A Warm Welcome to our visitors this evening from Reading Town for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

Previous Meetings

The two sides have met on just 3 occasions previously with our visitors having the better of things with Reading Town winning all three games.

The first meeting between the two sides came in Season 2010-11 when Reading Town left Rylands Way with all three points courtesy of a 3-0 win. In the return at Reading the home side triumphed 2-1, Bassett's consolation goal coming from Tom Dingle.



The two sides met again in Season 2011-12 in the Challenge Cup, Reading Town again winning by 3 goals to nil.

As well as their 100% record against us, Reading Town come to the Corinium this evening at the top of the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division table.

F.A. Vase

Well any chance we had of securing some prize money from FA competitions this season evaporated with the 7-0 hammering we suffered away at Western League Odd Down. The only consolation from this poor performance is that it wasn't our worst result in the FA Vase. Back in 2007-8, Paul

Burke's side went down 12-0 away at Wessex League side Bournemouth.

We had a few missing on Saturday due to injury and suspension but even with the absentees we could and should have put up a better show. Hopefully the lads will put this one down as a bad day at the office and perhaps spring a surprise against the current league leaders here tonight.

League Form

The defeat on Saturday came after gaining 4 vital league points in two away games. A 1-1 draw at Ascot, never an easy place to visit, was followed up by a midweek 3-2 win over Kidlington. This victory lifted us up into 11th place in the table with 12 points from our opening 9 games. The away form is certainly looking good and we now need to start winning our home games to climb further up the table.

Floodlit Cup

Our interest in the Floodlit Cup was ended by a good Tytherington Rocks side. Despite the defeat it was pleasing to see that Jeff and Drew took this competition seriously, fielding a strong side. Roberts frustrated by Wootton Bassett performance
Monday 16th September 2013

WOOTTON Bassett boss Jeff Roberts was disappointed that certain members of his side did not perform for the whole 90 minutes in the 1-1 Hellenic Premier draw at Ascot.

Roberts felt Bassett were well off their best in the first period against a home outfit that took a 1-0 lead in to the break thanks to Jon Bennett.

Soon after the resumption, striker Levi Cox converted from the spot to give the visiting side a share of the spoils, their third draw in four away league games this season.

"It's another point away from home, but we could have sneaked it to be honest," said Roberts.

"We didn't really come out of the changing room and didn't pick up on a corner that they scored from early on, which put us under the cosh.

"It seemed that in the first half there were some players who were hiding and not giving us 100 per cent.

"We had a chat with them at half-time and asked individual players what their issues were, and we came out in the second half and were much better.

"Either side could have sneaked it but we dominated the majority of the game."

Ascot might have gone in front with just five minutes played, but Sam Packer cleared off the line after Daryl McLean's delivery deflected awkwardly off Adam Corcoran.

Bassett keeper Luke Kuczynski then palmed Matt Jones' effort wide and moments later the hosts forged ahead as a low McLean corner was steered in at the near post by Bennett.

Sam Ockwell twice let fly from range as the visitors attempted to reply, but Kuczynski remained under fire from the Ascot front three.

Just after the half hour the keeper palmed a low cross to Jones before punching away the rebound and Jones forced another save from the

stopper following a Bennett cutback. A last-ditch Adam Corcoran tackle then deflected Bennett's curling shot over.

Bassett were level minutes into the second half, as Ryan Stanners broke down the right and played a one-two with Steve Yeardley (pictured below) before being tripped in the box, and Cox swept into the top-left corner from the spot.



Seconds later, Packer raced on to a Corcoran pass and squared for Alex Rigley, who forced keeper Chris Grace to parry away at full stretch.

Kuczynski got a fingertip to Jermaine Roberts' rising shot before Cox came close to a second, sending a low shot towards the bottom corner that Grace clawed round the post.

Ockwell's blushes were spared when the ball bobbed inches wide when he smashed the ball into defender Craig Bowden in the Bassett penalty area.

Substitute Lewis Chatwin then fired against the near post from a tight angle before Roberts could only direct straight into the gloves of Kuczynski.

Chatwin later scuffed wide from 12 yards before Ascot remonstrated with the referee after the final whistle, resulting in Dave Hoar receiving a red card.

Roberts to shake it up at Bassett

JEFF Roberts believes there is complacency in the Wootton Bassett camp and is keen to shake his squad up to improve results.

Bassett are without a victory in their last four games and the boss says he needs more quality at his disposal 'all over the pitch'.

This includes in midfield, which Roberts rates as his side's greatest strength.

"The midfield we've got is as good as you can get in the league but there's a couple of them not performing," he said.

"Alex Rigley has been a bit hot and cold, Sam Packer has come in from Ciren and been a bit disappointing, Ryan Stanners was a bit out of the game on Saturday (at Ascot).

"I felt a bit sorry for Jord (Roberts) and Sam Ockwell because you can't play with two midfield players.

"I still think we need a bit more quality all over the pitch. We're not tight enough at the back, we're sloppy in midfield and we're lacking in firepower up front.

"There's players turning up and thinking they are just in the side - there's been more than one or two like that, to be honest.

"A few changes might encourage people to buck their ideas up."

It is believed that Roberts has been prioritising his striker chase ahead of tonight's game at Kidlington in the Hellenic Premier.

Good evening and welcome to the management team, players and supporters of Reading Town, who have travelled to the Corinium Stadium this evening for this Hellenic League Premier Division fixture.

Reading are currently top of the table, having had a very strong start to the season with eight wins and a draw from eleven games. You can tell how tough tonight's game is going to be just by looking at our visitors' excellent defensive record so far this season as they have let in just nine goals.

Since our last programme notes we have played three matches – two in the league and one in the FA Vase.

Away at Ascot United we picked up a solid point thanks to Levi Cox's second half penalty. To be honest we could have sneaked it though had the team played to their full potential. We started sluggishly, conceding from a corner early on, which put us under the cosh. But after half time we came out and were much better and we dominated the majority of the second period.

Opponents - History

Reading Town FC • Club History

The club was formed in 1966 as Lower Burghfield and over the years changed its name several times, being known as XL United, Vincents United, Reading Garage and ITS Reading Town. The club started life in the Reading Combination League. In the early 1980's they were the Premier Division Champions on four occasions, culminating in the 1983/84 season when they made a clean sweep, winning not only the league title but three league cup competitions as well. The following season saw them move to the Reading & District League where they finished as runners-up in the Premier Division and went onto win the Reading Senior Cup.



1985/86 season saw them once again finish as runners-up in the Premier Division, but this time around they had to settle for runners-up in the Reading Senior Cup. In 1989/90 they joined the Chiltonian League, finishing third in the Premier Division. In 1993/94 they changed their name to Reading Town and relocated to their present Scours Lane ground. Ultimate success came in the 1994/95 season when they won the Premier Division Championship, gaining promotion to the Combined Counties League. In 1995/96 season they finished a credible 7th in the league and also won the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy. The 1996/97 season saw the installation of floodlights at the ground and the team went onto attain 6th place in the league and were beaten finalists in the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy. However, it was in the FA Vase, entering for the first time, where they achieved the greatest success. They reached the 4th Round Proper, before succumbing to beaten semi-finalists Banstead Athletic in a closely contested tie. In 1997/98 they finished as runners-up in the league after heading the table for most of the season. However one point from their last three games cost them dear and they were overtaken on the final day of the season by Ashford Town (Middlesex). This season also saw them enter the FA Cup for the first time in their history.

At the start of 2001/02 season Town former Manchester United and England star Neil Webb became Manager. But Neil was unable to transfer his success as a player to the Management role, after a poor start to the season he resigned in November. For season 2002/03 Town appointed 23-year old Colin Millard as Manager making him one of the youngest Managers' in the country and his enthusiasm and dedication to the job turned around their recent fortunes and a mid-table position was attained. In 2003/04 Town finished in 3rd place in the league behind AFC Wimbledon and AFC Wallingford. Season 2006/07 saw Town unveil their new 120 seat stand, to bring them in line with the ground grading required for Clubs at Step 5. During last season work was completed to erect covered terracing behind the railway-end goal, providing accommodation for 500 spectators. Season 2008/09 saw the Club move sideways across the Pyramid from the Combined Counties League to the Hellenic League finishing their first season in 8th position. The also won the Berks & Bucks F.A. Senior Trophy, beating Newport Pagnell Town 2-0 in the final.

2009/10 saw Town lead the league from day one until the final weeks of the season when they were overtaken by champions Almondsbury Town and Shortwood United, to finish in 3rd place. They again reached the final of the Berks & Bucks F.A. Senior Trophy but were soundly beaten 6-2 by Newport Pagnell Town. They were also beaten finalists in the Hellenic League Floodlit Cup, losing over two legs to Shortwood United 5-3 on aggregate. Some consolation was gained however, when they won the Southern Combination Cup for the first time, defeating Hanworth Villa in the final. During the season the Club made improvements to the ground, installing turnstiles and further seating necessary to gain a F.A. "E" Grading. Manager Colin Millard resigned at the end of the season and was replaced by Roddy Slater, who returned to the Club, after spending three seasons as Manager at Henley Town FC. Roddy Slater resigned as Manager at the end of 2010/11 season, replaced by Mark Bartley with Marcus Richardson as his Assistant. Bartley and Richardson only spent one season with the Club, winning the Hellenic Supplementary Cup, before leaving with most of the players for pastures new at Marlow.

Michael Butcher took over the management reigns for 2012/3, but his very young side struggled and he resigned in February 2013. Colin Millard rejoined the Club as Caretaker Manager and his position was made permanent in May this year. During the Summer the Club was taken over by new owners Battersea & Wandsworth Trade Union, a move that offers the club the stability to move forward.

Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.

The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the quarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6th time.

Match Reports

Another fruitful journey

Racecourse Ground, 14th September 2013

The longer journeys in the Hellenic League Premier Division are not proving to be much of a burden for Wootton Bassett Town. For the third straight game Jeff Roberts' team came home with a point, this time following a dizzying 1-1 draw with Ascot United.

It was a peculiar, yet entertaining match. Chances were frequent, though often created in uncharacteristic circumstances: for both teams a set piece in an advanced position typically led to a quick break and a shot at goal at the other end.

In fact that's how Bassett grabbed their equaliser shortly after the restart. Ascot failed to make the most of a free kick, Ryan Stanners initiated a counter down the right before being brought down in the box and Levi Cox converted the penalty.

Certainly it was an improvement to how the visitors had dealt with Ascot corners and free kicks throughout the rest of the match. As early as the fifth minute, after Luke Kuczynski had palmed Matt Jones' free kick over, Sam Packer was forced to clear off the line after Daryl McLean's delivery deflected awkwardly off Adam Corcoran.

Then in the tenth minute a low McLean corner was steered in at the near post by Jon Bennett, who had raced clear of his marker. It was harsh on Kuczynski, who had saved well again to glove Jones' stinging effort wide moments earlier, but he was left with little time to react.

Ascot continued to apply the pressure thereafter, helped by the fact Bassett were being somewhat careless with possession and trying to force the killer ball through to Cox and Alex Rigley up front rather than patiently trying to break down the hosts' shaky defence.

The means by which Bassett's two best opportunities arose also reflected their over-eagerness, with Sam Ockwell twice letting fly from range. In fairness to the central

midfielder both strikes came close – the first whistling over and the latter being fisted away. But when Ockwell's teammates tried to replicate him Ascot were able to breathe easily.

At the other end Kuczynski and his defence remained under fire as Ascot – playing with three men up front - exploited the space behind the visiting full backs. Just after the half hour the 'keeper palmed a low cross straight to Jones before punching away the rebound, before the unmarked forward forced a composed save from Kuczynski following a Bennett cutback. A last ditch Corcoran tackle then deflected Bennett's curling shot over.

A quick start to the second half then seemed to reverse the pattern of the match. When Jones headed Jon Denton's free kick from the right corner across goal from three yards out, Bassett broke with a purpose. Stanners charged forward down the right and a one-two with the advancing Steve Yeardley fashioned enough space for him to dart into the penalty area. There he was tripped leaving the referee no choice and Cox confidently swept the ball into the top left corner from twelve yards.

Seconds later, Packer raced onto a Corcoran ball placed into the left corner and squared for Rigley, who forced an outstretched Chris Grace to tip the ball away.

After Kuczynski survived a scare, redeeming himself following a goal kick by getting a fingertip to Jermaine Roberts' rising shot, Cox came close to a second. Collecting an inside pass from Stanners, the forward rolled his marker and sent a low left-footed shot towards the bottom corner, only being denied by Grace clawing the ball around the post.

With time beginning to wind down both teams then seemed open to throwing away the game.

A corner that came to nothing allowed Ascot to jaunt down the other end on 75 minutes. Ockwell seemed to have snuffed out the danger though, but he unwisely attempted to clear by playing across his own box, smashing the ball into Craig Bowden. After bouncing off the defender and veering towards

goal, a stranded Kuczynski was able to breathe a sigh of relief when the ball bobbed inches wide.

Four minutes later Yeardley sent Stanners free down the right again after Ascot wasted a set piece. Instead of carrying on towards goal, however, Stanners put too much on a square pass to Lewis Chatwin, forcing the substitute to shoot from an awkward angle from which he found the near post.

With two minutes remaining Bassett conceded possession from a throw, allowing Ascot to initiate another counter, but Roberts wasted the opening, firing straight at Kuczynski. One last chance fell to the visitors. Receiving a Kyle Rigley pass, with his back to goal, Cox unselfishly steered the ball to Chatwin, who was left with just Grace to beat. However, the forward, trying to bend his shot around Grace with the outside of the boot, scuffed his effort from twelve yards.

Time soon ran out, with both teams perhaps frustrated they didn't take more from the match. Ascot certainly let their feelings show, remonstrating with a very inconsistent referee at full time, which resulted in Dave Hoar receiving a red card after the whistle.

While some of his decisions may have baffled, the result was certainly fair.

And it's one Bassett, who gained their third consecutive away draw, will happily take.

Man of the Match: Steve Yeardley – helped keep Ascot's dangerous strike force in check and was a key part of the move that led to Bassett being awarded their penalty.

Rating: 6/10 – it was a performance worthy of a point. However, Bassett's frailty at set pieces was again exposed, while the midfield's slowness in tracking back helped allow Ascot to create more opportunities than they should have been allowed.

Inspired by the fantastic book "Got, Not Got" by Derrick Hammond and Gary Silke this Season's new feature looks at football related matters from the Editor's long lost youth that are no longer with us. Today it is.....

School Football Leagues

In the good old days the School Team used to play regular matches and for the kids of Wootton Bassett Comprehensive that meant the Swindon Schools League. Yes really there did used to be a schools league along the lines of the competitions run by the North Wilts & District League. Teams would play each other home and away and who can forget those visits to the delights of Hreod Burna, Cricklade, Kingsdown, Braden Forest, Cricklade, Headlands, Ferndale, Penhill and Richard Jefferies.

In the 1960's and 1970's the PE teacher, or some enthusiastic Maths or Arts teacher who dreamed of being a PE teacher, would drive the team to away games in the school mini-bus with games often being played midweek after school. Think of Brian Glover in the film Kes and you will get the picture.

For the kids of Wootton Bassett the main man was Mr Tanner ably supported by Mr Short. Looking back these were great times and I never really got the opportunity to thank Mr Tanner for all those extra hours he put in for no additional pay before he sadly past away a few years ago. I

know he was not liked by the non-sporting kids at the school but for those who played sport he was a legend and well respected. The only time I ever really had a problem with him was when Andy Ferguson and I played for Wootton Bassett Town in a Mid Wilts League football fixture on a Sunday rather than play in a school volleyball tournament. School games did not take priority on a Sunday but I am pretty sure Fergie and I had a rough time in PE lessons for a few weeks after that given that we had preferred to play for WBTFC.

As I said the Swindon League often meant midweek trips in the school mini-bus into the metropolis of Swindon. Now the school mini-bus had seen better days. In today's health and safety conscious world it would probably not have been permitted for the transport of children. Indeed when I started owning a car I often wondered how the old mini-bus had actually passed its MOT, one of the teachers obviously knew someone at a garage me thinks.

In addition to those league games there would also be friendlies against such exotic sides as Hardenhuish (Chippenham), Devizes and Melksham. These would invariably be played early on a Saturday morning on grounds that were often rock hard due to the overnight frost. Again health and safety did not seem to come into the equation in those days. The games got played, no one got hurt, no one got too upset at losing and it also had the added bonus of improving the kids knowledge of geography in Wiltshire.

The leagues died off when the teachers no longer wanted to work out of hours for no extra pay (hardly blame them really) and when the

lefty do-gooders went soft and decided to stop playing competitive sport in case kids got upset at losing (most of the kids supported teams like Swindon Town, or in my case QPR, so losing was something we were already used to so not really sure what they were trying to achieve by this non-competitive thing. The kids who hated PE still hated PE).

Visiting Headlands on a Thursday night when it was starting to get dark and potentially be threatened was all part of growing up for a Bassett kid in them days. You learned to look after yourself and the clever ones amongst also made friends with kids from the other schools just in case you bumped into them at the Brunel Rooms and needed someone to put a good word in for you.

Wootton Bassett Comp rarely won any schools competitions but always put up a good show. My personal memories are of great games against Hreod Burna and in particular a personal duel against Bobby Henshall. Bobby was very fast, whilst I was very slow, but somehow I always seemed to have a good game against him. The game my brother and others remind me of though is a cup game at Kingsdown when I was marking Paul Rideout. I think we came in level at half time and Mr Tanner congratulated me on how I was playing only for Rideout to go and score 5 goals in the second half. That mini-bus journey back to Bassett that night was a long one.

Promoted Sides

SUCCESS often breeds success, especially in Non-League football. Promoted sides always do well when making the step up, or so people think, but is it fact or fiction?

Well, if you look at the stats, the old saying is pretty accurate. With the benchmark ten games almost played in most leagues, certain sides have set out their stall for another promotion charge.

In the Skrill North, newly-promoted Hednesford Town have started well and led the way early on with fellow promoted side North Ferriby United also flying high.

One that catches the eye further down in the Ryman North is VCD Athletic who were top of the league coming into the weekend after finishing runners-up in the Kent League last season.

When speaking to a manager who has just won promotion, you can bet your bottom dollar that he'll mention momentum and a winning attitude as being key to the following season.

Promoted sides are often tipped to do well with a feel-good factor spurring them on but how much impact does it actually make?

Well, looking back at the past three seasons from Steps 1-3, the average position of a promoted side is... 10th.

It just goes to show how close divisions are in Non-League in terms of quality, with the biggest step, and lowest average finish for a promoted side at 13th, being the Skrill Premier.

With most promoted sides operating part-time and entering a mainly professional division, it can be tough but there is positive news for Chester, Welling, Halifax and Salisbury fans – no promoted side has gone straight back down over the past three seasons.

In fact, over the past three years, six sides have been promoted again from Steps 1-3 while only five have gone straight back down – a whopping 15 reaching the play-offs.

The Skrill North is the friendliest division for promoted teams with an average finish of sixth. The lowest finish over the past three terms? Colwyn Bay's 12th place finish in 2011-12.

The Skrill South isn't quite as welcoming though, with both AFC Hornchurch and Billericay falling straight back down last season. Despite that, it still has an average finish of 12th.

Of the three Step 3 divisions, the Evo-Stik NPL has seen the most success, helped by phoenix clubs Chester and FC Halifax.

And if your team hasn't started well, don't panic! As seen in the Skrill Premier last

season, it's a long old marathon and not a sprint.

Champions Mansfield and runners up Kidderminster Harriers failed to impress early on but both recovered to fight it out for the title on the last day of the season.

In Kiddy's case, they had yet to win after ten games – drawing five and losing five – but the club stuck with boss Steve Burr and were almost rewarded with a return to the Football League. Patience is indeed a virtue.

So, if you're lucky enough to be a fan of a promoted side, there's a very good chance you'll enjoy another fruitful season – have fun!

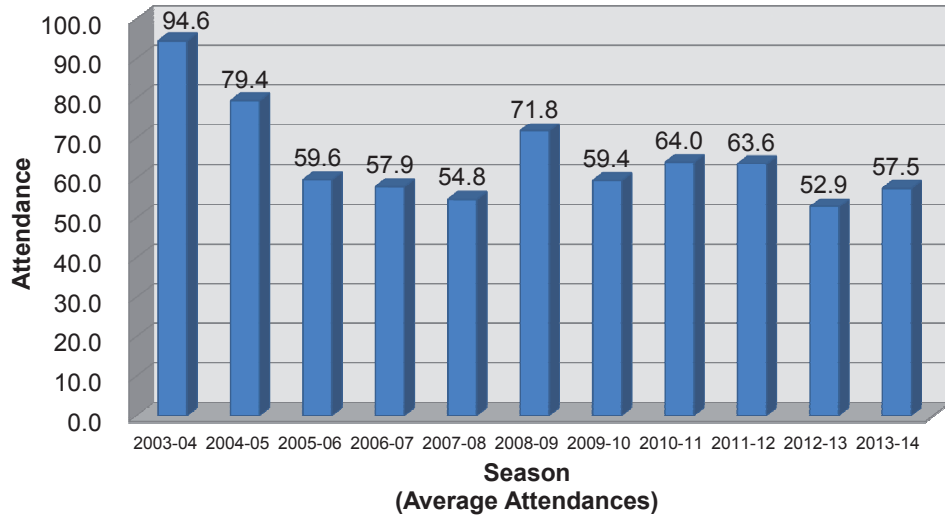

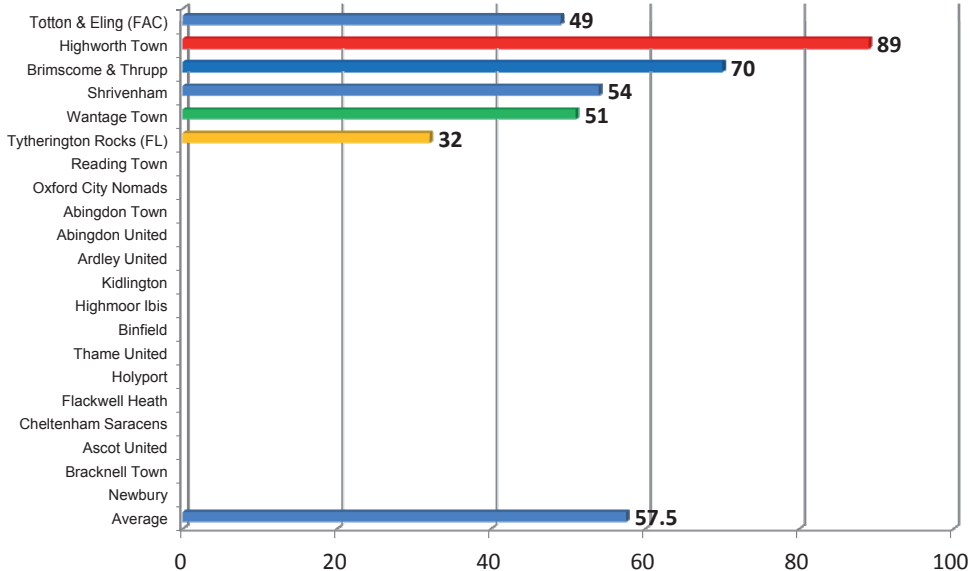

A stunning strike from Jamie Pierce with twenty minutes to go decided the game in the hosts favour after Bassett had rode their luck throughout the first period before equalising through Tom Dingle. Reading were in the end well worth the three points, but it was another missed opportunity for Bassett, still with five games left against teams battling it out for honours at the other end of the table, to get themselves out of danger. After troubling league leaders Ardley United in midweek, Bassett reverted to their midseason form that saw them slip into trouble with a frustratingly below par display. Although Ethan Delaney and Sam Collier threatened early, both seeing shots narrowly miss the target, Reading were dominant in the first half. Spearheading their charge was centre forward Marcus Richardson, whose ability to hold the ball up, made livewire pair Danny Seaward and Ashley Watkins, both intelligent with their runs, even more dangerous. In the 25th minute, the journeyman former pro, sent Seaward down the left flank, his cross being met by Jordan Cousineau, who headed across goal and narrowly wide. Despite their attacking quality, Bassett appeared more than willing to create problems for themselves with wastefulness in the midfield, which saw possession conceded all too easily. And it would be this failing, which played a crucial role in the hosts opener with twelve minutes to go before half time. Quick to counter, the ball was played into Richardson just inside the visitors half of the field. An unmarked Watkins was then played in down the left flank and he centred for Cousineau, making a late darting run, to direct the ball into the bottom right corner past a helpless Luke Sharps. The visitors seemed not to have learned their lesson after conceding a goal from such a simple, yet effective move. Two minutes later, Watkins blazed narrowly over after Seaward had beaten the offside trap and crossed from the right. Then, on the stroke of half time, Watkins breezed past right back Craig Bowden before delivering a dangerous low cross, which Richardson struck over with a first time effort.

To their credit, Bassett came out after the break a changed side. Tightened up at the back and less carefree when in control of the ball, they actually began to threaten and were rewarded for their enterprise on 67 minutes. A quick corner from Delaney to Matt Bown stung the unprepared hosts, and the latters weighted delivery was met by Dingle, who rose highest and looped a header into the back of the net with the help of the left-hand post. It was to be a fleeting lifeline though. Moments after an innocuous Richardson flick on had Sharps scrambling to bundle the ball away from danger after having hit the near post, the hosts retook the lead. After a weighted free kick taken from the halfway line, the burly Richardson set the ball perfectly for Jamie Piercey, who lashed an unstoppable volley into the bottom left corner from the right hand edge of the box. It was a hammer blow from which Bassett could not recover, try as they did for the final twenty minutes. Defeat means they slip a further place to 17th, just five points ahead of fourth bottom Witney United. Time to dig deep.

Scoops Man of the Match: Tom Dingle. Was rewarded for his hard work with his second goal for Bassett. Better service from his teammates is required though if his qualities are to be utilised fully.

Scoop Rating: 5/10. Reading dominated the midfield battle comfortably, which wound up deciding the game. Too haphazard in possession, Bassett created a number of problems for themselves, especially in the first half, from which the hosts fashioned a plethora of chances. Somewhat lucky to still be in the game at half time, Dave Turners side did claw their way back into the game, but after going behind again failed to muster anything meaningful in front of goal.

A mainstay at centre-half for Bassett, Carter is entering his fifth season with the club.

A consistent presence – both vocally and through his committed style of play – he first appeared for the club during the 2008/09 campaign – moving alongside manager Dave Turner from Pewsey Vale. That year Carter was a rock at the heart of the Bassett defence, which was the second stingiest in Division One West after champions Hardwicke.

Never one to shy away from speaking his mind – most commonly to brother Richie, Carter exudes passion and made 44 appearances, scoring twice.

Following a frustrating year with Premier Division strugglers Shrivensham, Carter returned to Rylands Way in 2010/11 and formed a solid partnership with Liam Edmondson. His appearances (44) and goals (two) mirrored those he posted in his first year at Rylands Way.

In 2011/12 he featured 35 times as Bassett finished with the third best defensive record in the division. Last season was a stellar campaign for Carter as he won both Managers' Player and Players' Player of the Year awards. Again Bassett conceded the third fewest goals en route to promotion to the Hellenic Premier with Carter playing 31 times.

After spending his formative years in senior football at Cirencester Academy, Carter briefly joined Highworth Town before moving to Fairford Town for the 2004/05 season, appearing in 30 games, scoring once.

Two years later he joined Turner at Pewsey, scoring four goals in 38 appearances in his first season. No stranger to quality defences, in

2007/08 he played 34 times, scoring the one goal, for a team who possessed the second best defensive record in the league.

A COUPLE of weeks ago I was asked to play for a Non-League Legends team against a Showbiz XI, and yes, like you, I am still wondering why – there were some real grass-roots heroes on the pitch!

Former Southall Town and Hayes prospect 'Sir' Les Ferdinand (pictured below) was the highest profile, while Wallingford Town product John Dreyer played for Luton in their top-flight heyday before ending his playing career back in Non-League with Stevenage and Maidenhead.

In fact, before his second spell at Stevenage as a coach led to his current role at Preston North End, I used to see 'Tumble' regularly when he was helping out at Hemel Hempstead and Flackwell Heath and I was playing for Hitchin Town and Ware.

John still had his boots on subbing up in Ryman One North

as recently as 2007, and in our 2-1 win at Wealdstone's Grosvenor Vale, he proved he's still got the quality left foot that Luton fans remember fondly for delivering one-step penalties with unerring accuracy.

It was also opportunity for me to catch up with a couple of former opponents who, thankfully, were on my side this time.

First, Dave Regis led the line alongside Ferdinand, and although I knew him best for his goalscoring feats at Wembley for my club, Notts County, he did the Non-League rounds at clubs like Dunstable Town, Fisher Athletic, Windsor & Eton and Barnet before getting his big break at 26.

As his career wound down at Hucknall Town in 1999-2000, I had to mark him in as a young Arnold Town centre-half. I reminded him about how I'd worn his stud marks from forehead to chin for a couple of weeks after clashing with the sole of his boot. He assured me it would have been accidental!

Another former Underhill favourite in our side was Derek Payne, quite rightly awarded the man-of-the-match award. I used to play against Payne in Ryman One South when I was at Bracknell Town in 2002-03 and he was turning out for Egham Town.

He's 46 now, but anyone watching a couple of Sundays ago would think him much younger. He was non-stop in midfield, pirouetting on the ball to beat opponents half his age and spraying it in all directions with his elegant left foot.

I asked the ex-Hayes, Watford, Southend and Peterborough man if he was still playing at all, and his response? "Nah, but I might do next season!"

At 47, I'd argue a case for the pocket dynamo to still be able to do a job at Step 3, should the watching Wealdstone manager Gordon Bartlett wish to add to the 'Dad's Army' he jokes he's assembled with the likes of Glen Little, Scott McGleish and Chris Moore already on the cast list!

In such esteemed company I realise that my presence was required not to give the back four an air of authority; ex-Hayes stalwart Reg Leather supplied that. But to give the match a bit of publicity.

We were raising money in for Women V Cancer, a charity chosen because Leather's wife Helen was diagnosed with breast cancer last year.

Thankfully now in remission, Helen is raising money for the charity through a variety of events, culminating in her and sister-in-law Lesley joining their 400km cycle across Cuba next year.

Bassett suffer another nightmare

After a 7-0 shellacking at the hands of Odd Down, Wootton Bassett Town have another FA Vase horror show to add to their inglorious list of misadventures in the competition.

Jeff Roberts' first venture into the tournament as Bassett boss may not have been the club's worst ever Vase defeat, but it was by far the most disappointing result and performance he has overseen during his short time in the Bassett hotseat. And it hurt.

That fact is demonstrated by the manager's decision to deliver an extended lecture to his team, who went into the game on the back of a reasonable stretch of form in the Hellenic League Premier Division, on the pitch following the full time whistle.

Quite rightly no one section of the team was spared his wrath. The defence provided too many gaping holes for Odd Down to exploit, the midfield failed to offer any kind of protection to the back four, while up front little was on offer as Lee Stevens and Lewis Chatwin were forced to feed off scraps. If anything Bassett were lucky to get nil.

They were behind within ten minutes when Brad Norris was given far too much time on the right wing and curled a cross into the

box, which caught keeper Wes Clarke out and nestled into the opposite bottom corner.

Three minutes later the lead was doubled. Taking advantage of Aaron Stevens dithering on the ball too long, Norris stole possession before quickly slamming a 25 yard drive into the top left corner.

Victims of a stunning, quick-fire two-goal salvo, Bassett were shell-shocked, a situation which only invited further pressure as the visitors sought to chase the game.

Mike Baker saw a shot deflected inches wide by Steve Yeardeley after the defence was again stretched by a ball over the top into the channel. Moments later Jordan Roberts was caught in possession and Kye Simpson powered past Adam Corcoran only to see his shot repelled by Clarke's feet. The rebound fell to Rory Kay who was denied by Clarke, who had to spring quickly to his feet and fling himself across goal.

Clarke again made a double save from Simpson and his brother Troy, but he could do little to deny Kay on 26 minutes. Given too much freedom in the centre of the park, Joe Raynes turned and picked out the run inside from the left from Kay, who, in behind the defence, confidently slotted home.

Still Odd Down came, Kye Simpson twice failing to find the back of the net after latching onto defence splitting passes.

Bassett were then finally able to put together a couple of threatening attacks, but failed to convert. Sam Packer saw a dangerous cross fly across the six yard box with no forward willing to gamble, Chatwin then sent a towering header just over before Sam Ockwell forced Kane Mannings to save on the dive. A goal then could have provided the visitors a lifeline, albeit undeserved.

Alas it was 4-0 within five minutes of the restart. Ben White had plenty of time to deliver his cross from the right and an unmarked Norris steered in from close range to complete his hat trick.

A fifth quickly beckoned, Clarke parrying wide from Simpson following a swift counter from a

Bassett free kick that was squandered.

It eventually arrived shortly after the hour when Corcoran's attempted clearing header from a Ashley Scott free kick bounced off an attacker and fell to the feet of Simpson who rammed home.

With nine minutes to go Clarke fumbled Sam Antsey's low cross, allowing Baker to tap in for six.

The rout was then well and truly completed in the final minute as Scott rounded off a decisive move with a drilled finish from a Simpson through ball.

Bassett's past three games in the Vase have now seen them suffer defeats by four, six and seven goals. It's a record that can't get any worse, surely?

On The Edge

Management of players is a very important input no matter what the game; it not only can enhance your Control but can also add a big plus to your own Personality and Leadership. To be animated (finger wagging) or vociferous in an arrogant manner (come here you) to certain perpetrators can only ignite situations even further. Its back to the same two words 'Respect' and 'Dignity'. Misconduct by players and your own disciplinary measures can become the topic of conversation in disagreement, but it is important you keep your cool, never become officious and not intimidated or swayed in your judgements by players concerned. At times you may become unpopular, I know that to well, but your governing policies will gain rewards and follow you to other games, I was nicknamed the 'vicar' for my dislike of foul and abusive language but it worked the oracle for me throughout my long career, on occasions a sensible word in the ear of the culprit can be just rewards if it is said quietly in frustration. It can be a thin line between deciding on a yellow card for certain offences (excluding mandatory situations) or taking a moment to offer words in disapproval of certain players misdemeanours (persistence has no excuse), but certain on field offences can be managed with a short worded sentence to calm down emotions or even a quiet word to the offender in the general flow of the game as long as you do not lose vision of actual play while doing so.

On numerous occasions, while assessing, I have seen referees rushing to the scene of disparity fumbling for his intended card which looks undignified at worse, go to the incident at a pace required then carry out your intended response to suit the crime I have to admit a quicker card may be needed if you feel it may prevent further animosity but make sure the right player receives it. I have on more than one occasion seen referees performing this fumbling routine and then appear to change his mind on arrival at the scene of foul play, that's the referees prerogative but it looks untidy. Two things I must add which is becoming prevalent within our game, when speaking to players/player keep your hands off them and if you are to show a disciplinary card do so in a definitive manner not in a way that looks impertinent and self-important. As an assessor it was never my wish to disagree with a referees purpose to show a yellow card but remember not all offences committed in the penalty area, by a defender, are worthy to be termed cautionable, a penalty kick may suffice. Players can be influenced in their actions by personnel in the technical area, if it becomes unacceptable and could jeopardise your control and you feel the need to have a word, bring the culprit to the touchline and face the field of play to carry forward your message rather than go into the situation head on. By bringing him forward in the manner mentioned no other personnel can hear your conversation or indeed lip read and this latter comment goes for the spectators who may be standing in that vicinity and hear everything. Remember no player during the 90mins are your 'mate' so don't call them one, they have a number and a certain coloured shirt that should be descriptive enough. Happy whistling and flagging
