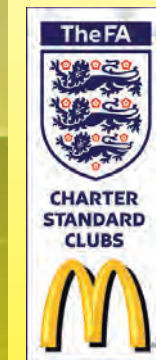

OPPONENTS HISTORY

Wantage Town FC • Club History

Affiliated to the Berks and Bucks F.A. in 1892, Wantage celebrated their Centenary Season in 1992 in style, by winning promotion and the Hellenic League Division One Cup, defeating Wollen Sports 3-2 in the final.

Prior to joining the Hellenic League in 1956, Wantage Town played in the Swindon & District North Berks and Reading & District Leagues. Their first success came in 1903-04 in the Swindon Advertiser Cup and they repeated this achievement in 1907-08 as well as becoming Swindon & District League Champions, to the great joy of the Town.



After the First World War, they briefly played in the North Berks League, winning the North Berks Cup in 1920 and 1921 and the Championship in 1921-22. Wantage played in the strong Reading & District League with no success, but then re-entered the Swindon & District, winning the title in 1933-34 season.

The Fifties was the most successful period for the Club, winning the League in 1952-53 without losing a game and again in 1955-56, while in 1954-55, the Club won no fewer than five cup competitions, including the Berks & Bucks Intermediate Cup. Since joining in 1956, Wantage have spent most of their 54 seasons in the Hellenic League in the Premier Division, but have won promotion from Division 1 on six occasions - as runners-up in 1969-70, 1987-88, 1991-92 and 1995-96, and as Champions in 1980-81 and 2003-4. Their best finish in the Premier Division has been third place on three occasions - 1973-74, 82-83 and 93-94. 1991-92 saw them set a Club record of 32 games unbeaten as they achieved promotion and Division 1 Cup success. Their runners-up position in 1996, and the subsequent installation of floodlights, saw Wantage Town regain the Premier Division status they lost in 1994. Following the installation of the floodlights in 1996, the Club has continued to invest in the upgrading of the facilities at Alfredian Park. In the past fifteen years the main pitch has been renewed, a training pitch has been established, and the Clubhouse has been refurbished.

The old stands were replaced with a new stand, accessed by a tarmacadamed road, and the old gravelled and 'pot holed' car park, was similarly tarmacadamed. Two new and additional pitches have been formed north of the Clubhouse, enabling five full sized pitches (including the adjacent School's pitches) to be used by the growing number of teams supported by the Club. Season 2003/2004 was one of the club's most successful. The first team won Division One East to regain its position in the Premier League of the GLS Hellenic Football League, and the Reserves finished top of their league, also winning promotion. The Reserves success was repeated in 2004/2005 as they secured the Reserve Division One title. The First Team consolidated their Premier League status, finishing in 10th place.

With Manager Andy Lyne departing to Oxford City, Town appointed a new First Team Manager, Richie Bourne. After 5 seasons in charge Bourne moved to Abingdon United in the close season. Continuity has been sustained, as Bourne's Assistant Manager Andy Wallbridge now heads the management team assisted by Ellis Langford. The Reserves now benefit from the safe and reliable management of Warren Griffin. A further senior team plays in the North Berks league under the stewardship of James Hicks. The Veteran's squad is run under the watchful eyes of James Connelly. The Club also runs four Youth teams, two at under 16 and two at under 18, cementing the Club's growing involvement with football at all levels.

With sound management in place throughout the Club, on and off of the pitch, and with growing support from the local community, the Club has a unique opportunity to put in place the foundation upon which progress to a higher level of football may be made. This was reinforced with the award of the F.A. Charter Standard, and the establishment of a F.A. Charter Community Football Partnership, which brings together all of the footballing interests in the area of Wantage and Grove, with Wantage Town F.C. at its hub.

Alfredian Park had an attendance record of 675 who witnessed the visit of Oxford United for a pre-season friendly in 2003.

 21. Resolute and intelligent midfielder player with ball winning determination and productive distribution. Joining the Club last season, Scott fitted in with ease.



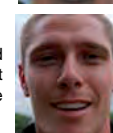
Liam McCullough Midfield

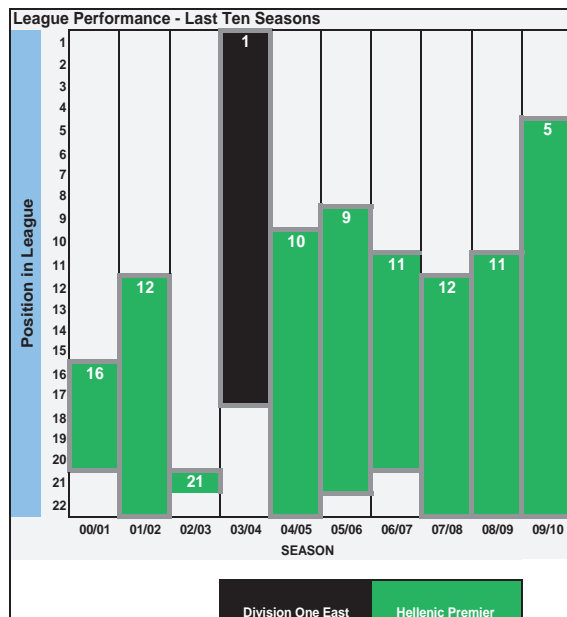
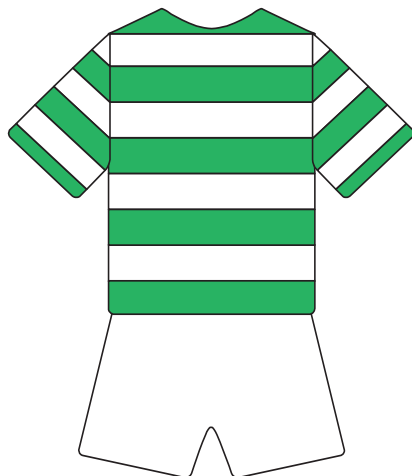
Andy Wallbridge Manager

comfortably triumphed 2-0. Rubbing salt into the wounds that afternoon was the fact both of the Gloucestershire side's goals were bagged by Stoddart on his former stomping ground. Mid-table Wantage then dished out a 4-0 hammering at Rylands Way.

It took a herculean effort in the final week of the season to ensure survival. A 20-yard drive from Vaughan decided the encounter at bottom side Harrow Hill in Bassetts favour before newly installed Highworth boss John Fisher was given a shock when their visitors triumphed by the odd goal in five. On a balmy April evening, strikes from Tooley and Turner earned another vital three points. Then on the final day of the season at Gloucester United, who at that moment headed the league, a lead they were eventually blow, a Kevin Theobald header with quarter of an hour to go secured a point, meaning Yeardeleys men finished 19th. While the symptoms of second season syndrome had been present throughout the course of the campaign, thankfully relegation had been avoided.

And that would soon become a habit. The final league table for the Hellenic Premier League is shown below along with all the results and scorers from the season:

Bassetts troubles then returned in December, beginning with a 4-0 shellacking at the hands of Pegasus Juniors. A week later came the first meeting of the season with Highworth Town. Goals from Macek and Nathan Hall had the hosts ahead 2-1 at the break, but the Worthians fought back during the second period to claim victory by the odd goal in five. Yeardeley's side then continued their strange trend of faring better when up against opposition heavily favoured to win when they met Southern League Swindon Supermarine in the quarter finals of the Wiltshire Premier Shield. The Hunts Copse outfit sent a weakened side to Rylands Way, although seven regulars still made an appearance. And they were to be embarrassed, setting up a semi final tie with Swindon Town , thanks to the brilliance of Swatton, as noted by the Evening Advertiser on Wednesday December 12th 2001 under the headline, *Bassett ace Geoff Swats aside Marine*:

Swindon Supermarine crashed out of the Wiltshire Shield last night at the hands of a spirited Wootton Bassett side. A goal in each half from Geoff Swatton proved enough to give Bassett a deserved 2-0 win against an under strength Marine. The only threat to their safe passage was the thick fog that descended on the Gerard Buxton ground during the match. Referee Brendon Malone must have been tempted to abandon proceedings as visibility levels swiftly deteriorated. But once Swatton had put Bassett 2-0 up on the hour, Malone was never going to risk getting lynched by the jubilant home faithful. Hunts Copse supremo John Murphy clearly wants to focus on the clubs quest for Dr Martens safety and blooded academy and fringe players such as Richard Knox and Liam Thompson. But Marine still had seven regulars in the starting line-up, so Bassett can be rightly proud of their performance.

Four days later, it was a case of after the Lord Mayors show when Almondsbury picked up all three points comfortably, defeating Bassett 2-0. Decembers performances continued to deteriorate as both Fairford (2-0) and North Leigh (6-0) showed no sympathy, leaving Yeardeley and his team lingering dangerously in 16th position going into the New Year.

January began on a similar note with a 2-0 defeat at home against Yate in a game which saw Hall and Luke Sharps sent off and Yeardeley ordered from the dugout. With suspensions therefore piling up, the manager could ill afford to lose any more players, but that is exactly what happened when Newton made the switch to join ex-Bassett teammate Lee Stoddart at Fairford in the middle of the month. In fairness to the winger, staying with his hometown club would not have helped further his burgeoning career, but still it was a bitter pill to swallow to lose such a gifted player. Without him though, Bassett began to regain some of their lost form, earning a point at home against Bishops Cleeve thanks to Steve Howse's 90th minute equaliser, it could well have been all three had Hall had not missed an earlier penalty, before winning the only two games able to be played in February. Against Cirencester Academy, Vaughan scored the only two goals of the game before getting himself sent off, and then Cheltenham Saracens were defeated by the odd goal in three courtesy of a last minute Simpkins free kick.

Debutant Nick Tooley found the back of the net to grab a hard earned point at Henley before consecutive home defeats against Southall Town (0-2) and Carterton (0-3) and a convincing loss away to Brackley (1-3). It was not exactly the greatest preparation for the Premier Shield last four contest with Swindon Town. The competition was generally used for blooding the then Division Two sides youngsters. But for this tie, former Liverpool star Neil Ruddock was given a run out as part of his recuperation from an injury. Bassett performed admirably and only narrowly missed out on a matchup with Chippenham Town in the final, with keeper Rich Stevens in particular in fine form, as the Wednesday 21st March 2001 edition of the Evening Advertiser noted in its report of the game:

Andy King will come face to face with Tommy Saunders after Towns 2-0 win over Wootton Bassett booked a Wiltshire Shield final date with high-flying Chippenham. First half goals from Nathan Edwards and Bertie Brayley were enough to give the Second Division side a comfortable victory but Pete Yeardeleys Hellenic side did not disgrace themselves. Town really should have won by more than two goals but Bassett keeper Richard Stevens was outstanding, keeping out decent strikes from Juan Cobian and Paul McAreavey. Although they faded badly in the second half, Bassett did threaten in the early stages. The lively Geoff Swatton thumped a shot just wide of Richard McKinneys right post in the seventh minute and Nathan Hall should have done better in the 23rd minute, scuffing a poor effort wide. But the visitors went desperately close to snatching a shock lead on 27 minutes when Richard Merchant sent a half volley whistling inches over the crossbar from the edge of the box. Town player-coach Neil Ruddock then tried a cheeky shot from the halfway line after a poor Bassett clearance. Ruddock said: "The keepers teased me into having a go. But seriously he was brilliant, making some great saves." But Town finally made the breakthrough on 36 minutes when Nathan Edwards slid home Juan Cobians cross. The lead was doubled four minutes before the interval when Paul Reeds clever chip was headed home by skipper for the night, Bertie Brayley. Paul Edwards caused havoc down the left flank and crashed a second half shot against the crossbar before being substituted. Bassett manager Pete Yeardeley said: "Our lads battled hard throughout. Our game plan was to close them down, frustrate them and try and hit them on the break. We had a couple of early chances we should have done better with but in the second half we were just chasing shadows. Swindon passed the ball around very well"

When back in league action, the losses continued to mount up, March finishing with poor performances away to Didcot (0-3) and at home against mid-table Shortwood (0-1). However, there was a glimmer of hope when talisman Vaughan scored an unstoppable volley to decide Bassetts visit to Bicester.

Still, Yeardeleys team had plenty of work to do in what was to be a hectic final month of the season. Eight games remained and it really was do-or-die. Goals either side of half time from Hall and Ricky Theobald helped Bassett on their way to a narrow 2-1 home win against Pegasus. Three disappointing defeats followed though, beginning with a 4-0 thumping at the hands of Southall on what was a night to forget. On the way to West London, the team minibus broke down, meaning they arrived late and had to change in its claustrophobic confines; they may as well not have bothered given the punishment they were then to receive! The team fared better at Abingdon where the spoils were shared following a goalless draw, but in the ensuing contest, Fairford

Great Team Performance Earns Bassett Three Points At Wantage

A Danny Clayton goal secured Bassett Town all three points away to Wantage Town in a great team performance which was only marred by Paul Patel (pictured) being taken off with a shoulder injury following a nasty challenge inside the first twenty minutes.



Wantage were the team who started the game on top, having two corners inside the first five minutes. They also had a couple of dangerous crosses that came to nothing as the Bassett defence started off where they had left off against Hook Norton.

Bassett themselves had their first attack of note in the 8th minute but again nothing came of it. Bassett were forced into an early change when Paul Patel suffered a damaged shoulder in the 13th minute following an ugly challenge from Wantage striker Chris Roche. To the astonishment of the Bassett contingent the referee took no action against the Wantage player for what had been a vicious attack on the Bassett defender. Patels game was ended by that incident and he was replaced by Stu Hemsley who was returning to the first team having missed a couple of games.

Both teams created chances in an even first half. As the half wore on Bassett started to gain initiative, earning a number of corner kicks which unfortunately came to nothing. Bassett continued to attack as the half drew to a close but numerous through balls and crosses were wasted. Mark Simpkins had the best chance for Bassett in the first half when a minute into injury time his shot was well saved after he dribbled past two defenders following good work by Rob Day. Bassett went into the break with the score deadlocked but looking the team who were most likely to score.

Bassett started off the second half where they had left off and took the lead in the 51st minute when a great Steve Hale kick put Danny Clayton into the clear and Clayton fired home from inside the Wantage area.



A minute later Wantage had Chris Roche, the same player who had fouled Paul Patel, booked for a foul on Stu Hemsley, Patels replacement.

Bassett had another good chance in the 54th minute when an excellent Mark Vaughan (pictured) ball put Nick Tooley through clear of the Wantage defence but the Wantage keeper came and collected the ball from under Tooleys feet. The Wantage keeper was again called into action moments later, making a brilliant save from a Gary Ashford shot following another good Mark Vaughan ball.

Allan Pluckrose had a good chance in the 67th minute when he headed just over from a Mark Simpkins free kick. Bassett made their second substitution five minutes later bringing Ben Gascoyne on for Rob Day.

Danny Clayton had another good chance for Bassett when his shot was again saved by the Wantage keeper, the busiest player on the pitch, following good work by Ben Gascoyne; three minutes later Nick Tooley hit over after taking the ball around four players.

Wantage had another player booked a couple of minutes later for starting a mini scuffle with Bassetts Mark Vaughan, Wantage then made a double substitution to try and salvage a goal.

They nearly got one when Steve Hale parried a good shot and the rebound was blocked and cleared to safety.

Bassett made their final change in the 83rd minute when Dave Jones was brought on for Mark Simpkins.

Wantage had a last chance effort a minute from time, but thankfully nothing came of it much to the relief of the Bassett followers as anything less than three points would have been a travesty. Bassett had gained three vital points just before Christmas and will be looking to make it six points from two games when they travel to Shortwood United on December 28th.

Managers Man of the Match: Mark Simpkins, he got better as the game went on.

Scoops Man of the Match: Allan Pluckrose, a solid game at the back for the Bassett centre-back.

Scoop Rating: 8/10, A great team performance which ensured Bassett got all three points.

they were certainly to be entertained, as Yeardleys outfit took the game to extra time before triumphing. The Monday 24th September 2001 edition of the Advertiser carried the following report of the game, under the headline, *Vaughan is on the Mark for Bassett*:

Wootton Bassett are through to the first round of the FA Vase after beating local rivals Calne Town 3-2 after extra time. [We needed that,] said a relieved Bassett manager Peter Yeardley. [It was a superb all round performance, the lads stuck to their task and got their reward. It was nice to win our first game in the Vase and let's hope we can start playing like that in the league and pick up a few more good results.] Visitors Calne Town had the better of the opening exchanges and took the lead on 32 minutes when they were awarded a penalty after a push in the box. Shaun Terry tucked the spot kick away past keeper Richard Stevens. Gradually the home side came more into the game and Gareth Walsh found the net on 40 minutes but the effort was disallowed. On the run-up to the interval things began to get heated and the referee was forced to disperse half a dozen yellow cards between the two sides. Calne almost scored a second at the start of the second half, Stevens making a great save from Craig Buck, and at the other end Jeremy Newton went close with a good effort. On 64 minutes Bassett at last drew level when Mark Vaughan was brought down and Mark Simpkins' free kick found Newton, who drove a low shot into the net. Bassett then began to get on top and Calne keeper Daryl Simms made several good saves to ensure the tie went into extra time. However the keeper was unable to stop a header from Vaughan entering the net five minutes after the start of extra time to give the home side the lead. Calne fought back and equalised ten minutes later, Matt Peters getting on the end of a free kick by Andy Power. In the second period play switched frantically from end to end and on 109 minutes a good through ball by Chris O'Connell found Vaughan who ran through to shot past Sims for the winner. Calne manager and former Bassett keeper Steven Hale said: [For some reason we stopped playing midway through the first half and a couple of defensive mistakes gave away the goals. Bassett ran the second half and deserve credit for their win. I wish them all the best in the next round.]

The Vase win seemed to be the perfect tonic for Bassett. It was quickly followed by three points in the league as the team finally arrested their woeful form, with goals from Vaughan and talismanic winger Jeremy Newton securing a 2-0 win at Cheltenham Saracens. The second month of the campaign then finished with progress in another cup competition, with unbeaten Bristol-based Division One side Winterbourne United, who took the lead, being dispatched by three goals to one in the Challenge Cup. Dave Turners solitary goal in the 89th minute made all the difference against Bicester Town before one of the upsets of the season to date came with the visit of previously unbeaten Didcot Town to Rylands Way. Towering defender Stuart Lamont was the key performer on the evening, netting a brace, whilst ample assistance was supplied by both Walsh and Mark Simpkins as the hosts triumphed 4-2 to leave the Railwaymen stunned.

Hydes early goal against high-flyers Brackley Town gave thoughts of another unexpected home result, but two vital mistakes from inexperienced stand-in keeper Darren Curtis meant at least a point went begging, allowing the Northamptonshire side to win 3-1. That defeat marked the beginning of another poor patch of form, with elimination from the FA Vase following a week later against Cornish visitors St. Blazey. Bassett put in an admirable performance against the South West Peninsula League outfit, who brought with them a jovial bunch of supporters. Reporting on the match for the Evening Advertiser, Ray Burroughs wrote for the Monday 22nd October 2001 edition:

Wootton Bassetts hopes of an extended FA Vase run were dashed by Cornish visitors St Blazey who scored two late goals to defeat the Hellenic Premier side 2-0. Bassett almost took a surprise lead after three minutes, Justin Hyde just failing to get a final touch. Home keeper Richard Stevens kept his side in the game making a great save from a well taken free-kick. As half-time approached a quick break by the home side saw Mark Simpkins thread a good through ball for Mark Vaughan who shot just wide of the post. Bassett started the second half well, forcing a couple of quick corners, but they were well cleared by the Cornish defence who switched to the attack and Harrington scraped the bar with good effort and Stevens made a brilliant close range save from Hooper. The home side missed a glorious chance to take the lead on the hour when Paul O'Connell found himself with only the keeper to beat but shot wide. With just 10 minutes remaining St Blazey took the lead their top marksman Dominic Richardson forcing the ball over the line from a corner. Bassett defender Phil Penning thought he had cleared the ball but the linesman decided that the ball had crossed the line. Three minutes later the visitors made sure of victory by adding a second from Nigel Pugh.

The hangover from this loss lingered, with a 3-0 thrashing at the hands of Cirencester Academy four days later and a 9-2 thumping, at home, against Yate in the Challenge Cup to make it four consecutive defeats. Fortunately Bassett bounced back, beating Wessex League Bemerton Heath Harlequins at home courtesy of a first goal for the club from Geoff Swatton in the opening round of the Wiltshire Premier Shield. It was the first and only time the club had taken part in this competition, which at this stage featured all county clubs from what was then step four of the non-league pyramid upwards, with Swindon Town also participating.

November then began with the visit of second placed North Leigh, who were given an extremely tough time, only prevailing thanks to a controversial goal that was scored directly from a free kick even though the referee had signalled it indirect. Three days later, nothing separated Bassett and Tuffley once again, with goals from Swatton and Richard Merchant being cancelled out by the visitors, thus splitting the points. The games continued to come thick and fast, with the trip to Almondsbury Town being switched to a Friday night. And the journey to Bristol was to be a fruitful one as Merchant and classy midfielder Tony Macek both scored in a 2-0 win. Another draw followed, this time against Abingdon United at Rylands Way, Simpkins from the spot and Paul O'Connell nothing for the hosts. It should really have been all three points though given Bassett had jumped into a two goal lead. Carterton Town were next to be held in a goalless draw that saw both teams have shots cleared off the line.

Season 2001-02 Too Close

What was going on in the world

The season kicked off with Atomic Kitten at number one in the charts with Eternal Flame and ended with Oasis at the top of the pile with Hindu Times. Apple announces the invention of their new music device called the I-Pod. The 11th of September sees Islamic terrorists fly aeroplanes into the World Trade Center in New York and also crash planes with intended targets in Washington. Thierry Henry fires the goals which take Arsenal to the Premiership championship, finishing seven points ahead of Liverpool. Arsenal then go onto to do the double by defeating Chelsea 2-0 in the FA Cup Final. Swindon Town finish in 13th place in the third tier of English football.

The summer of 2001 was one of stark change at Wootton Bassett Town, with numerous players following former manager Barry Giles out of Rylands Way. Free scoring Lee Stoddart was undoubtedly the biggest loss, but also gone were defenders Paul Davis and Lee Marshall and midfielders Paul Harper and Mick Goodwin. With the newly installed Pete Yeardley, who a season before had led the reserves, alongside Paul Burke, to the Hellenic League Reserve Division Two title whilst going unbeaten, forced to rebuild, it was unsurprising that clubs ambitions, but for one person, were scaled back, as the season preview published by the Evening Advertiser under the headline, *Bassett forced to rebuild after summer exodus* on Friday August 17th highlighted:

Top of the bottom three will suit us fine, says one Wootton Bassett supporter only half joking. Wootton Bassett secured a noteworthy 13th position in their top-flight debut in the Hellenic League last season. However, the summer has seen a mass exodus of players and management alike, causing an air of defeatism to descend on the supporters watching a low-key pre-season friendly. Bassett went on to lose the game but only just and to strong opposition in Western League outfit Devizes Town. The performance is enough to give new manager Pete Yeardley cause for optimism. He said: "We've made an encouraging start. Mick Byrne (assistant manager) and myself have trained the boys really hard over the last five weeks, and it shows. The fitness levels are excellent. Yeardley, who controlled last seasons unbeaten reserve team, has stepped up to replace former boss Barry Giles, who decided to step down at the end of last season. Giles departure opened the flood gates and the majority of the first team followed him out of the door. Yeardley, aided by assistant Mick Byrne, has reassembled the squad, bringing in talented lower league players, and offering some of last seasons all- conquering reserve side the chance to prove themselves in the first team. "We know the Wiltshire football scene well, so we targeted players who are young and receptive to coaching," said Yeardley. Nurturing gifted youngsters is the overriding theme at the club, with players aged six to 18 representing Bassett. "The youth set-up here is fantastic," said Yeardley. "We have good young teams in all age groups. It's the clubs foundation." New commercial manager Ken Locke is infectiously enthusiastic about Bassett's future. He said: "Without doubt, this club is going places. I aim to boost income and supply the club with improved facilities, like a team coach and player tracksuits. I want to fill pitchside advertising, and my objective is to raise £25,000 for the club this year." While others at the club remain cautiously optimistic about the new season, Locke predicts a highly successful campaign. "I believe we'll finish in the top three this season. We want to move up a further division, and I think once everything is in place, it will take us two years to get promoted." For the first time in their history, Bassett will also compete in the FA Vase. Manager Yeardley hopes that a good run will boost local interest: "We have a new squad which will need time to develop. I would be happy with a solid mid-table finish to match last season, but we will certainly aim to progress in future years." Bassett begin their campaign with a visit to Premier Division newcomers Bishops Cleeve."

With just one loss from the opening four games, the new boss certainly made a promising start. From the off it was obvious who Bassett would have to rely on for their goals though, with newly signed midfielders Mark Vaughan and CJ O'Connell both finding the net as their side twice came from behind to earn a point at Bishops Cleeve. O'Connell was on target again a few days later, his strike earning a point at Tuffley Rovers, before a Vaughan pair helped see of Harrow Hill by the odd goal in three in the first home match of the season. He notched his fourth away against Shortwood United, but this was not enough as Bassett, reduced to ten men following Justin Hydes dismissal, fell to their first defeat by a 2-1 margin. What was frustrating for Yeardley was the fact that both would end up missing significant parts of the season, but for altogether different reasons. In the case of Vaughan, it was his knack for picking up suspensions that would limit his availability. However in O'Connell's case, he was the victim of a horrific car crash early in September that would endanger his life. Thankfully, he recovered and he made an inspirational comeback with Bassett just over eighteen months later.

If August had offered hope, the September offered Bassett a reality check as the defeats began to pile up. The month started well, with a come from behind 3-1 triumph against Hook Norton, albeit in the Preliminary Round of the Challenge Cup. It could have been worse too had Rich Stevens not kept out a penalty with the hosts trailing. Vaughan ultimately levelled to force extra time, during which Garth Walsh and Hyde secured victory. Following a home defeat by the narrowest of margins against big spending Gloucester United, a Vaughan goal put Bassett in control away at Wantage Town. However, following a Phil Penning own goal on the hour, Yeardleys side capitulated and went on to lose the match 3-1. After defeat in the Floodlit Cup at the first hurdle against Tuffley, Bassett again lost 3-1 after taking the lead, this time away to Yate Town. A fifth consecutive league loss followed when newly promoted Henley Town stole a 1-0 win in a dire contest at Rylands Way.

Things therefore did not bode well for the team going into their next match, which was to be a historic one for the club, their inaugural FA Vase tie against near neighbours Calne Town. Not since the 1964/65 campaign had Bassett competed in a national competition, and the excitement level at the club was unsurprisingly palpable. Adding further spice to the tie was the fact the Calne team, joint managed by former Bassett keeper Steve Hale, included a number of players familiar to the Rylands Way club, namely keeper Darvl Simms, defender Paul Davis and forward Shaun Terrv. The match drew a healthy three figure crowd, and

Hat-Trick Hero Green Carries Bassett Past the Winning Post

Rylands Way, 12th April 2011

This time last week, Wootton Bassett Town were fighting for their Hellenic Premier Division lives. Now though they are sitting comfortably in 14th place as an Alex Green hat-trick paved the way for a come from behind 3-2 victory against Ascot United, meaning Dave Turners side have taken seven points from nine.

Green struck the winner with virtually the last kick of the game, lobbing an advancing Chris Grace from fifteen yards with a weighted effort after a perfectly placed through ball from youngster Adam Topping, who once again impressed off the bench. Although somewhat inconsistent during the year, the former Shrivenham front man gave a clinic in assured finishing, with all three of his goals being expertly taken. He would no doubt have applauded Ian Brooks opener for the visitors ten minutes in though. A looping cross from the left was not dealt with properly as Ethan Delaney, having missed a one-on-one opportunity at the other end moments earlier, failed to clear his lines. Brooks, ready to pounce on the edge of the area, then struck a searing volley, demonstrating perfect technique, into the top left corner past a despairing Stewart Thompson. The scores were then levelled midway through the period. Emphasising how far they have come this season, Bassett patiently built an attack, and after a neat set from Sam Collier, Richie Carter provided an inch perfect pass into the feet of Green from near halfway. Controlled brilliantly, the forward turned his marker on the edge of the box and with his next touch tucked the ball past Grace into the bottom right corner. Parity would last all of two minutes though. Brooks was again involved, this time acting as provider. His whipped in corner, placed dangerously underneath the crossbar, was fumbled by Thompson and Jessie Wilson was quickest to react, sweeping home the loose ball from close range. With quarter of an hour to go before the break, a jinking run from Delaney opened up the Ascot defence, and after his low cross was sliced, Green should really have equalised again. But he would make his only mistake of the match, somehow snatching at the ball and hacking it wide from eight yards. Moments before the half time whistle, Ascot were unfortunate not to have a third when their leading scorer Jon Bennett muscled his way past three defenders before shooting low from ten yards, but Thompson was able to redeem himself for his earlier error and made an assured save on the dive.

It would be all Bassett following the restart, the visitors no doubt with one eye on their Floodlit Cup semi final encounter with Abingdon on Thursday. However their second half defensive performance left a lot to be desired as Bassett controlled play and opened their visitors up with ease. The shrewd introduction of forward Topping for veteran defender Mark McMeeking tilted the games balance firmly in favour of the hosts. But it took them time to get back on level terms once again as both Matt Bown and Delaney came agonisingly close. Then, with eighteen minutes left, expert hold up play for Collier and a weighted ball into the right channel set Green, having beaten the offside trap, loose. And after bearing down on goal, he coolly slotted beneath Grace at his near post. Pressure continued to be applied, but Ascot appeared as though they were set to see it off and make the long journey home with a point in the bag. Indeed, Bassetts luck seemed to have deserted them when a dangerous low Delaney cross, needing just a touch to guide it home, sailed across the face of goal and out of play. But from nothing, Turners troops found a winner with seconds remaining. Jon Beedens clearance out of defence was controlled fantastically by Topping, and after holding off his marker he clipped the ball in for Green, having again breached a shaky offside trap, to provide the finishing touch. It was no less than Bassett deserved, and will give them extra confidence ahead of Saturdays visit of title chasers Wantage Town. Victory would severely dent the Alfredians title chances and mean Bassett would join the company of Slimbridge and Highworth Town as the only teams to do the league double over them this season.

Scoops Man of the Match: Alex Green , in an impressive team display, Jon Beeden, Matt Bown and Matt Boucher all stood out, but Green topped the lot, producing three quality finishes to seal three well earned points.

Scoop Rating: 8/10, chances for the visitors were few and far between, especially in the second period, which Bassett controlled. Although the two goals conceded came in disappointing fashion, those isolated incidents aside, this was a great performance. The team again showed their character to twice come from behind before going on to win and deservedly shot up the table as a result.



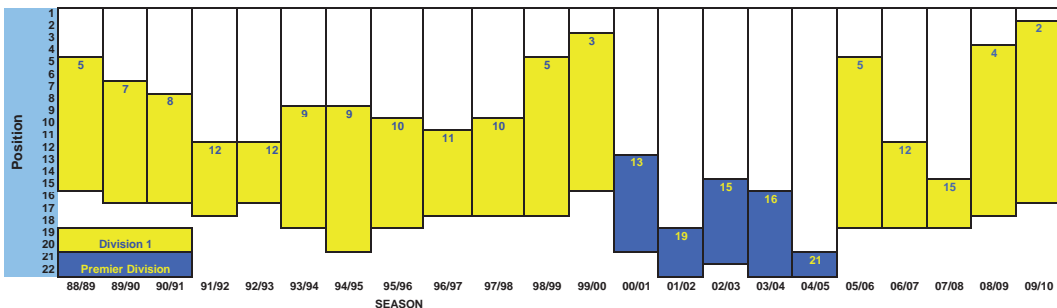

The result means we are nine points clear of our nearest rivals and two wins out of the next four will secure the first ever title for the club at this level.

As you know we have reached the final of the Wilts County Youth Cup and although we will be up against a strong New College side we are very much on course for a historic double and your support will be vital in helping us to try and achieve this.
