Swindon Advertiser Collier turned down Southern League offers for Bassett

Friday 25th October 2013

SAM Collier turned down a switch to Thatcham because he felt Wootton Bassett would be the best place to restore his confidence in the final third.



The 26-year-old struggled for goals with Cirencester this season despite featuring regularly for the Southern League Division One South & West outfit.

And following a heart-to-heart with Centurions boss Brian Hughes, Collier decided to reject a move to league rivals Thatcham in favour of Hellenic League Premier Division outfit Bassett.

Collier finalised his return to his former club yesterday - who groundshare with Ciren - and explained that he was keen to get back on the goal trail, starting this weekend at league leaders Reading.

"I've played pretty much every game for Cirencester this season and I've been doing OK, but I just felt my goal threat had gone away as I've only scored three in 15," said Collier.

"I was feeling low on confidence and I wanted to go away, enjoy it and get my goal threat back.

"Didcot rang me and Thatcham did as well. Didcot was never on the cards but Thatcham was something

I really thought about, as I played under Richie Bourne at Abingdon.

"But in the end I decided it was the best thing for me to go to Bassett. I guess it was the travelling and the fact I'm a bit low on confidence - going to a club in the same league as Ciren but at the other end of the table didn't seem a good thing for me.

"In an ideal world I'll stay signed on at Ciren and Hughesy will hear good things about me and want me back, but at this stage I'm a Bassett player rather than being on loan here."

Despite dropping down a division, Collier insists he is not expecting the goals to flood in straight away and believes he will have to work hard to earn his place in the starting XI.

"By no means am I thinking that I'm going to walk it and that it will be easy," said Collier.

"The difference between the two leagues is minimal and I don't expect to walk in there and be in the team every week."

Collier has limited knowledge of Reading but is looking forward to the challenge in Berkshire tomorrow.

"There's a few of the lads there that were at Abingdon when I was there. They are quite big and strong and it will be a test," he said.

Swindon Advertiser Roberts fumes at referee decisions

Monday 28th October 2013

BOSS Jeff Roberts was left angry at the decisions which he believes 'robbed' Wootton Bassett of a draw at home to Hellenic Premier leaders Reading.

Referee Templey twice turned down Bassett appeals for a penalty when they trailed 1-0 and after the hosts did equalise, he awarded a controversial free kick that led to Reading's late winner.

Roberts said: "We got robbed. Sam Packer got brought down in the area and the only person that didn't see it was the referee. They were even laughing in the away dugout.

"Five minutes later the keeper brought him down and he didn't give anything, when it's either a penalty or a dive.

"The ref didn't really give us anything at all. It was frustrating because we thoroughly deserved a point out of it.

"I find in this league some of the refs are really poor. In our 13 games we've had two that have been good.

"Yesterday we got robbed out of the game, it was very poor refereeing."

Reading missed two early chances with Imani Likita blazing over when clean through, before keeper Curtis Meare palmed over a free kick from Danny Horscroft.

Graham Lewis was off-target midway through the first period but soon after he made no mistake as he intercepted Kyle Rigley's pass, rounded Meare and tapped into the net.

The visitors almost doubled their lead when Josh Blackwood's free kick deflected over via Adam Corcoran, while Likita struck straight down Meare's throat.

After the restart Bassett were twice denied a penalty when Sam Packer was brought down in the box, the second time by keeper Nathan Silver, but it was Packer that was booked for diving.

Likita then headed wide when he should have done better and Bassett levelled the game with 10 minutes remaining.

Packer rolled a short corner to Jordan Roberts and the midfielder's far-post cross was superbly sidefooted home by Jason Milhench.

The hosts rode their luck when Horscroft's corner was headed against the bar and Meare drilled over on the follow-up, while Lewis came close with an audacious effort.

With two minutes left, makeshift centre-back Sam Ockwell was harshly adjudged to have handled and from the resulting free kick, Horscroft's delivery was nodded home by Tristam Dennis.

Opponents - History

Ardley United FC • Club History

Ardley United formed in 1945 just as the Second World War was ending. From humble beginnings playing mainly in the Lord Jersey Football League, the club has progressed through the Oxfordshire Senior League to Step 5 of the football pyramid in The Hellenic Football League.

Under the generous patronage of the Chairman, Norman Stacey, Ardley have flourished since gaining Hellenic League status. Proudly providing one of the finest playing surfaces at this level, plus excellent off pitch facilities for both players and supporters. Added to that the club has earned a reputation for being one of the most hospitable clubs to visit.



In the last 25 years Ardley have won the Oxfordshire Senior League Division One title on three occasions as well as the Junior Shield, also on three occasions. Apart from a barren period between 1973 and 1983 the club has won trophies almost every season throughout it's history. The club were in the "old" Division One of The Hellenic League for six years, winning the league in consecutive seasons 1996/7 and 1997/8.



Also winners of the Division One Cup for four consecutive seasons between 1994/5 and 1997/8, a record of achievement never previously attained and unlikely to be surpassed with the introduction of the combined Premier and Division One Challenge Cup competition. 1997/8 also saw the Ardley Reserve side as Champions of their league, and promotion to Division One of the Reserves section. League restructuring, and facility, requirements towards the end of the 1990's saw Ardley in the new "First Division".

The club worked hard to improve the facilities, which was rewarded with promotion to the Hellenic Premier League in season 2003/4. The following year the club was rewarded for it's achievements being awarded the Hungerford Cup for the greatest improvement in facilities and playing. Further accolade came in the same season on being awarded the Non League Paper's "National Game Award" for the most improved facilities. Season 2006/7 proved to be one of the best in the club's history finishing third in the Premier Division and also winning the Supplementary Cup. Season 2007/8 provided mixed fortunes, the League position was not as great as recent previous seasons, but further success in Cup competition was rewarded with finalist places in both the Floodlit Cup and Supplementary Cup. The Supplementary Cup Final was the last game in charge for manager Dan Still who had guided the team to three seasons of success.

Following Dan Still's departure, the manager's hotseat was filled by Kevin Brock for the start of the 2008/9 season. The ex-Oxford Utd, QPR & Newcastle Utd pro brought his experience as manager of both Oxford City and Banbury Utd to the club and this saw them enter arguably their most successful phase in their history. Achieving league positions of 5th and 7th in his first 2 seasons, Kevin then built a side which would challenge strongly for league honours in each of their next 2 seasons only to fall just short each time and end up in third place. In addition, the club also won the Bluefin Insurance League Cup in 2009/10 and narrowly lost in the final the following year. Having come so close to the league title in recent seasons has only spurred on Kevin, and his trusty and vastly experienced assistant Brian 'Robbie' Robinson, to try to improve on those results and no doubt they will be doing their utmost to land that elusive league title that everyone at the club would love to see.

A speedy and skilful forward, Ryan can often score goals from out of the blue, as his haul of 43 strikes during his previous spell at Ardley in 2011/12 will attest.

Previously with Banbury United, Troy holds the ball and brings others into play. The fittest player you will find he is also the first to get back and help his defenders.



Jon Gardner Forward
A vastly experienced forward who has played for Oxford City and Banbury among others, Jon gives everything on the pitch and will cause problems for most opposing teams.



Steve Howkins Forward
A strong and typical centre-forward, Steve enters his second season at Ardley having scored 36 goals in all competitions last season.



Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.



Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One West on a ground grading technicality, despite an appeal to the FA against the decision. In the circumstances manager Dave Turner did well to steer his side to 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. Last season Wootton Bassett were never out of the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing in 2nd place. In addition they had a fantastic run in the FA Cup reaching the 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time where they put up a spirited performance against Conference South side Dorchester Town. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided he had taken the team as far as he could and left after a successful 5 years in charge. In his place have come the former Calne Town management duo of Jeff Roberts and former Bassett player Drew Youngsam.

As Bassett enter their 3rd period in the Premier the new management team will be looking to consolidate in the top division at a time when the Club has to play games at Cirencester Town whilst the new ground is built at Ballards Ash.

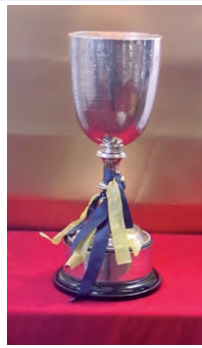

The Wiltshire Senior Cup was first competed for back in 1896-97 when Swindon Town were the winners. The Town have gone on to win the competition nine times, including the first six years of the competition. With their progress in the professional game it is a long time since Swindon Town have competed in the Cup. Wootton Bassett Town's first success in the competition was to come at the turn of the century when they made the final in 1902-03, losing to Warminster Town. Wootton Bassett made the final again the following season doing down to Swindon Town Reserves in the final. It would be 84 years before Wootton Bassett would grace the final of the competition again when in 1987-88 they made the final to this time lose against near neighbours Purton. Wootton Bassett Town finally won the cup in 1998-99 when they defeated Pewsey Vale in the final. This success was repeated two seasons later with a win over Shrewton United. Since this win the best the Bassett faithful have had is a couple of semi-final appearances. Last season Wootton Bassett Town went out in the Second Round, losing 3-0 away at Westbury United. The competition was won by Melksham Town, despite having been knocked out in the quarter final only to be re-instated due to their opponents Bradford Town playing an ineligible player. Melksham made the most of their second chance.

In the final the game ended 0-0 after 90 minutes against Downton but two extra time goals gave Melksham the cup for the 6th time.

Match Reports

Hard done by Bassett harshly denied at league leaders

Scours Lane, 26th October 2013

After matching Hellenic League Premier Division leaders Reading Town for 88 minutes, a controversial free kick and lapse in concentration condemned Wootton Bassett Town to a cruel 2-1 defeat.

With the two sides headed for their second draw against one another in the space of a month, Sam Ockwell – who had performed admirably filling in at centre half for the suspended Shaun Carter – was harshly adjudged to have handled, the ball appearing to have brushed his shoulder.

Thirty yards out from goal and towards the right wing, Danny Horscroft whipped in a fine delivery to the left post where Tristram Dennis, alone with only a teammate as company, guided a header into the opposite bottom corner.

Leaving the defender unmarked was a failure for which Bassett only had themselves to blame; similarly, Reading's opening goal of the game followed a horrible error from the visitors. Nevertheless, the hand referee Neil Templey had in swaying the game's outcome in awarding that late free kick for an offence that never was cannot be denied. Nor was it the first time on the afternoon that he had made an egregious error of judgment which went against Bassett.

Twice within five second half minutes he denied the visitors what appeared to be stonewall penalties. And on both occasions it was Sam Packer who was told to get back onto his feet.

On the hour the midfielder was laughably booked for a dive when it was clear to most observers in the ground that he had been caught by a flailing leg after twisting his way between and bursting past two Reading defenders.

Moments later he played an intricate one-two with Ryan Stanners on the

edge of the box and, when seeking to round home custodian Nathan Silver, he was sent tumbling to the floor. Yet again, however, Bassett's appeals for a spot kick were refused.

Typically, it is those placed higher in the league who benefit most over the course of the game from such unfair decisions. And that is caused by their ability to better craft openings and take advantage of the opportunities that arise.

That was the case in this affair. In the game's first four minutes the hosts spurned two fantastic chances to take the lead as Bassett were slow out of the blocks. Imani Likita found himself through on goal within sixty seconds, but blazed over before Horscroft sent a curling free kick towards the top right corner which young 'keeper Curtis Meare somehow managed to glove over the bar.

On twenty minutes they again threatened when Likita outmuscled Lee Stevens in the left corner and cut back for Graham Lewis, who could not find the target from a tight angle.

They were soon presented with a chance they could not spurn. Bassett were guilty of overplaying deep inside their half and on more than one occasion in the sequence of play it appeared as though the ball was set to be turned over to Reading. That eventually happened, Kyle Rigley having the misfortune to be the guilty partner as his pass back to Sam Ockwell did not carry the necessary weight. Lewis then raced onto the free ball, rounded a stranded Meare and tapped in.

For the remainder of the half Reading held the upper hand and almost doubled their lead when Josh Blackwood's low free kick was deflected inches over by Adam Corcoran, while Likita struck firmly but straight at Meare following Toby Nowell's weaving run.

After the restart Bassett began to place their hosts under pressure. With 52 minutes on the clock, a Jason Milhench flick forward caused all kinds of trouble for Jason Wagner and Ross Herridge who both slipped. Sam Collier looked set to pounce on the ball, but was just beaten to it by an onrushing Silver.

The visitors should then have had the chance to equalise and potentially take the lead as Packer made his presence felt only to be punished by poor officiating.

Those mishaps could have proven critical as Likita headed wide from close range while unmarked, but Bassett eventually made their mark with ten minutes remaining.

From the left corner, Packer rolled a pass back to Jordan Roberts who delivered a stunning cross to the far post, where Milhench had ghosted unnoticed and coolly sent a side foot volley beyond Silver.

It was just reward for Bassett's performance as they frustrated and took the game to their opponents, and a point seemed likely.

There were scares. A Horscroft corner was headed onto the bar and the follow up, with Meare beyond the ball after unsuccessfully claiming the delivery, smashed over. Lewis also came close with an audacious hooked effort with his back to goal. But Bassett appeared to have weathered this late surge.

That was until referee Templey put whistle to mouth and Bassett failed to defend the resulting set piece.

Man of the Match: Curtis Meare – an assured display from the young 'keeper, in which he made some crucial saves. His acrobatic tip of Horscroft's early free kick was sublime.

Rating: 6/10 – it was a performance that merited Bassett a point. During the first half, playing against a stiff wind, they found themselves under the cosh, but were able to limit their hosts. Jeff Roberts' team arguably held the upper hand after the restart and had certain crucial decisions gone in their favour and certain mistakes not been made, they would have finished the season undefeated against Reading Town.

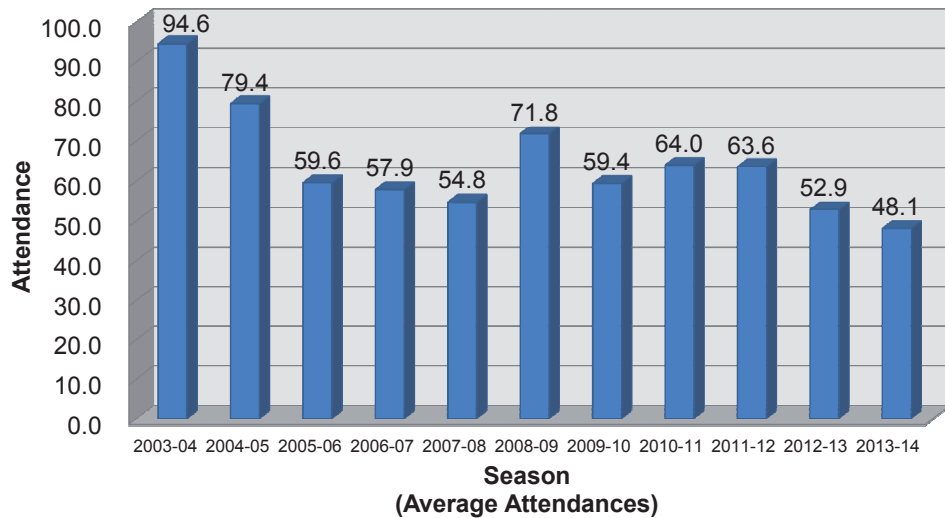

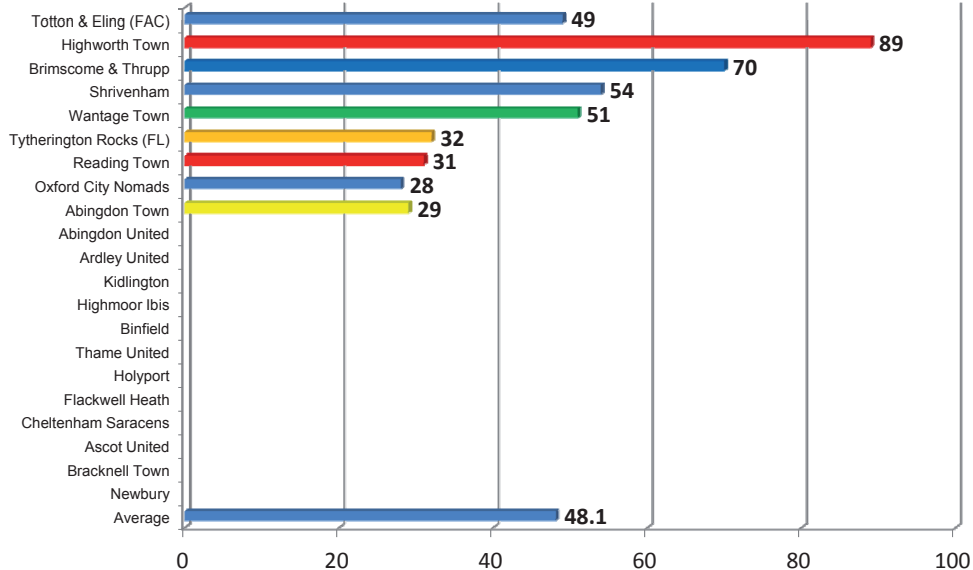

found the back of the net 26 times in 51 games. Collier scored both Bassett's goals as they upset eventual champions Wantage Town 2-1, while braces against Shrivenham and Witney United helped seal dramatic come from behind victories. He also played a key part in Bassett's run to the FA Cup first qualifying round, netting twice in the extra preliminary round replay with Bradford Town that Bassett eventually won on penalties before scoring the only goal of the game in a tight encounter against Almondsbury UWE.

Although Bassett wound up being demoted following that season, Collier initially stuck with Bassett, though his goalscoring exploits unsurprisingly attracted the attentions of teams at a higher level. He started the campaign strongly with five goals in the opening four games, including a hat-trick in a 5-1 thrashing of Tytherington Rocks, which took him past fifty in Bassett colours. Collier would finish the season with six goals, as he netted in a late season victory against Clanfield when making a guest appearance.

Early in the campaign, he departed for Southern League Abingdon United and was a leading light for them as they escaped relegation. In the league he struck 17 times, good enough to give him the fifth best record in Division One South and West.

In the summer of 2012 Collier moved to Cirencester and enjoyed another productive season, finishing as the Centurions' top scorer with 15 goals in 43 games. He began the 2013/14 campaign with three goals in sixteen appearances for Clren before sealing his move back to Bassett.

Amongst his other former clubs he counts Swindon Supermarine, Wantage and Purton.

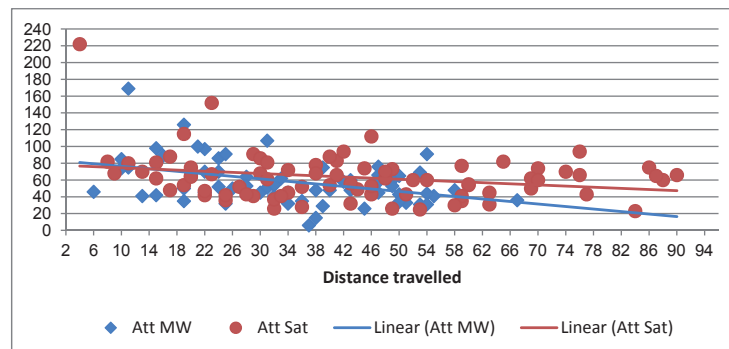

Going the extra mile to get a better crowd

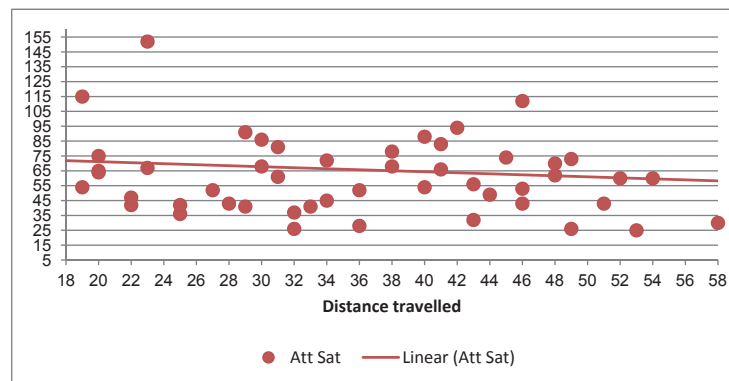
After last time looking at the effect of when a game is played on attendance, this article looks at the effect of where a game is played. Included are attendance figures for games this season, set against the distance in miles between grounds (using the quickest route according to Google Maps), while they have also been divided between those played on a Saturday and those played midweek.



Predictably, as travel distances reduce, so attendances increase with this occurring at a slightly greater rate for games played in midweek.

The average distance away teams have to travel in the Hellenic League Premier Division is around 38 miles, at which a game played on a Saturday would have around 65 people in attendance, with a midweek match attracting a crowd of 56. Unfortunately not all games can be local derbies. So the real proof

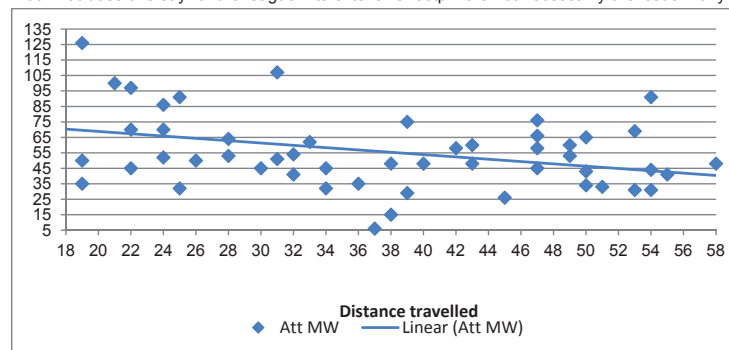
at the true impact of the Hellenic League's large footprint on attendances would be to look at the differences between attendances around the league average.



The next graph takes a closer look at games on Saturdays. As shown a game between sides 18 miles apart will only typically attract ten more fans than one between teams almost sixty miles apart. For midweek fixtures, however, the impact of distance travelled is significant.

about sixty miles apart. According to the Saturday trend line, the attendance at a game played between sides four miles apart would attract thirty more fans than one between teams ninety (90!) miles apart! Admittedly these figures will change as the season grows and frigid winter Saturdays become less of a pull.

But what does this say for the league? Its extensive footprint is not necessarily the issue many claim it to be. But it becomes an



issue when it comes to games played midweek. Problematically, not all Tuesday or Wednesday night fixtures can be between teams in close proximity to one another. Perhaps then, in order to prevent this, league size needs to be reduced in order to decrease the amount of midweek football played?
