# **EDITORIAL**



# **Ascot United FC • Club History**

Ascot United was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill, with "after match meetings" in the The Wells public house in Cheapside village (now Mikado's).

Within three seasons, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land north of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.

A new club house was erected at the Racecourse Ground.

2007	The men's senior team win the Reading Evening Post Cup Final at the Madejeski Stadium.
2008	The men's senior team finish 4th in their first season in the 1st Division East.
2009	The men's senior team finish 2nd in the 1st Division and gain promotion to Premier Division.
2010	The men's senior team finish 15th in the Premier Division "the clubs" highest ever league

The Club today has grown to become one of the largest football clubs in the UK. Currently there are over 750 registered players, embracing all ages from 5 upwards and all levels of ability. Ascot United fields 68 teams every weekend including 4 adult teams and 5 girls teams. It is supported by 46 businesses who provide various forms of sponsorship and is run by over 100 volunteers, 80 of whom have formal FA coaching qualifications. The clubs status was underlined in 2004 when it became an FA Charter Community club, at the time only the 2nd club in Berkshire to receive this prestigious award.





A 3-2 home win over a useful Stonehouse side followed as the fine run of form continued, new player Wilf Connolly, Andy Harkness and Micky Jefferies getting the important goals. The good run finally came to an end in the final fixture of the month away at Westbury where Wootton Bassett Town suffered a 2-0 reverse.

March commenced with a visit from Warminster Town and saw the biggest win of the season to date in the league as the visitors were dispatched 4-1, Micky Jefferies once again scoring twice with one a piece for Andy Harkness and Colin Taylor. From the biggest win of the season to the heaviest defeat as the Town were hammered away at Devizes 6-2. The home side would go on to win the league and certainly showed the form of champions, Wilf Connolly and Andy Harkness with the consolation goals. Wootton Bassett quickly bounced back from this disappointing result, defeating Peasedown MW 4-1 in the next game. Goalkeeper Dave Jones saved a penalty in the 4-1 home win. Two first half goals from Micky Jefferies and two in the second half from Pete Teetgen did the damage. The month ended with a mad rush of goals with nineteen being scored in the two fixtures. Wootton Bassett lost by the odd goal in a nine goal thriller with Paulton Rovers down in Somerset, Lou Nash scoring twice and Andy Harkness and Pete Teetgen with the other goals. The nine goal tally was exceeded the following week. Wootton Bassett found themselves two goals up at Chippenham but then conceded three before the break. The scoring pattern was repeated in the second half as Wootton Bassett went down 6-4 to Chippenham Town Reserves. Granville Taylor, Mick Jefferies, Andy Harkness and an own goal for Wootton Bassett in this one.

April as always was a busy month as Wootton Bassett sought to play all the games postponed due to the bad weather. Chippenham United came to Rylands Way for a midweek fixture and goals from Pete Teetgen, Tony Wall and Andy Harkness ensured a narrow 3-2 win. The following Saturday two first half goals from Micky Jefferies helped Wootton Bassett to a 4-2 lead at the break against Paulton Rovers at Rylands Way, Tony Wall and Andy Harkness with the other two. However, two second half goals from the visitors ensured the points were shared. Bottom of the table Calne were dispatched 2-1 at Rylands in a midweek fixture. Another midweek home fixture with Pinehurst was abandoned 11 minutes from time due to bad light with Bassett trailing 2-1. When the game was replayed Pinehurst won heavily scoring five times with Wootton Bassett managing just one in reply. The final three away fixtures resulted in just two points. A 4-0 defeat at Clandown was followed by a 2-0 home midweek win over Chippenham United. The final game of the season resulted in a very disappointing 5-1 away defeat at bottom of the table Calne & Harris United, Pete Teetgen with the consolation goal.

Wootton Bassett Town, after a spirited performance, faded down the final stretch and in doing so lost by three lengths, albeit short ones, against early form side Ascot United. In a physical, and at times petulant, encounter, neither side finished the ninety minutes with its full complement of starters.

Neck and neck with twenty minutes to go after Bassetts rearguard stoically ensured any counters from the home side were kept in check, Ascot caught their visitors napping when Tim Standing drilled a first time effort from twenty yards into the bottom right corner to open the scoring. The classy midfielder was somewhat lucky to still have been on the pitch though after a crunching, needless challenge on Ethan Delaney had only merited him a yellow card minutes prior. After going a goal behind, Bassett ran out of breathe, unable to deliver a counterpunch. The gap was widened seven minutes later as Dave Turners side shot themselves in the foot. Substitute Elliot Knight had only been on the pitch a matter of minutes, and this showed as he played a wayward back pass straight to home forward Jon Bennett, who galloped past a helpless Stewart Thompson before slotting the ball comfortably home. Trying desperately to claw their way back, Bassett were then caught on the break with eleven minutes remaining following a clinical counter. A swift passing move saw the ball fall to a wide open Sam McIntyre on the left wing, and he cut inside before drilling the ball into opposite corner from the edge of the box.

The final score though certainly flattered the hosts, who were made to work extremely hard for the victory. Ascot narrowly edged an extremely tight first half, but were unable to convert their territorial advantage into a goal. The best chance of the opening period arguably fell to Bassett as a header from a Matt Bown corner was blocked on the line. However, Ascot must be credited not only for some of the football they played (Bassett equally got the ball on the deck and stroked it around, albeit unfortunately not to the same effect as the hosts), but also for the way they did not cave in after being reduced to ten men just before the break when Rob Saunders was dismissed for a foul mouthed tirade directed at Jon Beeden. On the other hand, some of Stuart Scammells sides antics were disappointing. This is not to say Bassett were angels on the night, because they were not; the five bookings, two of which were received by Beeden, were testament to that. But the way in which the Ascot players constantly hounded the referee, and took it upon themselves to wind up their opponents left a poor taste. Two cases in the dying stages of the game highlight this. Firstly, the reaction of defender Paul McGrotty, who was also sent off for two bookable offences, to the kind of jostling you see at every corner kick was uncalled for. In needlessly squaring up to Beeden, the man the defender was marking, there is no doubt that McGrotty helped earn the Bassett full back a suspension. Then, after having been beaten by pace, substitute Simon Knight wrestled Delaney to the floor before copying the tactics of his teammate and going head-to-head with the young forward. By this point, three minutes into stoppage time and with almost a dozen cards already produced, the referee showed a modicum of common sense and only delivered a stern warning. Sadly the ugly side of their game took a shine of the beautiful side of it.

Scoops Man of the Match: James Turner, while Tim Standing pulled the strings effectively from the centre of midfield for the hosts, Turner impressively did the same for Bassett. He was effective in breaking up attacks with well timed tackles and his passes never went astray.

Scoop Rating: 7/10, two mistakes cost Bassett against opponents they matched up to extremely well for the majority of the game. Both sides played attractive football, although the game became farcical towards the end with a number of petty fouls being committed and bookings dished out at will.

follow as an error by keeper Dave Jones, who missed a clearance gifting the winning goal to the home side. It is not clear whether as a result of the keeper error that the axe was wielded the following week but Phil Smith made his debut in goal against Westbury United at Rylands Way. It was not a dream debut as two goals were conceded in the first 35 minutes. John Castle pulled one back before half time and Mick Jefferies added a second but Bassett eventually went down by the odd goal in five. October ended with another defeat away at Warminster, Mick Jefferies scoring the consolation goal. Dave Jones was back in goal for Bassett and had an outstanding game as reported in the Football Pink of 4<sup>th</sup> November 1961:

There was another close game at Warminster where Wootton Bassett were defeated 2-1. Warminster had to overcome a Mike Jefferies goal from Wootton Bassett before they could get on the winning trail. That second half was noteworthy for a wonderful display by Dave Jones in Wootton Bassett soal. He was brilliant, flinging himself at shot after shot, blocking, punching, smothering and finger tipping the ball in amazing fashion to rob the home forwards from having a much greater winning margin.

The first game in November saw Devizes Town visit Rylands Way and leave with both points courtesy of a 4-2 win, Mick Jefferies and Granville Taylor with the Bassett consolation goals. All six goals came in the second half and with twenty minutes to go it looked like Wootton Bassett would inflict the first defeat of the season on Devizes, leading 2-1 they proceeded to concede three goals in the closing stages as Devizes maintained their unbeaten record. The Football Pink of 11<sup>th</sup> November carried the following interesting report after the Devizes defeat:

Wootton Bassett have taken the lesson of the game to heart. They have decided to start training and, for this purpose have joined the Swindon Athletic Club where they begin their work this coming week.

The new training regime did not pay immediate dividends as Wootton Bassett went down 4-0 away at Peasedown to slip further down the table. Only Calne & Harris and Chippenham United were below then in the table after fourteen games. Some respite was offered by the First Round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup as Wootton Bassett saw off lower league opponents defeating Wroughton 7-2 at Rylands Way. John Castle fired a hat-trick, Mick Jefferies bagged a brace and there was one a piece for Peter Teetgen and Tony Wall. This started a good run of results. Back in the league a 3-0 home win over Chippenham Town Reserves brought two welcome points, Mick Jefferies with two and Pete Teetgen doing the damage for Bassett. The winning run continued into December when Bassett came from behind at Pinehurst to win 2-1. Bassett fell behind to a penalty but equalised on the stroke of half time through a Andy Harkness goal. Mick Jefferies fired in the winner in the second half. The Football Pink carried a headline the following week Wootton Bassetts six footers give Pinehurst little scope and commented that new centre-half Joe Robinson, an RAF Sergeant, who had played for West Auckland and Shildon Colliery, gave Wootton Bassett a back trio who were all over six foot tall.

It was back to Wiltshire Senior Cup action the following week and an away trip to lower league opposition in Marlborough Town. A Pete Teetgen hat-trick and a brace from Mick Jefferies gave Wootton Bassett a safe passage into Round 3 where Malmesbury would be the next opponents. The winning run came to an end when a visit to Swindon BR ended with the home side scoring the only goal of the game. Two days before Christmas Wootton Bassett lost 2-0 at home to Radstock and this was to be the last game of the calendar year as the away trip to Clandown the following week was postponed along with all other games in the Wiltshire Combination and Wiltshire League due to the big freeze. This was the first time since the formation of the Premier League in 1956 that all games had been postponed. The following week just one game at Westbury was played and as a result the Wiltshire Football Association sanctioned Sunday football to allow teams to catch up with fixtures.

The first game of the New Year saw a short trip to Malmesbury for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup against lower league opposition. Despite leading three times through goals from Tony Wall, Granville Taylor and Joe Robinson, the latter a penalty, Wootton Bassett managed to lose the tie 4-3. The following week Wootton Bassett conceded a late equaliser at home to Frome to share the

## Season 1961-62 Wonderful Land

#### What was going on in the world

The night of August 12-13 sees the Berlin Wall built. The Vietnam War officially begins as the first American helicopters arrive in Saigon. The audio cassette tape is invented. In the world of football a 46 year old Stanley Matthews is back playing for Stoke City. Alf Ramseys Ipswich Town are champions of Division One in their first season in the division, ahead of Burnley. Chelsea finish rock bottom and are relegated. Liverpool win Division Two and Norwich City defeat Rochdale to win the League Cup. Tottenham beat Burnley at Wembley to win the FA Cup. Swindon Town finish 9th in Division Three. What turns out to be a dull World Cup begins in Chile just as the season ends, Brazil defeat Czechoslovakia in the final. The season starts with Helen Shapiro at the top of the charts with You Dont Know and ends with the Shadows in top spot for a massive eight weeks with Wonderful Land

In its pre-season write-up the Football Pink of 19<sup>th</sup> August 1961 noted the comings and goings in terms of personnel at Rylands Way:

Wootton Bassett news is that Alex Stark will be missing this season, having returned to Dundee, while there also seems to be some doubt about Stan Embling. Against this Colin Taylor has returned after a season with Purton. Apart from that, Wootton Bassett expect to be much as last season when their dour defence kept the club well to the fore throughout.

Wootton Bassett Town opened their season with an away trip to Radstock. Fielding a weakened side, with traffic delays not helping the cause, Wootton Bassett went down 3-0. The first win of the season came in the local derby against Purton when goals from John Whitaker and Mick Jefferies secured a 2-0 win. This was followed by another home win three days later, Clandown being defeated 4-2. Peter Teetgen put Wootton Bassett in front from a corner from new signing Tony Wall, a winger who played for the county. Teetgen scored again before half time but Clandown pulled one back to leave the score 2-1 at the break. It was the same outcome in the second half as Bassett added goals through John Whitaker and Mick Jefferies. Wootton Bassett Town once again had goalkeeping problems to contend with as noted in the Football Pink of 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1961:

Every season I have to record that Bassett have a goalkeeper crisis with the need to make a panic signing. The only difference was that the emergency came earlier this season. They had the unusual luxury of having three signed goalkeepers, but none was available on Saturday so once again Secretary Percy Stone had to get busy. His Friday signing ultimately turned out to be a young Swindon lad, Partridge, who found Premier League shots a lot harder than Borough League ones, but let in only two.

A quick midweek return match with Purton saw Bassetts local rivals extract quick revenge winning the return game 3-2 at the Red House. A midweek home fixture saw a narrow 1-0 win over Swindon BR courtesy of a Pete Teetgen goal meaning that Bassett had won all three of their home fixtures but lost both their away fixtures and sat in 6<sup>th</sup> place in the league table. For a second consecutive Saturday Wootton Bassett Town were without a game and when they returned to action they suffered a heavy defeat going down 6-2 at Frome having been forced to field a side including five Reserve Team players. Tony Wall and P. Larkham with the Bassett goals. Wootton Bassett Town returned to winning ways a week later with a 2-1 home win over Swindon Town A, this after trailing 1-0 at the break, the second half goals for Wootton Bassett being scored by Colin Taylor and Mick Jefferies. September ended with the first home defeat of the season, Bassett minus their star RAF players, going down 4-0 to Trowbridge Town Reserves.

October opened with a home fixture against Melksham Town. Colin Taylor put Wootton Bassett in front at the break but Bassett then conceded two in the second half to go down 2-1. A week later another lead was conceded away at Stonehouse. Leading 2-0 through goals from Mick Jefferies and John Whitaker, Bassett conceded two penalties before half time to level things up. Worse was to

Rylands Way, 5th April 2011

Unbelievable. It is an adjective bandied around football circles far too often. Its use should really be limited to describing the sublime and the ridiculous, but is far too frequently employed to depict something merely above average. However, few would begrudge using it to portray what occurred during the second half of Wootton Bassett Towns relegation six pointer against Witney United.

The remarkable period began with the visitors a goal to the good, and they quickly extended that lead. With their backs against the walls. Bassett valiantly fought back, But as chance after chance went begging, their hopes of salvaging something seemed remote until two corners in the space of three minutes changed the game. With the scores back level, both sides pushed and pushed and pushed. Witney were denied twice by the woodwork, while desperation defending snuffed out other chances at both ends. The pace of the game, the ferocity and abandon with which both teams attacked, it was a dream for the spectator. Then, when all appeared settled and the points destined to be split, came the games truly unbelievable moment. It was nothing spectacular, instead it was ridiculous. Chasing a loose ball after a spill, visiting keeper Tim Griffiths and home forward Sam Collier tangled legs. A free kick should really have been awarded in Griffiths favour, but astonishingly the near-side assistant waved his flag before placing it across his chest. Penalty. For what only he knows. The explanation given to his colleague in the middle was that Griffiths had lashed out at Collier. If so, he was the only person in the ground to have noticed it. Uproar ensued, Griffiths was dismissed, while, as the storm temporarily calmed, Collier dusted himself off to smash home the spot-kick and give his side a 3-2 win and maximum points. The barrage of disapproval coming from the visitors continued though. Nick Weekes also received his marching orders for going too far with his protests, while the visitors fans and officials barracked the offending assistant with cries of cheat, cheat! Their furore was more than understandable given the games importance, prior to kick off the consensus was that the side who won the contest would, barring a spectacular surge in form from Carterton, the current occupiers of the final relegation spot, be all but safe for another season. But the choice of chant overstepped the mark. It could have all been different though had Witney not taken a lead from their patron, Prime Minister David Cameron, and snatched defeat from the jaws of victory. They controlled the first half, and should have been ahead on seven minutes. Neat interplay between Sean McKeon and Joe Fullerton carved open the Bassett defence and the latter set the ball back to the third member of their vibrant attacking trio, Joe Tustain. His firmly struck effort had Stewart Thompson beat, but Bassett were saved by the inside of the left post, the ball spraying across the face of goal before being hacked clear. Half chances came and went for the hosts, but it was Witney who were causing the most problems and they were finally rewarded for their persistence four minutes before half time. Continuing with their bad habits, Bassett gave the ball away high up the pitch after a Collier pass fell well short of its intended target, and one long ball over the top was their undoing. McKeon raced onto it, outpacing James Turner, before sweeping the ball expertly into the bottom right corner.

Thirty seconds after the restart he doubled his sides advantage, with Bassett yet again carved open all too easily. A decisive move down the right flank opened up the home defence, and an inside pass to McKeon presented him with an easy chance from twelve yards which he did not waste. It appeared to be game over. But staring a nail-biting fight from the drop in the face, the hosts fought back with gusto. A careless throw out from Griffiths created an opening for Ethan Delaney to bear down on goal, but under pressure he struck wide, before a neat one-two between Collier and Tom Dingle led to the former hitting the near post from close range. Just before the hour, a dipping effort from Matty Bown, whose introduction to the game was inspired, was acrobatically tipped over after the visitors keeper had initially misjudged the balls flight. For all their effort, Bassett seemed as though they would go unrewarded. But that changed on 67 minutes. Sam Packer floated in a corner to the far post, which Shaun Carter redirected. On the edge of the six yard box, his defensive partner Liam Edmundson added another flick, and Dingle found himself in the right place at the right time to guide the ball into the back of the net from two yards out. It was almost level a minute later when a Richie Carter lob with Griffiths stranded was headed off the line. Bassett would not have to wait much longer for the equaliser though. Again it came from a Packer corner, Delaney this time helping it on, and Collier, ever the poacher, swivelled, expertly turning the ball in from ten yards. Thereafter, all hell broke loose. Cautions, already having being received by Jon Beeden and McKeon, began to be dished out left, right and centre as tempers frayed and tackles flew in. The sides flew up and down the pitch, Witney coming closest to a winner, largely thanks to Tustains purpose and drive. With ten minutes remaining he shrugged off the attention of Edmundson and fired a powerful toe poke at goal from the edge of the area, which Thompson was equal to. With just two minutes of the allotted 90 left, a 25yard drive of his, aided by a slight deflection, rattled the woodwork and arrowed out for a corner. Jon Steedman weighted the resulting set piece perfectly and only a sublime fingertip save from Thompson prevented a goalwards bound header from crossing the line. As the seconds wound down even more, play reverted to the other end where the game most controversial moment played out before a dumbfounded crowd eyes. Unbelievable? Only to see what happened next was to believe it

Scoop® Man of the Match: Sam Packer, energetic and workmanlike in the centre of midfield, Packer ran his tail off all evening. His two corners would lead to Bassetts first two goals and his clever use of possession and desire to take the game to the visitors caused problems.

Scoop Rating: 7/10, the performance, especially in the opening 45 minutes and 30 minutes, was very average, and Bassetts mistakes were duly punished. But they fought back with intent and deservedly found themselves on level terms with twenty minutes remaining. From there on a draw would have been fair, although the final quarter of the match saw Dave Turners side play brilliantly. Three points, however earned, were more than welcome.






