# EDITORIAL

Good evening and welcome back to Rylands Way for this UHlsport Hellenic Premier League fixture against **Binfield**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Binfield** who have made the long journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home back along the M4.

**Binfield** are one of the sides fighting for the league title but surprisingly went down 2-0 at home to **Highworth Town** on Saturday. Whilst I say surprisingly, perhaps it was not a surprise given that **Binfield** had played a tough game against fellow title chasers **Ardley United** on Thursday night. **Binfield** defeated **Ardley** 2-1 but then undid some of the good work with that defeat to **Highworth**. With fixtures now coming thick and fast the form book is likely to go out of the window at times and throw up a few surprises before the end of the season. Hopefully tonight will be one of those occasions. I know our Head of Youth Section was at **Binfield** on Saturday and he reported that they had looked a tired side against **Highworth**. Having got back into the game with a great **Tom Dingle** header it was disappointing to concede so quickly afterwards given we were at last starting to get on top. That said it was a stunning strike and good enough to win any game and gave stand-in keeper **Luke Sharps** no chance. On Saturday the defence played well, and **Matty Bown** and **Ethan Delaney** were good going forward but we never really got to grips with the game in the centre of midfield. Only with the introduction of **Richie Carter** did we really start to compete.

Looking at what is in tonight's programme, the **From the Archives** feature this week goes back to **1996-97** and a frustrating season in the Hellenic League Division One under **Kevin Maloney**. # OPPONENTS HISTORY

## Binfield FC • Club History

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.



During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972, Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house we see today.

This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In the following season we reached the final of the Berks and Bucks Intermediate Cup for the first time but unfortunately lost in extra time.

In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt, and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign. A Cup Final appearance in the Reading Senior Cup also ended in disappointment as we lost by the odd goal in three to Peppard. In 1995 we reached the final of the Reading Senior Cup only to lose to Mortimer on penalties and in 96 we won the Chiltonian League again.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with more than 20 teams playing every weekend. The junior part of the club is now very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved we are constantly striving to improve player coaching and club facilities. In 2003 we added an Allied Counties Youth team which is now providing a steady stream of talented young players for the 1st Team. Our Reserves, using many youth players, were promoted to Division 1 in 2004, winning two Cup Finals as well.

In January 2005, Bracknell Forest Borough Council gave the club permission to install floodlights at Hill Farm Lane, and thus signaled the next stage of Binfield's development. The lights were installed early in 2008 and the first game under lights was a local derby match against Wokingham & Emmbrook. As is often the case it didn't go quite to plan and we lost that match 0-1.

Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds including one of the great games in our history. An evening replay against Fareham Town saw us fight back from 1-2 to win 3-2 with almost the last kick of the match.

We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football. Plans are now in place to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to pitch to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team and Veterans. August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup.

**James Partridge** Defence

Our top striker last year, Ian only played a third of the season but was still the league's 4th top scorer. Great control with a precision shot.

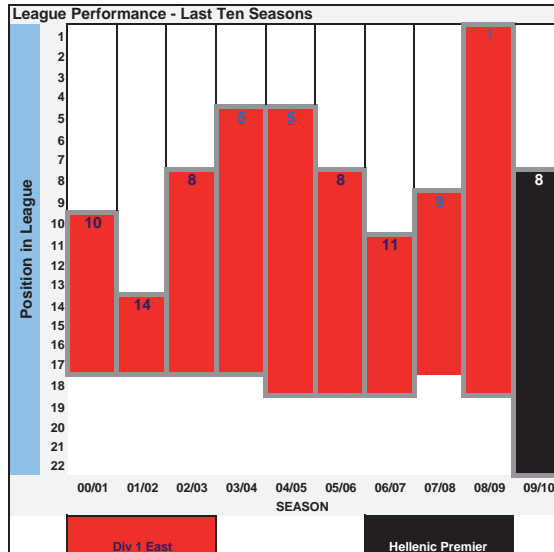
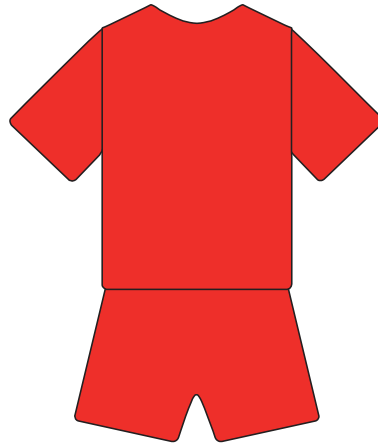


**Scott Williams** Forward

and Peter Dearlove. A disappointing 3-0 reverse saw Bassett return with no reward and were no doubt pleased to see the back of Harrow Hill who had done the league double over Bassett as well as knocking them out the league cup. March ended with another long away trip, this time to Hereford to play Pegasus Juniors. Bassett went down 3-1 to continue a poor run of league form, Simon Green with the Bassett consolation goal.

April was to be a very busy month as Wootton Bassett played catch-up with their league fixtures with nine games being squeezed into the month. The month opened with another defeat, Kidlington winning 3-0 on their own patch. After four league games without a win in the league the poor run was finally ended with a narrow 2-1 away win at Ross Town, Gary Ashford and Peter Dearlove with the important goals. Two 1-1 draws at home followed against Bishops Cleeve and local rivals Purton, Dominic Franklin netting against Cleeve and Peter Dearlove scoring in the local derby game. With the games coming thick and fast it was not surprising that during this spell Wootton Bassett put in a poor performance and crashed to their biggest defeat of the season, a 5-0 reverse at home at the hands of Kidlington. Goalkeeper Steve Hale again conceded five in the next fixture away two days later at Hallen but at least Wootton Bassett did manage a goal this time, Scott Vincent scoring in the 5-1 defeat. Just another two day break before the next fixture but Wootton Bassett were able to end the bad spell with a 2-0 away win at Clanfield, Scott Vincent and an own goal giving Bassett all three points. The season ended with three consecutive defeats at home, three games in which Wootton Bassett failed to score. A 4-0 home defeat to Milton was followed by a 3-0 loss at Purton and the season ended with a 1-0 defeat at home to champions Ardley United. These three defeats ensured Wootton Bassett did not improve on the previous seasons tenth spot, slipping one place in the table to eleventh. Goals had been the problem with just 37 scored in the league, with just three sides registering a lower tally. The joint top scorers were Ian Curtis and Gary Ashford, both netting just six times in the league and twice in cup competitions to head the goal scoring charts with the relatively low total of eight goals. Despite the lack of goals and a lower league position there was to be some consolation for the Club though as they won the Hellenic League Division One sportsmanship award. Kevin Maloney stepped down as manager after two seasons to be replaced by Dave Warren.

Next up was the Third Round of the League Cup and a visit to Clanfield where Bassett gained revenge for the league defeat in September with another excellent four goal performance, Harrison, Curtis and Ashford again on the score sheet along with Peter Dearlove in the 4-1 win. The victory gave Wootton Bassett Town a semi-final place for the fifth consecutive season. The cup win was to be the last time Bassett tasted victory in November as just one point was secured in the three league games that followed. A 1-0 defeat away at Cirencester United was followed a 2-1 home defeat to Cheltenham Saracens, Peter Dearlove with the consolation goal. The run of defeats was ended when Wootton Bassett shared the points in a 1-1 home draw with Pegasus Juniors, Ian Curtis netting for Bassett. The game saw Steve Hale play his first game of the season in goal for Bassett.

If November was a disappointing one in the League for Bassett, December 1996 saw the side remain undefeated in the month. A comprehensive 3-0 win over Easington Sports was most welcome, the win coming courtesy of goals from Gary Ashford, Ian Curtis and Jeremy Newton. The calendar year ended with two drawn games. Ian Curtis scored in the 1-1 draw against Hallen at Rylands Way and neither side found the net when Wootton Bassett visited Milton United. Little did those at Wootton Bassett know that it would be 15<sup>th</sup> February, nearly two months, before another league game would be played.

The New Year always brings with it the County Cup and 1997 was no different. Wootton Bassett had been given a bye in the First Round and the Second Round opponents were GPS Plessey. Due to bad weather the game was postponed until 18<sup>th</sup> January and when the game was finally played, goals from Gary Ashford, Justin Hyde and Dominic Franklin ensured a 3-1 win and a passage into the next round where the opponents would be another Wilts League side, Marlborough. Again due to bad weather this was in fact the next game with Marlborough visiting Rylands Way. In a tight game neither side could find the net meaning a replay the following week at Marlborough. A week later Wootton Bassett found themselves on the end of a shock County Cup exit as they lost 2-0 to their Wiltshire League opponents.

When Wootton Bassett Town returned to league action they put the disappointing cup exit behind them. Two goals from a returning Scott Vincent and one from Gary Ashford helped Wootton Bassett to a 3-1 away win at high flying Cheltenham Saracens. This was followed up with three more points at home the following week against Headington Amateurs as Wootton Bassett matched their best win of the season, scoring four goals through Gary Ashford (2), Newnham and an own goal.

It was at the beginning of November that Wootton Bassett Town had qualified for the League Cup semi-final and the tie, which was to be played over two legs, was eventually scheduled for the first two weeks of March. Of the fourteen man squad who had defeated Clanfield, only Paul Harrison, Barry Giles, Gary Ashford, Dominic Franklin and Peter Dearlove played in the First Leg at Harrow Hill which saw a disappointing 2-0 defeat. For the return leg at Rylands Way, Simon Green, Justin Hyde and Paul Parsons all returned and a much improved performance saw Wootton Bassett get back level on aggregate terms with Harrow Hill, leading 3-1 at the end of ninety minutes courtesy of goals from Barry Giles, Scott Vincent

## Bassett Suffer a Piercing Blow

It is well and truly squeaky bum time for Wootton Bassett Town after their 2-1 defeat at the hands of Reading Town, coupled with victories for fellow strugglers Bracknell Town and Carterton, narrowed the breathing space Dave Turners team have as their Hellenic League Premier Division campaign enters its final stages.

A stunning strike from Jamie Pierce with twenty minutes to go decided the game in the hosts favour after Bassett had rode their luck throughout the first period before equalising through Tom Dingle. Reading were in the end well worth the three points, but it was another missed opportunity for Bassett, still with five games left against teams battling it out for honours at the other end of the table, to get themselves out of danger. After troubling league leaders Ardley United in midweek, Bassett reverted to their midseason form that saw them slip into trouble with a frustratingly below par display. Although Ethan Delaney and Sam Collier threatened early, both seeing shots narrowly miss the target, Reading were dominant in the first half. Spearheading their charge was centre forward Marcus Richardson, whose ability to hold the ball up, made livewire pair Danny Seaward and Ashley Watkins, both intelligent with their runs, even more dangerous. In the 25<sup>th</sup> minute, the journeyman former pro, sent Seaward down the left flank, his cross being met by Jordan Cousineau, who headed across goal and narrowly wide. Despite their attacking quality, Bassett appeared more than willing to create problems for themselves with wastefulness in the midfield, which saw possession conceded all too easily. And it would be this failing, which played a crucial role in the hosts opener with twelve minutes to go before half time. Quick to counter, the ball was played into Richardson just inside the visitors half of the field. An unmarked Watkins was then played in down the left flank and he centred for Cousineau, making a late darting run, to direct the ball into the bottom right corner past a helpless Luke Sharps. The visitors seemed not to have learned their lesson after conceding a goal from such a simple, yet effective move. Two minutes later, Watkins blazed narrowly over after Seaward had beaten the offside trap and crossed from the right. Then, on the stroke of half time, Watkins breezed past right back Craig Bowden before delivering a dangerous low cross, which Richardson struck over with a first time effort.

To their credit, Bassett came out after the break a changed side. Tightened up at the back and less carefree when in control of the ball, they actually began to threaten and were rewarded for their enterprise on 67 minutes. A quick corner from Delaney to Matt Bown stung the unprepared hosts, and the latters weighted delivery was met by Dingle, who rose highest and looped a header into the back of the net with the help of the left-hand post. It was to be a fleeting lifeline though. Moments after an innocuous Richardson flick on had Sharps scrambling to bundle the ball away from danger after having hit the near post, the hosts retook the lead. After a weighted free kick taken from the halfway line, the burly Richardson set the ball perfectly for Jamie Piercey, who lashed an unstoppable volley into the bottom left corner from the right hand edge of the box. It was a hammer blow from which Bassett could not recover, try as they did for the final twenty minutes. Defeat means they slip a further place to 17<sup>th</sup>, just five points ahead of fourth bottom Witney United. Time to dig deep.

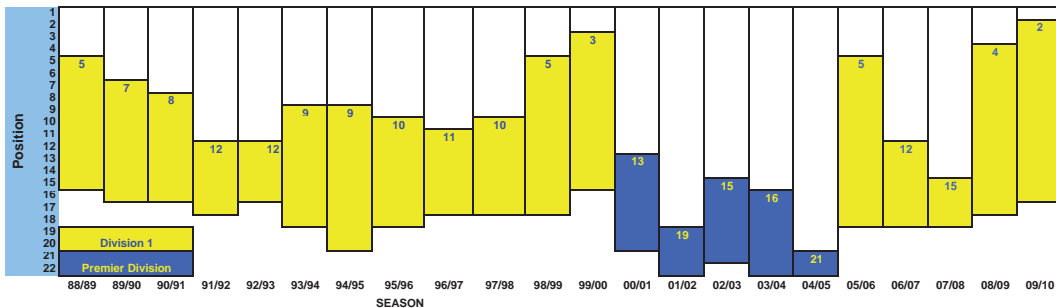

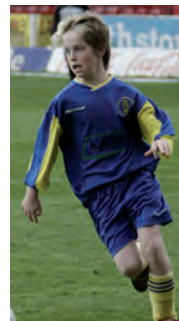
