# EDITORIAL

Good evening and welcome back to Rylands Way for this UHlsport Hellenic Premier League fixture against **Witney United**. We wish a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters from **Witney** who have made the journey for this fixture and wish them a safe journey home back to Oxfordshire.

Tonight is a vital game for both sides at the wrong end of the table and a must win game for both teams. **Witney** will be on a high from their excellent 4-1 away win at rejuvenated Fairford Town on Saturday. With Fairford having won at Oxford City in midweek I had this one down as a home win. Although Fairford have struggled at the foot of the table all season, they remained a tough nut to crack on their home ground and this was an impressive win by **Witney**. We are certainly under no illusions that this will be a tough game tonight. We have now lost five games in a row following the defeat against **Slimbridge** and have not won in our last nine games. The defeat on Saturday was harsh and how different had the result have been if the **stonewall penalty** had been awarded and **Slimbridge** reduced to ten men just prior to them taking the lead. It seems everyone in the ground saw the incident except the men in black. Decisions like these (the first **Slimbridge** goal also looked offside) decide games and whilst the saying goes that these type of things even themselves out over season it does at times feel like we are always on the wrong end of them. **Binfield**, **Ardley**, **Highworth Town** and the other sides chasing the title also suffered from these decisions on Saturday.

Despite the disappointment of Saturday all concentration now needs to be on achieving three vital points here tonight. Hopefully the side will be strengthened tonight by the return of **John Beeden** and also see the return from suspension of **Liam Edmondson**. The game tonight is just as big as some of those at the end of last season when we were chasing promotion. Having witnessed the game on Saturday I am also hoping we have had a little bit of rain to soften the pitch up as it was very difficult for the players to get the ball under control with the hard and rutted surface. Both sides were almost forced to engage in a long ball game given the way the ball was bouncing all over the place when both sides tried to play football on the ground. Despite the bad run of results of late there have been a few positives to take heart from. The performances of youngsters **Adam Topping** and **George Drewitt** bode well for the future. The signing of **Tom Dingle** has been a good one, a very clever player with a high work rate, typified by his cracking goal against **Slimbridge** on Saturday.

Manager **Dave Turner** looks back over recent games in his From The Dugout column later in the programme. Looking at what else is in tonight's programme, the **From the Archives** feature this week goes way back to **1962-63** and the worst winter in British history that sees the FA Cup final put back, Sunday football introduced and some teams having the whole of January and February off. **Wootton Bassett Town** also struggled at the wrong end of the table following the departures of **Mickey Jefferies** and **Lou Nash**. # OPPONENTS HISTORY

## Witney United FC • Club History

Witney in Oxfordshire, made world famous for its production of blankets, is a thriving market town and with over 22,000 residents it is the largest town in West Oxfordshire. The town of Witney dates back to AD969 and gained its name from the Saxon term 'Witan' that meant King. Witney United FC (WUFC) was formed by a group of Witney Town supporters following the demise of their beloved club. Intent on bring senior football back to the town the group registered Witney United FC with the Oxfordshire Football Association in 2001.



For almost a year they had little else other than the name! There was no ground, team or manager. That year was all about raising funds and the profile of the club. The club set itself a challenging business plan that targeted a return to Southern League football within 5 seasons. Finally after much hard work it all came together.

In 2002 WUFC gained a lease on the original Witney Town stadium and were accepted into Division One (West) of the Hellenic League. In it's first year the Club struggled to attract local players and finally finished 15th in the Division.

The second season saw the club move forward finally finishing the season in 4th place and gaining a surprise, last minute, offer of promotion to the Premier Division.

The challenge of promotion was compounded by the fact that the Club would start it's third ever season with it's third ever manager! But under the management team of Alan Clark, Steve Paish and Spencer Keyes the team proved it could hold it's own - finally finishing a creditable 11th out of 22. The Club also competed, for the first time, in the F.A. Vase winning through the first three rounds - eventually losing to Deal Town away. Further success was achieved in the Oxfordshire Senior Cup where Witney finally fell to Oxford City in the semi-finals.

The 2005/06 season saw United enter the FA Cup for the first time and were very unlucky to bow out after a replay against Southern League high-fliers Clevedon Town. The FA Vase brought similar disappointment as they went out to Truro City at the second hurdle.

In October 2005 Alan Clark resigned as 1st Team Manager and Spencer Keyes stepped up from Assistant Manager to replace him. Spencer's first management move was to recruit Pete Lamont as his No2. The side went from strength to strength and a top 6 finish was claimed on the very last day of the season to round off an excellent season.

United entered 2006/07 with a certain amount of optimism as the bid to bring Southern League football back to West Oxfordshire. A lack of consistency and too many draws saw them slip away from the leading pack and eventually finish 6th for the second season running. The club did however reach the Challenge Cup Final before losing 2-1 to Hungerford Town.

In the close season Keyes stood down as Manager and United moved quickly to appoint Andy Lyne. Lyner had two spells as manager at Witney Town in the nineties and his homecoming was well received by the fans who hoped he could work his magic for a third time at Marriotts Stadium. This saw United have their best ever season since formation finishing an excellent 4th place in the league and pushing the promotion contenders for long periods of the season. The 2008-09 season saw United go one better finishing in 3rd place in one of the tightest title run ins for years whilst also reaching the last 32 of the FA Vase.

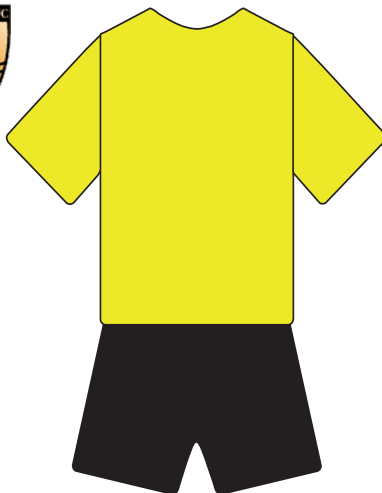

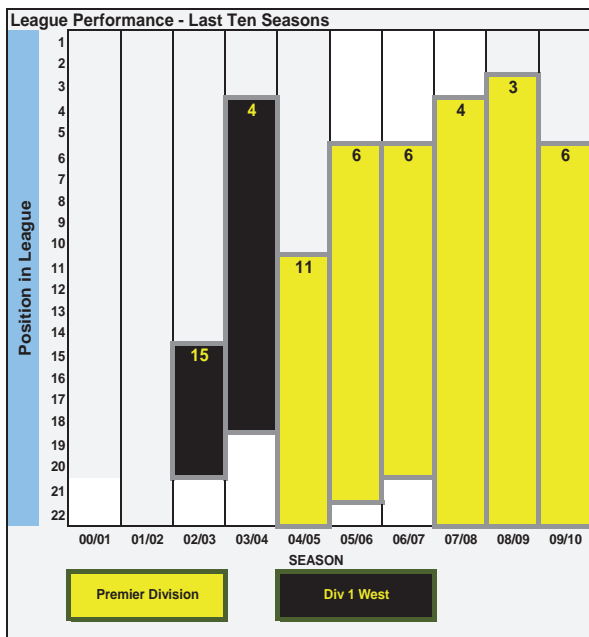

as Wootton Bassett Town secured two 2-2 draws at home against Purton and Stonehouse. Granville Taylor and Peter Teetgen scored against Purton and Joe Robinson and Johnny Lawrence against Stonehouse. Radstock Town, despite scoring for Bassett, inflicted a home defeat on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> April, 4-2 the score in this one. Two days later a visit to Clandown resulted in a 3-0 defeat. Melksham Town visited Rylands Way five days later and won by the same score line as Wootton Bassett lost their third game on the bounce. Surprisingly given the backlog, after playing four games in ten days, there was not another game for some two weeks.

The bad run, however, continued as Wootton Bassett Town went down to Chippenham Town Reserves. The rot was ended when Swindon BR visited Rylands Way as the two sides shared eight goals and the points, on target for Wootton Bassett Town were Terry Gardiner (2), Benny Lehane and the returning Lou Nash. With two of the last three games against title chasing Swindon side Pinehurst, the other against mid-table Devizes Town the expectation for further points was pretty low and so it proved with all three games being lost. This included a heavy 8-2 away defeat at Pinehurst. Wootton Bassett finished the season in 16<sup>th</sup> place out of 18 teams with 23 points from 34 games. In the end Pinehurst, despite the heavy win over Wootton Bassett, lost out on the league title to Somerset side Frome Town on goal average. Benny Lehane and Terry Gardiner proved to be astute signings as they led the goal scoring chart for Wootton Bassett and between the two of them matched Micky Jefferies efforts the previous season but how much better it would have been had Wootton Bassett Town been able to hang onto their prolific marksmen.

December 1<sup>st</sup> saw Swindon town A visit Rylands Way and leave with both points courtesy of a 4-1 win, Terry Gardiner with the Wootton Bassett consolation goal. Goals from Benny Lehane and Colin Taylor gave Wootton Bassett a narrow 2-1 win over Stonehouse. On the day the bad weather kicked in Wootton Bassett did manage to get their game played but probably wished they had not as they went down 5-1 away at Warminster Town, Johnny Lawrence with the solitary goal. Little did the players and management know that it would be March before they played again.

On the 12<sup>th</sup> January 1963 Swindon Town, with their players wearing basketball boots, defeated QPR 5-0 at the County Ground in a rare game to escape the bad weather. The Football Pink of 19<sup>th</sup> January 1963 reported that for the first time in the history of the Wiltshire Premier League all games had been postponed for three consecutive weeks. Seven days later and the run of non-activity had stretched to four weeks. Action was finally resumed on 26<sup>th</sup> January when Swindon Town A met Peasedown MW in a one sided affair. The only game to survive the weather saw Swindon Town run out winners 20-1 in a game Peasedown, one of the leading sides, probably hoped would have been called off. One wonders if Swindon Town gave some of their professionals a run out to maintain fitness because a side who won almost half their games in the season clearly were not the type of side to lose so heavily. The Football Pink carried the story that the Wiltshire FA had announced a two week extension to the season until May 19<sup>th</sup>. Following another two weeks of inactivity the headline in the Football Pink of 9<sup>th</sup> February 1963 ran *One match with four points at stake could solve end of season fixture problem* as the authorities looked at creative ways to deal with the problem. The report below noted that 92 games had been postponed so far as a result of the cold snap. In another step to alleviate the problem the Wiltshire FA sanctioned the playing of games on Sundays to get the season finished. In addition the Wiltshire Premier League cancelled its Subsidiary Cup competition and it took eleven Saturdays to settle the Calne & Harris v Swindon Victoria Wilts Senior Cup fixture. In the professional game the FA put back the FA Cup Final by three weeks to May 25<sup>th</sup>.

Two games were played on 23<sup>rd</sup> February but they did not involve Wootton Bassett Town. Wootton Bassett finally got to play their first game of the calendar year on 2<sup>nd</sup> March going down by the odd goal in five. On target for Wootton Bassett Town were Benny Lehane and Malcolm Thomas. A week later the first win of the year came in style as Wootton Bassett hit five without reply at home to Peasedown, Benny Lehane (2), Andy Harkness, Terry Gardiner and Tony Wall the Wootton Bassett scorers. Lehane and Gardiner scored again the following week at home to league leaders Frome Town but unfortunately Frome hit four of their own to take the points. Paulton Rovers were the next visitors to Rylands Way and Wootton Bassett Town found themselves one down in less than a minute. However, they fought back to win 4-2 thanks to a second half hat-trick from Benny Lehane, Andy Harkness with the other goal. The month ended with a trip to Melksham and Wootton Bassett found themselves 3-1 down, Bill Stevens netting for Bassett. The turning point in the game came when Melksham lost their keeper to injury. Wootton Bassett took advantage of their opponents predicament to score three times through Bill Stevens, Terry Gardiner and an own goal.

With the arrival of April, normally the final month of the season, Wootton Bassett Town still had some ten games still to play due to the harsh winter. In was not to be a glorious finish to the season either as not one of those remaining ten games were won. It did not start too badly

## Bassett Beaten Again by Late Saunders Strike

Marriots Stadium, 13<sup>th</sup> November 2004

**Ritchie Saunders dealt Bassett another big blow as he struck with five minutes left to go to give Witney United a 2-1 victory.**

A weakened Bassett side took the lead inside three minutes when John Magani finished off a great run, smashing the ball into the top corner past Sean Purcell after great work down the left by Geoff Swatton.

Stu Hemsley was then booked for Bassett on the quarter hour mark for a late foul on Tom Dingle.

Tom Messenger nearly gifted the equaliser to Witney in the 23<sup>rd</sup> minute as he sent a looping ball back to Ian Gill and Gill tipped wide.

A mistake by Steve Yeardley three minutes later gave Tom Smith a chance but his shot went just wide.

Bassett however had the better of the chances leading up to half time. In the 29<sup>th</sup> minute, Matt Bennett struck over from a Geoff Swatton reverse pass before Witney levelled up.

John McMahon connected with a deep free kick from Toby Fowler and McMahon's header looped over Gill who was caught off his line.

Six minutes before half time ex-Witney midfielder Steve Bunting beat Purcell but his shot rattled off the bar after Bunting received a cross from Chris Mills on the edge of the area which was meant to find the box.

On 44 minutes, a long punt from Ian Gill found Matt Bennett racing through but Purcell parried away Bennetts powerful strike.

Purcell was booked in stoppage time for dissent, and the Witney keeper was lucky not to receive his marching orders.

Things got physical in the second half with referee Robert Dunn making a meal of some decisions.

Bassett scorer John Magani should have received red for throwing a punch at Mitch Wyatt but both received yellows and then Tom Messenger was elbowed in the face and the referee failed to reach for his pocket.

Messenger was brought off injured because of this as Dave Tyler replaced him.

In the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute, McMahon was booked for Witney after pushing Steve Yeardley to the floor by his throat, another obvious red card offence.

A minute later, Mark King replaced Steve Bunting before Gill made a double save to deny Witney.

Gill parried a shot from Gary Wright only for Wyatt to head the ball towards goal and Gill brilliantly turned the ball over the crossbar.

Dunn's day in the middle went from bad to worse as he booked Andy Hallett for a challenge in which the Bassett defender won the ball before Ash Bradshaw replaced Magani.

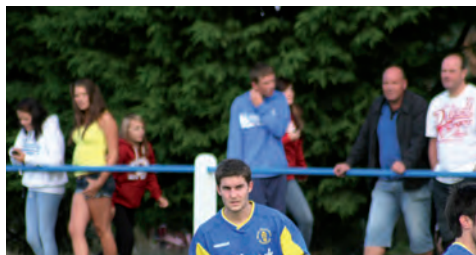

*and committee fitting two sunken baths in the dressing rooms, each capable of taking half a team at one plunge.*

A solitary strike from Johnny Lawrence was all Wootton Bassett had to show from another heavy home defeat as Trowbridge Town Reserves ran out 5-1 winners at Rylands Way. In an effort to strengthen the side, Wootton Bassett Town signed ex-Swindon Town player Terry Gardiner and RAF player John *Benny* Lehane. A midweek loss at Purton made it three straight defeats, this despite outplaying the home side in the early stages. Granville Taylor and Pete Teetgen scored the Bassett goals in a 3-2 defeat.

September kicked-off with another defeat, this time at home to Warminster, Terry Gardiner scoring what was to be the first of many goals for Wootton Bassett. The fifth straight defeat came in midweek at Calne, who even persuaded their Vice Chairman Geoff Hunt to come out of retirement and play in goal for them, Calne eventually winning 4-2, Benny Lehane with both Bassett goals. The same player bagged another brace in the next fixture away at Peasedown MW and in the process helped Wootton Bassett Town to their first win of the season, Johnny Lawrence adding a third in a 3-2 win and the first points of the season on the board. This was followed by a quick return game with Calne & Harris. Opponents Calne turned up late and the game was abandoned on 78 minutes due to poor light with Wootton Bassett leading 7-2 at the time. Thankfully the result stood and Calne were fined £1 (approximately £16 based on 2010 prices) for their tardiness. Terry Gardiner was the star of the show with four goals, Benny Lehane, Joe Robinson and Johnny Lawrence with the other Bassett goals. Clandown were the next visitors to Rylands Way and Benny Lehane continued his fine form in front of goal bagging another two as Wootton Bassett Town ran out 4-2 winners, Andy Harkness and Terry Gardiner with the other Bassett goals. The final game in September was not so fruitful for Wootton Bassett as they conceded two goals in the first eight minutes away at Paulton Rovers to make the headlines in the Football Pink for the wrong reasons. They eventually went down 4-1, an Andy Harkness penalty their only reward on the day.

October started with a visit from Westbury and it looked good for Wootton Bassett when Terry Gardiner scored in the first minute. However, the momentum could not be maintained and Westbury went on to score twice to take the points. Wootton Bassett returned to winning ways with the visit of Chippenham Town Reserves, Andy Harkness and Johnny Lawrence both bagging a brace in a 5-1 win, one of Harkness's goals coming from the penalty spot, Benny Lehane adding the other goal. The month ended with an excellent away win at Radstock Town. Trailing 1-0 at the break two goals from Johnny Lawrence and one from Benny Lehane gave Wootton Bassett a 3-2 win.

The upturn in form was partly due to two 17 year olds who had been recently signed. Alan Weeks had joined from Moreton FC and Bobby James had signed from Purton. The good form ran over into November with an excellent away win at Swindon BR. Two first half goals from Terry Gardiner gave Wootton Bassett a 2-1 half time lead and the team repeated the goal scoring into the second half as Wootton Bassett secured both points from a 4-2 win. The scorers in the second half were Benny Lehane and Johnny Lawrence. The win lifted Wootton Bassett up into 13<sup>th</sup> place in the table. Interest in the Wiltshire Senior Cup ended in the First Round as Wootton Bassett lost 3-0 away at Westbury. The other two games played in November saw two defeats including a heavy 7-1 reverse away to eventual champions Frome Town, Andy Harkness getting the consolation goal. The other game saw Wootton

## Season 1962-63 Return to Sender

### What was going on in the world

The season commenced after a World Cup that was hardly memorable in Chile, with defences on top and on field violence the norm. Brazil won the tournament by defeating Czechoslovakia 3-1 in the Final; this after knocking England out at the quarter final stage. The season kicked off with Frank Ifield at the top of the charts with I Remember You, a song which would spend seven weeks at the top. The season ended with the Beatles at the top with From Me to You, another song that was to be at number one for seven weeks. The season saw the worst weather in British football history. Only three third round FA Cup ties out of 32 were played on the day they were scheduled for, 5 January. Fourteen of them were postponed 10 or more times, the Lincoln-Coventry game 15 times! The replayed Blackburn-Middlesbrough tie was not completed until 11 March. When they did finally get playing Everton won the Division One title. Jimmy Greaves of Tottenham led the goal scoring charts with an impressive 37 goals. Manchester United won the FA Cup, defeating Leicester City 3-1 in the final. Stanley Matthews helps Stoke City to win promotion to the top division and wins the footballer of the year award in the process. Tottenham become the first British side to win a European trophy when they win the Cup Winners Cup, defeating Athletic Madrid 5-1 in the final. Swindon Town finish runners-up in the Third Division and are promoted to the second tier of English football.

Season 1962-63 will be remembered more for the terrible winter weather than the performances by Wootton Bassett Town Football Club. The *big freeze* started on 22 December and continued until March. In what was the worst winter in football history, even worse than 1946-47, games were still being played at the end of May to get the season finished. Things did not bode well in the close season when Wootton Bassett had lost the services of top scorer Micky Jefferies to Pinehurst and this was to prove a tough cold season in more than one way. The Football Pink of 18<sup>th</sup> August 1962 carried the following report on Bassetts loss of their top striker:

*The news from Wootton Bassett is more obscure until the results of their trial games becomes apparent. Obviously they are not going to replace a player like Micky Jefferies very easily. On top of that is also the retirement from the game of Frank Curtis, the return of Peter Larkham to Wroughton, Alec Rose leaving the district and Lou Nash being doubtful. Luckily the RAF pair of Andy Harkness and Wilf Connolly will again be available so may be in the end the club will produce a team on a par with that of the last few seasons.*

The season opened on the 18<sup>th</sup> of August with a tough home game against defending champions Devizes Town. The game went to form as the visitors left Rylands Way with both points after an easy 6-2 win, Malcolm Thomas and Granville Taylor scoring the Bassett consolation goals. The Football Pink the following week confirmed the departure of Lou Nash. The paper dated 25<sup>th</sup> August 1962 noted the following about the situation at Rylands:

*Mr Percy Stone and his Committee faced severe losses of tried and trusted players. The latest of these was when Lou Nash finally decided to leave. This seemed inexplicable for Lou had been one of the leading lights in all the summer work that had been going on in the clubs dressing rooms. When the new season came, however, Nash despite his long association with Wootton Bassett felt he would like a change of air and went over to Malmesbury Town. The summer work has resulted in the players*

## Slimbridge Handed a Gift

Rylands Way, 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2011

Elementary mistakes have been the downfall for Wootton Bassett Town more often than not when they have lost this season, the lack of thrashings during the course of their campaign attesting to that. And once again they played a role in their 2-1 defeat to promotion chasers Slimbridge, with both of the visitors goals being very much avoidable.

But the Swans three points were also influenced by some extremely questionable officiating, which left much to be desired. The games main flashpoint came six minutes before the half time whistle when Bassett were denied a stonewall penalty, while Slimbridge escaped not only having to face a spot kick but also playing the rest of the game at a numerical disadvantage. Expert skill from Sam Packer allowed him to fly past right back Fred Ward with ease, putting the hosts in a three-on-two situation. After advancing down the wing, he slipped a pass inside to Tom Dingle, who was under the close attention of defender Tom Speers. Dingle confidently rolled his marker ten yards from goal, but while he prepared to fire at goal, the defender went to the floor and reached out to block the ball with his hands. The handball was clear to the majority of the Rylands Way crowd, yet neither the referee nor his assistant managed to spot the blatant infraction, which denied Dave Turners side an obvious goal scoring opportunity. The incident came at a crucial juncture of the match. Bassett had just survived a quarter hour long Slimbridge onslaught that had seen two efforts cleared off the line. Still disgusted about the officials mistake, Bassett lost their composure and found themselves behind in the 43<sup>rd</sup> minute. Controversy surrounded the goal too, with it appearing as though Ross Langworthy, who got the final touch, was offside. However, a home defence at sixes and sevens played a crucial role too. Allowing the burly Marvyn Roberts the freedom to latch onto a routine ball over the top left keeper Stewart Thompson exposed, and the home custodian was duly lobbed. Langworthy then slid in at the left upright to ensure the ball nestled in the back of the net.

The early stages of the first half had been a tentative affair, but the visitors began to assert their dominance, with their first clear chance coming when Ben Wood looped a header just over after a corner had only been half cleared. In the 21<sup>st</sup> minute, Langworthy had Thompson beaten after shrugging off the attentions of Mark McMeeking, but an acrobatic clearance from Shaun Carter preserved parity. Craig Bowden was next to dash the visitors hopes when he scrambled the ball away off the line from a close range Roberts effort, after Thompson could only parry a stinging Langworthy drive. The defensive heroics continued following the restart too. Rob Hine beat Thompson to Paul Carters whipped in free kick, delivering a towering header which seemed destined to hit the roof of the net. But a despairing McMeeking headed clear before the loose ball was bundled away, Roberts once again having failed with the rebound. A fantastic goal fashioned out of nothing then made it 1-1 on 56 minutes. Bowden clipped a clearance down the right wing. Although played more out of defensive necessity rather than an attempt to initiate an attack, it fell perfectly for Dingle, whose intuitive diagonal run allowed him to lose the attention of his marker. Then, after bringing the ball down, he blazed an unstoppable drive from the right edge of the box past Dave Evans at his near post. Slimbridge appeared rocked with Wood lunging in dangerously on Matt Boucher moments after the goal was scored. It was reckless and two-footed, but somehow he escaped with just a yellow card as punishment. Soon after, Bassett were punished for lax discipline. A ball over the top split the defence, and Langworthy took full advantage, driving past McMeeking before sending a firm strike from 18 yards past Thompson. Although once again rattled, Turners side did not give up the ghost and came close to an equaliser ten minutes from time when Packer weaved his way through the Swans defence only for his touch to elude him ten yards from goal. His weak effort was deflected by Speers and collected easily by Evans. Compounding a frustrating afternoon for Bassett was Witney Uniteds convincing win away against Fairford Town. It therefore means the Blanketboys visit to Rylands Way on Tuesday is of huge importance. There is no better time to break a six game winless league streak.

**Scoops Man of the Match:** Tom Dingle, took his goal brilliantly and his intelligent play gave the Slimbridge defence trouble. This was most notable when his hold up play forced Slimbridge defender Tom Speers to take such drastic action and handle the ball. Unfortunately this was not punished.

**Scoop Rating:** 5/10, although let down by poor officiating, the two goals Bassett conceded were primarily a result of their own slack play. That will need to be eradicated on Tuesday if the team are to take a huge step towards securing their survival.



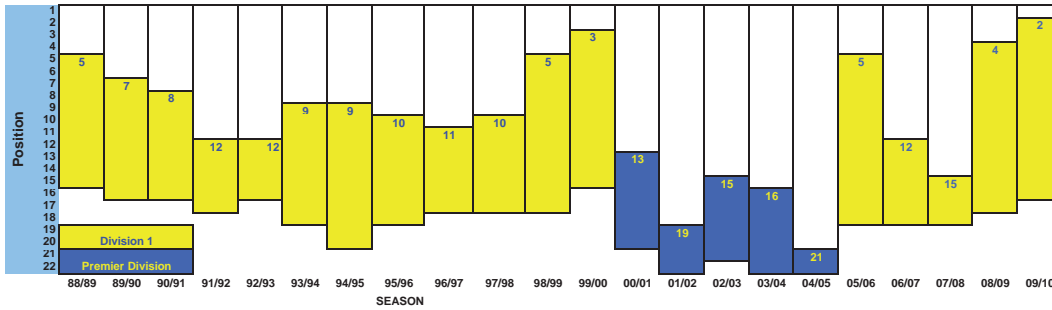

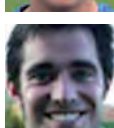

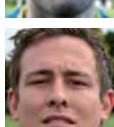

For some of the lads who have been with me since I started managing Youth teams 11 years ago this also makes up for the disappointment of three previous semi final defeats at U13, U15 and U18 level and an appearance in the final will be a very fitting reward for a superb and thoroughly deserved achievement by all involved with the floodlit side this year so far.

Aside from this we are also very well positioned at the top of the floodlit league and with four of the last five games taking place at home it could be the best season for a long while for the club and your support at these games would be very much appreciated.

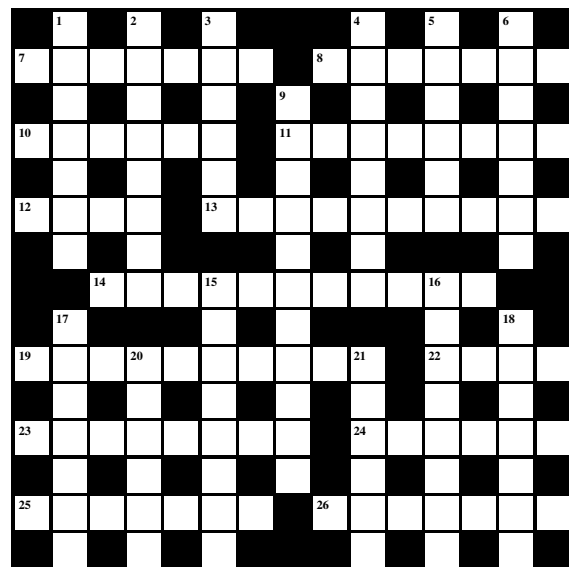

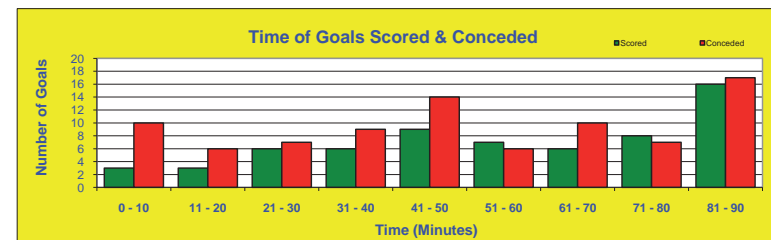
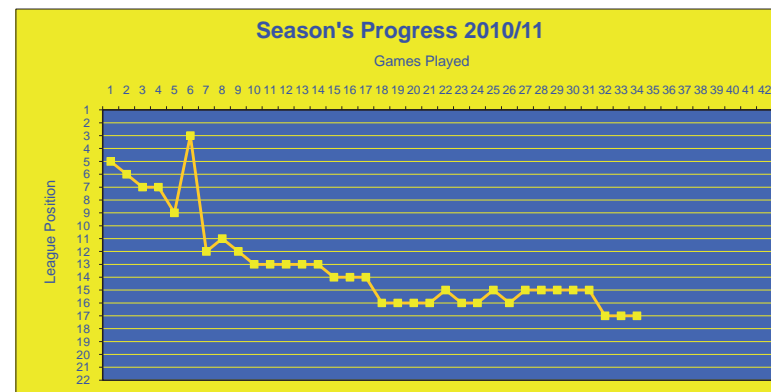
