EDITORIAL

Good evening and welcome back to Rylands Way for this **Uhsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture** against **Ardley United**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Ardley** who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home. A particularly warm welcome to former **QPR player Kevin Brock**.

Well what a good weekend it was for our sides in other sections of the Club. On Sunday the **Ladies side** won 1-0 in their final fixture of the season to claim **runners-up spot** behind Gloucester City Ladies in the Gloucestershire County Womens League. The **Under 18 Floodlit side** made it through to the final of the **FA County Youth Cup**, only the second time in the Clubs history that we have made the final of this prestigious competition. Hopefully Danny Grooms side can go one better than the 2004-05 side and lift the trophy for the first time in the Clubs history. Based on previous years the final should be at the County Ground. Congratulations also to Paul Burke and Mal Chivers **Under 11 side** who guaranteed **at least runners-up spot** with a win in their penultimate game of the season. They now have to hope that Pewsey Vale drop points in their two of their final three fixtures whilst Bassett win their own final game if they are to finish as champions.

Last week saw two tough fixtures involving sides from **Bracknell**. On Tuesday night I witnessed a very good team performance away at **Wokingham & Emmbrook**. The game finished 0-0 but was an entertaining game with Wootton Bassett having the better of the chances. We went closest to scoring in the dying seconds when Craig Bowden hit the bar with a header and Adam Topping was just denied from the rebound. The defence were excellent all night and this bodes well for the rest of the season. On Saturday **Bracknell** visited Rylands Way for the first time since our FA Cup meeting a few seasons ago. A **James Turner** goal gave us a half time lead but the visitors equalised on 76 minutes to ensure a share of the points. With **Carterton** securing another excellent point against Shortwood the battle at the bottom to avoid that fourth relegation spot remains as tight as ever.

Tonight will be a very tough encounter against an Ardley United side who look like champions elect as they now lead the table by some nine points, although Binfield have a couple of games in hand. With two matches to play still against Binfield we could still have a say in the destination of the title, particularly if the team can play like they did at Wokingham & Emmbrook.

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Ardley United FC • Club History

Ardley United formed in 1945 just as the Second World War was ending. From humble beginnings playing mainly in the Lord Jersey Football League, the club has progressed through the Oxfordshire Senior League to Step 5 of the football pyramid in The Hellenic Football League.

Under the generous patronage of the Chairman, Norman Stacey, Ardley have flourished since gaining Hellenic League status. Proudly providing one of the finest playing surfaces at this level, plus excellent off pitch facilities for both players and supporters. Added to that the club has earned a reputation for being one of the most hospitable clubs to visit.



In the last 25 years Ardley have won the Oxfordshire Senior League Division One title on three occasions as well as the Junior Shield, also on three occasions. Apart from a barren period between 1973 and 1983 the club has won trophies almost every season throughout its history.

The club were in the "old" Division One of The Hellenic League for six years, winning the league in consecutive seasons 1996/7 and 1997/8.

The club were in the "old" Division One of The Hellenic League for six years, winning the league in consecutive seasons 1996/7 and 1997/8. Also winners of the Division One Cup for four consecutive seasons between 1994/5 and 1997/8, a record of achievement never previously attained and unlikely to be surpassed with the introduction of the combined Premier and Division One Challenge Cup competition. 1997/8 also saw the Ardley Reserve side as Champions of their league, and promotion to Division One of the Reserves section. League restructuring, and facility, requirements towards the end of the 1990's saw Ardley in the new "First Division".

The club worked hard to improve the facilities, which was rewarded with promotion to the Hellenic Premier League in season 2003/4. The following year the club was rewarded for its achievements being awarded the Hungerford Cup for the greatest improvement in facilities and playing. Further accolade came in the same season on being awarded the Non League Paper's "National Game Award" for the most improved facilities.

Season 2006/7 proved to be one of the best in the club's history finishing third in the Premier Division and also winning the Supplementary Cup. Season 2007/8 provided mixed fortunes, the League position was not as great as recent previous seasons, but further success in Cup competition was rewarded with finalist places in both the Floodlit Cup and Supplementary Cup. The Supplementary Cup Final was the last game in charge for manager Dan Still who had guided the team to three seasons of success.

Though the club secured the services of one of the most successful non-league managers in the area, Kevin Brock. The ex Newcastle United professional is using his experience to bring the club further accolade. Top seven finishes in the past two seasons along with the Challenge Cup last season.

Joined Ardley in Feb 2011 following spells with Old Woodstock and Abingdon Town. A skilful winger with pace and the ability to score goals as he has already shown.



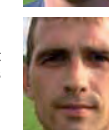
Adam Beckett Midfield

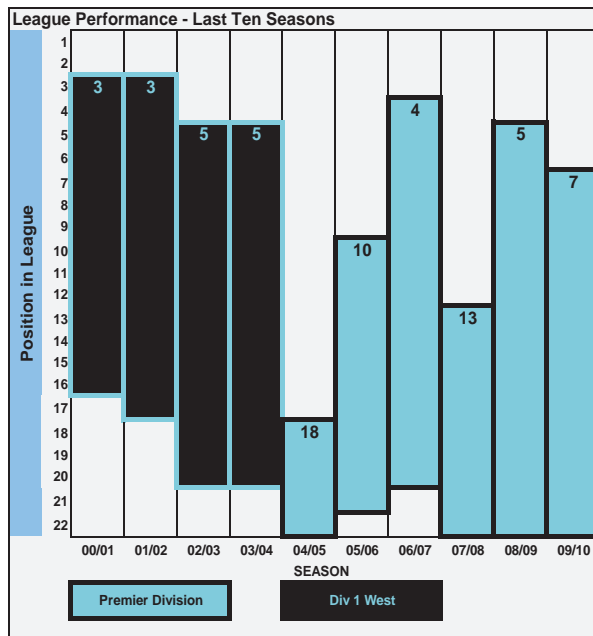
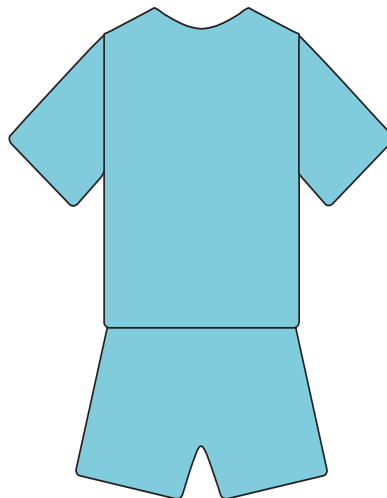
Troy Bryan Forward

manager Terry Plank showed his worth by scoring the winner with just seconds remaining. A fortnight later all hopes of a cup final appearance were extinguished in another classic against Ferndale in a Ghia Senior Cup replay. Goals from Andy Bowden and Ken Regan were cancelled out by the hosts, who forced penalties before triumphing 4-3 in the shootout. Two surprise league defeats then followed, the first coming at Wills, who prevailed by a solitary goal, before a crazy loss by the odd goal in five at Allied Dunbar. In the latter fixture Ken Regan had put his side ahead, before Bassett shot themselves in the foot completely, scoring two own goals and conceding once more. The hosts reciprocated their visitors generosity by putting through their own net themselves, but an equaliser could not then be found. A cruel 2-1 loss at Amesbury, the hosts scored the winner in injury time, then meant Bassett fell to seventh place.

A solitary Walker goal against Chippenham Town stopped the rot, before he struck a brace in a 3-1 win at Rylands Way against Corsham. But Bassett then found themselves falling back into sixth spot after another Walker goal was not enough to beat hosts Pinehurst, who held their visitors to a 1-1 draw. With the season winding down, the team could have done without a trip to leaders Old Manor, who at the time were six points clear at the top of the table. But as the Monday March 15th edition of the Evening Advertiser described, Bassett did not go home empty handed:

Wootton Bassett wiped out Old Manors opening goal by Jon Rushton with a reply from Peter Ward before half time, but things looked bleak when Mark Tutton restored Old Manors lead in the 86th minute. However, Bassett were awarded a penalty in injury time and Andy Bowden equalised.

The big guns kept coming. Against second place Bemerton a week later things did not go quite as well as they beat Bassett for the third time that season 2-0. However, third place Ferndale saw their title hopes extinguished at the end of March as Steve Ackrill scored the only goal of the game to earn the visitors both points. Bassett's own hopes of the crown had by now gone, but they were still able to finish in the top three. However carrying their indifferent form into April did them no favours as they began the final month of the campaign with a 2-0 reverse at the hands of Sanford.

A solitary Peter Ward goal was then enough to see off Pinehurst at Rylands Way to kick start an end of season run that would be a sign of what was to come a season later. Away to Park, goals from Walker and Roger Frost were enough to seal a 2-1 win that dented their hosts hopes of finishing in the top two. Second half strikes from Ackrill and Walker sealed a 2-0 triumph against Pewsey that lifted Bassett from seventh to fourth. In the penultimate game of the year Corsham were thumped 4-0, Harrison netting a brace and Frost and Dixon grabbing the others, before a single goal from Frost was enough for both points against Ferndale.

That five game stretch meant that Woolfords team, who had cemented a fourth place finish, the clubs best performance since the Wiltshire County League replaced the Wiltshire

Ardley nearly took the lead in the 25th minute, a long kick from keeper Tassell fell to Neil Barrett whose shot was parried away by Lee Flynn, this after Barrett had got past defender Rich Willis.

Tom Docherty was booked for Ardley in the 28th minute as he held back Magani who was clean through on goal. Then a minute from half time, Tony Bott had a half volley from twenty-five yards easily saved by Flynn.

Six minutes after the restart Moses Green found Matt Bennett with a great through ball but Bennetts shot was blocked before the rebound from Tyler was blocked and cleared away as Bassett continued to have trouble in front of goal.

Tyler nearly scored an own goal just before the hour mark as he mis-kicked a clearance from an Ardley corner, which just went wide of the post.

A Matt Bennett shot from the edge of the area went well wide in the 60th minute before Ashley Bradshaw made his first team debut in relief of Andy Youngsam who had a quiet outing.

Another youngster was brought on half way through the second half as Chris Mills, who impressed in midweek replaced Ben Gascoyne who continued his inconsistent run of form.

In the 70th minute, Rich Willis rose and headed a Bradshaw corner just over. Four minutes later, Martin Hall had a shot from the edge of the area easily saved by Flynn.

Twelve minutes from time Bassett made their final sub as Paul Patel came on for John Magani.

Immediately, Patel was involved in the action as Willis sent a long ball over the top that Patel ran on to, he took the ball into the box but his shot was easily saved.

Ardley snatched only their second win of the year five minutes from the end as a long ball over the top caused confusion at the back and substitute Paul Bough put the ball in from six yards as Lee Flynn failed to come out to get the ball.

Flynn held a shot from Chris Please in the 89th minute and Bassett's lack of urgency in the final minutes cost them again as they went through the motions all game.

Still, there would be no time for a losing streak to emerge, with Bassett coming from behind to defeat struggling Wills 2-1 thanks to a Harrison brace. Chippenham Town Reserves then became the first team to prevent the team from scoring, forcing a stalemate at Rylands Way on November 1st. However, the goals would once again flow seven days later, and in vast quantity, when the trip to Allied Dunbar was made. The Monday November 10th edition of the Evening Advertiser carried the following report of Bassetts demolition job that led to them drawing level on points at the summit of the table:

Shock result of Saturdays Wiltshire County League Division One game was the 1-0 defeat of leaders Park at Pewsey. It let Wootton Bassett draw level with them on points. Park will retain top spot, only on goal difference. Wootton Bassett led Allied Dunbar with a goal by Don McLeod only for Rob Salter to equalise. But visitors Bassett went on to score another eight goals through McLeod (2), Ken Regan (2), Nathan Walker (2) and Paul Harrison (2) to win 9-1.

Frustratingly though postponements and cup engagements meant that Bassetts share of top spot came and went quickly. Yet, hopes of success in both league and county cup contests remained alive. In the Ghia Senior Cup, Bassett twice surrendered two goal leads against Ferndale, and the two sides eventually settled for a 3-3 draw despite extra time being played, forcing a replay. Don McLeod struck twice for the hosts with Walker grabbing the other. A more conclusive result was reached a week later when Woolfords outfit travelled to Hellenic League Supermarine in the Wiltshire Senior Cup a week later. An additional thirty minutes of play was once again required, but this time the visitors were able to settle the match during this period to knock out the cup holders. The following report of the match appeared in the Monday December 8th edition of the Evening Advertiser under the headline: *Cup Holder Come Cropper at First Fence:*

Wiltshire Senior Cup holder Supermarine are out at the first hurdle after their 2-1 defeat by Wootton Bassett. In this first round clash Pete Horwat missed a good chance for Marine after two previous attempts had been cleared off the line. Early in the second half Horwat gave the home side the lead and later Mark Ayres brought off a brilliant point-blank save from the same player. A Wayne Taylor shot narrowly missed for Marine before Nathan Walker levelled the score after 75 minutes and Martyn Spackman prevented Bassett taking the lead by turning a good effort over the bar. At the end of 90 minutes the score stood at 1-1, but in the first period of extra time Kenny Regan scored a well taken winner.

In no mood to show any festive spirit, two comprehensive league victories followed to see out 1986. Firstly, Plessey Sports were sent packing by three goals to nil at Rylands Way thanks to goals from McLeod, Walker and Gerry McKay to lift Bassett into fourth. Lowly Wroughton were then thumped 5-0 thanks to braces from Regan and Steve Thomas and a further Walker strike.

January though was a different story. It began with a narrow 2-1 defeat at Bemerton in the County Cup. A Thomas goal had put the visitors on level terms, but Bemerton player-

What was going on in the world

Ahead of the season Diego Maradona helps wins the World Cup for Argentina in a tournament which includes the infamous hand of god incident in the game with England. The season starts with Chris de Burgh at the top of the pop charts with his *Lady in Red* and ends with *Starship* at the top with *Nothings Gonna Stop Us Now*. Conservative Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher wins a third term as major national industries including British Gas and British Airways are privatised. A cross channel ferry sinks off the coast at Zbrugge. In the world of football the Football League block the proposed merger between Queens Park Rangers and Fulham whilst Coventry win the FA Cup defeating Tottenham 3-2 in the final. Everton win the Division One title ahead of neighbours Liverpool but are prevented from entering Europe due to the ban on English clubs. Swindon Town finish third in Division Three and are promoted to Division Two.

Having finally assimilated to life in Division One of the Wiltshire County League, establishing themselves in the upper echelons of the division became the priority for Wootton Bassett Town going into the 1986-87 season. However with Purton and Calne Town both moving up the non-league pyramid, the former taking their place in the Hellenic League and the latter gaining promotion to the Western League, a shot at the title was not by any means out of the question. And Mick Woolfords side set out their stall from the off, losing just one of their opening six games.

The campaign began in late August with a 2-2 draw at Rylands Way against Amesbury. Paul Harrison was on hand to rescue a point that afternoon, scoring the equaliser with just five minutes left after Nathan Walker had earlier opened his account for the season. Three wins in ten days then followed to see in September in style. Firstly Wroughton were shown no mercy as Bassett romped to a 4-1 victory before strikes from Walker and Kevin Flavell earned a win by the odd goal in three in a midweek fixture away against Plessey Sports. Walkers prolific form continued when Sanford came to visit as he once more found the back of the net alongside Harrison in a comfortable 2-0 win. Bemerton would provide the only blot on the teams early season copybook when the previous seasons runners-up prevailed 3-1, Gary Dixon scoring the consolation for the visitors. However, Bassett bounced back immediately, courtesy once again of Walker, who bagged the only goal of the game away at Pewsey Vale.

October began with the distraction of the Ghia Senior Cup and a trip to second division Oldacre. But Woolfords side ensured they went into the next weekends clash with league pacesetters Old Manor on top form as they ran out comfortable 6-1 winners, Dixon scoring four of them. He was on target again in Bassetts return to league action, alongside Peter Ward; and with a clean sheet being kept, a four-way tie at the top of the table, Park and Amesbury being the other two sides, was created. This situation did not last long though. A week later Park came into Rylands Way and won by the odd goal in three, with Walkers late goal for the hosts proving scant consolation.

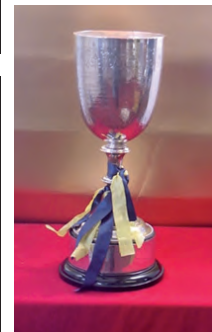

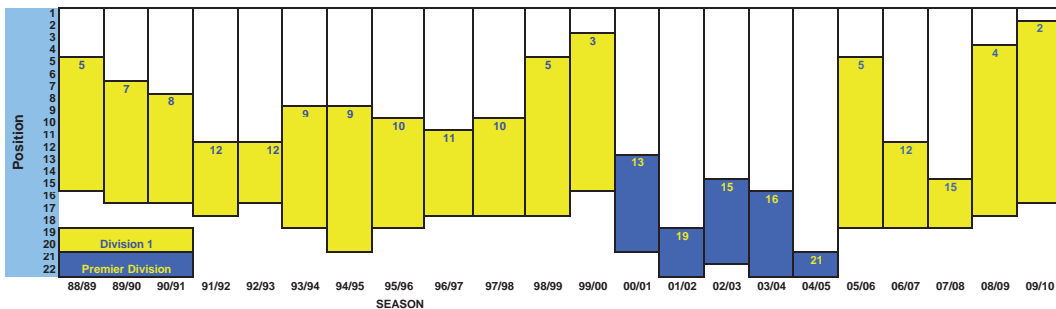

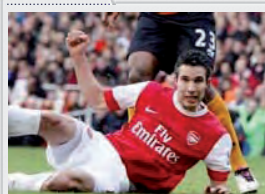

Senior teams: Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBTFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground grading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival.

We'll rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1st team, reserves, and under18s, Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Bassett, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide.

Chris Jones – Head of Senior Football

Youth teams: Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/ finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators, managers, assistants and players...yes even the first team!).

Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and playing pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBTFC just short of **£19,000** in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees, insurance, playing / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some **£35,000** per season! Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined **membership/ training fee** in the form of a standing order payment. To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for **12 months** (not just the playing season!) The current charge is **£18 per month** (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is **vital** that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process in updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne. The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions please do not hesitate to contact either Gill or myself.
