EDITORIAL

For Pegasus Juniors this will be their last fixture in the Hellenic Premier League after 12 consecutive seasons in the top flight. They then went onto secure the title following a 2-1 win at home against Ardley United. On Tuesday we went down to two second half goals at Abingdon Town and then Thursday we were humiliated at Binfield who are chasing second place, going down to our heaviest defeat of the season. Normally I would have gone to this one being just up the road from Binfield and was perhaps glad that I was on a flight back from South Africa when we were shipping in those seven goals. The programme for today's game has had to go to the printers ahead of the game against Flackwell Heath but hopefully by the time you read these notes we will have got back to winning ways and have some more points on the board.

Unfortunately the Under 18s did not make history by winning the Wilts County Youth Cup for the first time, going down 4-1 to a very good New College side. Hopefully they will have the consolation of the Wilts Floodlit League title and can go one better next season in the County Cup when most of this season's side will still be available.

It is at this time of year that it is appropriate to say a few thank yous. On behalf of the Club I would like to thank all the supporters for their attendance at games this season, we hope you have enjoyed the return to the Premier League and the higher standard of football. A big thank you also to the Club sponsors and in particular Cats Solutions for the sponsorship of this programme and also the Clubs six-a-side and Holland programmes. 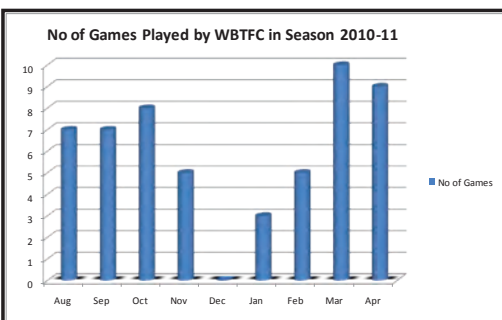


WORLD OF FOOTBALL

this week, former Chairman Mark Smedley

After a week away in South Africa, having flown back overnight, I started the programme for this game at 6.30 am this morning knowing it had to be at the printers today (Friday) so that it could be picked up on Saturday because of the holiday weekend. I had set a deadline for contributions by Friday morning and other than the ever reliable Dave Turner the email inbox waswell empty. No sign of the latest version of Touchline (the last edition having been published back in December) or contributions from the Club ahead of the print deadline I had set. I wondered what I can include in the last edition of the programme for the World of Soccer feature. In the good old days the Chairman of WBTF used to thank everybody in the last programme of the season for all their effort over the season but I had already received the usual too busy email from the Chairman. Rod, Roger, Chris, Pete, Steve, Andy et al I guess you will just have to make do with a verbal thank you this season at the End of Season do.

With a page to fill I thought I would make use some trivia. At the same time it was an opportunity to nip in the bud some incorrect negative feedback from Sam Collier regarding a lack of front cover exposure for our top striker this season! The stats do not lie young Sam, as once again you are the top cover guy this season along with Matty Bown, with both featuring 4 times out of 27 programmes. Ethan Delaney, Alex Green, Tom Dingle and Shaun Carter all featured twice; there were also two covers that featured a group of players. So Sam not only are you the top striker once again but also the top cover guy (although you have to share the honour with Matty this season). The second bit of trivia that might be of interest is the number of games played each month throughout the season. I was prompted to look at this following Scoops comments in his Binfield match round-up on the website where he quoted 19 games since the 1st of March!



In total 54 games will have played in Season 2010-11 and the graph to the left shows where the problem lies. Whilst some of those on the mass debating forum that is the Hellenic League Chat often blame the league for not scheduling fixtures at the start of the season the graph illustrates that this is not true as 7 or 8 games were played in the first 3 months of the season. The

problem really lies with the bad weather in November through to February and Cup replays. The snow came early this season (in November) and this, along with those FA Cup replays in those first few months is the real reason why the First Team had to play 10 and 9 games respectively in the last two months of the season.

The final piece of trivia relates to players christian names. I thought it would be interesting to look at the meaning of the names of some of our First Team players to see how apt they were. Interestingly there was certainly some traits consistent with the name meanings. Starting in goal, the name Stewart has the meaning of sty guardian and knowing how muddy those goal mouths can get at Rylands his mum and dad clearly knew he was destined to be between the sticks at Bassett in later life. Defender Liam will be interested to know his name means determined guardian, and he has certainly been that all season and in my opinion our most consistent defender. Sam has the meaning of Gods word and only God and one other person knows how Sam was given that penalty against Witney! Ethan means firm, strong and that is a good summary of, in my opinion, our most skilful player on the ball. Matt and Shaun both mean gods gift (to what is not specified so the players with these names can choose something they like most). OPPONENTS HISTORY

Pegasus Juniors FC • Club History

. . . in 1955 when Noel Watkin was in charge of the Herefordshire County Boys. That season they played seventeen, won ten and drew four, there was something about the side, they were a delight to work with and had a great team bond, so when the County fixtures were through, the team asked if they could stay together as a youth side . . . and Pegasus Juniors were born !

They were christened by Ted Woodriffe who took the name from the seniors amateur side of the era Pegasus, containing selection of Oxford and Cambridge Undergraduates. Coached by Vic Buckingham who later himself went on to win a FA Cup medal with West Bromwich Albion.

The team were renowned for their fair play and boasted a record of not gaining any red or yellow cards . . . they were an example to follow.

Pegasus grew from strength to strength and travelled Europe playing against the best teams in Belgium including Royal F.C. Bruges, many famous names graced Pegasus as Vice Presidents reading more like a programme from the Palladium - Norman Wisdom, Frankie Vaughan, Petula Clark, Dave King, and Alma Cogan, they all took great interest in the success of the club.



The club bond was a magical thing, it brought many different communities together, everyone worked for their neighbour and this was reflected in the field of play. Pegasus played and won many big fixtures, however one game that Pegasus lost was to Aston Villa due to an on form Ron Atkinson who netted 6 goals that day !

It was inevitable that players would move on to higher grades of football and many did that with distinction. Noel himself finally left after eight years and moved to the Isle of Wight, however Pegasus Juniors original members Jack Perks and Bob Pasley remained, they proudly gained membership into the Hellenic League and established a club house in Hereford. Pegasus Juniors were formed because a squad of players wanted to develop together and believed that they could be successful. There was such an affinity to play for the club, players would travel miles just to wear the shirt.

The original team were not only successful but won respect on and off the pitch, the teams belief came from their strong friendships and passion for football, this brought the community together.

 Signed from the successful Ledbury Town team who won the County Cup last season. Looking to step up to this level.



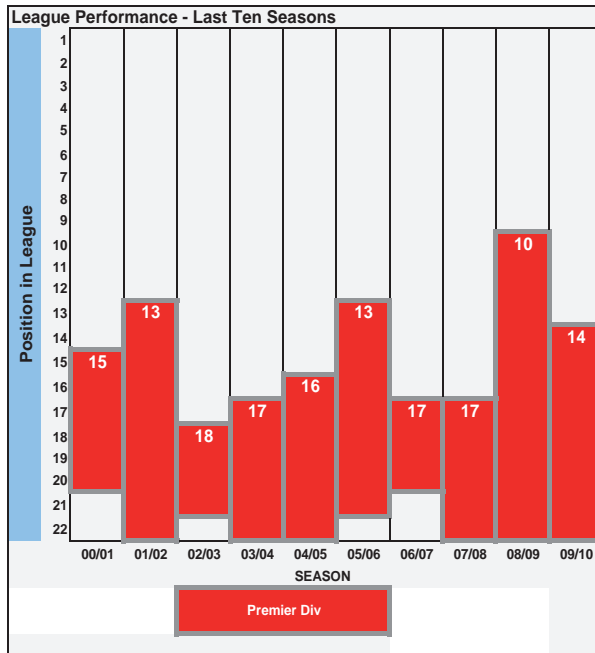
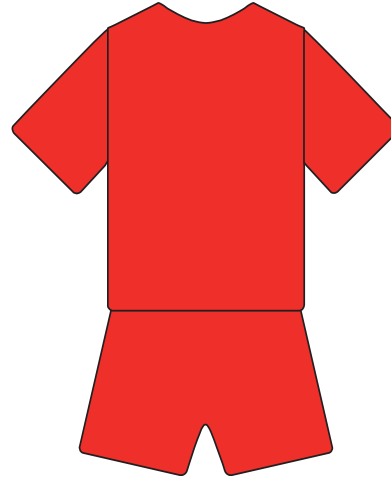
Tom Harding Forward

make the switch to Fairford Town bringing an end to what had been a fantastic five years at Rylands Way. And the prolific striker would certainly be missed.

Success during the 2000/01 campaign was not just limited to the first team, as the Reserves, led jointly by Pete Yeardeley and Paul Burke, totally dominated Reserve Division Two West, winning the title by a clear nine points from Almondsbury Town. Most impressively they finished the season undefeated, dropping a mere twelve points all season. Their season began with an early September trip to Quarry Nomads and there they were winners by the smallest of margins thanks to Syd Jackson before goals from Simon Edwards and Jack Dodd secured a 2-1 home win over Easington Sports. The perfect start continued with a 4-0 hammering of Clanfield at Rylands Way, as Edwards led the way with a brace.

The first points of the season were dropped in a tricky away fixture against Old Woodstock Town, who held Basset to a 2-2 draw thanks to an equaliser deep into stoppage time. It was back to winning way at home to Letcombe as three goals without reply secured a convincing victory. However, this was followed by a 2-2 home draw with Almondsbury. On a soaking day at Middle Barton, there was a return to winning ways as Martin Cooper grabbed the only goal of the game. They could not seal the double over Quarry Nomads though, with the Oxford based visitors, who included a handful of first team players, snatched a point after Jackson's fifth of the year had earlier given Basset the lead. Nine man Brackley Town were then put to the sword in a 5-0 thrashing, which featured goals from five different players, before Kidlington were disposed of by the odd goal in three courtesy of strikes from Steve Howse and Justin Hyde. However, things remained tight at the top, with two points separating Basset from third place with Old Woodstock. An easy looking away fixture against Wantage Town, who Basset had earlier knocked out of the Anagram Records Reserve Cup by an aggregate score, came next but despite plenty of chances the deadlock was never broken.

Confidence was not dented by what appeared to be a poor result though, as Basset went on a lengthy winning streak. This began at Clanfield where goals from Jackson and Hyde secured a narrow 2-1 victory before Middle Barton were hammered 4-1 at Rylands Way, with an Edwards hat-trick doing most of the damage. A lengthy away trip to Brackley saw Basset return with all three points, courtesy of Jackson and Hyde strikes, as well as a clean sheet. And a convincing 5-2 win over Old Woodstock pushed the Reserves eleven points clear at the top by the end of February. The odd goal in five was enough to secure three points at Milton United before a solitary Hyde strike separated Basset and hosts Kidlington. Despite trailing 4-2 with minutes remaining, Basset were then able to see off Division One Highworth Town 5-4 after extra time in the cup, before Easington were beaten 2-1 to increase the gap at the top to 14 points; at that point only fourth placed Almondsbury could catch Basset, meaning the title was very much in the bag.

The foot was not taken off the gas though, and Basset remained unbeaten to finish the season, drawing two out of their final four. Goalscoring exploits aside, it was Basset's stingy defence, a unit that conceded just 14 times throughout that year, that ultimately ensured a zero remained in the sides loss column. This was demonstrated in the final game of the season at Letcombe, where a fine performance from keeper Jason Hillier made sure the score remained unchanged come full time.

was headed into the net Paul Davis to give Bassett the lead and further goals in the second period from Stoddart and Jon Davis ensured the Hellenic Premier side a place in the semi finals.

January then concluded with a 2-0 home win against Wantage courtesy of goals from defender Paul Davis and the ever reliable Stoddart, who was certainly turning heads in his first season playing at such a level.

February would not be such a happy month however. Following consecutive home draws against Fairford (0-0) and fourth placed Brackley (1-1), the first loss of the New Year came against frontrunners Swindon Supermarine, who prevailed at home by the odd goal in three. Struggling Harrow Hill then held Bassett to a 0-0 draw before Shortwood won at Rylands Way by the odd goal in three.

March then got off on a terrible note, with a 4-1 reverse at Cirencester Academy. A 3-0 home win over Cheltenham Saracens, courtesy of Harper and Jon Davis penalties and a further strike from Newton arrested the decline, but home defeats soon came against Tuffley (2-3) and Supermarine (0-1) as Bassett slipped into eleventh. By now most clubs were suffering from a severe fixture backlog thanks to the appalling weather, and the level of crisis was highlighted in a report in the Advertiser published on March 26th, prior to those two defeats:

Clubs have been invited to make themselves available to play on Good Friday April 13 and the possibility of playing two matches in one match day. First team followed by reserve match or vice versa, has been offered to assist clubs with a serious fixture backlog. Under Football Association rules double header games may be allowed. The matches would have to be of 80 minutes duration each, an example could be game one kicks off at 2pm, the same clubs could then play game two at 4pm. All these points are subject to review depending on weather and possible further fixture postponements.

That meant the games were to come thick and fast. Initially this seemed to buoy Bassett on as they secured a 3-1 home win against Bicester Town, with Stoddart scoring yet another brace, and a 1-0 away win at Pegasus courtesy of Turner. Furthermore, a place in the final of the Senior Cup was sealed with another extra time win, this time against County League Cricklade Town, then managed by Alan Clark, in a match played at Highworth Town. An early own goal put Bassett ahead, however Cricklade equalised deep into injury time. In the first period of extra time, however, Goodwin found the winner to send his side to the final for the second time in three seasons. Then came another big win, this time against North Leigh, who were riding high in the league, as described in the Monday April 23rd edition of the Advertiser:

Wootton Bassett, who have been having a quiet spell of late in the Premier Section, sprang back to life with a 1-0 victory over North Leigh. After an excellent start to their first season, Bassett dropped into the lower half of the table, but the victory over Cricklade in the semi final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup and the win over North Leigh will have given the club a boost before they contest the Wiltshire Senior Cup final against Shrewton United from the Wiltshire League. Bassett had four regulars missing, but dug in and fought well in a goal-less first half in which neither keeper was troubled and most of the action took place in midfield. For Bassett, Lee Marshall and Paul Harper kept a stranglehold on the North Leigh front runners.

After the break honours remained even once again until the 82nd minute, when a good move down the right saw North Leigh concede a corner. Jeremy Newton swung the corner into the six yard box, and in the scramble the ball ran free for Steve Howse who rifled the ball through a crowded goalmouth and into the net, much to the delight of the Bassett faithful. In the closing stages, North Leigh pushed forward in search of an equaliser but the well marshalled Bassett defence stood firm to chalk up three points and move them up the table to 12th spot.

After a disappointing 3-1 reverse at home against Cirencester, two goals from Justin Hyde, a player who had only recently been called up from the Reserves, earned all three points against Carterton at Rylands Way. Two days prior to the County Cup final, high flying Yate were held to a 1-1 draw courtesy of a Lee Stoddart strike in the final home match of the season. And their good run of form continued against County League Shrewton United in the showpiece, staged at The Conigre as Bassett tasted success in the oldest knockout contest in Wiltshire for only the second time. The Saturday May 5th 2001 edition of the Evening Advertiser carried the following roundup of the match:

A goal from Lee Stoddart after seven minutes and a penalty from Paul Harper three minutes later gave Wootton Bassett a Wilts Senior Cup Final victory over Shrewton United by 2-0. Shrewton tried hard to get on terms in the second half but the woodwork and some excellent keeping by Richard Stevens prevented them from scoring.

It would wind up being a fitting parting gift from Barry Giles whose successful, albeit brief, spell would come to an end at the culmination of the season, which finished with a pair of losses to Brackley and North Leigh and a 3-1 win at Bicester. Furthermore, it would be the last hurrah for Lee Stoddart, who would finish the season with 25 goals, twenty of which came in the league, meaning he finished as one of the top scorers in the division. In the summer he would

Bassett Sneak In Late Goal to Get Score Draw at Home to Pegasus

An injury time equaliser from September Player of the Month Nathan Hall denied opponents Pegasus Juniors all three points in a close fought battle after Bassett had gone 2-0 down early in the second half. With Bassett looking to pick up vital points to move up the table they needed goals, something which there have been very few of in the last couple of weeks. With Bassett needing to take their chances totally the opposite happened in the first half on Saturday. Stu Lamont in the fourth minute came close with a shot but Kyle Weaving in the Pesagus goal easily held it. Neil Hotchkiss had a decent chance for Pegasus in the eighth minute but he shot wide past Steve Hale in the Bassett goal. Bassett gained back the initiative having three decent chances in succession □ Justin Hyde shot wide after a scintillating run starting on the half way line; Allan Pluckrose then headed into the back of the net from a Mike Simpkins corner only for it to be disallowed for pushing in the Pegasus box, and a minute later, Justin Hyde put in a decent cross which was not connected with. Stu Lamont had another chance, which went just wide in the 23rd minute when he headed a Mark Simpkins corner over. Bassett should really have been in the lead by now as Pegasus defending was somewhat criminal at times. Paul Garbutt had a good chance for Bassett in the 23rd minute when he struck just wide. At the other end, Neil Hotchkiss had another good chance for Pegasus in the 31st minute when his shot was spilled by Hale in goal but luckily Haler picked it back up. Joe Wright came close for Pegasus again in the 33rd minute before Bassett had four great opportunities to score before the break □ the best falling to Nick Tooley whose shot hit the post after he was one-on-one with keeper Weaving. 0-0 at the break was very disappointing for Bassett who had had a good half but just could not take their chances.

The second half started well for Bassett with two easy chances, one for Nick Tooley and one for veteran Allan Pluckrose, who hit the post after he connected with a great Mark Simpkins corner. Rob Hopkins pulled up injured in the 50th minute and he was replaced with youngster Paul Carson. Totally against the run of play, Pegasus broke the deadlock in the 58th minute when Gavin Stone hit home from 20 yards past a diving Steve Hale. It went from bad to worse when Pegasus went two goals to the good in the 63rd minute, when Stone scored his second beating Steve Hale, who was not anticipating a good through ball which Stone latched onto to score. Bassett started to pile the pressure onto Pegasus as Stu Lamont had a good header saved by Weaving after a great Paul Carson cross. Neil Bridges was brought on for Luke Sharps in the 67th minute to add an extra striker. Bassett made their final change six minutes later when Dave Jones was rested and player of the month Nathan Hall was put on in his place. Bassett started to get the initiative and in the 87th minute Stu Lamont's shot was deflected in to make it 2-1 to Pegasus. Deep into injury time Bassett had a lot of good chances and they were given hope of a goal after Leigh Stevens was sent off for Pegasus for pulling Neil Bridges shirt when Bridges was likely to grab his first goal of the season. The resulting free kick led to a corner. Nathan Hall scored the equaliser from the resulting corner, when a goalmouth melee let the ball fall to Hall who blasted home to make it 2-2. Bassett had got a welcome point after a great late second half performance to grab two goals in the space of five minutes.

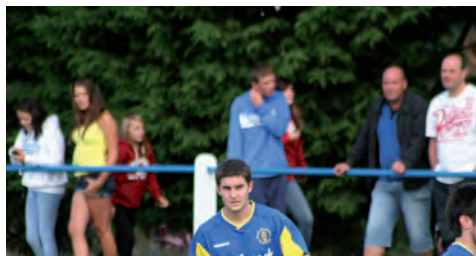

the break. John Bowdler took a free-kick from outside the box and his powerful shot flashed past home keeper Richard Stevens.

Four minutes after the re-start Bassett regained the lead when a good move out of defence involving Lee Marshall and Richard Merchant enabled Lee Stoddart to drill into the bottom left hand corner of the net. On the hour another good move involving several Bassett players was finished off once again by Stoddart, his powerful drive giving French no chance. Harrow received a further blow midway through the half when they lost influential defender Martin Read, sent-off for a second bookable offence. From then on Richard Stevens in the Bassett goal was hardly bothered. His side took control of the game and six minutes from time Stoddart completed his hat-trick latching onto a through ball from sub Ben Parsons to score from an acute angle. It was the striker's fifth goal in the last two games.

That result was followed with an impressive point at home against Didcot Town in a goalless draw. The trick was then repeated when Bassett visited Yate Town and shocked the recently relegated Southern League side by thrashing them 4-0, defender Lee Marshall completing the scoring. Four days later though came another crushing loss to Highworth in the reverse fixture at the Elms. Paul Harper found the net for Bassett, but the defence shipped four in a lopsided loss. Cirencester Academy were then to eliminate Bassett from the league Challenge Cup, winning 2-0 at Rylands Way with a certain Shaun Terry scoring one of the goals for the Centurions.

Giles team would then go unbeaten in three games during October. Jeremy Newton scored twice in a 2-1 home win against Abingdon United, popping up in the 83rd minute to grab the winner. A fine point was earned at Almondsbury courtesy of goals from Harper and a first for Nathan Hall. The double was then completed against Milton thanks to a solitary Hall strike, which lifted Bassett into the heady heights of the sixth to finish the month.

The teams fine form continued into the penultimate month of the calendar year, although things did not look as though they would begin well when Bassett found themselves 3-1 down at home against Pegasus Juniors midway through the second half. Further compounding the situation was the fact keeper Rich Stevens had been sent off, with defender Jason Edwards replacing him between the sticks. Undeterred though, Giles team fought back, securing the win thanks to late strikes from Mick Goodwin, Paul Davis and Stoddart, who fired home the winner with nine minutes remaining; Harper had earlier found the back of the net from the penalty spot. It was then onto the Wiltshire Senior Cup, the last remaining knockout competition of the year for Bassett after their elimination from both league competitions. And things got off to a fine start against Amesbury Town as Ray Burroughs summarised in the Tuesday November 21st 2000 edition of the Evening Advertiser:

Wootton Bassett booked a place in the second round after a comfortable 6-0 victory over Hampshire League side Amesbury Town. In a scrappy first 45 minutes Lee Stoddart finally gave Bassett the lead ten minutes before the break. The half-time cuppa then worked wonders for the home side who completely dominated the second half and added five more goals courtesy of Richard Merchant, Lee Marshall, Micky Goodwin and Nathan Hall (2), the latter spoiling a good performance by being sent off in the last five minutes.

The unpredictable weather meant it would not be until the middle of the next month that the team took to the field again, and when they did they showed signs of rust. Trailing bottom side Wantage Town by a goal at the break, Bassett contrived to concede two more at the beginning of the second period. Stoddart managed to peg the hosts back with a brace, but it was not to be. Amends were made in the final game of 2000, where a Hall strike earned a point at Carterton Town to ensure Bassett started the New Year in an impressive sixth.

Stoddart hit a pair of goals either side of half time to seal the points in a come from behind win at Abingdon to complete the double over the Oxfordshire side, before Lee Marshall equalised with quarter of an hour left to snatch a point at Tuffley Rovers. Another draw followed, with Didcot once again being frustrated and unable to score before the Senior Cup quarter final at near neighbours Purton. Bassett's Hellenic League Division One opponents proved more than a handful, and only after extra time did Giles team ensure progression to the semi finals for the third consecutive year. The Monday January 28th 2001 edition of the Evening Advertiser reported on the match as follows:

Wootton Bassett reached the semi-final of the Wilts Senior Cup with a 4-1 win over local rivals Purton after extra time. In a lively opening to the game, the two sides created several openings and there were goal-line clearances at both ends, Watkins and Wright missing early chances for Purton. On 24 minutes, Purton took the lead when a good free kick from Micky Heath was hoisted into the box and Courtney Chessell was on hand to head the ball into the net. For the rest of the half, honours remained fairly even. After the break, Bassett began to get on top and gained a deserved equaliser on the hour when Purton keeper Luke Alford could only fist away a goal-bound effort. The ball fell to Bassett's top marksman Lee Stoddart who made no mistake from close range. Bassett continued to press with Alford making several good stops and with skipper Mark McMechine marshalling the Purton defence well, the tie drifted into extra time. In the first period, a corner

After the rise, comes the fall

Rylands Way, 16th April 2011

Wootton Bassett Town failed to have their say in the title race, losing miserably 4-0 against Wantage Town, who went to the summit of the Hellenic Premier Division as a result.

When the two teams met earlier in the season, Dave Turners side produced a fantastic display that earned them all three points. And following Bassetts recent spell of great form, Wantage undoubtedly arrived at Rylands Way anticipating a tricky encounter. They would therefore have been surprised at the ease with which they cantered to their victory. Deservedly a goal to the good at the break, they experienced only the briefest of troublesome spells after the restart before putting the game to bed with three simple goals. Never needing to step up the tempo, the visitors were the better side from the off, and twice were denied an early lead by two assured Stewart Thompson saves. The veteran custodian was first equal to a Stuart Cattell header following a testing Tom Butler corner. He then produced a fine parry to keep out Butle's half volley after a Mark McMeeking header was not enough to get the ball clear. The home side almost caught Wantage out on the break shortly after. Quick play down the right created an opening for Tuesdays hat-trick hero Alex Green, but his firmly struck effort was parried wide by an equally firm Gareth Tucker fist. Tucker was almost beaten from the resulting corner, which Ethan Delaney connected with, but the young forwards volley was always rising and narrowly missed the target. The visitors then finally found their breakthrough. Just after the half hour, an uncontested square ball found Niall Hodgkins lurking 25 yards from goal, and after taking a touch he unleashed a powerful drive which flew into the bottom left corner.

Bassett came out fastest following the restart and came close to equalising twice within the periods first seven minutes. A low free kick from the edge of the area after Delaney appeared to have been felled in the box was sent narrowly wide by Sam Collier. Greens neat layoff to Sam Packer then presented the midfielder with a one-on-one opportunity but just before shooting, the ball took a wicked bobble and Packer lifted it over the bar from close range. This though was the only play of the half they would have.

It did not take long for the visitors to punish Bassetts profligacy as Butler completed a flowing move by smashing the ball beneath Thompson to double Wantages lead on 50 minutes. Ten minutes later Butlers weighted corner was missed by the keeper and nodded in from close range by an unmarked Matt Biddle. Another set piece completed the rout. Scott Dewar this time provided the assist as Danny Keen nodded his corner in at the far post after Thompson once again was beaten by the balls flight. It completed a miserable afternoon for Bassett, whose performance was mystifying given their recent run of form. They can put that right Tuesday against Abingdon Town in a match, which will go a long way to deciding Bassetts final position in the table. A victory would almost certainly guarantee them a place above the Abbots.

Scoops Man of the Match: Sam Packer, worked well again in the midfield, spending time both in the middle of the park and out wide. He was industrious as usual and unlucky not to score, falling victim to the famed *Bassett bobble*.

Scoop Rating: 4/10, a massive comedown after the previous three matches. Wantage were always favourites, but Bassett put up little fight with the chance to play spoiler to the visitors title hopes. Wantages performance couldn't be faulted but was not overwhelming, as they were aided by the hosts underwhelming play.



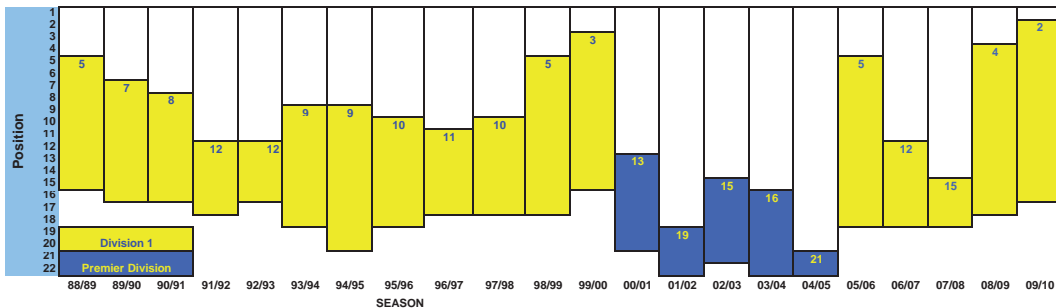

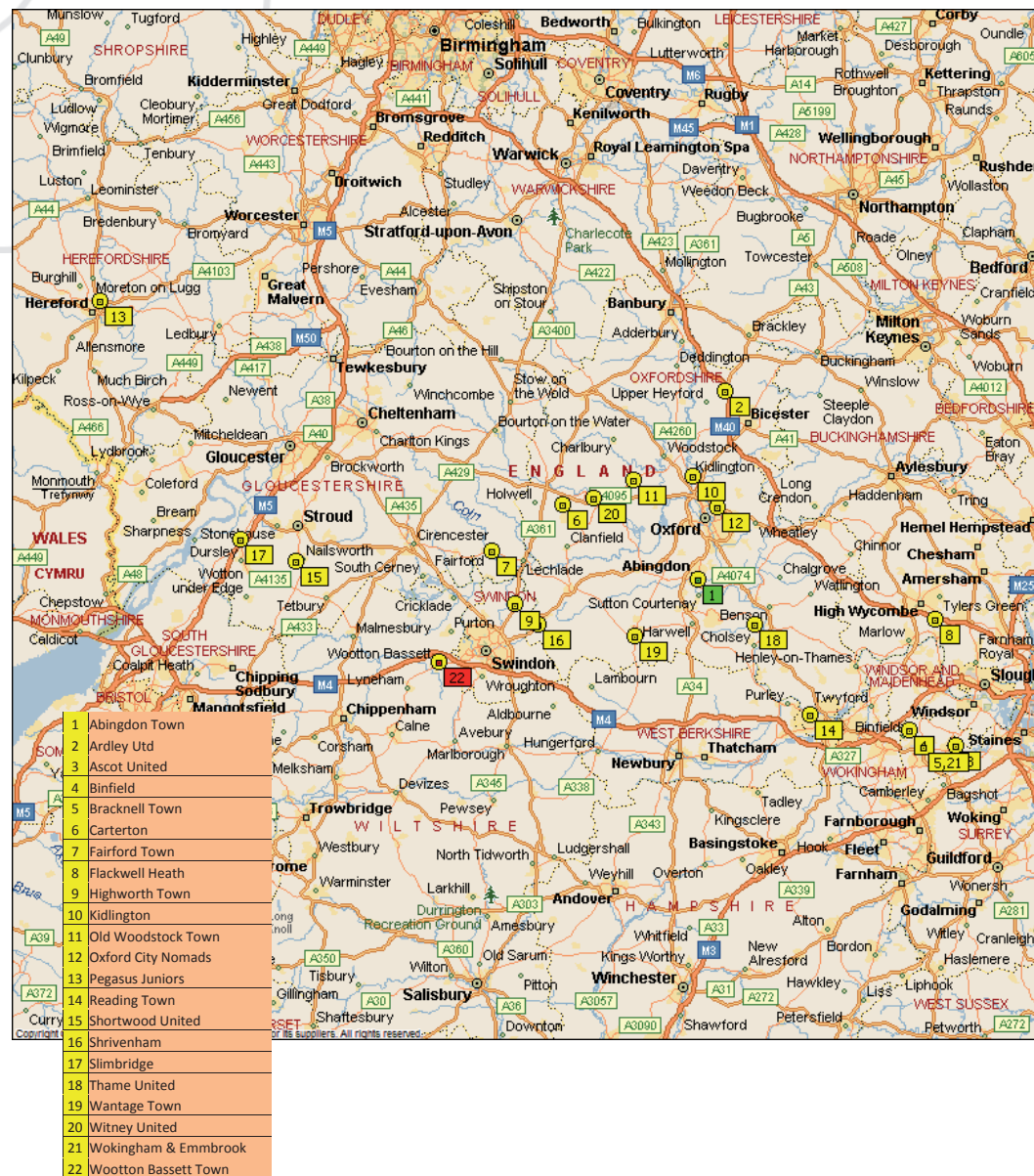
