends the first four weeks of the season in the top spot. The season is only in its early stages when the country is hit with the tragic news of the death of Princess Diana in a car crash in Paris. Scotland votes to create its own Parliament after 290 years of union with England. The season ends with Boyzone at the top of the charts with All That I Need. The top selling album during the season is Be Here Now by Oasis. The season concludes with the introduction of Viagra, the first pill to treat impotence and the Good Friday Agreement establishes a devolved Northern Irish assembly. In the world of football it is very much Arsenal's season as they win the Premier League title and FA Cup in Arsene Wengers first season at the helm. Having pipped Man Utd to the title they then defeat Newcastle 2-0 in the FA Cup final. Chelsea win the League Cup and also defeat Stuttgart in the final of the European Cup Winners Cup. Swindon Town finish 18th in Division One, the second tier of English football.

Dave Warren was about to start his first full season as First Team Manager of Wootton Bassett Town Football Club. There was also a new Chairman with Paul Harrison commencing his reign at the helm. Little did he know at the time that he would still be there over a decade later. The new Hellenic League season kicked off with a home fixture against Headington Amateurs. Two goals from Neil Timbrell and one from Kenny Regan gave Wootton Bassett a winning start to the season, 3-1 the final score. Another home game quickly followed as Kidlington were the visitors to Rylands Way; unfortunately the winning start could not be extended with Wootton Bassett going down by the odd goal in five, Timbrell again on the score sheet with Kevin Bray getting the other Bassett consolation goal. Neil Timbrell maintained his excellent scoring start to the season in the away fixture with Cirencester Academy but once again Wootton Bassett were on the wrong end of a game which saw five goals shared between the two sides, Jeremy Newton bagging the other Wootton Bassett goal. After two narrow defeats it was important for the Wootton Bassett side to get back amongst the points and a useful point was secured in the away fixture at Clanfield, Paul Harrison and Martin Cooper scoring in the 2-2 draw. The busy opening month of the season ended with an excellent win at home to Ross Town with four different scorers on target for Bassett in the 4-1 win, Peter Dearlove, Jeremy Newton, Kevin Bray and Justin Hyde the Bassett marksmen.

The first Saturday in September saw Wootton Bassett Town without a game and there was to be disappointment when they did return to action as the side went down 3-1 at home to Easington Sports, Paul Harper with the solitary Bassett goal. It was an identical score line the following week as Wootton Bassett returned from Cheltenham Saracens disappointed, Lee Stoddart with the consolation goal on this occasion. September was certainly a disappointing month with just two games and both being lost.

After a bad month Wootton Bassett Town were keen to get back to winning ways but October opened with a tough home fixture against high flying Ardley United. A creditable 1-1 draw thanks to a goal from Dominic Franklin brought the run of defeats to an end. The following week the team made the long journey to Hereford to play Pegasus Juniors and the journey back must have seemed even longer as the side went down 3-1, Dominic Franklin again on the score sheet. The month was, however, to end on a high with back to back victories against Watlington and Bishops Cleeve. At Watlington goals from Martin Cooper (2) and Jeremy Newton secured all three points. In the home game against Bishops Cleeve the star of the show was Peter Dearlove who fired a hat-trick with Martin Cooper and Dominic Franklin adding one a piece.

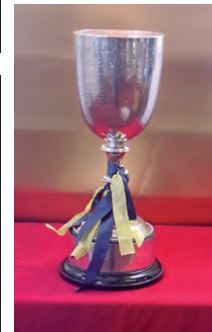

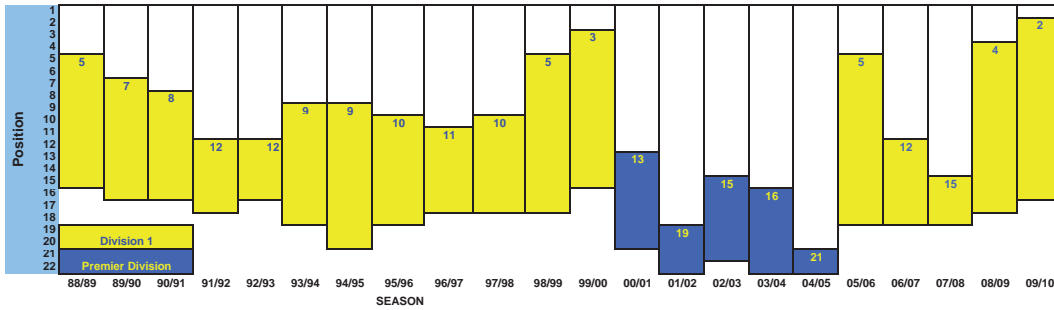

Senior teams: Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBTFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground grading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival.

Well rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1st team, reserves, and under 18s. Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Bassett, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide.

Chris Jones – Head of Senior Football

Youth teams: Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators, managers, assistants and players....yes even the first team!). Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and playing pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBTFC just short of £19,000 in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees, insurance, playing / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some £35,000 per season! Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined **membership/ training fee** in the form of a standing order payment. To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for **12 months** (not just the playing season!) The current charge is **£18 per month** (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is **vital** that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process in updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne. The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions please do not hesitate to contact either Gill or myself.

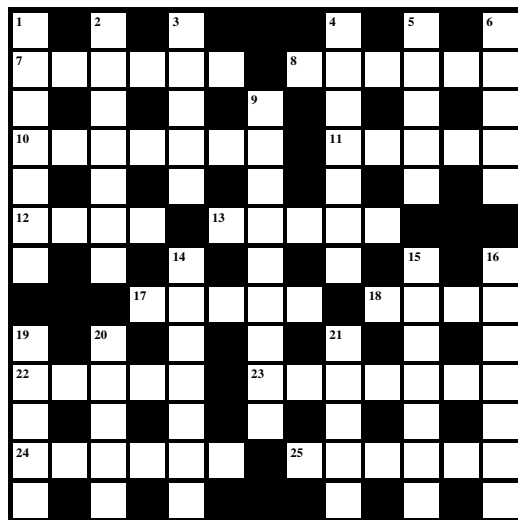

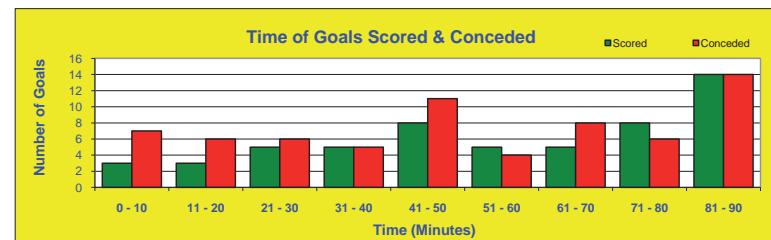
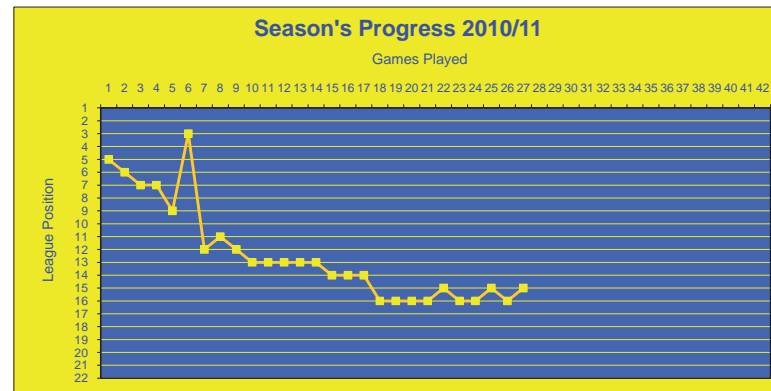
