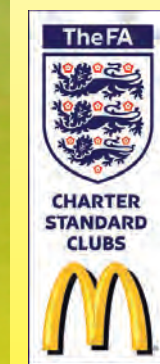

EDITORIAL

Good afternoon and welcome back to Rylands Way for this UHlsport Hellenic Premier League fixture against Slimbridge. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from Slimbridge who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home back to Gloucestershire.

Slimbridge, like last Tuesdays opponents Binfield, are one of the sides fighting for the league title. It will be a tough game again today and our record against Slimbridge is not good, in fact it took the game at the end of last season to avoid defeat for the first time in what was our tenth attempt. Looking at what else is in tonights programme, the **From the Archives** feature this week goes way back to **1937-38** and a poor season in the Wiltshire League. The final game of that season sees the heaviest known defeat in a league fixture traced to date. There is the usual updated league table of the Clubs own **Fantasy Football League** which sees Bryan Wood still top but his lead has now been eroded away to just three points. The **Youth Section** page includes a round-up from young Luke Walduck from games played on Sunday 27th March. **Scoop** provides a match report from the narrow defeat at **Reading Town**. WORLD OF FOOTBALL

this week, Stuart Smedley on the subject of crowds

The Swindon Supermarine fans forum has made interesting reading in the past couple of weeks. After their excellent success in the FA Cup earlier this season, it would have been expected that their run to the competitions second round would have led to a surge in attendances at Hunts Copse (or Webbs Wood Stadium as it is now called) given the publicity that the club gained.

Offering them hope that this would be the case was the fact their first round home tie against Eastwood Town attracted nearly 1200 fans. Meanwhile, fellow Southern League side Paulton Rovers saw their average league attendance jump to 238 following their run to the first round last season, where they were thumped at home by Norwich City; a season before their average gate was 164. (This season it has dipped, but is still so far at 200).

For Supermarine though it has not happened. In fact the reverse has been the case. This year, they are averaging 154 fans a game in the league, third lowest in the Zamaretto Premier behind Evesham United and Cirencester Town. Even worse, this is down from last season when they attracted 181 fans per league match.

It begs the question why? Three factors can be considered as explanations: the clubs size, their history and location.

Having been a one team club for the majority of their existence (Marine have since added a successful Ladies side and a few youth teams), generating bonds with the club will undoubtedly have been difficult because few players will have grown up having played for them. Yet even clubs with numerous sides at youth level, such as Ciren, struggle to pull people through the gate for their first team matches. Despite our clubs size too it is disappointing that few youth section players or parents are seen in the stands at Rylands Way games, but compared to the Hellenic average, our crowds are reasonable.

Success on the field has no doubt been helpful for Chippenham Town locally. On average, more than 400 fans attend Hardenhuish Park for the Bluebirds matches, many of whom would have been attracted to the club after their FA Vase success at the turn of the Millennium. Within the Hellenic League, Trowbridge Towns glorious past arguably helps keep them atop the Division One West attendance charts despite their current struggles on the pitch. Now though their crowd numbers are beginning to decline. Supermarines dwindling support post their glorious run is therefore an anomaly.

Consequently, it seems that the most important issue affecting them is their isolation. With their ground not within walking distance of any built up areas, the need to hop in a car to get out to South Marston can be seen as deterring people from attending. The same can be said for Ciren, whose Corinium Stadium is on the outskirts of the town. In comparison Chippenham, Highworth, Purton (and Bassett to a slightly lesser extent) are easy to get to for townfolk and all enjoy relatively healthy crowds for their level.

Theres a lesson in this for Bassett too with the potential relocation. Given the site being situated on the edge of town, we are going to have to get creative in order to maintain, and hopefully increase, our attendance levels. If we can continue to improve on the pitch, that will draw in a few more. But to realise the clubs full potential when the move occurs, scheduling some youth team fixtures on Saturdays to get players and parents staying behind for first team action; staging the odd first team fixture on a Friday night (as Witney United have done and achieved some massive crowds) to avoid clashes with our local rivals and Swindon Town; and developing a greater club ethos are necessary.

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Slimbridge AFC • Club History

The Gloucestershire village of Slimbridge is world renowned for its Bird Sanctuary, but in recent years much hard work has gone into making Slimbridge better known in football circles. The Club's history dates from 1902 playing in local football at various venues in and around the village. It was not until 1951 that the current ground at Wisloe Road was acquired, after a former player, Evi Thornhill, bequeathed it to the Club in his Will. For the next forty-odd years the Club were predominantly members of the Stroud and District League and the Gloucester Northern Senior League.



By 1988, a point of collapse approached, but fortunately, a handful of committee members led by Gordon King and Gordon Tudor kept the Club afloat. The following season local businessman Paul Chappell arrived. The Club was stabilised and construction of new changing facilities, to County League standard, were completed.

As playing standards improved, the building of a long awaited Social Club commenced in the 1998/99 season. The following year saw the introduction of John Mack, a successful local entrepreneur, as Chairman. In the summer of 2001, Doug Gray was appointed Manager. After achieving the Runners-up spot in their first season in the Gloucester County League, the club were accepted into the Hellenic League. Hellenic Division One West was won by an eleven point margin in 2002/03 and with it, promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division, where a creditable fourth place finish was achieved in 2003/04. In a marvelous season the club also claimed the Hellenic Floodlit Cup and the G.F.A. Challenge Trophy.

The summer of 2003 saw the floodlights installed. The attendance record was set at a Bank Holiday Hellenic Premier Division fixture that was part of the 2003/04 annual Ground Hop weekend. Local rivals Shortwood United provided the opposition in front of a crowd of 525.

Season 2004/05 again saw a fourth place finish in the Hellenic Premier Division, along with a first entry into the F.A. Vase competition which resulted in a useful run to the Third Round Proper.

Season 2005/06 under newly appointed Manager Doug Foxwell, brought the first entry into the F.A. Cup a 1-0 defeat did not dampen the sense of occasion. Also a second successful run in the F.A. Vase ending in the Third Round Proper, with a 3-1 defeat at Welwyn Garden City. After a record-breaking 64 game season, the team managed a fifth place finish in the Hellenic Premier Division. The club also won the Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy, both for the second time in three seasons.

Season 2006/07 proved the most successful in the Slimbridge history to date, with both the First Team and Reserve side recording League and Cup doubles, with the added bonus of record-breaking F.A. Cup and Vase runs for the senior side as well. In the F.A. Cup, a five match run from the Extra-Preliminary Round finished at Merthyr Tydfil in the Third Qualifying Round. In the F.A. Vase before defeat was tasted, the run ending in the Fifth Round Proper at home to the eventual winners, Truro City.

In the Hellenic Premier Division, a solid start was established. Due to the Cup runs, and then bad weather, which led to a record number of postponements during the subsequently extended season, half a seasons fixtures had to be played in the final two months. A tremendous effort saw the Club bring the Championship Shield to Wisloe Road, the winning margin being three points over second placed North Leigh. There was a rousing performance in the G.F.A. Trophy Final recording a third success in four seasons in that competition.

Alongside the playing success, progress in the improvement of facilities allowed the First Team to be accepted into the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, the highest level that the Club have ever operated at.

On July 10th 2007 the club decided not to take up the opportunity of playing in the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, instead the club reverted back to the Gloucester Northern Senior League. This meant a big upheaval in the club both on and off the field with the manager Doug Foxwell and several senior players moving on the pastures new, however a loyal band of players stayed on including James Cole taking over as player manager with assistance from long term club captain Leon Sterling.

following week when Wootton Bassett went down 2-1 at home to Melksham Town, also losing inside-left C. Weaving due to injury early in the second half. The consolation goal for Wootton Bassett was scored by W. Webb on his debut having previously played for Swindon Victoria, the paper noting that he now resides in Wootton Bassett. At this stage Wootton Bassett remained second bottom of the table.

Another home defeat next when Devizes Town left Wootton Bassett with both points following a 3-1 win. The Football Pink reported that it would have been a much heavier defeat but for an outstanding performance by Charles Waite in the Wootton Bassett goal, the keeper giving his best display of the season. Unfortunately Waite missed the following weeks fixture at home to Wilts Mental Hospital as Bassett again went down 1-3, Embling and Weaving also missing the game. The match report noted that veteran full back Strudley had been playing for 22 years. Waite was back for the game on 19th March 1938 against champions elect Westbury United. Indeed he even managed to get on the score sheet firing in a penalty to help Bassett to a 1-1 half time score. However, two second half goals from Mizzen gave Westbury the points. The following week saw Wootton Bassett play their last home game of the season which they won 3-2 against Warminster Town courtesy of goals from Dunford, Beazley and Embling. Indeed Bassett scored all three goals in the first ten minutes of the match but second half goals from Sheppard and S. Curtis meant a tense finish but two welcome points in a tough season.

Wootton Bassett finished the season with five away games. Goals from Brown 2, Beazley and Embling gave them the double over Warminster Town. This was followed by a 3-6 reverse at Westbury; this after leading 2-1 at the break through Pearce and Gleed, Perry scored the 3rd goal in the second half. Wootton Bassett then achieved a surprise win away at Wilts Mental Hospital, 2-1 the final score thanks to first half goals from J. Taylor and R.J. Beazley. The Club then hosted the Wiltshire Junior Cup Final between Swindon YMCA and Avebury which was won 4-2 by Avebury. Before returning to League action, Wootton Bassett then met Swindon Town A in the Wootton Bassett Challenge Cup Invitation Final. *Final* seems something of a misnomer as it appears that Wootton Bassett simply challenged one team each year with a cup awarded to the winner of the one game. In 1937-38 the game against Swindon Town was played at the County Ground and Wootton Bassett won the cup, although under the circumstances not something that you can really include in the Club's honours chart. In the penultimate game of the season Wootton Bassett lost 3-2 at Trowbridge Town, losing Beazley to a hand injury that required a hospital visit. Bud Flanagan, the former Swindon Town winger, scored a hat-trick for Trowbridge, Drury and Embling replied for Wootton Bassett.

The season ended on a real low with what is the heaviest defeat in the Clubs history and the Football Pink carried the headline *Wootton Bassett Tragic Experience at Melksham*. The report under the headline included the following:

In their last match of the season Wootton Bassett met with a crushing defeat at Melksham. They were defeated by 13 goals to 2. Owing to injuries and the opening of the cricket season, Wootton Bassett were weakly represented. The scorers were Riddick (8), Hood, Meadin, Longton, Wellman and Hughes for Melksham and Pearce and Gleed for Wootton Bassett.

Collier lob ensures Bassett break their Swans duck

Rylands Way, 10th April 2010

With a finish that was as cool as they come, Sam Collier made history for Wootton Bassett Town. More importantly, his winning goal moved his side one step closer to a return to the Hellenic Premier Division.

Ten minutes into the second half, with the scores knotted at one apiece against fellow title challengers Slimbridge, who had won all eight of the preceding encounters between the two clubs, the defender-turned-forward, with his weaker right foot, produced a perfectly weighted lob from the edge of the area that beat onrushing keeper Dave Evans. It wound up to be the decisive goal of the afternoon as Dave Turner's team triumphed by the odd goal in three to move back to the top of the table. And with Purton losing, the three points put Bassett's destiny further into their own hands. Their afternoon started perfectly. Four minutes in, the visitors failed to deal with a corner, allowing James Turner to recycle the ball. His teasing lofted pass was perfectly placed, allowing both Chris Oram and Collier to flick the ball on unchallenged before Jon Holloway stabbed home from 12 yards with a first time effort. It could, and perhaps should, have been two just minutes later. Holloway bravely kept an overhit Matty Bown free kick in play, but Craig Shand could only blast over from close range after the defender had headed the ball back across goal to him. Bassett's start had undoubtedly caught Slimbridge off guard. However the visitors reacted with intent, pinning their hosts into their own half for the majority of the remaining time in the first half. Yet, resolute defending, a staple of Turner's reign in the Rylands Way hotseat, limited them to a handful of half chances. The best the visiting side could muster prior to the break would come from a free kick on the stroke of half time, which Joe Tustain struck beautifully, but he could not beat Stewart Thompson, whose acrobatics ensured the ball found the roof rather than the back of the net.

The Bassett shotstopper, as good as they come in Division One West, though could do next to nothing to deny the forward shortly after the restart. The equaliser was something of a gift as Bassett failed to clear the lines, despite having numerous opportunities to do so. But it took a finish of the finest quality to put the sides back on level terms. From 30 yards, Tustain rifled a volley of the highest calibre into the top left corner that had Thompson rooted to the spot, unable to react. The strike made Arjen Robbens Champions League winner in the week look ordinary. By now Bassett were on the ropes, but another teasing ball from Turner would lead to their second, stunning the visitors. Full back Shane Anson should have done far better in dealing with the ball. But with Collier breathing down his neck, he could only slice his clearance straight to the forward. And in the rich vein of form he finds himself in, there would be no denying Bassett's leading marksman. Trailing once more, Slimbridge threw everything they had at Bassett in the dying stages. As in the first half though, they were met with spirited resistance. Thompson was in imperious form, brilliantly denying substitute Andy Varnham's snap shot with a fine parry low to his left, before saving low from a venomous Tustain free kick with seven minutes to go. The visitor's goalscorer, who seemed determined to cover every blade of Rylands Way grass in order to find his side an equaliser, proved himself a handful in the dying stages and deserved better when his right-wing cross was glanced agonizingly wide by Ross Langworthy. But his, and his teammate's efforts, would ultimately prove to be in vain. Those eight previous defeats to their Gloucestershire opponents? More than worth it for a victory of this magnitude.

Scoop's Man of the Match: Terry Adams, was everywhere for Bassett, stifling numerous Slimbridge attacks with his assured tackling, whilst also pulling the strings when his own side ventured forward.

Scoop Rating: 9/10, at times it was backs to the walls stuff, but Bassett acquitted themselves brilliantly. For all Slimbridge's possession and time spent in the host's half, the relatively few clear cut chances they created shows how well Dave Turner's side defended. The display put on by both sides was a fine advert for Hellenic League football. Hopefully both sides will be able to meet again at a level higher next year.

hat-trick and the prolific Embling. In the First Qualifying Round Wootton Bassett met another Wiltshire League side when they travelled to play the Wiltshire Mental Hospital in Devizes. The Hospital side defeated the Town by five goals to two, Embling and Beazley with the Wootton Bassett consolation goals.

Traditionally the first week of January sees the 3rd Round of the FA Cup played. The Football Pink for 1st January 1938 carried an advert for GWR for the forthcoming 3rd Round FA Cup tie at Grimsby, offered a *restaurant car excursion* to Grimsby for the princely sum of 14/6 return fare. The train would depart Wootton Bassett at 6.35am and Swindon at 6.50am, arriving at Grimsby (New Clee) at 12.50pm. The return journey would see fans back in Wootton Bassett at 12.15am on Sunday morning. Swindon drew the cup tie 1-1 forcing Grimsby into a replay at the County Ground, winning 2-1 at home. Swindon eventually lost 2-1 away at Luton in the 4th Round of the competition. On New Years Day Wootton Bassett played Purton at home losing the match 1-2, Weaving scoring the Wootton Bassett consolation goal. Given that Purton were one of the top teams in the County at the time the result itself was not unexpected but it was interesting to note that in the Football Pink the Purton reporter was required to put a few minds at rest ahead of their big FA Amateur Cup 1st Round Proper tie with Lowestoft as their star player H. Dixon had been injured in the game against Wootton Bassett. An extract from the report ran as follows:

During the week I have heard it stated that H. Dixons injury was the result of foul play. I should like to correct this erroneous impression, as I was standing quite near and had a clear view of the incident. It was easy to observe that it was a pure accident. Dixon himself held the same view. I understand he will be doubtful starter for the Lowestoft match next Saturday. If so it will be a big blow for Purton, as he has been a brilliant performer at outside right.

Purton lost the Lowestoft match 2-0 in front of a crowd of 1,500 that drew record gate receipts of £35. By a quirk of fate Wootton Bassett played Purton again immediately after the Lowestoft fixture and returned from Purton with a point following an excellent 2-2 draw. The headline ran *Gunter of Wootton Bassett distinguishes himself* and the report contained the following write-up:

Wootton Bassett Town who occupy a lowly position in the Wilts League table, did well last Saturday to gain a point at Purton. Purton were fully expected to win but Wootton Bassett gave them a good run and played better than their lowly position in the League would indicate. Purton had to make several changes and the Town were not at full strength so the division of the points was considered a fitting result. Each side scored two goals, the Bassett marksmen were S. Pratt and A. Embling. Wootton Bassett gave a trial to G. Gunter, a young goalkeeper, and he gave a good account of himself. He saved a penalty. C. Dunford who figured at centre forward also played a fine game. Dr Broadfoot returned to the Purton side and was easily their best forward.

The following week Wootton Bassett won 3-2 at home against Spencer Moulton from Bradford-on-Avon thanks to a last minute headed goal from Embling following a Perry corner. Embling had scored earlier after Bartlett scored the opening Bassett goal. Spencer Moulton scored two through Potter and Lidden. However, the good run came to an end the

Season 1937-38 A Foggy Day

What was going on in the world

Ladislao Biro invented the ballpoint pen which would revolutionise the job of the intrepid football reporter. Meanwhile in DuPonts research laboratories Roy J. Plunkett was busy developing Teflon. Freeze dried coffee (Nescafe) was produced for the first time and Adolf Hitler had his troops annexe Austria in March 1938 as Europe headed towards war. Preston North End made up for the previous seasons disappointment by defeating Huddersfield Town 1-0 after extra time in the FA Cup final. Arsenal won the English championship by a point from Wolves, with Preston third. Manchester United were promoted back to the top division and Swindon Town rose to the heady heights of 8th in Division Three South.

After the first season of consolidation back in Senior Football Wootton Bassett Town would have entered Season 1937-38 looking to climb the table and perhaps challenge near neighbours Purton and the likes of Melksham Town, Devizes Town and Westbury United, the powerhouses of Wiltshire football at that time. Unfortunately it was not to be and the club won the same number of games in the league as the previous season, registering just six wins all season. The first win in the league came at home against Calne & Harris United, a 3-0 win courtesy of goals from Fry, Brown and Embling. The Football Pink carried the following report on the victory:

Wootton Bassett won their first match of the season at home on Thursday when Calne & Harris were their opponents in a Wiltshire League fixture. They won by three goals to nil. For the first quarter of an hour Calne had the better of the game but the home defence was sound. Fry gave them the lead in twenty five minutes and just before the interval Brown scored from a penalty awarded for hands. Throughout the second half Wootton Bassett were on top and Embling put on a third goal.

After a tough start Wootton Bassett took steps to improve performances by signing the player C. Weaving, who had scored against them the previous season, from local rivals Purton. The Football Pink of 23rd October 1937 carried a report on his Wootton Bassett Town debut:

Wootton Bassett Town did themselves a good turn when, in a Wiltshire League match last Saturday they defeated Swindon Corinthians by three goals to two at Whitworth Road. With only ten minutes to go the Corries were leading by two goals to one and it looked as if they would hold it but the Town continued to peg away and were eventually rewarded when C. Weaving (recently transferred from Purton) scored his second goal of the match. Then in the closing minute, A. Embling scored the winner. C. Weaving who was at inside left played his first game for the Town. Though it took him some time to settle down he gave a masterly display during the second half and did his store in helping to secure victory. Another player who did well was Fred Drury, the captain and left full back.

Wootton Bassett again entered the national FA Amateur Cup meeting fellow Wiltshire League side Calne & Harris United in the Preliminary Round at Wootton Bassett. At the end of ninety minutes the score was level at two goals apiece but Wootton Bassett Town edged it in extra time, winning the tie 4-2. The scorers for Wootton Bassett Town were Beazley with a

Bassett Suffer a Piercing Blow

Scours Lane, 26th March 2011

It is well and truly squeaky bum time for Wootton Bassett Town after their 2-1 defeat at the hands of Reading Town, coupled with victories for fellow strugglers Bracknell Town and Carterton, narrowed the breathing space Dave Turners team have as their Hellenic League Premier Division campaign enters its final stages.

A stunning strike from Jamie Pierce with twenty minutes to go decided the game in the hosts favour after Bassett had rode their luck throughout the first period before equalising through Tom Dingle. Reading were in the end well worth the three points, but it was another missed opportunity for Bassett, still with five games left against teams battling it out for honours at the other end of the table, to get themselves out of danger. After troubling league leaders Ardley United in midweek, Bassett reverted to their midseason form that saw them slip into trouble with a frustratingly below par display. Although Ethan Delaney and Sam Collier threatened early, both seeing shots narrowly miss the target, Reading were dominant in the first half. Spearheading their charge was centre forward Marcus Richardson, whose ability to hold the ball up, made livewire pair Danny Seaward and Ashley Watkins, both intelligent with their runs, even more dangerous. In the 25th minute, the journeyman former pro, sent Seaward down the left flank, his cross being met by Jordan Cousineau, who headed across goal and narrowly wide. Despite their attacking quality, Bassett appeared more than willing to create problems for themselves with wastefulness in the midfield, which saw possession conceded all too easily. And it would be this failing, which played a crucial role in the hosts opener with twelve minutes to go before half time. Quick to counter, the ball was played into Richardson just inside the visitors half of the field. An unmarked Watkins was then played in down the left flank and he centred for Cousineau, making a late darting run, to direct the ball into the bottom right corner past a helpless Luke Sharps. The visitors seemed not to have learned their lesson after conceding a goal from such a simple, yet effective move. Two minutes later, Watkins blazed narrowly over after Seaward had beaten the offside trap and crossed from the right. Then, on the stroke of half time, Watkins breezed past right back Craig Bowden before delivering a dangerous low cross, which Richardson struck over with a first time effort.

To their credit, Bassett came out after the break a changed side. Tightened up at the back and less carefree when in control of the ball, they actually began to threaten and were rewarded for their enterprise on 67 minutes. A quick corner from Delaney to Matt Bown stung the unprepared hosts, and the latters weighted delivery was met by Dingle, who rose highest and looped a header into the back of the net with the help of the left-hand post. It was to be a fleeting lifeline though. Moments after an innocuous Richardson flick on had Sharps scrambling to bundle the ball away from danger after having hit the near post, the hosts retook the lead. After a weighted free kick taken from the halfway line, the burly Richardson set the ball perfectly for Jamie Piercey, who lashed an unstoppable volley into the bottom left corner from the right hand edge of the box. It was a hammer blow from which Bassett could not recover, try as they did for the final twenty minutes. Defeat means they slip a further place to 17th, just five points ahead of fourth bottom Witney United. Time to dig deep.

Scoops Man of the Match: Tom Dingle. Was rewarded for his hard work with his second goal for Bassett. Better service from his teammates is required though if his qualities are to be utilised fully.

Scoop Rating: 5/10. Reading dominated the midfield battle comfortably, which wound up deciding the game. Too haphazard in possession, Bassett created a number of problems for themselves, especially in the first half, from which the hosts fashioned a plethora of chances. Somewhat lucky to still be in the game at half time, Dave Turners side did claw their way back into the game, but after going behind again failed to muster anything meaningful in front of goal.



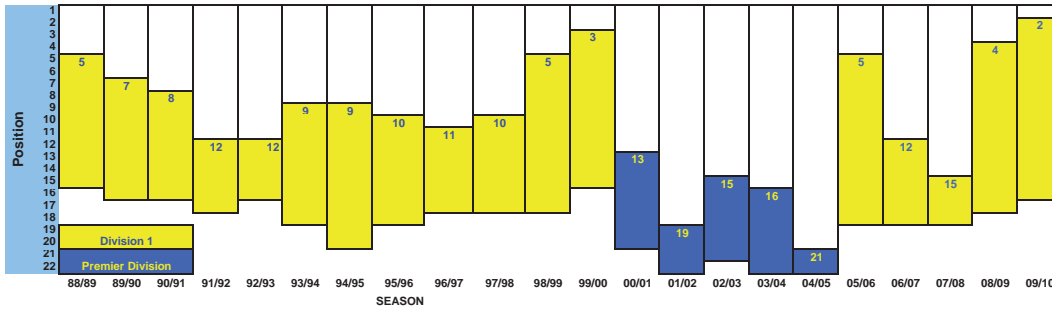

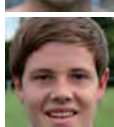

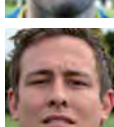

Senior teams: Welcome to the December addition of the touchline newsletter for the seniors section. Writing this we have just seen the Scottish referees strike this last weekend seemingly due to the fact that managers and players do not show them respect. With all jokes aside, it is a shame that some officials do not share the same respect to the clubs, as always it can be the minority that spoil it for the majority. This club has always tried to adhere, indeed promote, the respect campaign as we have always seen the referees role as an essential part of the game, but this can be difficult when officials seem to have such mixed abilities and lack consistency. We have also put a lot of work in this pre-season to maintain the promotion level so it was of interest when at a recent local derby a league official commented that the respective club had not been requested to increase the internal size of their dug-outs as per the FA Ground grade rule, again an inconsistency which we seem to be at the wrong end of. We have recently requested a stay of further work until the relocation is complete to ensure that monies are used in the best interest of all at WBTFC. Our request has been reviewed by the Hellenic league and FA Technical board and we must have covered accommodation for 200 in place for next season, despite the prospect of relocation. Whilst I have no issues with this decision I would expect consistency in application of the ground grading policy, but it seems from our travels not to be the case. If local football is to survive this economic situation then surely the respective leagues have a responsibility to all clubs to reduce the financial implications it imposes, if this is not done then football clubs at this level will have to review their strategy to ensure survival.

We'll rant over. We have seen a great 2010 from all levels and I am very pleased with the progress we have made from 1st team, reserves, and under18s, Congratulations to Danny Hale, Jack Ellis, Joe Shedherd, Adam Topping, Tom Glass and Nathan Hawkins who have been picked to represent Wilts county U18s, an excellent achievement and our objective will be to ensure that these lads enjoy their time at Bassett, develop further and stay at the club to play at the highest level we can provide.

Chris Jones – Head of Senior Football

Youth teams: Seasons greetings to all players, managers and families associated with the youth section of the club. It is hoped that the "earlier start" to winter this year is not an indication of what we can expect in January & February of 2011. If this weather continues we will no doubt be faced with the usual backlog of fixtures towards the season end. I still cannot understand why more fixtures are not scheduled midweek during the early season when the weather and pitches are far more receptive for players and spectators alike. If these "colder" winter trends continue then serious consideration will have to be given to fixture scheduling and season start/ finish dates at all levels of amateur football. As with most amateur clubs, over the years we experience a turnover in players, managers and assistants alike. For all those new to the club (or those requiring clarity) I thought it prudent to remind you of our operating targets and difficulties. All those associated with the club do so on a voluntary basis (includes all administrators, managers, assistants and players...yes even the first team!). Our biggest overheads by far are obtaining training and playing pitches and their resultant hire costs. Last season alone cost WBTFC just short of **£19,000** in obtaining these facilities (I would add that both the council and GS4 who administer the astro also imposed significant increases during the year) This coupled with the cost of providing registration fees, insurance, playing / training kit and match officials fees gives a total expenditure for the youth section of some **£35,000** per season! Obviously these costs cannot be met by sponsorship alone and without a rich Arab or Russian owner the club has to impose a combined **membership/ training fee** in the form of a standing order payment. To ease payments it was decided to spread these costs over the calendar year so the standing orders are for **12 months** (not just the playing season!) The current charge is **£18 per month** (with discounts for multiple family members) and it is **vital** that to maintain our current level of activities these standing orders are in place. I would ask for your cooperation in updating your statements/ payment details please. From the club perspective we are currently in the process of updating our full membership records so please bear with us if in the meantime you receive communication from our secretary Gill Gascoigne. The aim is by creating a database we can improve all aspect of communication, club events and news directly to you. As always your continued support is vital in providing organised sport for the children within our community. As ever if you have any questions or suggestions please do not hesitate to contact either Gill or myself.

The U18s stretched their winning run to 10 straight wins with a comprehensive 4-0 league victory over bottom club Pewsey. Danny Hale with another two, Josh Morse and Joe Shepherd did the damage against Pewsey but the score would have been doubled had it not have been from a fantastic goalkeeping display from the Pewsey goalkeeper. As stated in previous notes I represented the club at U18 level in two cup finals in the 1981 and 1982 and to be able to manage a club that I have been associated with for over 30 years in a County Cup Final without doubt is a major highlight for me and eradicates the disappointment of last years semi final defeat. For some of the lads who have been with me since I started managing Youth teams 11 years ago this also makes up for the disappointment of three previous semi final defeats at U13, U15 and U18 level and an appearance in the final will be a very fitting reward for a superb and thoroughly deserved achievement by all involved with the floodlit side this year so far.

Aside from this we are also very well positioned at the top of the floodlit league and with four of the last five games taking place at home it could be the best season for a long while for the club and your support at these games would be very much appreciated.

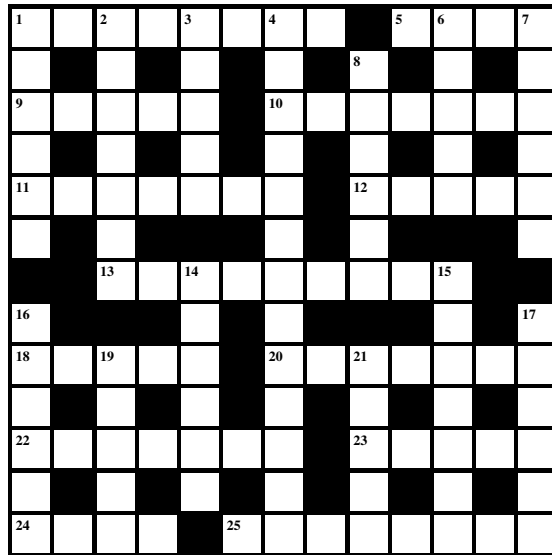

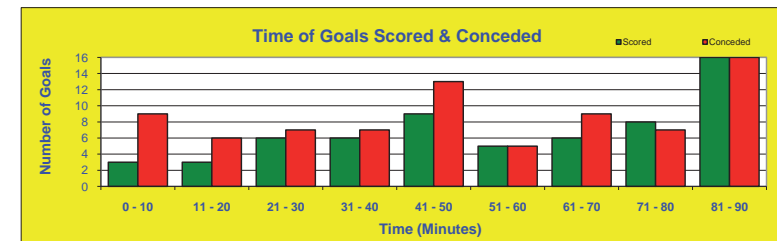
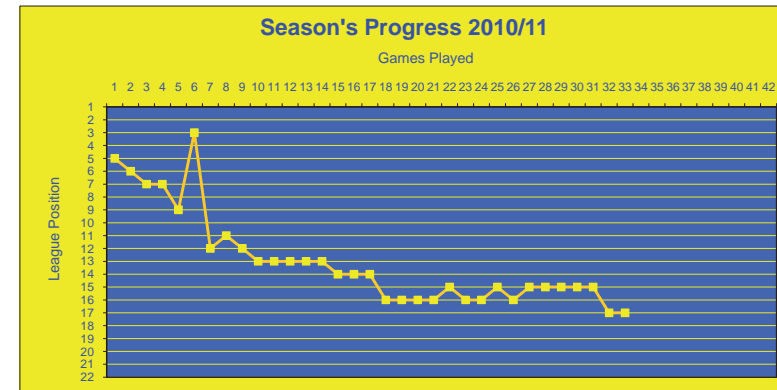
