# EDITORIAL

Good afternoon and welcome back to Rylands Way for this **Uhsport Hellenic League Premier Division** fixture against **Bracknell Town**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Bracknell** who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home.

**Bracknell** like ourselves find themselves at the wrong end of the table and this fixture is one of those proverbial *six-pointers*, especially given how **Carterton** have picked up of late. Whilst **Fairford**, **Pegasus Juniors** and **Shrivenham** now looked doomed to relegation, that fourth spot sees some seven teams up to 13<sup>th</sup> placed **Abingdon Town** fighting to avoid the drop. Our defeat at **Carterton** was disappointing, a slow start seeing us two down and despite a debut goal from Tom Dingle we were unable to get that elusive second to force a share of the points. We did pick up a point, however, on Tuesday night away at **Wokingham & Emmbrook**. Give that three days earlier **Wokingham & Emmbrook** had hammered **Highworth Town** 6-1 on their own patch the 0-0 draw was an excellent result. In a fine all round team performance, we probably edged the game and went closest to scoring when **Craig Bowden** hit the bar in the closing stages and **Sam Collier** fired a terrific shot just wide of the post. There is a report from **Scoop** on this game in today's programme. The defence were excellent all night on Tuesday including goalkeeper **Damien Teague**. I understand this is scheduled to be Damiens last game today but on behalf of the Club I would like to thank Damien for helping us out in our hour of need when regular keeper Stewart Thompson was injured.

Well penalties were needed to eventually make it through to the last eight of the **Bluefin Insurance Cup**. For the second time this season our lads were clinical from 12 yards and progressed to the quarter final stage of the league cup competition where we will meet **Flackwell Heath**. The Flackwell Heath game is now scheduled for **Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> March**, the third game of four in the space of a week. It will be tough for the lads to progress in such circumstances, including a long midweek journey to Wycombe, but with no free dates left our fixture backlog left the league little alternative.

Looking at what is in tonight's programme, Manager Dave Turner looks back at recent games in his **From The Dugout** column. The **From the Archives** feature this week goes back to **1967-68** and a mid-table finish in the Wiltshire Premier League and a disappointing showing in the Subsidiary Cup which was run to augment the fixtures. There is the usual updated league table of the Clubs own **Fantasy Football League** which still sees Bryan Wood still leading the way although the lead is now down to just 17 points. The **Youth Section** page includes a round-up from young **Luke Walduck** from games played on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> of March. As well as Scoops report from Tuesday nights game at Wokingham & Emmbrook there is also his report from the last time **Bracknell Town** came to Rylands Way. Back in Season 2007-8 Bracknell Town were in the Southern League and came to Rylands Way in the FA Cup. Two goals from Steve Yeardley secured a narrow 2-1 win against our higher league opponents. A repeat of that result would do nicely here today.

The next First Team game at Rylands Way is next Tuesday when league leaders Ardley United visit Rylands Way.

Enjoy the game and cheer the lads onto three more vital points.

# WORLD OF FOOTBALL

this week Mark Smedley on a former QPR hero

It is not often that footballing heroes of mine come to Rylands Way. There has been the odd sighting of Michael Meaker at Rylands Way over the years, despite 41 appearances for the Superhoops but he was hardly a hero (except when he represents the Rs in the Masters 5-a side on Sky when he is usually our best player). Kevin Brock on the other hand is a different matter. Despite him playing in the Oxford United side that humiliated my side at Wembley in the 1986 League Cup Final he was always very much appreciated in his time at Loftus Road. Kevin followed manager Jim Smith on his journey from Oxford to QPR in August 1987 in a transfer costing £260,000. Brock was a good solid all round player who scored on his debut for the Club against West Ham United on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1987. He went on to play 52 games scoring 3 times before following Jim Smith to Newcastle for a fee of £300,000. Brock was part of a QPR side that featured David Seaman, Paul Parker, Alan McDonald, Gary Bannister and Terry Fenwick. Brock was also part of the England Under 21 side that won the European Championship in 1984 defeating Spain in the final. The team that played in the two leg final also included Mark Hateley, Gary Bailey, Steve Hodge, Paul Bracewell, Mark Chamberlain, Gary Stevens, Mel Sterland, Danny Thomas, Danny Wallace and Gary Stevens. On Tuesday night Kevin Brock comes to Rylands Way with his high flying Ardley United side. Unfortunately he is getting on a bit now so you will not be able to witness him playing but take it from me he was a very good player in his day.

# OPPONENTS HISTORY

## Bracknell Town FC • Club History

Bracknell Town FC was formed in 1896 as Old Bracknell Wanderers and played local league football until 1959 when, on Bracknell becoming a New Towns, the club was elected into the Great Western League, where it spent four seasons. In 63/64, they were elected into the Surrey Senior League, winning the Championship in 69/70. In addition, the Robins won the League Cup in 68/69 and 69/70.

Bracknell moved into the London Spartan League a season later and in 74/75 won the League Cup. 75/76 saw the Club finish runners-up in both League and Cup to Farnborough Town and reach the last sixteen of the FA Vase.

Continuing their success in the 1980's, the Robins were victorious in the League Cup in 81/82 and 82/83, also winning the Premier Division in 82/83. The Robins were elected into the Isthmian League in 1984 and finished 8th in their first season, and as runners-up to Southwick the following year. Once promoted to Division One, Bracknell missed promotion to the Premier Division by a single point.

Season 92/93 was disappointing, with manager Paul Everest lasting eight games before resigning. Ex-Norwich City player Phil Alexander was appointed as manager and he turned the club around. Bracknell finished the 93/94 season as Division Three champions under his number two Nicky Collier. Collier took over the manager's role following Alexander's departure to Swindon Town. The following season almost saw Bracknell clinch a return to Division One, but they were pipped to promotion by Oxford City. Three seasons of mid-table security followed along with a run to the FA Cup 4th Qualifying Round.

Clive Tallentire and his brother Mark, an ex-player, were given the chance to lead the Robins forward in 99/00 season and Bracknell started the 00/01 season in unstoppable fashion, hitting the head of Division Three, eventually finishing 8th. However they did reach the FA Cup First Round Proper for the first time ever. The Tallentire's stepped down at the end of that season and former Farnborough Town manager Alan Taylor took up the challenge, achieving promotion from Division Three at the first attempt. The popular manager's second season at the helm was less successful, relegation was avoided on the final day but the Robins reward was an extremely eventful 03/04 season. Bracknell reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, the quarter final of the League Cup and a first Berks & Bucks Senior Cup Final for 22 years.

After 20 years in the Isthmian League, Bracknell moved to the Southern League and a new era saw Jon Underwood take over in 07/08. Six months in and one win later, Underwood left and youth team manager Andy Keen was installed as caretaker. Keen took the under performing Robins on a run of just one defeat in his five games before Byron Walton was appointed in February and eventually led Bracknell to safety.

2008/09 saw the Robins reprieved from relegation with a number of clubs going into administration, and Walton was replaced at the end of the season by Kerthney Carty, the former Maidenhead United reserve team manager.

Within two games of the new season however, 'KC' resigned from the club, replaced by former Tottenham Hotspur centre-back David Tuttle. Tuttle's reign though was a disaster, and the Robins were duly relegated with just 6 points on the board.

2010/11 see's the Robins looking to rebuild in the Hellenic Premier with new managers Steve McClurg and Richard Whitty and a young side. Both are very familiar with the club having been players in the 70's and 80's.

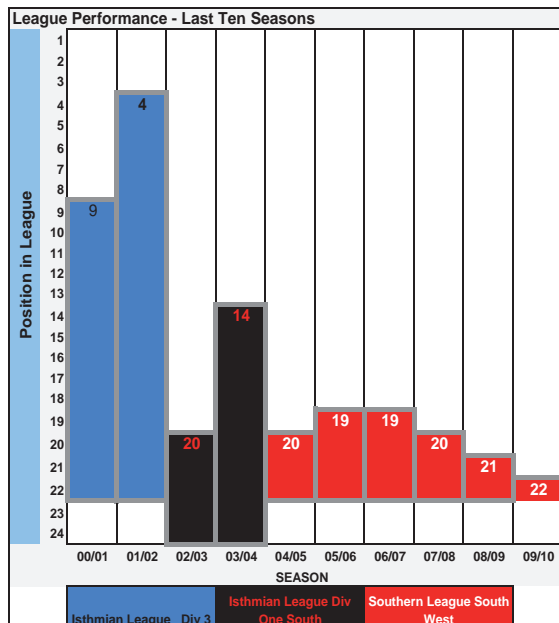
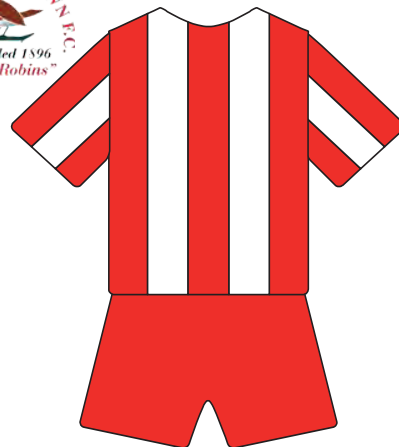

on as one of the highlights of the season by those involved. With the game played in difficult windy conditions, a Brian Ewen penalty gave Wootton Bassett Town a share of the points. This result was followed by a 4-2 defeat at top Swindon side Sanford, Cliff Thomas and Granville Taylor with the Bassett goals. The same two sides met again at the same ground in the Subsidiary Cup four days later and Sanford won this won 4-0. There was some relief at the end of the month as Bassett secured their first league win since November, defeating Black Sports 2-1 at Rylands Way, Fred Cremmin and Dave Challis with the goals.

April was to prove a very successful month for Wootton Bassett Town which saw them double their number of victories for the season; in fact all four wins occurred in the space of nine days starting on the 16<sup>th</sup> April with a 1-0 away win at Black Sports. Four days later Bassett hit five without reply at home to Devizes Town, both Alf Moseley and Brian Ewen bagged a brace and Bob Pearce scoring the other. Ewens two included a spectacular strike from twenty yards. Alf Moseley scored another two three days later at Rylands Way in a 2-0 win over Calne Town. Two days later goals from Brian Ewen and Ted Oxborrow secured the points away at Spencer Moulton, 2-1 the final score. The only blemish on another wise perfect month came in the final two fixtures. In the first Bemerton scored the only goal of the game at Rylands with Wootton Bassett Town contributing to their own downfall by missing a penalty and the Football Pink noted that they had most of the play during the game. In a busy month of fixtures this was followed by a 4-1 home defeat to Melksham, Gardiner with the Bassett consolation goal.

The good run of form continued into May and even included the first and what was to be the only away win in the Subsidiary Cup, this a 3-2 win at Black Sports, Thomas, Gardiner and an own goal doing the damage for Bassett. This was followed by an excellent win in the league at Rylands Way against bottom club Warminster Town, Frank Hanks scoring two on his debut in a 4-0 win, Brian Ewen and Tommy Gardiner with the other two goals. Four days later Wootton Bassett Town lost a midweek league fixture at Devizes, going down 2-0. The final away fixture in the Subsidiary Cup involved a trip to Bromham where Bassett went down 4-2 meaning five out of six away fixtures had been lost in this competition designed to augment the league fixtures. Despite the poor record in the competition both home and away Wootton Bassett were not bottom of the table, this fate belonged to Black Sports, but Wootton Bassett were some eleven points adrift of the fourth placed team. The 1967-68 Season was destined to finish on a winning note as Wootton Bassett Town defeated Westbury 4-1 at Rylands Way on the 25<sup>th</sup> May, a very late finish to the season primarily due to the additional twelve games played in the Subsidiary Cup competition. In the league Wootton Bassett Town finished just below half way, help by the excellent form in the last two months of the season which gave hope for a more successful season in 1968-69. ## Bassett Fry Yet Another Big Fish

Rylands Way, 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2007

Not content with one upset victory in the FA Cup – a victory against a local rival no less – Wootton Bassett Town produced another to advance to the First Qualifying Round of the world's greatest cup competition. Bracknell Town were the victims this time as the Southern League Division One South & West side went down 2-1.

Bassett were never in awe of their opposition – a team plying their trade two divisions higher – and took the game to them early on, resulting in a 15<sup>th</sup> minute lead. Paul Patel looped a shot over from range on five minutes before Richie Saunders saw a back post header palmed away by Michael Parkin after a pin-point Nathan Perkins corner seven minutes later. With quarter of an hour gone Steve Yeardley went one better, firing in from ten yards after a low, in-swinging Matty Bennett corner was allowed to run across the face of goal to the far post. Bassett were thankful to the frame of the goal in the 21<sup>st</sup> minute as a powerful Billy Matthews header crashed back off the bar after he connected with a Jermaine Lowe corner at the right post. The visitors continued surging forward in search of the equaliser and came close through Neil John, who found the side netting with a low 15-yard drive after Graham Lewis had beat Chris Mills down the left and cut the ball back. Another let off came with half an hour gone: Graham Lewis helped the ball on and John found himself goalside of Yeardley with only Sean Purcell to beat. He went for the lob from 20-yards which ended up inches wide of the left post. A minute later John Magani was gifted a great chance after a woeful backpass from Ian Brookes. However Magani hit a 12-yard effort straight at Parkin despite being one-on-one. The chances continued to flow before the break – John sent a free header at the front post wide from a Lowe corner before Lee Morse forced a fine save from Parkin with a curling 20-yard free kick that was acrobatically tipped over despite it looking as though the ball was headed for the top left corner.

Bracknell – winless in their first four league games – came out firing at the start of the second half as Bassett defender their lead somewhat nervously. The visitors nearly caught the hosts out in the 56<sup>th</sup> minute, outnumbering Bassett three to two, but Jordan Kiffin sent Lewis' through ball straight at Purcell. Two minutes later Chris Mills was caught in possession by Gavin Taylor deep inside the Bassett half and Kiffin fed the ball to Lewis, who fired into the bottom right corner from 12 yards with relative ease to tie things up.

The equaliser didn't incite the dropping of heads from Bassett as they continued to find ways in which to frustrate Bracknell. Thirteen minutes from time Bennett controlled a cross-field ball perfectly before rolling Ross Watson and he set free down the right. From a tight angle he unleashed a powerful effort across goal that had Parkin beat. However it agonisingly flew just past the left post. The game was won eight minutes later with the award of a dubious penalty for an unintentional Watson handball, that appeared to hit the defender's shoulder. Bracknell were livid with the decision, which resulted in Taylor and Joel Havermans going into their book for their protests.

Yeardley couldn't care one bit about whether the decision was a correct one though and dispatched the spot kick coolly into the bottom right corner. Parkin guessed correctly but was beat by the perfectly placed penalty. The next ten minutes were as nerve-wracking as any ever at Rylands Way with Bracknell having two great chances to get back on level terms. Firstly a neat clip over the top of the defence from Damien Smith put John in behind the defence down the right flank. However, instead of advancing further with the ball he went for a long range lob that fell comfortably into Purcell's hands. Then with the final chance of the game Watson curled in a free kick from the left that Smith rose and met with a glancing header at the front post. All it needed was a touch as it sailed across goal but thankfully for Bassett the ball left the field of play without one. Moments earlier Magani had another one-on-one opening go begging with the chance of putting a seal on the game. Good combination play from Neil Dix and Bennett set up the opportunity but Parkin smothered at the forward's feet.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Steve Yeardley – as always the Bassett captain was composed and clinical with his defending, and he showed his great finishing skills too with a real poacher's finish for the first before converting - as ever - from the penalty spot.

Scoop Rating: 10/10 – another fantastic FA Cup display. Bassett were not frightened at the prospect of going up against a team from two divisions higher and really took the game to Bracknell. The defending was solid, the midfield energetic and outstanding both going forward and coming back whilst the front two of Magani and Dennis King (who was replaced by Neil Dix midway through the second half) frustrating for the Robins' defence. A truly complete performance.

# FROM THE ARCHIVES - 1967-68

*in distress any respite and sailed in with a fourth goal through Colin Taylor to gain a thoroughly deserved first league win of the season.*

It was back down to earth with a bump again the following week as Wootton Bassett went down 3-0 at home to Trowbridge Town Reserves. The league and Subsidiary Cup fixtures continued to be scheduled across the whole season and the next fixture was a Subsidiary Cup fixture at home to Black Sports where two goals from Colin Taylor ensured the points were shared. This turned out to be just one of two games that Black Sports avoided defeat in during the competition.

The following week saw the second won in the league secured as Wootton Bassett Town returned from Calne with both points courtesy of goals from Colin Taylor and Tony Wall in a 2-0 win. The winning feeling was to last but a week as Wootton Bassett suffered what was to be their heaviest defeat of the season the following week, a 7-0 thrashing at the hands of Stonehouse in the Subsidiary Cup. The first week of December brought the traditional County Senior Cup fixture with a home tie against lower league Pewsey. A shock was on the cards as Bassett trailed 2-0 but goals from Tommy Gardiner and Colin Taylor ensured a replay. The replay was scheduled for the following week but was postponed due to the snow and eventually took place on the 16<sup>th</sup> of December with Bassett winning 2-1, all three goals coming in the second half. The win earned Wootton Bassett a home tie with Spencer Moulton. The Saturday before Christmas saw another Subsidiary Cup fixture at home to Chippenham Town Reserves, the visitors taking both points in a 2-1 win. The calendar year ended with a 3-1 away defeat at Westbury in a game which saw keeper Alan Collier kept very busy, Brian Ewen scoring the Bassett consolation goal from the penalty spot.

The New Year kicked off with the Wiltshire Senior Cup Second Round tie with Spencer Moulton. Recent signing from Cricklade, Alf Moseley, played a starring role in a 3-2 Wootton Bassett win. He scored the opening Bassett goal and it was then from one of his crosses that the opponents scored a second in their own net. The visitors scored two in the right end but a splendid header from Colin Taylor fifteen minutes from time sealed it for Bassett and gave the Rylands Way side a third round tie away at Devizes. The following week the snow returned with a vengeance resulting in all games being postponed. The snow melted in time for the following weeks fixtures and Wootton Bassett suffered a disappointing 3-1 defeat at Calne in the Subsidiary Cup, disappointing not just because of the result but also because Wootton Bassett could only field ten men. A similar score line the following week in the league when Bassett went down at Chippenham Town Reserves.

February commenced with the Wiltshire Senior Cup tie against Devizes Town and was to prove a disappointing month starting with an exit from the prestigious County competition. Another penalty from Brian Ewen was all Wootton Bassett could offer in reply to four goals from Devizes. The two league matches in the month were both drawn with Bromham (2-2) and Bemerton (1-1). Colin Taylor and Tommy Gardiner scored against Bromham, with Colin Taylor also scoring in the Bemerton fixture which Wootton Bassett started with just ten men. It is remarkable that they were able to secure a point against one of the leading sides as winger Alf Moseley was also sent off reducing Bassett to nine men. The other game in the month saw a 1-0 defeat against Chippenham Town in the Subsidiary Cup.

Whilst the league form was improving Wootton Bassett Town seemed to save their worst performances for the Subsidiary Cup and suffered a second thrashing at the hands of Stonehouse, although they concede one less goal this time, going down 6-0. At half time few would have predicted such a score as neither side had found the net but twenty minutes of madness at the start of the second half saw Bassett concede four goals. The one ray of sunshine on the day was the news that Dave Challis had re-joined the club from Sanford, perhaps two if you count the fact that this was the last home fixture of a poor Subsidiary Cup campaign when just one of the six home fixtures in the competition was won.

After conceding some seventeen goals in the three previous fixtures in the season against Stonehouse the point gained in the home league fixture against the eventual champions was no doubt looked back

## Season 1967-68 Whiter Shade of Pale

### What was going on in the world

The season kicks off with Scott McKenzie at the top of the charts with San Francisco (Be Sure To Wear Some Flowers In Your Hair) and ends with Yong Girl by Union Gap featuring Gary Puckett as the top selling single. Manchester City win Division One after a final days drama which sees them defeat Newcastle 4-3 away from home whilst rivals United lose 2-1 at home to Stoke. Manchester United recover from this disappointment to lift the European Cup by defeating Benfica 4-1 in the final after extra time. WBA win the FA Cup defeating Everton narrowly 1-0 in the final, again extra time being required to settle this final. Leeds win the Inter-Cities Fairs Cup and Alan Mullery becomes the first England player to be sent off. BBC Radio 1, Radio 2, Radio 3 and Radio 4 are launched. Walt Disney's Jungle Book film is released. Enoch Powell makes his controversial Rivers of Blood speech. The Beatles create Apple Records.

Season 1967-68 saw just fourteen teams in the Premier Division and the league decided to augment the fixtures for all the sides by running a Subsidiary Cup competition, where the fourteen sides were divided into two divisions of seven sides. Wootton Bassett Town found themselves in the North Zone. The teams that were missing from the previous season were the Somerset sides Frome Town Res, Paulton Rovers, Radstock Town and Peasedown MW. The fixtures for the Subsidiary Cup competition were spread over the whole season.

The season commenced for Wootton Bassett Town with an away trip to Stonehouse, a team who had finished 5<sup>th</sup> the previous season and were expected to be there or thereabouts come the season end. A 4-1 defeat saw Bassett get off to a bad start, Tommy Gardiner with the consolation goal. Midweek saw the Subsidiary Cup fixtures commence and another defeat for Wootton Bassett, Bromham leaving Rylands Way after a comfortable 3-0 win. The first point of the season came three days later at Rylands Way when Wootton Bassett Town and Chippenham Town Reserves shared the points following a 1-1 draw, Tommy Gardiner again the Bassett scorer. Another midweek Subsidiary Cup fixture at the end of August saw another heavy defeat at Sanford, 5-1 the score with Colin Taylor scoring the goal. After just two fixtures Wootton Bassett's chances in the Subsidiary Cup had almost evaporated already.

September kicked off with another game against Bromham, this time in the league at Bromham. Same result but this time Wootton Bassett shipped six goals, scoring just two in reply through Dave Challis and Tommy Gardiner. Spencer Moulton were the next opponents at Rylands Way and another disappointing 3-0 defeat saw Wootton Bassett Town struggling in both competitions and without a win. The poor run continued the following week when all Bassett had to show from the visit to Melksham was a Pat Short goal, the home side scoring five to take both points. September ended with another defeat at the hands of Sanford, this time in the league, Sanford winning 3-1 at Rylands.

The first win of the season came in the Subsidiary Cup with a 6-1 home success over Calne Town on the 14<sup>th</sup> of October. The first league win was not achieved until 28<sup>th</sup> October 1967 when Wootton Bassett visited fellow strugglers Warminster Town. Two goals from Colin Taylor, one for Tommy Gardiner and an own goal did the damage for Bassett in a 4-1 win. The Football Pink the following week carried the following report on the game:

*Warminster have turned to David Pyle, the ex-Bristol Rovers and City player to guide their players, and with visitors Wootton Bassett, a club waiting their first league win, like themselves they hoped for a win. Wootton Bassett, however, won 4-1 to open up a three points gap between themselves and Warminster. Colin Taylor put Wootton Bassett on the winning trail with the only goal of a fairly even first half, but when Alan Maidment equalised soon after the interval Warminster spirits rose. Johnny Gosden, of all men, put through his own goal, however to restore Wootton Bassett's lead and straightaway a snap-shot from Tommy Gardiner clinched it. Wootton Bassett well on top by this time did not allow their companions*

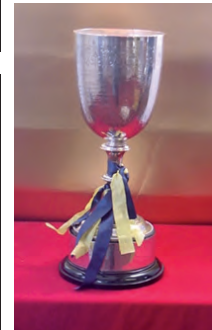

## Sumas Squeezed by Bassetts Discipline and Grit

Courtesy of one of their best performances of the season so far, Wootton Bassett Town earned a hugely welcome point as they held in-form Wokingham and Emmbrook, who thumped Highworth Town 6-1 on Saturday despite playing away from home, to a scoreless draw. Had it not been for the crossbar denying Craig Bowden with minutes remaining, they would have left Berkshire with all three points, which they would have been good value for.

It is these kind of results and performances on the road that Dave Turners side have struggled to achieve so far this season, which is arguably all that separates them from the Satsumas, who were also promoted last season. Although the determination and desire to get a result has always been there, more often than not a lapse in concentration and break down in discipline has cost them dear. Not on this night though. The hosts chances were limited thanks to a consummate all round performance. In spite of going up against a five man midfield for most of the match, Bassetts midfield four hustled and harried Wokinghams playmakers throughout the course of the game, breaking up their attempts to get the ball on the deck and play pretty football. Up front, Sam Collier, Tom Dingle and wingers Ethan Delaney and Matt Bown, were thorns in the home sides defence, who did not have such an easy day as they did against the Worthians. Most of all though, Bassetts back four were supreme. Neither Liam Edmundson nor Shaun Carter at centre half fell for the trap set by Wokingham, who played just one forward throughout, while full backs Richie Carter and Mark McMeeking were commanding in the air and confident going forward. They did survive one scare early on though when one of Larges Lanes notorious bobbles deceived keeper Dominic Teague, allowing Luke Lee a shot at an open goal. However, a despairing dive from Shaun Carter did just enough to deflect the ball wide for a corner. Both teams matched each other blow for blow as a midfield battle developed. And when rare opportunities appeared for either side, they were merely half chances. Midway through the period Dean Thomas rolled his marker brilliantly before firing on the turn from the edge of the area, but Teague comfortably held Ten minutes before half time, Bassetts best opening of the half came as Delaney, who was in imperious form, cut in from the left and wriggled his way past two defenders. The ball sat up perfectly for him 25 yards out, and his firmly struck effort went narrowly wide of the left hand post. Shortly after a beautiful touch from Dingle following a Matt Boucher cross-field ball presented the recent signing with an opening, but his shot from a tight angle in the right hand side of the box was parried away to safety by Stuart Harris.

Seconds after the restart, a Boucher free kick from the deep was not dealt with by the home defence, who allowed it to bounce across the face of goal, the ball narrowly avoiding nestling in the bottom right corner. As legs and minds tired, the match opened up. Yet at a time when usually at their most vulnerable, Bassett held the fort valiantly, surrendering just the one clear cut chance in the middle section of the second period. That fell in the 71<sup>st</sup> minute to the tricky Sam Whiting, who weaved his way the visitors midfield, before seeing an initial effort blocked. Edmundson could only produce a half clearance, the ball falling once more to Whiting, but after surging into the box, he could not find the requisite power to fire past the assured Teague. The introduction of Bowden for fellow youngster Delaney could have been perceived as a negative response from Turner as the clock wound down, but the substitute almost won the visitors the match with three minutes to go. Pushing for a victory, Wokingham had sent a further man up front, opting for a three man defence. And the gaps this left in the channels were taken advantage of. Bowden set Collier free down the left, further stretching the Sumas, and he met the forwards inch-perfect cross with a firm header from ten yards out that had Harris beaten. However, the balls trajectory was slightly too high, and struck the crossbar. The rebound fell invitingly for fellow sub Adam Topping, but a heavy first touch from the Wiltshire under-18 player allowed the hosts defence to recover, and his snap shot was deflected just wide. Injury time saw Sam Duffelen fire across goal and wide for the hosts, while Collier sent a shot on the turn narrowly over as neither side were capable of breaking the stalemate.

**Scoop** Man of the Match: Shaun Carter, in fine form at centre back, saving Bassett from falling behind early with a goalline clearance, while helping nullify a side who had racked up nine goals in their previous two games with disciplined defending.

**Scoop Rating:** 8/10, it may appear to be a high mark for a game which was drawn rather than won, but this was an outstanding, complete performance against a side whose form has been extremely good this season. From front to back, there was not one player who did not impress. Heres hoping this continues



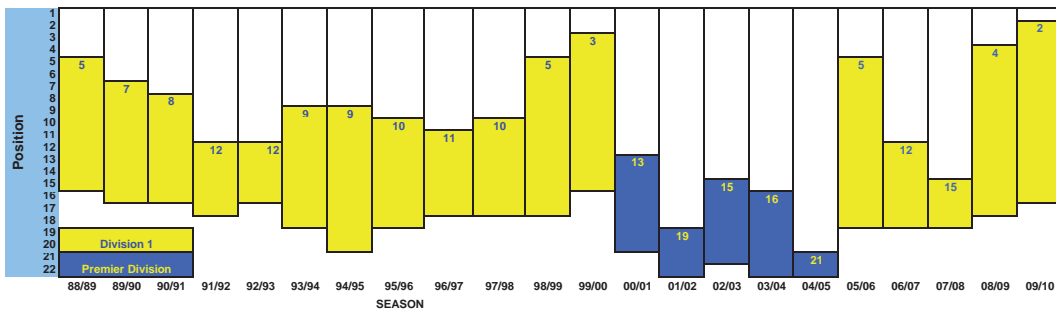

**Senior teams:** Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBTFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground grading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival.

We'll rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1<sup>st</sup> team, reserves, and under18s, Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Basset, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide.

**Youth teams:** Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/ finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators, managers, assistants and players...yes even the first team!).

Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and playing pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBTFC just short of **£19,000** in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees, insurance, playing / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some **£35,000** per season! Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined **membership/ training fee** in the form of a standing order payment. To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for **12 months** (not just the playing season!) The current charge is **£18 per month** (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is **vital** that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process in updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne. The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions please do not hesitate to contact either Gill or myself.
